Scouting Clarkson

Clarkson swept its ECAC Hockey series last weekend with wins over Harvard and Dartmouth. Zach Tsekos and Alex Campbell both scored in each game for the Golden Knights.

Ethan Haider was named the MAC Goaltending Goalie of the Week in the ECAC Haider shut out Dartmouth on Saturday making 27 saves and made 37 saves Friday night vs the potent Harvard offense.

He now has a .921% save percentage and a 2.007 goals against average on the season. The shut out against Dartmouth was his first as a Golden Knight.

All-Time vs. Clarkson

Friday's contest marks exactly 16 years since the first-ever matchup between the two sides, with Quinnipiac owning an 18-12-5 edge in the all-time series. The teams met six times last season and split a 2-2-2 record in those games. QU is 10-6-2 at home against Clarkson.

Scouting St. Lawrence

St. Lawrence is 2-3-4 to start the season following an 0-1-1 home weekend. After starting the season with seven straight road games, the Scarlet and Brown played their first two home games this past weekend.

On Friday night, the Saints fell into a 2-0 hole to Dartmouth in the second period following a dominant first period. The Skating Saints stormed back as Ashton Fry and Luc Salem scored 37 seconds apart in the third to knot the game up at 2-2 but the Big Green scored a goal later in the third to take the game.

On Saturday, the Saints faced a tall task in #6/10 Harvard, but ended up skating away with a tie. The Crimson took the 1-0 lead five minutes into the first period, but North Country native Will Arquiatt's first career goal tied the game late in the second period. Arquiatt got the puck in the offensive zone and made a highlight reel move to score his first goal in Scarlet and Brown

All-Time vs. the Skating Saints

Quinnipiac and St. Lawrence meet for the 45th time on Saturday night after squaring off seven times last year, including for the ECAC Hockey Championship in March. Despite dropping the title contest, the Bobcats have won 13 of the last 15 matchups between the squads.

Own the Dot

Led by captain Wyatt Bongiovanni, the Bobcats are currently second in the nation in faceoff win percentage (.585). Bongiovanni is sixth nationally with 142 total faceoffs won.

The Defense Does Not Rest

Averaging 1.42 goals against per game, Quinnipiac leads the nation in scoring defense. The team's 1.58 scoring margin is good for eighth in the nation.

Shots, Shots... Not.

QU did not allow a shot on goal until 11:25 into the 2nd period against Vermont. It's the second time ever that the Bobcats have held an opponent without a shot on goal in a period and the longest such stretch to start a game in the program's Division I history.

Quinnipiac has allowed less than 20 shots on goal in nine of 12 games played this season.

Shhhh...

Quinnipiac has posted two shutout streaks of more than 120 minutes already this season. The latest streak of 157 minutes began after AIC's lone goal on October 30 and ended in the first period of Friday's ASU game.

Earlier this season, the Bobcats did not allow a goal from the 6:15 mark of the 2nd period against Boston College to the 7:44 mark of the first North Dakota game, good for a 161:29 shutout streak.

Sky(ler)'s the Limit

Brind'Amour was named the ECAC Hockey Player of the Week for his performance at the Ice Breaker, as announced by the league on Oct. 11. Brind'Amour tallied a goal and an assist to lead the team with two points against BC. Brind'Amour then added another assist in the Bobcats' 2-0 win over No. 18 Northeastern. He also won 8-of-10 faceoffs against the Huskies.

Perets In Net

Perets owns top 15 spots on the national rankings for goals against average (1st, 1.09), save percentage (11th, .934), and win percentage (3rd, .917).

Pecknold's Progress

Quinnipiac men's ice hockey head coach Rand Pecknold won his 556th game in the win over Brown, surpassing John MacInnes (Michigan Tech) for 10th-most NCAA wins.

Pecknold earned career victory 550 in last weekend's 3-0 win over No. 18 Northeastern.

He is the 11th coach all-time to hit 550 career wins and the second active NCAA Division I coach to do so.

Preseason Accolades

Senior assistant captains Ethan De Jong and Zach Metsa both earned Preseason All-ECAC Hockey honors as voted on by the league's coaches and announced on September 27. The coaches also selected Quinnipiac men's ice hockey as the number one team in the 2021-22 preseason coaches' poll.

Respect Your Elders

The Bobcats added five graduate transfers to the roster for the 2021-22 season, after only having one previous grad transfers in the history of the program. Dylan St. Cyr (Notre Dame), Griffin Mendel (Denver), Oliver Chau (UMass), Brendan Less (Dartmouth), and Tony Stillwell (Brown) will all make their

Quinnipiac debuts this season.

