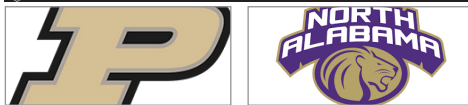

THE STARTING FIVE -- FIVE FACTS TO KNOW

- >> Sunday night will be the first look the Boilermakers will get against a different opponent since a March 6 loss to No. 6 Maryland in the Big Ten Tournament. The 2020-21 campaign marks the first season that Purdue has not played an exhibition since 1988-89. There have been several intrasquad scrimmages but no action against outside competition.
- >> Head coach Sharon Versyp enters her 15th season at the helm of the Boilermakers. The winningest coach in program history needs six victories to be just the third basketball coach at Purdue to amass 300 victories with the Boilermakers.
- >> The season opener will mark the debut for the highly-touted freshman duo of Madison Layden and Ra Shaya Kyle. Layden arrived in West Lafayette after becoming the first player in IHSAA history to lead three Final Fours in scoring and finishing runner up for Indiana Miss Basketball, while Kyle shattered records at Marion High School and enters as the tallest player in program history at 6-foot-6.
- >> Who will step up for the Boilermakers? With just a pair of starters healthy at the start of the season, Purdue will need to replace 60% of their scoring from a year ago and 51% of the total points over the last four years with the graduation of Dominique Oden and Ae'Rianna Harris and the offseason injury to Karissa McLaughlin. With a combined 103 combined starts Tamara Faruqhar and Kayana Traylor, lead the remainder of the roster that has a total of 27 starts at Purdue.
- >> While McLaughlin is out with injury, Versyp received a big boost in the guard department when Auburn transfer Brooke Moore was declared immediately eligible. The 5-7 guard from Atlanta played two seasons for the Tigers and averaged 6.8 points over 46 career games, including 8.6 points per game as a sophomore.

BOILER NOTES

THE OPENING TIP

- The Boilermakers open their 46th season of women's basketball at home against North Alabama on Sunday night at Mackey Arena.
- Purdue was originally set to face Bowling Green on Nov. 25 for the season opener, but protocol issues forced that game to be rescheduled for Dec. 13 at 2 p.m.
- The Nov. 29 start date is the latest for the Boilermakers since the 1995-96 season, an 80-72 win over No. 14 Kansas at Mackey Arena on Nov. 26.

IN SEASON OPENERS

- The Boilermakers hold an 37-8 all-time record in season openers with a perfect 26-0 mark at home.
- Under Versyp, Purdue is 13-1 in season openers with an average margin of victory of 20.5 points per game.
- Purdue's home opener kickstarts a six-game homestand to open the year, tied for the longest homestand to start a season since 1980-81.
- The Boilermakers opened the 2019-20 campaign with a 68-55 win over Milwaukee at Mackey Arena. Kayana Traylor (15) Dominique Oden (16) and Ae'Rianna Harris (12) finished in double figures, as the Boilermakers shot 47.9% from the field and 60% from three (9-15).

A NEW YEAR

- Purdue enters 2020-21 with a trio of returning starters, despite one that will be sidelined for considerable time, from a squad that went 18-14 overall and 8-10 in the Big Ten Conference last season.
- The Boilermakers have a trio of players set to make their debuts in the old gold and black Sunday night, including the No. 19-ranked recruiting class of Madison Layden and Ra Shaya Kyle.
- Head coach Sharon Versyp enters her 15th season at the helm of her alma mater, six wins shy of her 300th victory in West Lafayette.
- Purdue's senior class of four is its largest since the 2011-12 season with six, when the Boilermakers lifted the Big Ten Tournament Championship.

HONORING MJB

- Throughout the 2020-21 campaign, the Boilermakers will wear a special patch on their white and black with the initials MJB for former director of athletics Morgan Burke, who passed away in the summer of 2020 at age 68.
- Burke served as the Purdue Athletics' leader from 1993 to 2016 and helped the Boilermakers navigate into the modern era.
- He had an impact on the women's basketball team, heading the department during the 1999 national title run and the hiring of Sharon Versyp.

A WIN WOULD...

