• The most frequent visitor to Alexander Field makes another appearance as Purdue hosts Iowa for the fifth time in nine years. The Boilermakers are scheduled to play at home on Easter Sunday for the first time since 2016. After this weekend, Purdue plays 11 of its next 14 games away from Alexander Field.

• The Hawkeyes also visited Alexander Field in 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2019. This weekend they become the first visiting team to play five series at Alexander. Even before the three additional games this weekend, Iowa has already played more games (12) at Alexander than Indiana (4), Illinois (3) and Maryland (3) combined. Meanwhile, the Boilermakers have made only one trip to Iowa City since 2013, although they were scheduled to play at Duane Banks Field at this time last year prior to the shutdown.

• Purdue dropped 2 of 3 to Rutgers last weekend while Iowa won 3 of 4 in a pod vs. Ohio State and Maryland.

- Struck out a season-high 7 in his start at Indiana March 20 and followed that up with his first quality start (6 1/3 IP, 2 R, 5 K) in his Alexander Field debut.
- Defense did not do him any favors in his first 2 starts as a Boilermaker, with only 2 of the 8 runs he allowed vs. Nebraska & Michigan being earned.
- Pitched for Central Arizona College during the abbreviated 2020 season, registering a 0.49 ERA and 56 strikeouts in 36 2/3 innings.
- JUCO All-Star honoree gave up only 18 hits and 12 walks while earning 4 victories & pitching two complete games as a sophomore.
- Appeared in 7 games for USC during the 2019 campaign, giving up only 1 extra-base hit while registering a 3.86 ERA.
- Struck out the only batter he faced in the 8th inning vs. UCLA in a game played at Dodger Stadium.
- Played baseball & basketball at Pinnacle High School on the Northeast Side of Phoenix, helping Pinnacle win the 2018 Arizona Class 6A state title in basketball.
- Pitched for USA Baseball's 17U National Team Development Program as a junior while posting a 3.32 ERA & 42 strikeouts in 31 innings during HS season.
- Named to Perfect Game's All-West Coast first team & honorable mention All-American as a senior; PG ranked him as Arizona's No. 2 pitcher in his class.
- Posted a 2.12 ERA as a sophomore on varsity
- Honored as team's hustle player of the year on basketball court as a senior.

- Struck out Nebraska's 6-7-8 hitters in order in the 9th inning of the 2021 opener.
- Pitched in five games in 2020, making his collegiate debut as a starter in game No. 3 of the season vs. Hofstra.
- Joined Jett Jackson as the first Boilermakers since 2013 to make their collegiate debuts as starting pitchers during a season-opening weekend.
- Entered the season having only pitched three innings of regular season action at high school/college level since breakout 2015 campaign as a high school freshman.
- Worked 2 1/3 innings of hitless relief to earn the victory vs. Villanova in the championship game of the Campbell Invitational.
- Worked 4 innings of 3-run ball in his debut vs. Hofstra, including a pair of ground ball double plays.
- Did not allow a walk or earned run over 2 2/3 innings of relief in the midweek game at Indiana.
- Retired the final 5 batters he faced vs. Villanova, including a 1-2-3 7th inning after Purdue took the lead; successfully defended a squeeze bunt for an out at home.
- 3-time all-conference honoree; Team MVP & top hitter award winner as high school junior
- Went 5-1 with a 1.59 ERA & 82 Ks in 52 2/3 innings as a freshman; won the team's top pitcher & rookie of the year awards as a freshman
- Injuries kept him off the mound for both of his upperclassman seasons; had Tommy John Surgery in June 2017

