RICHMOND SPIDERS (1-0) vs MARIST RED FOXES (0-1)

• Richmond scored 101 points in its season-opening win vs Mount Olive Wednesday. It was the first time UR had scored 100 or more points in a regulation game since a 101-90 win vs Duquesne on Jan. 28, 2017 and the first time the Spiders did it in a regulation season opener since 1980 (103-64 win vs Radford).

• The Spiders were helped by centers Mike Walz, Jonathan Beagle, and Ryan Soulis, who combined for 28 points and 27 points on 12-12 shooting from the field. Walz (10 Pts, 11 Reb, 5-5 FGs) became the first Spider to shoot 100 percent from the field in a double-double since at least 2010.

• Richmond leads the all-time series vs Marist 3-2, but has lost two straight to the Red Foxes and is seeking its first win vs Marist since Dec. 12, 2000 (74-67 at the Robins Center).

• The Spiders are seeking a 2-0 start for the third straight season and fifth time in the last six years. Richmond hasn't started 2-0 in three straight seasons 1952 to 1955 (four straight 2-0 starts).

• Chris Mooney (349-268) is seeking his 350th win at Richmond. He would become the 11th active D-I coach with 350 wins at his current school, joining Mark Few (Gonzaga), Tom Izzo (Michigan State), Bill Self (Kansas), Randy Bennett (Saint Mary's), Matt Painter (Purdue), Scott Drew (Baylor), Leonard Hamilton (Florida St), Greg Kampe (Oakland), James Jones (Yale), and Ben Jacobson (UNI). (Mercyhurst's Gary Manchel, who only joined D-I this season, is not included.)

• Richmond has won 11 straight non-conference home games, a stretch that started following a loss to Wichita State on Nov. 17, 2022. Since 2019-20, UR is 29-2 (.935) vs non-conference opponents at home.

• 2024-25 is Chris Mooney's 20th season at Richmond, making him the A-10's third-longest tenured coach ever behind John Chaney (24 seasons at Temple) and Phil Martelli (24 seasons at Saint Joseph's). Across Division I, Mooney's tenure at UR is tied for the 10th-longest tenure by an active coach.

• Saturday's TV (Bob Black) and radio (Matt Smith) broadcasts will include play-by-play announcers only, with the analyst seat left open in honor of longtime Spider Basketball analyst and Richmond Athletics Hall-of-Famer Greg Beckwith, who passed away in May.

WITH A WIN ...

• UR will record its third straight 2-0 start for the first time since 1952-55 (4 straight).

• UR will win its 12th straight non-conference home game dating back to 2022.

• Chris Mooney will become the 11th active D-I head coach with 350 wins at his current school.

• Richmond will snap a two-game losing streak to Marist and beat the Red Foxes for the first time since 2000.

• Richmond will be 17-1 in the Robins Center over the last two seasons.

THE BIG PICTURE

2024 REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS

Now in its 24th season in the the Atlantic 10, Richmond is the defending A-10 regular season champions for the first time. The 2023-24 Spiders went 15-3 in A-10 play, setting a program record for most conference wins in a season, and shared the regular season conference title with Loyola Chicago. (UR was the No. 1 seed at last year's A-10 Championship after beating Loyola head-to-head during the regular season.)

The title was Richmond's first regular season championship since winning the CAA in 2001, UR's final season before moving to the Atlantic 10.

Last year's team won 11 straight games from December 16 to January 31, the third-longest win streak in school history and longest since 1935. That included a win vs No. 16 Dayton in the Robins Center, a victory that snapped Dayton's 13-game win streak (the longest active streak in D-I) and gave Chris Mooney his 16th win vs a ranked team during his Richmond tenure.

The Spiders received votes in the AP Top 25 poll on two occasions last season, the first times UR has appeared in the poll since the October 2021 preseason poll (Receiving Votes).

ROSTER RECONSTRUCTION

More than half of the members of the 2024-25 Spiders are new to Richmond, a group that includes six transfers and three freshmen. The nine newcomers are the most ever for Chris Mooney in his 20 seasons with the Spiders.

After accepting just seven incoming transfers during his first 17 years at Richmond, Chris Mooney has now brought in 12 transfers over the last three seasons.

