- The 2nd-seeded Quinnipiac Bobcats continue their postseason run after defeating #3 St. Cloud State, 5-4, on Friday night. The Bobcats advanced to the program's fourth Regional Final since 2012-13 where the team is 2-1 overall.
- Quinnipiac saw multiple team members win major ECAC Hockey awards Yaniv Perets (Goalie and Player of the Year), Zach Metsa (Best Defensive Defenseman), and head coach Rand Pecknold, who was named Tim Taylor ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year for the second straight season. He recently won the 200th ECAC game of his career.
- Perets was also named to the Hobey Baker Top 10 list after posting the best statistical regular season in ECAC history.
- Quinnipiac won its second-straight Cleary Cup and 6th in 10 seasons. Only one other ECAC program (Harvard) has won as many Cleary Cups in a 10-year span.

# QUINNIPIAC GAME NOTES

## Quinnipiac in the NCAA Tournament

Quinnipiac reached the NCAA Tournament for the eighth time in program history, and seventh time in the past nine tournaments. Prior to last year, the last time Quinnipiac was in the NCAA Tournament in 2019, the Bobcats defeated Arizona State before falling to eventual national champion Minnesota Duluth in the Allentown Regional Final. Quinnipiac is 8-7 all-time in the NCAA Tournament and 2-1 in Regional Finals.

## Cleary Cup Champions

The Bobcats won the Cleary Cup as ECAC Hockey Regular Season Champions for the sixth time in the past 10 seasons after going 17-4-1 in league play. Only one other team (Harvard) has won as many Cleary Cups in any 10-year span in league history.

## G.Rand Pecknold

Quinnipiac men's ice hockey head coach Rand Pecknold was named Tim Taylor ECAC Coach of the Year for the second year in a row.

He recently coached his 1,000th career game, becoming the 19th coach in DI history to achieve the milestone. He won his 556th game in this season's first win over Brown, surpassing John MacInnes (Michigan Tech) for 10th-most NCAA wins. Pecknold earned career victory 550 in this season's 3-0 win over No. 18 Northeastern.

He is the 11th coach all-time to hit 550 career wins and the second active NCAA Division I coach to do so.

## First Of All

Quinnipiac senior Zach Metsa has repeated as an All-ECAC Hockey First Team selection and is joined this season by teammate Yaniv Perets, as announced by the league office last week.

Quinnipiac has now had 12 First Team All-ECAC Hockey picks in program history and 41 players named to All-ECAC Hockey Teams since the Bobcats joined the conference for the 2005-06 season.

## Griff Gets It Done

Graduate student Griffin Mendel has thrived during his season at Quinnipiac, but more specifically in the postseason. The Denver transfer has eight postseason points in 5 games after posting no more than 9 points total in any of his previous four seasons.

## Metsa World Peace

Metsa, who was also selected to the First Team last season, led a defensive unit that put together one of the best seasons in the history of NCAA Hockey, smashing the single-season shutout record with 16 blank sheets as a team. Metsa and the Bobcats lead both the league and the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 1.1 goals per game in 2021-22. The senior has blocked

28 shots, and leads the team with 36 points, 16 of which came in league play.

Metsa has ranked inside the top 3 in the nation all season long in points, assists, and plus/minus amongst defenseman and currently leads the nation in plus/minus rating (+38).

## Perets In Net

Earlier this month, Perets was ECAC Hockey's Ken Dryden Goaltender of the Year and the league's Player of the Year, becoming the 11th goalie in league history to win both awards.

The net minder also landed on the Hobey Baker Top 10 list and earned his fourth-consecutive ECAC Hockey MAC Goaltending Goalie of the Month award after wrapping up the best statistical season in league history.

Perets is the sixth Quinnipiac player to be named a finalist for the Hobey, joining Odeen Tufto '21 and Keith Petruzzelli '21 last season, Chase Priskie '19 in 2018-19, Eric Hartzell '13 in 2012-13, and Reid Cashman '07 in the 2004-05 season.

One of the best goaltenders in not only the league, but the nation, Perets led all of NCAA hockey this regular season in save percentage (.955), GAA (0.82), and shutouts (11). He also eclipsed ECAC Hockey league-only records in all of these categories, putting together one of the best goaltending seasons in the history of the league. Perets was a huge part of a Bobcat team that finished the season 17-4-1 in league play, earning the Cleary Cup and top seed in the post-season tournament.

