NEWS & NOTES

- » The St. John's women's basketball team will begin postseason play on Friday, taking on Xavier in the opening game of the BIG EAST Tournament at Mohegan Sun Arena.
- » Tip-off between the Red Storm and the Musketeers is set for 11 a.m. and will be streamed live on the BIG EAST Digital Network with announcers Pat O'Keefe, Kim Adams and sideline reporter Meghan Caffrey.
- » After serving as the engine behind the Red Storm's offense this season, Leilani Correa was named to the All-BIG EAST First Team.
- » The sophomore guard became the 18th player in St. John's history and the eighth under the direction of Head Coach Joe Tartamella to be named to the league's top team. In addition to leading the Red Storm in scoring, Correa ranks fifth overall in the conference, averaging 18.0 points per contest.
- » Through 20 games this year, the Manchester, N.J., native has finished in double figures on 15 occasions, eclipsing the 30-point plateau a BIG EAST-best five times. In addition to her ability to score the ball, Correa leads the Johnnies in steals, recording 1.9 thefts per game, good enough to rank ninth overall in the conference.
- » Unique Drake finished the regular season strong for St. John's, reaching double figures in each of her last three appearances, highlighted by a career-best 22 points against Georgetown on Feb. 24.
- » Over the Red Storm's recent three-game stretch, the Columbia, S.C., native led her squad in scoring, netting 18.3 points per game on a 56 (22-of-39) percent shooting from the floor, including a 60 (6-of-10) percent mark from 3-point range.

SCOUTING XAVIER

- Xavier (5-9, 2-8 BIG EAST) wrapped up the regular season with a 58-48 victory over Georgetown on Feb. 28.
- In the win over the Hoyas, senior forward A'riana Gray posted her 28th career double-double, finishing with 14 points and 12 rebounds.
- Gray leads the way for Xavier in both scoring and rebounding, averaging 12.9 points and 6.7 boards per game.
- Nia Clark is the team's second-leading scorer, averaging 11.8 points per game while Kae Satterfield enters postseason play with a 10.0 scoring average.

- The St. John's locker room is closed to the media following the game. The team is allowed the customary 10-minute cooling off period and time with the coaching staff to meet with the team after each game. The St. John's Athletic Communications staff will secure coach and student-athletes for the interview room. Coach Joe Tartamella will enter with student-athletes, unless detained by radio/television interviews. Coach and student-athletes will complete interviews and be available for one-on-ones.
- The only pregame interviews allowed on game days will be for St. John's radio, and local or national television productions. No game day interviews will be allowed unless specifically requested for televised games.

CORREA ALL-BIG EAST FIRST TEAM

- The BIG EAST released its annual end-of-season awards on Thursday, as sophomore guard Leilani Correa earned a spot on the All-BIG EAST First Team.
- Correa becomes the 18th Johnnie in program history to earn a spot on the league's top team and the eighth to do so during the Joe Tartamella era.
- A year after snagging the conference's Sixth Woman of the Year award, Correa continued to turn heads in the BIG EAST, racking up six conference weekly accolades, including Player of the Week recognition on Feb. 1.
- Correa, who was a unanimous selection to the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team as season ago, led the Red Storm in scoring this year, averaging 18.0 points per game, good enough to rank fifth overall in the league. During conference action, The Manchester, N.J., native was one of the biggest offensive threats, averaging 17.5 points per outing against BIG EAST foes. The sophomore guard has reached double figures 15 times over the 2020-21 campaign, leading the Red Storm in scoring on eight different occasions.
- Known for her ability to score, Correa cracked the 30-point plateau a BIG EAST-best five times this season.

#SJUWBB IN THE BIG EAST TOURNAMENT

- Dating back to the first BIG EAST Women's Basketball Tournament in 1983, St. John's owns a 30-32 all-time record in conference tournament games.
- The Johnnies have made 11 trips to the BIG EAST semifinals and have played in the conference title game five times.
- Four of those five championship game appearances resulted in league titles with the most recent coming in 2016 by way of a victory over Creighton.

ST. JOHN'S AS THE NO. 8 SEED

- St. John's has entered the BIG EAST Tournament as the no. 8 seed a combined four times in program history, with an overall record of 4-4.
- The Johnnies have won the opening round each time they have been seeded at no. 8, but have fallen in the quarterfinals all four times.

win a victory over Providence on Feb. 21.

- With 169 victories, Tartamella passed Joe Mullaney (168).
- Tartamella is just eight wins shy of passing Kim Barnes Arico as the all-time winningest coach in program history.

CEO OF THE 30-POINT CLUB

- With 20 games under her belt this season, Leilani Correa has recorded a league-best five 30-point performances.
- Earlier this season, the sophomore guard set a program-record with three-straight 30-point efforts, including back-to-back game-high 33-point performances against Top-25 teams. (then-No. 3/5 UConn on Feb. 3 and No. 22/22 DePaul on Feb. 10).
- Correa has netted a career-high 35 points twice this year.
- Her first 35-point performance came at Delaware on Dec. 10.
- Just under two months later, Correa turned in a 35-point performance at Georgetown on Jan. 27.
- With 35 points against the Delaware, Correa became the first St. John's player to reach that mark since Tawana Jackson turned in 36 points against Boston College on Feb. 1, 1995.
- With five 30-plus point efforts this season, Correa is the only player in program history to record 30 or more points a combined eight times over her young career and the first player to do so since the realignment of the BIG EAST.

