BOILER NOTES

TEAM

- Purdue won the toss and deferred to the second half.
- Game captains were Kieren Douglas and Payne Durham.
- Prince Boyd Jr. was the only Boilermaker to make their first start at Purdue.
- The 56-point margin of victory was the largest for Purdue since a 59-point shutout win over Southeast Missouri in 2011.
- It is the second shutout of the Brohm era.
- Purdue out gained Indiana State 521-145, moving to 24-5 under Jeff Brohm when out gaining the opponent.

OFFENSE

- 21 points is the most the Boilermakers have scored in the first quarter since scoring putting up the same number in a 45-24 win over Eastern Kentucky (Sept. 3, 2016).
- King Doerue scored his third touchdown of the season on Purdue's first possession. The senior only needed two games to surpass his touchdown total from all of last season.
- With his four touchdowns today, Aidan O'Connell moved into sixth on the Purdue all-time touchdown pass list with 48, passing Scott Campbell.
- Tyrone Tracy Jr. rushed four times for 37 yards, the most yards on the ground of his career.
- Charlie Jones hauled in nine receptions for 133 yards and three touchdowns, it is the first multi-touchdown game of his career.
- Jones now has four touchdowns through two games as a Boilermaker. He scored three touchdowns in two years in stints at both Buffalo and Iowa.
- His 286 receiving yards thus far on the season puts Jones just 37 yards shy of surpassing his total from two years of play at Iowa.
- Walk-on running back Devin Mockobee rushed 13 times for 78 yards and a touchdown in his Purdue debut.
- Offensively, Purdue scored a touchdown on seven of its first nine drives. The only two drives the Boilermakers failed to score on started inside their own two-yard line.
- The Boilermakers had 12 different receivers catch a pass from four different quarterbacks. Purdue has had double digit receivers in both games this season.
- Purdue's four quarterbacks in the game combined to go 25-for-30 for 289 yards, four touchdowns and no interceptions.
- Four Purdue players totaled at least 30 rushing yards. Five rushers logged a run of more than 10 yards.
- Purdue was a perfect 5-for-5 in the red zone with five touchdowns.

DEFENSE

- Purdue's defense allowed only 145 total yards of offense, the lowest total by a Boilermaker defense in at least 25 years.
- Defensive back Sanoussi Kane forced a fumble on the first defensive play for Purdue. It was the first the first forced turnover of his career.
- Jamari Brown's end zone interception in the second quarter was the first INT of his four year collegiate career.
- Cam Allen's 65 yard interception return for a touchdown was his first and the 8th INT of his career.
- It was the first time that the Boilermakers have had interceptions returned for a touchdown in back-to-back games since 2010 (Nov. 13 vs. Michigan, No. 20 vs. Michigan State).
- Only four of the 15 Indiana State drives went into Purdue territory. The only two that entered the red zone for the Sycamores resulted in a turnover on downs and an interception.
- The Sycamores had five players catch a pass in the game. Purdue held four of the five to five or less receiving yards.
- The Boilermakers held the Sycamores to just 51 yards on the ground. This is the third time in the Brohm era that Purdue has held an opponent to less than 60 rushing yards (Nov. 11, 2021 vs. Indiana, 58; Oct. 28, 2017 vs. Nebraska, 40).
- Purdue held Indiana State to 94 receiving yards, marking the seventh time in the Brohm era that the Boilermakers kept their opponents at 100 or fewer yards through the air (Last: Oct. 10, 2021 vs. Wisconsin, 52).
- Sanoussi Kane recorded seven tackles (six solo) to set a new career high. He had matched his previous high with three last week.
- Purdue held to Indiana State to 3-of-16 on third down.
- It is the 13th time in the Brohm era that the Boilermakers recorded at least four sacks.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- Mitchell Fineran went 7-7 on extra point attempts. He was not asked to kick a field goal as all of Purdue's scoring drives ended in a touchdown.
- West Lafayette native Caleb Krockover made his collegiate debut and made the final extra point for the Boilermakers.