Four members UR's incoming transfer class earned All-Conference honors at their previous institution: Jonathan Beagle was the 2023 America East Rookie of the Year at Albany, B. Artis White was a two-time Honorable Mention All-MAC selection at Western Michigan, Dusan Neskovic earned Academic All-Ivy honors at Dartmouth in 2024, and Jack D'Entremont was a multi-time All-ODAC honoree at Washington & Lee.

Richmond's two other incoming transfers come from perennial powers Michigan (George Washington III) and UConn (Apostolos Roumoglou). They are the first players to transfer to Richmond from a power-conference school since Marshall Wood in 2014 (Virginia Tech).

WHO'S BACK

Richmond returns eight players from last year's regular season champions. That matches UR's second-fewest returners ever during Chris Mooney's tenure (7 in 2006-07). UR returns one starter (DeLonnie Hunt), matching the fewest under Mooney (also 1 in 2011-12 and 2023-24).

Point guard DeLonnie Hunt started 22 games last season. Hunt missed 10 games after fracturing his wrist vs Colorado last November, returning to the starting lineup in mid-January. His 31.3 minutes per game last year were tied for second most among Spiders, and he also ranked among UR's leaders in scoring (9.3 PPG - 5th), rebounds (3.0 RPG - 5th), assists (1.8 APG - 4th), and 3pt FG pct (38.6 - 2nd).

A vocal leader who commands huddles in practice, pregame, and during the game, Hunt had the seventh lowest turnover percentage in the A-10 last season according to KenPom and the lowest among point guards.

RATE OF RETURN

Richmond's eight returning players accounted for 22 percent of UR's scoring and 30 percent of the team's total minutes played last year. Hunt is UR's top return-

ing scorer after averaging 9.3 PPG last season, fifth on the Spiders.

PRO SPIDERS

Three members of last year's team are playing professionally, including 2024 A-10 Co-Player of the Year Jordan King (Spain - Lucentum Alicante), 2024 All-A-10 selection Neal Quinn (France - Aix Maurienne), and last year's leading rebounder Isaiah Bigelow (Hungary - Zalakeramia).

At least a dozen former Spiders in the midst of their professional careers, including 2022 A-10 Championship Most Outstanding Player Jacob Gilyard (Cleveland Cavaliers) and UR's No. 2 all-time leading scorer Grant Golden (AEK B.C. in Greece). During his time at Richmond, Mooney has coached 32 players who went on to professional playing careers.

YEAR 20 FOR MOONEY

The 2024-25 season is Chris Mooney's 20th at Richmond, making him the third-longest tenured coach in Atlantic 10 history behind John Chaney (24 seasons at Temple) and Phil Martelli (24 seasons at Saint Joseph's). Mooney entered the 2024-25 season tied for the 10th-longest tenure among active D-I coaches.

SPIDERS UNDER MOONEY

Chris Mooney owns Richmond records for most total wins (348 entering 2024-25), most wins in a season (29 in 2010-11), most conference wins in a season (15 in 2023-24), highest NCAA Tournament seed (7th in 2010), highest NIT seed (1st overall in 2015), and highest A-10 Championship seed (1st in 2024).

In 2024, he was named Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year and NABC District 4 (A-10) Coach of the Year for the first time and a finalist for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award for the second time (also in 2010) after leading Richmond to a share of the Atlantic 10 regular season title and a 23-10 record.

Mooney has led Richmond to a pair of Atlantic 10 tournament titles (2011 and 2022) and its only A-10 regular season title (2024). He is one of 11 coaches ever to win multiple A-10 tournament titles, and his two A-10 tourney titles are tied for the fifth-most of any coach in conference history.

The Spiders have made 10 postseason appearances under Mooney (3 NCAA Tournaments, 4 NITs, 3 CBIs), reached the 2011 Sweet 16 and 2022 NCAA Tournament 2nd Round, and posted eight 20-win seasons, 12 winning seasons, and 14 seasons at .500 or better.

Mooney signed an extension with Richmond during the 2024 offseason. Terms were not disclosed.

VOICE OF THE SPIDERS

For the 42nd straight season, Bob Black is handling play-by-play duties for Spider Men's Basketball broadcasts. Black also hosts an afternoon show on ESPN Richmond, the Spiders radio rights-holder.

In 2023, Black received the Atlantic 10's Bob Vetrone Media Award, which recognizes those whose service, professionalism and commitment have made a lasting contribution to the A-10's student-athletes and institutions. In April 2023, he was also recognized by Richmond Athletics for his 40 years of service as the recipient of the Distinguished Faculty/Staff Award.

