WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Regardless of what happens on the out-of-town scoreboard, the Rams can clinch a postseason berth with a Saturday victory over Alberta.
- This is the lone meeting of the Canada West schedule for these two teams, marking the second consecutive year they've only matched up once in conference play.
- The last four games between the Rams and Alberta have all been decided by seven or fewer points – a 29-22 win for Alberta last year, a 35-31 win for the Rams and a 44-42 win for Alberta in 2014, and a 25-20 win for Regina in 2014.
- The Rams hold an 18-7 advantage over Alberta in the all-time series.

RAMS STEADY AT NO. 4: The Rams have now been ranked No. 4 in three consecutive CIS Top Ten polls since their win over Calgary, marking their highest ranking since the team started out 5-1 to earn the No. 3 spot in the weekly poll. Calgary (No. 5) and UBC (No. 10) are also ranked.

NESBITT CONTINUES PLAYER OF THE WEEK RUN: LB Danny Nesbitt earned CIS and Canada West Defensive Player of the Week honours after collecting a pair of interceptions, a pass breakup, one solo tackle, and four assisted tackles in the team's 37-29 win over Saskatchewan at the new Mosaic Stadium. Nesbitt's selection marks the fifth time this season the Rams have had a Canada West Player of the Week and the fourth time this year they've had a CIS weekly honour.

PICTON NEARS COMPLETIONS MARK: QB Noah Picton is nearing the Canada West single-season completions record, set at 182 by former Rams pivot Marc Mueller in 2010 and matched by Saskatchewan's Drew Burko last year. He's only 37 completions short of surpassing that mark as he comes into Saturday's game with 146 for the season. He's also on pace to break Derek Wendel's CIS record of 216 completions that was set just last season, but so is Wendel - the Ottawa quarterback has 183 with two games left on the OUA schedule.

MORE NOAH NUMBERS: Besides his completions mark, Picton is on pace to break Andrew Buckley's Canada West and CIS record of 3162 passing yards that he set last season in his final year with the Dinos. Picton is also on pace to threaten Teale Orban's mark of 26 touchdown passes, which has stood as the University of Regina and Canada West record since the 2006 campaign. The third-year quarterback enters Week 6 with 2084 passing yards and 18 touchdown passes.

CLOSING IN ON CLERMONT: Out of all the quality receivers that have come through the Rams program, Jason Clermont went on to have the most successful professional career of them all. And Mitchell Picton has one of his U of R records squarely in his sights, as the fourth-year slotback has a CIS-leading nine touchdown receptions this season - just two short of Clermont's mark of 11, which has stood as the school record since way back in 2001. Picton is also within reach of Addison Richards' U of R record of 55 receptions, and he's on pace to break the Canada West record of 66 set last season by Saskatchewan's Mitch Hillis.

DHEILLY CANADA WEST SACKS LEADER: He's only had a pair of starts in his CIS career, but rookie DL Nicholas Dheilly has taken over sole possession of first place in the Canada West sacks race. He had three in the Calgary game, and added one more against Saskatchewan to give him a conference-leading four for the season. No first-year player has led Canada West in sacks since the conference began tracking the statistic in 1981.

JACOB PALMARIN SIGNS CIS LETTER OF INTENT: Named a CJFL All-Canadian last year for the Kamloops Broncos, RB Jacob Palmarin committed to the Rams this week. Palmarin led the CJFL in carries (121), rushing yards (1089), and rushing touchdowns (13) in 2015, but has missed the entire 2016 campaign due to injury. He becomes the 10th member of the University of Regina's 2017 recruiting class.

IN THE FAMILY: Three players on the offensive side of the ball for the Rams are first cousins - RB Blake Anaka, SB Mitchell Picton, and QB Noah Picton - while K/WR Daniel Scrapper and WR Michael Scrapper are brothers. LB Danny Nesbitt is the son of defensive line coach Greg Nesbitt.

HEAD COACH STEVE BRYCE

Steve Bryce was hired in March, 2016 as the head coach of the University of Regina Rams.

Prior to coming to the U of R, Bryce's longest coaching stint was at Etiwanda High School in Rancho Cucamonga, Calif. where he spent seven seasons as head coach of the Eagles. Taking over a team that had just had a winless season, it didn't take Bryce long to guide Etiwanda to the top of the Baseline League. The Eagles had 4-1 league records in 2006, 2007, and 2009 and won California Interscholastic Federation playoff games in both 2009 and 2010.

More recently, Bryce coached at the Bantam level in Regina Minor Football and with the South Saskatchewan Selects U14 team at the 2016 Texas School of Football tournament in Arlington, Texas.

