Ramapo College of NJ



Ranked by U.S. News & World Report as number one among public comprehensive colleges in the north, Ramapo College of New Jersey is sometimes mistaken for a private college. This in part, is due to its unique interdisciplinary academic structure, its size of approximately 5,600 students, and its pastoral setting in the foothills of the Ramapo Mountains on the New Jersey/New York border.

Established in 1969, Ramapo College offers bachelor's degrees in the arts, business, humanities, social sciences and the sciences, as well as in professional studies, which include nursing and social work. In addition, Ramapo College offers courses leading to teacher certification at the elementary and secondary levels. The College also offers three graduate programs as well as joint degree programs with the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey and New York Chiropractic College.

Undergraduate students choose to concentrate their studies in one of five schools with more than 700 course offerings and 40 academic programs. Ramapo College boasts an average student/faculty ratio of 17:1 and average class size of 23, affording students the opportunity to develop close ties to the College's exceptional faculty.

The College's mission is focused on the four "pillars" of a Ramapo education: international, intercultural, interdisciplinary and experiential, all of which are incorporated throughout the curriculum and extracurriculum. The international mission is further accomplished through a wide range of study abroad and student exchange links with institutions all over the world through the New Jersey State Consortium for International Studies (NJSCIS). Additional experiential programs include internships, co-op, and service learning.

A campus-wide building program during recent years has resulted in the completion of the Bill Bradley Sports and Recreation Center, with its 2,200-seat arena, fitness center, rock climbing wall, indoor track and dance/aerobics studio; the Overlook residence hall, the Village apartment complex and Laurel Hall, a 435-bed, suite-style residence hall. The Angelica and Russ Berrie Center for Performing and Visual Arts houses performance theaters, art galleries, and specialized spaces devoted to fine arts, computer art, photography, theater, dance, and music. Currently under construction, the Anisfield School of Business academic facility will be a central feature of the main entrance to the campus.

In addition to Ramapo's ranking in U.S. News, an article in the February 2006 issue of Kiplinger's magazine named Ramapo College among the top 100 public colleges and universities. The article, "Best values in public colleges," included the sub-head, "Yes, you can still get a first-class education at a reasonable price." Ramapo College also is one of 222 select colleges and universities profiled by The Princeton Review in the 2007 edition of The Best Northeastern Colleges.

Dr. Peter Philip Mercer became the College's fourth president on July 1, 2005. The College is governed by a Board of Trustees who are appointed by the Governor of the State. Thomas Zelante, Esq. is the chairman of the board.

2006 Season Review

5-2 OVERALL

The Ramapo College men's tennis team finished their 2006 season 5-2 overall. Ramapo opened the year at home facing Muhlenberg College falling short, 3-4 before going on a two-match win streak first defeating Bard College, 6-1. They followed with a 4-3 victory over Rutgers Newark. The team traveled to FDU Florham falling short 2-5 on April 20th before wrapping up the season with three straight victories including a 4-3 win over Baruch, a 6-1 win over John Jay, and a 7-0 victory over the College of Staten Island.

Individually, sophomore Jared Rochman led the way in singles action going undefeated at 7-0 while Scott Seaman followed with a 5-2 singles record overall. Keith Drobin went 4-1 and Joseph Marino posted a 3-1 singles record of his own. Paul Jones and Adam Toth also posted 3-1 records in singles action while Greg Kohr and Ross Switkes posted two wins and three losses and two wins and four losses respectively.

In doubles action, Jones went undefeated at 6-0 while Rochman posted six wins and only one loss. Seaman went 3-4 in doubles match-ups and Kohr finished at .500 with two wins and two losses. Switkes finished the year at 2-4 along with Andrew Godzwon while Toth went 1-1 and Dobrin, 1-0. Marino wrapped up the year finishing 1-2 in doubles action.
