Recap: Rivalry, Momentum & New Leadership

- **Rivalry Reset:** Prairie View A&M opens the 2025 season in the historic Labor Day Classic against arch-rival Texas Southern. PVAMU aims to avenge last year's 27-9 loss and kick off a new era on a high note.
- **New Leadership:** Tremaine Jackson begins his tenure as head coach after a stellar run at Valdosta State (40-12), bringing renewed energy and 72 new players while retaining 33 veterans, including key contributors like Lamagea McDowell, Cam Peters, Jamal Marshall, James Kate, and Kam Amao.
- **End-of-Year Momentum:** PVAMU closed 2024 with three straight wins (Florida A&M, Mississippi Valley State, Texas A&M-Commerce), building positive momentum into the new season.

Key Returning Players & Projected Starters – Here are some key returners likely to impact the game:

Offense

- **Lamagea McDowell (RB, Sr.)** – Veterans running back, integral to the ground game; cited as a retained veteran by Coach Jackson.
- **Connor Wisham (RB, Sr.)** – Senior back from Baton Rouge, offering size and versatility.
- **Cameron Peters (QB, Sr.)** – The most seasoned returning quarterback; likely to lead the offense under center.
- **Ja'Koby Banks (WR, So.)** – Emerging sophomore pass-catcher from Missouri City, already showing promise.
- Other notable returning WRs: **Rodny Ojo**, and **Jeremiah Ratliff**, all expected to contribute as receiving options.

Defense & Specialists

- **Jamal Marshall, James Kate, Kam Amao** are veteran players retained by Jackson for leadership and continuity

HEAD COACH TREMAINE JACKSON



Tremaine Jackson begins his first season as the 35th head football coach at Prairie View A&M University, effective January 1, 2025. With a legacy of excellence and a commitment to student-athlete success, Coach Jackson brings a wealth of experience and an unrivaled passion for the sport to the University.

Joining PVAMU fresh off being named AFCA Division II National Coach of the Year, Jackson served as head coach of the Valdosta State University Blazers' football team from 2022-24, amassing an overall record of 30-9 in his three seasons. He guided the Blazers to an undefeated regular season in 2024 enroute to the NCAA Division II National Championship game.

In his second year with Valdosta State, Jackson led them to the Gulf South Conference championship, becoming the first Black coach in conference history to win the title with the team ranked in the top 15 nationally in passing offense, first downs, completion percentage, passing efficiency, net punting, and fumbles recovered. Additionally, the team achieved the highest-grade point average in program history.

Before taking over Valdosta's program, Jackson was head coach for the Colorado Mesa Mavericks; defensive line coach at Texas State, and a defensive coordinator at Abilene Christian. He also spent time as assistant head coach at the University of Sioux Falls, helping lead the Cougars to a combined 32-5 record in four seasons.

Jackson began his coaching career at Texas A&M University-Kingsville, as the Javelinas' defensive line coach. He served as defensive coordinator at Texas Southern University from 2008-2011 helping that team win the 2010 Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) title. Jackson also had stops at Trinity Valley Community College, and Evangel University.

Named by ESPN as one of 45 minority coaches under 45 to watch and to FootballScoop's 2022 Minority Watch List, Jackson was twice selected to participate in the NFL's Bill Walsh Minority Fellowship, spending a week in June of 2023 with the Pittsburgh Steelers and part of training camp in 2024 with the Jacksonville Jaguars. He also completed NFL internships with the Houston Texans and San Diego Chargers.

Jackson is vice president of the Minority Coaches Advancement Association, has served on several AFCA committees, and was recipient of the 2022 Harry Butler Community Service Award for dedicated community service and outstanding volunteerism. He has been recognized throughout his coaching career for his ability to build winning teams, while cultivating a culture of excellence both on and off the field.

A former student-athlete, Jackson played on the defensive line at Texas Southern for two years after transferring from the University of Louisiana-Monroe. He is a 2006 graduate of the University of Houston, where he obtained a bachelor's degree in interdisciplinary studies. The Houston, Texas native has one daughter, Harmony.

2025 SEASON PREVIEW

Offensive Outlook

Coach Jackson has emphasized the importance of building from the trenches.

“If we can’t get 8–10 guys on the offensive line to play as a cohesive unit consistently, then we’re going to struggle. That’s where our success starts.”

