HEN TRACKS

- The Blue Hens return to action for a second straight road game when they travel to Richmond for a critical CAA matchup against well-known rivals.

- Head Coach Danny Rocco will be traveling to Richmond for the first time since spending five seasons with the Spiders. He compiled a 43-22 record during his tenure and is the only coach in Richmond history to usher them to three straight FCS playoff appearances.

- As a head coach, Rocco is 25-6 at Robins Stadium.

- Last year, these two teams played an absolute thriller in Newark with the Blue Hens winning a 42-35 game in OT in front of a jam-packed Delaware Stadium. Two current NFL players starred in that game with UD's Bilal Nichols (now with the Chicago Bears) and Richmond's starting QB Kyle Lauletta (now with the NY Giants).

- These two teams have squared off in quite the battles during the series' 87-year history. In six of the past 10 meetings, the game has been decided by six points or less, including two games that went into OT.

- Delaware will be looking to bounce back after falling to defending national champion and top-ranked North Dakota State, 38-10, on Sept. 22. In his 13 seasons as a head coach, Danny Rocco is 35-11 (.761) following a loss.

- Delaware has won six of its previous eight games coming off a bye week dating back to the 2010 season. As a head coach, Danny Rocco is 8-4 coming off a bye week.

- In his 12-plus seasons of being a head coach, Danny Rocco has compiled a 36-34 (.514) record in road games. Average road winning pct. at the FCS level is .343.

- Delaware's defense continues to be its biggest strength as it limited the Bison to just 10 points in the final three quarters. The Blue Hens' first team defense has allowed just four TD drives of 60 yards or more in the first four games of the season.

- Turnovers have been critical for the Blue Hens over the past two years with Delaware boasting a 11-4 record when having one or fewer turnovers in a game. Last year, the Blue Hens went 6-1 in such games. On the opposite side, Delaware is 7-2 under Coach Rocco when forcing at least two turnovers in a game.

GOING STREAKING

Redshirt senior PK Frank Raggo has upped his consecutive PAT streak to 74 after his boot in the fourth quarter against NDSU. The 74 straight PATs is the program record.

Senior Jamie Jarmon has now caught a pass in 19 straight games dating back to 2016. Classmates Vinny Papale (8) and Joe Walker (7) have streaks of their own as well.

WRAPPING THEM UP

Senior LB Charles Bell moved in to 22nd place on the all-time tackle list in program history with 271 for his career. Classmate and position mate Troy Reeder (two-plus seasons) needs just 12 to move into the 200-plus club, he would be the 48th player in school history to reach that total.

Senior S Nasir Adderley now has 204 career tackles, which ranks 46th all-time in program history. He is just the 15th defensive back to reach 200 in a career.

THAT'D BE JUST GRAND

With just 157 more yards from senior RB Kani Kane, the Blue Hens would have a trio of 1,000 yard career rushers.

Thomas Jefferson (373 carries, 1802 yards) and Kareem Williams (275 carries, 1403) have already reached that category.

DAS BOOTS

Jake Roth extended his school record for career touchbacks to 50 vs. NDSU. He has 50 career touchbacks in 114 kickoffs (a .412 success rate).

Frank Raggo 's nine career 40+ field goals is one shy of the UD record 10 by Sean Baner (2010-13).

OWNING THE CLOCK

Time of possession is always critical and the Blue Hens have proven that, winning nine of their previous 12 games in which they've owned the clock.

NO FLY ZONE

Dating back to 2016, the Blue Hens have at least one INT in 15 of their past 22 games, including 8 of 11 games last fall. So far this year, Delaware has INTs in two of their first four games.

THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

Kane has proved to be quite a duo with backfield mate De-Joun Lee, as the pair provide a "thunder and lightning" element to the Blue Hens' offense.

Kane ran for 106 yards in Delaware's opener against Rhode Island, while Lee ran for 94 on just 11 carries in the Blue Hens' win over Lafayette.

