**Stacy Francis**  
Sixth Season  
TCU '98

**S**tacy Francis begins her sixth season as head coach of the Lady Rams basketball team. Under Francis' guidance the team has seen steady improvement since 2001. From the 2001-02 season to the 2003-04 season, the Rams made an 18 game improvement, going from 1-24 to 22-9.

In her second season at Texas Wesleyan, Francis led the Lady Rams to an 11-19 record, which was a 7.5 game turnaround from her first year. That marks the second biggest turnaround in school history. In the 2003-04 season, the Lady Rams turned in the largest improvement in school history, by gaining 10.5 games on the season before, going 22-9.

The 2004-05 season saw the Lady Rams make a little history. Texas Wesleyan finished second in the RRAC and made its first appearance in the NAIA National Tournament. Their 23 wins also marked the second highest total in school history.

In 2005-06, Francis led the team to its third consecutive season with at least 15 wins. The Lady Rams' 60 wins between 2003-06 are the most in a three-year span since 1983-86 when

the program too 67 wins.

A three-sport star at Austin's Sidney Lanier High School, Stacy was named first-team all-district in basketball, softball and track in her sophomore through senior years. Francis shot 60 percent from the field during her three-year career. She was district champion in the long jump in her senior season. Francis was also named to the district all-academic team for three straight years. In addition, she was named Who's Who Among American High School Students following her senior year.

After her high school graduation, she accepted a basketball scholarship to TCU, where, following a red-shirt season, she was a four-year starter. She started 101 of 108 games for the Lady Horned Frogs during her four-year tenure. Francis is fourth on the school's all-time rebounding list with 637 boards and ninth all-time in games played with 108. She is also tenth in career free-throws made with 178, and eighth in free-throws attempted with 290. Stacy received her Bachelor of Science degree in psychology in 1998. She also received her Masters in Education from Texas Wesleyan in December of 2004.

Prior to joining Texas Wesleyan, Francis taught social studies and coached volleyball, basketball, and track at Fort Worth's Meadowbrook Middle School. She lives in Arlington, TX.

She is the daughter of Barbara Price and Michael Gay. She has two brothers, Demarcus and Michael Jr., and one sister, LaShonda.



**Nishia Hobbs**  
Assistant Coach  
Second Season

**N**ishia Hobbs is entering her second season as an assistant coach at Texas Wesleyan.

A graduate of Everman High School in Everman, TX, Hobbs went on to play two seasons at Southwestern Christian College and two seasons at Texas College. She was named All-Conference as well as team MVP and captain in her freshman season at Southwestern Christian. She was named co-MVP in her senior year at Texas College.

Hobbs has had previous coaching experience at Murray State College (OK) where she served as an assistant coach during the 2002-03 season. She also coached at Coldsprings High School (TX) where she served as head volleyball and tennis coach as well as assistant basketball and track coach while teaching physical education.

Hobbs received her associates degree from Southwestern Christian in 2000 and her B.S. in physical education in 2002. She currently resides in Fort Worth, TX, with her daughter Lailyn Walker.

## LADY RAMS READY TO RETURN TO NATIONAL SCENE

The Texas Wesleyan University women's basketball team has strung together three consecutive seasons with 15 or more wins. Under Stacy Francis' guidance they have won 20 or more in two of the last three seasons. The 2006-07 Lady Rams are looking to return to their 2004-05 form, when they went 23-11 and advanced to the national tournament.

This season, the Rams feel they have the right mix of veteran leadership and incoming talent to make a push to the national tournament.

Nastassia Brown will be a major part of that effort. Brown, a 5-9 Sr., is back after a red shirt season. In 2004-05 she helped lead the team to its first NAIA National Tournament, ranking second on the squad with 10.4 points per game.

Pilar Pinkus will add veteran leadership to the team. Pinkus saw action in 28 games last season and reached double-figures in scoring nine times. She scored a career-high 18 points in a 71-58 win over Jarvis Christian. Sheleatha Simmons will also be looked to for leadership on the floor. Simmons is just a sophomore; however, she made 24 starts and played in every game last season. Simmons had her best game against Hardin-

Simmons when she scored a season-high 12 points and brought down five rebounds.

Coach Francis has brought in a talented recruiting class of eleven student-athletes, including seven junior college transfers. The recruiting class is highlighted by a pair of scoring threats in Kim Gatlin and DeLesa Williams and an inside presence in Keegan Harry.

Gatlin is a 5-6 guard out of Beaumont, TX. She was a four-time All-District selection for Jessica White at West Brook High School. Williams, a guard from Waco, TX, was a three-time All-District performer at University High School. Harry is a transfer-student from Hill College where she averaged ten points and eight rebounds per game as a sophomore.

With a wealth of talent added to a core of proven veteran leadership, the Lady Rams look prepared to make another push toward the 2007 NAIA Women's Basketball Division I National Tournament.

**CLIMBING THE LADDER:** Stacy Francis is on pace to climb to second on the school's All-Time Wins list this season. Francis' 72 career wins is just 13 shy of Kris Shelton's 85 wins.

**A LONG WAY FROM HOME:** Junior transfer Christina Haywood's hometown of Anchorage, Alaska, is 3,015 miles from Fort Worth. Milica Rogic's hometown of Belgrade, Serbia is a whopping 5,826 miles as the crow flies.

**CONTINUED EXCELLENCE:** The Lady Rams' 60 wins in the last three seasons is the most in a three-year span since 1983-86 when the program took 67 wins.