Scott Ungerer, a three-year starter for Richmond who began his Spiders career under John Beilein in 1998, will serve as the team's primary color analyst this season.

In addition to doing the ESPN Richmond radio broadcast for all Robins Center games on national TV, Black and Ungerer will anchor the SpiderTV broadcast for all of Richmond's home games on regional TV. Those broadcasts are produced and directed by Richmond Athletics Video Specialist Blake Ellett.

Greg Beckwith, a former Spiders point guard and Richmond Athletics Hall-of-Famer who served as Black's color analyst for 21 years, passed away unexpectedly in May. Before the season, the team announced plans to honor Beckwith at its season opener on November 6 (moment of silence), its November 9 game vs Marist (Play-by-play only on TV and radio broadcasts with no color commentary), and its January 25 game vs Davidson (as part of the re-named Greg Beckwith Alumni Weekend).

The team will also wear a patch on its uniform throughout the season to honor Beckwith's service to the program as a player and broadcaster.



ROCKIN' ROBINS

Richmond went 15-1 at the Robins Center last season, with its only loss coming vs UMass on February 14. It was UR's best home record since the Robins Center opened in 1972. Richmond's women's team went 14-0 at home last year, giving Richmond basketball the third-best combined home record (29-1) of any D-I school.

Over the previous five seasons (from 2019-20 through 2023-24), Richmond's home record of 58-15 (.795) is second best in the Atlantic 10 behind Dayton (67-9, .882).

SMALL SCHOOL, BIG CROWDS

Richmond averaged 5,834 fans at home games last season, third most in the Atlantic 10 and 86th across Division I. 2023-24 was the 13th straight season UR has ranked among the top 100 men's basketball programs in average attendance (not including the 2020-21 season when fans weren't permitted).

Last season, Richmond had the highest attendance across Division I (5,834) among schools with a total enrollment of less than 4,000 students.

The Spiders played before four capacity crowds of 7,201 in 2023-24, selling out (and winning) its games vs Dayton, La Salle, Davidson, and VCU.

OFFENSIVE FLOW

Richmond runs a fast-paced offensive system that requires every player on the court to handle the ball, pass, and cut -- often on the same possession.

The Richmond offense embodies the concept of "position-less basketball." While guards will begin most possessions further away from the basket and front court players will begin most possessions on the wing or in the paint, they will rarely end up anywhere near where they started. Possessions are a frenzy of back-door cuts, entry passes to the high and low post, screens both on the ball and off the ball that, ideally, lead to an open high-percentage shot at the rim or from three-point range.

The Spiders often excel at finding teammates and taking care of the ball. They've ranked among the top 30 in the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio in five of the previous six seasons. (UR particularly excelled at avoiding turnovers last season, averaging just 8.6 per game, fourth best in D-I.)

DEFENSE REACHES NEW HEIGHTS

Richmond has played almost exclusively man-to-man defense in each of the previous five seasons after mostly relying on a match-up zone scheme early in Mooney's tenure. Playing man-to-man, Richmond has ranked among D-I's top 120 defenses via KenPom's defensive efficiency metric in five straight seasons after finishing outside the top 200 in 2017-18 (234th) and 2018-19 (287th).

The Spiders allowed just 98.1 points per 100 possessions in 2023-24, 34th best in Division I. That's Richmond's best national ranking in defensive efficiency in any season under Chris Mooney. Assistant Coach David Boyden oversees much of UR's defensive gameplan and strategy.

WHERE THE SPIDERS DWELL

ROBINS CENTER

Built in 1972 through the generosity of the E. Claiborne Robins family, the Robins Center is in its 53rd season as one of the premier small-school college basketball arenas in the nation.

Last season, an average crowd of 5,834 attended Richmond's home games, giving UR the highest attendance of any Division I school with a total enrollment under 4,000 students. The Spiders played before four capacity crowds of 7,201, selling out (and winning) its games against Dayton, La Salle, Davidson, and VCU.

Dick Tarrant Court, named for the legendary Spiders coach who led Richmond to its first five NCAA Tournament appearances, was stripped to the boards and completely refinished in August (which resulted in the removal of the old women's three-point line and a thinner jump-ball circle).

