### What's On Tap ...

The Spiders and Tribe will meet Saturday for the 135th time during the "Oldest Rivalry in the South," the Capital Cup Presented C&F Bank ... The meeting, which will be played in 2024 as the final year where both teams share a conference, dates all the way back to 1898 ... Only three rivalries in NCAA Division I have more games played: Lafayette-Lehigh (159), Princeton-Yale (146) and Harvard-Yale (139).

### Series History ...

Richmond holds a one-game upper hand in the historic rivalry that currently sits at 65-64-5 after the Spiders beat the Tribe, 27-26 a year ago in Williamsburg to be named CAA champions ... Richmond has won 15 of the last 20 meetings.

### Spiders On Top ...

Last week's 24-21 win over Hampton secured Richmond at least a share of the CAA title, marking the Spiders second CAA title in as many years ... It also extended the team's win streak to nine games, the longest since 1998 ... Last week's win, along with losses from Villanova and Stony Brook, earned Richmond the conference's automatic bid to the FCS Playoffs, per the league's tiebreaker rules ... The Spiders could be crowned outright champions with a win against William & Mary and a Rhode Island loss to Bryant on Saturday.

### Back-To-Back-To-Back To The Playoffs ...

Richmond will head to the FCS Playoffs for the third consecutive year ... The last time the Spiders made three straight playoff appearances was from 2014 to 2016 ... Prior to that, they achieved the feat in the 2007, 2008 and 2009 seasons ... Richmond has now won back-to-back conference titles for just the second time in program history, also doing so in the Southern Conference in 1968 and 1969.

### Coach Huesman In The Capital Cup ...

Head Coach Russ Huesman has been a part of The Capital Cup 25 times in his career prior to Saturday's meeting ... Huesman, who is in his eighth year as Spiders head coach, has spent time on both the Richmond and William & Mary sidelines in his coaching career ... He is 21-4 all-time in the Capital Cup as a coach and is 5-2 in the series as a head coach, winning in 2017, 2018, 2021 spring, 2021 fall and 2023 ... Last year's Capital Cup victory in Williamsburg was the 100th win in Huesman's career as a head coach and earned Richmond a share of the CAA title.

### Of Note ...

A win against William & Mary would give Richmond its first 10-win regular season since 2009, tying the program's best-ever regular-season record ... The Spiders won the inaugural CAA championship in 2007 alongside co-champion UMass ... The Spiders have won CAA titles in 2007, 2009, 2012, 2015, 2023 and 2024, but have never been crowned outright champions ... With a win against William & Mary, Richmond will have its first undefeated conference season since going 6-0 in the Southern Conference in 1968 ... Richmond's 2024 CAA title is its sixth and final in the conference and this year marks the 14th time in program history the team has made it to the FCS Playoffs ... The Spiders are one of five teams to clinch auto-bids to the FCS Playoffs so far, joining Montana State (Big Sky), Mercer (SoCon), Incarnate Word (Southland) and Abilene Christian (United Athletic) ... Only six teams ever have posted an undefeated record in CAA play (2021 Spring Delaware, 4-0), (2019 James Madison, 8-0), (2017

James Madison, 8-0), (2016 James Madison, 8-0), (2014 New Hampshire, 8-0) and (2008 James Madison, 8-0).

### **1K For ZPS . . .**

Zach Palmer-Smith had his fourth 100-yard rushing game of the season at Hampton, turning in 166 yards and two scores on 27 carries, and became the first Richmond player to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season since Jacobi Green (1,409 yards) in 2015 . . . Palmer-Smith, who entered the game with 980 rushing yards, surpassed the 1,000-yard milestone on his very first carry—a 54-yard run on the Spiders’ opening play from scrimmage.

### **What Grant He Do?! . . .**

Defensive end Jeremiah Grant has been menacing opposing quarterbacks all season with a 11.5 sacks, 95 sack yards and 1.04 sacks per game . . . Grant turned in three of Richmond’s season-high seven sacks against Towson for his second game this season with three sacks . . . Grant is now tied with Richmond Athletics Hall-of-Famer Lawrence Sidbury Jr. for third-most in a single season and his 19.5 career sacks tie him for 10th all-time at UR . . . Grant needs 2.5 more sacks to tie and 3.0 sacks to break Richmond’s single-season sacks record, currently held by Marc Megna, who set the record with 14.0 sacks in 1997.

### **Huesman Moves Up The Rankings . . .**

The University of Richmond began playing football in 1881 and in its 142 year history has had 37 head coaches . . . With the win against Towson, Head Coach Russ Huesman, who has led the program since the 2017 season, became the third-winningest coach in program history . . . The win marked Huesman’s 49th at the helm of the Spiders, passing Jim Reid for the No. 3 spot . . . Huesman, who reached the half-century mark with the win against Campbell, is now just three wins away from surpassing Ed Merrick for second place . . . Frank Dobson, who coached the Spiders from 1913-1917 and again from 1919-1933, holds the record for the most wins in program history with 79.

### **Trending Upwards . . .**

The 2021 Spiders battled through injuries and started the season 2-5 before orchestrating four consecutive wins to end the season, including a 20-17 Capital Cup victory over William & Mary . . . Since the turnaround at the end of the 2021 season, the Spiders are 31-10 overall and an astounding 25-3 in Coastal Athletic Association conference games.