BLOCK PARTY

- Through 21 games this season, the Johnnies sit second in the conference for blocks this season with 5.9 rejections per game, good enough to sit 10th on the national level.
- With a combined 123 blocked shots this year, the Red Storm also sits second in the conference and ranks 12th in the NCAA.
- In the Red Storm's win over Saint Peter's on Dec. 1, the squad set a program record for blocks, recording 16 rejections against the Peacocks.
- St. John's 16 blocks against Saint Peter's still leads the NCAA for the most rejections in a single game this season.

BAILEY BRINGING A LATE SPARK

- Kadaja Bailey has been a bright spot for the Johnnies during the second half of the season.
- Over the last nine games, Bailey is boasting 11.3 points per game on a 44 (40-of-89) percent shooting from the floor.
- Bailey has also crashed the glass well for St. John's over her last eight outings, pulling down a team-high 7.7 rebounds per game.
- The junior guard has recorded a double-double in three of the team's last nine contests, finishing with a career-high 14 rebounds in two of those games (at Villanova and at Georgetown)
- Over 21 games this season, Bailey sits second on the team in scoring with 10.3 points per game.
- She currently leads the team in rebounding, pulling down 6.3 boards per game to rank 12th in the BIG EAST.
- Bailey also sits second on the team in blocks this season, with 1.2 rejections per game to rank eighth overall in the conference.

CAPTAIN Q UNDERGOS SEASON-ENDING SURGERY

- After seeing action in eight games this season, St. John's head women's basketball coach Joe Tartamella announced that senior guard Qadashah Hoppie will miss the remainder of the 2020-21 campaign after suffering a shoulder injury that required season-ending surgery.
- Hoppie saw action in eight games this season for the Red Storm, averaging 18.0 points per contest.
- Through 104 career games, Hoppie is currently the active leading scorer in the BIG EAST with 1,323 points and sits inside the top-50 in all of Division I.
- Earlier this year, the 5-foot-9 guard moved into second on the Red Storm's all-time list for 3-pointers made with 185.

DRAKE DRIVING THE POINT

- After averaging just 7.3 minutes per game a season ago, Unique Drake has stepped up to the plate as the team's primary point guard this year.
- The sophomore has started in all 21 games for the Red Storm this season, averaging over 30 minutes per contest.
- Boasting 9.5 points per game this year, Drake has more than quadrupled her scoring output from a season ago.
- Drake leads the team in assists this year, dishing out 3.0 dimes per game.
- The Columbia, S.C., native is knocking down 49.4 (80-of-62) percent of her tries from the floor this season and 68.8 (22-of-32) percent from the charity stripe.
- Drake has been a bright spot as of late for the Red Storm, leading the Johnnies in scoring over the last three games of the regular season.
- The Columbia, S.C., native averaged a team-high 18.3 points per game on a 56 percent shooting from the floor, including a 60 percent mark from beyond the arc over the Red Storm's three-game stretch.

- Raven Farley and Rayven Peeples have both seen career-high performances for the Red Storm this season.
- In the team's season opener against FDU, Farley recorded a career-high 20 points and 11 rebounds for the first double-double of her collegiate career. Peeples' career-best effort came against Saint Peter's, as the junior forward registered a career-high 22 points and five blocks, falling just shy of double-double with a team-high nine rebounds against the Peacocks.
- In the Johnnies most recent win over Providence, Peeples set a new career-high for rebounds, pulling down 13 against the Friars.
- Peeples is a converting at a team-high 60.4 (64-of-106) percent clip from the floor this season to rank second in the BIG EAST
- Farley sits second on the team in rebounding this year, pulling down 5.5 boards per game.

HEAD COACH JOE TARTAMELLA



Joe Tartamella was introduced as the eighth head coach in the history of the St. John's women's basketball program on April 27, 2012.

In his eight years at the helm of the Red Storm, Tartamella has continued the tradition of success that he helped to implement as a member of the coaching staff, boasting an overall 162-100 record as head coach. With 162 victories, Tartamella sits third on the program's all-time win list.



In his career with the Red Storm, Tartamella has played a vital role in helping turn around the St. John's women's basketball program and ushering its present success. During Tartamella's tenure, St. John's has advanced to 12 BIG EAST Tournaments, three WNITs, and six NCAA Tournaments, including the program's first Big Dance berth in more than 17 years during the 2005-06 campaign and the team's first-ever appearance in the Sweet 16 during the 2011-12 season. Tartamella has coached 30 All-BIG EAST and All-Rookie players, 17 All-Met selections and has enjoyed many a national Top 25 ranking during his time at St. John's, including a program-best No. 13 Associated Press ranking during the 2011-12 campaign.

Tartamella is coming off a successful 2019-20 campaign, that saw the Red Storm enjoy its highest scoring output since the 1994-95 season, averaging

72.3 points per game. Under the direction of Tartamella, the Red Storm finished 19-12 overall, and third in the BIG EAST with an 11-7 conference mark. Prior to the season being cut short, Tartamella and the St. John's women's basketball program were in line to make their seventh postseason appearance in the last eight seasons.

In 2018-19, Tartamella helped lift the Johnnies to their most notable win in terms of national rankings in nearly a decade, as the Red Storm upset No. 8/7 Marquette, 81-74.

During the 2017-18 season Tartamella led St. John's back to the postseason for the 11th-straight year as the Johnnies advanced to the Quarterfinal Round of the WNIT for the first time in program history. Three of Tartamella's athletes garnered accolades by the BIG EAST following the 2017-18 campaign as Qadashah Hoppie was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Year, the first freshman to earn the award for the Johnnies since Da'Shena Stevens, in 2008-09

season. Hoppie and Tiana England both earned unanimous selection to the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team, while Maya Singleton was tabbed to the All-BIG EAST Second Team. On January 10th, Tartamella moved up to third place on the All-Time Win List with 119 wins after defeating Butler, 73 to 55.

