– AROUND THE HORN –

• Weekend No. 2 sets up as a homecoming for two members of the Purdue coaching staff, with Greg Goff and Chris Marx returning to North Carolina as the Boilermakers take on Campbell, Maine and Villanova at the Campbell Invitational.

• It's Purdue's first non-conference tournament since winning two of three at Stetson's four-team invitational in March 2018.

• Goff was the head coach at Campbell from 2008 to 2014, winning 224 games and leading the Camels to the 2013 Big South regular-season title as well as the 2014 Big South Tournament championship. Campbell won 141 games from 2012 to 2014, highlighted by an impressive 49-10 mark (.831) in 2013.

• Marx was the pitching coaching at Campbell from 2015 to 2019.

The Boilermakers are visiting the state of North Carolina for the third year in a row. Prior to a 2018 Regional at UNC, Purdue made just one trip to the Tar Heel State from 2013 to 2017.

- Recognized as the team's co-Pitcher of the Year honoree in 2019.
- Purdue's all-time leader (minimum 75 innings) in strikeouts per nine innings (10.04) and fewest hits allowed per nine innings (5.97).
- Has now pitched on Opening Day three years in a row, earning the season-opening start this year.
- Moved to Purdue's Friday starter role for the final weekend of April after serving as the bullpen's fireman for the first two months.
- In Big Ten play, led the league with a .163 batting average against and ranked second with a 1.67 ERA in league play.
- Just the seventh pitcher in team history to reach 100 career strikeouts as a sophomore and his 73 Ks were the most ever by a Purdue sophomore.
- Recorded 73 strikeouts in 60 1/3 innings pitched, with his 10.89 Ks per nine innings mark becoming a program record for pitchers with a minimum 60 innings.
- 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team as a starting pitcher, moving into the weekend rotation in mid-March and making five starts in Big Ten play.
- Surrendered only 21 hits in 41 innings, with only four hits going for extra bases, an impressive mark of 4.6 hits per 9 innings that ranked second in program history.
- Compiled a .147 batting average against as a starting pitcher, surrendering only 16 hits in 33 innings.
- Enjoyed his productive season while making 15 of his 18 appearances and working 32 1/3 of his 41 innings away from home.
- First-team all-conference in football, basketball & baseball as a senior at CHS.
- Recorded 127 Ks as a junior and 124 Ks as a senior, leading the state both years.

- Worked five innings of one-run relief to earn the win in game 3 of the 2020 season-opening series vs. Hofstra, closing out the victory.
- His longest outing as a Boilermaker was also the longest outing of any Purdue pitcher during the first weekend of 2020.
- Redshirted in 2018 with elbow injury, undergoing Tommy John surgery in May 2018.
- Says he suffered the injury in December 2017 during semester break.
- Made his collegiate debut in the April 16, 2019 home win vs. Butler live on FS1.
- Pitched 11 consecutive scoreless innings to begin his college career.
- Made his first start in Big Ten play in the series finale at Illinois in mid-May, but only went 2 innings because it was his third outing in an 8-day span.
- Came back from Tommy John in less than a year and wanted to pitch even sooner but coaching staff opted to be a bit more cautious with him.
- Was projected as a likely midweek starter or weekend reliever for 2018 before injury.
- Four-year varsity letterwinner at Hilliard Darby HS in suburban Columbus as a teammate of current Boilermaker Justin Fugitt; Justin's dad Chris was the coach.
- Says he has been on the same team with Fugitt since they were 8 years old
- Ohio's Huntington Park Pitcher of the Year as a senior.
- Went 10-1 with a 0.81 ERA as a senior to lead HDHS to conference and district titles; also part of conference championship teams in 2015 and 2016.
- Ohio Capital Conference Player of the Year as a senior.
- Went 4-1 with a 0.44 ERA and 43 strikeouts in 31 innings pitched as a junior.
- Honor roll student as an upperclassman.