I'm The Captain Now

Senior Wyatt Bongiovanni was named the 48th captain in program history, succeeding Odeen Tufto '21 who served as the team captain for the Bobcats in 2020-21. Bongiovanni previously served as an assistant captain for the Bobcats as a junior during Tufto's captaincy.

Ethan de Jong and Zach Metsa have been named assistant captains for the 2021-22 season.

Welcome Aboard

Rand Pecknold and his staff have announced the addition of Mike Corbett to the Quinnipiac men's ice hockey program as an assistant coach. Corbett comes to Hamden with an extensive resume in coaching and was most recently the assistant coach at Robert Morris University in Pittsburgh, Pa. With the Colonials, he coached three AHA All-League selections, two all-rookie selections, and the league's rookie, defenseman, and co-player of the year. Corbett takes the role of Bill Riga, who left the program in the summer to become the head coach at Holy Cross.

All Smiles

Ty Smilanic (Denver, Colorado) was invited to USA Hockey's World Junior Summer Showcase. A 2020 NHL Draft third round selection of the Florida Panthers, Smilanic was one of 44 players invited by USA Hockey to the World Junior Summer Showcase. Among the 44 invitees, Smilanic is one of 17 that played college hockey in the 2020-21 season.

Cleary Cup Champions

The Bobcats won the Cleary Cup as ECAC Hockey Regular Season Champions for the fifth time in the past nine seasons after going 10-4-4 in league play. Quinnipiac has clinch the Cleary Cup in two of the last three seasons.

ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year

Head coach Rand Pecknold was named the ECAC Hockey Tim Taylor Coach of the Year for the third time in his career. It was also the fourth league coach of the year award in his career after taking home the honor in Atlantic Hockey in 2004-05.

First Team All-League

The Bobcats placed three players on the ECAC Hockey First Team for the first time in program history, as Tufto, Petruzzelli and Metsa all earned first team honors. It was each of their first times named to the First Team, and for Tufto it capped off a four-year run as an All-League selection after he was named to the All-Rookie Team in 2017-18 and had back-to-back Second Team selections in 2018-19 and 2019-20.

All-Rookie Team

First year Ty Smilanic was named to

the ECAC Hockey All-Rookie Team after leading the nation with 14 goals. Smilanic was one of the most dominant scorers not just in the league but in the nation. He is Quinnipiac's 10th ECAC Hockey All-Rookie Team selection, and fourth in the last four years. The Bobcats have had 21 All-Rookie Team selections since joining the Division I ranks as members of the MAAC Hockey League followed by Atlantic Hockey.

Quinnipiac in the NCAA Tournament

Quinnipiac reached the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in program history, and sixth time in the past eight tournaments. Prior to last year, the last time Quinnipiac was in the NCAA Tournament in 2019, the Bobcats defeated Arizona State before falling to eventual national champion Minnesota Duluth in the Midwest Regional Final. Quinnipiac is 7-7 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

de Jong and the Restless

Ethan de Jong was one of the Bobcats most dominant players in 2020-21 as he tied for first on the team and eighth in the nation with 14 goals while his 29 points were good for 14th in the nation last year. Both were career-highs.

de Jong picked up points in seven straight games prior to the NCAA Tournament and 11 of his last 12 games.

Metsa World Peace

Zach Metsa was among the nation's top defensemen last season as he led the country with 21 assists and 26 points while his five goals were sixth among defensemen. He recorded points in seven of the last nine games as the blueliner reached career-highs in goals, assists and points.

No Ty-me Like the Present

Sophomore Ty Smilanic had an impressive first season in the blue and gold for the Bobcats as he tied for first on the team and eighth in the nation with 14 goals. He chipped in seven assists for the Bobcats to give him 21 points, one of eight rookies in the nation with at least 21 points.

Burgart King

Desi Burgart has provided some invaluable depth scoring for the Bobcats, tallying a career-high 10 goals and 16 points a year ago. He had more goals and points last season than his first two seasons combined.

Rollin' In My Lombo

Michael Lombardi had a red-hot February for the Bobcats as he recorded points in seven of eight games from Feb. 5-March 5 to boost his scoring to five goals and 10 assists for 15 points. Lombardi's 16 total points are more than he had in his first two seasons in the blue and gold (14).

Guus Van Goal

Guus van Nes had an impressive 2020-21 as he piled up 12 assists to go with two goals

for 14 points after just five as a first year in 2019-20. van Nes played in all 29 games this season for the Bobcats.

Fillin' It Up

Christophe Fillion joined the Bobcats squad a few games into last season and his made an immediate impact, chipping in six goals and adding four assists for 10 points. Fillion was one of just six rookies in ECAC Hockey to record at least 10 points.