The facility is much more than a basketball arena, however. The Robins Center has been home to addresses by world leaders, University commencements, WTA Tour events, track competitions, water polo matches, concerts, a 1992 Presidential Debate, and more.

Renovations to the lower level of the building in 2018 resulted in the creation of the Blandford-Everett Student-Athlete Performance Center, which provides Richmond's student-athletes with the latest strength and conditioning equipment, access to a nutrition fueling center, and a state-of-the-art sports medicine facility.

The arena underwent a \$17 million renovation in 2013 that revamped the lighting system and installed four 33' x 15' video boards in the corner sections. The renovation also reduced the arena's capacity from more than 9,000 to its current 7,201.

QUEALLY ATHLETICS CENTER

The Queally Athletics Center is the everyday home of Spiders basketball.

Opened in October 2020 following 18 months of construction, the \$15 million practice facility's centerpiece is Breed Family Practice Court. The gym includes a replica of the Robins Center court plus two additional half-courts and two more retractable baskets on the sidelines of the main court, for a total of six in the facility. Steps from the court is a 20-seat theater that allows for instant review of practice film and diagramming of offensive and defensive schemes.

The Boggs Strength and Conditioning Room, used exclusively by the men's and women's basketball teams, abuts the court's endline and is separated only by a pair of see-through retractable overhead doors. A six-table Sports Medicine suite, a hydrotherapy room with two pools, and the Bugg Fueling Station all border the strength and conditioning area and form the Ball Family Training Center.

Locker rooms and lounges for the men's and women's teams are also located on the ground floor, while the second floor includes Spider Hall, the main entrance to the Queally Athletics Center. The space, which serves to engage fans and alumni in celebration of the proud tradition of Richmond Athletics, features a giant video board as well as entrances to Millhiser Gymnasium and the University's new Student Well-Being Center, which are both adjacent to the QAC.

Head coach Chris Mooney believes that the facility has a tremendous impact on his team. "The Queally Athletics Center has transformed our entire basketball program. Our student-athletes utilize the amenities of the physical structure each and everyday as prospective Spiders see the facility and anticipate their future at Richmond," said Mooney.

The facility is named for 1986 alumni Paul and Anne-Marie Queally, longtime supporters of the University of Richmond who contributed a \$7.5 million lead gift to launch the fundraising efforts for the center.



MILLHISER GYMNASIUM (MILL-high-zer)

Now in its second century, one of the most historic and celebrated buildings on the University of Richmond campus has been completely renovated and now houses the Millhiser Student-Athlete Development Center and offices for both the men's basketball and women's basketball staffs.

The newest version of Millhiser Gymnasium opened in fall 2020 after being refurbished as part of the University's construction of the Queally Athletics Center and the Student Well-Being Center. A mezzanine level was installed to provide office suites for Richmond's basketball programs while the first floor, which still includes the historic gymnasium court surface, is the site of the Student-Athlete Development Center. The Center includes study and meeting spaces for Richmond's student-athletes as well as offices for Richmond Athletics' Academic Services and Leadership Development departments.

Millhiser's entry hall includes a restored classroom that overlooks the Queally Athletic Center's practice court and a recruiting room with end-zone views of Robins Stadium.

As part of Richmond's commitment to a sensitive restoration of the facility, many of Millhiser's iconic arched windows, which had been bricked in for decades, were re-opened.

Millhiser Gymnasium opened in 1921 and was Richmond's home court between 1922 and 1946.

SPIDER BITES

Go beyond names, heights, and hometowns to get to know what's REALLY important about the 2024-25 Spiders.



For starters, the Spider are big Christmas guys. Like "carols in November" big. More than 70 percent (12 of 17) of this year's team claims Christmas as their favorite holiday. The early caroling might be off-putting to the four Spiders who say Thanksgiving is the best holiday (DeLonnie Hunt, Jason Roche, Jack D'Entremont, and Jaylen Robinson). It likely won't bother Apostolos Roumoglou, who isn't content with a single day to celebrate. He says his favorite holiday is "summer."

Unsurprisingly, Roumoglou is one of the 13 Spiders (76 percent) who say that summer is their favorite season of the year. When warmer temperatures make the Spiders seek a soak, a slight majority (53%) say their preferred body of water is the ocean. 35 percent would opt for a lake instead. Despite Richmond's "River City" moniker, only one Spider – Jaylen Robinson – picked a river as his favorite body of water. (Robinson's hometown Jacksonville, Fla. is also known as the River City.)