KANE TRAIN

Kane's 100+ yard performance against URI was the third such game of his brief Delaware career. In his 14 games as a Blue Hen, every time Kane has gotten 20+ carries, he's rumbled for at least 99 yards.

PRACTICE COVERAGE

Delaware practices are open to the media, but please call in advance if you plan on attending. Practices during the week (Tues.-Thurs.) are usually from 4 pm to 6:30 p.m. Players and coaches will usually be available after practice. There is no media availability on Friday or pregame Saturday. Please contact the University of Delaware Athletics Communications Office for the schedule.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Post-game interviews for home games will be conducted in the media room of the Bob Carpenter Center. Coach Rocco and requested players will be available after a brief cooling off period. Interviews following road games will be subject to the policies set forth by the home teams and will run through Assistant AD for Athletic Communications Scott Day.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

Arrangements for media credentials for University of Delaware's home football games in 2018 must be made through the University of Delaware Athletics Communications Office. Requests by accredited media members should be made in writing and submitted on company letterhead to Scott Day.

Priority of issuance of credentials will be given to daily newspapers and television stations which cover Delaware football on a regular basis.

Credentials must be requested at least 48 hours prior to requested game.

MEDIA WILL CALL

A will call window will be operated on game days at Delaware Stadium box office for the distribution of credentials which have not been mailed. Proper ID will be required.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

A media packet will be distributed to your seat prior to kickoff. It will include a game program, flipcard and game notes for each team and the CAA. If you are missing any material, please contact a member of the University of Delaware Athletics Communications Office.

Quarterly statistics and play-by-play will be distributed during the game. Final statistics and booklets will be distributed as soon as possible following the game.

THE STORIES BEHIND THE UNIFORMS

IT'S A FAMILY THING

The Reederers have been synonymous with Blue Hen football since the 1980s when Dan Reeder roamed the backfield at the University of Delaware before moving on to an NFL career. Now, Dan's two sons, Colby and Troy have become All-Conference LBs for the Blue Hens.

OH BROTHER

Delaware will be the only FCS program in the country with three sets of brothers on the roster this fall. Along with the Reeder brothers, Pat and MJ Kehoe will be critical pieces of the Blue Hens offense, while Brandon and Brian Dennis will both be defensive backs this fall.

GETTING DOWN TO BUSINESS, LITERALLY

Fifth-year senior QB J.P. Caruso spent three weeks this summer interning at a business firm in New York City to gain real life experience for his post-graduate plans.

IT'S ALL IN THE LEG

It's no surprise that All-CAA kicker Frank Raggo has a soccer background. That soccer background runs back to one of the most historical players in soccer history, Pele. Raggo's grandfather, Julio Mazzei, served as the head coach of the New York Cosmos of the NASL and played a major role in bringing Pele to play in the U.S.

QUITE A LINEAGE

Nasir Adderley made highlight reel play after highlight reel play in 2017. He's one of only two players in all of FCS that had 75 tackles and five INTs last year. That standout play is nothing new to the Adderley name. His cousin is Herb Adderley, NFL Hall of Famer, three-time Super Bowl Champion and all-pro defensive back for the Packers and Cowboys. His grandfather, Nelson, played at Ohio State and later played in the CFL.

HE REALLY IS A MAN OF MANY TALENTS

Jamie Jarmon is not only Delaware's version of a swiss army knife on the offensive side, but he's somewhat of a swiss army knife off the football field as well. His athleticism was on display throughout his youth, which led him to a three-year minor league baseball career after he was drafted in the second round of the MLB Draft in 2012. Outside of his athletic prowess, he spent several years serving as a volunteer firefighter.

I'LL TAKE THAT GUY ON MY JEOPARDY TEAM

Redshirt junior Collin Wallish spent most of the spring transitioning into the starting center role for the Blue Hens offensive line. It's no easy task, but if anyone could do it, it was Wallish, who holds a near perfect 4.0 grade point average while studying engineering at the University of Delaware.

