RICHMOND SPIDERS (1-0) vs NORTHERN IOWA PANTHERS (1-0)

• Richmond will present 2022 Atlantic 10 Championship rings to members of last year's team and unveil banners recognizing the team's 2022 conference title and 2022 NCAA Tournament appearance prior to the game. 12 players from last year's team are on this year's roster, including a pair of 2021-22 starters (Tyler Burton and Andre Gustavson) and Matt Grace, who made the game-winning field goal in last year's A-10 semifinals and championship game. Several members of Richmond's decorated Class of 2022 are also expected to be in attendance.

• Richmond has won three straight games in the series, including wins vs Northern Iowa in 2020-21 (78-68 at home) and 2021-22 (60-52 on the road). In last season's game, Tyler Burton scored a game-high 26 points on 10-16 shooting from the field (5-9 from three-point range). No Panther scored more than 13 points.

• Richmond held VMI to 25 percent shooting (16-64) in its season-opening win Monday night. That was the lowest field goal percentage for a Spiders opponent since November 17, 2011, when UR held Hampton to 15-60 shooting (25 percent) in a 72-51 win.

• The Spiders are seeking their third 2-0 start in the last four seasons (also in 2019 and 2020). Prior to 2019, Richmond hadn't won its first two games of a season since 2013.

• In his first career start, redshirt freshman Jason Nelson scored a team-high 13 points Monday vs VMI, all of them coming in the second half. Nelson is the first Spiders freshman to score 13 or more points without committing a turnover since current fifth-year guard Andre Gustavson did it vs Fordham on February 20, 2019.

• Richmond collected 44 rebounds Monday vs VMI, matching the most for the Spiders in any game last season (44 at Saint Louis on January 2). It was the most rebounds for the Spiders in a season opener since 2012 (45 vs Liberty).

• After accepting just seven incoming transfers during his first 17 years at Richmond, Chris Mooney brought in three transfers this offseason: center Neal Quinn (Lafayette), guard Jason Roche (Citadel), and forward Isaiah Bigelow (Wofford). In the season opener Monday, the trio combined for 24 points and 14 rebounds on 7-14 shooting from the field in 56 minutes of action.

• This is coach Chris Mooney's 18th season at Richmond. That's the third-longest tenure at a single school by an A-10 coach, trailing only John Chaney (24 seasons at Temple) and Phil Martelli (24 seasons at St. Joseph's).

WITH A WIN ...

• UR would open 2-0 for the third time in the last four seasons (also in 2019, 2020).

• UR would win its fourth straight game vs UNI, a streak dating back to 2015.

• UR would win its ninth straight non-conference home game and improve to 18-1 in non-conference home games over the last four seasons, with the only loss coming vs Hofstra in 2020.

• UR would be 6-1 in its last seven Friday night home games, a stretch dating back to the 2018-19 season.

• Chris Mooney would win his 314th game at UR, two shy of matching Jim Baron for the fourth-most wins by a coach in A-10 history.

CEDAR FALLS, IOWA -- With just over two minutes remaining, Northern Iowa's Cole Henry rolled to the basket and found himself wide open, poised to cut the Panthers deficit to eight with an uncontested layup. But after playing more than 58 minutes without a steal, Richmond's Jacob Gilyard, who entered the game leading Division I with 3.4 steals per game this season, was due.

Gilyard left his man and deftly slapped the ball away from Henry before collecting the loose ball and dribbling up court, this time as the all-time steals leader in Division I. The steal was the 386th of Gilyard's career, breaking a tie with Providence's John Linehan (1997-2002) for the most in NCAA Division I history.

The Spiders bench leapt to its feet and cheered as Gilyard was fouled, sending the game to a media timeout as a crowd of more than 15 family and friends that made the four-and-a-half hour drive up from Gilyard's hometown of Kansas City celebrated and held up the numbers 3-8-6.

"It was definitely big time, to hear my family roar and cheer after I got the steal was huge," said Gilyard. "I'm just happy to have my family here to see it."

"I felt a little hectic towards the end of the game. Like, 'Man, am I gonna get it? Am I gonna get it?' I tried not to force it though. I'm happy it happened how it did. I'm just happy it was a huge time to get a steal. I think it would have been a bucket for them and would've cut the lead to [eight]."

On the Spiders ensuing possession, Grant Golden found Nathan Cayo on a back-door pass for a left-handed layup, pushing UR's lead to 58-46, its largest of the game, and securing a second-straight road win for Richmond.

