What's On Tap . . .

The Spiders took down Davidson in emphatic fashion Saturday, cruising to a 41-0 victory at Robins Stadium to earn Richmond's first-ever playoff victory shutout and first in any game since 2017 ... The Spiders held the No. 1 rushing defense in the country to just 123 yards on the ground ... Prior to the contest, the Wildcats averaged 350.5 rushing yards per game ... The Spiders face their toughest challenge of the season when it travels to No. 2 Sacramento State to play the 11-0 Hornets Saturday.

Series History . . .

Saturday marks the first meeting between Richmond and Sacramento State ... The trip to California also comes as the Richmond program's first ... Robins Stadium in Richmond, Va. is a mere 2,782 miles from Hornet Stadium in Sacramento, Calif.

Spiders In The Playoffs

The 2022 postseason run marks the 12th time Richmond has made the playoffs ... the Spiders reached the postseason most recently in 2016 ... the 2022 playoffs mark the first for the Spiders with **Russ Huesman** at the helm ... Richmond's history in the NCAA FCS playoffs has been highlighted by semifinals appearances in 2007, 2015 and 2016 and the national championship victory in 2008 ... Saturday's game marks the 15th time Richmond has played a playoff game on the road ... The team is an even 7-7 when playing on the road ... **SEE MORE ON PAGE 34**

Udinski's Record-Setting Day . . .

Reece Udinski was nearly perfect against Davidson Saturday, connecting on 29 of 32 pass attempts for his highest completion percentage (90.3%) this season ... With his performance, he set the FCS playoffs single-game record for completion percentage ... He is also on pace to set the FCS highest completion percentage in a season record (minimum 200 attempts) currently set at 75.2% by Eric Sanders of Northern Iowa in 2007 (237 of 315) ... Udinski is currently 357 of 476 this season for a completion percentage of 75.0 percent.

Tackling Machine . . .

Redshirt junior linebacker **Tristan Wheeler** is one of the top defensive players in all of NCAA FCS Football ... Wheeler has been a force since he stepped on campus, starting 36-straight games at linebacker ... He opened the season with a bang against Virginia, posting a career-high 19 tackles followed by double-figure tackling performances with 12 against Saint Francis and 13 against Hampton ... He enters Saturday with 361 career tackles, including three-consecutive 100-plus tackle seasons in his past three full seasons of football (2019, 2021 and 2022) ... He eclipsed 100 tackles on the season with his third of eight against Davidson ... he averages 9.5 tackles per game which ranks 23rd in FCS football ... Richmond's defensive leader, so far this season he's tallied 11.0 TFL (-29 yards), 2.0 sacks (-9 yards), two interceptions, three pass breakups and six quarterback hurries.

All-CAA Honors . . .

The University of Richmond football team boasts 11 players named to this year's All-CAA Football teams ... In total, five were named to the first team (**QB Reece Udinski, OL Ryan Coll, DL Marlem Louis, LB Tristan Wheeler, WR Jakob Herres**), two (**OL Joe More, CB Aaron Banks**) to the second and four to the third (**WR Leroy Henley Jr., DL Ray Eldridge, DL Jeremiah Grant, LB Phil O'Connor**)... **SEE MORE ON PAGE 49**

Catch Me If You Can ...

Redshirt sophomore **Jasiah Williams** is seventh in NCAA FCS and leads the Colonial Athletic Association with 7.3 receptions per game ... **Jakob Herres** is third in the CAA and 23rd in the country at 5.8 and **Leroy Henley** is fourth in the CAA and 30th in the country with 5.5.

Moving The Chains ...

The Spiders have been efficient on offense this season through 12 games ... Richmond is first in the Colonial Athletic Association and are third in the country with 293 total first downs, averaging 24.4 per game ... The Spiders lead the CAA and are 12th in the country in third down conversions at 46.9 percent, converting 73-162 attempts this season.

Aussie, Aussie, Aussie ...

Junior punter and Australia native **Aaron Trusler** has been strong this season on special teams ... Trusler has helped the Spiders to second in the CAA in net punting at 39.5 yards per kick ... He has punted the ball 45 times at a 41.23 yard average and the Spiders' punt coverage has been elite, ranking fourth in the country at 1.80 yards per return ... Last game, he averaged a season-high 46.50 yards per punt and booted a career-high 63-yarder in the contest.

Oh Captain, My Captain ...

The Spiders named three team captains at the end of the spring football camp for the 2022 season ... Redshirt senior running back **Aaron Dykes**, redshirt junior linebacker **Tristan Wheeler** and redshirt senior defensive lineman **Aidan Murray** were chosen by their teammates as

leaders on the team ... Dykes has played in 41 career games for the Spiders, including 37 starts at running back ... He has made 27-straight starts at running back and has been the team's kickoff returner since his redshirt freshman year ... Wheeler has played in 39 games and has made 36-straight starts at linebacker – the most on the team ... Murray has played in 27 games in his career and has made 15-straight starts but will miss the 2022 season after suffering an Achilles tendon injury in early July ... Murray was on track to be named to the preseason All-Colonial Athletic Association team prior to the injury. The Spiders will name one special teams' captain for each game this season to join Dykes and Wheeler at the coin toss ... Linebacker **Wayne Galloway (Virginia)**, punter **Aaron Trusler (Saint Francis, Stony Brook, Villanova, Delaware)**, placekicker **Jake Larson (Lehigh, William & Mary)** return man **Savon Smith (Elon)**, placekicker **Andrew Lopez (Hampton, New Hampshire, Davidson)** long snapper **Brain Catanzarite (Maine)** and holder **Braxton Hughes (William & Mary)** have been captains so far this season.

QB1 With The Gun ...

Graduate transfer quarterback **Reece Udinski** has put up impressive numbers in his collegiate career, playing at both VMI and Maryland ... Udinski spent most of his playing career with the Keydets, finishing his career connecting on 783-of-1,268 passing for 7,877 yards and 48 passing touchdowns at VMI ... He finished his VMI career after 39 games as a Keydet as the program's all-time leading passer and ranking sixth all-time in Southern Conference history ... Udinski enters Saturday's game with 11,258 passing yards in NCAA FCS play ranking second among all current quarterbacks in FCS football ... He trails only Tim DeMorat from Fordham who has 13,461 in his career ... Udinski has 11,358 total career passing yards, taking into account his time at Maryland ... Udinski's best season came in 2019 when he passed for 3,276 yards on 306-of-479 passing ... He finished the year with 19 touchdowns while only throwing five interceptions all season ... His 3,276 yards passing in the Air Raid offense set a VMI single-season passing record while his completion percentage of 63.9 percent was the best in program history ... He opened the year with an FCS-record 368 consecutive passes without an interception and posted 11 games with 200 yards passing or more ... Udinski also spent the 2021 season as the backup quarterback at Maryland, appearing in four games for the Terrapins, including the Pinstripe Bowl victory over Virginia Tech ... He finished the year 11-of-15 for 100 yards and a touchdown.

Keydet Connection . . .

Joining Udinski as a Spider this season is his former VMI teammate and wide receiver **Jakob Herres** ... Herres comes to the Spiders as one of the most decorated wide receivers in NCAA FCS Football ... He has caught 295 receptions for 3,901 yards and 32 touchdowns through the air ... He ranks first in NCAA FCS Football in career receptions, second in career receiving yards and is fourth in receiving touchdowns among active NCAA FCS wide receivers. Herres' best season came in the spring 2021 season when he helped the Keydets make the NCAA FCS Playoffs ... He was named the So-Con Offensive Player of the Year and was a consensus First Team All-America selection ... He was one of 16 finalists for the Stats Perform Walter Payton Award, given to the national FCS Offensive Player of the Year ... He finished fourth overall in the voting for the Walter Payton Award and was named the Virginia Offensive Player of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond ... Herres led the SoCon with 80 receptions for 978 yards and eight touchdowns in eight games ... He averaged 12.2 yards per catches and 122.2 yards per game, both numbers leading the SoCon.

Coming At You Fast . . .