TICKLING THE IVORIES

Junior WR and Delaware native Chichi Amachi skills aren't limited to the gridiron as the William Penn High School graduate is also a pianist.

A MAN'S BEST FRIEND

Other than his family, it's tough to find anything that head coach Danny Rocco loves more than his nearly 200-pound St. Bernard, Max.

BY GOD, THAT'S KRETKOWSKI'S MUSIC

If one were to talk to James Kretkowski without seeing him, you may not get the impression of a big, intimidating figure. However, his 6-6, 305-pound frame matched with his long hair and impressive beard make him a prime candidate for professional wrestling, which is exactly what the Oceanside, N.Y. native hopes to pursue after his collegiate playing career is over.

CONNECT FOUR (OR MORE)

Since 1990, only three schools that have competed at the NCAA FCS level during that entire time period have won at least four games every single season. Delaware, Montana, and Northern Iowa are the members of this exclusive club of consistent winners.

YEAR TWO

In his previous two stops as head coach, Rocco coached both Liberty and Richmond to at least one eight-win season in his first two years at the helm. Out of his 12 years as a head coach, Rocco has eight seasons of eight wins or more and 10 of at least seven or more.

ROCCIN' OUT

Head Coach Danny Rocco enters the 2018 season just three wins away from his milestone 100th career victory as a head coach. He is currently seventh among active head coaches in winning pct. with a 97-46 (.678) career mark. He remains the only FCS head coach (30 of them in total) with 12+ years of experience without a losing season.

THE BELL RINGS AGAIN

When senior LB and two-time All-CAA honoree Charles Bell's season ended in 2017 due to a broken vertebrae, most thought it was the end of his football career. However, Bell is back at 100-percent and will be a critical cog in Delaware's defensive unit this fall. He is serving as team captain for the third straight season.

University of Delaware Director of Athletics and Recreation Services Chrissi Rawak announced on Dec. 14, 2016 that Danny Rocco, who enjoyed outstanding success at NCAA Division I FCS members Liberty University and University of Richmond, had been selected to lead the Blue Hens as head football coach.

Rocco, 58, who has three 10-win seasons and three NCAA FCS Playoff appearances under his belt, became just the 23rd head coach in Delaware's 125-season history and just the sixth head coach since 1940.

A veteran of 33 seasons as a football coach, including the last 12 as a head coach at the NCAA Division I FCS level, Rocco has found nothing but success. That success followed him to Delaware in his first season.

Rocco led the Blue Hens to a 7-4 record in 2017, a three-win improvement from the previous year and on the brink of the program's first FCS playoff berth since 2010.

In his 12 seasons as a head coach, he has never posted a losing season and owns a career record of 97-46 (.678).

A native of Huntingdon, Pa. and a 1984 graduate of Wake Forest University, Rocco inherits a program that has won six national championships, finished as national runner-up five times, made 20 NCAA Tournament appearances, and captured 16 conference championships.

Rocco transformed the Spiders back into a national power during his five-year tenure. He inherited a team that went 3-8 in 2011 and led the 2012 squad to a five-win turnaround with an 8-3 overall record and a share of the CAA title.

He went on to lead Richmond to a five-year record of 43-22 that included three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, including a berth in the semifinals in 2015 and a trip to the quarterfinals this past season.

He was named the Touchdown Club of Richmond Coach of the Year in both 2012 and 2015 and was a finalist for the FCS Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year award both of those seasons.

During his 12 seasons as a head coach (five at Richmond, six at Liberty), he has been a National Coach of the Year Finalist five times, and has won six conference championships and four conference Coach of the Year honors.

He has coached 167 all-conference honorees and 32 student-athletes who garnered All-American honors, including two Delaware student-athletes in 2017 - Brody Kern and Bilal Nichols.

Fourteen different players under Rocco's tutelage have gone on to earn professional contracts and his teams have finished in the final FCS Top-25 poll in eight of the past 10 seasons, including finishing No. 3 in 2015.