Tartamella led the 2016-17 St. John's team back to the postseason for the 10th-consecutive season as the Johnnies advanced to the WNIT Round of 16 for the fourth time in five total appearances. Additionally, the Red Storm reached the 20-win mark for the fourth-straight year. Three of Tartamella's players were recognized by the BIG EAST following the 2016-17 campaign as Jade Walker earned a spot on the All-BIG EAST First Team, while Aaliyah Lewis became just the second player in program history to be named Defensive Player of the Year after the senior earned a share of the award. Finally, rookie Alisha Kebbe was named to the BIG EAST All-Freshman Team after taking home the conference's Freshman of the Week Award a league-best four times during the regular season. On Jan. 22, 2017, Tartamella became the fifth coach in program history to win 100 games with a 60-50 win over Providence at Carnesecca Arena.

In March of 2016, Tartamella returned the Red Storm to a place of prominence that the program had not experienced in nearly three decades. Following three magical days in Chicago, the Johnnies claimed their first BIG EAST Title since 1988. The road to the championship proved difficult, as the Red Storm had to face off against top-seeded DePaul on its home court in the semifinals less than a week after the Blue Demons wrapped up the best regular season in the history of the new BIG EAST with a 16-2 mark. Trailing by double digits in the second half, the Johnnies stormed back to take the lead in the final period, knocking down their final 11 shots from the floor and securing a spot in the BIG EAST Championship game for the second time in three years. In the final, the Red Storm put forth its best defensive effort of the season, limiting Creighton to just 37 points and claiming the BIG EAST title.

After its miraculous title run, the Red Storm secured a berth in the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time in the last seven seasons and earned a postseason bid for the ninth-straight campaign.

Two of Tartamella's players were recognized by the BIG EAST following the 2015-16 season, as super seniors Aliyyah Handford and Danaejah Grant were both named to the all-conference first team. In addition, Handford became the first player in St. John's history to take home BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year honors after finishing second in the conference in steals on the season. Handford and Grant both indelibly left their mark on the St. John's record book in 2015-16, as Handford became the program's first 2,000-point scorer and Grant moved into ninth place on the career scoring list despite playing what amounted to just three full seasons in red and white.

In April, the two seniors became the third and fourth players in the Tartamella era to hear their names called in the WNBA Draft, as Handford was selected 27th overall by the Connecticut Sun and Grant was taken four picks later at 31 by the Washington Mystics.

The Red Storm won 23 games for the third-straight season in 2015-16, bumping Tartamella's career record to 87-45, good enough for a winning percentage of .659.

In 2014-15, Tartamella guided St. John's to the postseason for the eighth-straight season, taking the Red Storm to the WNIT Round of 16 for the third time in school history. This past season marked the second time in Tartamella's three-year tenure as head coach that St. John's has won at least a pair of postseason games. The Red Storm also won 23 contests for the second-straight year.

Tartamella's star player, Aliyyah Handford, was named All-BIG EAST First Team and WBCA All-Region for the second-consecutive year after registering the second-most productive offensive season in school history. The junior guard scored 655 points during the campaign, propelling her into seventh place on the school's all-time scoring list. Two other members of the Red Storm were also recognized by the conference, as Danaejah Grant found a spot on the All-BIG EAST Second Team after scoring 580 points (fifth-most in school history) and Amber Thompson garnered All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention honors after shattering her own single-season rebounding record with 370 boards.

In 2013-14, Tartamella piloted the Red Storm to 23 victories and a trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, the program's fifth-straight trip to the Big Dance. Aside from the team's NCAA Tournament berth, the campaign featured a number of other highlights, including a win over nationally-ranked Texas A&M at Madison Square Garden, a 13-5 BIG EAST mark, the program's first appearance in the BIG EAST Tournament Final since 1988 and an 11-game winning streak.

Under Tartamella, St. John's has made two trips to the NCAA tournament, while his players have garnered an array of individual awards. Following his first year as head coach, Tartamella saw Shenneika Smith and Nadirah McKeith earn First Team All-BIG EAST honors. In addition, Smith earned a spot on the All-Met First Team, while McKeith was named the All-Met Player of the Year and Handford took home the hardware as the MBWA Rookie of the Year. Most notably, however, McKeith and Smith were both taken in that spring's WNBA Draft and McKeith became the first St. John's player to sign a WNBA contract, playing the 2013 season with the Washington Mystics. The duo also earned WBCA Honorable Mention All-America accolades.

Following the 2013-14 campaign, Handford found a spot on the All-Met and All-BIG EAST First Teams, while Eugeneia McPherson, Jade Walker and Amber Thompson were also recognized by the conference.

In his first season as head coach, Tartamella guided the Red Storm to its fourth-straight NCAA Tournament berth after finishing the season tied for third in the BIG EAST Conference with an 11-5 record and winning eight of its last 10 regular season games. St. John's was also the host school for the First and Second Rounds of the 2013 NCAA Tournament.

Tartamella made his head coaching debut at the WBI Tip-Off Invitational in November 2012. He earned his first-career coaching victory, 72-54, against UCF on Nov. 11 at the Ocean Center in Daytona Beach, Fla. Against Rutgers on Jan. 6, 2013, Tartamella killed two birds with one stone, recording his first-career BIG EAST win and his first-career BIG EAST road win, 48-44, over the Scarlet Knights. On March 9, 2013, Tartamella notched his first BIG EAST Tournament victory, 51-45, against Seton Hall.

