College Profile



Founded in 1848, Rhodes is a private, residential, coeducational college of liberal arts and sciences. Its approximately 1,700 students choose among 32 majors leading to a Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science degree. The college also awards a Master of Science degree in accounting.

One of the few selective U.S. liberal arts colleges located in an urban setting, Rhodes occupies 100 wooded acres in midtown Memphis. The campus has been nationally recognized for its adherence to the standards of collegiate Gothic architecture and has been frequently cited as one of the most beautiful in the nation. The college has a strong tradition of service, with 83 percent of all students involved in community service activities. Widely recognized as a top-tier liberal arts college, Rhodes is governed by a student-administered honor code.

Hallmarks of a Rhodes education are the strong mentoring relationships between students and faculty and the emphasis on the synergistic relationship between classroom learning and experiential activities such as research, internships, service and study abroad.

Rhodes at a Glance

- The College's approximately 1,700 students are a diverse group, representing 43 states, the District of Columbia, and 5 foreign countries.
- The student/faculty ratio is 10.5:1, and the average class size is 13.
- 95% of faculty members have a doctoral degree or the highest degree in their discipline.
- There are 24 academic departments with 8 interdisciplinary majors. The most popular majors: Business Administration, Biology, Political Science, and English.
- 74% of students live on campus in one of the 15 residence halls.
- Active students: 83% participate in community service; 75% participate in academic internships at 100 local, national, and international employers; 65% participate in intramural and club sports (27% varsity).
- Very successful graduates: twice national average acceptance rate to medical school (AMCAS data); over 95% admissions to business, divinity and law schools (Career Services surveys); top employers: Ernst & Young, Morgan Keegan, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital, Teach for America and Youth Villages.

**Head Men's Basketball Coach
Associate Director of Athletics**

Herb Hilgeman begins his 34th season as Rhodes' head basketball coach in 2009-2010. In addition to his coaching duties, he also serves as an associate athletic director. During his tenure as head coach, Hilgeman's teams have been nationally ranked 14 times in the NCAA Division III Top 25.

In his 33 years at Rhodes, Hilgeman has become the all-time leader in wins in the school's history. Entering the 2009-10 season, he has a career record of 463-341 as a Lynx coach, which equates to a winning percentage of (.578) – ranking him top 5 all-time in the SCAC. With his 463 wins, he is two shy of the SCAC all-time leader in career victories. He also ranks in the Top 40 among Division III head coaches in winning percentage and career victories.

Under Hilgeman's direction, Rhodes men's basketball has been ranked as high as 4th in the nation, 1st in scoring margin, 2nd in scoring offense, 3rd in won-lost percentage, and 6th in free throw percentage. In 1997-98, Rhodes led the nation in field goal percentage defense. The 1992-93, team finished the season with a 21-6 record and advanced to the 2nd round of the NCAA tournament, after hosting a 1st round game in Mallory-Hyde Gymnasium and defeating Virginia Wesleyan by a score of 71-62. During the 1991-92 season, the Lynx thrilled fans with a school record 20-game winning streak – the longest streak in Division III for that year.

Hilgeman has also been recognized by his peers for his coaching successes, having been named the South Region Coach of the Year for both the 1979-80 and 1980-81 seasons, the Collegiate Athletic Conference Coach (CAC) of the Year in 1990-91, and the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) Coach of the Year in 1992-93.

A native of Southgate, Kentucky, Hilgeman graduated from Miami University (Ohio) in 1972 with a B.S. in Education. As a four-year letterman in basketball while at Miami, he participated in the 1969-70 NIT Tournament and in the 1970-71 NCAA Tournament. He then served for two years as a basketball and baseball coach at Highlands High School in Ft. Thomas, Kentucky, before moving to Centre College in 1975 as an assistant basketball coach and head track coach. A year later, he accepted his present position at Rhodes College and in 1978 received his master's degree in Education from Memphis State University.

Coach Hilgeman and his wife, Beth, reside in Cordova, Tennessee. They have four children: Michelle, Mary, David, and Charlie.

