Turnage leads the Wildcats with three goals on the season for six points in five games. Lena Stiebing has seven points in five games with three assists and two goals. Cato Roell has a 3-2 record with 11 saves for a .611 save percentage.

About The Spiders

Richmond opened the 2021 Spring season with a 3-1 loss at VCU. Sophomore Evie Hanson scored the Spiders lone goal to take an early lead. VCU quickly answered with two goals in the first half. Sophomore goalkeeper Erika Latta held the Rams scoreless in the third quarter, but VCU was able to get a third goal in the fourth to put the game out of reach.

Kaitlyn Csensits | Midfielder | Emmaus, Pa. | Emmaus High

Csensits was a four-year letter winner of the four-time Eastern Pennsylvania Conference Champions Emmaus High field hockey program. She also helped the Green Hornets squad to four AAA District XI titles, four AAA Pennsylvania State semifinal appearances and one AAA Pennsylvania state championship. Csensits also helped her club team, the Firestyx, to won Pool C at the National Field Hockey Festival and was a four-year starter and two-time captain of the Emmaus High girls' lacrosse team.

Oliva De Cain | Defense | Bryn Mawr, Pa. | Radnor High

De Cain was a four-year starter and letter winner of the Radnor High field hockey program. She collected Radnor's Jen Shillingford Award, first-team All Main-Line and All-Central League, as well as second-team All-Delco, NFHCA Pennsylvania All-Region, and MAX Field Hockey Pennsylvania All-region honors after her senior season in 2019. De Cain was a founding member of her club team, Main Line Mayhem FHC, and helped them establish a strong reputation as multi-year pool winners at the National Field Hockey Festival.

Ella Hayes | Midfield/Defense | Virginia Beach, Va. | Salem High

Hayes was a four-year starter for the Salem High field hockey program, also serving as team captain for three-straight seasons. She led the team in goals, assists and defensive saves each of her sophomore, junior and senior seasons. She also earned second-team All-Region honors each of those years. Hayes, the 2020 Salem High Valedictorian, helped her Saints Field Hockey Club team move up the national ranks to 7th in March 2020.

Madi Hyatt | Forward/Midfield | Fredericksburg, Va. | Mountain View High

Hyatt was a four-year varsity starter and letter winner for the Mountain View field hockey program, helping the program to back-to-back state titles in 2016 and 2017. She guided her team to a perfect 24-0 record in 2017. Hyatt was also a two-time team captain, a four time first-team All-District, All-Region, and Free Lance Star all-area athlete as well as a three-time first-team All-State honoree. After her senior season, Hyatt also was named District Player of the Year, Regional Player of the Year and second-team All-America. She also helped her club team, Panthers United, win a Shooting Star Thanksgiving Championship in 2019 and to qualify for the National Indoor Tournament.

Alexandria Lavelle | Midfield/Defense | Bryn Mawr, Pa. | Merion Mercy Academy Lavelle joins the Spiders after a strong showing as a four-year varsity starter for the Merion Mercy field hockey program. As a senior captain, she was named an AACC