- Just the second Boilermaker this century to pitch on Opening Day in four straight seasons, earning the start each of the last two years.
- Recognized as the team's co-Pitcher of the Year honoree in 2019.
- Ranks among the top 10 in program history in fewest hits per 9 innings (6.64, 2nd), strikeouts per 9 innings (9.66, 2nd) & WHIP (1.23, 7th).
- Posted a rare 10-strikeout game as a reliever in 2019 at Northwestern.
- Moved to Purdue's Friday starter role for the final weekend of April in 2019 after serving as the bullpen's fireman for the first 2 months.
- In Big Ten play in 2019, led the league with a .163 batting average against and ranked second with a 1.67 ERA in league play.
- Just the seventh pitcher in team history to reach 100 career strikeouts as a sophomore & his 73 Ks were the most ever by a Purdue sophomore; his 10.89 Ks per 9 innings mark in 2019 remains a team record (minimum 60 innings).
- 2018 Big Ten All-Freshman Team as a starting pitcher, moving into the weekend rotation in mid-March and making five starts in Big Ten play.
- Surrendered only 21 hits in 41 innings, with only four hits going for extra bases, an impressive mark of 4.6 hits per 9 innings that ranked second in program history; Enjoyed his productive freshman season while making 15 of his 18 appearances and working 32 1/3 of his 41 innings away from home.
- First-team all-conference in football, basketball & baseball as a senior at CHS.
- Recorded 127 Ks as a junior & 124 Ks as a senior, leading the state both years.

ANOTHER WEEKEND AT ALEXANDER: PURDUE BASEBALL HOSTS IOWA



HEAD COACH GREG GOFF

Greg Goff joined Purdue baseball as an assistant coach in July 2017 and was promoted to head coach in June 2019. The 2021 season will be his 16th as a collegiate head coach.

Previously a head coach at four universities, Goff succeeded his friend and longtime colleague Mark Wasikowski, who returned to the University of Oregon as the Ducks' new head coach in June 2019.

Goff has previously served as the head coach at Campbell University (2008-14), Louisiana Tech University (2015-16) and the University of Alabama (2017) as well as Division II University of Montevallo (2004-07). He also helped lead the Boilermakers to a memorable 38-win season in 2018, punctuated by the program's third NCAA Regional bid in program history. Purdue finished second in the Big Ten standings and was also the runner-up at the Big Ten Tournament in Goff's first year with the program.

Along with bringing an upbeat personality to the dugout and contagious energy to his role as the first-base coach, Goff helped numerous Boilermakers develop offensively the last two years. He played a leading role in coaching the base running and outfield defense. He also filled in as the program's pitching coach for a few games during a 2018 home sweep of Michigan while Steve Holm was with his wife for the birth of their second child. Purdue has compiled a 28-15 record at Alexander since Goff joined the coaching staff, headlined by a program-record 13-game home win streak to close the 2018 campaign. That represents Purdue's best two-year mark at home since 2011 to 2012.

In his first two years at Purdue, Goff helped develop and organize new community events for the program like the preseason fan fest and first pitch dinner. Both events proved very popular and helped generate preseason interest going into the new campaign. He has also served as the director of Purdue baseball camps.

Twenty-six Boilermakers registered a grade-point average of 3.0 or better during the 2019 fall semester. During the 2016-17 school year, Alabama's 3.259 team GPA established a program record.

Over 40 Purdue players completed at least 10 hours of community service during the 2019 fall semester as part of the program's increased emphasis in that aspect of the student-athlete experience. As a team, Goff's team logged over 450 hours of community service during the first half of the 2019-20 school year.

Goff and his wife, Tina, are the parents of four daughters: Kara, Kiley, Kolby and Kenzie. Kara plays softball at Louisiana Tech and Kiley joined Purdue softball for the 2020-21 school year.

SIX 40-WIN SEASONS

- As a head coach, Goff's teams have won over 40 games six times. Campbell was one of only eight Division I programs to win 40-plus games for three straight years from 2012 to 2014, posting 131 total victories during that span. The Camels enjoyed a historic 49-10 campaign in 2013.
- He also won 42 games in his final season at Louisiana Tech, helping lead the Bulldogs to an NCAA Regional bid.
- Montevallo was a DII College World Series qualifier in 2006 under his guidance. As an assistant coach at Delta State, the Statesmen also qualified for the DII College World Series in 1994 and 1996.

ENDED NCAA REGIONAL DROUGHTS AT CAMPBELL & LOUISIANA TECH

- In Goff's final season at Campbell (2014), the Camels qualified for their first NCAA Regional in 24 years. Two years later, he led Louisiana Tech to its first Regional bid in 29 years. The 2014 Camels and 2016 Bulldogs both won at least one game in their Regionals, with La Tech coming through the loser's bracket to reach a Regional final at Mississippi State.