Assistant Coordinator of Recreational Services**

Thad Phillips begins his third year at Rhodes College this season. Before joining the Lynx, Phillips coached a season at SCAC member Oglethorpe University. He was a member of the coaching staff at Carroll University (Waukesha, WI)

for two seasons, with a trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2005. Prior to coaching at Carroll, Phillips was a staff member at Concordia University Wisconsin for three seasons, culminating in a conference championship in 2004. Coach Phillips was a starting guard on a conference championship team at Concordia University Wisconsin. He also serves as an assistant coordinator of recreational services at Rhodes.



Lee Qualls

Assistant Basketball Coach

Lee Qualls enters his 11th season as a Lynx basketball assistant coach. A Memphis native, Qualls was a four-year starter, first team all-conference, first team all-suburban and MVP at Ramsey High School in Ramsey, New Jersey. Qualls attended The College of William & Mary on a football scholarship, and received

his B.A. in Business Administration in 1983. He later earned his MBA from UNC-Chapel Hill in 1988.

In addition to contributing to individual player instruction and game management, Qualls will also assist in the Lynx recruiting efforts. He brings a unique coaching perspective to the program, including his corporate experiences in international marketing.

Andrew is in his first year as the student assistant for the Lynx. Currently a junior at Rhodes, Andrew is majoring in psychology with a religious studies minor. He lived the majority of his life in New England, but currently calls Hendersonville, North Carolina home.

Andrew Gibson begins his third year as the head athletic trainer. He joined Rhodes College after completing an athletic training fellowship at Campbell Clinic.