Given their love of the ocean, it makes sense that nearly all Spiders (15 of 17) would prefer to visit a beach instead of the mountains. George Washington III is the sole Spider who would rather head for higher ground. When it comes to vacation time, DeLonnie Hunt doesn't want to go to the shore or the hills. His preferred vacation destination is "the crib."



While at home, Hunt might spend his time watching his favorite movies: sequels Creed 2 and Friday After Next. Other favorite films of the Spiders include Caddyshack (scratch golfer Mike Walz's pick), Lion King (George Washington III), Step Brothers (Jack Graham), and two movies that each received the support of a pair of Spiders: The Blind Side (Jack D'Entremont and Jaylen Robinson) and Good Will Hunting (Liam Weaver and Ryan Soulis).

Soulis was one of two Spiders (along with Apostolos Roumoglou) who ... humbly ... said the best actor to play them in a movie would be two-time People Magazine Sexiest Man Alive Brad Pitt. Kevin Hart was also named twice, by both Mikkell Tyne (who, despite being the shortest Spider at 5'10", is actually five inches taller than Hart) and Jaylen Robinson. Mike Walz correctly tabbed 80s action star Dolph Lundgren, whose roles include Ivan Drago in Rocky IV and He-Man, as the actor who should play him in a movie.



While Deadpool & Wolverine is the most common answer to the last movie the Spiders saw in theaters, with seven responses, it seems like the players weren't all that impressed by Ryan Reynolds and Hugh Jackman. When asked to name their top superhero, Wolverine received just one vote (Bryson McGlothlin) and Deadpool was shut out. As would be expected, the most popular response from the Spiders was Spider-Man, who was named by eight players.

There's less consensus among the Spiders when it comes to music. No artist captured a majority of support when the Spiders were asked to name their preferred pregame music, although NBA YoungBoy (Collin Tanner, DeLonnie Hunt), Future (Hunt, Michael Walz), and Eminem (Jason Roche, Liam Weaver) all received two votes. There was even more dissension when we asked who the Spiders saw at their first concert. Lil Uzi Vert (Hunt, Jack Graham) was the only artist named more than once, and responses ranged from rap (Rod Wave – B. Artis White) to country (Zac Brown Band – Kirby Mooney) to rock (Arctic Monkeys – Ryan Soulis) to international (Goran Bregovic – Dusan Neskovic). Three Spiders (Mikkell Tyne, Bryson McGlothlin, and Jaylen Robinson) claim they've never been to a concert.



Culinarily, the Spiders are up for almost anything. Except for hot dogs for lunch. 10 Spiders said dinner is their favorite meal of the day. Seven went with breakfast. Lunch got no votes. 13 Spiders chose a burger as their preferred cookout entrée, four chose a chicken sandwich, and zero chose a hot dog. The Spiders have spoken, and mid-day glizzies have no place on this team.

Two places that do are the Queally Athletics Center, Richmond's practice facility, and the Robins Center. Those basketball-centric locations were the most frequent answers when the Spiders were asked to name their favorite place on campus, with the QAC getting three votes and the Robins Center getting seven. When playing a game in the Robins Center (or anywhere else), this year's Spiders narrowly prefer wearing Richmond's white jerseys, named by seven players as their favorite uniform color. Six chose UR's blue jerseys, and four picked Richmond's alternate red uniforms.

In his first 19 seasons at Richmond, Chris Mooney has led the Spiders to their only two Atlantic 10 tournament championships (2011, 2022), their only Atlantic 10 regular season championship (2024), three NCAA Tournaments, eight 20-win seasons, and 10 postseason appearances while amassing 348 wins, more than any other coach in program history.

Mooney ranks among the longest-tenured and most successful coaches in Atlantic 10 history. The 2024-25 season is Mooney's 20th with the Spiders, marking the third-longest tenure by a coach at a single school in conference history (John Chaney - 24 seasons at Temple; Phil Martelli - 24 seasons at Saint Joseph's). In his first 19 seasons at Richmond, Mooney amassed 175 conference wins, the fourth most in A-10 history, and 348 total wins, third in Atlantic 10 history. Mooney is one of 11 coaches to ever win multiple A-10 tournament titles, and only four coaches have won more A-10 tournament championships than Mooney's two: John Chaney (6), John Calipari (5), Phil Martelli (3), and Fran Dunphy (3).

