SCHEDULE NOTES

- Purdue has nine matches remaining on television this season, including one non-conference match. All home matches will be streamed on B1G+.
- Purdue is set to take on seven AVCA top-25 opponents, five of which rank among the top-8 nationally.
- The non-conference slate included 10 total matches with four opponents recognized in the 2021 AVCA final poll.
- Holloway Gymnasium has already sold out for all but one match. Meanwhile, the student section, the Block Party, sold out their season tickets in under two hours of going on sale.

A LOOK AT NORTHERN KENTUCKY NORSE

Series Record: 2-0 (PUR Leads) | Last Meeting: Sept. 21, 2013 (W, 3-1 in West Lafayette)

- The Norse are coming off a five set loss to Austin Peay and have taken on two top-25 opponents in then-#4 Louisville (L, 0-3) and then-#22 Western Kentucky (L, 0-3).
- Leading the team's offense is outside hitter Anna Brinkman with 3.42 points per set, 2.89 kills per set. The Norse gets the most touches by far, totaling 342 attempts this season, with Abby Kanarky receiving the next-highest with 264 attempts.
- Allie Siefke leads the defensive effort at the net with 1.21 blocks per set. Meanwhile, the back row is led by Anna Burke's 4.25 digs per set.

A LOOK AT BALL STATE CARDINALS

Series Record: 22-4 (PUR Leads) | Last Meeting: Sept. 3, 2019 (W, 3-1 in West Lafayette)

- The Boilermakers have won every match against the Cardinals since 1977.
- Ball State is averaging 13.4 kills per set and a .262 attack %. In comparison, they are limiting opponents to a .220 efficiency despite allowing more kills per set (13.6).
- The team's middle blockers are the Middle blocker Marie Plitt leads the team with 2.96 points per set, .78 blocks per set and a .385 attack %. Plitt was named MAC West Division Offensive Player of the Week following a .484 attack % over the team's three matches in the tournament over the weekend.
- Defensively, Maggie Huber is averaging 3.90 digs per set.
- The Cardinals took Dayton, a team Purdue faced in the NCAA Second Round last December, to five sets before falling 12-15 in the fifth. In the match, Ball State totaled 89 digs and 10 total blocks (3-14). Setter Megan Wielonski recorded 49 assists in the loss.

STARTING THE SEASON STRONG

- Purdue's 6-0 start was the best since 2018. It is the eighth time under HC Dave Shondell.
- The Boilermakers are off to one of its most efficient non-conference starts, ranking third in the league with a .288 hitting %.
- Four Boilers that have started are hitting above .300: Raven Colvin (.393% with 73-14-150), Hannah Clayton (.350% with 55-14-117), Eva Hudson (.321% with 134-30-324), Emily Rastovski (.417% with 6-1-12)

RETURNING HOME: KELLI MILLER

- Purdue's all-time digs leader Kelli Miller returns to Holloway since playing for the Old Gold & Black from 2005-08, where she totaled 2,013 digs and 4.05 digs per set.
- In a program that is known for their defensive game, she averaged 4.63 digs per set in 2007, which still ranks as the second-most in Purdue history. In fact, Miller is one of six Boilermakers in program history to produce at least 4.04 digs per set in a single season - and she did so for three years (2006, 2007, 2008).
- Meanwhile, she is third all-time with 568 digs in 2008, and made the top-10 list in season digs for each of her final three seasons. Miller was Dave Shondell's first recruit to commit to the program after taking the helm.
- Kelly Miller was an assistant for the Shondell's brother, Steve Shondell at Ball State before taking over the program.

LOUISVILLE INVITATIONAL LOOK-BACK

- The Boilermakers split the weekend in Louisville, receiving its first loss of the year at then-#4 Louisville in straight sets before taking down Xavier in three.
- With just eight errors, Purdue had its most efficient match of the year vs. Xavier, hitting .422. It's the most efficient match and the fewest errors since playing in the NCAA First Round: .424% vs. Illinois State (12/2/21) in four sets.

PURDUE IN THE AVCA RANKINGS

- Following a 1-1 weekend, Purdue dropped one spot to No. 10 in the latest poll.
- The preseason poll marked the team's third straight season ranked at least #13.
- Purdue is ranked in the AVCA top-13 for 26 straight weeks (begins: March 8, 2021), a program-record.
- The program has been ranked for 80 consecutive weeks (begins: preseason 2017), the longest active streak by any Purdue team, including men's basketball.
- Purdue is coming off its highest final ranking in program history at #6, besting the team's previous record, #7 which was season the season before.
- The Boilermakers set their highest-ever ranking last year, checking in at #3 following the take-down of #3 Ohio State inside Holloway Gymnasium, 3-2 (9/24/21).

EFFICIENCY IS KEY

- Raven Colvin is one of the most efficient attackers in all of the Big Ten, ranking sixth in the league with a .393 hitting %.
- Produced a .500 attack % in each of the matches last weekend: 8 kills, 1 error, 14 attempts at #4 Louisville followed by 11 kills, 2 errors, 18 swings vs. Xavier.
- Colvin has hit above .400 in five matches.
- The 2021 Big Ten All-Freshman Team has not committed more than three errors in a match all season.