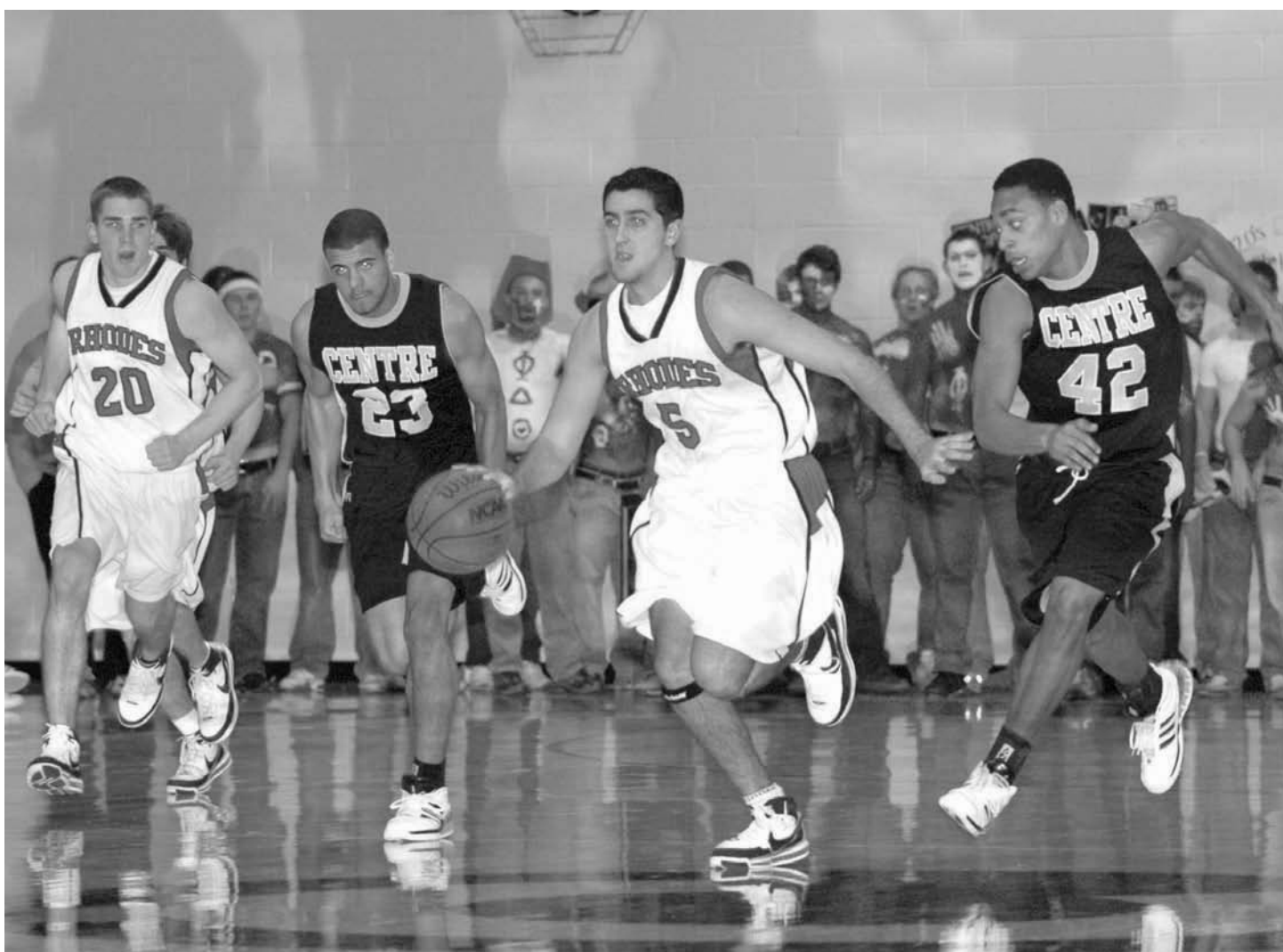

2009-2010 Season Outlook

Rhodes College looks to rebound from a subpar last season, and this year's senior class is determined to make that a reality. Rhodes returns five seniors and a total of eight letter winners. Of those eight letter winners only one started more than ten games last year, and only two have started more than fifteen games in their career. Even with those statistics the Lynx feel this year can be special and are determined to prove it.

