- Boiler Notes

THE OPENING TIP

- The Boilermakers square off with Northwestern on Sunday for the lone meeting in the regular season between the two clubs.
- · Purdue plays their second straight game away from home looking to snap a two-game skid, the longest losing streak of the year.
- The Old Gold and Black is tied with Maryland, Michigan and Ohio State for sixth in the league at 2-2.

LAST TIME OUT

- The Boilermakers dropped their road contest at No. 12/13 Indiana 66-48.
- Ae'Rianna Harris was the lone player in double figures with 15 points, while Cassidy Hardin hit Purdue's two 3-pointers on the night.
- Purdue is 0-3 this season against ranked opposition.

ROILER RIG 3

- Karissa McLaughlin, Dominique Oden and Ae'Rianna Harris have powered the Boilermakers in 2019-20.
- The trio averages 11.8 points and 5.7 rebounds, which ranks 12th and fifth among top-three scorers on a team in the Big Ten.
- Largely thanks to Harris' 48 blocks, the group has 52 rejections on the year, which is the most among a top-three.

TAKING TEAMS OUT OF RHYTHM

- The Boilermakers' defense has stymied opposition this season, holding opponents to 59.3 points per game.
- Entering their games against Purdue, opponents have failed to hit their scoring average 15 times and their field goal clip 13 times.
- Opponents are averaging 15.5 points below their season average and 10.1% below their average field-goal percentage.

HOME AND AWAY

- Purdue enters Thursday's showdown with a 7-1 mark at home and a 2-3 record on the road.
- Despite double-figure averages from Dominique Oden, Ae'Rianna Harris and Karissa McLaughlin at home and on the road, the Boilermakers are averaging 12.4 points less on the road.
- Defensively, Purdue has allowed 6.4 points per game with an average of 2.3 more steals and 1.7 more blocks away from home.

- BOILER NOTES

SPLASH SISTERS

- Karissa McLaughlin, Cassidy Hardin, Kayana Traylor and
- Dominique Oden have connected on at least 10 3-pointers this year. • McLaughlin leads the Big Ten in 3-point attempts and sixth in 3-pointers made with 35.
- Purdue is sixth in the conference with a 34.2% clip from distance and averaging five triples per game.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Purdue is 7-1 this season at Mackey Arena.
- The Boilermakers have a 43.5% shooting clip and an average of 69 points per game at home
- · Purdue has also dominated on the glass, outrebounding opponents by 6.9 boards per game.
- Dating back to 2015-16, Purdue is 53-19 in games at Mackey Arena, including a 31-6 mark in non-conference contests.

IN THE B1G TEN

• Entering the 38th season of Big Ten play, the Boilermakers are going for their eighth regular season title and first since 2001-02

- Purdue holds an all-time record in the Big Ten of 403-229, the thirdmost wins in the league behind Ohio State and Iowa.
- The Boilermakers have claimed a record nine Big Ten Tournament titles, including back-to-back in 2012 and 2013.
- In the Big Ten Conference, Purdue is 232-84 at Mackey Arena and 171-145 on the road.
- Purdue opened Big Ten play with a 66-50 win on the road at Ohio State, for its first win in Columbus since 2004.

SERIES HISTORY

- Purdue owns a 50-22 all-time record against Northwestern with fourth straight wins against the Wildcats.
- The Boilermakers are 22-15 in Evanston, including 11 wins in the last 15 trips to Northwestern.
- In the 2019 meeting at Mackey Arena, Karissa McLaughlin drilled a 3-pointer with 1.4 seconds remaining to lift the Boilermakers to a 61-58 win. The triple was her career-high ninth in the game.

IRON WOMEN

- Even with a deep bench, the Boilermakers continue to squeeze everything they can out of their starting lineup accounting for 79.2% of Purdue's total points this season.
- The starters have scored all but 15 or fewer points in 11 games.
- Karissa McLaughlin is second in the Big Ten in minutes played with 34.7. Dominique Oden is ninth with 32.8 minutes a night.
- · Last season, McLaughlin, Oden and Ae'Rianna Harris ranked first, fifth and 10th, respectively, in the Big Ten in minutes played.

JOINING THE 1,000-POINT CLUB

- McLaughlin joined the 1,000-point club with her 3-pointer with 5:24 remaining in the fourth against Western Kentucky.
- The junior is the 18th Boilermaker to reach the milestone as a junior and the 21st to hit the mark in less than 100 games.
- The 79 games it took to reach 1,000 points tied Carol Emanuel, Katie Douglas and Dominique Oden for the fifth-fastest pace.
- . McLaughlin is the third 1,000-point scorer on the current roster, joining Oden and Ae'Rianna Harris.
- The junior posted the third most points by a sophomore in program history with 510 and the seventh most by a rookie with 353.