Bryce is a former player himself with the Regina Rams, playing for five seasons and helping the program win a national championship in 1987 – his first year with the team. He went on to play for four years at James-town College, where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in 1997 with an emphasis on human biology. He continued his education at Cal State San Bernardino, receiving a Bachelor of Science in geology in 2015.

RECAP

Rams lose overtime thriller in season opener

Sean Stenger's 10-yard chip shot on the second possession of overtime gave the Saskatchewan Huskies a 41-39 win over the University of Regina Rams on Friday night at Griffiths Stadium in what was both teams' first conference game of the season.

The loss was a heartbreaking one for the Rams, who were playing their first Canada West game under the guidance of first-year head coach Steve Bryce.

"Overall, I thought we played well for 90% of the game but 10% of bad play will kill you and that's what happened to us tonight," Bryce said. "There were a whole lot of mistakes, a whole lot of penalties, way too many dropped balls, and some blown coverages when it mattered the most. Noah (Picton) was awesome tonight and is delivering the ball exactly where he needs to, and moving forward we'll build on what did work and try to eliminate some of those mistakes."

Picton was brilliant in Friday's game, becoming just the second player in Rams history to throw for at least 400 yards and rush for more than 100. He completed 29 of his 41 pass attempts and set career highs with 481 passing yards, four touchdown passes, and 108 rushing yards.

But it wasn't enough to put one in the win column for the Rams (0-1). After the Rams went ahead 31-28 with 1:36 to go following a four-play, 75-yard drive that featured a 56-yard completion to Mitchell Picton up the left sideline and a completed two-point convert, they had a chance to win the ball game after Saskatchewan (1-0) had a third-and-20 situation from their own

20-yard line. But Saskatchewan quarterback Kyle Siemens found Yol Piok for a 35-yard completion to midfield, and Stenger's 20-yard field goal on the last play of regulation sent the Rams into their first overtime game in nearly 11 years.

The teams traded touchdowns on the first possession of overtime, but the Rams had to settle for a rouge on the second possession after a 37-yard field goal attempt was pulled left. That set the stage for Saskatchewan's game-winning drive, which was aided by a 15-yard face mask penalty that brought the Huskies down to the 12-yard line.

Siemens finished 28-for-42 for Saskatchewan and threw for 338 yards and three touchdowns in the win. Mitch Hillis, Yol Piok, Colton Klassen, and Chad Braun each had at least five receptions for the Huskies, with Piok catching seven for a team-high 105 yards and Hillis finishing with a team-leading eight catches for 78 yards including a touchdown. Tyler Chow was credited with 23 rushes for a game-high 147 yards.

Rams second-year slotback Ryan Schienbein was the game's top receiver, finishing with career highs of eight catches and 151 receiving yards as well as catching the second and third touchdowns of his career. Khalid Kornegay had four catches for 132 yards in his Rams debut, including an 85-yard touchdown on the team's first drive of the second half. Riley Wilson (eight catches for 79 yards) and Mitchell Picton (six catches for 95 yards and a touchdown) also had big games for Regina.

For the Rams defensively, Braedy Will had six solo and two assisted tackles in his first game as a Ram. Danny Nesbitt had five solo tackles, four assisted tackles, and forced a fumble, while Cord Delinte had the team's lone sack of the contest.

The Rams will now prepare for their home opener, set for next Thursday against Manitoba (0-1) at Mosaic Stadium. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m.

Rams score epic comeback win over Manitoba

The University of Regina Rams scored two touchdowns in the final 95 seconds to upset the No. 8-ranked Manitoba Bisons by a 41-38 score on Thursday night in a wild Canada West game at Mosaic Stadium.

Third-year quarterback Noah Picton engineered two massive drives in the game's final minutes, first leading the team on an 11-play, 87-yard drive that he finished off himself with a one-yard plunge. It looked bleak for the Rams after their onside kick attempt failed and Manitoba got the ball down to the Rams' 24-yard line up by five, but Corey Greene's tackle on Alex Christie jarred the ball loose and Zack McEachern pounced on it to give the Rams new life.

And the Rams offence did it again, starting from their own six-yard line. The big play was a Picton pass to Riley Wilson for a 49-yard gain and the nine-play, 104-yard drive was finished off with a touchdown pass to Ryan Schienbein on a 3rd-and-5 situation from 15 yards out.

Manitoba had one last chance with a heave towards the end zone, but there were only Rams in the vicinity and Joey Dwyer picked it off to seal the win.