### **Traynor Claims CAA Defensive Player of the Week Honors . . .**

Redshirt freshman safety Matthew Traynor was named the Coastal Athletic Association Defensive Player of the Week after helping Richmond to a 27-24 victory over Campbell . . . Traynor tallied a career-high 12 tackles as well as another career-best 2.0 tackles for loss and intercepted a pass in the first quarter during the victory at Campbell . . . The 12 tackles exceeded his previous best by five and the interception was the second of his career . . . Traynor served as a leader on the Spiders defense that held the Camels to just seven second-half points as the Spiders came back from a ten-point deficit.

### **O’Haire Kicks His Way To The Top . . .**

True freshman Sean O’Haire was named both the Coastal Athletic Association Special Teams Player of the Week as well as the Stats Perform FCS National Special Teams Player of the Week after contributing 17 points in the Spiders 35-24 victory over Towson . . . In just his second game seeing action, the Ireland native came off the bench in the first quarter and went 5-for-5 on field goals, making kicks from 21, 22, 47 (career best), 36, and 18 yards, while also converting 2-for-2 on PATs during Richmond’s Homecoming victory . . . His five field goals made are a program record and his 17 points scored tie for first all-time among Spiders kickers . . . His five field goals made matched the most in FCS so far this season.

### **There They Go! . . .**

Junior Zach Palmer-Smith leads the Spiders ground attack . . . The junior transfer recorded a season and career-high 200 yards and his team-leading seventh

touchdown of the year on 25 carries to help Richmond earn the win over North Carolina A&T on Oct. 5 . . . During the contest, Palmer-Smith, along with fellow running back Andrew King, helped the Spiders average 8.2 yards a carry and were the first Spider duo to rush for 100 yards or more in a single game since Oct. 10, 2015 when Jacobi Green and Seth Fisher pulled off the feat against Elon . . . Palmer-Smith rushed for over 150 yards in three of the last seven games and is the first Spider to do so in three-consecutive games since 2015 when Green did the same during weeks seven through nine . . . King is Richmond's first true freshman to run for 100 yards since 2016 . . . King's six carries needed to achieve 100 rushing yards are the least for a Spider since before 1977 — the furthest back Richmond's records go .

### **Field Flipper . . .**

Punter Aaron Trusler has helped Richmond reach fourth in the country in net punting with 42.15 yards a kick . . . Trusler and the rest of the Spiders punt coverage unit are currently first in the CAA and 13th nationally with 42 opponent punt return yards allowed all season . . . Against North Carolina A&T, he recorded a 75-yard punt, the second-longest of his career, just one yard short of his career best . . . Trusler is responsible for three of the 10 longest punts in program history with kicks of 76, 75 and 74 yards under his belt.

### **Coleman Collects CAA Offensive Player of the Week . . .**

Camden Coleman was named the CAA Football Offensive Player of the Week after he led the Spiders to their sixth straight victory with a 41-14 road win over Bryant . . . Coleman was 15-of-16 passing for 278 yards and four touchdowns while adding a fifth on the ground . . . Coleman had a four-yard rushing touchdown run in the first quarter before throwing touchdown passes from 60, 36, 15 and 16 yards in the second quarter to give the CAA-leading Spiders a 41-7 lead at half . . . His 322.2 pass efficiency rating and 93.8% completion percentage were the best in FCS this season.

### **Career-High Day For DeGennaro . . .**

Nick DeGennaro hauled in seven catches on seven targets for a career-high 162-yard game at Bryant . . . DeGennaro is the first Spider to record 150+ yards in a game since Jakob Herres recorded 174 at Maine in 2022 . . . DeGennaro has now had four 100+ yard receiving games in his career.

### **ZPS Delivers . . .**

Zach Palmer-Smith earned his first start as a Spider and was Richmond's leading rusher with 80 yards on 21 attempts and two touchdowns in the 38-0 win over Charleston Southern . . . Against Delaware State, Palmer-Smith ran for 156 yards and three touchdowns . . . Palmer-Smith turned in his team-leading seventh touchdown of the season against North Carolina A&T and ended the day with 25 carries for a season and career-high 200 yards . . . He's the first Richmond player to rush for 150+ yards in three consecutive games since 2015 when Jacobi Green pulled off the feat . . . ZPS currently sits second in the CAA with 169 carries for 927 yards and nine touchdowns (second in CAA) and has helped the Spiders reach second in the CAA in rushing yards with 1,959 and was named the CAA Offensive Player of the Week following his performance against North Carolina A&T.

### **Up Goes Fraser . . .**

Redshirt freshman corner CJ "Tank" Fraser recorded a career-high nine tackles, 0.5 tackles for loss, a forced fumble and an interception in Richmond's 27-17 victory at Elon . . . During the contest, Fraser more than doubled his tackles total from the season . . . The interception was the first of his career and one of three turnovers forced by the Spiders in the game . . . For his performance, Fraser was named the CAA's Defensive Player of the Week, Richmond's first weekly honor of the year.

### Here Comes Hodges . . .

CJ Fraser's first career interception during the Elon game was possible thanks in part to fellow red-shirt freshman Jamar Hodges, who recorded a hurry on the Elon quarterback and forced an errant pass that found its way into Fraser's arms . . . The Petersburg native who was seeing his first collegiate playing experience, came up with 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble later in the game as well . . . Against Delaware, he recorded three tackles, a forced fumble that was recovered by Richmond and a quarterback hurry.