During his time with the Spiders, Richmond defeated 14 nationally-ranked opponents, including a victory over then-No.3 James Madison during the 2015 season when ESPN's College GameDay was in Harrisonburg, Va.

Rocco is only the third man in Colonial Athletic Association Football (formerly Yankee Conference and Atlantic 10 Conference) history to serve as head coach at two different institutions. Jim Reid coached at former CAA member Massachusetts in 1986-91 before moving on to serve as head coach at Richmond in 1995-2003. Current University of Michigan defensive coordinator Don Brown was head coach at Northeastern in 2000-03 before moving over to UMass in 2004-08.

At Liberty, Rocco made an immediate impact, taking over a program that had gone 1-10 in 2005 and building the Flames into a Big South Conference power. He led his first team to a 6-5 record (the largest turnaround of any FCS program that season) and guided the squad to Big South Conference Championship four times in six seasons.

He posted an overall record of 47-20 (26-5 in league play) and was named Big South Coach of the Year four times. He would go on to be named a finalist for the national Eddie Robinson Award and Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award in each of the final three seasons in Lynchburg. Liberty finished the last four years ranked inside the Top 25 in both major FCS polls.

Before becoming a head coach, Rocco spent 23 seasons at the NCAA Division I Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and National Football League levels.

Prior to his arrival at Liberty, Rocco spent the previous five seasons at Virginia. He was a part of four consecutive bowl appearances for the Cavaliers, including back-to-back Continental Tire Bowl victories in 2002 and 2003. During his time in Charlottesville, UVA piled up 37 wins with Rocco serving as the associate head coach and linebackers coach under Al Groh.

In addition to his coaching duties with the Cavaliers, he also served as the recruiting coordinator during his first two years in Charlottesville. His 2002 recruiting class was ranked in the top 10 in the nation by many of the major recruiting services, including a fifth-place ranking by ESPN.

Prior to UVA, Rocco spent the 2000 season alongside Groh as an assistant linebacker and special teams coach with the New York Jets. Before joining the Jets, he was the linebackers coach at Maryland during the 1998 and 1999 campaigns.

Prior to his time in College Park, Rocco spent four seasons at the University of Texas, where the Longhorns captured three straight conference titles, including winning the inaugural Big 12 Championship in 1996 and earning three consecutive trips to bowl games (Sun Bowl, Sugar Bowl and Fiesta Bowl).

Before Tom Coughlin was a Super Bowl winning coach with the New York Giants, he was Rocco's mentor at Boston College for two seasons. As a defensive assistant, Rocco was a part of the revitalization of the Golden Eagles, returning the program to the national stage as participants in the 1992 Hall of Fame Bowl and the 1993 Carquest Bowl.

Rocco also spent the 1987 season as the linebackers coach at Colorado under Bill McCartney and three seasons as the linebackers coach at Tulsa.

The start of Rocco's coaching career came at his alma mater, Wake Forest, where he spent three seasons in total, two as a graduate assistant and one as the defensive line coach during the 1986 season.

As a player, Rocco's collegiate career began at Penn State, where he earned two varsity letters and competed in the 1979 Liberty Bowl and the 1980 Fiesta Bowl before transferring to Wake Forest. While in Winston-Salem, he was a two-year starter and senior captain for Groh.

He was no stranger to coaching after growing up in a football family. His father, Frank Rocco, Sr., served as an assistant coach at Penn State before joining the Liberty staff in 2000. Frank Rocco, Jr., also joined the Flames staff in 2000 as a wide receivers and quarterbacks coach and received a promotion to offensive coordinator prior to his departure in 2003. Frank, and brother, Dave, are both currently coaching at the high school level in Virginia.

In January of 2016, Rocco was elected to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees.

Rocco is married to the former Julie Mills and they are the parents of two children, David and Amy. David currently serves as offensive coordinator at Western Illinois University.