Richmond struggled to find an offensive rhythm for most of the first half and trailed by five with 1:38 remaining before halftime. But Isaiah Wilson followed a free throw by Cayo with a corner three-pointer with 28 seconds on the clock. With the Panthers holding for the last shot, Tyler Burton stole the ball from UNI's A.J. Green near midcourt and laid it in just before the halftime buzzer to give Richmond a 28-27 lead at the break despite shooting 31 percent from the field (11-35) and 18 percent from three-point range (3-17).

"We had a great finish to the first half, but mostly we were fairly unimpressive offensively," said Spider coach Chris Mooney. "Most of that was because it's hard to get transition [points] on them and they're really, really in the lane tightly and we had open shots and we were 3-17 from three. We just talked about, 'hey - we'll make more shots in the second half' and finally I think that broke loose a little bit."

Richmond started to find the bottom of the basket during a 10-1 run midway through the second half, allowing UR to build a 49-38 lead with 9:51 left in the game. From that point, the Spiders had an answer to every move by UNI, never allowing the Panthers to pull closer than six down the stretch en route to a 60-52 win.

Tyler Burton led Richmond with a game-high 26 points, the second-highest total of his career and giving him a combined 56 points in UR's two games in Iowa this season.

Richmond held UNI, which was averaging 75 points per game and shooting 39 percent from three-point range prior to Sunday, to its lowest point total of the season and hassled the Panthers three-point shooters, holding them to three makes in 22 attempts.

Green, who was coming off 30 points in back-to-back games, finished with six points on 2-12 shooting after being hounded by Richmond's Isaiah Wilson and Dji Bailey for much of the game.



THE BIG PICTURE

PRESEASON POSITION

The Spiders placed seventh in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, which was released at the conference's media day in Brooklyn, NY on October 13. It is the fourth straight season the Spiders have placed in the top half of the A-10 Preseason Poll, tying UR's longest such streak (2013-16) since the conference eliminated divisions in 2005.

THE CHAMPS ARE HERE

Richmond is defending its 2022 Atlantic 10 championship, the second A-10 title in program history and first since 2011. The Spiders defeated four teams in four days to win the title at Capital One Arena in Washington, DC last season. UR opened the tournament with a win vs 11-seed Rhode Island (64-59) before knocking off the tournament's top three seeds: 3 VCU (75-64) in the quarterfinals, 2 Dayton (68-64) in the semifinals, and 1 Davidson (64-62) in the championship game.

Graduate student Jacob Gilyard was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player after averaging 19.8 points, setting a tournament record with 16 steals, and playing all 160 minutes. Grad student Grant Golden (11.8 PPG, 4.8 RPG, 2.0 APG) was also named to the All-Tournament Team.

Matt Grace made the game-winning basket in both the semifinals and the finals. In the semis vs Dayton, Grace hit a three-pointer from the right wing to break a 59-59 tie with 1:40 to play, helping UR complete a 15-point comeback in the 2nd half. In the championship game vs Davidson, Grace's And-1 with 19 seconds to play turned a two-point Richmond deficit into a 1-point UR lead as the Spiders overcame a 6-point deficit in the final 90 seconds of regulation.

NCAA TOURNAMENT EXPERIENCE

Richmond was a 12 seed in the 2022 NCAA Tournament and drew 5 seed Iowa, the Big Ten champions, in the first round at KeyBank Arena in Buffalo, NY. The Spiders upset the Hawkeyes 67-63 behind a game-high 24 points from Jacob Gilyard and 18 points and 11 rebounds from Tyler Burton.

It was Richmond's ninth NCAA Tournament win when seeded 12th or higher, more than twice as many as any other school in the nation. UR also improved to a perfect 4-0 when facing 5 seeds in the NCAA Tournament.

It was Richmond's 24th win of the season, tied for the fourth-most in a season in program history. UR fell to 4 seed Providence in the second round.

MOONEY EXTENSION

The NCAA Tournament win vs Iowa was UR's 27th vs a power-conference opponent and 15th vs a top-25 team during Chris Mooney's tenure, giving Mooney half of the wins vs ranked opponents in school history (15 of 30).

Richmond announced a three-year contract extension with Mooney in June, keeping him under contract with the Spiders through the 2026-27 season.

