RICHMOND SPIDERS (3-0)

• This is the second of two campus games Richmond will host as part of this year's Roman Legends Classic Presented By Old Trapper. In the championship round, Richmond will face Wisconsin at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, NY on November 25 and either Auburn or New Mexico on November 26.

• Richmond is 3-0 for the first time since 2012 and third time under Chris Mooney (also 2006). The Spiders are seeking their first 4-0 start since 1985, when they advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

• The Spiders have scored at least 90 points in all three of their games this season. It's the first time the Spiders have scored at least 90 points in three straight games since February, 1969. The last time they scored 90 in four straight was December, 1954.

• Jacob Gilyard was named A-10 Co-Player of the Week with VCU's Marcus Santos-Silva after averaging 22 points, 5.5 assists, and four steals while shooting 65 percent from the field in Richmond's wins over Vanderbilt and CSUN. It's the second time Gilyard has been named A-10 Player of the Week (also February 11, 2019).

• With Nick Sherod winning A-10 Co-Player of the Week on November 11, this year's Spiders are the fourth different team to have two different players win the A-10 Player of the Week Award in the first two weeks of a season. They join Davidson in 2017, Massachusetts in 2013, and Temple in 1998.

• Gilyard (22.7), Sherod (22.0), and Blake Francis (18.0) are Richmond's leaders in points per game. Richmond is the only team in D-I with three players averaging at least 18 points per game.

• Grant Golden recorded a double-double against CSUN despite playing just 18 minutes. It's the second time he's recorded a double-double despite playing fewer than 20 minutes (also Coppin State last season). No other Spider has a double-double with fewer than 20 minutes played in the last 10 seasons.

• Richmond is 3-0 vs current Southland Conference schools, with all three wins coming over McNeese State (in 1999, 2001, and 2005).

WITH A WIN ...

• UR would be 4-0 for the first time since 1985, when the Spiders won 23 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

• Richmond would improve to 4-0 all-time against McNeese State.

• Richmond would win its sixth straight game vs a non-conference opponent dating back to last season, the Spiders longest non-conference win under Chris Mooney.

• The Spiders have their longest home win streak (4 games) since 2015 and be 7-2 in their last nine home games following a six-game home losing streak.

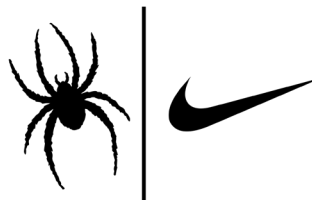

UNIVERSITY OF RICHMOND, Va. - The University of Richmond overcame a slow start to lead by as many as 14 points in the second half of a 58-50 victory over McNeese State (2-1) on Saturday at the Robins Center.

The Spiders (2-1) took a few minutes to get going, trailing 9-2 out of the gate, but Richmond responded with a 21-5 run midway through the first half to take the lead for good. Richmond pushed that lead to double digits in the opening minutes of the second half and opened up a 14-point lead with 10:02 to play on a 3-pointer by junior Peter Thomas.

Senior Jermaine Bucknor led the Spiders in scoring for the third-straight game and scored in double-figures for the sixth-straight outing with 17 points, despite facing a box-and-one defense in the second half.

"I thought he did a great job handling that," Richmond head coach Chris Mooney said. "He did not force anything, but he was still able to make things happen. We were still able to run our offense, but we just did some different things like dipping into holes in the defense."

"The coaches did a good job reminding me when I would run by the bench that I could do other things, like get to the glass and cut harder to get other guys open," said Bucknor, who also led the Spiders with seven rebounds.

Thomas scored a career-high 13 points, all coming in the second half, hitting a career-high three 3-pointers on six attempts. He also had two assists and two steals.

"The first two games I passed up some open shots and the coaches started telling me to take the shot," Thomas said. "When the coaches are telling you to take the shot, it gives you a lot more confidence."

Sophomore 6-foot-11 center Drew Crank posted a career-high 10 points, connecting on both of his 3-point attempts. He is shooting 66-percent (2-for-3) from behind the arc this season.

"I had never shot a 3-pointer in a game until (Tuesday) against UVA," Crank said. "Coach has given me a lot of confidence. If I'm open he says take the shot. Today I felt confident, I had a couple of open looks, my teammates ran the offense to get me the ball and I made the shots."

