THE OPENING TIP

- >> The Boilermakers return to Mackey Arena to open a two-game homestand Thursday evening against Michigan on the Big Ten Network.
- >> The two clubs will meet for the first time this season, after a Jan. 24 tilt was postponed when all of the University of Michigan Athletics halted activities for two weeks. The Boilermakers will be the first team the Wolverines have faced since their 81-77 loss against No. 17 Ohio State.
- >> Madison Layden is seventh in the Big Ten with 2.2 steals per game, fourth in total takeaways with 33 and in the top-15 nationally in both among rookies. The rookie has also shown off her sharpshooting touch with a triple in 13 straight games.
- >> Fatou Digne has hit double-digit rebounds in each of the last five games, averaging 12.1 during the stretch. The redshirt senior is up to third in the Big Ten with 10.3 rebounds per league game. She is one of six players in the Big Ten to nab 14 boards in three different games.
- >> The Boilermakers have connected on 75 3-pointers per win this season at a 39.8% clip, compared to 4.3 trifectas per loss at a 21.8% mark from outside.
- >> Kayana Traylor has definitely taken a junior jump, averaging 7.3 more points per game this season - 13.9 ppg in 2020-21 vs. 6.6 ppg in 2019-20.
- >> The Boilermakers will go for their first ranked win in 14 tries, since a 56-53 win over No. 25 Indiana on Jan. 20, 2019.
- >> Kayana Traylor ranks fifth in the Big Ten in free throws made (66) and sixth in free throws attempted (81).
- >> Brooke Moore enters Thursday's game averaging 12.5 points over the last four games. Purdue is 4-3 when she hits 10 points.
- >> The Boilermakers will be without senior guard Karissa McLaughlin for the remainder of the season. After offseason surgery on her ankle, the career 3-point record holder shut it down for the year due to nagging residual pain in order to rehab and eventually be pain free.

BOILER NOTES

LAST TIME OUT

- Despite a +18 rebounding margin, 20 more field goal attempts and 23 offensive rebounds, the Boilermakers dropped a 54-49 decision at Illinois.
- Purdue tied a program record for fewest free throws made and attempted, going 1-for-1 against the Fighting Illini.
- Brooke Moore scored five straight in the fourth to give Purdue a two-point lead, but Illinois went on a 7-0 run in the final 41 seconds to win the game.

NO FALSE ALARM THIS TIME

- Thursday night marks second attempt for the Boilermakers and Wolverines to play this season, after the first contest was postponed on Jan. 24.
- Back in January, the Boilermakers already traveled to Ann Arbor, before receiving word about the postponement around 10 p.m.
- Purdue has had four games affected by the pandemic this season Bowling Green (moved from Nov. 25), Miami (canceled), Rutgers and Michigan (postponed).

FATOU'S FEELING IT

- Fatou Digne's continued dominance in the post has started to earn her a spot in the program record book.
- The Senegal international is currently tied for fifth in rebounds per game by a senior and 11th in program history with 8.8 boards.
- Her 51.3% career field goal clip is ninth in program history, needing 62 more field goal attempts to qualify for the list.

KT'S DIMES

- While Kayana Traylor's scoring is up 73 points per game this year, the junior has dished out 54 assists for 3.6 dimes per game, good for 18th in the Big Ten.
- She is currently tied with Indiana head coach Teri Moren for 22nd in program history with 275 dimes.
- She led the Boilermakers in assists 38 (22-16) times over her career and posted 25 (18-7) games with at least five assists.

DIAGNE DOUBLE-DOUBLES

- Fatou Digne recorded four straight double-doubles against Penn State (14 pts, 18 rebs), Minnesota (11 pts, 12 rebs), Wisconsin (11 pts, 12 rebs) and Iowa (16 pts, 10 rebs). The four-game stretch tied for second longest in program history, behind Whitney Bays nine-game streak in 2014-15.
- Following back-to-back performances against Iowa Wisconsin, she was named to the Big Ten Weekly Honor Roll for the first time in her career.
- Digne is one of five players from the Big Ten averaging at least nine points and nine rebounds during conference play at 9.3 points and 10.3 boards.