- Purdue has assisted on 61.4% (223-363) of its made field goals. • With the season's top mark of nine dimes against Northern
- Illinois, Kayana Traylor holds the team lead with 65 dimes. • Purdue assisted on 63% of its shots from last year (493-779)
- McLaughlin is the fourth player in at Purdue with at least 100 assists and lead the team in helpers as freshman and sophomore.

RISS DON'T MISS

- McLaughlin's 34 points against Kent State topped her previous career high of 28, set against Northwestern on Feb. 17, 2019. She went 9-for-15 from the field, including a 6-for-10 mark from deep, and a perfect 10-for-10 at the free throw line.
- The junior etched her name in the single-game record book at several points – T-7th points, T-10th 3-pointers, most points by a Boilermaker in a win at Mackey Arena.
- The Fort Wayne native featured on "SportsCenter Top 10" thanks to a 65-foot buzzer beater at the end of the first half with 0.5 seconds, checking in at No. 3. It was the second time she made the cut after the game-winning 3-pointer against Northwestern last year.

DEFENSIVE FOCUS

- Strong defense has always been a staple of a Sharon Versyp team, and the 2019-20 squad is nothing different, as Purdue has held eight opponents under 60 points.
- The 34 points allowed against Chattanooga were the secondfewest points the Boilermakers have ever given up a true road game and fewest since Feb. 20, 1976 at Northwestern during the program's first season.
- Dating back to the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Boilermakers have held opponents under 60 points 74 times.
- In Purdue's history of 1,359 games, the Boilermakers have held an opponent under 60 points in 560 contests (41.2%).

THE SHOOTING TOUCH

- Purdue sits 10th in the Big Ten with a shooting clip of 42%,
- shooting above 40% in 11 games this season.
- Against Chattanooga, Purdue shot 52.7% from the field, the best mark since Jan. 5, 2019 against Michigan.
- The Boilermakers have created and converted the easy shots, with an average of 27.5 points in the paint.
- Opponents, meanwhile, have averaged just 36.3% from the field and 27.9% from behind the arc against the Boilermakers.

400 FOR COACH V

- With the win against Kent State, head coach Sharon Versyp joined the 400-victory club for her career.
- She has won a program record 156 games at Mackey Arena and sits third in wins behind Gene Keady (294) and Matt Painter (207)
- Versyp is the winningest coach in Purdue women's basketball history with 287 victories. She has led the Boilermakers to victory 354 times, when considering her 67 wins as a four-year starter at Purdue from 1985-1988.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

- Purdue is 26th in the nation in blocked shots per game with five.
- The Boilermakers are 76th in the nation and fifth in the Big Ten in scoring defense at 59.3 points allowed per game
- The Old Gold and Black has allowed just 9.9 second-chance
- points per game, thanks to 26.2 defensive rebounds per game.

TURNING DEFENSE TO OFFENSE

- Transition offense was a key emphasis during the offseason.
- Purdue is averaging 15.2 points off turnovers.
- Purdue's active hands have forced an average of 14.5 turnovers.
- On the flip side, the Boilermakers are giving up 17.3 points off turnovers per game due to an average of 17.7 giveaways per night.

NIQUES NICE TOUCH

- Dominique Oden is third on the team the team with 11.1 points per game, including and a 39.4% 3-point mark.
- She is just the 15th player in program history to amass 100 starts in a career, hitting the mark earlier this season.
- The senior topped the 1,000-point mark as a junior, just the 33rd player to accomplish the feat before their senior campaign.
- Oden became the 15th player in program history to join the
- 1,500-point club after a 20-point performance against Wisconsin. • Her excellence exceeds the bounds of the court as a civil
- engineering major, with an intensive internship on campus, as well as community service focuses with Hunger Hike, Carry the Torch and Community Cancer Network.

MCLAUGHLIN FROM DEEEEEEP

- Karissa McLaughlin leads the team with 35 3-pointers on the year.
- The junior is fourth in program history with 198 triples, closing in on Courtney Moses' record of 240.
- After six 3-pointers against Kent State, the Fort Wayne native tabbed her fifth career game with at least five triples
- McLaughlin is a career 36.7% shooter from behind the arc, good for ninth in program history.
- In 84 career games, McLaughlin has drained at least one 3-pointer in 72 games and two in 58 contests.
- In her first two years at Purdue, she never shied away from a 3-point opportunity, setting the freshman and sophomore season records and tying the single-season mark of 88 triples.
- . McLaughlin is three assists away from becoming the 16th player in program history to notch 300 helpers in a career.