Redshirt senior **Aaron Dykes** is one of the most dangerous kickoff returners in NCAA FCS Football ... Dykes, a two-time First Team All-Colonial Athletic Association selection, entered 2022 second among all returning FCS kick returners with three career kickoff returns for touchdown and ranked seventh among all returners with 1,564 kickoff return yards ... Last season, Dykes averaged 27.3 yards per kickoff return, ranking second all-time in program history in a single season, trailing only Justin Rogers' 30.4 yard average in 2004 ... Dykes has returned three kickoffs for touchdowns in his career ... He posted a 98-yard return last fall against Villanova and recorded two returns for touchdowns against Delaware in 2019 – both in the first half of the Spiders' victory ... This year, he has returned 16 kickoffs for 285 yards, averging 23.8 yards per game.

Welcome Back . . .

This season, the Spiders have seen the return of two members of the team who missed significant time due to big injuries ... Linebacker **Xavier Marshall** made his first appearance of the season against Saint Francis since suffering a knee injury at Stony Brook last season ... He made his first start of the year at Lehigh ... Running back **Milan Howard** also made his first appearance against Saint Francis, returning after injury his knee in preseason practice for the spring 2021 season ... Howard scored his first post-injury touchdowns with a pair in the second half against Davidson Saturday.

Parker Produces . . .

Sophomore defensive back **Bryson Parker** had a strong start to the season ... Parker finished the season opener against Virginia second on the team with 11 tackles off the bench, including six solo tackles ... He also led the team with two pass breakups from the safety position ... Parker's 11 tackles surpasses his season total of nine tackles in 11 games last season as a reserve ... He recorded his first career interception in the second half against Lehigh and picked two more with grabs against Stony Brook and Villanova ... He is currently third on the team with 55 tackles and has six pass breakups and a quarterback hurry.

New Look Offense . . .

Head coach **Russ Huesman** made a big change in his coaching staff in the offseason, making a change at offensive coordinator and bringing in **Billy Cosh** to take over an offense that ranked sixth in the Colonial Athletic Association in scoring in 2021 ... Cosh comes to Richmond after spending four season at VMI, including the past two as offensive coordinator ... Cosh's offense, dubbed the Air Raid Offense, finished in the top 20 in the country in numerous categories and top two in the SoCon in seven offensive marks ... The Keydets ranked 20th in the nation in scoring offense (29.2), 18th in passing efficiency (144.77), 17th in total offense (427.6

yards), ninth in passing offense (309.4 yards) and fifth in total first downs (201).

Replacing Defensive Line . . .

The Spiders had one of the top defensive lines in Colonial Athletic Association Football last season with two All-Conference selections and a third that was in line for preseason All-Conference accolades this season ... Richmond will have to replace all three of those performers this season though ... All-Conference selection Darius Reynolds led the team with 9.5 sacks and 13.0 tackles for loss in his final year of eligibility ... All-Conference defensive tackle Kobie Turner added 3.0 sacks and 10.5 tackles for loss before transferring to Wake Forest for his final year of eligibility ... Captain **Aidan Murray** added 5.0 sacks and 7.5 tackles for loss and was in line for the leading role this year before suffering a season-ending Achilles injury in the summer ... Defensive ends **Jeremiah Grant** and **Marlem Louis** lead the returning healthy players with 4.5 and 4.0 tackles for loss last season, respectively ... Defensive tackles **Carsen Stocklinski** and **Matei Fitz** made their collegiate debuts against Virginia.

Familiar #BossHawgs . . .

The Spider offensive line has two long-time starters to replace in Tim Coleman and Clayton McConnell but bring a wealth of experience back to the team ... Redshirt senior tackle **Joe More** leads the Spiders having played in 41 games with 37 starts ... Redshirt junior guard **Cade Salyers** is next with 38 career games played and 28-straight starts ... Redshirt junior tackle **Ryan Coll** has played in 36 career games with 30 career starts, making 23-straight with most of his career games at offensive line being played next to Salyers ... Redshirt junior center **Tom Elia** has played in 26 career games and has made 12 career starts all coming this season.

Switching Sides . . .

Redshirt freshman **Carsen Stocklinski** spent the 2021 season in the offensive line room, learning behind a very deep squad in his first year in college ... During this past offseason with the Spiders becoming thin at defensive line after the injury to **Aidan Murry** in July, the coaching staff approached Stocklinski about switching sides of the ball ... He eagerly accepted after playing both offensive and defensive line in high school and seeing an opportunity in front of him this year on the defensive line ... Stocklinski has worked hard in the transition and has started every game this season ... He earned All-Conference and All-County honors on both sides of the football in high school at Oconoe County in Georgia.

Phil-Er-Up . . .

Redshirt senior linebacker **Phil O'Connor** has patiently waited for his time to come, sitting behind a pair of All-Conference linebackers in **Tristan Wheeler** and recently graduated Tyler Dressler ... O'Connor made his way into starting lineup this year and has played in 29 games in his career ... He started the final five games of the year last season with the Spiders went 4-1 and played a vital role in all five games ... He posted a career-high 12 tackles this season at Delaware.

Iron Spiders . . .

Entering Saturday's game, redshirt senior offensive lineman **Joe More** and redshirt senior running back **Aaron Dykes** lead the team with 41 career games played ... Redshirt junior linebacker **Tristan Wheeler** leads the team with 36-straight starts in his career ... Dykes and redshirt junior **Cade Salyers** are second with 26-straight starts.

Punter From Down Under . . .

Junior punter **Aaron Trusler** is one of 22 names selected to the FCS Punter of the Year Award Preseason Watch List, which honors the nation's top collegiate punter in the FCS ... The Augusta Sports Council, also home to the Ray Guy Award (awarded to the best collegiate punter in the FBS), created the FCS Punter of the Year Award in 2019 to honor the best collegiate punter playing in the FCS ... Last season, Trusler averaged 40.2 yards per punt with four coming in at over 50 yards ... In 57 attempts in 2021, the junior covered 2,289 yards and stuck 19 inside the opposing team's 20-yard line ... His career-long came against James Madison last year when he recorded a 62-yarder.

Spiders Close Year On Winning Streak . . .

Richmond closed out the 2021 season winning four-straight games to finish the year with a winning record at 6-5 ... The Spiders posted wins at New Hampshire, against Towson, Delaware and at William & Mary ... The four-game winning streak was the longest winning streak for the Spiders since winning five in a row in the 2016 season ... The victory also secured the Spiders first winning season since 2017 and gave them momentum heading into the offseason.

New Faces On The Sideline . . .

Head coach **Russ Huesman** has a bunch of new faces on the sideline on his coaching staff this season ... **Billy Cosh** has been brought in as the new offensive coordinator while Richmond alum **Winston October** is the new wide receivers coach ... **Chris Ellis** is the new defensive ends coach while **Justin Poindexter** is the new running backs coach ... **Dave Legg** has come on as the recruiting coordinator ... **Cody Gray** has returned as a defensive assistant while **Will Ahrens** and **Sam Karn** are defensive and offensive graduate assistant coaches, respectively.

Preseason CAA Poll . . .

The Spiders were picked to finish fourth in the preseason Colonial Athletic Association poll by the league head coaches ... Defending conference co-champion Villanova was picked to finish first overall in the preseason poll with 270 points and 16 out of 26 votes ... Delaware was picked second with 235 points (7 first place) while Rhode Island was third at 224 points ... Richmond came in fourth at 219 points, followed by William & Mary (206), Elon (191), Stony Brook (151), Maine (134), New Hampshire (117), Monmouth (105), Towson (81), UAlbany (64) and Hampton (31) ... This marks the first year in the CAA for both Monmouth and Hampton.

Two Honored on Preseason Team . . .