Regarded as one of the top up-and-coming mentors in women's basketball, Tartamella's coaching career was forged over a nine-year tenure assisting St. John's all-time winningest coach, Kim Barnes Arico. Beginning as a Red Storm graduate assistant in 2002, Tartamella, 36, worked his way through the ranks and served as Barnes Arico's associate head coach for the four seasons leading up to his elevation to head coach. He has been an integral part of a staff that has been to six NCAA Tournaments, including St. John's run to its first-ever NCAA Sweet 16 in 2012. As a program, St. John's has been to the NCAA Tournament nine times.

Life after the storm: Qadashah Hoppie looks beyond her years at St. John's

St. John's Women's Basketball Guard Qadashah Hoppie has been putting her heart out onto the court of Carnesecca Arena for the past three years. Her passion has always been for the game of basketball. With just about a month left until she tips off her final season with St. John's, the Staten Island-native is starting to look more seriously at what she is going to pursue in her future.

Since her first appearance on the court as a Johnny, Hoppie has been a key player on the team; she has earned many accolades, led the team in scoring, broke program records and reached 1,000 career points during the 2019-20 season. After a hard-working career of playing basketball, Hoppie alludes that the 2020-21 season will not be her last time on a court.

"I want to continue playing professionally," Hoppie said in an interview with the Torch via Zoom. "Whether that's in the WNBA or some other Euro league, that's what I want to continue to do."

Hoppie wants to play basketball, and it is as simple as that. She said that she doesn't want to do this for "too, too long" because she understands that her body will not endure a basketball career forever.

Though one day her career as a player will come to an end, she hopes to be a member of a team, courtside.

"I do want to get into coaching after that," Hoppie said.

From the moment she stepped onto the Queens campus, Hoppie has been preparing for a future in coaching. She said that prior to committing to the University, Women's Basketball Head Coach Joe Tartamella knew that she was eager to pursue this career. She said that Tartamella and herself often sit down, watch film from prior games together and discuss what it is like to be a coach.

"He's someone that came from different ranks," Hoppie said. "He's seen it all, from the lowest to the highest, so he kind of tries to give me different teaching points and I just kind of watch and learn as much as I can."

These coaching tips are just some of the many lessons and memories Hoppie will carry with her after retiring her long-held jersey for the Red Storm.

"No matter who we are playing, we show our heart," Hoppie said, highlighting her team's grit during games.

Hoppie referred to the endless perseverance that the team emits. She said that oftentimes some opponents look down on the team, yet they work to the best of their abilities to prove those opponents wrong.

"Teams, no matter what their ranking is, they still worry about us when they have to play us," Hoppie said.

Off the court, Hoppie said she will always reminisce on the team's trip to the Virgin Islands in November of the 2018-19 season. On this trip, the team played in the Paradise Jam tournament, where they went 2-1 in wins against Purdue University and the University of Mississippi and faced a loss against the University of Connecticut.

"The Virgin Islands [trip] taught me that although the basketball part is important, the chemistry and the family part is even more important," Hoppie said.

Hoppie continued, stating that if the team wasn't connecting and having as much fun as they were off the court, she doesn't think they would have played as well as they did on it.

After learning tips from the coaches at St. John's, building unbreakable bonds, playing countless minutes on the court and holding onto cherished memories, Hoppie will enter her future as a woman in the sports industry. Hoppie mentioned that there are a limited number of women in coaching positions within the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), especially head coaches – a position that she is striving for.

"Anybody that is shooting for that dream, just know that it's possible, especially now," Hoppie said. "Everything is changing so don't try to change your dreams because of the stigma of men being the head of the whole NCAA college basketball world."

Looking forward, Hoppie sees all that lies ahead beyond her last year at St. John's. After leaving her mark on the court of Carnesecca, she can rely on the Red Storm fans and Athletics Department to support her every step of the way.

It's Bigger than Basketball: Qadashah Hoppie and Greg Williams Respond to NBA Social Justice Initiatives

An athlete has the honor of having a platform, and with this honor comes the responsibility and ability to reach countless individuals. As we have seen in recent years, numerous athletes have utilized theirs for the best, speaking out against injustices in an attempt to make the world a better place – take Colin Kaepernick, for example.

St. John's athletes are well-known on and off campus, and although their platform may not be as large as a professional's, it is just as significant. Speaking to players from both the women's and men's basketball teams, it is evident that the recent protests and actions taken by the National Basketball Association in regard to the Black Lives Matter movement has had a huge impact on the sports world. Women's Basketball Captain Qadashah Hoppie and Men's Basketball junior guard Greg Williams discussed how important it is for professional players to make use of their renowned platform.

How do you feel the protesting of games in the NBA has helped the Black Lives Matter movement?

Both Hoppie and Williams say they are pleased with the steps the NBA has taken to express their allyship with the Black community. The NBA showcasing its concern demonstrates the importance of the message of equality the movement is highlighting to the world.

"I think the NBA has done a great job with taking initiative," Williams said. "It's great to see high profile players like LeBron using their platform to send out a good message."

"A lot of times when things like this happen people get distracted with things that aren't as important," Hoppie said. "The issue is there but if it's not affecting you, you don't really care, at this level of entertainment, everybody can see it and it's bringing more people to the fight."

Hoppie emphasized that the platform of an NBA athlete reaches individuals of every background, not only in the United States but around the globe. This helps increase awareness of what is happening in our country and allows more people to understand how essential it is for our nation to work to dissolve the everyday prejudices that the Black community has faced for centuries.