- Be better than a loss
- Make the Boilermakers 38-8 all-time in season openers and 27-0 when opening the season at home.
- Be the seventh straight win in a home opener for Purdue.
- Pull head coach Sharon Versyp within five victories of joining the 300-win club at Purdue, a list of six coaches that includes Matt Painter and Dave Shondell.

BOILER NOTES

A LOOK BACK OVER THE LAST FEW MONTHS

- After going blow-for-blow with No. 6 Maryland in the Big Ten Tournament, the Boilermakers were set to reach their 27th NCAA Tournament in program history.
- When the NCAA made the (correct) decision to cancel the postseason tournament, head coach Sharon Versyp worked to ensure the student-athletes were able to make it home. Only two players did not return home - Tamara Farquhar stayed in West Lafayette to rehab an injury, while Fatou Diagne remained in Indianapolis to stay with her brother.

BIG SHOES TO FILL

- The Big 3 is no more. Gone are Ae'rianna Harris and Dominique Oden to graduation, and Karissa McLaughlin will be out for a considerable amount of time due to offseason surgery.
- The trio accounted for 60% of Purdue's scoring last year and 51% of all points over the previous four seasons.
- Oden set the program record for most minutes played and games started, while finishing her career with 1,755 points for seventh in program history.
- Harris etched her name in the Purdue record book more than 25 times, including the all-time blocks record for men and women.
- Combined, the graduated duo accounted for 2,303 points, 1665 rebounds, 520 assists, 391 blocks and 322 steals over the previous four seasons.
- The trio were named All-Big Ten each of the previous two seasons, and Harris was named back-to-back Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year.

THE NEW ROOKIES

- The Boilermakers welcome a pair of highly touted freshmen to the scene in Madison Layden and Ra Shaya Kyle.
- After signing their National Letters of Intent in November of 2019, ESPNW ranked the recruiting class at No. 19 in the nation.
- Layden was a two-time Indiana state champion, a runner up for Indiana Miss Basketball and the first player in IHSAA history to lead three different Final Fours in scoring in boys or girls and a four-star recruit and the No. 57 player in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz.
- Kyle, the tallest player in program history at 6-foot-6, cracked the top-100 scorers in Indiana history, the 47th player in state history to score 50 points in a game, five-star recruit and the No. 36 player in the nation by ESPN HoopGurlz.

KT'S DIMES

- Junior guard Kayana Traylor makes her return to the point for her third season in West Lafayette poised to break into the career top-25 in assists, currently 38 away from Janon Roland with 259 in 24th place.
- The Martinsville, Ind., native ranks 14th in program history with a 1.23 assist-to-turnover ratio.
- In her career, Traylor led the Boilermakers in assists last season with 102 and finished 12th in the Big Ten.
- She led the Boilermakers in assists 29 times over her career and posted 20 games with at least five assists.
- Traylor has basketball in her blood. Her mother (Danielle) played at LSU, her father (Jeff) at Iowa and aunt (April) at Florida State. She also has three sisters who are up-and-coming talents on the prep stage.

FATOU FINDING A WAY

- Redshirt Senior Fatou Diagne took tremendous strides during the 2019-20 season, posting career highs with 3.5 points and 4.1 rebounds per game.
- Her production shot up in the final stages of the season, as she picked up her first two career double-doubles against Michigan State and Maryland in the Big Ten Tournament.
- Diagne missed Purdue's 2019 Australia Tour due to playing with Senegal in the Women's AfroBasket, in which she helped the Lionnes reach the championship game against Nigeria.
- During the early stages of the pandemic isolation stages, Diagne helped raise money for orphanages back in her native Senegal.

STRONG STARTERS

- With just two starters returning, Purdue will look to
- Even with a deep bench, the Boilermakers squeezed everything they can out of their starting lineup last season, accounting for 80.2% of Purdue's total points this season.
- The starters scored all but 15 or fewer points in 19 games, including all 54 points against No. 18 Indiana on Feb. 3.
- After a 2018-19 campaign with 18 total complete games, there were just five complete games in 2019-20.

DROPPING DIMES

- Purdue assisted on 61.9% (471-761) of its made field goals last year
- Kayana Traylor held the team lead with 102 dimes.
- Purdue had 24 performances with at least five helpers.
- The Boilermakers were seventh in the Big Ten with 14.7.
- Purdue assisted on 63% of its shots from last year (493-779).
- Traylor is the seventh Boilermaker to deal at least 100 in each of her first two seasons.