"This might be my proudest moment so far as a coach," Rams head coach Steve Bryce said. "Feeling a part of the Rams family for over 25 years and knowing how hard these guys have worked, it's such an incredible feeling to come away with the win tonight."

Picton finished with video game numbers in the win, setting school records in both completions (40) and pass attempts (60), throwing for a career-high 490 yards, and tossing four touchdown passes for the second consecutive

week.

Mitchell Picton and Riley Wilson both hit the 1000-yard mark in career receiving yards in the win. Wilson had eight catches to lead all players with 127 yards, while Picton tied Schienbein for the game high with nine receptions and had 108 yards and two majors. Khalid Kornegay just missed hitting triple digits for the second week in a row, finishing with six catches for 94 yards and a touchdown.

Second-year running back Blake Anaka stepped in for an injured Jens Johnson and had 11 carries for a career-high 79 yards.

Danny Nesbitt led the team in tackles, finishing with seven solo and six assisted including one for a two-yard loss. Braedy Will had the team's first interception since 2014 after picking off the ball in the end zone late in the third quarter, while Mason Rossler had five solo tackles, two assisted tackles, and a pair of pass breakups.

Manitoba quarterback Theo Deezar also had stellar numbers, finishing 30-for-49 for 457 yards and two touchdowns. Christie finished with a game-high 97 rushing yards, while Shai Ross had a team-leading 126 yards on just four receptions. Both Trysten Dyce and Jesse Walker had 80 receiving yards.

D.J. Lalama was everywhere for the Bisons defence, leading Manitoba in tackles and also registering a late sack fumble that Houston Rennie scooped up and turned into a 19-yard touchdown return. Tristen O'Meara was credited with four pass breakups, while Evan Foster had two tackles for loss including a sack.

With how the game finished, it's a little hard to believe that the game was a defensive struggle for most of the first half. Neither team scored a touchdown until the two teams traded majors in the final three minutes of the second quarter - first an Anthony Dyck seven-yard reception for Manitoba, then a Mitchell Picton 16-yard touchdown catch with 11 seconds to go that sent the Rams into halftime with a narrow 13-10 lead.

The Rams scored two majors in the third quarter, both on 75-yard drives. Kornegay and Schienbein caught touchdowns from 10 yards out and 17 yards out, respectively, with Schienbein's giving the Rams a healthy 27-14 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

But then Manitoba reeled off 24 unanswered points, starting with a conceded safety. Then Christie punched one in from a yard out to cap off a 10-play, 80-yard drive for the Bisons that got them to within one score. An onside kick caught the Rams napping and three plays later Manitoba was back in the end zone on a Cam Fox 28-yard touchdown catch that put Manitoba up 30-27. Rennie's 19-yard fumble return touchdown put the Bisons up 38-27 and sent some fans towards the exits, but the Rams replied with those two huge drives to come away with a critical win for the program.

The Rams (1-1) will now prepare for a road tilt against UBC (1-0) next Saturday in Vancouver. Manitoba (0-2) is back in action next Friday with a home game against Alberta (0-1).

RECAP

Defence shines for Rams in win over UBC

On the strength of a sterling defensive performance, the University of Regina Rams pulled out a 20-10 road win over No. 6-ranked UBC on Saturday night at Thunderbird Stadium.

The Rams defence didn't allow a single offensive touchdown to UBC, as the Thunderbirds' lone major of the game came off a blocked punt.

"Our defence was outstanding tonight and especially when it counted the most," Rams head coach Steve Bryce said following the win. "They bent between the 20-yard lines and gave up some yards and first downs but they were lights out in the red zone. It was a frustrating first half, but we got back into a rhythm after halftime and started to execute and it paid off for us."

UBC made four trips into the red zone but only scored on one of them, a short field goal midway through the second quarter. The U of R forced turnovers on UBC's other three opportunities deep in Rams territory, starting with a Danny Nesbitt fumble recovery on a botched snap on the first drive of the game. Jeff Propp's first career interception put an end to a UBC drive late in the first half, and UBC's fourth and final trip to the red zone was ended after the Rams made a huge goal-line stand with the game tied

midway through the third.

And that goal-line stand led to the Rams taking their first lead of the game, as Noah Picton engineered a seven-play, 108-yard drive capped by a five-yard touchdown to Mitchell Picton - his second touchdown reception of the game - to put the U of R up 17-10. The Rams added a field goal to go up 20-10 with a little over four minutes to go, and those turned out to be the final points of the game. Braedy Will's second interception in as many games stopped UBC on their next possession, and the Thunderbirds' final drive of the game was put to an end after Korey Greene tackled Trivel Pinto inches short of the first-down marker on a third-down gamble to seal the win for the Rams.