### October Named to EE Football's 2000s All-Decade Team . . .

Former Spiders defensive back and current Offensive Coordinator and Wide Receivers Coach Winston October has been named to the Edmonton Elks (formerly Eskimos) 2000s All-Decade Team as a kick returner . . . October played six years in the Canadian Football League, spending 1999-2000 with the Montreal Alouettes while being a member of Edmonton's team from 2001-04 . . . During his career with Edmonton, he returned four punts for touchdowns and had two seasons (2003, 2004) with over 1,000 kickoff return yards . . . Additionally, he saw time as a wide receiver, posting 19 receptions for 196 yards in 2003 and was part of the 2003 Edmonton Grey Cup Championship team . . . When he finished his career, he was second all-time in Edmonton history in total punt return yardage, punt return touchdowns and kickoff return yardage in a season . . . Following his playing career with Edmonton, he would serve as the team's pass game coordinator and wide receiver coach in 2021.

### Next Man Up Mentality . . .

Donovan Hoilette made the offseason switch from linebacker to defensive end and appeared in Richmond's first two games before suffering a season-ending leg injury against Wofford . . . Taking his spot as a starter will be Camden Byrd . . . Byrd, who made his first career start against Charleston Southern, recorded a career-high seven tackles including a sack at Delaware State . . . Offensive lineman Keith Gouveia went down with injury during the Charleston Southern game . . . Taking over Gouveia's spot at left guard is Scott Hummel, who has been a regular on Richmond's offensive line since transferring from James Madison ahead of the 2023 season . . . Landon Ellis stepped up in lieu of an injured Nick DeGennaro during the Delaware State game when the sophomore recorded a career-high seven receptions for 131 yards including a career-long 61-yard touchdown reception . . . Camden Coleman earned his first start of the season at Delaware State, filling in for Kyle Wickersham who was out with an ankle sprain . . . Coleman helped the Spiders to its highest offensive output of the year, going 18-of-32 for 312 yards and a 61-yard touchdown pass to Ellis against the Hornets.

### NFL Spiders . . .

A pair of Spider graduates are gearing up for the NFL season . . . Kobie Turner '21 is entering his second season as a defensive tackle with the Los Angeles Rams and was recently voted a team captain . . . Turner played his final season as a Spider in 2021 before using his final year of eligibility at Wake Forest . . . Turner finished third in points for the NFL's Defensive Rookie of the Year Award after his first season as a pro saw him collect 57 tackles and nine sacks . . . Following this year's NFL Draft, Tyrek Funderburk signed as an undrafted free agent with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and has since made the 53-man active roster as a cornerback . . . Funderburk played four season for the Spiders, graduating in 2022 before using his fifth year at App State where he was named First Team All-Sun Belt and Second-Team All-America . . .

### October's Offense . . .

Last year wide receivers coach Winston October served as Co-Offensive Coordinator alongside offensive line coach Adam Ross who left for Murray State this offseason . . . This year the play calling will solely be October's responsibility . . . Last year's offense ran 825 total plays (3rd most in CAA) while averaging 345.5 yards per game . . . The 2024 Spiders return every wide receiver who recorded a touchdown a year ago.

### A Familiar Offensive Line . . .

Richmond's offensive line is reloaded as it welcomes back team captain Tom Elia, Keith Gouveia, Scott Hummel, Parker Mitchell, Cade Salyers and Phillip Gray III who all made at least one start in 2023 and, with the exception of Salyers who missed the majority of the year due to an early-season injury, were listed on the final two-deep of 2023 . . . Salyers is now set to return to competition and will line up next to familiar faces like veterans Elia and Gouveia who have been longtime fixtures on the o-line, along with redshirt sophomores Gray III and Mitchell . . . Outside of the time he was injured, Salyers along with Elia, Gouveia, Gray III and Mitchell have been listed on nearly every two deep of their careers . . . Last season's offensive line helped the Spiders rank second in the CAA in completion percentage at 67.8 percent, while Kyle Wickersham led the nation in the category at 72.6 percent during his first season in the starting role Richmond averaged 345 yards and 28.2 points per game

and was fourth in the CAA and 19th nationally in first downs . . . Left tackle Gabe Carbajal made his first career start at Virginia and has earned the nod in each game since . . . Ronald Anderson and Cade Kapristo made their Spider debuts at the end of the Charleston Southern game.

### Spider Slingers . . .

Last season, Richmond used four quarterbacks through its first four games and four quarterbacks made their first career starts through the team's first six games . . . Despite a rocky 2-3 start to the season and instability, Richmond quarterbacks still put up record-setting and nation-leading numbers . . .

### Spider Debuts . . .

Eight Spiders made their Richmond debut in the season opener at Virginia including junior transfer running back Zach Palmer-Smith, freshman defensive back Kyree Richardson, freshman linebacker Peyton Seelmann, redshirt senior transfer kicker Brandon Peskin, redshirt freshman running back Aziz Foster-Powell, redshirt sophomore transfer linebacker Carter Glassmyer, senior transfer tight end Matt Robbert and redshirt freshman wide receiver Cassius Harris . . . Seven of the eight Spiders making their debut recorded stats last Saturday, with Peskin connecting on two field goals and a PAT . . . Palmer-Smith and Foster-Powell led the Spiders run game, with Palmer-Smith paving the way with 77 yards on seven carries.

