QUINNIPIAC GAME NOTES

Scouting Union

The Dutchmen dropped their most recent matchup to LIU by a 4-1 margin. Sophomore Liam Robertson scored his team-leading 11th goal of the season on the powerplay to extend his point streak to four games. Senior Brandon Estes picked up the primary assist to set a new career high point streak with six games. First-year Collin Graf also added an assist.

All Time vs. the Dutchmen

The Bobcats own a slight advantage over Union in the all-time series and have dominated recent history. Of the 21-17-5 record for QU, the Bobcats are unbeaten in the last four matchups dating back to November 10, 2018.

Scouting RPI

Juniors Zach Dubinsky and TJ Walsh scored to lead the Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI) men's hockey team to a 2-0 victory over Dartmouth College, on Tuesday night at Thompson Arena.

Freshman goaltender Jack Watson earned his third shutout on the season, stopping all 18 shots he faced. He is now one shy of the RPI freshman record of four, set by Nathan Marsters '04 during the 2000-01 season. The blanking is also RPI's first over Dartmouth in Hanover in 50 tries, dating back to 1976.

All Time vs. the Engineers

The Bobcats have dominated the series with RPI, winning 19 times along with 7 losses and 9 ties. Quinnipiac is 8-2-0 in the last 10 contests between the two teams and hasn't lost at home to the Engineers since 2010.

Two is Better Than One

One week after ascending to the top of the national polls, Quinnipiac dropped one spot to number two after last weekend's overtime loss to #8 Cornell.

It was the first time that Quinnipiac has achieved the No. 1 spot in the nation since the 2015-16 season. That season, the Bobcats advanced to the program's second NCAA Frozen Four and the National Championship game.

Mets and Perets

Zach Metsa and Yaniv Perets have been nominated for the 2022 Hobey Baker Award. Metsa and Perets are two of 77 nominees for this year's Hobey Baker Award, and two of 11 from ECAC Hockey. This is the 42nd year of the Hobey Baker Award, presented annual to the top NCAA Division I Men's Ice Hockey player.

Quinnipiac has had three players in its program history named as finalists for the Hobey Baker Award, most recently Odeen Tufto and Keith Petruzzelli, who both reached the Top 10 for last season's award. Chase Priskie '19 was a Top 10 Finalist in 2019 and Reid Cashman '07 was selected as a Top 10 Finalist in 2005 while Eric Hartzell

'13 was Hobey Hat Trick finalist in 2013, reaching the final three.

Own the Dot

Powered by captain Wyatt Bongiovanni, the Bobcats are 2nd the nation (and 1st in ECAC) in faceoff win percentage (.563). Bongiovanni is 21st nationally and third in the ECAC with 265 total faceoffs won.

Captain Clutch

Wyatt Bongiovanni scored his fifth game-winning goal of the season in last week's win over Colgate. The captain is tied for the NCAA lead in GWGs this season.

It was also the 13th GWG of his career, which puts him third in Quinnipiac's D1 history in the category.

The Defense Does Not Rest

Averaging 1.00 goals against per game, Quinnipiac leads the nation in scoring defense. The team's 2.58 scoring margin is good for second in the nation.

Shots, Shots... Not.

QU did not allow a shot on goal until 11:25 into the 2nd period against Vermont. It's the second time ever that the Bobcats have held an opponent without a shot on goal in a period and the longest such stretch to start a game in the program's Division I history. Quinnipiac has allowed 20 or less shots on goal in 18 of 26 games played this season.

Shhhh...

Yaniv Perets broke Michael Garteig's Quinnipiac record for shutouts in a season with his ninth. As a team, the Bobcats have tied the NCAA Division I record for single-season shutouts (Niagara, 12).

Earlier this season, his 247:57 individual shutout streak came to an end on LIU's second period goal. The streak ranks as the 11th-longest streak in NCAA Men's Ice Hockey Division I history and the longest in program history.

Perets In Net

Perets was named ECAC Hockey/MAC Goaltending Goalie of the Month in January, marking the third-straight month that he's earned the award.

He posted three more shutouts in the month of January, including two in ECAC play. He has now lowered his nation-leading GAA to 0.78 and improved his save percentage to .955%.

Chau Does He Do It?

Graduate transfer Oliver Chau recorded two assists against LIU to achieve the 100-point milestone for his career. The 2021 National Champion is tied for the team lead with 26 points in 26 games this season.

He has recorded at least a point in 14 of his last 15 games played.

QUINNIPIAC GAME NOTES

A Touch of CLASS

Wyatt Bongiovanni was named one of 20 candidates for the 2021-22 Senior CLASS Award, as announced on Wednesday, Dec. 8.