Sophomore Monty Sanders also posted a career high with nine points.

Richmond sank nine 3-pointers with Thomas hitting a career-high three treys and centers Crank (2-for-2) and Kevin Steenberge each connecting on the first 3-pointers of their careers.



THE BIG PICTURE

THE SPIDERS SYSTEM

Over his 15 seasons at Richmond, Chris Mooney's offense has evolved into a system that embodies the concept of "basketball without positions." While shorter players will begin most possessions further away from the basket and taller players will begin most possessions on the wing or in the paint, they will rarely end up anywhere near where they started. On each possession, every player on the court is equally as likely to handle the ball, shoot a three, cut back door, or set up on the low block. The Spiders offense places a premium on passing, cutting, and outside shooting, and Richmond's coaches focus on developing those skills in each Spider.

Richmond's offense often results in a high team field goal percentage, a ton of opportunities for assists, and relatively few turnovers. Over the previous five seasons (2014-15 through 2018-19), Richmond ranks 26th in D-I in field goal percentage (46.9), 17th in assists per game (15.6), 10th in fewest turnovers per game (10.2), and sixth in assist-turnover ratio (1.52).

CHANGES ON DEFENSE

According to Mooney's estimation, the Spiders spent between 60 and 70 percent of their court time this offseason working on defense. Specifically, Richmond worked to install a man-to-man defensive scheme after playing primarily a matchup zone in recent years. The process involved reteaching the Spiders the very fundamentals of man-to-man defense, with a focus on plugging gaps, closing out on shooters, and preventing offensive rebounds.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

Jacob Gilyard was named First Team Preseason All-Atlantic 10 and Grant Golden was a Second Team Preseason All-A-10 pick at the conference's media day in October. Gilyard is the fifth different Spider to earn Preseason First Team All-Conference honors under Mooney, while Golden is the fourth Spider under Mooney to land on a Preseason All-Conference team in multiple seasons. Prior to this season, no team had placed a pair of non-seniors on the Preseason All-Atlantic 10 First or Second Teams since 2015, when Rhode Island juniors Hassan Martin and E.C. Matthews both landed on the First Team. (Dayton also has two non-seniors on the Preseason First or Second Teams this season.)

The Spiders landed sixth in the preseason poll, their highest preseason projection since 2016 (also sixth). Richmond received 248 points in the preseason poll, its most since the 2015 season, when the Spiders were also picked to finished sixth and received 262 points in preseason voting.

"THE BEST CLASS THAT RICHMOND'S EVER HAD"

Richmond was led by sophomores Jacob Gilyard, Grant Golden, and Nathan Cayo in 2018-19. Those three players, now juniors, have been joined by Nick Sherod, who received a medical redshirt last season following a torn ACL in November, and Blake Francis, a Wagner transfer who sat out last season, in Richmond's junior class.

Each of Richmond's five scholarship juniors has already proven that they have the ability to produce at an elite level, particularly on the offensive end. While Golden (17.2 PPG) and Gilyard (16.2 PPG) both earned All-Conference honors in 2018-19, Cayo registered the largest scoring increase in the A-10, averaging 12.9 PPG, up from 2.3 in his freshman season. In 2017-18, Sherod scored a team-high 17.6 PPG in conference play and Francis scored a team-high 17.3 PPG in his final season at Wagner.

Chris Mooney has said on more than one occasion that he feels the Golden-Gilyard-Cayo-Sherod-Francis class "will be the best class that Richmond's ever had."

RATE OF RETURN

12 of this year's 15 Spiders, including Blake Francis, who sat out the 2018-19 season after transferring from Wagner, are returnees from last season. Freshmen Tyler Burton and Gabe Arizin and sophomore transfer Connor Crabtree are the only newcomers on the roster.

Seniors Julius Johnson (3.4 PPG) and Keith Oddo (0.3 PPG) and graduate student Noah Yates (3.8 PPG) all graduated in the spring, although Oddo is playing at Louisville while this season while pursuing a graduate degree.

Richmond returns 90 percent of its scoring from last season -- the second-highest rate in the A-10 behind Davidson's 94 percent -- and much of its other production.