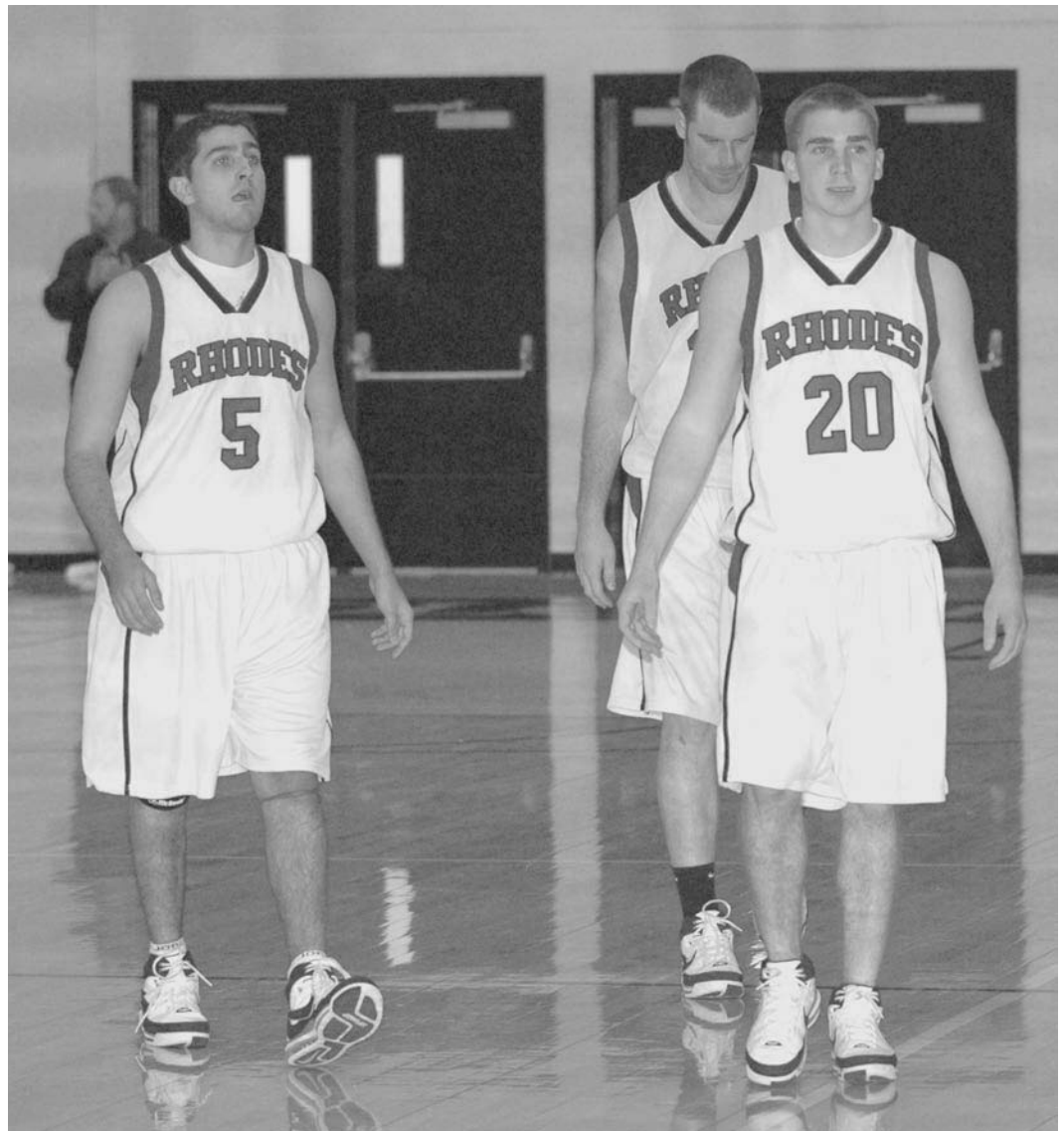
Returning for Rhodes at the point guard position is senior **Andyshea Saberioon** (Houston, TX). Saberioon played in a career high 22 games last season and averaged 7 points for the Lynx. Senior **Reid Hamilton** (Birmingham, AL) is looking to return to his sophomore form when he started 26 games for the Lynx. Reid appeared in 13 games for Rhodes last season after missing the first semester recovering from a knee injury. **Larry Cunningham, Jr.** (St. Charles, MO) will be looked upon to be a dominant force in the middle for the Lynx. Cunningham has played in 20 games or more each season since his arrival on campus, playing a career high 218 minutes last season. **Chris Eberle** (Cincinnati, OH) and **Andrew Sillyman** (Cordova, TN) will be relied on this season from the perimeter positions. Eberle, a strong combo guard, is able to guard multiple positions and is able to knock down the three point shot. Sillyman is a long 6'7 athlete who is more than capable of stretching the defense with his long range shooting ability, and his length makes him a quality defender.