At Richmond, Mooney owns program records for most total wins (312 entering 2022-23), most wins in a season (29 in 2010-11), most conference wins in a season (14 in 2019-20), highest NCAA Tournament seed (7th in 2010), higher NIT seed (1st overall in 2015), and highest A-10 Championship seed (2nd in 2010).

Mooney is one of 11 coaches ever to win multiple A-10 championships, and his two A-10 titles are tied for the fifth-most of any coach in conference history. Mooney and Mark Schmidt (St. Bonaventure) are the only active A-10 coaches with multiple conference championships, and Richmond and Saint Louis are the only A-10 schools with multiple A-10 titles and three or more NCAA Tournament wins during Mooney's tenure at UR (since 2005-06).

2022-23 is Mooney's 18th season with Richmond. The only coaches in A-10 history with a longer tenure at a single school are John Chaney (24 seasons at Temple) and Phil Martelli (24 seasons at Saint Joseph's).

FUTURE PRO

Tyler Burton, Richmond's leading scorer and rebounder last season, announced he was withdrawing from the NBA Draft to return to Richmond for his senior season on June 1.

Burton, who originally declared for the draft on April 6, participated in the NBA G League Elite Camp and worked out for 10 NBA teams last spring.

Burton was a Second Team All-Atlantic 10 pick and a First Team NABC All-Conference selection last season as he led Richmond with 16.1 points and 7.7 rebounds per game.

TRANSFERS

After accepting just seven incoming transfers during his first 17 years at Richmond, Chris Mooney brought in three transfers this offseason to replenish the Richmond roster.

Neal Quinn signed with UR on April 14, choosing the Spiders over Pitt, Penn State, Virginia Tech, and Loyola Chicago. He was Second Team All-Patriot League at Lafayette last season, leading the Panthers in points (14.7 PPG), rebounds (7.4 RPG), assists (4.0 APG, second in Patriot League), and field goal pct (54.5, led Patriot League).

Isaiah Bigelow signed with the Spiders on April 15. The Wofford graduate averaged 8.3 points and 5.5 rebounds for the Terriers last season.

Jason Roche signed with the Spiders on April 26 after entertaining offers from Missouri, Pitt, Kansas State, and St. Bonaventure after entering the transfer portal. Roche was the Southern Conference Rookie of the Year at Citadel last season. He made 110 three-pointers (ninth in D-I, first among freshmen) and led the SoCon with 36.2 minutes per game.

Quinn and Bigelow have two years of eligibility remaining, while Roche has three.

NEW BENCH

Richmond's three assistant coaches are all in their first year in that role with the Spiders.

David Boyden is a Richmond native who brings nearly 20 years of college coaching experience to UR. He was an assistant at UNCG last season following five seasons as an assistant at Radford.

Will Gipe was promoted to assistant coach after spending six years on the Richmond staff, including the three as the Director of Program Development. Gipe, 28, was the A-10's second-youngest assistant coach at the time of his promotion.

THE BIG PICTURE

Peter Thomas returns to Richmond after originally serving as the team's Director of Basketball Operations from 2008 to 2013. Thomas, a Spiders captain as a senior in 2006-07, spent the previous nine seasons at Campbell, including the last five as associate head coach.

From last year's staff, Kevin Hovde is an assistant at Florida, Maurice Joseph is an assistant at Butler, and Rob Jones is associate head coach at Liberty.

VOICE OF THE SPIDERS

For the 40th straight season, Bob Black is handling play-by-play duties for Spider men's basketball broadcasts. Black also hosts an afternoon show on ESPN Richmond, the Spiders radio rights-holder.

Black is teamed with analyst Greg Beckwith, a member of the Richmond Athletics Hall of Fame who is second on UR's career assists and steals lists.

In addition to doing the ESPN Richmond radio broadcast for all Robins Center games on national TV, Black and Beckwith anchor the SpiderTV broadcast for all of Richmond's home games on regional TV. Those broadcasts are produced and directed by Richmond Athletics Video Specialist Blake Ellett.

WHO'S BACK, WHO'S NOT

With six players electing to use their additional year of COVID-19 eligibility to return to Richmond last season, the Spiders roster swelled to 20 players. With the eligibility of those six players expiring and two players leaving via transfer, UR's roster is at 16 players for 2022-23.

GILYARD, GOLDEN GO OUT ON TOP

Among the eight players not returning from the 2021-22 team are four of the top 25 scorers in program history: Nathan Cayo (1,385 points), Nick Sherod (1,415 points), Jacob Gilyard (2,039 points), and Grant Golden (2,236 points).