WELCOME BACK, TAM

- Tamara Farquhar's return from injury provides the Boilermakers with another key experienced veteran in the lineup.
- Prior to her season-ending injury at the start of Big Ten play, Farquhar had made 54 straight starts.
- The Canadian international was a complimentary piece in the post with Ae'rianna Harris for two seasons and looks to build a new relationship with Fatou Diagne, Ra Shaya Kyle, Rickie Woltman and Nyagoo Gony.
- Entering her senior season, she ranks 10th in program history with 6.5 rebounds per game.

TAKING TEAMS OUT OF RHYTHM

- The Boilermakers' defense stymied opposition in 2019-20, holding opponents to 64.1 points per game.
- Entering their games against Purdue, opponents failed to hit their scoring average 26 times and their field goal clip 21 times.
- Opponents averaged 8.9 points below their season average and 4.9% below their average field-goal percentage.

DEFENSIVE DIGITS

- With the graduation of Ae'rianna Harris, the Boilermakers will look to a deep contingent of post players to become the enforcer down low.
- Harris set the Purdue record for men and women for career blocks with 380.
- Purdue was 38th in the nation in blocked shots per game with 4.6, and 27th in total blocks with 148.
- The Boilermakers were sixth in the Big Ten in scoring defense at 64.1 points allowed per game
- The Old Gold and Black has allowed just 10 second-chance points per game, thanks to 25.3 defensive rebounds per game.

CLOSING IN ON A COACHING CLUB

- Head coach Sharon Versyp is on the verge of joining the Purdue 300-wins club, currently six wins away.
- In her 15th season at Purdue, Versyp has a 411-241 career record through 21 seasons as a head coach.
- Versyp is fifth in Big Ten history with 145 conference wins, 11 behind Michigan State's Karen Legland (1976-00) at 256.

WE WANT SOME MO

- Junior transfer Brooke Moore was declared immediately eligible at the start of November, slating her to make an immediate impact.
- A two-year player at Auburn, Moore averaged 6.8 points and 2.3 rebounds during her stint with the Tigers.
- The 5-foot-7 guard was ranked as the No. 11 guard in the nation coming out of high school.
- Versyp has had the junior work through several positions and enjoys the energy and personality Moore brings to the court.



BOILER NOTES

WINNING TRENDS

- Since the start of the quarters era in 2015-16, the Boilermakers have benefited from early leads and held off late charges to pick up wins.
- During that span, the Boilermakers are 61-8 when scoring at least 70 points and 64-9 when holding opponents below 60 points.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

- Strong defense has always been a staple of a Sharon Versyp team, and the 2019-20 squad is nothing different, as Purdue held 10 opponents under 60 points and 25 under 70 points.
- Dating back to the start of the 2014-15 campaign, the Boilermakers have held opponents under 60 points 76 times.
- Versyp's teams have held opponents to an average of 61.1 points per game during her Boilermaker career (28,724 points in 470 games)
- In Purdue's history of 1,375 games, the Boilermakers have held an opponent under 60 points in 562 contests (40.8%).

SPLASH SISTERS ARE BACK

- The 3-point trio of Karissa McLaughlin, Kayana Traylor and Cassidy Hardin return for another year in West Lafayette.
- The "Splash Sisters" accounted for 262 3-pointers since the start of the 2018-19 season.
- 61 of Hardin's 68 made field goals during her first two seasons at Purdue came from behind the arc.
- McLaughlin will set the program record for career 3-pointers, after already breaking the single-season marks for freshman, sophomore and junior seasons.
- Traylor, while making just 54 triples in her career, is a 30.7% shooter from distance.
- New faces Brooke Moore, Madison Layden and Rokia Doumbia could make substantial additions and grow the sisterhood this season.

MCLAUGHLIN FROM DEEEEEEP

- Karissa McLaughlin endured ankle surgery during the offseason that will keep her out for considerable time, and the Boilermakers will be the without one of the most prolific shooters in program history.
- The 2017 Indiana Miss Basketball has led the Boilermakers in 3-pointers made all three seasons with 75, 88 and 71 triples, respectively.
- The senior needs seven 3-pointers to break Courtney Moses' all-time record of 240 career triples. McLaughlin is currently second.
- McLaughlin is a career 36.6% shooter from behind the arc, good for ninth in program history.