CHASING GIANTS

- Ae'Rianna Harris' blocking prowess is made even more remarkable when you consider the fact that she only stands 6-1.
- Harris has the highest approach vertical on the team at 28 inches and holds the second-highest standing vertical at 24 inches. Her vertical in both categories improved by at least three inches during the offseason.
- The Indianapolis native has contested the opening tip in all of her starts and has 83-17 record in jump balls, including a 4-0 mark in overtime games.
- The Indianapolis native is the shortest member of the Big Ten's 300-blocks club.

RI-JECTIONS

- Ae'Rianna Harris is second on the NCAA active blocks list.
- Harris has blocked a shot in 93 of 120 career games.
- Harris broke the program record for blocks in 103 games.
- She is one-of-two players in Big Ten history to post at least two seasons with 300 points, 300 rebounds and 100 blocked shots.
- Harris is on pace to be the first player in program history to join the 1,000-point, 1,000-rebound and 300-block club, as well as the second player in Big Ten history.
- Harris has 48 rejections on the year, which is first in the Big Ten and fifth in the country. Her three blocks per game is second in the conference and 11th in the nation.
- Harris turned away nine shots against No. 5 South Carolina, tying Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton against Michigan State on Feb. 11, 2007, for second in program history.

RI-BOUNDS (YES...KNOWINGLY USED THE SAME NICKNAME STYLE TWICE)

- The first player to surpass 700 rebounds in three years at Purdue, Ae'Rianna Harris Harris is 28 boards shy of the school record of 968 set by Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton.
- She is currently second in program history with 941 rebounds, passing Sam Ostarello during the Western Kentucky game
- The Indianapolis native broke the program record for career defensive rebounds against Wisconsin.
- Harris is tied for second in program history with 25 doubledoubles and second in rebounds per game at 7.9.

THIS IS PURDUE BASKETBALL

- The 2019-20 season is the 45th campaign for women's basketball at Purdue.
- This is the 39th season for Big Ten women's basketball. Purdue has won a record nine Big Ten Conference Tournaments and seven regular season titles, including four outright - 1991, 1999, 2001 and 2002.
- Purdue has had 36 All-America selections by the Associated Press or WBCA in its history, with Ae'Rianna Harris as the most recent honoree in 2019 as an Honorable Mention All-American.

BOUNCE BACK CAMPAIGNS

- The Boilermakers are going for their first NCAA Tournament appearance since the 2016-17 campaign.
- Purdue has made a program-best nine NCAA Tournaments under Versyp, reaching the Elite Eight twice.
- Under Versyp, the Boilermakers have received a postseason bid in 12 of her 13 season, electing to forgo a WNIT appearance in 2018-19 due to mounting injuries at the end of the season.
- · Purdue is tied for 10th in Division I history with 26 NCAA Tournament appearances (Notre Dame, LSU, Iowa).
- The Boilermakers have failed to win 20 games just seven times since 1986-87, and every time they bounced back with at least 20 victories the following season, including a trio of Elite Eight

BOILERS DOWN UNDER

- In August, the Boilermakers went on a 10-day tour of Australia, including four games against professionals.
- The thrilling tour featured excursions to the Melbourne Star Ferris Wheel, a crocodile park, a dive at the Great Barrier Reef, a tour of the Sydney Opera House and a climb on the Sydney Harbour Bridge.
- The squad had 10 extra practices and ample time to bond together prior to the start of the school year.
- The team flew more than 44 hours in the air and over 22,000 miles during the tour.

WHEEL RISE EVENT

- In September, junior Leony Boudreau joined together with Shelby Gruss, a PhD candidate in agronomy and the former captain of the U.S. Wheelchair Basketball team, to create the Wheel Rise Event.
- · Boudreau planned and carried out an afternoon that featured the Illinois wheelchair basketball team playing an intrasquad scrimmage, lectures from distinguished professors and opportunities for women's basketball players to see what it was like on the court in wheelchairs. (Hint: Very Hard)

AN ALL-TIME GREAT ON THE SIDELINE

- Head coach Sharon Versyp is in her 14th season leading Purdue. • She holds the program record for overall and Big Ten wins and NCAA Tournament appearances

- Jenelle Grant mad her long-awaited debut for the Boilermakers against Northern Illinois.
- The England international made her first start with Purdue.
- The redshirt junior dropped a season-high seven points vs. Gonzaga.
- The London native played two seasons at the University of the Pacific, before sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer regulations.