Gilyard and Golden combined for eight A-10 All-Conference selections during their Richmond careers and are both among the school's all-time leaders in games played, points, and assists.

Golden also ranks third on Richmond's career rebounding list and is eighth in blocks.

Gilyard holds the NCAA D-I record for career steals (466), the A-10 record for career assists (782), and UR record for career three-pointers (332). Over the previous five seasons, Gilyard played 5,747 minutes for Richmond, over 500 more minutes than any other player in D-I over that span.

Following last season, Gilyard was given the Men's Basketball Senior CLASS Award, given to one senior or graduate student in recognition of his achievements in competition, character, the classroom, and one's community.

OFFENSIVE FLOW

Richmond runs a fast-paced offensive system that requires every player on the court to handle the ball, pass, and cut -- often on the same possession.

The Richmond offense embodies the concept of "position-less basketball." While shorter players will begin most possessions further away from the basket and taller players will begin most possessions on the wing or in the paint, they will rarely end up anywhere near where they started. Possessions are a frenzy of back-door cuts, entry passes to the high and low post, screens both on the ball and off the ball that, ideally, lead to an open high-percentage shot at the rim or from three-point range.

The Spiders excel at taking care of the ball, and have ranked in the top 25 in the nation in fewest turnovers per game in each of the previous four seasons (including ninth in 2021-22). Richmond has also ranked in the top 25 in D-I in assist-to-turnover ratio in each of the previous four seasons (including 16th in 2021-22), and in seven of the last eight seasons.

MAN-TO-MAN 'D'

Richmond has played almost exclusively man-to-man defense in each of the previous three seasons after mostly relying on a match-up zone scheme for many years. Playing man-to-man, Richmond has ranked among D-I's top 100 defenses via KenPom's defensive efficiency metric in each of the previous three seasons (including 94th in 2021-22) after finishing outside the top 200 in 2017-18 (234th) and 2018-19 (287th).

ATTENDANCE OVERLOAD

Richmond men's basketball's average attendance during the 2021-22 season ranked 78th across Division I, marking the first time the Spiders have finished in the top 80 in the nation since 1992-93. An average crowd of 6,072 attended Richmond's 15 home games last season.

Richmond has ranked in the top 100 in the nation in attendance in each of the previous 10 seasons (not including 2020-21), but 2021-22 is UR's best ranking since 1992-93, when the Spiders finished 69th in D-I with an average crowd of 7,214 in coach Dick Tarrant's final season.

Only two Atlantic 10 schools, Dayton and VCU, played in front of larger crowds than the Spiders in 2021-22. It's the first time Richmond has finished in the top three in the conference in attendance since 2017-18.

With a total enrollment of 4,002 last year, Richmond was the smallest school in the nation to average at least 6,000 fans in 2021-22, the 50th season of basketball at UR's Robins Center.

NEW THREADS

The Spiders have new red alternate uniforms this season as the University of Richmond enters the second year of a five-year deal with adidas to become the official athletic footwear, apparel and accessory brand for the University of Richmond. The agreement runs through June 2026.

WHERE THE SPIDERS DWELL

ROBINS CENTER

Built in 1972 through the generosity of the E. Claiborne Robins family, the Robins Center is in its 51st season as one of the premier small-school college basketball arenas in the nation.

In its 50th season in 2021-2022, an average crowd of 6,072 attended Richmond's home games, which ranked 78th across Division I and marked the first time the Spiders have finished in the top 80 in average attendance in the nation since 1992-93. That year, an average crowd of 7,214 attended UR home games during legendary coach Dick Tarrant's final season.

Only two Atlantic 10 schools, Dayton and VCU, played in front of larger crowds than the Spiders in 2021-22. With a total enrollment of 4,002, Richmond was the smallest school in the nation to average at least 6,000 fans in 2021-22, the 50th season of basketball at UR's Robins Center.

The facility is much more than a basketball arena, however. The Robins Center has been home to addresses by world leaders, University commencements, WTA Tour events, track competitions, water polo matches, concerts, a 1992 Presidential Debate, and more.

Renovations to the lower level of the building in 2018 resulted in the creation of the Blandford-Everett Student-Athlete Performance Center, which provides Richmond's student-athletes with the latest strength and conditioning equipment, access to a nutrition fueling center, and a state-of-the-art sports medicine facility.