## Shhhh...

Yaniv Perets has broken Michael Garteig's Quinnipiac record for shutouts (8) in a season with 11 thus far. As a team, the Bobcats set a new NCAA Division I record for single-season shutouts with 16.

Earlier this season, his 247:57 individual shutout streak came to an end on LIU's second period goal. The streak ranks as the 11th-longest streak in NCAA Men's Ice Hockey Division I history and the longest in program history.

In league play this season, Perets went 369 consecutive minutes without allowing a goal, setting the ECAC record for longest streak.

## A Little Thirty Told Me

The win over SLU was Quinnipiac's 30th of the season, marking the program's third 30th-win season in the last 10 years. Quinnipiac becomes the only program in league history to compile three 30+ win seasons. The win over St. Cloud tied the program record for wins in a season (32).

## Chau Does He Do It?

Graduate transfer Oliver Chau recorded two assists against LIU to achieve the 100-point milestone for his career. The 2021 National Champion is second on the team with 33 points in 41 games this season.

## He Was Number One

Earlier this season, the Bobcats ascended to the top of the national polls. It was the first time that Quinnipiac has achieved the No. 1 spot in the nation since the 2015-16 season. That season, the Bobcats advanced to the program's second NCAA Frozen Four and the National Championship game.

## Own the Dot

Powered by captain Wyatt Bongiovanni, the Bobcats are 2nd the nation (and 1st in ECAC) in faceoff win percentage (.576). Bongiovanni is sixth nationally and first in the ECAC with 451 total faceoffs won.

## Captain Clutch

Bongiovanni, a 2022 All-ECAC Third Team selection, scored his fifth game-winning goal of the season in a win over Colgate. The captain is third in the NCAA in GWGs this season and is third in Quinnipiac's DI history in the category (13).

He entered finished the regular season fifth in the ECAC in goals and sixth in total points. He was also selected as a finalist for the Senior CLASS Award.

He is also the fourth men's ice hockey player in program history to be named a finalist for the Senior Class Award, joining Jean-Marc Beaudoin '10, Chase Priskie '19, and Odeen Tufto '21. All three finished as Senior CLASS Award Second Team All-Americans.

## The Defense Does Not Rest

Averaging 1.12 goal against per game, Quinnipiac leads the nation in scoring defense. The team's 2.17 scoring margin is good for second in the nation.

## Shots, Shots... Not.

QU did not allow a shot on goal until 11:25 into the 2nd period against Vermont. It's the second time ever that the Bobcats have held an opponent without a shot on goal in a period and the longest such stretch to start a game in the program's Division I history.

## Weekly Teej

Senior forward TJ Friedmann was named the ECAC Hockey Player of the Week following Quinnipiac's sweep of LIU. Friedmann recorded a four-point weekend that included two assists in Friday night's road victory and two goals in Saturday's 5-0 rout in Hamden. The senior has posted career-best numbers in goals, assists, and points, as he currently sits sixth on the team with 23 points on the year (10g, 13a).

## de Jong and the Restless

Ethan de Jong was named a finalist for the ECAC's Best Defensive Forward award.

De Jong, one of the nation's best penalty killers, was sixth in the league with a +24 rating. He trailed five teammates in the category that was dominated by Quinnipiac with ten players in the top ten. The senior is fourth on the team with 31 points (11 goals, 20 assists) and is recently joined the program's 100-point club.

## Preseason Accolades

Senior assistant captains Ethan De Jong and Zach Metsa both earned Preseason All-ECAC Hockey honors as voted on by the league's coaches and announced on September 27. The coaches also selected Quinnipiac men's ice hockey as the number one team in the 2021-22 preseason coaches' poll.

## I'm The Captain Now

Senior Wyatt Bongiovanni was named the 48th captain in program history, succeeding Odeen Tufto '21 who served as the team captain for the Bobcats in 2020-21. Bongiovanni previously served as an assistant captain for the Bobcats as a junior during Tufto's captaincy.

# HEAD COACH RAND PECKNOLD



Rand Pecknold enters his 28th season at the helm of the Quinnipiac men's ice hockey program after being hired to the position on May 5, 1994.

To date, Pecknold features a career record of 581-332-100 and currently ranks third among all active NCAA Division I coaches in career victories.

Pecknold guided Quinnipiac to its fifth Cleary Cup in the last nine seasons in the 2020-21 season as the Bobcats cruised to the ECAC Hockey Regular Season Championship. The Bobcats won 17 games in the pandemic-shortened season, the 21st time a Pecknold team has won 17-plus games and Quinnipiac has never finished with fewer than 16 wins in a season since joining ECAC Hockey in 2005-06. The Bobcats reached the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in program history, and sixth time in the past eight seasons a tournament was held.