The Spiders placed two on the preseason All-Colonial Athletic Association Team ... Earning preseason All-Conference honors for the Spiders were redshirt senior kick returner **Aaron Dykes** and redshirt junior linebacker **Tristan Wheeler** ... Both Dykes and Wheeler are two of the Spiders' three team captains this season. Dykes is a two-time All-CAA selection as a kick returner, earning First Team All-CAA honors last fall ... He enters 2022 second among all returning FCS kick returners with three career kickoff returns for touchdown and ranks fourth among all returners with 1,501 kickoff return yards ... Last season, Dykes averaged 27.3 yards per kickoff return, ranking second all-time in program history in a single season, trailing only Justin Rogers' 30.4 yard average in 2004. Wheeler is a three-time All-CAA selection, including back-to-back First Team All-Conference accolades ... He was named Second Team All-America by Stats Perform last fall and was a First Team Sophomore All-America honoree by HERO Sports ... He led the team and the CAA in total tackles in the regular season with 114. He ranked eighth in the nation in total tackles and tackles per game (10.4) ... He entered the season with 256 total tackles in 27 career games.

Young Guys In Back . . .

Last year, the Spiders started at least one true freshmen or redshirt freshmen in every game last season and six times had both positions starting with first or second year players ... Redshirt sophomore **Aamir Hall** started all 11 games last season leading the team with 12 pass breakups, the most by any non-upperclassman in the Colonial Athletic Association ... Hall has played in 18 career games at the boundary corner ... Sophomore **Angelo Rankin** started six games at field corner last fall, making his first career interception at Stony Brook ... Rankin played in 10 games total last season ... Sophomore **Bryson Parker** also played in 11 games last season in the defensive backfield at corner before moving over to the safety position this offseason. The Spiders aren't all young in the defensive backfield though as redshirt senior cornerback **Tyrek Funderbuk** has appeared in 39 games with 19 starts at corner ... Redshirt senior safety **Aaron Banks** has played in 39 games with 23 starts, including 19-straight, while redshirt junior safety **Gio Seigler** has appeared in 21 games.

Walter Payton Award Finalist . . .

Stats Perform has announced 30 FCS finalists for the 2022 Walter Payton Award, which is annually presented to the national offensive player of the year in college football's Division I subdivision with **Reece Udinski** named as

one of 11 quarterbacks on the list ... Named to the award's preseason watch list, Udinski has gone 329-445 (73.9%) this season with his completions per game (29.91) tying for first in the country and his completion percentage (.739) ranking second ... His 3,152 passing yards rank sixth this season while he's thrown 24 touchdown passes and has ran in four on his own ... He is second among all active quarterbacks with 11,012 passing yards and fourth in total offense with 10,759 yards ... He has thrown for 3,152 yards so far this season, becoming just the third Spider to eclipse the 3,000 passing yards mark in a single season ... He has led Richmond to the third-highest producing offense in the CAA, picking up an average 461.7 yards per game ... He leads the CAA in completions (329), attempts (445), completion percentage (.739), completions per game (29.91), passing yards (3,152) and average passing yards per game (286.5) ... Udinski has helped the Spiders to first in passing yards per game in the CAA with an average of 290.0 ... So far this season, he's thrown the second-most touchdowns in a single game in program history with five against Stony Brook on Sept. 24 ... The following week at Elon, he made 58 pass attempts which ties him for second in a single game and his 42 completions from the game rank first all-time in program history and third most by any player in the country this season.

Buck Buchanan Award Finalist . . .

Stats Perform has announced 30 FCS finalists for the 2022 Buck Buchanan Award, which is annually presented to the national defensive player of the year in college football's Division I subdivision with redshirt junior linebacker **Tristan Wheeler** making the list ... One of FCS football's top defensive threats, Wheeler is on pace for his third-straight 100+ tackles season in full football seasons (2019 and fall 2021) ... So far this season he has 97 tackles (47 solos), nine tackles for loss (-24 yards), two sacks, two interceptions, three pass breakups and three quarterback hurries ... He recorded a career-high 19 tackles to open the season at Virginia ... Named to the award's preseason watch list, Wheeler has started 35-straight games since his freshman season—the most of any Spider.

**HEAD COACH
SIXTH SEASON
CHATTANOOGA, 1983**

Russ Huesman is in his sixth season as head coach of the University of Richmond football program and his 14th season overall as a collegiate head coach in the fall of 2022. This is Huesman's second stint with the Spiders after spending five seasons (2004-08) as an assistant coach, including the 2008 National Championship team.

In his 30-plus years of coaching, Huesman has coached 48 All-Americans and 21 NFL Draft Picks, while being a part of nine conference championships and the 2008 National Championship with the Spiders. He has spent 23 years coaching in the Colonial Athletic Association, bringing a wealth of experience to the Spiders.

Last fall, the Spiders closed out the year winning four-straight games to finish the season with a 6-5 overall record. Richmond posted wins down the stretch over New Hampshire, Towson, Delaware and rival William & Mary. The win over UNH on the road marked the first victory for the Spiders in Durham since 2000 while the win over William & Mary gave the Spiders the lead in the all-time series 64-63-5. The Spiders placed seven on the Colonial Athletic Association All-Conference teams, including five First Team All-CAA honors in Tristan Wheeler, Tyler Dressler, Kobie Turner, Clayton McConnell and Aaron Dykes.

During the unconventional spring 2021 season, the Spiders posted a 3-1 record in the shortened CAA season that saw Richmond nationally ranked for most of the season. The Spiders finished the year No. 14 in the country and were third in the CAA standings with a 3-1 record. Defensive lineman Kobie Turner was named the CAA Co-Defensive Player of the Year while eight Spiders earned All-Conference accolades. Richmond also won the CAA Team Academic Award for the first time in program history, despite battling the COVID-19 pandemic.

In 2019, the Spiders finished the year 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Colonial Athletic Association play. Richmond picked up three victories against nationally ranked opponents, including a pair of them coming on the road. The Spiders defeated No. 18 Maine and No. 19 Delaware on the road while knocking off No. 20 Stony Brook at home at Robins Stadium. Freshman linebacker Tristan Wheeler was named the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, given annually to the top freshman in all of NCAA FCS. Wheeler was joined by Aaron Dykes as Freshmen All-America selections in 2019 while the Spiders placed eight on the postseason All-CAA teams.

Huesman led the Spiders in 2018 through a tough, injury-riddled season. Richmond's defensive line was the top unit in the Colonial Athletic Conference, leading the league with 23.5 sacks. Junior Maurice Jackson led the CAA in sacks and earned All-America honors for his play. Senior Andrew Clyde earned All-Conference honors for his third-straight year, becoming the first Spider to start every game of his collegiate career.

Huesman returned to Richmond in 2017 and guided the Spiders to a 6-5 record. The Spiders had 11 different players earn All-CAA honors, led by the Offensive Player of the Year Kyle Lauletta. He became the first Richmond player to win Offensive Player of the Year since Greg Lilly in 1992. Lauletta led the CAA with 3,737 yards, 28 passing TDs and 3,827 yards of total offense and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award.

Joining Lauletta on the All-CAA First Team were Alex Light (OL), Garrett Hudson

(TE), Dejon Brissett (WR), Griffin Trau (PK) and Andrew Clyde (DL). The All-CAA Second Team included Tyler Wilkins (WR) and Cortrelle Simpson (WR), while Brandon Waller (DL), Justin Rubin (LB) and John Yarbrough (OL) were all named to the All-CAA Third Team.

Prior to returning to Richmond, Huesman spent eight tremendously successful seasons at Chattanooga. He was named the Southern Conference Coach of the Year three times (2009, 2013, 2014) and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year three times.

In his eight seasons at Chattanooga, Huesman helped guide the Mocs to a 59-37 record, including a 36-16 mark in his last four seasons (2013-16), which featured three Southern Conference regular season championships. Chattanooga was one of only 10 programs in the country to reach the FCS Playoffs each year from 2014-16. The Mocs were also just one of four programs in the country to post a playoff win during that time.

In his eight seasons, the Mocs had at least seven players named to the All-SoCon team every year, including a school-record 17 honorees in 2014. Prior to Huesman's arrival, the Mocs had not boasted seven members of any All-SoCon team since 1979.

Chattanooga had 17 All-America honorees and three NFL draft picks with DB Buster Skrine (Cleveland – 2011), QB B.J. Coleman (Green Bay – 2012) and LB Davis Tull (New Orleans – 2015) over eight-year period.