The arena underwent a \$17 million renovation in 2013 that revamped the lighting system and installed four 33' x 15' video boards in the corner sections. The renovation also reduced the arena's capacity from more than 9,000 to its current 7,201.

QUEALLY ATHLETICS CENTER

The Queally Athletics Center is the everyday home of Spiders basketball.

Opened in October 2020 following 18 months of construction, the \$15 million practice facility's centerpiece is the Breed Family Practice Court. The gym includes a replica of the Robins Center court plus two additional half-courts and two more retractable baskets on the sidelines of the main court, for a total of six in the facility. Steps from the court is a 20-seat theater that allows for instant review of practice film and diagramming of offensive and defensive schemes.

The Boggs Strength and Conditioning Room, used exclusively by the men's and women's basketball teams, abuts the court's endline and is separated only by a pair of see-through retractable overhead doors. A six-table Sports Medicine suite, a hydrotherapy room with two pools, and the Bugg Fueling Station all border the strength and conditioning area and form the Ball Family Training Center.

Locker rooms and lounges for the men's and women's teams are also located on the ground floor, while the second floor includes Spider Hall, the main entrance to the Queally Athletics Center. The space, which serves to engage fans and alumni in celebration of the proud tradition of Richmond Athletics, features a giant video board as well as entrances to Millhiser Gymnasium and the University's new Student Well-Being Center, which are both adjacent to the QAC.

Head coach Chris Mooney believes that the facility will have a tremendous impact on his team. "The Queally Athletic Center will transform our entire basketball program. Our student-athletes will utilize the amenities of the physical structure each and everyday as prospective Spiders see the facility and anticipate their future at Richmond," said Mooney.

The facility is named for 1986 alumni Paul and Anne-Marie Queally, longtime supporters of the University of Richmond who contributed a \$7.5 million lead gift to launch the fundraising efforts for the new center.

MILLHISER GYMNASIUM (MILL-high-zer)

As it enters its second century, one of the most historic and celebrated buildings on the University of Richmond campus has been completely renovated and now houses the Millhiser Student-Athlete Development Center and offices for both the men's basketball and women's basketball staffs.

The newest version of Millhiser Gymnasium opened in fall 2020 after being refurbished as part of the University's construction of the Queally Athletics Center and the Student Well-Being Center. A mezzanine level was installed to provide office suites for Richmond's basketball programs while the first floor, which still includes the historic gymnasium court surface, is the site of the Student-Athlete Development Center. The Center includes study and meeting spaces for Richmond's student-athletes as well as offices for Richmond Athletics' Academic Services and Leadership Development departments.

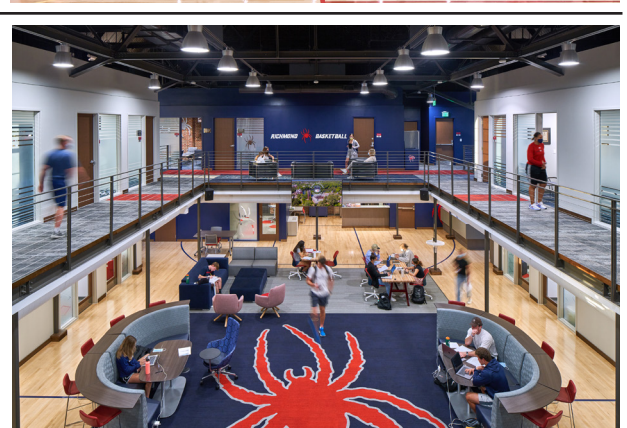
Millhiser's entry hall includes a restored classroom that overlooks the Queally Athletic Center's practice court and a recruiting room with end-zone views of Robins Stadium.

As part of Richmond's commitment to a sensitive restoration of the facility, many of Millhiser's iconic arched windows, which had been bricked in for decades, were re-opened.

Millhiser Gymnasium opened in 1921 and was Richmond's home court between 1922 and 1946.

FAMILY BUSINESS

Several Spiders have family members who participated in college athletics.

Tyler Burton's father Quinton played at Providence and helped the Friars to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances in 1989 and 1990. He scored 11.1 PPG as a senior. When he was being recruited, his final two schools were Providence and Richmond.