THE BIG TEN COMPARISON

- The Boilermakers continue the tradition of having one of the toughest defensive units in the Big Ten, ranking No. 4 in opponent service aces (0.82), No. 4 in digs (14.07) and No. 5 in blocks (69).
- Offensively, Purdue ranks No. 3 in hitting % (.288) and limits the opponent block to 1.54 per set, good for No. 4 in the league.

MAKING AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT: EVA HUDSON

- As the Big Ten leader with 5.30 points per set and 4.79 kills per set, Hudson has set the standard for Big Ten freshmen.
- Hudson ranks 12th nationally in points per set as a freshman. To put in perspective, the next freshman ranked is Angeles Alderete (East Carolina), who checks in at 40th with 4.68 points per set. Meanwhile, the next Power 5 freshman to rank after Hudson is Logan Lednický (Texas A&M) at No. 72 with 4.39 per set.
- Hudson recorded a career-high 21 kills vs. Milwaukee and matched the mark vs. Xavier, and is the most by a Big Ten player in a three-set match this season.
- Hudson has recorded 21 kills on two occasions this season, she has done so at some of her most efficient performances of her young career: .475% vs. Xavier and .395% vs. Milwaukee, proof that when she gets going, she is even more difficult to stop. In the past seven years, only All-Americans Sheridan Atkinson, Grace Cleveland, Danielle Cuttino and Faye Adelaja have registered as efficient of a match while posting 20+ kills. Of those four Boilermakers, only Hudson has accomplished the feat as an underclassman.
- Hudson was selected Big Ten Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week after Week 1, marking the first time in program history a Boilermaker has won both awards (excludes Defensive Player of the Week and Freshman of the Week honor, of which three Purdue freshmen have garnered, including current teammate Raven Colvin).
- She is the 11th student-athlete in Big Ten history to receive both Player and Freshman of the Week honors in the same week. All but one those players went on to be named All-Americans during their career and/or Big Ten Freshman of the Year.
- Hudson was named MVP of the Tennessee Classic and a Louisville Invitational All-Tournament Team honoree.
- Posted 36 attempts in the season-opener, the most touches by a freshman since before 2014. A feat she has continued to best and current stands at a season-high of 54 which came vs. #RV Utah (9/2).
- Hudson posted an ace in the first seven straight matches.
- The freshman has been knocking on the door for her first double-double, most recently coming two digs shy at #4 Louisville (17 kills, 8 digs).

STEPPING UP: MADDIE SCHERMERHORN

- This season, Schermerhorn is averaging 4.46 digs per set, second in the Big Ten and 60th in the nation.
- The libero is coming off a 2021 season which she averaged 1.42.
- In the five-set victory vs. Utah (9/2) Schermerhorn recorded a career-best 26 digs, the most by a Big Ten player in a 5-set match.
- Schermerhorn led the Big Ten in Week 2 of play, recording 59 digs on her way to earning her first-ever Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week nod.

IN COMPARISON: 2022 VS. RECENT HISTORY

- The Boilermakers are serving tough, out-acing opponents 36-17 in the first two weeks of play. In the past 10 years, Purdue has only created as many aces through its first six matches two other seasons (2018 and 2015).

DEFENSE LIVES HERE

- Purdue led the nation in total blocks last year with 372.5.
- Purdue went 31 straight matches with seven or more blocks, a feat that came to a close at the Louisville Invitational.
- The Boilermaker block has gotten better year over year, not only ranking first or second in the Big Ten in total blocks the past three straight seasons, but among the top seven in the nation: (#1 in 2021, #5 in 2020, #7 in 2019).
- The team's 631 block assists in 2021 not only led the nation, but broke a 35-year-old program record.
- Purdue has out-blocked opponents 1.4 blocks per set last season, the largest margin for the program in 17 years.
- The Boilermakers averaged 15.17 digs per last season, a mark only reached four times in the program's last 17 seasons.