Huesman's first stop at Richmond came from 2004-08 as defensive coordinator molding the Spiders' defensive unit into one of the best in the country. In his final year at Richmond, the national championship season, the Spiders led the country in interceptions and finished in the top-10 in four other defensive categories.

Under Huesman's guidance, the Spiders had 23 All-Conference selections, including former NFL standouts Lawrence Sidbury, Jr. and Justin Rogers. During his five-year period as an assistant coach, the Spiders posted a 42-23 (.646) record and played in the FCS Playoffs three times with a quarterfinal appearance in 2005, a semifinal appearance in 2007 and the National Championship in 2008.

Prior to his time with the Spiders, Huesman spent six years at the University of Memphis (1998-03), where he held several positions, serving as the recruiting coordinator and offensive line coach. He also coached the outside linebackers, tight ends and running backs. As recruiting coordinator, Huesman brought in a Top 50 recruiting class, ranked No. 1 in Conference USA, in 2002. It was the first recruiting class ranked in the Top 50 at Memphis.

Huesman also coached for 13 years at William & Mary (1985-97), both with the defense and special teams. During his time in Williamsburg, Huesman coached Steve Christie, a 15-year NFL place kicker with Tampa Bay, Buffalo, San Diego and the New York Giants. His coaching family tree also includes Mike Tomlin, head coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers, Sean McDermott, the head coach of the Buffalo Bills and Alan Williams, the former defensive backs coach of the Detroit Lions. All three played for Huesman at William & Mary.

Huesman's success on the gridiron is not limited to just coaching as he was a standout player at perennial power Moeller High School in his native town of Cincinnati, Ohio. He helped Moeller's team compile a record of 43-0-1 and win a pair of Ohio state championships.

An all-city selection in football as a senior, Huesman signed a football scholarship with Chattanooga, where he started all four years as a defensive back (1978-81) and was a two-sport athlete. During his playing career with the Mocs, he helped UTC to a 31-11-2 mark and two Southern Conference championships. Huesman also patrolled center field on the baseball diamond for the Mocs during his freshman and junior seasons.

Huesman was on the Mocs' sidelines for the 1982 season as a student coach, earning his degree in business education in 1983. He followed that up with a move to the University of South Carolina as a graduate assistant under the late Joe Morrison.

Huesman and his wife Amy have two daughters, Natalie and Emily and two sons, Jacob and Levi.

1968 Tangerine Bowl

Richmond 49, Ohio 42

ORLANDO, Fla. - Richmond entered the 1968 Tangerine Bowl as decided underdog to 17th-ranked Ohio University, one of three major unbeaten and untied football teams in the nation. But, as the Bobcats would soon learn, sometimes the worst bite is that of an upset-minded Spider.

Quarterback Buster O'Brien threw for a school-record 447 yards on 38-of-58 passing, split end Walker Gillette reeled in 20 passes for 242 yards and safety Jimmy Altis grabbed one interception and recovered two fumbles in leading Richmond to a 49-42 win at Orlando, Fla.

"It is the biggest thing I have ever been associated with," Spider head coach Frank Jones said. "I know it is the biggest athletic victory for the University of Richmond."

Ohio took the early lead when quarterback Cleve Brown fired a 48-yard touchdown strike to Todd Snyder, the first of three scores for the fleet receiver. Richmond knotted the score on O'Brien's scoring pass to Jim Livesay. Minutes later, O'Brien scored on a 31-yard touchdown run, putting the Spiders in front for good.

"I've played football a long time, but this is the greatest," O'Brien said after the game. "It's something we've been working on since spring practice."

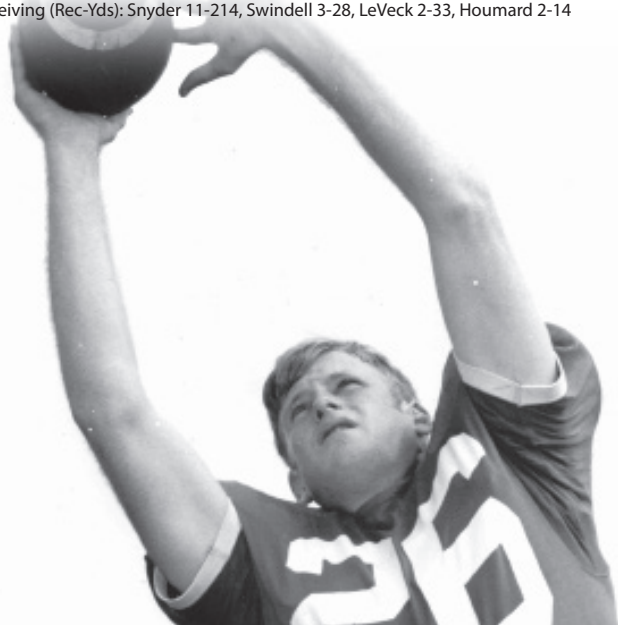

ORLANDO, Fla. - By beating William & Mary 21-19, the Spiders won the Southern Conference Championship and an automatic bid to the Tangerine Bowl, where Richmond met the undefeated and highly-ranked University of Toledo Rockets. The Rockets brought a 34-game winning streak into the contest. Barty Smith represented the Spiders' offense on the day with 10 carries for 51 yards. Richmond was overwhelmed by the tenacious Rocket defense which allowed Spider quarterback Ken Nichols just two completions and forced two interceptions and one fumble in a 28-3 defeat.

Richmond grabbed the lead with a 27-yard field goal by Keith Clark midway through the first quarter. Toledo took the lead for good early in the second quarter when All-America defensive end Mel Long recovered Nichols' fumble in the end zone. The Rockets scored once more before halftime and twice in the fourth quarter to win their 35th consecutive game. Toledo out-gained the Spiders on offense 395 to 138 in total yards.

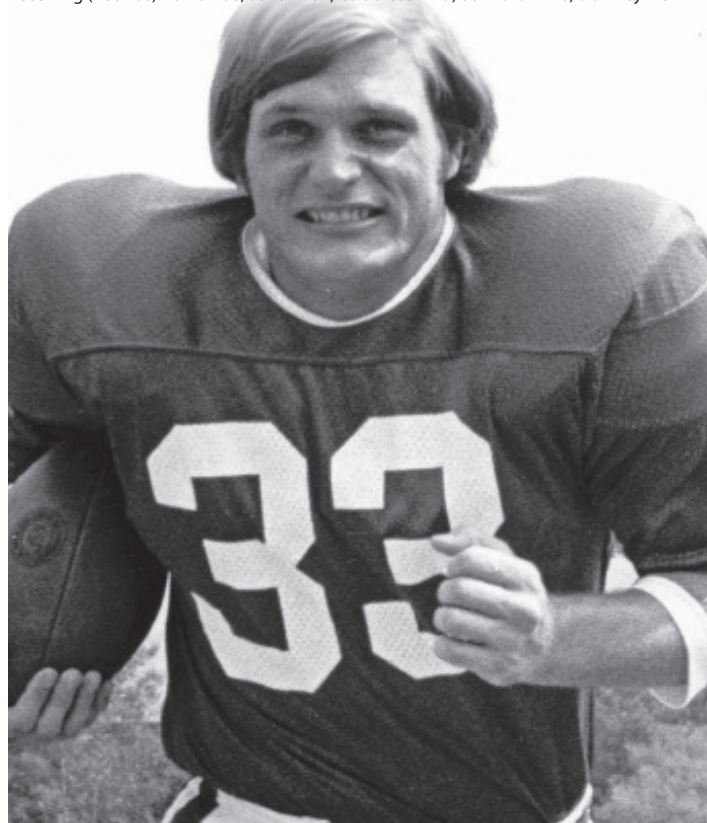

RICHMOND, Va. - This first round Division I-AA playoff game was a great offensive show for both teams. Richmond gained a total of 430 yards, 205 rushing and 225 passing. Boston University totaled 374 yards with 196 of them on the ground and 178 in the air. Richmond's Greg Grooms and David Bayer each scored two touchdowns, while each gained more than 100 total yards. Boston U's Paul Lewis scored two touchdowns while rushing for 156 yards, and Bill Brooks scored three fourth-quarter touchdowns and totaled 112 yards receiving.