BOILER NOTES**MAD MONEY**

- Freshman Madison Layden's rookie season averages have her amongst the best in program history - ninth in assists per game (2.9), second in steals per game (2.2), second in 3-pointers per game (1.9), and seventh in minutes (29.5).
- Despite just four games in double figures, Layden is fourth in team scoring with 8.0 points per game and tops the team with 26 3-pointers.
- Her stats have jumped up to 9.1 points, 3.1 assists and 1.2 steals per game in the Big Ten.
- The freshman has recorded a steal in every game this season and has a stretch of 13 straight games with a triple.

TAM'S DAY VS. PENN STATE

- Tamara Farquhar posted a perfect outing from the floor making all seven of her attempts against Penn State to finish with a team-high 16 points.
- Farquhar is just the eighth player to make 100% of her shots with at least seven attempts in program history.
- The senior also added four assists, her fifth career outing with at least a quartet of dimes.

4-GAME DOUBLE-DOUBLE QUARTET

- Fatou Diagne's four-game double-double stretch tied for second in program history.
- Below are averages during double-double streaks of at least four games in Purdue history.

WE'LL HAVE MOORE OF THAT

- Brooke Moore is second on the team with 11 points per game and 9.5 per league contest.
- She sits second on the team with 20 3-pointers at a 30.8% clip.
- The junior has reached double figures in seven games. Purdue is 5-2 when Moore scores at least 10 points.

FATOU FINDING A WAY

- Fatou Diagne leads the team with 8.8 rebounds per game, which ranks seventh in the Big Ten.
- The redshirt senior opened Big Ten play averaging 10.3 points and 11.6 rebounds per game over her first three outings.
- Diagne is averaging 9.8 points and 9.9 rebounds per Big Ten game.
- She tied the second-longest double-double streak in program history with four - at Iowa (16p, 10r), vs. Wisconsin (11p, 12r), at Minnesota (11 pt, 10 r), and vs. Penn State (14 p, 18 r)
- Diagne posted back-to-back 13-point, 9-rebound games to start Big Ten play against Northwestern and Penn State.
- The redshirt senior has games of 18 (Penn State) and 17 (Nebraska) rebounds this season, good for 14th and 20th in program history.
- The Senegalese international took tremendous strides during the 2019-20 season, posting career highs with 3.5 ppg and 4.1 rpg.

3-POINTER FTW

- The Boilermakers are shooting 39.8% from distance with 7.5 makes per win, compared to just a 21.8% clip and 4.3 3-pointers in losses.
- Madison Layden leads the team with 26 triples, followed by Brooke Moore with 20.
- Layden has hit a triple in 13 straight games, including six with multiple trifectas. Ashley Morrisette holds the Purdue record with 25 games in a row.

ROOKIE GETTING IT DONE ON BOTH ENDS

- Madison Layden has made major impacts on both ends of the court with 44 assists and 33 steals on the year.
- The Kokomo, Ind., native is one of five freshmen nationally with more than 40 assists and 30 steals this season.
- Layden is one of five freshmen in the nation and the only one from the Big Ten with at least 2.5 assists, 2.0 steals and 1.5 3-pointers per game

MILESTONE MADE

- With the win over Wisconsin, head coach Sharon Versyp officially joined Purdue's 300-victory club as its eighth member.
- In her 15th season, Versyp has a quartet of Big Ten Tournament titles and nine NCAA Tournament appearances.
- With 139 conference wins at Purdue, plus nine at Indiana, Versyp is eight Big Ten victories away from moving into fourth in league history.