The NBA has been inscribing BLM messages on the courts and players have taken to their own apparel to stand in solidarity with the movement. How do you feel about administration and players using their platform to voice their opinions?

"I really appreciate players and administration speaking out," Williams said. "It's something that, as a player, I really look up to."

Williams added that it is nice to see the NBA using their voice to reach their large audience.

"They might just be basketball players but being able to speak out gives them the opportunity to impact the world."

These professional players have the ability to make American issues a global concern thanks to their platform, and Hoppie says this factor is important.

"I'm pleased to see the NBA and WNBA taking steps ahead with the players," Hoppie said. "You see the support when you want us to play for you, to make money for you, be the face of your brand, and I think it's necessary that since we do all of this for you that you support us when it's something this important."

Hoppie listed a number of things the WNBA allowed players to do to support the Black Lives Matter movement: walk out of the game, kneel for the pledge of allegiance and wear shirts with seven gunshots on the back.

"It's good to see the players and the NBA finally gain the confidence to say something," Hoppie said.

Hoppie highlighted that the calls of the Black Lives Matter movement are so much bigger than the sport of basketball. The St. John's players and administration recognize this, using their voices to emphasize the fact that without representation, there will be no justice. The calls for human decency, racial equality and respect need to be addressed before addressing anything else.

As seen on Twitter, some feel that NBA and WNBA players have a privilege over other workers in that they are wealthy enough to essentially stop going to work to protest. Do you feel players are abusing their power at all?

"Not at all," Hoppie said.

Hoppie said that until this year, players such as Colin Kaepernick have lost their jobs after letting their voices be heard. She said that athletes are held to higher standards in terms of what they say and put on the media.

"A lot of people could've been quiet, they didn't have to say anything," Hoppie said. "People could try and sit back and not get upset and be silent, so for them to speak up shows that no matter what they get paid it's a big deal."

It has been announced in recent news that Big East players will be wearing BLM patches on their uniforms for the entire upcoming season. How do you feel about this recognition of the movement throughout the season?

As announced in mid-August, the men's and women's basketball teams of the Big East Conference will wear patches dedicated to the Black Lives Matter movement. The gesture was unanimously approved by all 11 schools, each one excited to take part in the fight for justice.

"I think it's a good opportunity for players in the Big East to take some sort of initiative," Williams said. "I really look forward to being able to help spread the message."

It seems that young athletes have a positive outlook on doing their part in contributing to the movement. Williams said that it is great that the Big East will have the same opportunities as the NBA regarding the movement. By having the representation all season long, the topic will not just be swept under the rug but instead embraced and recognized as an urgent matter that demands to be addressed.

Within St. John's women's and men's basketball teams there is an awareness of just how important NBA participation in the Black Lives Matter movement is for the fight for racial equality in America. Qadashah Hoppie and Greg Williams emphasized that the actions taken by the NBA players and administration hold significant value in the progression of the battle. These steps prove to the world that, while it may just be basketball, there is no voice too big or too small to speak up against the injustices that the Black community faces in American society.

Big East Basketball Takes Leadership Role in Voter Registration

As part of a conference-wide effort to bring awareness to social justice issues, Big East schools are ensuring that all members of their men's and women's basketball programs are registered to vote ahead of November's presidential election.

Big East Commissioner Val Ackerman says the conference's basketball teams provide a strong platform to launch these initiatives and set an example for the rest of its students.

"Particularly in high profile sports like basketball for us, the athletes are very prominent and are role models for students," Ackerman said. "Our basketball players in particular have embraced this leadership opportunity in civic engagement, service work, and mentorship work."

Camree Clegg, a Westland, Mich. native and guard on the basketball team at St. John's, says her teammates are holding one another accountable to vote and encouraging others around them to do the same.

"As a student-athlete, you have this platform and you have to encourage other people who are watching you," Clegg said.

Clegg, a redshirt sophomore, requested an absentee ballot from her home state of Michigan for the first time. She says the rest of her teammates are either registered to vote in New York or waiting on absentee ballots too.

The St. John's men's basketball program also completed this initiative, as they announced on August 28 that every member of the team is registered to vote.

"I was very proud to see that," said St. John's Athletics Director Mike Cragg.

Cragg says voter registration was a priority of the first men's basketball meeting in the summer, where players were encouraged not only to participate in national elections, but local elections as well.

"Coach Anderson (men's basketball) and all of our coaches are committed to voter education," Cragg said. "At some point we'll have all of our athletes registered in all of our sports, but Coach Anderson has really taken the lead on that."

Clegg says the women's basketball team had the same priorities, even before they set foot on campus this semester.

"They (the coaches) have hit it head on," Clegg said. "They told us that we need to take action and vote because our voice matters."

This push for voter registration comes from the Big East itself, as well as the independent group, Coaches For Action. This group was created by 21 minority assistant coaches in the conference who are implementing various initiatives to elevate the voices of student-athletes, with voter registration at the forefront.

Coaches for Action reinforces the Big East's new partnership with RISE, an organization that provides educational programming to help "equip sports leaders to create positive change on matters of racism, social justice and equality," (BigEast.com).

On Sept. 8, St. John's women's basketball brought in Sharod Tomlinson, Director of RISE Network Mentoring Program at the university, to speak to the importance of voting.

Tracy Ellis-Ward, Big East Associate Commissioner of Women's Basketball, says the conference does not have statistics available to show the number of student-athletes that are registered to vote, but all of its schools have initiatives in place to encourage registration.

