#### – AROUND THE HORN –

• The WKU series represents Purdue's first games in Kentucky since an April 2017 midweek game at Louisville. The Boilermakers have not played a weekend series in the Bluegrass State since sweeping a three-game set at Murray State in March 2012.

• Purdue has dropped four in a row since winning the Campbell Invitational as part of a 6-1 start. The Boilermakers led North Carolina 4-0 entering the seventh inning Sunday, but UNC rallied for five runs against closer **Bo Hofstra**, winning the game in the 10th on a walk-off double.

• Purdue gave up runs (7) in the first inning for the first time since its first game and committed a season-high five errors in Wednesday's midweek opener at Indiana.

• **Skyler Hunter** recorded a hit to open all three games of the tournament in Minneapolis, doubling as the game's first batter Friday and Sunday. He was a team-best 5-for-12, representing Purdue on the all-tournament team. His seven-game hit streak came to an end Wednesday.

- Did not give up a hit over the first 5 2/3 innings of 2020 until North Carolina got him for 8 hits over 2 innings March 1 inside U.S. Bank Stadium.
- Retired every batter he faced as part of an 8-out save in the Campbell win.
- Academic All-Big Ten & the team's co-Pitcher of the Year in 2019.
- Pitched in every Big Ten victory, earning a win and five saves in conference play (fifth in team history).
- Ranks among the program's all-time leaders already in strikeouts per nine (9.36), fewest hits allowed per nine (7.45) and WHIP (1.25) – minimum 75 innings.
- Started the March 13 road game at Indiana State and his season took off after that outing; registered 35 strikeouts vs. 11 walks (3.18 K/BB ratio) over the final two months after early struggles with his command led to him recording 13 walks vs. 12 Ks (0.92 K/BB) in his first 11 2/3 innings.
- Helped the Cotuit Kettleers win the 2019 Cape Cod League title in August.
- Pitched in 28 games in 2018, all but one in relief, to establish a Purdue freshman record for appearances.
- Retired 18 consecutive batters over three appearances to begin his college career, earning Big Ten Freshman of the Week for an 11-out save vs. Saint Louis.
- Three-year all-conference honoree in HS batted .403 with a 0.48 ERA as a senior.
- Helped his Babe Ruth League teams qualify for the 13- and 15-year-old World Series.
- Averaged 14 points per game in basketball as a senior to earn all-conference honors.

- Has opened 2020 strong with three consecutive five-inning appearances, earning the win in his outings vs. Hofstra (relief) & Maine (starter).
- His longest outing as a Boilermaker was also the longest outing of any Purdue pitcher during the first weekend of 2020; matched it the last 2 weeks.
- Redshirted in 2018 with elbow injury, undergoing Tommy John surgery in May 2018.
- Says he suffered the injury in December 2017 during semester break.
- Made his collegiate debut in the April 16, 2019 home win vs. Butler live on FS1.
- Pitched 11 consecutive scoreless innings to begin his college career.
- Made his first start in Big Ten play in the series finale at Illinois in mid-May, but only went 2 innings because it was his third outing in an 8-day span.
- Came back from Tommy John in less than a year and wanted to pitch even sooner but coaching staff opted to be a bit more cautious with him.
- Was projected as a likely midweek starter or weekend reliever for 2018 before injury.
- Four-year varsity letterwinner at Hilliard Darby HS in suburban Columbus as a teammate of current Boilermaker Justin Fugitt; Justin's dad Chris was the coach.
- Says he has been on the same team with Fugitt since they were 8 years old
- Ohio's Huntington Park Pitcher of the Year as a senior.
- Went 10-1 with a 0.81 ERA as a senior to lead HDHS to conference and district titles; also part of conference championship teams in 2015 and 2016.
- Ohio Capital Conference Player of the Year as a senior.
- Went 4-1 with a 0.44 ERA and 43 strikeouts in 31 innings pitched as a junior.
- Honor roll student as an upperclassman.