The quarterback competition is the hottest topic coming into fall. With seven QBs on the roster — including spring standout Cameron Peters, veteran Lucas Coley, and newcomers like Tevin Carter, Tyler Nelson, and Blake Murphy — the battle is far from settled. Coach Jackson says the decision must be made before Week One:

“Only one guy can be the quarterback, and the one who protects the football, distributes it the right way, and leads the team will earn it.”

With experienced weapons including tight end Ethan John and wideouts like Rodney Ojo, Ja’Koby Banks, and Andre Dennis, and a powerful backfield led by Lameaga McDowell, Connor Wisham, and Chase Bingmon — the offense has the potential to be explosive once the right trigger man is found.

Freshmen to Watch

Three big-bodied offensive linemen Reggie Wilson, Quan Byers, Austine Anyia could see early playing time if they adjust to the college speed.

“You always want to build with in-state linemen who have that kind of size and upside.”

Defensive Depth & Leadership

Defensively, the Panthers return a solid group of contributors led by rising standout Eric Zachery and versatile veteran Kamren Amao in the secondary.

“Zachery should’ve been starting last year — he’s matured and had a great spring.”

Jeremiah Harris returns at linebacker with an expanded role, while Jamal Marshall and Tiago Sumbo anchor the defensive front. Jayven Jackson is another name to watch as he adjusts to a new role in Jackson’s system.

“It’s about putting our guys in the best positions to be disruptive — not just playing defense, but attacking.”

Special Teams Reset

Outside of returners Carlos Villagomez and Ben Stewart, Prairie View will have new faces across all special teams units.

“We feel we’ve upgraded that room — we’ll play our style without being handcuffed. Carlos has won us games before, and we need him healthy and consistent.”

Schedule Breakdown

The Panthers open the season in a high-stakes rivalry game vs. Texas Southern in the Labor Day Classic — a SWAC Western Division clash and the de facto Battle for Houston.

“That’s the one that attracted me here. It’s personal, it’s conference, it’s a rival. We have to win Game One.”

Non-conference matchups include a pair of Southland Conference foes Northwestern State and UTRGV; an FBS test at Rice, and a Homecoming showdown against Lincoln University (CA).

“We’re not here to just be a good SWAC team. We want to be a premier FCS program.”

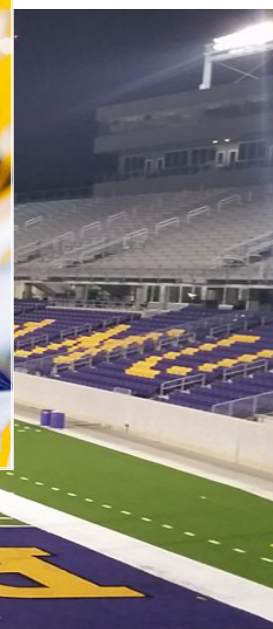
This makes the third Lady Panthers Western Division Championship title.

PANTHER HISTORY

The first football coach at Prairie View was H.B. Hucles, who began in 1924. Before Hucles's arrival at Prairie View, the school played two games without a coach on record: a 1907 7–0 win against a team from Wylie, Texas and a 1920 7–6 loss to Tuskegee University.

Prairie View's most recognized and celebrated coach was William "Billy" Nicks. Nicks was head coach in 1945–47, assistant coach in 1948–51, and head coach again in 1952–65. His record for 17 years was 127-39-8. He led the Panthers to eight Southwestern Athletic Conference championships and five black college national championships. At the Panthers' peak under Nicks, Eddie Robinson was said to dread playing Prairie View.

Nicks was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 1999. Nicks was named the American Football Coaches Association's recipient of the Trailblazer Award. The award was presented posthumously at the AFCA Kickoff Luncheon on Monday, January 7 at the 2008 AFCA Convention in Anaheim, California.

Prairie View is recognized as the first historically Black university to create and play in a post-season bowl game. The Prairie View Bowl was played in Texas from 1929 through 1961.

The Panthers won Black college football national championship titles in 1953, 1954, 1958, 1963, and 1964 and Southwestern Athletic Conference Championships SWAC in 1933, 1951, 1952, 1953, 1954, 1958, 1960, 1963, 1964, and recently in 2009. Notable football players that have achieved success in the National Football League (NFL) are National Football Hall of Fame Inductee Kenny Houston, who played for the Houston Oilers and Washington Redskins and Otis Taylor, who won a World Championship with the Kansas City Chiefs in 1969. On a small note of significance, Charlie "Choo Choo" Brackins, who played from 1952–1955, was the first HBCU alumnus to play quarterback in the NFL.