### Wickersham and Coleman Find Success . . .

Kyle Wickersham finished the season as Richmond's starting quarterback and would go on to lead the nation in completion percentage at .726 . . . While Wickersham (188) threw 38 more passes than Camden Coleman (150), both completed 100 of their attempts . . . Wickersham ran the ball much more than Coleman (112 attempts to 20), picking up 401 yards and four rushing touchdowns on the season . . . Breaking onto the scene during the Maine game, the then-true freshman Coleman made his first career start and came alive, throwing six touchdown passes, tying for the most in a single game in program history and the most in the CAA in 2023 . . . For his performance, he was named the FedEx Ground FCS National Freshman of the Week as well as the CAA Offensive Player of the Week and earned the starter job for the following three weeks including the next game at Rhode Island where he led the team to an upset victory over the No. 22 Rams.

### Defense, Defense, Defense . . .

In 2023, Richmond's defense stood near the top of FCS in defensive touchdowns (5, T-1st), takeaways (26, T-4th), third down defense (0.29, 4th), sacks (39 T-6th) and interceptions (16, T-7th)— all of which categories the Spiders were first or second in the CAA in . . . Linebacker Wayne Galloway is Richmond's top returning tackler after picking up 60 a year ago . . . Corner D'Angelo Stocker and safety Jabril Hayes each recorded a team-leading three interceptions and are back in 2024 as well as Matei Fitz (4.5), Jeremiah Grant (4.0) and Donovan Hoilette (3.5) who were third, fourth and fifth on the team in sacks in 2023.

### Replacing Tristan Wheeler . . .

Tristan Wheeler, one of the best players to ever wear Richmond across their chest ended his storybook career last season after starting 50-straight games, totaling 487 career tackles to be the active leader among all levels of NCAA football . . . The five-time All-CAA selection is believed to be the first player in NCAA history to be named an All-American in five-consecutive seasons as well . . . Redshirt sophomore Carter Glassmyer, who transferred from Saint Franics, is being called on to take over the strongside linebacking position . . . Team veteran and captain Wayne Galloway plays inside linebacker and will be a strong voice for the defense as well as waekside linebacker Quantraiil Morris-Walker who steps into a starter role in 2024.

# 2024 RICHMOND FOOTBALL



## **DeGennaro Does It . . .**

The 2023 season saw wide receiver Nick DeGennaro start all 13 games on his way to being named Second Team All-CAA . . . He tied the program record for touchdowns in a single season, hauling in 11 . . . He recorded 71 receptions for 904 yards and averaged 5.5 receptions and 54.8 yards per game . . . He recorded three touchdowns in a win over Maine, tying the program record for most in a single game . . . Against No. 22, Rhode Island, he caught a career-long 69 yard reception and scored two touchdowns to help Richmond pull off the upset win . . . So far this offseason he's also been named Preseason All-CAA and Preseason All-America by Phil Steele, named to the Shrine Bowl 1000, was named Preseason All-Conference by the CAA, a preseason All-American by FCS Football Central, was named to the Reese's Senior Bowl Watch List and was tabbed the fifth-best wide receiver returning in 2024 by HERO Sports . . . DeGennaro scored his first touchdown of the season against Charleston Southern off a 39-yard strike from Kyle Wickersham.

## **Down In The Trenches . . .**

Last season, the Spiders' defense tied for first in defensive touchdowns (5), tied for fourth in takeaways (26), fourth in third down defense (0.29), and tied for sixth in sacks (39) in the country — all of which categories the Spiders were first or second in the Coastal Athletic Association in, thanks in part to Richmond's front four . . . 2023 saw notable success with tackles Matei Fitz, Aidan Murray, and Carsen Stocklinski . . . This experienced trio combined for 89 tackles and 17 sacks, contributing to Richmond's run defense, which finished 19th overall and second in the CAA with 112.7 rushing yards allowed per game . . . Although Murray has since graduated, TJ Baldwin and Elijah McMillan can expect to work into the rotation at tackles behind veterans Fitz and Stocklinski . . . Last season's defensive ends, lead by, Marlem Louis who, Camden Byrd, Jeremiah Grant and Zander Barnett collectively notched 103 tackles, 17.5 sacks and 152 tackle yards . . . With Louis transferring to FBS San Diego State and Barnett graduating, new roles need to be filled . .

## **The Punter From Down Under . . .**

Australian punter Aaron Trusler returns for his final year of eligibility to cement himself among the nation's best in his position . . . Last season, the All-CAA and All-America selection punted 63 times for a total of 2,168 yards including a long of 76 yards during Richmond's Capital Cup and CAA championship-solidifying victory over William & Mary . . . The punt came as the sixth-longest in program history and tied for the longest in the CAA in 2023. His 2023 campaign saw him average 41.6 yards per punt, and punch a career-high 26 inside the 20 yard line while accounting for seven punts over 50 yards . . . A 2023 FCS Punter of the Year semifinalist and 2024 Preseason FCS Punter of the Year honoree, Trusler will once again be counted on to flip the field and keep opposing team offenses away from the Spiders end zone . . . An ode to his Australian rules football background, Trusler used his legs last season to pick up a first down on a fake punt during the win over Elon . . . He will also be called on to serve as Richmond's primary holder once again . . . During the Charleston Southern game, Trusler recorded a 74-yard field-flipping punt, the second-longest of this career and seventh-longest in program history . . . Trusler's career-best 76 yard punt is sixth all-time for Richmond.