Gabe Arizin is the grandson of Basketball Hall-of-Famer Paul Arizin, a 10-time NBA All-Star who twice led the league in scoring. He attended Villanova and led the nation in scoring as a senior in 1950. His No. 11 jersey has been retired by the school. He was inducted into the College Basketball Hall of Fame in 2006. Gabe's father Mike played at William & Mary and La Salle. He earned All Southern-Conference honors following his freshman and sophomore seasons at W&M.

Jason Nelson's father Jason Nelson Sr. played basketball at Virginia Union University and was a member of the school's 2005 team that won the NCAA Division II National Championship. Malcolm Dread's brother Myles plays basketball at Penn State, and his father Aaron played basketball at Millersville University in Pennsylvania.

Connor Crabtree has had three members of his immediate family play college basketball. His dad Keith and his mom Carol played basketball at Longwood University. His older brother Keegan played at D-II Lees-McCrae College.

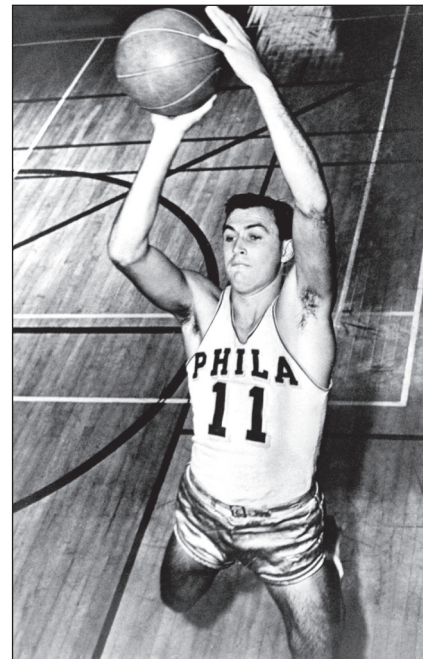

SPIDER BITES

BASKETBALL (AND OTHER THINGS)

Who is the greatest basketball player of all time? More than half (9 of 16, or 56 percent) chose LeBron James. Michael Jordan, with four votes, was the only other player picked more than once. When it comes to athletic skills off the court, five Spiders (Dji Bailey, Isaiah Bigelow, Malcolm Dread, Jason Nelson, Marcus Randolph) named football as their best sport outside of basketball, edging out golf and baseball (three votes each) as the most popular answer. The choice was easy for Liam Weaver, a three-time All-State soccer selection in high school, and Canadian Matt Grace, who went with a national obsession in ice hockey. Tyler Burton chose tennis, while Neal Quinn said he excels at a different racket sport: badminton. When it comes to playing basketball for Richmond, half of the Spiders said they prefer to wear UR's home whites uniform, twice as many as both road blues and alternate reds (both 25 percent).



FOOD FOR THOUGHT

The Spiders recognize the need to load up on food that will give them the fuel needed to make it through the day. Broccoli is the favorite vegetable of a team-high five Spiders (31 percent), while pineapples, strawberries, and watermelons split the favorite fruit title, with three votes each. When that extra kick needs to come from more artificial sources, the Spiders are divided on a preferred caffeine source, with five players each choosing coffee, tea, and energy drinks. Of course, even the most healthy-minded college students can lose their way at times. When that happens, the Spiders prefer Chick-fil-A as their fast food restaurant of choice (7 of 16 votes, four more than any other restaurant) and will choose pepperoni on their pizza (the favorite topping for eight Spiders, five more than runner-up bacon). When the Spiders are forced to cook for themselves, their best bet seems to be pasta. Six of the 16 Spiders said the best dish they can cook involves some type of noodle, including everything from chicken alfredo (Isaiah Bigelow & Michael Walz) to the somewhat less-refined ramen noodles (Marcus Randolph).

STAGE FRIGHT

Overall, the Spiders are a brave bunch. 75 percent of them have no problems riding roller coasters (although Dji Bailey, Connor Crabtree, Malcolm Dread, and Aidan Noyes will pass). And six of them (38 percent) have braved the tattoo needle, with Mo Dread sporting a team-high eight tattoos. When forced to confess one thing they are afraid of, a team-high four players chose heights (Jason Nelson, Aidan Noyes, Jason Roche, Michael Walz). Other answers included clowns (Dji Bailey), cockroaches (Andre Gustavson), dolls (Quentin Southall), snakes (Neal Quinn), and -- incredibly -- Spiders, with Tyler Burton, Connor Crabtree, and Liam Weaver saying they are afraid of the UR mascot. Spider-Man is the favorite superhero of three Spiders (Isaiah Bigelow, Andre Gustavson, Quentin Southall), the second-most popular choice among the team but far behind Batman, the favorite superhero of 11 Spiders (69 percent).