- Became Purdue's first true freshman since 2013 to debut as a starting pitcher during the season-opening weekend.
- Shined vs. No. 23 North Carolina inside U.S. Bank Stadium, surrendering only a first-inning single over six shutout innings.
- Purdue led UNC 4-0 when he left the mound with the bases empty in the bottom of the seventh inning.
- Settled in over his last two outings vs. Villanova and UNC after he admits nerves were a factor in his collegiate debut; 10 strikeouts vs. 3 in 11 innings his last 2 outings after walking 3 over 3 innings without a strikeout in debut vs. Hofstra.
- Four-year letterwinner at Dickson County High School west of Nashville.
- Played first base and pitched, earning region and team MVP honors as a senior.
- Ranked as the No. 2 right-hander in his class in Tennessee by Perfect Game.
- Visited and committed to Purdue while pitching at a tournament in Westfield, Indiana, in the summer of 2018.
- Helped his high school team improve from 7-27 as a freshman to 19-18 as a senior.

# HEAD COACH GREG GOFF

Greg Goff joined Purdue baseball as an assistant coach in July 2017 and was promoted to head coach in June 2019. The 2020 season will be his 15th as a collegiate head coach.

Previously a head coach at four universities, Goff succeeded his friend and longtime colleague Mark Wasikowski, who returned to the University of Oregon as the Ducks' new head coach in June 2019.

Goff has previously served as the head coach at Campbell University (2008-14), Louisiana Tech University (2015-16) and the University of Alabama (2017) as well as Division II University of Montevallo (2004-07). He also helped lead the Boilermakers to a memorable 38-win season in 2018, punctuated by the program's third NCAA Regional bid in program history. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings and was also the runner-up at the Big Ten Tournament in Goff's first year with the program.

Along with bringing an upbeat personality to the dugout and contagious energy to his role as the first-base coach, Goff helped numerous Boilermakers develop offensively the last two years. He played a leading role in coaching the base running and outfield defense. He also filled in as the program's pitching coach for a few games during a 2018 home sweep of Michigan while Steve Holm was with his wife for the birth of their second child. Purdue has compiled a 28-15 record at Alexander since Goff joined the coaching staff, headlined by a program-record 13-game home win streak to close the 2018 campaign. That represents Purdue's best two-year mark at home since 2011 to 2012.

In his first two years at Purdue, Goff helped develop and organize new community events for the program like the preseason fan fest and first pitch dinner. Both events proved very popular and helped generate preseason interest going into the new campaign. He has also served as the director of Purdue baseball camps.

Twenty-six Boilermakers registered a grade-point average of 3.0 or better during the 2019 fall semester. During the 2016-17 school year, Alabama's 3.259 team GPA established a program record.

Over 40 Purdue players completed at least 10 hours of community service during the 2019 fall semester as part of the program's increased emphasis in that aspect of the student-athlete experience. As a team, Goff's team logged over 450 hours of community service during the first half of the 2019-20 school year.

Goff and his wife, Tina, are the parents of four daughters: Kara, Kiley, Kolby and Kenzie. Kara plays softball at LSU and Kiley has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball at Purdue beginning in the 2020-21 school year.

## SIX 40-WIN SEASONS

- As a head coach, Goff's teams have won over 40 games six times. Campbell was one of only eight Division I programs to win 40-plus games for three straight years from 2012 to 2014, posting 131 total victories during that span. The Camels enjoyed a historic 49-10 campaign in 2013.
- He also won 42 games in his final season at Louisiana Tech, helping lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional bid.
- Montevallo was a DII College World Series qualifier in 2006 under his guidance. As an assistant coach at Delta State, the Statesmen also qualified for the DII College World Series in 1994 and 1996.

## ENDED NCAA REGIONAL DROUGHTS AT CAMPBELL & LOUISIANA TECH

- In Goff's final season at Campbell (2014), the Camels qualified for their first NCAA Regional in 24 years. Two years later, he led Louisiana Tech to its first Regional bid in 29 years. The 2014 Camels and 2016 Bulldogs both won at least one game in their Regionals, with La Tech coming through the loser's bracket to reach a Regional final at Mississippi State.

## HISTORY OF TURNAROUNDS

- Goff's teams have had a losing record only five times in his 14 years as a head coach. Four of those five seasons were his first at a respective university. He has led his teams to some impressive turnarounds.
- In just two seasons, Louisiana Tech went from 15-35 the year before Goff's arrival to 42-20 in 2016, ending a 29-year NCAA Regional drought in the process. At Campbell, he inherited a team that was 11-45 in 2007. But under Goff, the Camels posted a winning record (27-24) in his second season and won 40 games by his fifth year (2012).
- Purdue's win total also jumped from 29-27 in 2017 to 38-21 in Goff's first year on the staff in 2018.