NO SENIOR MOMENTS

2019-20 is Richmond's first season since 1999-00 without a senior on the team. Richmond is one of six D-I programs without a senior or grad transfer on its roster this season, joining CSU-Bakersfield, Mount St. Mary's, Santa Clara, Stony Brook, and USC-Upstate.

2019-20 is also the third straight season Richmond didn't have a senior in its starting lineup on opening night after having at least one senior start its season opener every year from 2000 to 2016.

NATIONAL EXPOSURE

At least 10 of the Spiders 31 regular-season games this season will be broadcast on national television: four on NBC Sports Network, two on CBS Sports Network, one on the SEC Network, and three on the ESPN family of networks.

Of the 16 game scheduled for the Robins Center this season, three will be broadcast nationally (Boston College, Charleston, and VCU) while 12 more will be shown on regional television on either MASN or the NBC Sports Washington networks.

VOICE OF THE SPIDERS

For the 37th straight season, Bob Black will handle play-by-play duties for Spider men's basketball broadcasts. Black, who also hosts a morning show on ESPN Richmond, the Spiders radio rights-holder, underwent surgery to remove a vocal polyp in June. Following the successful procedure, Black has said that he is "more fired up to get going than I have been in a long time." Black will be teamed with analyst Greg Beckwith, a member of the Richmond Athletics Hall of Fame who is still the program's career leader in assists and steals. Black and Beckwith will do all away games and national TV home games on ESPN Richmond radio. They will anchor the SpiderTV broadcast for all of Richmond's home games on regional TV. Those broadcasts will be produced and directed by Blake Ellett.

WEIGHTY MATTERS

Redshirt junior Grant Golden will play the 2019-20 season close to 255 lbs, down about 20 lbs from his playing weight in 2018-19. Golden focused on cutting weight this offseason after he said he felt his legs were heavy at the ends of games last season.

On the other hand, sophomore Souleymane Koureissi has bulked up to 215 lbs this offseason. That's up 25 lbs from what he weighed when he came to Richmond in the summer of 2018.

THE BIG PICTURE

WILD START

Richmond opened its season with a pair of wild games at the Robins Center, becoming the first team since Southern Miss in 2012-13 to start a season with two straight overtime wins.

Richmond trailed Saint Francis (PA) by 10 with 100 seconds remaining in regulation in its season opener on November 8 before a 12-2 run, keyed by a full-court press that led to three Red Flash turnovers in a 32-second span, tied the game at 90 and forced overtime. Richmond prevailed 100-98 in the extra period, the Spiders most points scored in a season opener since 1980.

In their next game, the Spiders were tied with Vanderbilt at 80 at the end of regulation. With 25 seconds left in OT, Jacob Gilyard tied the game with a reverse layup. With four seconds left, Gilyard intercepted a Vanderbilt pass and flipped the ball ahead to a streaking Andre Gustavson, who was fouled on his dunk attempt with 0.6 seconds left and went on to make the game-winning free throw in a 93-92 Spiders win.

Richmond was the first team to start a season with back-to-back wins by no more than two points since UNLV in 2014-15.

IN A CLASS BY HIMSELF

While the Spiders are scheduled to return their entire roster in 2020-21, Richmond currently has one open scholarship. That spot will be filled by Isaiah Wilson next season, the only member of Richmond's Class of 2020 signing class. Wilson, a point guard from Pittsburgh, Pa., is a Top-200 national recruit who is rated as the fourth-best Class of 2020 recruit in Pennsylvania by 247sports.com as well as 31st best 2020 point guard in the nation.

FAMILY BUSINESS

Several Spiders have family members who participated in college athletics.

Jake Wojcik's father Dave was head coach at San Jose State from 2013-17 and has 19 seasons of college coaching experience. He played collegiately at Loyola (Md.). Wojcik's uncle Doug is a former head coach of both Tulsa (2005-12) and College of Charleston (2012-14) and played at Navy, where he was an All-CAA performer and teammate of Basketball Hall-of-Famer David Robinson.

Junior Nick Sherod is the son of E.J. Sherod who played basketball at ODU. Nick's grandfather, Edmund, was a Hall-of-Famer at VCU before playing for the New York Knicks.

Jacob Gilyard's father Rodney is a member of Ottawa University's Athletics Hall of Fame and graduated as the school's all-time leader in assists and steals in 1992.