Boston got on the board first with an 11-yard run by Lewis with 6:05 remaining in the opening quarter. Lewis was the key to the drive, rushing four times for 65 yards. Richmond answered with its own touchdown at the 41-second mark. Bob Bleier hooked up with Grooms for a 21-yard scoring pass. The big play was a 56-yard pass to Leland Melvin.

Richmond took the lead for good on its next possession. Grooms scored again on a six-yard run at 8:43 of the second quarter. The drive was 12 plays for 65 yards. The Spiders scored again on their third consecutive drive when Bayer ran it in from nine yards out. This score resulted from a Spider reception by Don Miller. The drive accumulated 44 yards on six plays at the 5:24 mark of the second quarter. The Spiders survived a late comeback effort by the Terriers to advance to the second round.

KINGSTON, R.I. - This Division I-AA quarterfinal playoff game was similar to Richmond's first round game in that it was an offensive battle. The two teams combined for almost 900 total yards. Richmond gained 491 and Rhode Island 402. The Spiders passed for 278 yards and rushed for 213. The story for Rhode Island was Tom Ehrhardt passing for 389 yards and three touchdowns. The most critical aspect of the game was the Spiders missing three first-half field goal attempts.

Richmond opened the scoring by converting a 25-yard field goal by Brendan Toibin with :53 remaining in the opening period. Rhode Island answered quickly on its next possession. Bob Donfield caught a two-yard pass from Ehrhardt at the 11:28 mark of the second quarter. Ehrhardt was the key, completing all eight attempts for 57 of the 58 yards the drive consumed.

The Spiders came back to take a 10-7 lead by scoring on a 12- yard pass from Bob Bleier to Leland Melvin with 4:15 left in the first half. Once again, the Rams came right back. This time Ehrhardt threw a two-yard touchdown pass to Dameon Reilly with 1:07 left in the half. The drive went 70 yards on nine plays to make the halftime score 14-10 Rhode Island.

The Rams held a 23-10 lead heading into the fourth quarter when the Spiders tightened the game at 23-17. David Bayer scored from one yard out to cap a 10-yard play, 68-yard drive. Richmond could not muster another scoring drive. The game ended with the Rams advancing to the semifinals.

Appalachian State scored first, converting a 32-yard field goal by Bjorn Nittmo with 8:31 remaining in the opening quarter. The drive only gained three yards on four plays, but benefited from great field position. ASU's defense blocked a Richmond punt and recovered it on the Spiders' 17-yard line.

Richmond answered at the 1:59 mark with a 41-yard field goal by Rob Courter. This score came after an ASU fumble was recovered by Jack Henrietta for the Spiders.

Appalachian State took the lead for good at the 8:45 mark of the second quarter when Tim Sanders scored from five yards out. The decisive score capped a three-play, 30-yard drive.

RICHMOND, Va. - Riding the momentum of a nine-game winning streak and making its first postseason appearance since 1987, the third-seeded Spiders dropped a 24-23 decision to No. 14 seed and undefeated Lehigh in first round action.

The Spiders jumped out to an early 14-0 advantage after a pair of 70-yard scoring drives. Tailback Jasper Pendergrass put the Spiders on the board first, barreling to a 19-yard touchdown run in the first quarter. Quarterback Jimmie Miles extended Richmond's advantage, finding the end zone on a four-yard run in the early stages of the second quarter. Miles was one of the Spiders' most effective offensive weapons on the day, rushing for 80 yards on 24 carries.

Lehigh narrowed the Spiders' advantage to 14-7 after fullback Jeff Snyder scored from six yards out. The two teams went to halftime tied at 14-14 when Mountain Hawks quarterback Phil Stambaugh connected with Rick Moore on a 45-yard scoring play at the 5:32 mark.

A 25-yard scoring run by Lehigh running back Ronald Jean gave the Mountain Hawks a 21-14 lead to open the fourth quarter. Richmond responded with a Jeff Falkowski 38-yard field goal with 1:53 showing on the clock. The Spiders took a 23-21 lead after Pendergrass burst to paydirt with 1:18 remaining in the game.

After Richmond's PAT failed, Lehigh continued to employ a short passing game that had been effective all day to march into Spiders' territory. The Mountain Hawks converted a crucial fourth and three play on Richmond's 45-yard line. Two plays later, Lehigh kicker Jaron Taaffe connected on a 30-yard game-winning field goal with three seconds to go.

On a cold, wet afternoon, the teams played a scoreless first half. Freshman Jake Stewart missed a pair of field goals for the Penguins that could have put them on the scoreboard first. He missed a 37-yarder early in the first quarter and a 41-yard attempt on the final play of the second period. Youngstown State moved to the Richmond seven on its first possession of the third quarter, with 58 yards coming on a pass from junior quarterback Jeff Ryan to junior wideout Sean Guerriero. That aerial set up a 24-yard field goal by Stewart that put the Penguins on top 3-0.

Later in the third period, the Spiders moved to the Youngstown State 21, but Kirchner missed a 38-yard field goal. Richmond put together its most impressive drive of the afternoon in the fourth quarter. The Spiders moved 71 yards in 18 plays in 9:24, advancing to the Youngstown State seven, where Kirchner hit a 24-yard field goal with 2:47 remaining to tie the game at 3-3. On the ensuing possession, the Penguins picked up a first down and moved to their own 37, where Ryan was picked off by Hill at the Youngstown State 44. Hill took the ball down the sideline to the end zone to put Richmond in front 10-3 with 1:22 left.

Senior cornerback Harold Hill, older brother of Jason, intercepted Ryan with 0:41 remaining to secure the win for the Spiders. Richmond's defense held the Penguins to 94 yards rushing, 95 yards passing, 189 yards of total offense and eight first downs.

HAMPTON, Va. - David Freeman and Tim Hightower each scored a pair of rushing touchdowns and A-10 Defensive Rookie of the Year Sherman Logan registered three sacks as Richmond defeated third-seeded Hampton, 38-10, on Saturday evening in the opening round of the 2005 NCAA I-AA playoffs.

The win marked the first for the Spiders in the I-AA playoffs since, 2000, when it defeated Youngstown State, 10-3. Hampton (11-1) entered the game as the lone unbeaten team in I-AA and boasted a 12-game home winning streak, the third longest in the nation.

After holding Hampton to three-and-out on the opening possession of the game, Richmond junior Ryan Mace's muffed punt was recovered by Jahiri Jones of HU at the Spiders' 29-yard line. On the ensuing play, however, UR senior defensive back Joe Mallory intercepted his second pass of the season inside the five-yard line to keep Hampton off the scoreboard.

When Pirates' placekicker Andrew Paterini missed a 20-yard field goal, Richmond drove 80 yards on 10 plays, capped off by a one-yard scoring run by senior quarterback Stacy Tutt, his 11th of the season, to give the Spiders' a 7-0 lead with 2:58 to play in the opening quarter. Nine of the 10 plays on the drive for Richmond were runs, totaling 69 yards.

Hampton then went 69 yards on nine plays and opened the second quarter with a 44-yard field goal by Paterini to climb within 7-3 at the 14:48 mark.

After a Chris Radford punt, Hampton drove down the Spiders' seven-yard line before Antwan Smith hit Onrea Jones on a slant pass to give the Pirates a 10-7 lead with 7:58 to go in the opening half. Richmond answered right back, however, going 62 yards in 12 plays with senior Joseph Fore's 22-yard field goal at the 2:48 mark tying the score at 10-10.

After Richmond was forced to punt on its opening series of the third quarter, junior Ryan Mace returned a Hampton punt 25 yards to the Spiders' 49-yard line at the 7:52 mark. It marked Mace's longest return of the season. Richmond capitalized on the return by going 51 yards in five plays, with Hightower going in untouched from three yards out to put the Spiders ahead, 17-10, with 6:11 to play in the third quarter. The drive featured several nifty runs by UR senior quarterback Stacy Tutt, who used an assortment of scrambles and designed bootlegs to move Richmond down the field.