## COACHING HONORS

- Goff was named the South Central Region Coach of the Year by the American Baseball Coaches Association at both Louisiana Tech (2016) and Montevallo (2006). He was the 2013 Big South Coach of the Year at Campbell after leading his team to a school-record 49 wins and a conference title. Montevallo won a combined 100 games over his final two seasons, posting a new single-season record both years.

## BEFORE BECOMING A HEAD COACH

- Goff has coached 10 future big leaguers and over 50 MLB Draft picks, highlighted by Cy Young award winner Brandon Webb while he was the pitching coach at Kentucky (2000-03). Longtime big leaguer and World Series champion Joe Blanton also pitched for Goff at Kentucky.
- Along with his years as the pitching coach at Kentucky, Goff served as an assistant at Southeast Missouri State (1998-99) and his alma mater Delta State (1994-97) before becoming a head coach for the first time in the summer of 2003 at Montevallo. It was at SMO in the late 1990s where he first worked with Wasikowski. They helped lead the Redhawks to an NCAA Regional in 1998.

## HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF MINNEAPOLIS WEEKEND

- The weekend of Feb. 28 to March 1, the Boilermakers battled No. 14 Duke, No. 8 NC State and No. 23 North Carolina at Minnesota's CambriaCollegeClassic inside U.S. Bank Stadium (home of the Minnesota Vikings).
- The last time Purdue played three different top-25 teams during the same weekend was February 2001 when the Boilermakers opened at Rice's Tournament. They defeated the No. 1 Owls on Friday, lost to No. 16 UCF on Saturday and won a quasi rubber game Sunday vs. No. 18 Wake Forest. That weekend helped get the program nationally ranked in the following week's Baseball America poll.
- Purdue is believed to have played only one other weekend indoors. That was an April 2009 series vs. Minnesota inside the Metrodome. The Gophers played in the Metrodome from 2004 to 2010. However, a May 2004 Purdue-Minnesota series was played on campus at Siebert Field. The teams did not play in 2006 and 2007, and Minnesota visited West Lafayette in 2005, 2008 and 2010. The Boilermakers returned to Minneapolis for the first weekend of Big Ten play in April 2011. But the series was moved to Target Field after the roof of the Metrodome collapsed during a blizzard in December 2010.

## HATS OFF TO THE PITCHING STAFF

- While it's true Purdue posted a streak of big innings (4-plus runs) in eight consecutive games (2019 season finale and the first 7 games of 2020), it was really flawless defense and run prevention that helped the Boilermakers win the Campbell Invitational the weekend of Feb. 21 to 23. They did not commit an error and surrendered only seven runs (2.3/game) in the three games after giving up 32 runs over four games (8/game) during the season-opening series vs. Hofstra. Overall, the defense had been charged with just six errors in the first 10 games before committing five in six innings in the March 4 midweek opener at Indiana.
- The seven runs allowed was the fewest given up in a three-game weekend since limiting both Michigan and Rutgers to four runs in 2018 series sweeps at Alexander Field during the magical 21-2 stretch run. The Boilermakers surrendered only five runs in a March 2018 sweep at Penn State, marking the best the pitching staff had performed away from home as it did last weekend in Buies Creek.

HOFSTRA VS. HOFSTRA – ADVANTAGE PURDUE

- **Bo Hofstra** entered the week as one of only six relievers nationally with multiple saves and no hits allowed on the season. Just one of the other five pitchers has faced more batters than Hofstra (11). Hofstra was the only pitcher in the Big Ten to record multiple saves during the opening weekend.
- Hofstra retired 9 of 10 batters faced, striking out four, while closing out the Friday and Sunday wins. The 11th batter he was credited with facing was an intentional walk to whom he did not deliver a pitch.
- Hofstra became the eighth Boilermaker with 10 career saves. He earned two saves in the same weekend for the second time, also accomplishing the feat in a March 2019 series win at Northwestern.