GOFF & MARX RETURN TO BUIES CREEK: PURDUE BASEBALL AT THE CAMPBELL INVITATIONAL



HEAD COACH GREG GOFF

Greg Goff joined Purdue baseball as an assistant coach in July 2017 and was promoted to head coach in June 2019. The 2020 season will be his 15th as a collegiate head coach.

Previously a head coach at four universities, Goff succeeded his friend and longtime colleague Mark Wasikowski, who returned to the University of Oregon as the Ducks' new head coach in June 2019.

Goff has previously served as the head coach at Campbell University (2008-14), Louisiana Tech University (2015-16) and the University of Alabama (2017) as well as Division II University of Montevallo (2004-07). He also helped lead the Boilermakers to a memorable 38-win season in 2018, punctuated by the program's third NCAA Regional bid in program history. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings and was also the runner-up at the Big Ten Tournament in Goff's first year with the program.

Along with bringing an upbeat personality to the dugout and contagious energy to his role as the first-base coach, Goff helped numerous Boilermakers develop offensively the last two years. He played a leading role in coaching the base running and outfield defense. He also filled in as the program's pitching coach for a few games during a 2018 home sweep of Michigan while Steve Holm was with his wife for the birth of their second child. Purdue has compiled a 28-15 record at Alexander since Goff joined the coaching staff, headlined by a program-record 13-game home win streak to close the 2018 campaign. That represents Purdue's best two-year mark at home since 2011 to 2012.

In his first two years at Purdue, Goff helped develop and organize new community events for the program like the preseason fan fest and first pitch dinner. Both events proved very popular and helped generate preseason interest going into the new campaign. He has also served as the director of Purdue baseball camps.

Twenty-six Boilermakers registered a grade-point average of 3.0 or better during the 2019 fall semester. During the 2016-17 school year, Alabama's 3.259 team GPA established a program record.

Over 40 Purdue players completed at least 10 hours of community service during the 2019 fall semester as part of the program's increased emphasis in that aspect of the student-athlete experience. As a team, Goff's team logged over 450 hours of community service during the first half of the 2019-20 school year.

Goff and his wife, Tina, are the parents of four daughters: Kara, Kiley, Kolby and Kenzie. Kara plays softball at LSU and Kiley has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball at Purdue beginning in the 2020-21 school year.

SIX 40-WIN SEASONS

- As a head coach, Goff's teams have won over 40 games six times. Campbell was one of only eight Division I programs to win 40-plus games for three straight years from 2012 to 2014, posting 131 total victories during that span. The Camels enjoyed a historic 49-10 campaign in 2013.
- He also won 42 games in his final season at Louisiana Tech, helping lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional bid.
- Montevallo was a DII College World Series qualifier in 2006 under his guidance. As an assistant coach at Delta State, the Statesmen also qualified for the DII College World Series in 1994 and 1996.

ENDED NCAA REGIONAL DROUGHTS AT CAMPBELL & LOUISIANA TECH

- In Goff's final season at Campbell (2014), the Camels qualified for their first NCAA Regional in 24 years. Two years later, he led Louisiana Tech to its first Regional bid in 29 years. The 2014 Camels and 2016 Bulldogs both won at least one game in their Regionals, with La Tech coming through the loser's bracket to reach a Regional final at Mississippi State.

HISTORY OF TURNAROUNDS

- Goff's teams have had a losing record only five times in his 14 years as a head coach. Four of those five seasons were his first at a respective university. He has led his teams to some impressive turnarounds.
- In just two seasons, Louisiana Tech went from 15-35 the year before Goff's arrival to 42-20 in 2016, ending a 29-year NCAA Regional drought in the process. At Campbell, he inherited a team that was 11-45 in 2007. But under Goff, the Camels posted a winning record (27-24) in his second season and won 40 games by his fifth year (2012).
- Purdue's win total also jumped from 29-27 in 2017 to 38-21 in Goff's first year on the staff in 2018.