The end of Jim Crow caused a significant talent drain for all HBCUs. Nicks had been able to stem the tide somewhat by persuading many of the state's black high school coaches to continue sending their players to Prairie View rather than to a predominantly white school. At one point, nearly all of them had played for Nicks, and owed their jobs to him. Usually, a single phone call from Nicks was enough to persuade one of Nicks' former players to send a prospect to "The Hill." He wasn't above threatening to have them fired if they didn't do so. However, Prairie View's fortunes sank rapidly after Nicks retired in 1965. The Panthers would only "officially" finish above .500 twice from 1968 to 1989. This included winless seasons in 1974, 1979, 1983, and 1984 and a 28-game losing streak from 1982 to 1985. They managed a .500 record in 1988 under coach Haney Catchings—their first non-losing season since 1976. However, that win was forfeited after the season due to an ineligible player.

Prairie View bottomed out when it returned to the field for the 1991 season. The team did not have any scholarships because only 150 alumni responded to a request to help raise a scholarship fund. The Panthers did not win a single game until 1998. The 80 consecutive losses spanning parts of nine seasons (including two losses to close the 1989 season) almost doubled Columbia University's 44 straight losses between 1983 and 1988.

The streak finally ended with a 14–12 victory over Langston on September 26, 1998. However, that team only had 15 scholarship players. The road back was difficult; the Panthers only won a total of 23 games between 1998 and 2006.

On November 10, 2007, Prairie View clinched its first winning season since 1976, and only their second since 1967, with a 30–27 victory over traditional power Jackson State University under then head coach Henry Frazier, III.

In 1999 the SWAC moved to a new divisional format with Western Division and Eastern Division champions to play for the SWAC Championship. On November 14, 2009, it clinched its first SWAC Western Division Championship by defeating Alcorn State. The next weekend would see the Panthers go undefeated in the SWAC by defeating Arkansas Pine Bluff and securing an 8–1 record; their only loss during the season was to New Mexico State. They finished the season by winning the SWAC Championship on December 12, defeating Eastern Division Champion Alabama A&M, 30–24, in the SWAC Championship Game. They exited the 2009 SWAC football campaign with an unblemished 9–0 SWAC conference record. They were led by their quarterback, 6 ft 4 in, 225-pound KJ Black, who led all quarterbacks in the SWAC with a passer efficiency rating of 168.1 their SWAC second-leading rusher in Donald Babers that averaged 5.2 yards per carry.



K.J. Black - Atlanta Falcons Second Year

K.J. Black was named Atlanta Falcons offensive assistant on Feb. 3, 2024.

In the 2024 season, Black worked primarily with the team's wide receivers, guiding third-year wideout Drake London to single-season career highs in receptions (100), receiving yards (1,271) and receiving touchdowns (nine). London became the third player in Falcons history with 100 receptions, 1,200 yards and nine touchdowns in a single season, joining Roddy White (2010) and Terance Mathis (1994).

Black also worked with free agent additions Darnell Mooney and Ray-Ray McCloud III. In 16 games played, Mooney recorded 64 receptions for 992 yards and a single-season best five receiving touchdowns. McCloud recorded career bests in receptions (62), receiving yards (686), rushes (10) and rushing yards (79) in his first year as a Falcon.

Black arrived in Atlanta after spending two seasons (2022-23) with the Los Angeles Rams. He served as an offensive assistant in 2023 after spending 2022 as part of the Bill Walsh Diversity Coaching Fellowship, where he worked alongside Falcons Offensive Coordinator Zac Robinson.

In 2023, Black helped Rams quarterback Matthew Stafford complete 326-of-521 attempts (62.6 percent) for 3,965 yards, 24 touchdowns and 11 interceptions for a 92.5 passer rating and earn Pro Bowl honors for the second time in his career. Stafford ranked in the top 12 among quarterbacks in completions, passing yards and touchdown passes. Rams wide receiver Puka Nacua recorded the most receptions (105) and receiving yards (1,486) by a rookie in NFL history, earning second-team AP All-Pro and Pro Bowl honors. Nacua also set the NFL record for most receiving yards by a rookie in a playoff game in NFL history with 181 yards against Detroit.