The St. John's community will continue with voter education in the coming weeks leading up to the election. Throughout the week of Sept. 21, the athletic department held various voter registration events, so the rest of its teams could follow the lead of women's and men's basketball.

"They have leadership capabilities naturally and they want to exercise those responsibilities beyond athletics," Ackerman said. "We believe that student-athletes have a special place in the effort and can help make a difference."

St. John's Prepares to Take on the Season

Last college basketball season ended abruptly for the women's team of St. John's University. They were on campus practicing following the Big East Tournament awaiting word on whether post-season play would see them in the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament or in the WNIT. "[The players] did the best they could to stay in shape, but certainly there's a difference between [that and] having the strength and conditioning coach working with them and being in basketball shape," said Tartamella. "They did a good job of keeping their bodies ready. I feel they're in a really good place now."

This will be guard Qadashah Hoppie's senior season. With the goal of playing professionally, Tartamella said she's fit and focused.

"Obviously, the hope is that she continues her progression," said Tartamella. "As a player who I've always looked to—whether quietly or vocally—to be a part of the toughness we have as a team and also be a huge part of our leadership group, she's really played well. Certainly, she scored the ball at a high rate. This becomes in a way her year to be able to put a nice bow on her career as she gets ready for the next step...She's really put in the work...and she's determined to lead us to win."

St. John's and Seton Hall ready to return to action

While schedules are still being finalized, Division I women's basketball teams are gearing up for a return to action. Last week, the Big East Conference held its media day virtually for the first time. There was plenty of talk about the anticipation of returning to competition, but the coaches also addressed issues related to COVID-19 and #BlackLivesMatter.

St. John's University was ranked fourth and Seton Hall University sixth in the Big East Preseason Coaches' Poll. Two St. John's players, sophomore guard Leilani Correa and senior guard Qadashah Hoppie, were named to the Preseason All-Big East Team. Seton Hall senior guard Desiree Elmore was also named.

"[Desiree has] gotten herself in tremendous shape," said Seton Hall coach Tony Bozzella. "She's been very dedicated. This is the most I've seen Des put into her game, so I'm really proud of her for that. She's continued to get better, and we need her to play...like a First Team All-Conference player for us to hopefully be successful."

St. John's coach Joe Tartamella is looking for a big year from Hoppie. Known as a greater offensive player, she's been working on raising her defense. "She's just so humble; I think her leadership is now really shining," said Tartamella. "She shows that every day in practice—the energy and communication she brings to our younger players." He further noted that Hoppie is also outspoken on issues such as social justice and voting.

Last Thursday, Bethune-Cookman University, an HBCU institution in Florida that played in the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Tournament in 2019, became the first D I institution to cancel all sports for the 2020-'21 academic year due to COVID-19. Bozzella and Tartamella said they are maintaining all health and safety protocols and training the players with the intention of playing this season.

"We try to make it as normal as possible in how we practice and how we operate from day-to-day," said Tartamella. "We have to be the most flexible we've ever been in how we do things."

St. John's courses are in hybrid mode, with the majority of classes virtual, but some classes meeting in person one or two days a week. Tartamella said the players go to the socially distanced study hall to get out of their rooms and feel like they're really in school.

"Our school has put forth some tremendous guidelines that's made things very accessible for our student-athletes to still have a life, but also make things as safe as possible," said Bozzella. "Our kids want to play basketball. They're doing everything in their power to stay safe. Hopefully, that's enough."

Hoppie ready to bring it in senior season

St. John's University senior guard Qadashah Hoppie agreed that it seems like not long ago that she emerged on the scene as a hotshot freshman. "Everything went fast, but it's been great being at St. John's and seeing the growth from my freshmen year," said Hoppie. "I'm excited to finish with a bang in my senior year."

Named to the Preseason All-Big East Team, the Staten Island native said she and her Red Storm teammates are focused on their season opener versus St. Francis College scheduled for Nov. 25. Although it has been announced that there will be no spectators due to COVID-19 restrictions, Hoppie said it doesn't dim their enthusiasm.

"We've been waiting for this time the whole summer, just waiting to see if we would be able to play this year, so we're really excited and happy to have a start date and something to push forward to," said Hoppie. "We've been practicing, going hard. As these weeks close in, we're just finetuning things and trying to get better."

When St. John's cleared its campus in mid-March, Hoppie returned to her family. In anticipation of stationing in place, the strength coach for women's basketball prepared simple workouts that the players could do at home. Those exercises along with some running of Staten Island's hills kept her busy. She had a basketball hoop, so she could do a bit of shooting on her own.

After about two months, she returned to her off-campus apartment in Queens and was able to workout a bit and keep herself in shape until she was able to begin training on campus in late July. Hoppie, a business management major, said as senior leader on the team it's important to make sure there's a sense of unity.

"We have to be extra safe and extra cautious, and that may be hard for some people," Hoppie said. "As far as the other side, we have a lot of freshmen and sophomores, so continuing to lead them so they can become leaders once they cross over to that junior/senior world."

"Keeping everybody together because at the end of the day it's just going to be us in those gyms," she continued. "We're not cleared to have fans, so we have to maintain a certain togetherness."

"In the beginning of the season, it's going to be about focusing on our team, our chemistry and building up enough chemistry so that by the time Big East Conference comes around [the Red Storm's Big East opener is Dec. 4] and further on into playoffs...we're ready."