COACHING HONORS

- Goff was named the South Central Region Coach of the Year by the American Baseball Coaches Association at both Louisiana Tech (2016) and Montevallo (2006). He was the 2013 Big South Coach of the Year at Campbell after leading his team to a school-record 49 wins and a conference title. Montevallo won a combined 100 games over his final two seasons, posting a new single-season record both years.

BEFORE BECOMING A HEAD COACH

- Goff has coached 10 future big leaguers and over 50 MLB Draft picks, highlighted by Cy Young award winner Brandon Webb while he was the pitching coach at Kentucky (2000-03). Longtime big leaguer and World Series champion Joe Blanton also pitched for Goff at Kentucky.
- Along with his years as the pitching coach at Kentucky, Goff served as an assistant at Southeast Missouri State (1998-99) and his alma mater Delta State (1994-97) before becoming a head coach for the first time in the summer of 2003 at Montevallo. It was at SMO in the late 1990s where he first worked with Wasikowski. They helped lead the Redhawks to an NCAA Regional in 1998.

HOFSTRA VS. HOFSTRA – ADVANTAGE PURDUE

- **Bo Hofstra** entered the week as one of only six relievers nationally with multiple saves and no hits allowed on the season. Just one of the other five pitchers has faced more batters than Hofstra (11). Hofstra was the only pitcher in the Big Ten to record multiple saves during the opening weekend.
- Hofstra retired 9 of 10 batters faced, striking out four, while closing out the Friday and Sunday wins. The 11th batter he was credited with facing was an intentional walk to whom he did not deliver a pitch.
- Hofstra became the eighth Boilermaker with 10 career saves. He earned two saves in the same weekend for the second time, also accomplishing the feat in a March 2019 series win at Northwestern.

FAST START FOR FASCIA

- Entering the week, **Zac Fascia** was one of seven catchers nationally, and one of only two Big Ten players total, batting .500 with an OPS of at least 1.250 (minimum 15 plate appearances). He leads Big Ten catchers with six runs scored.
- Fascia hit safely in all four games vs. Hofstra, becoming the first Boilermaker to accomplish the feat in a four-game set since **Ben Nisle** at Texas in February 2019. **Skyler Hunter** has hit safely in every game of a four-game weekend five times in his career. Fascia finished the series 7-for-14 with 11 productive plate appearances, registering three extra-base hits, two hit by pitch and two sacrifice flies.
- The senior delivered the go-ahead sacrifice fly in the eighth inning of Saturday's comeback win.
- For the weekend, he threw out four base runners at second base. Fascia also played some first base, too.

IMPRESSIVE DEBUT SERIES AT THE PLATE FOR LaPLANTE

- **Kyle LaPlante** batted in the 2-hole in all four games vs. Hofstra during his debut weekend as a Boilermaker. He had a big impact for Purdue offensively, finishing the series 6-for-15 with 10 productive plate appearances.
- He was the only Boilermaker to record an RBI in all four games of the series, highlighted by his two-out, three-run double to break a 6-6 tie in the eighth inning of the season-opening win. The infielder drove in a run or scored a run in the big innings of all four victories.
- LaPlante hit Purdue's first home run of the season in the game 3 win vs. Hofstra. Fellow newcomer **Miles Simington** later hit a grand slam in the same game, helping Purdue score nine unanswered runs over the seventh and eighth innings. LaPlante and Simington both joined Ben Nisle (2018 season opener) as the last Boilermaker to accomplish unique home run feats. Nisle homered in his second collegiate at-bat as the last newcomer to hit Purdue's first home run of a season and the last Boilermaker whose first hit was a homer.