MCLAUGHLIN MILESTONES

- Karissa McLaughlin's junior season was filled with a host of milestones.
- She became the 35th member to join the 1,000-point club, the 18th as a junior and the 21st to do it in less than 100 games
- The Fort Wayne native joined the 200 3-point club as its fourth member with Courtney Moses (240), Katie Gearlds (238) and Brittany Rayburn (201).
- McLaughlin also notched her 300th assist as the 16th player in program history.
- With more than 100 dimes in each of her three seasons, she is the fifth player in program history to amass 100 assists as a freshman, a sophomore and a junior.

SPLASH HARDIN

- Cassidy Hardin averaged 4.3 points and shot 35.2% from distance over 29 games with three start as a sophomore.
- The Bargersville, Ind., native has 30 games with at least one 3-pointer, 17 with multiple triples.
- Hardin is a career 30.2% shooter from deep with 61 of her 68 made field goals coming from distance.
- The junior enjoyment for knocking down triples carries over even when she goes home, spending much of her free time shooting in her indoor halfcourt setup.

SPECIAL STALLINGS

- After two seasons receiving sparse playing time, junior Ajah Stallings is poised to step into a much larger role in 2020-21.
- The Indianapolis native has proved to be one of the better defenders on the squad and her offense has taken significant strides during the offseason.
- An inspiration to the local basketball community, Stallings was a three-star recruit and Honorable Mention All-State at North Central High School.
- Stallings overcame a damaged brachial plexus at child birth, the network of nerves that sends signals from the spinal cord to the shoulder, arm and hand, that limited the range of motion of her right arm, stopping her from flattening or rotating her palm.
- In addition to her achievements on the court, Stallings enrolled in the College of Pharmacy and received her white coat in the fall of 2020.

DOOOOUM-BIA

- Rokia Doumbia, while being forced to sit out due to NCAA transfer regulations, has made an impact during practices, alongside fellow transfer Brooke Moore.
- The Mali international spent two seasons at Arkansas, playing 55 games over two years, averaging 3.3 points and 4.2 rebounds as a sophomore in 2019-20.
- Prior to her time with the Razorbacks, Doumbia was a four-star recruit and was also named the MVP of the FIBA U16 Africa Championship in 2015 for her native Mali.

TOWERING TALLS

- The Boilermakers have some serious height on the roster this season, with the average height at 5-foot- 11 and one-quarter inches.

COVID-19 CHANGES

2020 ADJUSTMENTS

- Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Boilermakers will face a year unlike any other.
- Playing a shortened 25-game regular season, Purdue will play five non-conference games and 20 contests in the Big Ten.
- Unfortunately, fans will not be allowed at Mackey Arena this season for the first time in program history.
- After the cancellation of the Cancun Challenge, the Boilermakers do not have a non-conference tournament/event on the schedule, also a program first.

MAKING THE MOST OF ISOLATION

- After the 2019-20 roster saw its postseason dreams crushed by the (100% correct) decision to cancel the NCAA Tournament for safety purposes, Coach Versyp was instrumental in helping the Boilermakers find their ways home.
- All but two student-athletes were able to return home, while Fatou Diagne remained in Indiana due to strict travel restrictions back to Senegal, and Tamara Farquhar stayed in West Lafayette to actively rehab her knee injury.
- While scattered all over the world, Versyp held multiple Zoom chats each week with the team to ensure each student-athlete's well-being.

NEW-LOOK MACKEY

- Mackey Arena will have a decidedly different look to it without fans this season, as only family members will be allowed to watch the game.
- In an effort to keep a secure bubble around the student-athletes, only certain tested individuals will be allowed on the event level, in addition to student-athletes being tested daily throughout the season.
- The benches have been separated by at least three feet, forcing support staff to sit behind the scoring table, which has also been pared down.
- Players will have masks on while on the sidelines. Each student-athlete will have a small pale next to her assigned seat that will have multiple water bottles, a towel and other necessities to recover on the sideline.
- Purdue's marketing team continued its successful fan cutout program, after nearly 2,000 were purchased for football season. An even higher number is expected for the hoops campaign.

