Ranked by U.S. News & World Report as fourth in the Best Regional Universities, North category, Ramapo College of New Jersey is sometimes mistaken for a private college. This is, in part, due to its unique interdisciplinary academic structure, its size of approximately 5,660 students and its pastoral setting in the foothills of the Ramapo Mountains on the New Jersey/New York border.

Established in 1969, Ramapo College offers bachelor's degrees in the arts, business, humanities, social sciences and the sciences, as well as in professional studies, which include nursing and social work. In addition, Ramapo College offers courses leading to teacher certification at the elementary and secondary levels. The College also offers four graduate programs as well as articulated programs with the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey, New York Chiropractic College, New York University College of Dentistry, SUNY State College of Optometry and New York College of Podiatric Medicine.

Undergraduate students choose to concentrate their studies in one of five schools with more than 700 course offerings and 40 academic programs. Ramapo College boasts an average student/faculty ratio of 18:1 and average class size of 23, affording students the opportunity to develop close ties to the College's exceptional faculty.

The College's mission is focused on the four "pillars" of a Ramapo education: international, intercultural, interdisciplinary and experiential, all of which are incorporated throughout the curriculum and extracurriculum. The international mission is further accomplished through a wide range of study abroad and student exchange links with institutions all over the world through the New Jersey State Consortium for International Studies (NJSCIS). Additional experiential programs include internships, co-op and service learning.

A campus-wide building program during recent years has resulted in the completion of the Anisfield School of Business academic facility, a central feature of the main entrance to the campus; the Bill Bradley Sports and Recreation Center, with its 2,200-seat arena, fitness center, climbing wall, track and dance/aerobics studio; the Overlook and Laurel residence halls and the Village apartment complex. The Angelica and Russ Berrie Center for Performing and Visual Arts, completed in 1999, houses performance theaters, art galleries and specialized spaces devoted to fine arts, computer art, photography, theater, dance and music. The Sharp Sustainability Education Center and the Salameno Spiritual Center were completed in 2009.

Ramapo College of New Jersey is listed in the February 2010 issue of Kiplinger's Personal Finance Magazine as among the "100 Best Values in Public Colleges" for 2009. This is the fifth consecutive year Ramapo has been included in the "100 Best Values in Public Colleges." The college was ranked #49 in the country, and as one of three colleges in New Jersey in the Top 100.

Ramapo College also is one of 218 institutions recommended by The Princeton Review in the "Best in the Northeast" section in the 2011 edition of The Best Northeastern Colleges.

Dr. Peter Philip Mercer became the College's fourth president on July 1, 2005. The College is governed by a Board of Trustees who are appointed by the Governor of the State. The chairman of the board is A. J. Sabath '93.



Head Coach



Arnie Ramirez



Now entering his 40th year coaching as he started as an assistant at LIU in 1978. He enters his 38th year as a head coach and 12th season at the helm of the Roadrunner program, Coach Ramirez celebrated his 300th career win in 2004 while leading the Roadrunners to an 11-0 victory over Medgar Evers College.

Coach Ramirez has 340 career victories coming into the 2010 season and has 81 wins at Ramapo. He has led the Roadrunners to three ECAC Championship appearances (2000 and 2005) the latest coming in 2007 where they made it to the semifinals.

Coach Ramirez's record speaks for itself. Prior to his coaching post at Ramapo College, he was the Head Men's Coach at Long Island University. During his tenure at L.I.U., Coach Ramirez was the winningest coach in the university's 75-year soccer history. He led the Blackbirds to nine post-season tournament bids including four NCAA Tournament appearances; two New York Region Championships; two ECAC Tournament appearances (with the title in 1979); four Metropolitan Conference Championships; consecutive ECAC Metro Conference flags and the Northeast Conference Championship in 1985, 1986, 1989 and 1997. He trained former US national team captain and current youth director for the USSF, Claudio Reyna and Gregg Berhalter now with the Los Angeles Galaxy. He also coached Giovanni Savarese at LIU. Coach Ramirez was inducted into the L.I.U Hall of Fame in February of 2006. A United States Soccer Federation A-license holder, Coach Ramirez has developed a total of nine All-Americans, was named Coach of the Year in the Metropolitan Conference three times and was selected Coach of the Year by his peers in the New York Region in 1985. A former staff coach for the Eastern New York coaching staff, Coach Ramirez is credited with being the first coach to offer bi-lingual D-license coaching courses.