DID YOU KNOW

- **Ben Nisle** reached base safely and scored a run in all four games vs. Hofstra. He leads the Big Ten with seven runs scored entering weekend No. 2 of the season.
- Purdue hitters off the bench enjoyed a very productive weekend and were a big reason why the Boilermakers won the four-game series. Reserves finished the weekend a combined 5-for-7 with a .727 on-base percentage, nine RBI and nine total productive plate appearances. **Miles Simington's** grand slam, Purdue's first since April 2017, headlined the big hits. Bryce Bonner's two pinch-hit, RBI singles were both timely knocks in close games. **Tyler Powers** and Bonner also delivered doubles in games they did not start.
- Middle infielders **Evan Albrecht** (2-for-7, 2B, 3 BB, 5 RBI) and Powers (3-for-7, 2B, BB, 4 R) were both very productive at the bottom of the lineup while also playing flawless defense. Albrecht delivered a game-tying two-out, two-run double in the seventh inning of Purdue's comeback win Saturday evening. He reached base safely and drove in a run in all three games in which he played.
- **Andrew Bohm** and **Kyle Wade** both escaped bases-loaded jams, but Purdue relievers otherwise struggled with preventing inherited runners from scoring – with 14 of 24 coming around to score. Bo Hofstra stranded the potential tying run at second base as an inherited runner in the eighth inning of the series finale. Yet six of the 10 runners Purdue relievers kept from scoring came in those two innings that Bohm (Friday) and Wade (Sunday) finished.

HUNTER A CONSTANT ON OPENING DAY

- Senior **Skyler Hunter** became the ninth Boilermaker since 2004 to make four consecutive opening day starts. Current assistant coach Harry Shipley was the last to do it. Assuming he returns for his senior season, **Ben Nisle** could join the club in 2021.
- Junior **Trent Johnson** was selected as Purdue's opening day starter on the mound. He pitched on opening day for the third year in a row, appearing in relief during his underclassman seasons.

- **Tyler Powers** started at least 10 games at three different infield positions in 2019 – third base (29), second base (13) and shortstop (11). He was the only Boilermaker with a double-figure start total at three different positions.
- In 2019, **Trent Johnson** and **Andrew Bohm** became only the sixth and seventh pitchers in program history to reach the 100 career strikeout benchmarks as sophomores.
- Senior **Milo Beam** has played in 75 career games off the bench, easily the most of any active Boilermaker. He is also the only current player with more runs scored (45) than hits (41), scoring the decisive run in a walk-off win three times in his career.
- **Skyler Hunter** has nearly 100 more hits (204) than strikeouts (107) in his career. **Bryce Bonner** sports the best career ratio of walks (51) to strikeouts (54).

DOMINANT ARMS

- Four current Boilermakers – **Trent Johnson**, **Bo Hofstra**, **Matt Moore** and **Trevor Cheaney** – all have more career strikeouts than both innings pitched and hits allowed. As a natural correlation, they also have more innings pitched than hits allowed.
- Meanwhile, **Andrew Bohm** and **James Kulak** have more strikeouts than innings pitched. **Dalton Parker** and **Conner Tomasic** have more innings pitched than hits allowed.
- As Purdue's all-time leader in both categories, Johnson's sports a team-best 4.26 difference in his career ratios for strikeouts per nine innings and hit allowed per nine innings.
- Cheaney is back this season as redshirt senior after an injury sidelined him in 2019. He was one of Purdue's top relievers during the 38-win campaign two years ago.

MORE FROM THE SEASON-OPENING SERIES WIN

- The Boilermakers scored seven of their nine runs with two outs.
- Purdue's four pitchers combined for 12 strikeouts, matching the 2017 team for the second most in a season opener this century.
- **Mason Gavre** delivered an RBI single in his first at-bat as a Boilermaker, accounting for Purdue's first hit and RBI of the season.
- **Jett Jackson** (3+ IP, 3 H, 2 R, 3 BB) and Jackson Smeltz (4 IP, 6 H, 3 R, BB, 3 K) started on the mound for Purdue on Saturday, both making their collegiate debuts. They became the Boilermakers' first pitchers since 2013 to debut as part of the rotation during the season-opening weekend.
- The Boilermakers posted all three of their victories in comeback fashion. It marked the first time since a March 2012 sweep at Murray State that Purdue won three times in the same weekend after trailing in all three games. Coincidentally, the 2012 Big Ten championship team outscored Murray 40-5 in that series.