A Daly Dose of Hoops

St. John's seeks to maintain status quo of postseason success amid roster reshaping

Joe Tartamella has presided over the richest period in St. John's women's basketball history, be it as the head coach for the past eight seasons or the seven years prior in which he served as Kim Barnes Arico's lead assistant. Yet after a year in which the Red Storm missed the postseason for the first time since 2007, and then having COVID-19 cancel any potential late March reservations 12 months later, the 41-year-old hits the hardwood with a renewed sense of enthusiasm and commitment akin to a first-year coach running the show for the first time.

"The best part you can take away from it is the ability to play in those pressure games," Tartamella said as he recounted St. John's late surge into bubble contention to end last season. "The way Leilani (Correa) played in those games as a freshman and how she stepped up was really great to see, and obviously Q (Qadashah Hoppie) coming back battle-tested and Kadaja Bailey, same thing. We had to play with our backs to the wall the second half of the Big East (season), and I thought we performed pretty well."

The Red Storm will look almost entirely different when it opens its season Saturday at Fairleigh Dickinson, even with Correa, Hoppie and Bailey coming back. Gone are Tiana England to Florida State, and Alisha Kebbe to graduation, but Tartamella did not sit still while college basketball was shut down during the infant stages of the coronavirus pandemic, retooling his roster into a uniquely styled unit that matches some trademarks of past teams in Queens.

"We've added some things up front to help our rebounding situation," he said. "We're not as fast, I would say, but we're going to look to continue to score the ball the same way and be stout on defense and clearing the glass. We recruited players we feel that could help us, two junior college players in shoring up where Alisha was and helping us rebound, younger players like Unique Drake and Cam Clegg. It's never easy to replace anybody, and Alissa Alston was a big piece to what we did as well, so although we did lose a lot, we still have some pretty good pieces in there with Leilani and Q and Kadaja. From what I've seen, I feel pretty good about how we can fill those gaps right now, and I think they're only going to improve with time and with experience."

Correa, in particular, looks the part of a future superstar. With three 30-point games already under her belt, the New Jersey native captured Sixth Player of the Year honors in the Big East and likely would have won Freshman of the Year recognition if not for Madison Siegrist of Villanova. Correa's transcendent talent already bears resemblance to program legends the likes of Da'Shena Stevens and Aliyyah Handford, with the best only yet to come.

"She certainly proved what she's capable of doing," Tartamella reaffirmed. "I've never seen a kid score — she had three 30-point games, she was averaging 20 a game in the last five games, had 28 against Creighton in the Big East tournament — as a true freshman. She was that important to what we did, and for a player of her stature with the success she had, she was willing to do whatever she needed to let her team win, and that was the most impressive thing about her, because a lot of other players in her position may not have been happy with the role she was in at the time. But she embraced it, and obviously it'll be a different role this year, but I think she can be as great as she wants to be."

Hoppie and Bailey add a level of security with their experience, and Tartamella is also hopeful that Raven Farley can impact the game in the paint similar to how Amber Thompson protected the rim for the Red Storm in the past. Drake and Clegg will lead a by-committee approach to replacing England at the point guard spot, with twins Emma and Sophia Nolan being counted on to take on more of a role than last season. All in all, with a slightly younger roster and mounds of experience coming back, expectations are high and optimism is pervasive within the walls of Carnesecca Arena.

"I'm going to make sure you see the same thing offensively," Tartamella declared when asked what to expect from St. John's this season. "We're going to be a little more balanced from the defensive side, but we're going to keep up our speed and our fast tempo game, we hope to spread the wealth as always and take care of the ball, and we hope to bring some excitement to whoever we're allowed to play in front of."

St. John's basketball steamrolls St. Peter's with Big East play looming

Following a season opener win where the St. John's basketball program defeated Fairleigh Dickinson, the Johnnies kept that momentum in its home opener against St. Peter's.

A dominant first half propelled the Johnnies (2-0) to a victory over the Peacocks (1-1), 85-47.

Still without unanimous selection to the Preseason All-Big East Team, Qadashah Hoppie, the Red Storm's other Preseason All-Big East member Leilani Correa has been able to pace the team in scoring, while getting her teammates involved.

"I felt we played better than the other day which is the most important part," head coach Joe Tartamella said, "I thought we got great contributions from some of the newcomers today which was important."

Correa finished Tuesday's victory with 19 points, three rebounds, five assists, one block, and a steal while Rayven Pepples led the Johnnies with 22 points, nine rebounds, and five blocks.

"When we play smaller teams like this, we have a lot of shooters on our team, and I bring the defense in by posting up and scoring and getting rebounds it opens up the floor a lot more," Pepples said.

St. John's was able to shoot a scorching 54.1 percent from the field and 53.8 percent from 3-point range while holding St. Peter's to a 22.5 percent clip from the floor and a lowly 9.1 percent from beyond the arc.

Unique Drake also added 16 points, four rebounds, and four assists while Kadaja Bailey posted 14 points, five rebounds, and two assists in the victory.

St. John's basketball thrown into the fire early

Despite not having a close game yet, head coach Joe Tartamella thinks his team is ready for the gauntlet of Big East play.

"We can adapt a little bit quicker, but we have a lot of things we need to sure up heading into Big East play, and we have a couple of days to get things right. I like our ability to rebound the ball more than we did last year, I think that is one of the biggest differences," Tartamella added.

St. John's will remain in Queens and were scheduled to face the Georgetown Hoyas on Friday afternoon but Georgetown had COVID-19 positive tests within its program and that game has been postponed.

Unique Drake patrols a higher court in the city that never sleeps

Gone is the bouffant hairdo that Westwood basketball crowds were familiar with as she led the Redhawks deep into the postseason. The St. John's point guard sports more practical dreads.