## **New Faces On Staff . . .**

Head Coach Russ Huesman added four new members to its staff ahead of the 2024 season in offensive line coach/run game coordinator Keegan Kennedy, running backs coach Rachid Ibrahim and tight ends coach Kyle Edwards as well as Director of Football Operations/Recruiting Coordinator Dan Madden . . . Kennedy comes to Richmond from Harvard where he served in the same role since January of 2019 . . . Prior to Harvard, Kennedy spent three seasons with Coastal Athletic Association member Rhode Island and has made stops at Central Florida and John Carroll . . . Ibrahim comes to the Spiders after coaching stints at Virginia Tech and Wisconsin . . . Prior to Richmond, Ibrahim served as a graduate assistant with the Hokies . . . Prior to his time in Blacksburg, Ibrahim coached at Wisconsin during the 2022 season where he was an offensive analyst assistant working with the Badgers running backs . . . Edwards comes to Richmond after working with some of the nation's top programs and coaches at stops including Alabama and Maryland . . . Most recently, Edwards served on the Maryland staff as a graduate assistant beginning in May 2021, working with the Terrapins quarterbacks and tight ends under offensive coordinators Dan Enos and Josh Gattis . . . As a student-athlete, Edwards served as scout team quarterback for head coach Nick Saban at Alabama from 2017-19 . . . Despite not seeing game time, Edwards was an instrumental member of the 2018 National Championship team that held the nation's top-ranked offense as well as the Crimson Tide's 2017 Orange Bowl-winning roster . . . During his time in Tuscaloosa, Alabama's quarterbacks room consisted of Edwards along with three Heisman Trophy finalists and eventual NFL starters in Tua Tagovailoa, Jalen Hurts and Mac Jones.

## **Richmond Moves To The Patriot League . . .**

The University of Richmond has accepted an invitation for Spider Football to join the Patriot League . . . The Spiders will compete in the CAA in 2024 and move to the Patriot League prior to the 2025 season . . . Richmond will join the Patriot League as an associate member in football only . . . Conference affiliations for all other Spider sports will not be affected . . . The decision comes following a comprehensive University review of the football team's conference affiliation initiated after the 2023 season in response to continued changes in the national FCS landscape . . . Richmond will become the eighth football member of the Patriot League, joining Bucknell, Colgate, Fordham, Georgetown, Holy Cross, Lafayette, and Lehigh. The Spiders are the first school to enter or exit the Patriot League football conference since 2004.

## **Into The Portal . . .**

Richmond's coaching staff explored the transfer portal this offseason and brought in six new members to the team including kicker Brandon Peskin from Fordham, linebacker Carter Glassmyer from Saint Francis, running back Zach Palmer-Smith from Wagner, wide receiver Cole Schilling from Elon, tight end Matt Robbert from Cornell and defensive end Colin Freer from Princeton . . . Last season, Peskin was named First Team All-Patriot League after making good on 14-of-17 field goal attempts, the sixth-most ever in a season by a Fordham kicker . . . He led the Patriot League and was 15th in the FCS in field goals per game at 1.27 and was 15th in the nation (lead the Patriot League) in field goal percentage at .824 . . . He booted a career-long 45-yarder against Lehigh on the last play of the game to give the Rams the win and was named the Patriot League Special Teams Player of the Week following the game . . . Peskin is third all-time in just three seasons at Fordham in PATs with 109 and led the Patriot

League in scoring in 2022 . . . He spent his freshman season at FBS Syracuse, where he did not appear in any games . . . Glassmyer comes to Richmond following a standout season for the Red Flash as a redshirt freshman in 2023 . . . He was a Jerry Rice Award Finalist and Stats Perform FCS Freshman All-American as well as the NEC Defensive Rookie of the Year . . . He appeared in all 10 games and recorded a team-high 90 tackles with 6.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks and one forced fumble and fumble recovery . . . Last season he led all FCS freshmen and was 28th overall with 9.0 tackles per game while his 78 tackles during NEC conference play were 23 more than any other player . . . Palmer-Smith enters 2024 as Richmond's most seasoned back, having transferred from Wagner where he was second on the team in rushing yards as a true freshman in 2022 with 249 followed by a sophomore season where he led the team 699 yards on 135 carries and three touchdowns . . . Matt Robbert brings substantial experience with 57 receptions for 787 yards and five touchdowns over 23 games with the Big Red and averaged 13.8 yards per catch and 34.2 yards per game . . . Cole Schilling looks for his first real playing time after appearing in two games while at Elon, and Freer is making his collegiate football debut this season as he transferred from Princeton after playing three seasons of close defense for the Tigers lacrosse team.

## **Preseason All-CAA . . .**

The University of Richmond football team was picked to finish second overall in the Coastal Athletic Association Football preseason poll and five Spiders were honored with preseason All-Conference honors . . . Earning Preseason All-Conference honors for the Spiders were wide receiver Nick DeGennaro, defensive end Jeremiah Grant, punter Aaron Trusler and defensive back/special teams player Jabril Hayes, while linebacker Wayne Galloway earned an Honorable Mention nod.