Pecknold was crowned the ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year for the third time in his career while Odeen Tufto was named the league's player of the year and Keith Petruzzelli earned the goaltender of the year honors. Tufto was also named a CCM/AHCA First Team All-American while both Tufto and Petruzzelli were named Top 10 Finalists for the Hobey Baker Award. Petruzzelli was also a finalist for the Mike Richter Award.

During the 2020-21 season, the Bobcats also placed three players on the ECAC Hockey First Team for the first time in program history in Tufto, Petruzzelli and Zach Metsa.

The Bobcats finished the 2019-20 season with their 18th 20-win season in the Rand Pecknold era, going 21-11-2 before the season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Bobcats earned two All-ECAC Hockey selections and were primed to make deep runs in the ECAC Hockey Tournament as the No. 3 seed and were on the verge of another NCAA Tournament appearance.

He completed his 25th season as Quinnipiac's men's ice hockey head coach in 2018-19, and earned an historic victory as he picked up the 500th win of his career midway through the season with a 6-0 shutout of Colgate. Pecknold is one of four active Division I men's ice hockey coaches with 500 career wins and is one of 14 all-time at the Division I level.

The 2018-19 season saw the Bobcats earn a share of their fourth Cleary Cup as ECAC Hockey Regular Season Champions with a league-best 14 victories against ECAC Hockey competition. Quinnipiac also returned to the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time in program history, earning a first round victory over Arizona State to reach the Midwest Regional final where the Bobcats faced the Minnesota Duluth Bulldogs.

Several Bobcats earned major individual honors as goaltender Andrew Shortridge was named the ECAC Hockey Goaltender of the Year, CCM/AHCA Second Team All-American, ECAC Hockey First Team and was a finalist for the Mike Richter Award. Chase Priskie was a Top 10 Finalist for the Hobey Baker Award, ECAC Hockey First Team and a finalist for the Senior CLASS Award. Quinnipiac also placed Odeen Tufto on the ECAC Hockey Second Team while all three were named to the New England Hockey Writers' All-New England Teams.

The 2017-18 season featured one of the toughest non-conference schedules in recent memory, as the Bobcats saw #13 Boston College, #2 Boston University, and Northeastern in four of the opening five games of the season. Quinnipiac tied BC on the road, while falling to BU in the home opener, before sweeping a Northeastern team in Boston, Mass, that ended up an NCAA Tournament team and nationally ranked in the top-ten.

Aside from Northeastern, the Bobcats earned victories over two other NCAA Tournament teams, Princeton and Clarkson, and won five of their last seven games in ECAC play, earning the #9 seed in the ECAC Tournament.

As the #9 seed, the Bobcats traveled to Ingalls Rink where they swept their in-state rival, Yale, in the ECAC Tournament Opening Round best-of-three series. Until 2017-18, Pecknold had posted 20 straight non-losing seasons. In addition, Quinnipiac led the nation in total wins from 2013-2017, with 132 victories.

Following the 2017-18 season, Pecknold won a silver medal at the IIHF World Championship as an assistant coach with the 2018 U.S. Men's National Team.

Hired at Quinnipiac on May 5, 1994, Pecknold previously served as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Connecticut College, for three seasons under head coach and former NHL player Doug Roberts. A standout for the Camels, Pecknold led Connecticut College to the 1990 ECAC South Championship. As a senior, Pecknold set school season records for goals (17) and points (47) by a defenseman. He earned First-Team All-ECAC South honors and a spot on the Division III All-New England Team. Playing as a forward for two seasons, he led the Camels in goals as a sophomore (19) and junior (23).

An economics major, Pecknold earned his bachelor's degree in 1990 and added a master's degree in education in 1993. A native of Bedford, N.H., Pecknold played scholastically at Lawrence Academy in Groton, Mass. Pecknold, his wife, Nikki, sons Tate and Rex, and daughters, Cecelia and Georgia currently live in Southport, Conn.

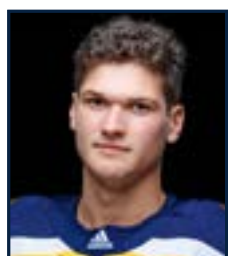

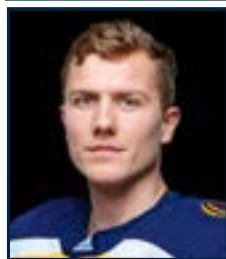