HEAD COACH RAND PECKNOLD



Rand Pecknold enters his 28th season at the helm of the Quinnipiac men's ice hockey program after being hired to the position on May 5, 1994.

To date, Pecknold features a career record of 550-326-97 and currently ranks second among all active NCAA Division I coaches in career victories.

Pecknold guided Quinnipiac to its fifth Cleary Cup in the last nine seasons in the 2020-21 season as the Bobcats cruised to the ECAC Hockey Regular Season Championship. The Bobcats won 17 games in the pandemic-shortened season, the 21st time a Pecknold team has won 17-plus games and Quinnipiac has never finished with fewer than 16 wins in a season since joining ECAC Hockey in 2005-06. The Bobcats reached the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in program history, and sixth time in the past eight seasons a tournament was held.

Pecknold was crowned the ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year for the third time in his career while Odeen Tufto was named the league's player of the year and Keith Petruzzelli earned the goaltender of the year honors. Tufto was also named a CCM/AHCA First Team All-American while both Tufto and Petruzzelli were named Top 10 Finalists for the Hobey Baker Award. Petruzzelli was also a finalist for the Mike Richter Award.

During the 2020-21 season, the Bobcats also placed three players on the ECAC Hockey First Team for the first time in program history in Tufto, Petruzzelli and Zach Metsa.

The Bobcats finished the 2019-20 season with their 18th 20-win season in the Rand Pecknold era, going 21-11-2 before the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Bobcats earned two All-ECAC Hockey selections and were primed to make deep runs in the ECAC Hockey Tournament as the No. 3 seed and were on the verge of another NCAA Tournament appearance.

He completed his 25th season as Quinnipiac's men's ice hockey head coach in 2018-19, and earned an historic victory as he picked up the 500th win of his career midway through the season with a 6-0 shutout of Colgate. Pecknold is one of four active Division I men's ice hockey coaches with 500 career wins and is one of 14 all-time at the Division I level.

The 2018-19 season saw the Bobcats earn a share of their fourth Cleary Cup as ECAC Hockey Regular Season Champions with a league-best 14 victories against ECAC Hockey competition. Quinnipiac also returned to the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time in program history, earning a first round victory over Arizona State to reach the Midwest Regional final where the Bobcats faced the Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs.

Several Bobcats earned major individual honors as goaltender Andrew Shortridge was named the ECAC Hockey Goaltender of the Year, CCM/AHCA Second Team All-American, ECAC Hockey First Team and was a finalist for the Mike Richter Award. Chase Priskie was a Top 10 Finalist for the Hobey Baker Award, ECAC Hockey First Team and a finalist for the Senior CLASS Award. Quinnipiac also placed Odeen Tufto on the ECAC Hockey Second Team while all three were named to the New England Hockey Writers' All-New England Teams.

The 2017-18 season featured one of the toughest non-conference schedules in recent memory, as the Bobcats saw #13 Boston College, #2 Boston University, and Northeastern in four of the opening five games of the season. Quinnipiac tied BC on the road, while falling to BU in the home opener, before sweeping a Northeastern team in Boston, Mass, that ended up an NCAA Tournament team and nationally ranked in the top-ten.

Aside from Northeastern, the Bobcats earned victories over two other NCAA Tournament teams, Princeton and Clarkson, and won five of their last seven games in ECAC play, earning the #9 seed in the ECAC Tournament.

As the #9 seed, the Bobcats traveled to Ingalls Rink where they swept their in-state rival, Yale, in the ECAC Tournament Opening Round best-of-three series. Until 2017-18, Pecknold had posted 20 straight non-losing seasons. In addition, Quinnipiac led the nation in total wins from 2013-2017, with 132 victories.

Following the 2017-18 season, Pecknold won a silver medal at the IIHF World Championship as an assistant coach with the 2018 U.S. Men's National Team.

Hired at Quinnipiac on May 5, 1994, Pecknold previously served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Connecticut College, for three seasons under head coach and former NHL player Doug Roberts. A standout for the Camels, Pecknold led Connecticut College to the 1990 ECAC South Championship. As a senior, Pecknold set school season records for goals (17) and points (47) by a defenseman. He earned First-Team All-ECAC South honors and a spot on the Division III All-New England Team. Playing as a forward for two seasons, he led the Camels in goals as a sophomore (19) and junior (23).

An economics major, Pecknold earned his bachelor's degree in 1990 and added a master's degree in education in 1993. A native of Bedford, N.H., Pecknold played scholastically at Lawrence Academy in Groton, Mass. Pecknold, his wife, Nikki, sons Tate and Rex, and daughters, Cecelia and Georgia currently live in Southport, Conn.