**HILL COLLEGE CONNECTION:** The Lady Rams' Roster contains three players out of Hill College. Shawntay Anglin, Milica Rogic, and Keegan Harry all attended Hill last year.







## Sid W. Richardson Center


The Sid W. Richardson Center was built in 1970 and has been the home of Ram basketball and volleyball ever since. The gymnasium holds 1,500 seats for both basketball and volleyball games.

The Sid W. Richardson Center has played host to NAIA regional championships, TAPPS regional high school championships, basketball camps, national and state table tennis championships, cheerleading camps and competitions, all-university picnics, multiple student activity programs and body building contests over the years. A true multipurpose facility, the center also hosts exercise and sports studies classes, intramurals and recreational activities.

The sports medicine team is headed by James Bothwell, MD (Team Medical Director and Orthopedist), Michelle Kirk, MD (Family Practice), Marian Zinnante, MD (OB/GYN), Bonnie Ahrens, PA (Orthopedist), and Paige Cook LVN. The Wesleyan Athletic Training Service Program provides numerous opportunities for on campus clinical experience of Athletic Training Students.



The Sid W. Richardson Gymnasium



# Texas Wesleyan Athletics History



## Women's Basketball

The women's basketball team advanced to the national tournament in 2005. It was the program's first appearance in the national tournament. The Lady Rams have won 15 or more games in three consecutive seasons.

**The Texas Wesleyan athletic department has been competing in intercollegiate sports for almost a century. Here is a look at some of the highlights the Rams have enjoyed in every sport since 1908:**

**Men's Soccer:** The men's soccer team has advanced to the postseason the last three seasons, winning their first Red River Championship and advancing to the Region VI tournament for the first time last season.  
-Ram Soccer also has the third most goals scored in one game in NAIA history, scoring 26 goals in 2003 against Dallas Christian.

**Women's Soccer:** The women's soccer team qualified for the postseason for the fourth consecutive season, and also won its first Red River Championship in 2005.  
-Jessica Carrion was named 1st-team All-Conference in all four seasons with the Lady Rams. She graduated with six Texas Wesleyan redcards holding the single game, season, and career records in goals and points.

**Volleyball:** The volleyball team advanced to the "Elite 8" of the national tournament in 2004 and 2005. The Lady Rams have made eight trips to nationals and finished as high as second in 1982 and 1990.  
-In 2005, the Lady Rams set school records by winning 58 consecutive games and 30 consecutive matches.



## **Golf**

The men's golf team has enjoyed a rich history, winning six national titles and finishing in the Top-3 22 times. The program has produced 63 All-America selections and nine NAIA medalists. The Rams have also finished in the Top-10 of the NAIA National Tournament in 45 of their 52 tournament appearances.

**Men's Basketball:** The men's basketball team made history last season by winning their first National Championship. They also became the lowest seed (27th) ever to win the NAIA National Tournament when Ben Hunt hit a three with 0.2 seconds remaining to deliver a 67-65 win over Oklahoma City.

-The Rams have produced 13 All-Americans, one of which was Clifton McNeely, who led the entire nation in scoring in 1947.

**Women's Basketball:** The women's basketball team advanced to their first-ever NAIA National Championship in 2005.

-The Lady Rams have enjoyed three consecutive seasons with 15 or more wins.

**Golf:** The men's golf team has won six national titles (more than any other NAIA institution) and have finished in the Top-3 22 times.

-The Rams have produced 63 All-America selections and nine individuals have won medalists honors at the NAIA National Championship.

**Baseball:** The baseball team has amassed over 1,000 victories in its 36-year history and have had 36 players drafted by the major leagues.

Former Ram Jeff Moronko saw time in the majors with the Cleveland Indians.

-The Rams have put together consecutive 30-win seasons for the first time since 1984, and they are led by head coach Mike Jeffcoat, a former major league pitcher with the Texas Rangers.

**Softball:** The softball team has qualified for the postseason the last four seasons and advanced to the national tournament in 1984.  
-Lady Ram head coach Shannon Gower led the 2005 team to a 28-25 record in her first season marking the team's first winning record in three years.  
-In 2006 the Lady Rams hit a school record and then an NAIA record 66 home runs.

## Men's Basketball

The men's basketball team won its first national championship last season when Ben Hunt hit "the shot heard 'round the world" with 0.2 seconds remaining to deliver a 67-65 win over Oklahoma City University.



## **Volleyball**

The 2005 Wesleyan volleyball team reached the "Elite 8" of the NAIA National Championship for the second consecutive season. The Lady Rams went 16-0 in conference play and won 58 consecutive games.



**The Texas Wesleyan athletics program has also enjoyed success in other sports that are now defunct:**

-The Texas Wesleyan football team won two conference titles in their eight seasons in the 1930s.  
-The Texas Wesleyan men's and women's tennis teams have won four conference titles in their history and the men's team has qualified for the NAIA National Tournament four times.

## History

Texas Wesleyan University was founded in 1890 by the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, as Polytechnic College, and built on a forty-two acre tract of land donated by A.S. Hall, W.D. Hall and George Tandy. Classes began in 1891. A faculty of 10 taught a student enrollment of 110 that first year.

In 1934, male students were admitted and the college took the name of Texas Wesleyan College. This marked a new era for the University's stability and future growth.

On January 9, 1989, the name was officially changed to Texas Wesleyan University in recognition of the University's outstanding graduate programs in Education and Health Science. The 1990-91 academic year marked the celebration of a century of service in higher education.