NOVEMBER TO REMEMBER (THOUGHT OF THE CAR COMMERCIAL DIDN'T YOU)

- Purdue was 6-0 for the sixth time in school history, matching the best start in the Versyp era.
- The 6-0 start tied matched the best month of November in program history, tying 2011-12.
- Dominique Oden averaged 14.2 points per game, while Ae'Rianna Harris was just .7 rebounds away from averaging a double-double to start the year.

ALL-CONFERENCE NODS

- For the second straight year, the Boilermakers placed a pair of players on the Preseason All-Big Ten teams.
- Karissa McLaughlin and Ae'Rianna Harris received the preseason honors from the coaches and media.
- Purdue was picked to finish fifth by the league's coaches, the first preseason poll appearance since 2012-13.
- Maryland was the only other Big Ten program to place two players on a preseason squad.

MICCELL AMEDIIC CTATC

HALL OF FAMER - SHEREKA WRIGHT

- On Tuesday, the Purdue Athletics unveiled its 2020 Hall of Fame class, featuring women's basketball star Shereka Wright, as well as men's basketball standout Robbie Hummel.
- Wright is the only three-time All-American at Purdue, the threetime All-Big Ten First Team selection amassed 2,251 points, 793 rebounds and 177 blocks.
- Wright made and attempted more free throws than any player in Big Ten Conference history, going 776 for 1,071 from the line.
- After a two-year career in the WNBA, Wright joined the college coaching ranks and currently serves as an associate head coach at Vanderbilt.

IOINING THE FAMILY

- On Wednesday, Purdue added a pair of standout recruits from Indiana on National Signing Day.
- Madison Layden, a 6-foot-1 guard from Kokomo, is a two-time state champion and regarded as one of the most versatile guards in the nation. She is a three-time All-State selection.
- Ra Shaya Kyle is an imposing 6-foot-6 post player from Marion. An All-State pick in 2019, Kyle is a five-star recruit and the No. 5 center in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz.
- The recruiting class was ranked No. 17 by ESPN HoopGurlz and the fourth in the Big Ten, marking head coach Sharon Versyp's 12 top-20 class in her 14 seasons at Purdue.
- Kyle set the Marian single-game and career points record earlier this season, while Layden broke the same marks in Howard County the weekend after Christmas.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

- The 2019-20 roster has the highest amount of international players in program history with five.
- Three Canadians Boudreau, Tamara Farquhar and Roxane Makolo - come from Quebec and Dawson College. The trio represent the only Canadians to play for Purdue.
- Fatou Diagne hails from Thies, Senegal, and Jenelle Grant calls London, England, home.
- Purdue has a total of eight international players in its history, five of whom are on this year's team.

STARTING YOUNG

- The Boilermakers returned all-five starters from 2018-19 Harris, Oden, McLaughlin, Traylor and Farguhar.
- Together, the quintet has 376 starts amongst them.
- In the 45-year history of Purdue women's basketball, there have been 27 freshmen starters. The 2019-20 squad features four of them Oden, Traylor, McLaughlin and Farquhar.
- As a player, Versyp was the 12th rookie starter and 1-of-10 fouryear starters in program history.
- Purdue was one-of-three Power 5 programs with 100% of its scoring back for 2019-20, joined by Boston College and Florida State

REPRESENTING THEIR COUNTRIES

- Fatou Diagne was named to Senegal's 2019 AfroBasket roster in August. The Thies, Senegal, native guided the Lionnes to championship game against Nigeria and runners-up honors.
- Averaged six points, and 7.4 rebounds during th tournament.
- Roxane Makolo traveled with the Boilermakers to Australia but did not play in a game.
- The Quebec native was tabbed to play for the U19 Canadian Junior National Team at the FIBA Women's Basketball World Cup in Bangkok, Thailand, where her team finished eighth.
- Karissa McLaughlin received an invitation to the U.S. Pan American Games trials last May. Coach Versyp accompanied McLaughlin for part of the five-day experience, which allowed the two to develop a tighter bond.

HOPE FOR THE FUTURE

- On Saturday, the Boilermakers took part in the Hope on the Horizon Festival of Trees, hosted by the Community Cancer Network.
- The event brought leaders throughout the community together to honor those who have battled cancer in their lives, as well as raising funds for cancer research and treatment through a live auction of theme-decorated Christmas trees.
- The gala raised more than \$150,000 to help cancer patients in Lafayette, West Lafayette and other communities around the state.
- Purdue also assist the West Lafayette/Lafayette Hunger Hike, to raises funds to ensure that poverty-stricken children don't go hungry.


