Sophomore Arden Tierney picked up seven draw controls against VCU (April 17) to tally 102 career draw controls in 15 games, the fastest Spider to reach that mark.

KWOLEK COLLECTS 100th CAREER COACHING VICTORY

Head Coach Allison Kwolek picked up her 100th career victory Friday against Davidson to move to a 100-51 record in her ninth season at the helm of the Spiders Women's Lacrosse Program. She has guided the Spiders to six Atlantic 10 Championship finals appearances, two A-10 Tournament titles and two NCAA Touranment appearances.

GEIERSBACH, ROYCROFT COLLECT A-10 WEEKLY HONORS

Sam Geiersbach was named A-10 Offensive Player of the Week, while Sarah Roycroft collected A-10 Rookie of the Week. In the Spiders victories at VCU and at GMU, Geiersbach had seven goals and four assists for 11 points and one ground ball. The attacker from West Babylon, N.Y., also had 12 of her 15 shots on goal and went 2-for-3 for the weekend in free position goals. She led the UR offense with four goals, including the game winner, and three assists in the Spiders 19-13 win at VCU. She was second with three goals and one assist for four points and had one ground ball against Mason. In two starts this week, Roycroft tallied a game-high three caused turnovers and three ground balls against Mason. The midfielder from Westwood, Mass., helped the UR defense to hold Mason to nine shots in the first half and only five on goal, and 13 shots (8 SOG) in the second half.

WRIGHT COLLECTS A-10 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR

Brittney Wright was named Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Week March 30. Against GW, Wright held their leading scorer to only one goal, while holding VCU's leading scorer without a goal for the first time this season. She also collected two ground balls and a caused turnover against GW and two caused turnovers against VCU. Leading the defense this year, she has helped the Spiders to a Top-20 national ranking of in goals against average, holding opponents to only average nine goals against the Spiders.

GEIERSBACH NAMED TO 2021 TEWAARATON AWARD WATCH LIST

Sam Geiersbach has been named to the 2021 Tewaaraton Award Watch List, college lacrosse's highest honor, the Tewaaraton Foundation announced (March 11). This is Geiersbach second-straight season to be recognized for the honor.

GIANFORTE COLLECTS 600TH CAREER SAVE

With seven saves against George Washington (March 26), goalie Megan Gianforte collected and surpassed 600 career saves as a Spider. Her 630 total saves ranks second among active goalkeepers in Division I.

GEIERSBACH SCORES 150th GOAL IN SPIDER CAREER

With her five goals in the Spiders 19-2 win at Old Dominion (Mar. 14) Sam Geiersbach tallied her 150th career goal becoming one of the fastest Spiders to reach that mark in 53 games. She now sits sixth all time in program history with 158 career goals, fifth in assists with 93, and fifth with 251 total points.

TIERNEY BREAKS SINGLE GAME DRAW CONTROLS PROGRAM RECORD

Sophomore attack Arden Tierney collected 13 draw controls in the Spiders' 19-10 victory over Radford, breaking Caroline Queally's 2018 record of 12 draws against LaSalle. She heads into the GW game with 90 career draw controls.

RICHMOND RECOGNIZES NINE SENIORS

Richmond women's lacrosse would like to recognize the program's nine seniors on this year's squad.

NICOLE CONCANON - SYOSSET, NY - ATTACK

Concannon joined the Spiders prior to the 2020 season after two seasons at Villanova. As a Spider, she has tallied 28 goals and 12 assists for 40 points in 15 games with 13 starts. She's scored in all but one game she's appeared in for UR. Concannon has also collected 12 ground balls and two caused turnovers. She had a career-high four goals against VCU (3/28).

BECCA CURRO - NISKAYUNA, NY - ATTACK

Battling injuries, Curro only appeared in eight games for the Spiders, all in the 2019 season. She tallied four goals and two assists, with two ground balls.

SAM GEIERSBACH - WEST BABYLON, NY - ATTACK

One of the program's most prolific players, Geiersbach currently sits in the top five in goals (158), points (251) and assists (93) in program history in 55 career starts. She is a two-time Tewaraaton Award Watch List honoree (2020, 2021) and collected seven All-Atlantic 10 honors, including Rookie of the Year (2017) and Tournament MVP (2019), with first, second, tournament and rookie team accolades as well.

MEGAN GIANFORTE - BRIELLE, NJ - GOALKEEPER

Six-time Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Week honoree, Gianforte has been named to the A-10 All-Tournament Team three times (2017, 18, 19), as well as two first team and one second team accolades. She has a 62-15 career record in 77 career games, with 631 total saves for a .477 save percentage and a 9.62 GAA. She has 192 career ground balls which is second among active leaders.

MEKENZIE MONTGOMERY - HAINESPORT, NJ - ATTACK

Montgomery has made three starts in 33 games she's appeared in for her Spider career. She has four goals and two assists for six total points, as well as seven draw controls, two ground balls and two caused turnovers.

MADISON OSTRICK - MEDFORD, NY - MIDFIELD

Ostrick collected 2019 Second Team and 2020 Preseason All-Atlantic 10 honors. She has 37 straight starts at midfield for the Spiders, appearing in 64 total games. She has 73 goals and nine assists for 82 career points, with six game winning goals, 65 ground balls, 45 caused turnovers and 67 draw controls.

REAGAN WILLIAMS - GREENLAND, NH - ATTACK

Battling injuries in her career, Williams appeared 28 games with three starts. She tallied 15 goals, four assists for 19 points, wiht 13 ground balls, four caused turnovers and three draw controls.

BRITTNEY WRIGHT - MOORESTOWN, NJ - DEFENDER

Wright has made 41 starts in 56 appearances for the Spiders. She has 52 groundballs, 35 caused turnovers, one draw control and one assist. Wright was named to the 2018 Atlantic 10 All-Rookie Team, and was a 2020 Preseason All-Atlantic 10 selection. She was named A-10 Defensive Player of the Week this season (Mar. 30).

RACHEL ZIEMBA - CAZENOVIA, NY - ATTACK