CONSISTENT KT

- Junior Kayana Traylor has career year with 13.9 points, 3.2 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game, including 13.4 ppg, 2.6 rpg and 3.3 apg per BIG game.
- The junior is one of 13 players from the Big Ten averaging at least 13.0 points, 3.0 assists and 3.0 rebounds per game.
- The junior ranks fifth in free throws made (66) and fifth in attempted (81) in the Big Ten. Purdue is 17-6 when Traylor makes at least four freebies.
- Traylor has basketball in her blood. Her mother (Danielle) played at LSU, her father (Jeff) at Iowa and aunt (April) at Florida State. She also has three sisters who are up-and-coming talents on the prep stage.
- Traylor set a career-long stretch of four straight games in double figures to start the year. She has touched double figures in all but four games.

FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Madison Layden was tabbed the Big Ten Freshman of the Week after averaging 12 points, 4.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists with a 61.5% field goal clip against Iowa and Wisconsin.
- The rookie from Kokomo matched Purdue's freshman record for 3-pointers in a game with six against Iowa.
- Only four Big Ten rookies have posted a 6-3-point, 4-assist game in the last six years, including Madison Layden and Karissa McLaughlin.
- She is Purdue's first Freshman of the Week since Nov. 13, 2017, when Karissa McLaughlin earned it with a 21-point college debut against Central Michigan.

THE SPECS CAN STEAL

- Madison Layden is seventh in the Big Ten with 2.2 steals per game, fourth in total takeaways with 33 and in the top-15 nationally in both among rookies.
- Layden is tied for fifth nationally among rookies with a steal in 15 games.
- Purdue is 2-3 when Layden records three steals.

ON THE HONOR ROLL

- For the first time in her career, Kayana Traylor made an appearance on the Big Ten Honor Roll after a 21-point, seven-assist outing against Nebraska.
- Fatou Diagne later made her first career appearance on the Big Ten Honor Roll after back-to-back double-doubles against Iowa and Wisconsin, averaging 13.5 points and 11 rebounds over the two games.

MOORE, PLEASE

- Brooke Moore is second on the team 11.0 points per game, including a trio of 20-point outings.
- She is second on the team with at least 10 points in seven games.
- She missed the Michigan State on Jan. 3 game after returning home to attend a funeral for a family member.
- The junior from Auburn is third on the team with 29 assists this season.
- Moore is averaging more than six points, one rebound and two assists better than her sophomore season when she was at Auburn.

20+ DIMES

- The Boilermakers dished out 21 assists in back-to-back games (Buffalo & BGSU) for the first time since 2018-19.
- Purdue added a 23-dime game against Penn State.
- Purdue has topped 20 helpers in 18 games over the last six years.
- Five players have recorded a combined 11 games with at least five assists.
- Purdue is 7-3 when at least one player drops at least five dimes.

RESPECT THE SPECS

- Madison Layden tallied a 5-point, 6-rebound, 7-assist game against Michigan State, just the second Purdue rookie in the last six seasons with that stat line, joining Kayana Traylor.
- The 2020 Indiana Gatorade POTY is second in the Big Ten among freshmen with 39 assists.
- Layden scored 13 points against Bowling Green with four assists and four steals. The only other freshman in the last six years to hit that stat line for the Boilermakers - Karissa McLaughlin.
- Layden's first career record was matching the single-game 3-point record for freshman with six against Iowa.

MOORE IS GOOD

- Junior Brooke Moore had a career day for the Boilermakers against Bowling Green, with highs in points, assists, free throws (9-11) and blocks (1).
- The Atlanta native is just the fourth Boilermaker to record multiple 20-point, 4-3-pointer games in the last six seasons.
- Moore is one of 13 players in the nation this season to tally a 20-point, 9-assist game and one of four from the Big Ten.
- The junior transfer was declared immediately eligible at the start of November, slating her to make an immediate impact.
- The 5-foot-7 guard was ranked as the No. 11 guard in the nation coming out of high school.