"My mom has dreads, so I just decided that I might as well get them," she said. "And with a lot of our games being back-to-back, I didn't have the time. For me, it's very conventional."

What is still present on the court is the Westwood work ethic, which she says is tried and true.

"Westwood forever. I love Westwood," she said. "They made me where I am today. From my freshman to senior years, that's really where it all started. I want to thank Westwood community for doing all what we and Coach (Gregory) Bauldrick, he's the best. He taught me a lot."

What Drake learned, in short, is to be humble, to work constantly at getting better, and when the time comes, show up and play. She's been doing that ever since she found a home with the Red Storm, which took note of her play in Blythewood and did everything to get her up to New York City.

"They had called me one day, and then a week later I went up on a visit," she said about the recruiting process back in 2018. "When I was up there I got to the atmosphere and met the coaching staff. It felt like home, that's what made me decide to come here."

Drake caught a lot of attention as a four-star recruit. She ultimately chose St. John's over offers from Clemson, North Carolina State, and East Carolina, as well as Florida International, Charlotte, and Winthrop.

She solidified her place among the Westwood athletic elite after leading the Redhawks to the 2019 upper state championship game. The 5-7 Drake also finished out her career as a 1,500-plus point scorer, averaging 17.0 points per game over 107 games. She was a first-team 2018 USA Today South Carolina and in 2019 was nominated for the McDonald's All-American game as well as a runner-up for the Gatorade Player of the Year.

Once she was headed to St. John's, Drake knew that those accolades were promptly relegated to the past. Ahead of her lie Division One basketball in, of all places, Queens.

"It was a big transition from there (Blythewood) because up here it's really cold, it's way busier up here, a lot of cars and traffic, a different economy. It's loud, but all of it gives you a lot of energy, it's never a dull day."

Amid that changed environment, Drake went to work. She knew coming in as a freshman that she was going to show what skills had brought her to St. John's, and that she had to watch the upper classmen work and play to get a feel for the obvious change in tempo from high-school play.

"I wasn't expecting to start," she said. "I needed to learn the game more and watch the upper classmen to see what I needed to do to get on the floor. I wanted to work hard and see where I was going to go."

In the 2019-2020 season Drake didn't start, but she did play 204 minutes in 27 games. Her first double figure scoring game was an 11-point effort against James Madison University Nov. 17.

"I went into that game and just felt ready to play," she said. "You don't think too much about the competition, they're there. For me it was just putting out the same intensity just as I was an upperclassman."

That season the Red Storm went 19-12 overall and posted an 11-7 Big East mark. The Johnnies reached the second round of the Big East tournament before falling 78-55 to Marquette.

Not long afterward, the coronavirus shut down all NCAA basketball tournaments, along with just about every other athletic and social activity in New York, the United States, and the world.

While the Covid-19 global pandemic had its effects, Drake said she knew her sophomore season was soon to come, and she would have to get ready for it. She had adjusted to the flow of the college game by then, but she knew she had to be a better point guard, and that meant hitting the weight room regularly, working on agility, and taking time to perfect her ball-handling skills.

"When I was a freshman I noticed all the other point guards were built and toned, and I didn't have that," she said. "So I had to get my body in shape. I worked hard on my shot a lot and on my handles. I know I was going to be touching the ball, and I had to make sure my handles were solid."

This year, St. John's (5-9, 2-7) has struggled in the Covid era, with five cancellations or postponements and only eight games remaining. Drake, however, has come into her own as a court leader. She's started 13 games and averages 7.9 points

Against Villanova Jan. 25, she scored a season-high 21 points and five assists. Villanova won 81-78 in overtime, but Drake's point total in the absence of senior guard Qasashah Hoppie, the team's second highest scorer who went down with a shoulder injury, showed that she has indeed elevated her game.

"I felt loose. I felt like I needed to play," she said. "I had to step up my defense and offense, and now I need to be a leader on the floor without Q. It took me a couple of games to get used to being the point guard and running the offense. (The) JMU (game) showed me that if I could do it, it could be done."

Drake keeps close ties to her family in Blythewood, but said she has a second home at St. John's. That's good news for the Red Storm.

"Life is going as it should. I'm just happy where I am and where this is going. I'm not somewhere I don't want to be. Here, I feel like you have to grow with it, grow into the moment."

St. John's basketball lands head coach Joe Tartamella milestone victory

The St. John's basketball team cruised past the Providence Friars, 65-47, inside Carnesecca Arena on Sunday afternoon.

Then, St. John's dominated in the third quarter, outscoring the Friars 16-8 and the team wouldn't look back.

The Red Storm dominated this game thanks to some balanced scoring across the board as four players finished the game in double figures.

Sophomore Unique Drake poured in a game-high 17 points.

Junior forward Raven Peeples also finished with a 12-point, 13-rebound double-double despite battling some foul trouble early on and Kadaja Bailey chipped in 12-points.

Leilani Correa, the Big East Conference third-leading scorer, had a poor start to the game but still managed to fill up the stat sheet with 15 points, 10 rebounds, five assists, and five steals despite shooting just 5-of-15 from the field.

The balanced effort offensively across the board for the Red Storm is something to build upon for the final games of the regular season and gather momentum for the Big East Tournament.

St. John's has struggled to find a consistent scoring presence outside of Correa, especially after senior Qadashah Hoppie went down with a season-ending shoulder injury.

Barnes Arico, who is the current head coach at Michigan, had Tartamella join her staff in Queens in 2005 as an assistant coach.