The Spiders then followed up Tutt's touchdown by recovering an onside kick, their second successful attempt in as many weeks, to take over possession at the Hampton 37 yard line. UR capitalized just 1:32 later as Freeman barreled in on a two-yard run with 4:39 remaining in the third quarter to give the Spiders a 24-10 advantage.

An eight-yard run by Hightower extended Richmond's lead to 31-10 at the 10:28 mark of the fourth quarter before junior Johnny Campbell's first career interception set up a two-yard scoring run by Freeman with 3:17 remaining in the game. Freeman finished with a game-high 117 yards on 21 carries, while Hightower added 73 yards.

RICHMOND, Va. - Sophomore fullback Jerome Felton rushed for a pair of touchdowns and Richmond quarterback Stacy Tutt's fourth down pass in Furman territory with just over a minute remaining fell incomplete as the Paladins edged UR, 24-20, in the quarterfinals of the NCAA I-AA playoffs.

Felton rushed for a team-high 92 yards on 20 carries while senior quarterback Ingle Martin passed for 249 yards and a touchdown. Eleven of Martin's 17 completions went to junior wideout Justin Stepp, who finished with 143 receiving yards.

Richmond struck quickly on its opening possession as senior quarterback Stacy Tutt found freshman tight end Joe Stewart for his first career scoring reception just 2:02 into the contest to give the Spiders a 7-0 lead. Richmond's 66-yard drive was highlighted by a 42-yard scamper by Tutt before the senior quarterback found Stewart from 18 yards out.

Furman answered right back as Ingle Martin hooked up with senior running back Daric Carter for an 18-yard touchdown pass with 9:39 remaining the opening quarter. Tutt then engineered a 10-play, 60-yard drive that was capped off with the senior signal caller going into the end zone untouched from four yards out to put Richmond ahead, 14-7, at the 4:09 mark of the first quarter.

The Paladins drove into Spiders' territory at the start of the second quarter and had first-and-goal at the Richmond nine-yard line. However, a 17-yard sack by UR junior defensive tackle Johnny Campbell on third down and a missed field goal by Scott Beckler from 38 yard out kept the score at 14-7.

A two-yard run by Felton at the 6:10 mark of the second quarter knotted the score at 14-14 before Beckler's 36-yard field goal with 1:07 remaining in the half gave Furman a 17-14 advantage as the teams headed to the locker room.

On the opening possession of the third quarter, Furman drove deep into UR territory before a fumble by Felton was recovered by Richmond senior defensive tackle Dan Mangiero at its own 26-yard line. However, the Spiders went three-and-out and the Paladins drove 63 yards in four plays, capped off by a one-yard plunge by Felton, to take a 24-14 lead at the 8:19 mark of the third quarter.

Richmond climbed to within 24-20 with 8:20 left in the fourth quarter as Tutt hit senior tight end Ben Teufel with a 10-yard touchdown pass. The Spiders went 79 yards on 13 plays in 8:20 but UR could not convert the extra-point attempt.

Furman gained possession at its own 26-yard line on its opening series of the fourth quarter. Forced to punt after driving into Richmond territory, the Spiders gained possession at their own 15-yard line with 3:47 remaining in the game.

A 13-yard scramble by Tutt moved Richmond down to the Furman 30-yard line with 1:14 to play. Faced with fourth down and seven following a timeout, the Paladins were whistled for off-sides, giving the Spiders a fourth and two with 1:09 on the clock. Tutt scrambled to his left but his pass fell incomplete, securing the Paladins' first appearance in the I-AA semifinals since 2001.

The Spiders (10-2) head to Wofford and make a quarterfinal appearance for the second time since 2005. Eastern Kentucky, outgained 417-288, finished 9-3.

Ward was 13-for-18 for 139 yards and the Spiders' defense helped out with a pair of interceptions and two fumble recoveries. Richmond did not turn the ball over, becoming the first team this season not to commit a giveaway against the Colonels.

SPARTANBURG, S.C. -- Tim Hightower rushed for two second-half touchdowns to lead Richmond to its first-ever spot in the Football Championship Subdivision semifinals in a 21-10 victory at Wofford.

The Spiders (11-2) set a school mark for wins this season when Hightower found the end zone.

He had an 18-yard run to the Wofford 1, then followed with his first touchdown to put Richmond ahead 14-10 with 11:55 to play.

The Spiders got the ball back three minutes later when safety Michael Ireland picked up a botched punt attempt -- the only one tried by either team -- and ran it back to the Terriers' 1. Hightower scored one play later and Richmond was up 21-10.

Hightower was held to 88 yards, nearly 100 fewer than the 180 he put up in the opening playoff victory over Eastern Kentucky last week.

The road won't get easier for the Colonial Athletic Association co-champs -- the Spiders will likely travel to face two-time defending NCAA FCS winners, Appalachian State in the semis.

Wofford (9-4) had beaten the Mountaineers in September, three games after Appalachian's stunning victory at Michigan. The Terriers had hoped to face their Southern Conference brothers once again with a spot in the national finals on the line.

But they couldn't get past Hightower and the Spiders.

BOONE, N.C. -- Appalachian State began the season by stunning Michigan and will end it playing for a record third straight national championship.

The Mountaineers can thank their elusive and versatile quarterback for their latest victory.

Armanti Edwards rushed for 313 yards and four touchdowns and threw for 182 yards and three more scores as Appalachian State advanced to the Football Championship Subdivision title game with a 55-35 win over Richmond.

Edwards, a sophomore, dominated on the ground as the Mountaineers built a 21-point lead. After Richmond rallied to tie, Edwards went to the air to put it away.

His 29-yard TD pass to tight end Nic Cardwell with 10 minutes left made it 49-35. His 13-yard TD pass to Cardwell with 5:27 left iced it.

Edwards' rushing yards were the most by a quarterback in FCS - formerly Division I-AA - history, and 18 shy of the playoff rushing record. He also completed 14 of 16 passes in a nearly flawless performance that ended with the fans tearing down the goal posts, the same way they did when the Mountaineers won at Michigan in September.

Behind Edwards' shiftiness and quick bursts of speed, Appalachian State (12-2) won its fifth straight game and plays Delaware for the title in Chattanooga, Tenn. (ASU went on to beat Delaware, 49-21, and claim its third consecutive national championship.)

Eric Ward threw for 208 yards and three touchdowns and ran for two more scores for Richmond (12-3), which had its eight-game winning streak snapped in its first FCS semifinal appearance.

Spiders career-rushing leader Tim Hightower finished with 97 yards on 22 carries.

The Spiders (10-3) advanced to play at Appalachian State in the quarterfinals next Saturday. The Colonels (8-4) had a seven-game winning streak snapped and dropped their 13th straight non-conference road game.

Ward was 16 of 23, completing seven passes to Gray for 87 yards. Kevin Grayson caught five passes for 107 yards. Richmond's Josh Vaughan rushed for 90 yards on 23 carries.

The Spiders broke a 10-10 halftime tie by scoring on their first four possessions of the second half.

After Shawn White returned a short kickoff to the Eastern Kentucky 34, a pair of catches gave the Spiders a first-and-goal on the 9, and Vaughan scored on an 11-yard run around the left side.

The next drive began on the 20 following Patrick Weldon's interception. Ward and Gray connected on a 14-yard score.

Gray's leaping, 23-yard touchdown catch pushed the Spiders' lead to 31-10 with 13:38 remaining in the game.

The Colonels failed on a fourth-and-4 from their 38 setting up the Spiders' final scoring drive. Vaughan then scored on a 17-yard run.

The teams traded turnovers in a scoreless first quarter with each quarterback throwing an interception and the Spiders losing a fumbled punt.

The Colonels had a second fumble recovery deep in Richmond territory negated by a penalty for roughing the punt receiver.

The Colonels began a drive on their 20 late in the first quarter and Cody Watts replaced Allan Holland as quarterback. The new-look offense was successful, moving 48 yards before stalling for a 49-yard field goal by Taylor Long.

Richmond took the lead on a 45-yard pass from Ward to Grayson.

Eastern Kentucky capped a 92-yard scoring drive with Holland's 1-yard run. The Colonels began with 2:07 left and Holland completed six straight passes, the last a 48-yarder to Garnett Phelps to Richmond's 1.