LEISURE WEAR

The life of a Division I student-athlete doesn't allow for a great deal of leisure time, but when they do get some time for recreation and vacation, 11 of the 16 Spiders are more likely to head to the ocean rather than a lake (four) or river (one - Jason Nelson, a native of Richmond, Va. AKA River City). Opinions are more divided when it comes to the ideal climate, season, or place to travel. By a nine to seven margin, the Spiders say they would rather be cold than hot. But spring is the season of choice for a team-high seven Spiders, with summer, fall, and winter each receiving three votes. When it comes to international travel, Ireland would be the preferred destination for a team-high three Spiders (Malcolm Dread, Neal Quinn, Jason Roche). The other countries to receive multiple votes were Japan (Dji Bailey, Liam Weaver), Greece (Tyler Burton, Michael Walz), Italy (Connor Crabtree, Quentin Southall), and Burkina Faso (Gabe Arizin, Matt Grace). When vacation turns to staycation, the Spiders have opinions about how to fill their free time. A team-high five players say The Lion King is their favorite Disney movie, narrowly edging out Ratatouille (three votes). For a second-screen experience while watching Simba, the Spiders choose Instagram as their favorite social media app, with IG outpacing twitter nine votes to five. Two Spiders, Connor Crabtree and Malcolm Dread, opt for Tik Tok instead.



TURN ME UP

When it comes time to get ready for a game, a team-high five Spiders said Drake is the artist most likely to be on their headphones. Lil Baby (four), J-Cole (two), and Rod Wave (two) also received multiple votes. While all 16 Spiders chose rap as their preferred pregame music, their responses when they were asked about the first concert they ever attended were more varied. Gabe Arizin's first concert was a show by the Black-Eyed Peas, while Jason Roche's was country singer Luke Bryan. Liam Weaver (Train) and Matt Grace (Weezer) saw alternative rock acts at their first concerts, while Tyler Burton opted for something a little harder, attending a Marilyn Manson and Rob Zombie show. The least surprising answer came from Marcus Randolph, who said his first concert was a show by Robert Randolph and the Family Band. His father, Marcus Randolph Sr., is the drummer of the four-time Grammy-nominated blues/funk/gospel group.

CHRIS MOONEY

HEAD COACH

18th SEASON

PRINCETON, 1994

In his first 17 seasons at Richmond, Chris Mooney led the Spiders to their only two Atlantic 10 championships, three NCAA Tournaments, seven 20-win seasons, and nine postseason appearances while amassing more wins than any other coach in program history (312 entering the 2022-23 season).

Mooney ranks among the longest-tenured and most successful coaches in Atlantic 10 history. The 2022-23 season is Mooney's 18th with the Spiders, giving him the third-longest tenure by a coach at a single school in conference history (John Chaney - 24 seasons at Temple; Phil Martelli - 24 seasons at Saint Joseph's). In his first 17 seasons, Mooney amassed 154 conference wins, the fourth most by a coach in A-10 history, and 312 total wins, the fifth most by a coach in A-10 history. Mooney is one of 11 coaches to ever win multiple A-10 titles, and only four coaches have won more A-10 championships than Mooney's two: John Chaney (6), John Calipari (5), Phil Martelli (3), and Fran Dunphy (3).

In 2021-22, Mooney and the Spiders captured the second A-10 title in program history and upset Big Ten champion Iowa in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. Richmond won four games in four days to win the Atlantic 10, opening with a win against 11-seed Rhode Island and then defeating 3-seed VCU, 2-seed Dayton, and 1-seed Davidson. The Spiders overcame 15-point deficits against URI and Dayton, two of UR's six comeback wins of 14 or more points during the season, and defeated Davidson 64-62 in the A-10 final after trailing by six points with 90 seconds remaining. Richmond earned a 12 seed in the Midwest Region of the NCAA Tournament and a match up with Big Ten champion Iowa, a 5 seed, in the First Round. Days after being named Most Outstanding Player of the A-10 Tournament, Jacob Gilyard led all players with 24 points and six assists and Nathan Cayo recorded a pair of 'And-1's' in the final 90 seconds to lead UR to a 67-63 win and secure the sixth trip to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament in program history. The win was Richmond's ninth NCAA Tournament win when seeded 12th or lower, more than twice as many as any other school in Tournament history. Richmond finished 24-13, the fourth-most wins ever by a Spiders team, and Mooney was named UR's Coach of the Year by the school's Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC). After setting the NCAA Division I career steals record in December, Gilyard was a semifinalist for the Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year, a Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American, and the Virginia State Defensive Player of the Year. In April, he won the Senior CLASS Award as the top senior or graduate student-athlete in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball. Gilyard also earned A-10 All-Conference honors for a fourth straight season. Tyler Burton led Richmond in scoring and rebounding and was named Second Team All-Atlantic 10 by the conference and First Team All-Atlantic 10 by the NABC. Burton totaled the 14th-most points, 594, and the seventh-most rebounds, 285, in a season in program history. Grant Golden was named to the A-10 All-Tournament Team and finished his Spiders career with the second-most points (2,246), third-most rebounds (1,015), and fourth-most assists (476) in Spiders history.