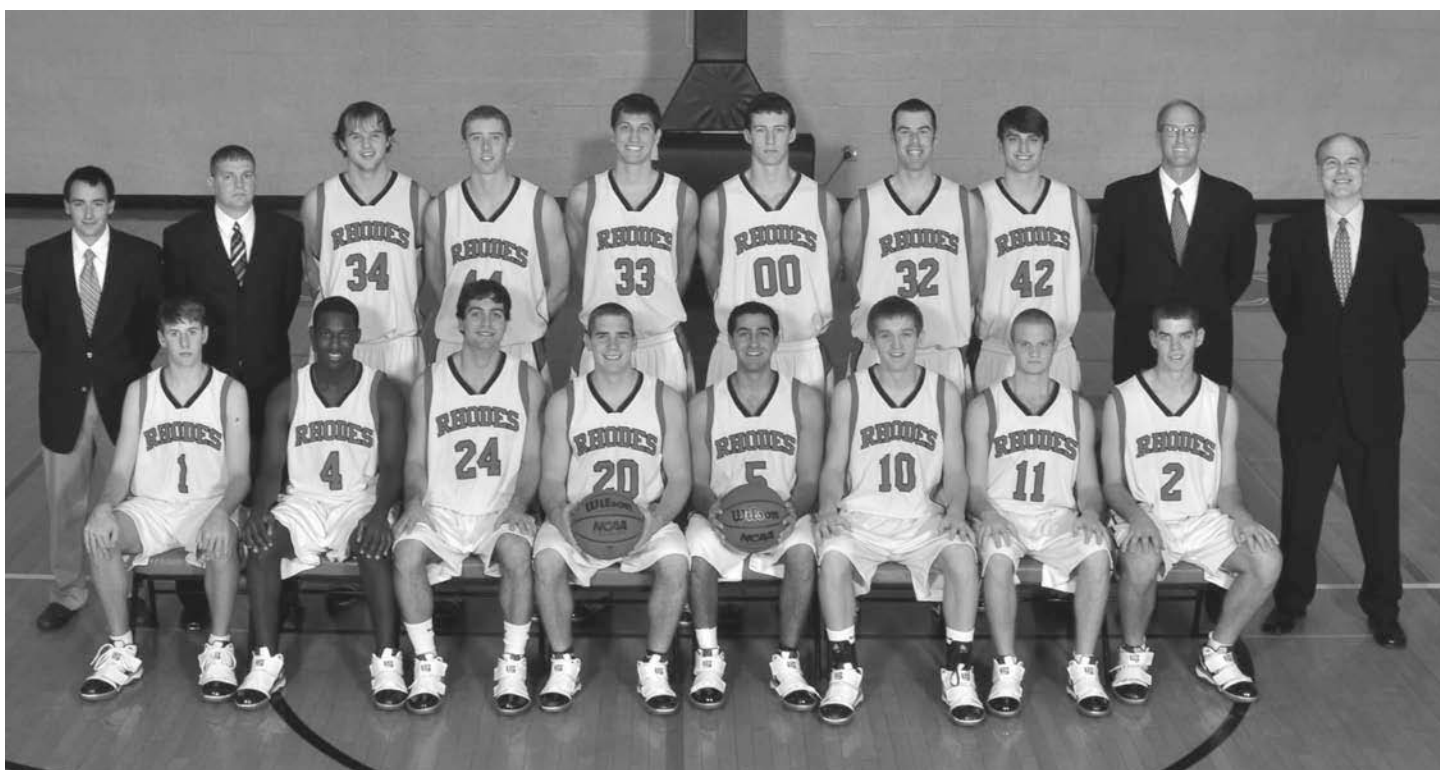
The remaining returning letter winners for Rhodes are junior **Josh Arant** (Charlotte, NC), sophomores **Kory Kilpatrick** (Athens, GA) and **Jonas Williams** (Birmingham, AL). Arant is a strong forward who can score from beyond the arc as well as drives to the basket. He will be looking for playing time this season after gathering experience the past two seasons. Kilpatrick started 19 games last season for the Lynx before a stress fracture ended his season prematurely. Kilpatrick recorded

3 double doubles last season and led the Lynx in rebounding with 7.8 per game. He scored in double figures in 5 games last year and recorded double digit rebounds in 6 games. Williams is a 6'8 power center who played in 21 games last season. Williams is a big, strong post who will be looked upon to control the middle for the Lynx.

Trying to replace the graduating senior class is a strong first year class of six. **Reid Cates** (Westview HS, Martin, TN), **Andrew Galow** (Oswego HS, Oswego, IL), **Theo Hartwell** (Academic Magnet, Charleston, SC), **Joey Miller** (Athens Academy, Athens, GA) **Brad Luckett** (Christian Brothers HS, Cordova, TN) and **Jonathan Smith** (St. George's, Bartlett, TN) all look to compete for minutes this season.

When asked about his outlook on the 2009-2010 season, Coach Hilgeman said, "We are excited to have five seniors to lead us and blend with our new players. Our team is a close, cohesive group that will play hard and play together."