Freshman Tyler Burton's father Quinton played at Providence and helped the Friars to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances in 1989 and 1990. He scored 11.1 PPG as a senior. When he was being recruited, his final two schools were Providence and Richmond.

Grant Golden's father played at Fairfield University and he had two grandfathers that played collegiate football. Grant's brother Bryce is a sophomore on Butler's team this season.

Sophomore Jordan Gaitley is the son of Stephanie Gaitley, currently the head coach of the women's basketball team at Fordham University and the head coach of Richmond's women's team from 1985-91, when she amassed a 116-63 record over six seasons at the Robins Center. Gaitley also has two older brothers who played collegiately. His oldest brother Dutch is currently an assistant coach for the Charlotte Hornets.

Freshman Gabe Arizin is the grandson of Basketball Hall-of-Famer Paul Arizin, a 10-time NBA All-Star who twice led the league in scoring. He attended Villanova and led the nation in scoring as a senior in 1950. His No. 11 jersey has been retired by the school. He was inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006. Gabe's father Mike played at William & Mary and La Salle. He earned All Southern-Conference honors following his freshman and sophomore seasons at W&M.

Junior Blake Francis' father Carl attended Virginia Union University and played linebacker for four seasons. He is currently the Director of Communications for the NFL Player's Association. Also in Francis' family:

- Brother Branden played football at Liberty from 2010-13
- Cousin Tyler Thornton played basketball at Duke from 2010-14
- Cousin Marques Hagans started at QB for Virginia from 2004-05 and played in 10 NFL games after being picked in the 2006 NFL Draft.

MVP OFFSEASON

Grant Golden spent multiple weeks at the end of July and the beginning of August working out in Houston with former NBA All-Star and current Houston Rockets Player Development Coach John Lucas.

While in Houston, Golden worked out with several current NBA players, including playing in multiple pickup games with NBA MVP James Harden.

SPIDER BITES

Internationally Known

Nick Sherod and Souleymane Koureissi have taken educational immersion trips to South Africa and Grant Golden has studied in Cuba since the end of the 2017-18 season. But when given a chance to take a roundtrip flight to anywhere on the globe, some Spiders opted for less academic journeys. Blake Francis would like to visit Santorini, Greece. Jacob Gilyard is ready for a return trip to the Cayman Islands, where the Spiders played in 2017. Jordan Gaitley chose Wakanda, the fictional country from Marvel's movie *Black Panther*.

Making the Tough Choices

When it comes to comics, the Spiders are more than twice as likely to prefer Marvel to DC Comics (53 percent to 20 percent, with 27 percent choosing 'neither'). Made to weigh in on other hot-button issues, the Richmond roster chose ketchup (67 percent) as its top condiment, easily outdistancing barbeque sauce (20 percent), and picked LeBron James (58 percent) over Michael Jordan (25 percent) - with Giannis Antetokounmpo and Jimmy Butler each getting one write-in vote. Befitting basketball players, the Spiders would prefer to have the ability to fly (67 percent) over the ability to be invisible (33 percent).

Color Wheel

Perhaps no issues splits the Spiders as much as uniform color. 40 percent of Richmond's roster prefers the Spiders red jersey, 40 percent like the blue jersey best, and 20 percent chose the white jersey.

Dusty In Here

While some Spiders claim to have never cried at a movie, a 2018 film led to damp eyes for at least four players. Grant Golden, Matt Grace, Nick Sherod, and Jordan Gaitley all said that the last movie they cried at is Lady Gaga's *A Star is Born*.

Face Your Fears

Tyler Burton and Connor Crabtree were both heavily recruited before signing with Richmond this offseason. The duo decided to come to Richmond despite both admitting that the thing they are most afraid of is spiders.

ROBINS CENTER

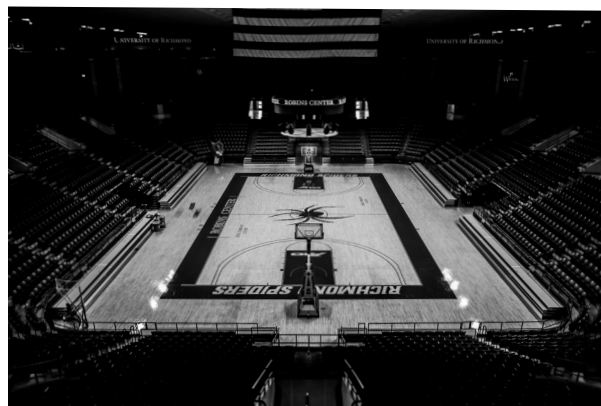
Built in 1972 through the generosity of the E. Claiborne Robins family, the Robins Center underwent a \$17 million renovation in 2013 that transformed it into the one of the premier college basketball arenas in the nation.