Mooney and the Spiders posted a 14-9 record in the COVID-shortened 2020-21 season and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT. Richmond opened the season by winning the Bluegrass Showcase in Lexington, Ky. The Spiders beat 10th-ranked Kentucky in the final game for the program's first road win ever vs a team in the top 10 of the Associated Press Poll. UR rose as high as 19th in the AP Top 25 during its 4-0 start, the best ranking for the Spiders since December 1957. Richmond earned a 2-seed in the NIT and defeated MAC regular-season champion Toledo in the First Round despite playing without its two leading scorers, Blake Francis and Grant Golden, who were sidelined with injuries. Jacob Gilyard broke Richmond's career assists record while leading the nation in steals for a second straight season and being named a Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American. Tyler Burton earned the A-10's Chris Daniels Award, given to the conference's most improved player. He was one of four Spiders to earn A-10 honors, as Francis, Gilyard, and Golden landed on the league's All-Conference teams for a second straight season.

In 2019-20, Mooney led Richmond to one of the best regular seasons in program history and was on the verge of taking the Spiders to the NCAA Tournament when the postseason was canceled due to COVID-19. The Spiders went 24-7, tying the school record for regular-season wins, and posted three wins over power-conference opponents, including a victory over eventual Big Ten champion Wisconsin in the Legends Classic. Richmond went 14-4 in conference play, a program record for conference wins in a season, and finished second in the Atlantic 10, the highest regular-season finish for UR since joining the conference in 2001. Mooney's Spiders relied on a starting lineup comprised entirely of juniors, three of whom -- Jacob Gilyard, Blake Francis, and Grant Golden -- earned All-Atlantic 10 honors following the season. Gilyard was also named A-10 Defensive Player of the Year and was a semifinalist for the Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year Award after leading D-I with 99 steals, a single-season school record. The Spiders received votes in the AP Top 25 six times, including a season-high six in the final poll of the season.

2009-10 and 2010-11 are remembered as two of the top seasons in Mooney's coaching career and in Spider basketball history. In 2011, Richmond defeated Dayton in the A-10 championship game to earn Mooney's first conference championship, the Spiders first title since Richmond joined the Atlantic 10 in 2001. The Spiders would go on to the second Sweet 16 in program history by downing Vanderbilt and Morehead State in the NCAA Denver Subregional. Richmond finished 29-8, set a school record for wins, and finished 21st in the coaches poll.

In 2010, Richmond earned its first NCAA at-large bid since 2004, garnering a seven seed before falling in the first round of the tournament. Mooney was named the 2010 Sporting News Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year, and was a finalist for the 2010 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year award. The Spiders finished the season ranked 24th in the final AP Top 25.

Mooney previously coached at Air Force for five seasons: three as an assistant, one as an associate head coach and his final season as head coach. In 2004-05, Mooney led the Falcons to an 18-12 record and votes in the national polls. His 18 victories were the most by a first-year head coach at Air Force.

Mooney began coaching at the high school level, taking a job at Lansdale Catholic High School in Lansdale, Pa., in 1994. His first college coaching experience came at Division III Beaver College, now known as Arcadia University. He spent two seasons there from 1998-2000. While at Beaver College, Mooney only coached part-time, spending much of his time as an event coordinator. He helped plan weddings and events while also serving as the team manager. Mooney is married to the former Lia Chomat, a Princeton graduate who also has a doctorate in psychology from Penn. The couple has two sons, Danny and Ryan.