FAST START FOR FASCIA

- Fascia hit safely in all four games vs. Hofstra, becoming the first Boilermaker to accomplish the feat in a four-game set since **Ben Nisle** at Texas in February 2019. **Skyler Hunter** has hit safely in every game of a four-game weekend five times in his career. Fascia finished the series 7-for-14 with 11 productive plate appearances, registering three extra-base hits, two hit by pitch and two sacrifice flies.
- The senior delivered the go-ahead sacrifice fly in the eighth inning of Saturday’s comeback win.
- For the weekend, he threw out four base runners at second base. Fascia also played some first base, too.

IMPRESSIVE DEBUT SERIES AT THE PLATE FOR LaPLANTE

- **Kyle LaPlante** batted in the 2-hole in all four games vs. Hofstra during his debut weekend as a Boilermaker. He had a big impact for Purdue offensively, finishing the series 6-for-15 with 10 productive plate appearances.
- He was the only Boilermaker to record an RBI in all four games of the series, highlighted by his two-out, three-run double to break a 6-6 tie in the eighth inning of the season-opening win. The infielder drove in a run or scored a run in the big innings of all four victories.
- LaPlante hit Purdue’s first home run of the season in the game 3 win vs. Hofstra. Fellow newcomer **Miles Simington** later hit a grand slam in the same game, helping Purdue score nine unanswered runs over the seventh and eighth innings. LaPlante and Simington both joined Ben Nisle (2018 season opener) as the last Boilermaker to accomplish unique home run feats. Nisle homered in his second collegiate at-bat as the last newcomer to hit Purdue’s first home run of a season and the last Boilermaker whose first hit was a homer.

BOILERMAKERS ENJOY BIG PRODUCTION OFF THE BENCH

- Against Hofstra, Purdue hitters off the bench enjoyed a very productive weekend and were a big reason why the Boilermakers won the four-game series. Reserves finished the weekend a combined 5-for-7 with a .727 on-base percentage, nine RBI and nine total productive plate appearances. **Miles Simington’s** grand slam, Purdue’s first since April 2017, headlined the big hits. **Bryce Bonner’s** two pinch-hit, RBI singles were both timely knocks in close games. **Tyler Powers** and Bonner also delivered doubles in games they did not start.

HUNTER A CONSTANT ON OPENING DAY

- Senior **Skyler Hunter** became the ninth Boilermaker since 2004 to make four consecutive opening day starts. Current assistant coach Harry Shipley was the last to do it. Assuming he returns for his senior season, **Ben Nisle** could join the club in 2021.
- Junior **Trent Johnson** was selected as Purdue’s opening day starter on the mound. He pitched on opening day for the third year in a row, appearing in relief during his underclassman seasons.

- In 2019, **Trent Johnson** and **Andrew Bohm** became only the sixth and seventh pitchers in program history to reach the 100 career strikeout benchmarks as sophomores.
- Senior **Milo Beam** has played in 76 career games off the bench, easily the most of any active Boilermaker. He is also the only multi-year letterwinner with more runs scored (49) than hits (41), scoring the decisive run in a walk-off win three times in his career.
- **Skyler Hunter** has 100 more hits (217) than strikeouts (117) in his career.

DOMINANT ARMS

- Four current Boilermakers – **Trent Johnson, Bo Hofstra, Matt Moore** and **Trevor Cheaney** – all have more career strikeouts than both innings pitched and hits allowed. As a natural correlation, they also have more innings pitched than hits allowed.
- Meanwhile, **Andrew Bohm** and **James Kulak** have more strikeouts than innings pitched. **Dalton Parker** and **Jett Jackson** have more innings pitched than hits allowed.
- Johnson is Purdue’s all-time leader in fewest hits allowed per nine innings. Bohm overtook Johnson for the strikeouts per nine innings record, with Hofstra also in position to take that record with a big game or week. Johnson’s sports a team-best 3.99 difference in his career ratios for strikeouts per nine and hit allowed per nine.
- Cheaney is back this season as a redshirt senior after an injury sidelined him for all of 2019. He was one of Purdue’s top relievers during the 38-win campaign two years ago. He got the final out of the Feb. 23 win vs. Villanova in his official return to the mound.