The Spiders retaliated with Andrew Howard's 26-yard field goal after Ward had completed passes of 27 and 19 yards. The Colonels stuffed Richmond's running attack in the first half, holding the Spiders to 30 yards on 16 carries.

The Spiders finished with 412 yards, controlling the ball for 36:09, 12:35 in the fourth quarter.

The Spiders (11-3) advance to the FCS -- formerly Division 1-AA -- semifinals for the second consecutive year and face Northern Iowa, which defeated New Hampshire 36-34.

Armanti Edwards threw for 323 yards and one touchdown and ran for another score for the three-time FCS champion Mountaineers (11-3). But Edwards also threw a career-worst five interceptions in the second half, leading to four Richmond scores.

Eric Ward also had a rushing score, and Andrew Howard and Brian Radford both added field goals for the Spiders.

Appalachian State took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter, driving 95 yards -- aided by a 15-yard face mask call, and a pass interference in the end zone on Richmond -- before Edwards scored on a 2-yard run with 2:58 left.

CEDAR FALLS, Iowa -- Eric Ward and the Richmond Spiders never doubted, never wavered.

Down 20-7 going into the fourth quarter? Well, get some stops on defense and start moving on offense.

Which is just what they did.

Eric Ward threw a 13-yard touchdown pass to Joe Stewart with 14 seconds left and Andrew Howard kicked the extra point, giving Richmond a 21-20 victory over Northern Iowa on Saturday and sending the Spiders to the Football Championship Subdivision title game.

Richmond (12-3) reached the final for the first time and will play Montana in Chattanooga, Tenn., on Friday night. The 12 victories are a school record for the Spiders, who lost to Appalachian State 55-35 in last year's national semifinals.

The unseeded Spiders beat second-seeded Appalachian State in the quarterfinals before knocking off third-seeded Northern Iowa (12-3), which was seeking its second trip to the championship game in four years.

Richmond started the winning drive at its own 38 with 1:44 remaining and no timeouts left. Ward completed six passes in the march, including a 4-yarder to Shawn White on fourth-and-2 at the UNI 26 -- White's only catch of the game.

Two plays later, Ward hit Stewart in the end zone.

Ward also threw a 40-yard touchdown pass to Kevin Grayson and scored on a 1-yard sneak that drew the Spiders to 20-14 with 11:16 left. He finished 28-of-35 for a career-high 280 yards and no interceptions.

Pat Grace's two third-quarter touchdown passes helped the Panthers build their 20-7 lead, but after stopping the Spiders on fourth-and-1 with 2:13 to play, they couldn't come up with another big stop in the final drive.

Grace was 19-of-28 for 224 yards, including touchdown passes of 4 yards to Ryan Mahaffey and 10 yards to Jarred Herring. But Grace overthrew Herring and Schuyler Oordt on what would have been sure touchdowns and dropped a throwback pass when he had four blockers and an open field in front of him.

The Panthers stalled four times on good drives and had to settle for Billy Hallgren's field-goal attempts. Hallgren connected from 35 and 25 yards, but missed from 42 and 51 yards.

Late in the game, when Northern Iowa had a chance to run out the clock, Farley went conservative on third-and-8 at his own 44. Grace ran for 2 yards, the Panthers punted and Derek Hatcher returned it 26 yards, giving the Spiders decent field position for their winning drive.

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn. -- Richmond coach Mike London heard talk from Montana fans expecting an easy national championship win. After all, his Spiders lost three of their first seven games.

Turns out it was Richmond that got the easy win.

Eric Ward caught a touchdown pass and threw for another score, Josh Vaughan ran for 162 yards and a touchdown and the Spiders dominated Montana 24-7 on Friday night for the school's first Football Championship Subdivision national championship.

"I guess the only ones who believed we could do this thing were the people inside the Richmond program," said London, in his first season in charge at his alma mater.

The team held a players-only meeting on Oct. 12 after a loss to James Madison and pledged not to give up on making a playoff run.

Richmond (13-3) won its next eight games behind the calm coaching of London, who replaced Dave Clawson after two seasons as defensive coordinator at Virginia. The Spiders went on to upset defending national champion Appalachian State in the playoff quarterfinals and hung on to beat Northern Iowa before toppling two-time national champion Montana.

A crowd of mostly Richmond fans rushed the field in Chattanooga, surrounding the players as they accepted the championship trophy.

The Grizzlies (14-2), who lost the 2004 championship to James Madison and were making their fifth trip to the title game, found themselves in a 21-0 hole by halftime.

"We picked a really bad day not to show up," Montana safety Colt Anderson said.

Ward struck first when he pitched the ball to fullback John Crone just a few minutes into the game. The quarterback took off toward the end zone and Crone hit him from 23 yards out -- his first touchdown pass and Ward's first touchdown reception.

"I began giggling when it was called, because I never thought we would run it," Crone said. "It happened in slow motion and when I saw him open, I knew I had to hit him or I would never hear the end of it."

Montana moved quickly downfield in an attempt to answer, but the drive stalled at the 11 and Brody McKnight missed a 34-year field goal attempt.

Little would go right for the Grizzlies the rest of the half.

Cole Bergquist threw a 15-yard pass to Steven Pfahler deep in Montana territory, but a penalty for an illegal block erased the play and another drive stalled.

Richmond took over at the Montana 34 and, three players later, Vaughan bounced a run outside and scored from 5 yards out to make it 14-0 with 11:29 left in the first half.

Ward's 13-yard touchdown pass to Garrett Wilkins with 2:13 to go before halftime capped a 12-play, 75-yard drive that took up nearly 7 minutes.

Bergquist was sacked seven times in the game, with Lawrence Sidbury responsible for four of them. The Montana quarterback completed 19 of 36 passes for 267 yards and an interception.

"We did nothing special," Sidbury said. "We just did what we are coached to do. We were able to get pressure on them."

Marc Mariani caught seven passes for 172 yards for the Grizzlies.

Montana didn't reach the end zone until 11:56 left in the game, when Chase Reynolds plowed in from 4 yards out. But Eric McBride picked off Bergquist moments later, and Brian Radford's 39-yard field goal with 6:54 left in the game dashed any hopes of a Montana comeback.

"The did a really nice job, doing to us what we've been doing to people we've played lately," Montana coach Bobby Hauck said. "They gave a great effort. They got out to a good start and held on. They played great defense and didn't let us back in the game."

RICHMOND, Va. -- Senior QB Eric Ward racked up 276 yards of total offense but No. 4 Richmond needed to dodge a pair of missed field goals by No. 9 Elon in the final 90 seconds and held on to win 16-13 in an NCAA First Round playoff game at UR Stadium.

Richmond (11-1) improved to 6-2 all-time in NCAA First Round games, advancing past the opening-round in three consecutive seasons and four of the last five.

Of Ward's 276 yards, a career-best 136 came on the ground as the senior became just the 34th player in FCS history to surpass the 10,000-yard total offense mark in a career.

He chewed off 74 yards on one play as he sprinted through the Elon defensive line, got key blocking downfield by his receivers and ran virtually untouched into the end zone to put the Spiders up 10-0 early in the second quarter.

Senior kicker Andrew Howard booted two field goals before the break and the Spiders led 13-3 at the half. Elon (9-3) and Richmond traded second-half field goals before the Phoenix struck for a 22-yard touchdown pass from Scott Riddle to Terrell Hudgins with 9:04 left to make the score 16-13.

That's when another dramatic UR Stadium finish unfolded before a crowd of 6,143 - Richmond's largest NCAA First Round crowd at home since 1998.

Howard, who drilled his first three field goals of the game from 27 yards, 33 and 42 yards, misfired wide left on a 46-yard kick with 3:43 remaining.

That missed kicked ended a clock-eating 10-play drive that consumed 5:21, but gave the Phoenix good field position at the 29. Riddle moved his team downfield in six plays - three completions to Hudgins - and took two shots to the end zone to Aaron Mellette and Hudgins, but settled for a 27-yard attempt by Shreiner on fourth-and-three, which was pushed wide right.