Noah Picton finished 25-for-34 with 282 passing yards and two touchdowns. The usual suspects were the leading receivers, including Khalid Kornegay with just three catches but for a game-high 92 yards. Riley Wilson added seven catches for 79 yards, while Mitchell Picton had seven catches for 67 yards and a pair of touchdowns and Ryan Schienbein finished with five receptions for 26 yards. Atlee Simon missed last week and most of Week 1 due to injury, but returned to the lineup on Saturday and rushed 17 times for a game-high 84 yards.

Greene led the Rams defence in tackles, finishing with seven solo and four assisted. Michael Stefanovic added three solo tackles and six assisted, with his fellow linebackers Nesbitt and Zack McEachern each collecting four solo and four assisted. The picks by Propp and Will gave the Rams two interceptions for the second consecutive week.

UBC quarterback Michael O'Connor finished 32-for-48 and had 347 passing yards, but was intercepted twice and was also charged with a fumble on the game's opening drive. Will Watson (eight catches for 88 yards) and Marcus Davis (six for 81) were the leading receivers for the Thunderbirds, who fall to 1-2 with the loss.

Now tied for second in the Canada West standings, the Rams (2-1) will likely break into the CIS Top Ten ranking next week and now prepare for a home game next Friday night against unbeaten Calgary (3-0).

UBC will look to get back up to the .500 mark next weekend with a road game at winless Alberta (0-3).

Last-minute hit by Dwyer seals win over Calgary

Joey Dwyer's punishing hit on Calgary quarterback Jimmy Underdahl forced a turnover with only seconds remaining, sealing a 32-27 win for the University of Regina Rams over the No. 2-ranked and previously unbeaten Dinos on Friday night at Mosaic.

Underdahl had hooked up with Kelton Bailey for a 36-yard touchdown just minutes earlier to get Calgary to within five, and the Dinos looked as if they were about to complete the comeback with a game-winning touchdown as Underdahl streaked towards the end zone from Regina's 12. But Dwyer rocked the Calgary pivot with a crushing hit on the one-yard line, jarring the ball loose with safety Braedy Will right there to jump on it for the turnover.

The win puts the No. 9-ranked Rams (3-1) into first place in the Canada West standings. Calgary is also 3-1, but the Rams will hold the tiebreaker as Friday was the lone meeting of the Canada West schedule for these two teams.

"When these guys start to believe, they can accomplish just about anything and we saw that out there tonight," Rams head coach Steve Bryce said. "We didn't even play a full four quarters of football tonight, so I'm really excited to see what these guys can do when we finally put it together for all 60 minutes."

Down three starters on the offensive line, the Rams couldn't get much going on the ground and almost completely relied on their vaunted aerial attack. And fourth-year slotback Mitchell Picton was the primary weapon, collecting 13 passes for 215 yards

and catching three touchdowns in a span of under 14 minutes in the second half. Riley Wilson also had a big game, catching five passes for a total of 124 yards while Ryan Schienbein had three catches for 87 yards.

Noah Picton completed a season-low 23 passes, but had the deep ball working for a large majority of the game and finished with 452 yards and four touchdown passes.

Making his first start for the U of R, rookie defensive lineman Nicholas Dheilily joined Stan Van Sichem and teammate Michael Stefanovic as the only Rams ever to collect three sacks in one CIS game. Stefanovic also had a sack to give the Rams four for the game. Dwyer was also in on a team-leading 14 tackles to go along with his game-winning forced fumble.

Underdahl finished 27-for-45 on the night with 313 passing yards, with Hunter Karl as his top receiver with six catches for 74 yards. Starting running back Quentin Chown was injured early in the ball game, so Jeshrun Antwi and Bryce Harper had the majority of the carries for Calgary. Antwi had 11 carries for 73 yards, while Harper finished with 11 rushes for 48 yards.

Aaron Statz and Adam Laurensse both had picks for Calgary, while Matthew Carson and Connor McGough both had a sack. Micah Teitz was in on a team-leading 10 tackles for the Dinos defence.

The game started out all Dinos, with pretty much every yardstick pointing Calgary's way after the first quarter. They led 11-0 after the opening 15 minutes with 164 yards of offence - and that was 167 more than the Rams, who only ran six plays in the quarter and had minus-3 yards to show for it.

Calgary added to its lead with Niko DiFonte's second field goal of the game early in the second, giving the Dinos a 14-0 advantage. But the Rams finally made something happen just before half, as Picton found Schienbein for a 68-yard major with just over a minute to go before the break. The Rams added a late safety to make it 14-9 at the break, then broke the game wide open in the third.