Last season, the Spiders averaged 5,730 fans per game, fifth in the Atlantic 10. In 2017-18, Richmond averaged 6,492 fans per game, its most since the 1992-93 season when capacity at the arena was over 9,000. Today, the arena has a capacity of 7,201.

The Robins Center complex houses the University's athletic squads and serves as the showplace for University of Richmond basketball. Renovations to the lower level of the building in 2018 resulted in the creation of the Blandford-Everett Student-Athlete Performance Center, which provides Richmond's student-athletes with the latest strength and conditioning equipment, access to a nutrition fueling center, and a state-of-the-art sports medicine facility.

In addition to sporting and recreational activities, the Robins Center annually serves as the site or Richmond's commencement exercises and also provides a forum for countless other educational and cultural events.

The eyes of the world were focused on the Robins Center in 1992, when one of that year's Presidential debates was held in the Center's main arena. In 2011, President Obama delivered an economic address to a capacity crowd.

QUEALLY ATHLETICS CENTER

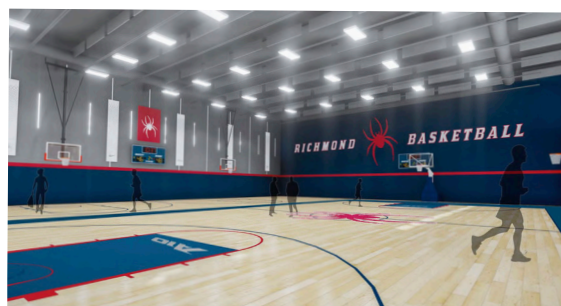
The Queally Athletics Center is the future home of Spiders basketball.

Sports medicine and nutritional facilities, along with an athletic training room with hydrotherapy, will ensure the health and well-being of student-athletes. Strength and conditioning areas, including a full-sized practice gym, coaches offices and team locker rooms will help athletes compete at maximum performance levels. A new Academic Support Center will be located in the renovated Millhiser Gymnasium to ensure that student-athletes have access to the resources they need to maintain progress toward their educational goals. A Spider Hall will engage fans and alumni in celebration of the proud tradition of University of Richmond athletics.

The facility is named for 1986 alumni Paul and Anne-Marie Queally, longtime supporters of the University of Richmond who contributed a \$7.5 million lead gift to launch the fundraising efforts for the new center, which is expected to open in the fall of 2020.

The site will also be home to Richmond's new student Well-Being Center, which will house all campus health care services in addition to providing facilities for wellness education and nutrition services.

CHRIS MOONEY

HEAD COACH

15th SEASON

PRINCETON, 1994

Chris Mooney is the winningest coach in Richmond basketball's storied history, a distinction he earned with a win over Wake Forest on December 1, 2018 for his record-setting 240th victory on the Spiders sidelines. Now in his 15th season with the Spiders, Mooney has led Richmond to a pair of NCAA Tournaments and a pair of NIT Quarterfinals.

Hired by Richmond prior to the 2005-06 season, Mooney is the second longest-tenured coach in the Atlantic 10, trailing only Bob McKillop (Davidson). Mooney ranks fifth all-time in conference history in both A-10 wins by a head coach (124) and overall wins by an A-10 head coach (250).

Mooney has led the Spiders to seven total postseason appearances - all in the last 12 seasons. Under Mooney, the Spiders made trips to the NCAA tournament in 2010 and 2011 and trips to the NIT Quarterfinals in 2015 and 2017. In the spring of 2011, Mooney's Spiders made national headlines en route to the NCAA Sweet 16, knocking off five-seed Vanderbilt and Morehead State in the process. Richmond finished both the 2010 and 2011 seasons ranked in the top 25.