## **Oh Captain, My Captain . . .**

The Spiders have named three captains in center Tom Elia, safety Jabril Hayes and linebacker Wayne Galloway . . . Richmond's ironman, Elia, has appeared in 41 games, making the last 25 starts and has taken nearly every snap during his streak, which is the longest of the team . . . Hayes finds himself rolling with the first stringers at free safety for the first time during August's training camp . . . Hayes had a breakthrough season in 2023 where he played in 12 games, recording 23 tackles including 19 solo and a pair of pass breakups . . . He led the team lead in interceptions with three and recorded his first career pick six on a 48-yard return at North Carolina A&T . . . Hayes' big season in 2023 concluded with him being named First Team All-CAA special teams and Fifth Team All-CAA by Phil Steele— the first all-conference awards of his career . . . Galloway played in all 13 games in 2023, starting the last 11 . . . He was third on the 2023 team with 60 tackles and notched 9.0 tackles for loss (-25 yards) . . . An All-CAA Honorable Mention heading into the season, Galloway returned two interceptions for touchdowns last year, a feat rare for a linebacker.

## **2024 GAME RECAPS**

### **Virginia Too Much For Spiders . . .**

Virginia jumped to an early lead and nearly doubled Richmond's offensive output in the season opener last Saturday, picking up 497 yards to the Spiders 257 . . . Aaron Trusler punted six times as Richmond only crossed over the 50-yard line twice during the opening half, with one ending in a fumble recovered by Virginia on its own 46-yard line, while Virginia scored in all but one offensive drive in the first half (missed field goal attempt) . . . Kyle Wickersham scored Richmond's lone touchdown on a five-yard run and the point-after attempt was made by transfer Brandon Peskin in his first action as a Spider . . . Peskin also connected on two field goals, one from 35 yards and another from 33 yards . . . Virginia quarterback Anthony Colandrea ended the night going 17-of-23 for 297 yards with a pair of touchdowns . . . Wickersham was 13-of-22 for 110 yards . . . Saint Francis transfer Carter Glassmyer led the defense in his Spider debut, registering seven tackles while five Spiders each added five apiece including Matei Fitz who also came up with a sack for a loss of 20 Cavalier yards.

### **Late Spark Not Enough For Spiders Against Wofford . . .**

Camden Coleman punched in a three-yard touchdown run late in the fourth quarter to provide the Spiders offense with a much-needed spark, but it wouldn't be enough as Richmond dropped their home opener against Wofford last Saturday, 26-19 . . . Richmond outgained the Terriers, 318-304, but four interceptions and two quarterback sacks would prove costly for the Spiders.

### **All Phases Impress as Spiders Plunder Charleston Southern, 38-0 . . .**

The Spiders dominated Charleston Southern from start to finish Saturday during Family Weekend Presented by Sheehy Lexus of Richmond, entering the win column for the first time this season with a 38-0 shutout victory over the Buccaneers . . . The win came as Richmond's first shutout win since doing so against Davidson during the First Round of the 2022 FCS Playoffs when the Spiders won, 41-0 . . . The Spiders picked up 370 total yards to Charleston Southern's 131 and held the Buccaneers to just 39 yards on the ground in the contest thanks in part to a stifling Richmond defense led by Jeremiah Grant . . . Richmond found the end zone in each quarter and the Spiders recorded points in all three phases.

### **Spiders Push Past Delaware State . . .**

Richmond put up its highest offensive output of the season at Delaware State, turning in its first game with a 100+ yard rusher, 100+ yard receiver and 300+ yard passer since Oct. 1, 2022 at Elon . . . True freshman Andrew King jumpstarted the Spiders with his first collegiate touchdown that came off the end of a 20-yard run . . . Ellis, who recorded the first 100-yard receiving game of his career, scored his first touchdown off a 61-yard pass down the middle as part of his career-high seven catches, 131-yard night . . . Camden Coleman started at quarterback, going 18-of-33 for 312 yards and the touchdown pass to Ellis . . . Zach Palmer-Smith had a big night, running for 156 yards and three touchdowns to improve to a team-leading five on the year . . . The 100+ rushing, 100+ receiving, 300+ passing game at Delaware State was the first for Richmond since 2022 when Richmond lost at Elon,

### **Spiders Extinguish Phoenix For CAA-Opening Win . . .**

Richmond's defense recorded three takeaways that resulted in 10 points and six tackles for loss including three sacks while its offense ended six out of its 10 drives in the red zone or with a score as the Spiders passed Elon, 27-17, to open Coastal Athletic Association conference play Saturday . . . Quarterback

Camden Coleman earned his second start in as many weeks and ran in a six-yard touchdown for his second rushing touchdown of the season . . . Coleman started the game 0-for-5, but went 8-for-8 after that leading up to his touchdown run . . . He finished the day going 15-of-22 for 203 yards.

## **Ground Game Prevails As Spiders Edge North Carolina A&T Win For Fourth In A Row . . .**

The run game came alive against North Carolina A&T as two Spiders rushed for over 100 yards for the first time since 2015 to help No. 21 Richmond pass North Carolina A&T, 20-17, for the team's fourth consecutive win and second Coastal Athletic Association conference win in as many weeks . . . Zach Palmer-Smith and Andrew King helped the Spiders average 8.2 yards a carry . . . Richmond's 286 rushing yards were its most this season as it outgained the Aggies 410 to 349 in total offense . . . Defensively, Chance Graves led the Spiders with nine tackles (previous single-game high was 2), while Matthew Traynor came up with seven including 1.5 tackles for loss and a pair of pass breakups (one in the end zone) . . . Wayne Galloway also recorded seven tackles as well as a sack for a loss of nine yards in the fourth quarter.