It took the Pictons two plays to score on their second possession of the second half, first with a 52-yard completion and then a 13-yard touchdown reception that gave the Rams their first lead of the game. The lead was extended to 18-14 with a Daniel Scrapper field goal a few minutes later, and the Rams scored another major on the next possession thanks in large part to a 38-yard completion to Wilson that set up the second 13-yard touchdown catch of the quarter for Picton.

Picton's third touchdown catch was a 58-yard connection early in the fourth quarter that put the Rams up 32-17. DiFonte added a 34-yard field goal on the ensuing drive to get the Dinos to within 12, eventually leading to Bailey's touchdown and the last drive of the game which ended with Dwyer's hit.

RECAP

Rams open new Mosaic Stadium with win

The No. 4-ranked University of Regina Rams improved to 4-1 on the season and improved their winning streak to four games with a 37-29 win over visiting Saskatchewan on Saturday afternoon in Canada West action.

The game was the first to be played at the new Mosaic Stadium, with the announced crowd of 16,500 setting a new Canada West attendance record in any sport. The Rams avenge their only loss of the season with the win, as they suffered a two-point overtime loss in Week 1 to the Huskies in Saskatoon.

"Overall I thought the guys played pretty well besides a few penalty issues, and they were able to stay focused all things considered," Rams head coach Steve Bryce said. "We really enjoyed the big-game atmosphere at the new stadium, and I really hope that we hooked some of them and we'll see some of them out for our next home game against UBC."

Rams quarterback Noah Picton completed 29 of his 42 passes for 370 yards and four touchdowns, throwing two majors apiece to Mitchell Picton and Ryan Schienbein. Schienbein finished as the game's top receiver with career highs in both receptions (13) and receiving yards (189), while Picton had seven catches for 85 yards. Atlee Simon had his best game of the year for the Rams, finishing with a game-high 114 rushing yards on 23 carries.

Nicholas Dheilly led the Rams with 7.5 tackles and also brought down Saskatchewan quarterback Kyle Siemens once to pull into sole possession of the Canada West lead with four sacks on the season. Danny Nesbitt had

a pair of interceptions to become the first Rams player with multiple picks in a game since Kirby Kezama in the 2012 Hardy Cup game, while Jeff Propp added his second interception of the year.

Siemens was 23-for-43 for Saskatchewan (2-3) and finished with 265 passing yards including a five-yard touchdown to Colton Klassen in the first quarter. Tyler Chow had 17 carries for 63 yards and a pair of majors, while Chad Braun had four catches for a team-leading 83 yards.

Spencer Krieger and Eric Thakurdeen both had interceptions for the Saskatchewan defence.

Nesbitt's first pick of the game set up the game's first score. The Rams finished off a quick four-play, 45-yard drive with a 11-yard touchdown pass to Schienbein for their first points at the new stadium. Saskatchewan responded immediately with what would be the longest scoring drive of the game, going 87 yards in eight plays and tying up the game with the short reception by Klassen.

Daniel Scrapper's 29-yard field goal on the final play of the first quarter put the Rams back ahead, but Saskatchewan took their only lead of the game midway through the second after Thakurdeen's interception set up the Huskies with great field position. Six plays and 27 yards later, Chow punched it in from two yards out to put Saskatchewan up 15-10 including a Sean Stenger rouge on the ensuing kickoff.

But the Rams - and specifically Mitchell Picton - struck twice in quick succession before halftime. Picton grabbed his eight touchdown catch of the year to finish off a 77-yard drive with just over two minutes left in the half, and then caught his ninth of the season from 25 yards just 91 seconds later on a drive that also featured a 30-yard completion to Simon.

Regina took a 24-18 lead into half after another Stenger field goal on the last play of the second quarter, and scored 13 consecutive points in the third to put some distance between the two teams. Picton found Schienbein up the seam for a 60-yard touchdown five minutes into the third and a single, a safety, and a field goal gave the Rams a 37-18 lead heading into the fourth.

That would be all the Rams would need, though Saskatchewan made things plenty interesting after a late Chow touchdown and another Stenger kickoff single made the score 37-29 with under four minutes to go. Saskatchewan got the ball twice in the final minutes of the game, but Nesbitt's second interception put an end to the first drive and a failed Saskatchewan gamble on third and 21 sealed the win for the Rams.

With the Canada West bye week upcoming, both teams will return to action two week-ends from now. Saskatchewan will host UBC (3-2) on Oct. 14, while the Rams will hit the road for a matchup with Alberta (0-5).