Bongiovanni is one of four ECAC Hockey student-athletes nominated for the award, joining Brown's Luke Kania, Union's Josh Kosack, and Dartmouth's Harrison Markell. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as a NCAA Division I senior or graduate student and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. The complete list of candidates follows this release.

Weekly Teej

Senior forward TJ Friedmann was named the ECAC Hockey Player of the Week following Quinnipiac's sweep of LIU. Friedmann recorded a four-point weekend that included two assists in Friday night's road victory and two goals in Saturday's 5-0 rout in Hamden. The senior has already posted career-best numbers in goals, assists, and points, as he currently sits seventh on the team with 16 points on the year (7g, 9a).

de Jong and the Restless

Ethan de Jong recorded his first career hat trick in the win over St. Lawrence. His four-point weekend was enough to earn him ECAC Hockey Player of the Week accolades.

de Jong, currently third on the team lead with 24 points in 26 games this season, was one of the Bobcats' most dominant players in 2020-21 as he tied for first on the team and eighth in the nation with 14 goals while his 29 points were good for 14th in the nation last year. Both were career-highs.

Metsa World Peace

Zach Metsa continues to be among the nation's top defensemen as he currently ranks first in points (26), sixth in assists (19), and first in +/- (+29) of all blue liners in the nation.

All Smiles

Ty Smilanic (Denver, Colorado) was 25 players named to the 2022 U.S. National Junior Team. Despite the 2022 IIHF World Junior Championship being canceled due to COVID-19, Smilanic was able to participate in preliminary camp and experience part of the Team USA journey.

Sky(ler)'s the Limit

Brind'Amour was named the ECAC Hockey Player of the Week for his performance at the Ice Breaker, as announced by the league on Oct. 11. Brind'Amour tallied a goal and an assist to lead the team with two points against BC. Brind'Amour then added another assist in the Bobcats' 2-0 win over No. 18 Northeastern. He also won

8-of-10 faceoffs against the Huskies.

Recently, the junior tallied three points in a 9-0 win over Princeton and two more against Colgate.

Pecknold's Progress

Quinnipiac men's ice hockey head coach Rand Pecknold won his 556th game in the win over Brown, surpassing John MacInnes (Michigan Tech) for 10th-most NCAA wins. Pecknold earned career victory 550 in this season's 3-0 win over No. 18 Northeastern.

He is the 11th coach all-time to hit 550 career wins and the second active NCAA Division I coach to do so.

Preseason Accolades

Senior assistant captains Ethan De Jong and Zach Metsa both earned Preseason All-ECAC Hockey honors as voted on by the league's coaches and announced on September 27. The coaches also selected Quinnipiac men's ice hockey as the number one team in the 2021-22 preseason coaches' poll.

Respect Your Elders

The Bobcats added five graduate transfers to the roster for the 2021-22 season, after only having one previous grad transfers in the history of the program. Dylan St. Cyr (Notre Dame), Griffin Mendel (Denver), Oliver Chau (UMass), Brendan Less (Dartmouth), and Tony Stillwell (Brown) all made their Quinnipiac debuts this season.

I'm The Captain Now

Senior Wyatt Bongiovanni was named the 48th captain in program history, succeeding Odeen Tufto '21 who served as the team captain for the Bobcats in 2020-21. Bongiovanni previously served as an assistant captain for the Bobcats as a junior during Tufto's captaincy.

Cleary Cup Champions

The Bobcats won the Cleary Cup as ECAC Hockey Regular Season Champions for the fifth time in the past nine seasons after going 10-4-4 in league play. Quinnipiac has clinch the Cleary Cup in two of the last three seasons.

All-Rookie Team

First year Ty Smilanic was named to the ECAC Hockey All-Rookie Team after leading the nation with 14 goals. Smilanic was one of the most dominant scorers not just in the league but in the nation. He is Quinnipiac's 10th ECAC Hockey All-Rookie Team selection, and fourth in the last four years. The Bobcats have had 21 All-Rookie Team selections since joining the Division I ranks as members of the MAAC Hockey League followed by Atlantic Hockey.

Quinnipiac in the NCAA Tournament

Quinnipiac reached the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in program history, and sixth time in the past eight tournaments.

Prior to last year, the last time Quinnipiac was in the NCAA Tournament in 2019, the Bobcats defeated Arizona State before falling to eventual national champion Minnesota Duluth in the Midwest Regional Final. Quinnipiac is 7-7 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.

HEAD COACH RAND PECKNOLD



Rand Pecknold enters his 28th season at the helm of the Quinnipiac men's ice hockey program after being hired to the position on May 5, 1994.