## **Spiders Win Fifth In A Row, Hand Delaware First Loss Of Season . . .**

A storied series came to a close last Saturday as the No. 15/18 University of Richmond football team handed Delaware its first loss of the season, using four first-half touchdowns in a row to pass the previously undefeated Blue Hens, 28-9 . . . Richmond maintained its first-half dominance after the break and translated it into two scoreless quarters for the Blue Hens . . . The Richmond defense was lead by Carter Glassmyer with eight tackles including a tackle for loss, while Wayne Galloway came up with four tackles, a quarterback hurry, and assist on a sack with Camden Byrd that resulted in a loss of 13 Blue Hens yards . . . Camden Byrd had a big game as well with three tackles, 1.5 sacks (-17 yards), a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry. Quantraill Morris-Walker had five tackles, two pass breakups and recorded his second interception of the season when he picked off the Delaware quarterback in the fourth quarter.

## **Spiders Blow Past Bryant . . .**

Richmond secured its sixth consecutive victory and remained undefeated in Coastal Athletic Association play with a 41-14 win over Bryant . . . Similar to the 28-9 victory over Delaware, Richmond scored all its points in the first half and used long offensive drives in the second to ward off the Bulldogs . . . Bryant got on the board first with a touchdown on its opening possession, then Richmond scored on each of its six first-half possessions to pull away early from the CAA's newest team.

## **Spiders Top Towson For Homecoming Victory . . .**

Richmond won its seventh game in a row during Homecoming, defeating Towson, 35-24, to remain undefeated in Coastal Athletic Association play . . . The Spiders forced Towson into four turnovers including seven sacks that resulted in 13 points, Landon Ellis caught a pair of touchdown passes, and true freshman kicker Sean O'Haire was five-of-five on field goals to help Richmond secure the win.

## **Spiders Sneak Past Campbell . . .**

With the game tied at 24 apiece, redshirt senior Brandon Peskin kicked a 36-yard field goal with one second left in regulation to give the Spiders a 27-24 win over Campbell Saturday night and earn the team sole ownership of first place in the Coastal Athletic Association standings . . . The Spiders and Camels traded blows back and forth in the contest that featured four ties (0-0, 7-7, 17-17, 24-24) . . . The Spiders only lead of the game came after Peskin's game-winning field goal as time winded down . . . Nick DeGennaro (40-yard reception), Zach Palmer-Smith (1-yard rush), Ja'Vion Griffin (9-yard reception) and Brandon Peskin (Two 36-yard field goals) scored, while Ellis came up with 101 yards on seven receptions for his second game of both the season and his career with over 100 receiving yards.

# RUSS HUESMAN

**HEAD COACH  
EIGHTH SEASON  
CHATTANOOGA, 1983**

2024 marks Russ Huesman's eighth season as head coach of the University of Richmond football program and his 16th season overall as a collegiate head coach. This is Huesman's second stint with the Spiders after spending five seasons (2004-08) as an assistant coach, including being the 2008 National Championship team's defensive coordinator.

In his 40-plus years of coaching, Huesman has coached 51 All-Americans and 23 NFL Draft Picks, while being a part of 10 conference championships and the 2008 National Championship with the Spiders. He has spent 25 years coaching in the Coastal Athletic

Association, bringing a wealth of experience to the Spiders.

2023 was another big year for Huesman as the Spiders reached the playoffs in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2016. Richmond earned a share of the CAA title for the first time since 2015 and advanced to the FCS Playoffs Second Round for the second year in a row. The Spiders were at or near the top of the national rankings in key statistical categories and eight Spiders were named All-CAA while punter Aaron Trusler, offensive lineman Ryan Coll and linebacker Tristan Wheeler earned All-America honors. Richmond regained possession of the Capital Cup with a thrilling 27-26 victory over William & Mary, giving the Spiders a share of the CAA title and Huesman's 100th head coaching victory. After starting the season 3-5, Huesman and the Spiders put up a seven game win streak including a win over No. 22 Rhode Island to end the season with a 9-4 overall record.

Huesman's 2022 team won five of its final six regular season games to finish 6-2 in the CAA, tied for third in the final conference standings. Richmond knocked off three top 25 opponents in 2022 en route to its best finish since 2016. The Spiders earned a berth in the FCS Playoffs, where they defeated Davidson 41-0 in the First Round, posting the first postseason shutout in program history. In the Second Round, Richmond pushed unbeaten No. 2 seed Sacramento State to the limit, taking a lead into the fourth quarter before falling 38-31. Richmond placed 11th in the season-ending Stats Perform FCS Media Poll and 12th in the AFCA Coaches Poll. Quarterback Reece Udinski won the Dudley Award as the top college football player in Richmond and linebacker Tristan Wheeler was given the CAA's prestigious Chuck Boone Leadership Award for his athletic and academic accomplishments. In total, the Spiders took home 11 All-CAA selections and named two All-Americans in Tristan Wheeler and Ryan Coll in 2022.

In 2021, the Spiders closed out the year winning four-straight games to finish the season with a 6-5 overall record. Richmond posted wins down the stretch over New Hampshire, Towson, Delaware and rival William & Mary. The win over UNH on the road marked the first victory for the Spiders in Durham since 2000 while the win over William & Mary gave the Spiders the lead in the all-time series 64-63-5. The Spiders placed seven on the Colonial Athletic Association All-Conference teams, including five First Team All-CAA honors in Tristan Wheeler, Tyler Dressler, Kobie Turner, Clayton McConnell and Aaron Dykes.