BOILER NOTES

TOP TAM

- Tamara Farquhar is averaging 6.7 rebounds per night and 2.3 offensive boards per game.
- She averaged a double-double of 12.5 points, 11.3 rebounds over the first four games of the season.
- Prior to her senior season, Farquhar had 10 games with at least 10 rebounds. She has three so far this year.
- In addition, Farquhar has set career highs in 3-pointers made (1 vs. UB) and assists in a game (6 vs. UB).
- Purdue is 4-2 when Farquhar leads the team in rebounding this season.
- After suffering a season-ending knee injury in January 2020, which snapped a streak of 54 starts, Farquhar stayed in West Lafayette during the isolation spring to rehab her injury the athletic training staff.

DOOOOOO-BIA

- Rokia Doumbia is averaging 2.6 points and 2.8 rebounds and 10.9 minutes per game, including 5.5 points and 5.5 boards when playing over 10 minutes.
- She made her debut for Purdue against Northwestern, after sitting out the first four games while waiting on a personal waiver from the NCAA to grant immediate eligibility.
- In her debut, Doumbia tallied two points, two boards and two assists.
- The Mali international spent two seasons at Arkansas, playing 55 games over two years, averaging 3.3 ppg and 4.2 rpg as a sophomore in 2019-20.
- Prior to her time with the Razorbacks, Doumbia was a four-star recruit and was also named the MVP of the FIBA U16 Africa Championship in 2015 for her native Mali.

OKAY, SHAY

- Ra Shaya Kyle has made some solid contributions off the bench to start her career with 5.5 points and 3.9 rebounds over 10.7 minutes per game.
- The rookie is 45th the nation in rebounding percentage of 19.7%.
- Kyle is third among freshman in the Big Ten in rebounding and leads the team with 12 blocks on the year.
- The 6-foot-6 center leads the league freshmen with 21 offensive boards.
- The Marion, Ind., native made a statement in her first game in the old gold and black, nearly tallying a double-double with 16 points and nine rebounds... IN ONLY EIGHT MINUTES.
- Kyle is the tallest player in program history at 6-foot-6.

SPLASH HARDIN

- Cassidy Hardin has connected on nine 3-pointers. The junior has hit a triple in six games this year.
- She found her touch against Penn State, going 3-for-3 from deep.
- Hardin knocked down her first triple of the year against Buffalo.
- Purdue is 24-15 when Hardin makes at least one 3-pointer in a game and 14-6 when she makes multiple triples.
- Hardin is a career 30.6% shooter from deep with 70 of her 79 made field goals coming from distance.
- The junior's enjoyment for knocking down triples carries over even when she goes home, spending much of her free time shooting in her indoor halfcourt setup.

20+ DIMES

- The Boilermakers dished out 21 assists in back-to-back games (Buffalo & BGSU) for the first time since 2018-19.
- Purdue added a 23-dime game against Penn State.
- The three 20+ assist games mark the 16th, 17th and 18th such outings since 2015-16.
- Five players have recorded a combined 11 games with at least five assists.
- Purdue is 5-4 when at least one player drops at least five dimes.

60 is the Key

- The Boilermakers have held two opponents below 60 points this season.
- Since 2015-16, the Boilermakers rank fifth in the Big Ten with 75 games of holding opponents under 60 points.
- In Purdue's history of 1,390 games, the Boilermakers have held an opponent under 60 points in 565 contests (40.8%).
- Under head coach Sharon Versyp, opponents have failed to score more than 40 points 20 times, 50 points 94 times and 60 points 223 times.

STARTERS SHINE

- Purdue has rolled with four different starting lineups this season, with Fatou Digne, Tamara Farquhar and Kayana Traylor earning a spot in the five for every game so far.
- The Boilermakers' starting five has averaged 48.8 points per game or just about 73%, getting a little more production out of the bench with 17.5 points per outing.
- The Boilermakers squeezed everything they can out of their starting lineup last season, accounting for 80.2% of Purdue's total points this season.