HISTORY OF TURNAROUNDS

- Goff's teams have had a losing record only five times in his 14 years as a head coach. Four of those five seasons were his first at a respective university. He has led his teams to some impressive turnarounds.
- In just two seasons, Louisiana Tech went from 15-35 the year before Goff's arrival to 42-20 in 2016, ending a 29-year NCAA Regional drought in the process. At Campbell, he inherited a team that was 11-45 in 2007. But under Goff, the Camels posted a winning record (27-24) in his second season and won 40 games by his fifth year (2012).
- Purdue's win total also jumped from 29-27 in 2017 to 38-21 in Goff's first year on the staff in 2018.

COACHING HONORS

- Goff was named the South Central Region Coach of the Year by the American Baseball Coaches Association at both Louisiana Tech (2016) and Montevallo (2006). He was the 2013 Big South Coach of the Year at Campbell after leading his team to a school-record 49 wins and a conference title. Montevallo won a combined 100 games over his final two seasons, posting a new single-season record both years.

BEFORE BECOMING A HEAD COACH

- Goff has coached 10 future big leaguers and over 50 MLB Draft picks, highlighted by Cy Young award winner Brandon Webb while he was the pitching coach at Kentucky (2000-03). Longtime big leaguer and World Series champion Joe Blanton also pitched for Goff at Kentucky.
- Along with his years as the pitching coach at Kentucky, Goff served as an assistant at Southeast Missouri State (1998-99) and his alma mater Delta State (1994-97) before becoming a head coach for the first time in the summer of 2003 at Montevallo. It was at SEMO in the late 1990s where he first worked with Wasikowski. They helped lead the Redhawks to an NCAA Regional in 1998.

Skyler Hunter is chasing Purdue's all-time records for hits and triples as a fifth-year senior this season. He is the Big Ten's active career leader and ranks among the top five nationally in both categories. Hunter has been a starter in center field since the beginning of the 2017 season.

NINTH-INNING MAGIC

- Purdue's home-opening weekend was highlighted by Saturday's memorable ninth-inning comeback, which produced the ninth walk-off win in Alexander Field history. The seven-run rally in the bottom of the ninth was the program's most prolific do-or-die inning at home in the last 20 years. An April 2008 win vs. Minnesota at Lambert Field, which was a seven-inning affair as part of a Saturday doubleheader, marked the only other time the Boilermakers scored at least four runs in the final frame for a walk-off win. Coincidentally, Purdue also scored six times in the bottom of the sixth of the seven-inning nightcap that day to rally for a 7-5 win, eventually sweeping the series with Minnesota on Sunday.
- **Mason Gavre's** three-run homer Saturday was the program's first walk-off home run since Ryne White hit a solo shot in the ninth inning of an April 2006 win vs. Illinois State at Lambert Field. **Ben Nisle** also scored the game-winning run in the Opening Day walk-off vs. Nebraska. He's the first Boilermaker since Milo Beam in 2017 to score the winning run in multiple walk-offs in the same season.

SIMINGTON TWO-HITS THE ENTIRE SERIES

- **Miles Simington** not only drove in the game-tying run in the ninth inning Saturday with an opposite-field sacrifice fly, the outfielder also had two hits in all three games of the series with Rutgers. He finished the series 6-for-12 with two doubles and no strikeouts. It marked the fourth season in a row that a Boilermaker had multiple hits in all three games of a weekend. **Ben Nisle** did it in February of last year at the Campbell Tournament, which Purdue won thanks to victories vs. Maine, Villanova and the host Camels. Nisle actually had two hits in four consecutive games.
- **Ryan Howe** (March 29-April 3) and **Skyler Hunter** (April 23-26) had multiple hits in three consecutive games at Alexander Field in 2019, but both streaks did not happen as part of the same series. Simington is the first Boilermaker to accomplish the multiple-hit feat in a home series since Eric Charles in April 2012 vs. Michigan State.
- **Tyler Powers** registered his first four-hit game as a Boilermaker in Saturday's win, highlighted by an RBI single in the seven-run ninth inning. He drove in the third of seven runs during the rally. Powers finished the series 6-for-13 and is batting .480 (12-for-25) during his six-game hit streak. Against Iowa in 2019, Powers turned three 5-3 double plays and had three hits in Purdue's game 2 win.