During the unconventional spring 2021 season, the Spiders posted a 3-1 record in the shortened CAA season that saw Richmond nationally ranked for most of the season. The Spiders finished the year No. 14 in the country and were third in the CAA standings with a 3-1 record. Defensive lineman Kobie Turner was named the CAA Co-Defensive Player of the Year while eight Spiders earned All-Conference accolades. Richmond also won the CAA Team Academic Award for the first time in program history, despite battling the COVID-19 pandemic.

In 2019, the Spiders finished the year 5-7 overall and 4-4 in Colonial Athletic Association play. Richmond picked up three victories against nationally ranked opponents, including a pair of them coming on the road. The Spiders defeated No. 18 Maine and No. 19 Delaware on the road while knocking off No. 20 Stony Brook at home at Robins Stadium. Freshman linebacker Tristan Wheeler was named the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, given annually to the top freshman in all of NCAA FCS. Wheeler was joined by Aaron Dykes as Freshmen All-America selections in 2019 while the Spiders placed eight on the postseason All-CAA teams.

Huesman led the Spiders in 2018 through a tough, injury-riddled season. Richmond's defensive line was the top unit in the CAA, leading the league with 23.5 sacks. Junior Maurice Jackson led the CAA in sacks and earned All-America honors for his play. Senior Andrew Clyde earned All-Conference honors for his third-straight year, becoming the first Spider to

start every game of his collegiate career.

Huesman returned to Richmond in 2017 and guided the Spiders to a 6-5 record. The Spiders had 11 different players earn All-CAA honors, led by the Offensive Player of the Year Kyle Lauletta. He became the first Richmond player to win Offensive Player of the Year since Greg Lilly in 1992. Lauletta led the CAA with 3,737 yards, 28 passing TDs and 3,827 yards of total offense and was a finalist for the Walter Payton Award.

Joining Lauletta on the All-CAA First Team were Alex Light (OL), Garrett Hudson (TE), Dejon Brissett (WR), Griffin Trau (PK) and Andrew Clyde (DL). The All-CAA Second Team included Tyler Wilkins (WR) and Cortelle Simpson (WR), while Brandon Waller (DL), Justin Rubin (LB) and John Yarbrough (OL) were all named to the All-CAA Third Team.

Prior to returning to Richmond, Huesman spent eight tremendously successful seasons at Chattanooga. He was named the Southern Conference Coach of the Year three times (2009, 2013, 2014) and was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year three times.

In his eight seasons at Chattanooga, Huesman helped guide the Mocs to a 59-37 record, including a 36-16 mark in his last four seasons (2013-16), which featured three Southern Conference regular season championships. Chattanooga was one of only 10 programs in the country to reach the FCS Playoffs each year from 2014-16. The Mocs were also just one of four programs in the country to post a playoff win each year during that time.

In his eight seasons, the Mocs had at least seven players named to the All-SoCon team every year, including a school-record 17 honorees in 2014. Prior to Huesman's arrival, the Mocs had not boasted seven members of any All-SoCon team since 1979.

Chattanooga had 17 All-America honorees and three NFL draft picks with DB Buster Skrine (Cleveland – 2011), QB B.J. Coleman (Green Bay – 2012) and LB Davis Tull (New Orleans – 2015) over eight-year period.

Huesman's first stop at Richmond came from 2004-08 as defensive coordinator molding the Spiders' defensive unit into one of the best in the country. In his final year at Richmond, the national championship season, the Spiders led the country in interceptions and finished in the top-10 in four other defensive categories.

Under Huesman's guidance, the Spiders had 23 All-Conference selections, including former NFL standouts Lawrence Sidbury, Jr. and Justin Rogers. During his five-year period as an assistant coach, the Spiders posted a 42-23 (.646) record and played in the FCS Playoffs three times with a quarterfinal appearance in 2005, a semifinal appearance in 2007 and the National Championship in 2008.

Prior to his time with the Spiders, Huesman spent six years at the University of Memphis (1998-03), where he held several positions, serving as the recruiting coordinator and offensive line coach. He also coached the outside linebackers, tight ends and running backs. As recruiting coordinator, Huesman brought in a Top 50 recruiting class, ranked No. 1 in Conference USA, in 2002. It was the first recruiting class ranked in the Top 50 at Memphis.

Huesman also coached for 13 years at William & Mary (1985-97), both with the defense and special teams. During his time in Williamsburg, Huesman coached Steve Christie, a 15-year NFL place kicker with Tampa Bay, Buffalo, San Diego and the New York Giants. His coaching family tree also includes Mike Tomlin, head coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers, Sean McDermott, the head coach of the Buffalo Bills and Alan Williams, the former defensive backs coach of the Detroit Lions. All three played for Huesman at William & Mary.

Huesman's success on the gridiron is not limited to just coaching as he was a standout player at perennial power Moeller High School in his native town of Cincinnati, Ohio. He helped Moeller's team compile a record of 43-0-1 and win a pair of Ohio state championships.

An all-city selection in football as a senior, Huesman signed a football scholarship with Chattanooga, where he started all four years as a defensive back (1978-81) and was a two-sport athlete. During his playing career with the Mocs, he helped UTC to a 31-11-2 mark and two Southern Conference championships. Huesman also patrolled centerfield on the baseball diamond for the Mocs during his freshman and junior seasons.

Huesman was on the Mocs' sidelines for the 1982 season as a student coach, earning his degree in business education in 1983. He followed that up with a move to the University of South Carolina as a graduate assistant under the late Joe Morrison.

Huesman and his wife Amy have two daughters, Natalie and Emily and two sons, Jacob and Levi.