SCAC Profile

History of the SCAC

The Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference (SCAC) was founded and began operation on September 1, 1962, as the College Athletic Conference (CAC). Centre College of Danville, Kentucky; Southwestern at Memphis (Tennessee) (now known as Rhodes College); The University of the South of Sewanee, Tennessee; and Washington and Lee University of Lexington, Virginia, were the four charter members of the conference. Later in 1962, Washington University of St. Louis, Missouri, became the fifth member and the CAC remained unchanged until 1972.

Following membership changes throughout the 1970s and 1980s, the conference went through restructuring and renaming. With the addition of Millsaps College of Jackson, Mississippi, and Trinity University of San Antonio, Texas, in 1988 and Hendrix College of Conway, Arkansas, and Oglethorpe University of

Atlanta, Georgia, in 1991, membership reached a then all-time high of eight. In 1991, the conference renamed itself the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference, its first full-time commissioner Steve Argo was hired, and a conference office was established in Atlanta, Georgia. The SCAC added Southwestern University of Georgetown, Texas, in 1993 with participation beginning in the 1994-95 academic year. In 1997-98, the SCAC added DePauw University of Greencastle, Indiana, with participation beginning in 1998-99. Austin College of Sherman, Texas and Colorado College of Colorado Springs, Colorado, were confirmed as members of the league with participation beginning in the 2006-07 academic year. Birmingham-Southern College of Birmingham, Alabama, was approved as the 12th member of the SCAC with play in 2007-08. In July of 2008 Dwayne Hanberry was named the 2nd commissioner in the history of the SCAC.

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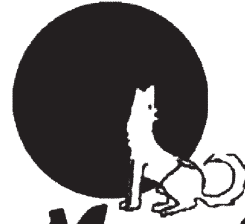
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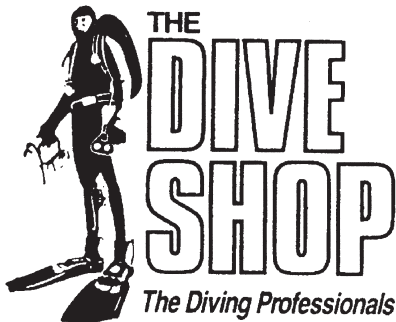


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Athletics Facilities

The Bryan Campus Life Center (BCLC) officially opened on March 17, 1997, to Rhodes students, faculty, staff and alumni. The \$22 million facility has become the centerpiece of campus life at Rhodes. Within the facility, there is the Mallory-Hyde Gymnasium; a 6,900-square-foot fitness room; a multi-sports forum that can accommodate basketball, volleyball, baseball, golf, track and tennis; an indoor track; three racquetball courts; two squash courts and six locker rooms. Also within its walls are the Lynx Lair, an upscale snack bar and grill for students, and the McCallum Ballroom for lectures, dances and special events.

Immediately adjacent to the BCLC is Alburty Pool. Originally installed in 1977, Alburty Pool received a new deck and pool house with the construction of the Bryan Campus Life Center. The twenty-five meter pool contains six lanes and is heated. In 1998-99, for the first time, a bubble was placed over the



pool to allow the men's and women's intercollegiate swim teams to practice during the winter, as well as provide some additional lap swimming time for students, faculty, and staff.



Athletics Facilities

The Bryan Campus Life Center also has become the nerve center for Rhodes Athletics. Lynx athletes and coaches have a substantial locker room, spacious offices and a tremendous training room. The state-of-the-art, 6,900-square-foot fitness room combines free weights with resistive cardiovascular equipment to meet a variety of needs for all users. There is also a state-of-the-art sound system and four televisions equipped with cable for users' viewing and listening pleasure. Colleges with fewer than 5,000 students average 1.3 square feet per student in their fitness facilities. Rhodes far exceeds this standard, providing 4.9 square feet per.

Fargason Field is home to Lynx football. All Rhodes home games are played before the 3,300 capacity stadium. The field is settled within the college's track facility which boasts one of the region's highest quality outdoor tracks.