NISLE, HUNTER AMONG ELITE COMPANY OVER FIRST 11 GAMES

- **Ben Nisle** accounted for eight of Purdue's first 18 extra-base hits over the first 11 games season. In doing so, he became just the sixth Boilermaker since 2001 with eight over the first 11 games.
- Meanwhile, **Skyler Hunter** enters the weekend leading the Big Ten with 13 walks. He was only the third Boilermaker since 2001 to draw a dozen walks over the first 11 games. He's also the most unexpected to accomplish the feat. Through the end of the 2019 season, the switch-hitter had 204 hits vs. 44 walks in 713 career plate appearances.

INDIANA SERIES NOTABLES

- Purdue has endured some offensive struggles early this season against the toughest schedule in the Big Ten over the first three weekends. However, the Boilermakers scored 13 runs last weekend in Bloomington after Hoosiers had given up only 15 runs in their first eight games. Purdue held the lead at the end of 14 innings over the course of the series after leading for only four innings over the first eight games.
- For the second year in a row, the Boilermakers hung a loss on the reigning National Pitcher of the Week. IU's Saturday starter McCade Brown struck out 16 over seven hitless innings vs. Penn State on March 13 and had surrendered only one run on three hits in his first 14 innings of the season. Brown struck out eight of the 25 batters he faced Saturday, but the Boilermakers scored five times on five hits and four walks.
- The Boilermakers sent 10 men to the plate in their four-run third inning Saturday, each of the first eight reaching first base.
- **Skyler Hunter** walked and singled in his first two plate appearances Sunday to extend his reached base safely streak in Big Ten play to 17 consecutive games dating back to May 2019. He finished the series with five walks and five runs scored, both team highs. However, streaks ended Sunday for both of Purdue's most consistent hitters early this season. **Miles Simington's** 11-game reached base safely streak came to an end and **Ben Nisle's** six-game hit streak was also snuffed out.
- **Mike Bolton Jr.** batted leadoff Sunday for the first time as a Boilermaker. It marked the first time since May 16, 2019, that someone other than Hunter was Purdue's leadoff man. Bolton delivered an RBI ground-rule double in the fourth inning, his second extra-base hit of the season.
- The Boilermakers remain hitless (0-for-15) for the season with the bases loaded. They were 0-for-7 in such opportunities in Bloomington. Two-out hits were also a difference in the series – Indiana had 10, Purdue only three.

NISLE JOINS SELECT COMPANY WITH HOME RUNS VS. MICHIGAN

- Ben Nisle homered in consecutive games for the second time in his career in the final two games of the Michigan series. He had actually been the last Boilermaker to accomplish the feat, back in a March 2018 series at Tulane during the spring break trip. But Nisle joined even more select company by going deep for the fourth consecutive year and hitting Purdue's first home run of a season for the third time in his career. Nisle is the only Boilermaker this century to accomplish the latter feat. Over the last 20 years, only 14 Boilermakers have homered in four straight seasons.

FASCIA ON BUSTER POSEY AWARD WATCH LIST FOR THIRD TIME

- Zac Fascia has returned as a fifth-year senior this season and again earned a spot on the initial watch list for the Buster Posey Award. Fascia is part of the first watch list for the third consecutive season. A year ago, the watch list was released on March 10 and the season was shut down two days later due to the coronavirus pandemic.
- Fascia gunned down a Big Ten-high 18 base stealers in 2019 and also worked with a pitching staff that set team records for strikeouts (477) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.10).
- During Purdue's season-opening series with Nebraska, Fascia hit safely in all four games and delivered the game-winning RBI with a sacrifice fly in the walk-off win Friday. He was also behind the plate Friday and Sunday as Purdue racked up 31 of its 46 strikeouts, which is believed to be a program record for a four-game series. The Boilermakers had 15 Ks on Friday and 16 Sunday. Both totals rank among the top five in program history.
- The Brampton, Ontario, native was selected by the New York Mets in the 37th round of the 2018 MLB Draft after his sophomore season at Indian Hills College in Iowa, where he was a two-time Region XI Defensive Player of the Year. He had opportunities to move on the professional ranks again in 2019, but wanted to return for his senior season at Purdue. That season ultimately was cut short, but the eligibility extensions allowed him to return.