To date, Pecknold features a career record of 570-328-100 and currently ranks third among all active NCAA Division I coaches in career victories.

Pecknold guided Quinnipiac to its fifth Cleary Cup in the last nine seasons in the 2020-21 season as the Bobcats cruised to the ECAC Hockey Regular Season Championship. The Bobcats won 17 games in the pandemic-shortened season, the 21st time a Pecknold team has won 17-plus games and Quinnipiac has never finished with fewer than 16 wins in a season since joining ECAC Hockey in 2005-06. The Bobcats reached the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in program history, and sixth time in the past eight seasons a tournament was held.

Pecknold was crowned the ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year for the third time in his career while Odeen Tufto was named the league's player of the year and Keith Petruzzelli earned the goaltender of the year honors. Tufto was also named a CCM/AHCA First Team All-American while both Tufto and Petruzzelli were named Top 10 Finalists for the Hobey Baker Award. Petruzzelli was also a finalist for the Mike Richter Award.

During the 2020-21 season, the Bobcats also placed three players on the ECAC Hockey First Team for the first time in program history in Tufto, Petruzzelli and Zach Metsa.

The Bobcats finished the 2019-20 season with their 18th 20-win season in the Rand Pecknold era, going 21-11-2 before the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Bobcats earned two All-ECAC Hockey selections and were primed to make deep runs in the ECAC Hockey Tournament as the No. 3 seed and were on the verge of another NCAA Tournament appearance.

He completed his 25th season as Quinnipiac's men's ice hockey head coach in 2018-19, and earned an historic victory as he picked up the 500th win of his career midway through the season with a 6-0 shutout of Colgate. Pecknold is one of four active Division I men's ice hockey coaches with 500 career wins and is one of 14 all-time at the Division I level.

The 2018-19 season saw the Bobcats earn a share of their fourth Cleary Cup as ECAC Hockey Regular Season Champions with a league-best 14 victories against ECAC Hockey competition. Quinnipiac also returned to the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time in program history, earning a first round victory over Arizona State to reach the Midwest Regional final where the Bobcats faced the Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs.

Several Bobcats earned major individual honors as goaltender Andrew Shortridge was named the ECAC Hockey Goaltender of the Year, CCM/AHCA Second Team All-American, ECAC Hockey First Team and was a finalist for the Mike Richter Award. Chase Priskie was a Top 10 Finalist for the Hobey Baker Award, ECAC Hockey First Team and a finalist for the Senior CLASS Award. Quinnipiac also placed Odeen Tufto on the ECAC Hockey Second Team while all three were named to the New England Hockey Writers' All-New England Teams.

The 2017-18 season featured one of the toughest non-conference schedules in recent memory, as the Bobcats saw #13 Boston College, #2 Boston University, and Northeastern in four of the opening five games of the season. Quinnipiac tied BC on the road, while falling to BU in the home opener, before sweeping a Northeastern team in Boston, Mass, that ended up an NCAA Tournament team and nationally ranked in the top-ten.

Aside from Northeastern, the Bobcats earned victories over two other NCAA Tournament teams, Princeton and Clarkson, and won five of their last seven games in ECAC play, earning the #9 seed in the ECAC Tournament.

As the #9 seed, the Bobcats traveled to Ingalls Rink where they swept their in-state rival, Yale, in the ECAC Tournament Opening Round best-of-three series. Until 2017-18, Pecknold had posted 20 straight non-losing seasons. In addition, Quinnipiac led the nation in total wins from 2013-2017, with 132 victories.

Following the 2017-18 season, Pecknold won a silver medal at the IIHF World Championship as an assistant coach with the 2018 U.S. Men's National Team.

Hired at Quinnipiac on May 5, 1994, Pecknold previously served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Connecticut College, for three seasons under head coach and former NHL player Doug Roberts. A standout for the Camels, Pecknold led Connecticut College to the 1990 ECAC South Championship. As a senior, Pecknold set school season records for goals (17) and points (47) by a defenseman. He earned First-Team All-ECAC South honors and a spot on the Division III All-New England Team. Playing as a forward for two seasons, he led the Camels in goals as a sophomore (19) and junior (23).

An economics major, Pecknold earned his bachelor's degree in 1990 and added a master's degree in education in 1993. A native of Bedford, N.H., Pecknold played scholastically at Lawrence Academy in Groton, Mass. Pecknold, his wife, Nikki, sons Tate and Rex, and daughters, Cecelia and Georgia currently live in Southport, Conn.

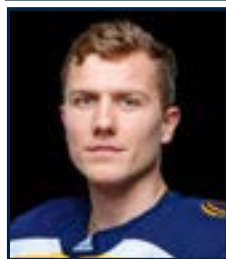