D UP

- Purdue has forced an average of 13.9 turnovers a game and converted them into 14.5 points per night.
- On the flip side, Purdue has given up a 17.5 points off 17.9 turnovers per game.
- Against Buffalo, Purdue had 34 points off turnovers, most since Dec. 2017.
- With the graduation of Ae'Rianna Harris, Purdue's blocked shot tally has dropped from 4.6 blocks per game to 2.6.

THE 3-POINT RECORD

- Karissa McLaughlin is officially the best 3-point shooter in program history, after knocking down a pair of triples at Maryland. It was never so much a question of if, but when the Fort Wayne native would pass Courtney Moses' 241 3-pointers for the all-time mark at Purdue.
- McLaughlin is 16th in the NCAA active list, trailing the impressive 330 makes by Katie Benzan from Maryland.
- After Ae'Rianna Harris set the Purdue record for all-time blocks last year, McLaughlin has her sights on Carsen Edwards' Purdue record of 281 triples.
- McLaughlin is one of only 10 players in the last six years to score at least 350 points, with at least half coming from three, in three straight seasons.
- The senior was shut down for the season due to injury after the Wisconsin game in January.
- The last five career 3-point record holders were former Indiana Miss Basketballs - McLaughlin (2017), Courtney Moses (2010), Katie Gearlds (2003), Stephanie White (1995) and Jennifer Jacoby (1991).

- Karissa McLaughlin underwent ankle surgery in the summer and was expected to miss the entire season, but made her 2020-21 debut against Penn State on Dec. 20.
- After seven games with four starts and 76 points per game, lingering pain in her ankle led her to prematurely shut down her senior season.
- Last season, she became the 35th member to join the 1,000-point club, the 18th as a junior and the 21st to do it in less than 100 games
- The Fort Wayne native joined the 200 3-point club as its fourth member with Courtney Moses (240), Katie Gearlds (238) and Brittany Rayburn (201).
- McLaughlin earned her undergraduate in selling and sales management. She will begin her graduate program in technology leadership and innovation at Purdue next semester

COVID-19 CHANGES**IMPRESSIVE GPA**

- During a semi-virtual semester of challenges, the Boilermakers posted another solid GPA of 3.28.
- The Boilermakers put six players on the Dean's List and eight on the semester honor roll.
- 14 of the student-athletes recorded a GPA over 3.0.

MAKING THE MOST OF ISOLATION

- After the 2019-20 roster saw its postseason dreams crushed by the (100% correct) decision to cancel the NCAA Tournament for safety purposes, Coach Versyp was instrumental in helping the Boilermakers find their ways home.
- All but two student-athletes were able to return home, while Fatou Diagne remained in Indiana due to strict travel restrictions back to Senegal, and Tamara Farquhar stayed in West Lafayette to actively rehab her knee injury.
- While scattered all over the world, Versyp held multiple Zoom chats each week with the team to ensure each student-athlete's well-being.

NEW-LOOK MACKEY

- Mackey Arena will have a decidedly different look to it without fans this season, as only family members will be allowed to watch the game.
- In an effort to keep a secure bubble around the student-athletes, only certain tested individuals will be allowed on the event level, in addition to student-athletes being tested daily throughout the season.
- The benches have been separated by at least three feet, forcing support staff to sit behind the scoring table, which has also been pared down.
- Players will have masks on while on the sidelines. Each student-athlete will have a small pale next to her assigned seat that will have multiple water bottles, a towel and other necessities to recover on the sideline.
- Purdue's marketing team continued its successful fan cutout program, after nearly 2,000 were purchased for football season. An even higher number is expected for the hoops campaign.

MEDIA CHANGES

- A limited number of media and photographer credentials will be issued during the 2020-21 season. All requests must be made at least 48 hours prior to tip by emailing Ian MacDougall.
- There will be no media or photographer access to the floor or event level. There will be no in-person interviews.
- All interviews will be conducted via Zoom over a link that will be sent through email to credentialed media.
- Aside from a pregame flipcard, there will be no printed materials provided to the media. All stats can be found via PurdueStats.com. A postgame book will be posted to PurdueSports.com within an hour of the game's end.