THE NEWCOMERS

- The Boilermakers welcome six newcomers to the team this season, including three transfers: junior DS Emily Brown (previously at Missouri), fifth year MB Hannah Clayton (previously Iowa) and fifth year S Grace Balensiefer (previously Northern Illinois).
- Three freshmen join the roster: Lizzie Carr (MB, 6'6", West Chester, Pa.), Eva Hudson (OH, 6'1", Fort Wayne, Ind.) and Brielle Warren (OH, 6'1", College Station, Texas).
- Hudson was a 2021 AAU All-American and AAU 18 Open National Champion. She was the first-ever three-time Summit Athletic Conference MVP and a two-time Ultra Ankle JVA All-National Team selection. As a senior, she averaged a .462 hitting % at Bishop Dwenger High School and finished her HS career at a .428 clip, 1,557 kills and 811 digs.
- Warren was the No. 4 recruit out of the state of Texas for the 2022 class. Named to the 2021 AVCA All-America Watch List, the outside hitter received MVP honors as a freshman in the U15 Junior Olympics and was a member of the 2021 USA Volleyball U19 Summer Training Series. In addition, she guided her team to a UIL 5A State Runner-Up finish in 2020 and helped her club team Houston Skyline to a #5 national ranking as a junior. Her father, Ty, played for the New England Patriots - teammates with Raven Colvin's father, Roosevelt Colvin.
- Warren is the first Boilermaker out of the state of Texas since Anna Drewry (2009-12).
- Carr was a member of the National Team at East Coast Power, where she helped the team to a fifth-place finish at AAU nationals. As a senior, she posted 418 kills, 103 total blocks and 47 aces in just 21 matches. Additionally, she was named Max Preps/ AVCA Pennsylvania Player of the Week (9/13/21) after posting 47 kills and 5.88 kills per game.

THE PURDUE ROSTER AT A GLANCE

- A relatively untested team, Purdue lost six starters this season and 73% of last year's kills.
- Returning Boilermakers account for 27 total starts, led by Colvin with 21 starts, followed by Maddie Schermerhorn and Ali Hornung with two apiece.
- Heading into her senior year, libero Schermerhorn has some of the most experience on the team playing in all 33 matches last season.
- The Boilermakers graduated seven players: two fifth-year returners and five seniors which included four All-Big Ten honorees, 2021 AVCA Second Team All-American Caitlyn Newton, 2021 AVCA Honorable Mentions Hayley Bush, Grace Cleveland and Jena Otec (in 2020, Cleveland was a First Team All-American and Otec Purdue's first-ever Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year).
- Eight of Purdue's 17 players come from the state of Indiana.

2021: A SEASON TO REMEMBER

- In addition to setting program records in total blocks, block assists, and national rankings, Purdue notched seven victories vs. ranked opponents, including five wins vs. top-8 teams and four wins vs. top-5 teams.
- The Boilermakers graduated the most talented senior and super-senior class in program history, with five Boilers making their mark as one of the best in program history in at least one category: Hayley Bush, Grace Cleveland, Marissa Hornung, Caitlyn Newton and Jena Otec.
- The record books were rewritten by the senior and super-senior class, accounting for a total of 14 career top-10 marks (categories: kills, kills per set, total attempts, hitting %, assists, service aces, block assists, total blocks, blocks per game, digs and digs per game).
- Purdue is one of just three teams to sweep the national champions in the regular season this century: 2021 Purdue 2-0 vs. Wisconsin, 2016: UCLA 2-0 vs. Stanford and 2004: Saint Mary's 2-0 vs. Stanford.
- Meanwhile, Purdue was one of two schools in the nation to win an NCAA women's soccer tournament game, an NCAA women's volleyball tournament match and its football bowl game.

DAVE SHONDELL & COACHING STAFF

- Dave Shondell was named both Big Ten Coach of the Year and Regional Coach of the Year for the second time in his career last year.
- Shondell, along with his coaching staff of associate head coach John Shondell and assistant head coach - recruiting coordinator Kathy Jewell are entering their 20th season together at Purdue. No Power 5 coaching staff has stayed all together for as long. In total, there are only eight active head coaches who've celebrated 20 or more years at their institution. Shondell is one of two in the Big Ten.
- Under his direction, Shondell has guided Purdue to 13 20-win seasons.
- Purdue's five Big Ten losses in 2021 are the second-least in a single season (least: 4, 2011) during the Shondell era.
- Last season, Shondell surpassed two milestones: 600 matches at Purdue (vs. Rutgers, 10/2) and 400 wins, earned in the next match (at Illinois, 10/6). Shondell is the ninth head coach in Big Ten volleyball history to reach 400 wins.
- Shondell owned a record of 414-206 (.668) entering the 2022 season.
- Shondell signed a contract extension in August 2021, running through the 2024 season.
- Shondell and company have coached 23 All-Americans and 79 All-Big Ten honorees.

SETTING THE STANDARD: INAUGURAL BIG TEN VOLLEYBALL MEDIA DAY

- HC Dave Shondell, sophomore middle blocker Raven Colvin and senior outside hitter Emma Ellis attended the first of its kind Media Day for women's volleyball.
- The event was held at the Big Ten Network Studios in Chicago.

PRO BOILERS

- Annie Drews led the team to a gold medal in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics, not only the first Boilermaker to make the Olympic team, but the first from the state of Indiana. She came off the bench to begin pool play, but started the final six matches, including the gold medal match, and led the team in kills and points each time. Drews is back in Japan again to spend another season with the JT Marvelous pro team.
- All-American setter Ashley Evans just wrapped up with the U.S. Women's team at the Pan American Cup, where they won bronze.
- As part of Team USA, Danielle Cuttino and Annie Drews went 1-1 vs. Turkey in the USA Volleyball Cup over the weekend in Long Beach, California. Drews recorded 35 points over the two matches, including a team-leading 21 points in their win.