Recognized as an ambassador to the world's most popular sport, Coach Ramirez has been called upon several times throughout his successful career to serve in different roles internationally. He was the Technical Director of the Puerto Rican National Team, liaison for the Bolivian National Team at World Cup '94 and liaison for the Mexican National Team at the '96 Olympic Games in Atlanta, GA. In 1993, Coach Ramirez was invited by Pele, his friend of over 30 years, and former New York Cosmos Coach Professor Julio Mazzei, to accompany them to Japan to give instructional clinics to Japanese youngsters during a visit extended to them by the Japan World Cup 2002 bidding committee. The trio returned to Japan in 1996 to give more clinics. Coach Ramirez has also traveled to Europe, Africa, South America, and Bermuda to conduct clinics.

Among other international career highlights, Coach Ramirez was honored by former Bolivian President, the late Hugo Banzer, for being the first coach to bring players from the acclaimed Tahuichi Soccer Academy to America. On January 2, 1999, Coach Ramirez was bestowed with the highest honor granted by the late Tahuichi President, Rolly Aguilera for his commitment and dedication to the academy and its players.

At home, Coach Ramirez has devoted his career to promoting soccer from the youth level to the college and professional levels. He has coached youth teams sponsored by the Bergen Kickers, in Union City, NJ and Clarkstown, NY, where he trained former U.S. National Team Captain and current Red Bulls star, Claudio Reyna and his National Team teammate Greg Berhalter. Coach Ramirez also served as the Director of the Pele Soccer Camps from 1978 to 1982. In 1996, he was one of eight coaches commissioned to participate in the MLS Combine to evaluate and select players for the new professional league. A U.S. Army Veteran, Ramirez played for the 24th Infantry and for Schwaben Augsburg of the German Regional League from 1964-66.

Coach Ramirez graduated from Long Island University in 1970 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education and in 1974 he earned his Master's degree in Health Education from City College. For the past nine years he taught adapted physical education at (PS 811M) the Mickey Mantle School in Manhattan, NY, he retired from teaching in the NYC Board of Ed in 2009.

He and his wife of 43 years Julia, reside in Manhattan.



Assistant Coach



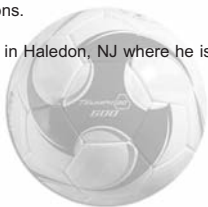
Dany Estupinan

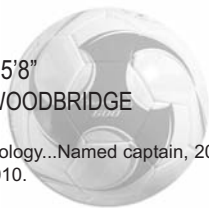

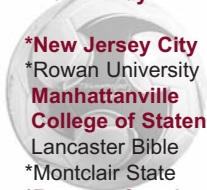

NJAC Philosophy



The New Jersey Athletic Conference was founded in 1985 when the New Jersey State Athletic Conference, a men's sports conference, merged with their corresponding institutions in the Jersey Athletic Conference, a women's sports conference. The ten founding member institutions were Kean College (now University), Montclair State College (now University), Jersey City State College (now New Jersey City University), Glassboro State College (now Rowan University), Ramapo College of New Jersey, Rutgers University-Camden, Rutgers University-Newark, Stockton State College (now The Richard Stockton College of New Jersey), Trenton State College (now The College of New Jersey), and William Paterson College (now University).

While meeting as a joint body to vote on broader policy and procedure matters, the conference continued to operate with separate legislative divisions governing men's and women's sports. Throughout its evolution, the conference has been guided by the following operating principles:

- *To legislate through by-laws, policies, procedures, and ethical guidelines the administration of the intercollegiate athletic programs of conference members.
- *To promote intercollegiate athletics as an integral part of the total education program.
- *To protect the welfare of the student-athlete.
- *To foster and uphold the highest standards of athletic competition and academic integrity.
- *To support the principles and practices of Title IX and gender equity.
- *To encourage allied membership in appropriate state, regional and national organizations.
- *To cooperate with other amateur athletic organizations in promoting intercollegiate athletics.

Championships were originally offered in twelve sports: men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, women's volleyball, men's golf, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's swimming and diving, wrestling, and football. Today, the NJAC hosts seventeen championships: ten for women (cross country, basketball, field hockey, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, volleyball) and seven for men (cross country, baseball, basketball, football, soccer, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field). The conference ranks as one of the strongest in NCAA Division III, with member schools capturing forty national championships over the past sixteen years, and numerous final and semifinal round appearances. More than 550 NJAC student-athletes have received All-America honors. In 1999-2000, two NJAC members The College of New Jersey and Rowan University, scored in the top ten of the prestigious Sears Cup ranking.

In 1999, the New Jersey Athletic Conference added three new chapters to its history. In May, it hired its first commissioner. In September, the conference amended its constitution to allow affiliate members on a sport-by-sport basis and accepted the State University of New York at Cortland as its first affiliate member for the sport of football. And in October, it revised its constitution and bylaws to merge the men's and women's sports divisions into a single decision-making body; to create committees which more directly address the needs and interests of the student-athletes and faculty athletic representatives; and to strengthen the partnership between the office of the president and the department of athletics on each of our member campuses.