Mooney has earned many honors during his Spiders career. He was tabbed the Sporting News Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year in 2010, while also being selected as a finalist for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award. That same year, he won Richmond's Voice of the University Award, given to a faculty or staff member for being a voice that represents the University of Richmond in a positive manner to the wider community. Later in 2010, Richmond Style Weekly tabbed him for the 40 Under 40 list, spotlighting UR's community involvement with the homeless, Special Olympics, Arthritis Foundation, Friends of Jaclyn Foundation and the ASK Foundation for Childhood Cancer Research.

20 of Mooney's former players have gone on to play professionally in either the NBA, the G League, or overseas, including at least one from 11 of the last 14 graduating classes.

In 2018-19, the Spiders became the first team in four years to place a pair of sophomores on the Atlantic 10's All-Conference teams, as Jacob Gilyard earned Second Team honors and Grant Golden was named to the Third Team. Gilyard and Golden were forced into bigger roles after junior Nick Sherod, the Spiders most experienced starter, suffered a season-ending knee injury in late November. With Sherod out, the Spiders were one of the 25 youngest teams in Division I, relying on freshmen and sophomores for 87 percent of their points. The Spiders youth often showed up at the end of games, as Richmond lost seven games despite leading with five minutes left in regulation. The Spiders finished 13-20, and held a lead of eight or more points in half of their losses.

In 2017-18, Mooney oversaw the development of one of the nation's youngest teams, starting a junior, two sophomores, and two freshmen. Facing one of the 25 most difficult out-of-conference schedules in Division I, the Spiders entered A-10 play with a 2-10 record. But Richmond exceeded expectations in the league, finishing tied for fifth with a 9-9 record that included a pair of wins against crosstown rival VCU and a 2-0 mark against eventual league champion Davidson.

In 2016-17, the Spiders swept the two major Atlantic 10 awards, with senior T.J. Cline winning A-10 Player of the Year and freshman De'Monte Buckingham earning Rookie of the Year honors. UR rebounded from a 6-6 start to finish third in A-10 play and earn an NIT bid where the Spiders won games at Alabama and home vs Oakland.

In 2014-15, Richmond finished the regular season on a six-game winning streak, and was one of the "Last Four Out" of the NCAA Tournament at-large field, thereby securing the No. 1 seed and home-court advantage in the NIT, where they would reach the tournament's quarterfinals.

2009-10 and 2010-11 are remembered as two of the top seasons in Mooney's coaching career and in Spider basketball history. In the spring of 2010, Richmond earned its first NCAA at-large bid since 2004, garnering a seven seed before falling in the first round of the tournament. Mooney was named the 2010 Sporting News Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year, and was a finalist for the 2010 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award. The Spiders finished the season ranked no. 24 in the final top-25 rankings.

In 2011, Richmond defeated Dayton in the A-10 championship game to earn Mooney's first conference championship, the Spiders first and only league title since Richmond joined the Atlantic 10 in 2001.

The 2010-11 Spiders would go on to the second Sweet 16 in program history by downing Vanderbilt and Morehead State in the NCAA Denver Subregional. The Spiders run came to an end at the hands of Kansas in San Antonio. Richmond finished 29-8, set a school record for wins, and finished no. 21 in the coaches poll.

Mooney previously coached at Air Force for five seasons: three as an assistant, one as an associate head coach and his final season as head coach. In 2004-05, Mooney led the Falcons to an 18-12 record and votes in the national polls. His 18 victories were the most by a first-year head coach at Air Force.

Mooney began coaching at the high school level, taking a job at Lansdale Catholic High School in Lansdale, Pa., in 1994. His first college coaching experience came at Division III Beaver College, now known as Arcadia University. He spent two seasons there from 1998-2000. While at Beaver College, Mooney only coached part-time, spending much of his time as an event coordinator. He helped plan weddings and events while also serving as the team manager.

Mooney is married to the former Lia Chomat, a Princeton graduate who also has a doctorate in psychology from Penn. The couple has two sons, Danny and Ryan.

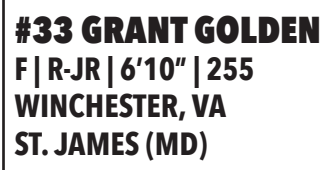

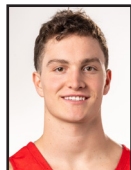