As a coaching fellow during the 2022 season, Black played a pivotal role in the development of younger quarterbacks John Wolford and Bryce Perkins. During an injury-riddled season, both Wolford and Perkins saw playing time and made significant improvements while working with Black. Wolford started three games in place of an injured Stafford and threw for 390 yards and one touchdown. Perkins appeared in four games, starting one, and threw for 161 yards and a touchdown, while rushing for 90 yards.

Prior to joining the Rams, Black served as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Florida A&M. He joined the coaching staff at FAMU in 2019 as passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach. Under Black's leadership, Rattlers quarterback Ryan Stanley threw for 2,566 yards in 2019, earning MEAC Offensive Player of the Year honors.

Black started his coaching career in 2011 at his alma mater, Prairie View A&M, where he served in a variety of roles including graduate assistant (2011-14), passing game coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2015-17) and tight ends coach (2018).

As a player, Black played quarterback at Western Kentucky University before transferring to Prairie View A&M, where he threw for 4,187 yards and 35 touchdowns over two seasons with the program. In 2009, he led the Panthers to the program's first SWAC Championship since 1964 and earned Offensive Player of the Year honors and Black College Player of the Year accolades.

Black and his wife, Erin, have two daughters, Peyton Dianne and Zoe Giselle.

HODGE - ATLANTA FALCONS

Khadarel Hodge Wide Receiver - Atlanta Falcons Third Year

KhaDarel Jamal Hodge from Small town QB to NFL Playmaker - from Undrafted to Unshakable

Hodge isn't just a wide receiver he's a survivor, a specialist, and a spark plug. Raised in D'Lo, Mississippi, a town of fewer than 500 people, Hodge grew up in a single-parent household with three siblings, raised by his mother Michelle and guided by his grandfather, a preacher. That upbringing shaped his grit, faith, and work ethic that define his NFL journey.

At Mendenhall High School, Hodge was a dual-threat quarterback, putting up video game numbers with over 5,000 total yards and 68 touchdowns across his junior and senior seasons. A second-team All-State honoree, Hodge was a natural leader with raw talent and poise. He committed to Alcorn State as a quarterback but redshirted his freshman year and ultimately transferred.

His next stop, Hinds Community College, marked a major shift: Hodge moved from quarterback to wide receiver. It was a gamble and a turning point. In 2016, he transferred again, this time to Prairie View A&M, where he found his stride. Over three seasons, he caught 104 passes for 1,797 yards and 21 touchdowns. As a senior, Hodge dominated the SWAC with 844 yards and 12 touchdowns, earning First-Team All-SWAC and Black College All-America honors.

Despite his production and athleticism he ran a 4.58 40-yard dash with a 38-inch vertical at his Pro Day Hodge went undrafted in 2018. But his drive kept him moving forward. He signed with the Los Angeles Rams after a tryout and was promoted from the practice squad to the active roster in September. That season, he appeared in 14 games, recorded his first NFL catch, contributed on special teams, and played in Super Bowl LIII.

Hodge was waived in 2019 but immediately claimed by the Cleveland Browns where he emerged as a standout on special teams. In his first season in Cleveland, he led the team with 13 special teams tackles and contributed as a rotational wideout. He stayed with the Browns through the 2020 season, making 11 catches for 180 yards in nine games despite stints on injured reserve and the COVID-19 list.

After being waived by Cleveland in 2021, Hodge was picked up by the Detroit Lions, where he continued to bring value as a depth receiver and special teams mainstay.

In March 2022, Hodge signed with the Atlanta Falcons, a move that began his most productive stretch in the NFL. In his first season, he played all 17 games and set career highs with 13 receptions, 202 yards, and his first touchdown. He re-signed in 2023 and again played all 17 games, upping his totals to 14 receptions and 232 yards.

In 2024, Hodge signed a one-year deal to stay in Atlanta and delivered one of the most memorable seasons of his career. In Week 5, he caught the game-winning touchdown in overtime against Tampa Bay. In Week 15 against the Raiders, he blocked a punt and tipped another, earning NFC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. He finished the season with seven receptions for 131 yards and a touchdown—but his biggest accolade came post-season: NFC Special Teamer for the Pro Bowl, the first Pro Bowl selection of his career.

Hodge re-signed with the Falcons again on March 17, 2025, agreeing to a two-year, \$6 million deal—recognition of both his consistency and his impact.