The Spiders went three-and-out and punted back to Elon with 25 seconds left and no timeouts.

Riddle found Lance Camp for 16 yards, Hudgins for eight and Camp for six more, before spiking the ball with seven seconds left.

Staring down a 48-yarder that would send the game to overtime, Shreiner had his game-tying attempt blocked by senior NG Parker Miles as the clock expired.

The Spiders trademark "Stonewall Defense" yielded just 27 yards rushing and was at its best with Elon in the Red Zone, limiting the Phoenix to a pair of field goals after the visitors had the ball at the seven in the second quarter, and a pivotal defensive stand in the third quarter after a first-and-goal at the one.

RICHMOND, Va. -- Junior LB Eric McBride's eight-yard fumble return for touchdown gave No. 4 Richmond the lead with less than four minutes remaining, but Appalachian State QB Armanti Edwards engineered a game-winning drive that lifted his Mountaineers past the Spiders, 35-31, in the NCAA Quarterfinals at UR Stadium.

Edwards threw a four-yard touchdown pass to Matt Cline with 10 seconds to play, capping a wild last few minutes and giving Appalachian State (11-2) the victory over the defending champion Spiders (11-2) in the last-ever Richmond Football game at venerable UR Stadium.

The finish was wild, beginning with McBride's strip with 3:26 left that looked like it might rescue the Spiders, who had not trailed in the game until the fourth quarter.

On the play, the Spiders punted and Travaris Cadet fielded it inside his 10 for the Mountaineers. While he was trying to return it, McBride stripped the ball from his arms and took it eight yards into the end zone -- a critical play that gave Richmond the lead back at 31-28.

But the Mountaineers had plenty of time, and used almost all of it in driving 70 yards before Edwards rifled the third-down pass to Cline, just out of the diving reach of Michael Ireland.

The touchdown capped a 21-point fourth quarter for the Mountaineers, who hadn't led until Edwards' second scoring run with 4:27 remaining that gave them a 28-24 edge.

Earlier in the quarter, Devon Moore had capped a three-play, 64-yard drive with a five-yard run, and then started a 73-yard drive with runs of 15, 11 and 22 yards.

Moore, who finished with 175 yards on 22 carries, also had a six-yard burst to set up a first-and-goal from the three, and Edwards faked the handoff to Moore on the next play and scampered untouched for the TD.

Like at the start of the game, both teams scored on their first possession after half-time. Appalachian State needed to go just 43 yards after Devin Radford's career-best 46-yard kickoff return. The drive included a four-yard run by Moore on a fourth-and-two from the Richmond 35, and the game was tied at 14 three plays later when Moore ran it in from the 19.

The Spiders needed 14 plays to regain the lead. Kendall Gaskins had a 2-yard run on fourth-and-one from the Mountaineers' 36 and Richmond quarterback Eric Ward had an 18-yard run on third-and-13 from the 22. Gaskins ran it in from the one to make it 21-14 three plays later.

Richmond had two chances to extend its lead, but settled for field goal tries both times. Andrew Howard missed the first, from 29 yards, but made the second from 27 with 9:23 left.

Ward, who played his final game as a Spider, capped his brilliant career with a 17-of-31 effort through the air for 202 yards and a TD. He also rushed 11 times for 51 yards. It marked his fourth 200-yard passing games in the Playoffs.

With the victory, the Spiders advance to the second round of the FCS Playoffs and will face the No. 6/6 Coastal Carolina Chanticleers on Saturday in Conway, S.C. at 1 p.m.

Richmond QB Michael Strauss had four touchdown passes on the day, while RB Seth Fisher accounted for three scores in the win. WR Reggie Diggs finished with eight receptions for 132 yards and two TDs.

Defensively, DL Evan Kelly had three tackles, a sack and a forced fumble, while DB Justin Grant had eight stops and an interception. LB Eric Wright and DB Tafon Mainsah also had one interception each in the victory.

The Spiders seized control of the contest early, scoring the game's first 22 points to take a commanding lead after the first quarter. Strauss connected with Diggs on a 16-yard TD to open the scoring, while Fisher added a pair of 1-yard touchdown runs to take the 22-0 advantage.

After Morgan State scored the next 10 points, Diggs' second touchdown reception pushed the lead back to 19. Strauss notched his third TD pass of the game to begin the third quarter, connecting with Fisher on a 22-yard score.

Leading 36-17 midway through the third quarter, K Peter Yoder connected on a 42-yard field goal -- setting the Richmond school record with 19 field goals made this season. Strauss put an exclamation point on the team's win in the fourth quarter, hitting WR Rashad Ponder on a 38-yard touchdown. Morgan State added a late score, but it would not be nearly enough as Richmond defeated the Bears, 46-24.

The 46 points scored for the Spiders on Saturday is the most in the team's 18-game FCS Playoff history.

Defensively, the Spiders continued to force turnovers. After forcing the William & Mary Tribe in to three turnovers last week, UR was back at it again, forcing the Bears to turn it over three times as well.

LB Omar Howard had a team-high eight tackles, while four Spiders tallied six tackles a piece.

RICHMOND, Va. -- The No. 16/18 Richmond Spiders fell to the No. 6 Coastal Carolina Chanticleers, 36-15, on Saturday afternoon in Conway, S.C. in the second round of the FCS Playoffs.

QB Michael Strauss passed for a season-high 402 yards and two touchdowns, while WR Brian Brown had eight receptions for a career-high 181 yards and two scores. WR Reggie Diggs had eight catches for 140 yards, while WR Rashad Ponder had nine receptions for 82 yards.

Defensively, LB Omar Howard had a game-high 12 tackles, while DB Justin Grant had 10 stops. DL Winston Craig has six tackles, including a sack, while DB Tafon Mainsah had two stops and three pass breakups.

In a defensive first half, Coastal Carolina was able to take a 14-0 lead in to the break. After pushing their lead to 21-0, Richmond got on the board with a 76-yard touchdown strike from Strauss to Brown -- a career long for both players. In the fourth, Brown and Strauss would connect on a 15-yard touchdown, but it would not be enough as Coastal would advance to the FCS Playoff Quarterfinals, 36-15.

With the loss, Richmond's terrific 2014 season comes to an end. The Spiders won nine games in a season for the first time since 2009 and also reached the playoffs for the first time in five years.

RICHMOND, Va. -- The University of Richmond football team (9-3, 6-2 CAA) was dominant on Saturday afternoon, burying Capital Cup rival William & Mary (9-4, 6-2), 48-13, at Robins Stadium to claim a second round win in the FCS Playoffs and earn the right to advance to the quarterfinals for the first time since 2009.

All-Conference running back Jacobi Green collected 141 yards in the game and three rushing scores on 25 carries to pace the offense while QB Kyle Lauletta threw for 146 yards and rushed for two scores. Lauletta completed 12 passes on a season-low 17 attempts and spread the ball around. Brian Brown led the team with four catches for 41 yards with James Pavik picking up three catches for 44 yards. Reggie Diggs also caught three balls and totaled 40 yards. Lauletta became just the second QB in Richmond football history to surpass the 3,000-yard mark during the game.

With his effort on Saturday, Green now has 1,426 yards for the season, which places him fourth all-time in the single-season record books. His 18 touchdowns rank third-all time behind Josh Vaughan and Tim Hightower who each collected 20 rushing scores in separate seasons.

Richmond DB David Jones was spectacular again opposite William & Mary. He began the Richmond with a 50-yard punt return that set up a score for the Spiders. It is the longest return for the Spiders this season and the longest since Justin Rogers had a 54-yard return in 2010. Jones also broke two records with one play in the second quarter. The junior picked off Steve Cluley in the end zone to set a new single-season interception record (9) and took it 100 yards to the house to register the longest interception return in Richmond football history.

That new star for the University of Richmond football team came in the form of sophomore Kevin Johnson, who took off his own redshirt to play in the Spiders' FCS Playoff game against North Carolina A&T on Saturday.

Johnson tossed for 315 yards and a touchdown to lead Richmond past the Aggies, 39-10, for their fourth playoff win in the past three seasons. The Spiders are one of just five schools in the country with a playoff win in each of the past three years.