MEDIA CHANGES

- A limited number of media and photographer credentials will be issued during the 2020-21 season. All requests must be made at least 48 hours prior to tip by emailing Ian MacDougall.
- There will be no media or photographer access to the floor or event level. There will be no in-person interviews.
- All interviews will be conducted via Zoom over a link that will be sent through email to credentialed media.
- Aside from a pregame flipcard, there will be no printed materials provided to the media. All stats can be found via PurdueStats.com. A postgame book will be posted to PurdueSports.com within an hour of the game's end.

"SHARON VERSYP SHOW" RETURNS

- The new season of the "Sharon Versyp Show" debuted two weeks before the season in a new location, the Kissel Center at Ross-Ade Stadium.
- Host and voice of the Boilermakers Tim Newton and Coach Versyp chat from 7-8 p.m. every Monday night about the previous week, the upcoming opponents and other behind-the-scenes nuggets.
- Fans can listen on 95.3 BOB FM or by logging onto the Purdue Athletics Facebook page or the Purdue Women's Basketball Twitter feed.

DIGITAL PROGRAM

- With no fans in attendance Purdue Athletics created a digital program that will be updated several times throughout the year.
- The digital program will provide links on how to follow the Boilermakers, as well as all the proud Purdue partners.

HONORING MORGAN BURKE

- Throughout the 2020-21 campaign, the Boilermakers will wear a special patch on their white and black with the initials MJB for former director of athletics Morgan Burke, who passed away in the summer of 2020 at age 68.
- Burke served as the Purdue Athletics' leader from 1993 to 2016 and helped the Boilermakers navigate into the modern era.
- He had an impact on the women's basketball team, heading the department during the 1999 national title run and the hiring of Sharon Versyp.

BOILER NOTES

SIGNING THE NEXT GENERATION

- Head coach Sharon Versyp made another big splash on the recruiting trail in November, signing a quartet of prep stars to National Letters of Intent.
- The Boilermakers will welcome Sacha Washington (Georgia), Ava Learn (New York), Skye Williams (Ohio) and Jayla Smith (Indiana) to West Lafayette next summer, as the Class of 2021 was ranked No. 22 in the nation by ESPNW.
- In addition to the Class of 2020 being tabbed No. 17 last year, Versyp has signed a top-25 recruiting class 13 of her 15 seasons.

NEW CAPTAINS

- A week prior to the season, the players elected a their captains for the year - Fatou Diagne, Tamara Farquhar and Kayana Traylor.
- The trio represent the 87th, 88th and 89th captains in program history.
- Together, Farquhar and Diagne mark the first time that two international student-athletes were captains at Purdue.
- Farquhar is the 20th multi-year captain in Purdue history.
- The record for most years served as a captain is three, held by Drey Mingo, FahKara Malone and Carol Emanuel.

SOPHOMORE JUMP

- The 2020-21 campaign will offer two of Purdue's three sophomores to take a jump during their sophomore seasons.
- Rickie Woltman appeared in 19 games before her freshman year came to a close early due to injury. The St. Louis native has rehabbed and worked on her mid-range game to offer Versyp another option in her offensive arsenal.
- Bria Harmon found the floor just three times during her first year in West Lafayette, but the former Georgia First Team All-State selection has shown promising improvement during the offseason.
- Roxane Makolo suffered a major injury a few weeks before the season opener and will miss the entire campaign.

FIGHTING OFF THE INJURY BUG

- The Boilermakers welcome back several players who were forced to miss the later stages of the 2019-20 season due to injury, all credit to athletic trainer Jessica Lipsett.
- Senior Tamara Farquhar remained in West Lafayette throughout the spring and summer to rehab a knee issue. After constant work, she was cleared full-go around the first practice of the fall.
- Rickie Woltman bounced back from a knee ailment that sidelined her in February to be ready for the season opener.
- The biggest setback was the offseason surgery to Karissa McLaughlin that led her to being ruled out for the season back in early July. The 2017 Indiana Miss Basketball has made notable strides in her rehab.