From undrafted free agent to Pro Bowl special teamer, KhaDarel Hodge has built a career not just by catching passes but by refusing to let go of opportunity.

Quinton Bell | Linebacker | Miami Dolphins - Third Year

Quinton Bell – The Relentless Edge - In an NFL landscape filled with elite prospects from powerhouse programs, Bell has carved his own unique path—built on raw athleticism, personal reinvention, and an unshakable resolve to outwork everyone in the room. From track spikes to pass rush moves, Bell has always defied expectations—most notably by becoming the first Prairie View A&M player drafted into the NFL since 1980.

But before his name appeared on draft boards, Bell was simply a high school standout from Long Beach, California, chasing opportunity.

Early Life & High School Foundation - Born and raised in Long Beach, California, Bell found his competitive edge early. He attended Costa Mesa High School, where his talent as a three-sport athlete was impossible to miss. At 6'4" and 210 pounds, Bell was a physical specimen whose speed and agility made him stand out on the football field, basketball court, and track.

In football, he played both wide receiver and outside linebacker, earning a slew of honors in 2013: First Team All-Area, All-Region, All-Conference, and All-County. His impact helped Costa Mesa earn sectional and conference titles.

Off the gridiron, Bell's track performance turned heads. He won the Orange Coast League Championship in the 100-meter dash and anchored the record-setting 4x100-meter relay team—proving he was more than just power and size; he was explosive. That blend of speed and athleticism would become the hallmark of his future.

After graduating in 2014, Bell accepted a collegiate offer from Prairie View A&M University, an HBCU with a storied history and one that would soon become a launching pad for his NFL dreams.

Prairie View A&M – From Receiver to Defensive Threat - Bell arrived at Prairie View in 2015 as a wide receiver and spent the next three seasons (2015–2017) working within the Panthers' offensive system. He also competed as a sprinter for the school's track and field team—balancing dual-sport commitments with the discipline and drive of a pro.

But it wasn't until 2018, in his senior season, that Bell's football career took a dramatic and risky turn. He switched positions—moving from wide receiver to defensive end, a move rarely seen so late in a collegiate career. It turned out to be the defining decision of his life.

In just one season at his new position, Bell flashed elite upside as a pass rusher, thanks to his explosiveness off the edge, quick first step, and ability to convert speed to power. His performance put NFL scouts on alert.

At his Pro Day, Bell put up numbers that rivaled the best edge prospects in the draft:

NFL Journey – The Grind of a True Pro - In the 2019 NFL Draft, the Oakland Raiders selected Quinton Bell in the 7th round (230th overall)—making him the first Prairie View A&M player drafted in nearly 40 years. It was a breakthrough moment, not just for Bell, but for his school and for HBCU athletes across the country.

His rookie year was a rollercoaster. He was waived during final roster cuts but re-signed to the Raiders' practice squad. A month later, he was released, beginning a stretch of NFL stops that would test and refine his resilience.

Tampa Bay Buccaneers (2019–2021) - In November 2019, Bell signed with the Buccaneers' practice squad and remained with the team into the 2020 and 2021 seasons. He signed multiple reserve/future contracts, showcasing steady development as a defensive depth piece and special teams contributor. Despite being waived in August 2021, Bell's work ethic and attitude kept him on the radar.

Atlanta Falcons (2021–2023) - The Atlanta Falcons picked up Bell in September 2021. After time on the practice squad, he signed a reserve/future deal and made the active roster in 2022, appearing in three games. Though he was waived later that season, he remained with the Falcons through early 2023, gaining valuable reps and continuing to refine his technique.

Philadelphia Eagles (2023) - Bell briefly signed with the Philadelphia Eagles in August 2023 but was released after preseason.

Miami Dolphins (2023–Present) - In October 2023, Bell landed with the Miami Dolphins joining their practice squad and later signing a reserve/future contract in January 2024. The Dolphins re-signed Bell in May 2025, a vote of confidence in his development, discipline, and potential to contribute as a rotational edge rusher and special teams weapon.

Legacy in Progress - Bell's journey is one of adaptability, perseverance, and next-level athleticism. From catching passes in high school to rushing quarterbacks in the NFL, Bell has shown an extraordinary ability to evolve—and a refusal to quit.

He's more than a late-round draft pick. He's a symbol of what happens when raw talent meets relentless effort. Whether it's breaking track records, switching positions mid-career, or grinding through practice squads, Bell continues to prove he belongs—one snap at a time.