The 2023-24 Spiders stormed to the program's first regular season title since joining the Atlantic 10 in 2001, winning a program-record 15 conference games along the way and earning consensus A-10 Coach of the Year honors for Mooney. Despite a roster that featured eight newcomers, Richmond won its first eight A-10 games as part of an 11-game winning streak that stretched from mid-December to the end of January, the Spiders' longest win streak since 1935. On January 27, the Spiders beat 16th-ranked Dayton 69-64 at the Robins Center, snapping the Flyers' 13-game win streak, the longest in D-I at the time, and giving Mooney his program-record 16th win vs an AP top-25 opponent. The Spiders received votes in the AP poll following the win, one of two times UR would be represented in the poll during the season. Richmond clinched a share of the A-10 regular season title and the No. 1 seed in the A-10 Championship vs Saint Joseph's on March 6 as UR improved to 15-1 at home, its best record in the Robins Center since the arena opened in 1972. Mooney was named Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year by his fellow coaches in March. Later in March, Mooney was named NABC District 4 (A-10) Coach of the Year and, for the second time in his career, a finalist for the Jim Phelan Award, given to the National Coach of the Year. Richmond was selected to the NIT field for the fourth time under Mooney and first since 2021.

Mooney's season ended prematurely in 2022-23, when on February 17 he announced that he was stepping away from the program to have heart surgery. Mooney underwent a successful procedure to remove an aortic aneurysm at the University of Virginia Medical Center on February 28 and was back in the office in April.

In 2021-22, Mooney and the Spiders captured the second A-10 title in program history and upset Big Ten champion Iowa in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. Richmond won four games in four days to win the Atlantic 10, including victories over 3-seed VCU, 2-seed Dayton, and 1-seed Davidson. The Spiders defeated Davidson 64-62 in the A-10 final after trailing by six points with 90 seconds remaining. Richmond earned a 12 seed in the Midwest Region of the NCAA Tournament and a match up with Big Ten champion Iowa, a 5 seed, in the First Round. Days after being named Most Outstanding Player of the A-10 Tournament, Jacob Gilyard led all players with 24 points and six assists to lead UR to a 67-63 win and secure the sixth trip to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament in program history. Richmond finished 24-13, the fourth-most wins ever by a Spiders team, and Mooney was named UR's Coach of the Year by the school's Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC). After setting the NCAA Division I career steals record in December, Gilyard was a semifinalist for the Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year, a Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American, and the Virginia State Defensive Player of the Year. In April, he won the Senior CLASS Award as the top senior or graduate student-athlete in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball. Grant Golden was named to the A-10 All-Tournament Team and finished his Spiders career with the second-most points (2,246), third-most rebounds (1,015), and fourth-most assists (476) in Spiders history.

Mooney and the Spiders posted a 14-9 record in the COVID-shortened 2020-21 season and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT. In November, the Spiders beat 10th-ranked Kentucky for the program's first road win ever vs a team in the top 10 of the Associated Press Poll. Jacob Gilyard broke Richmond's career assists record while leading the nation in steals for a second straight season and being named a Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American. Tyler Burton earned the A-10's Chris Daniels Award, given to the conference's most improved player.

In 2019-20, Mooney led Richmond to one of the best regular seasons in program history and was on the verge of taking the Spiders to the NCAA Tournament when the postseason was canceled due to COVID-19. The Spiders went 24-7, tying the school record for regular-season wins, and posted three wins over power-conference opponents, including a victory over eventual Big Ten champion Wisconsin in the Legends Classic. Richmond went 14-4 in conference play and finished second in the Atlantic 10. Jacob Gilyard was also named A-10 Defensive Player of the Year and was a semifinalist for the Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year Award after leading D-I with 99 steals. The Spiders received votes in the AP Top 25 six times.

2009-10 and 2010-11 are remembered as two of the top seasons in Mooney's coaching career and in Spider Basketball history. In 2011, Richmond defeated Dayton in the A-10 championship game to earn the Spiders' first title since Richmond joined the Atlantic 10 in 2001. The Spiders would go on to the second Sweet 16 in program history by downing Vanderbilt and Morehead State in the NCAA Denver Subregional. Richmond finished 29-8, set a school record for wins, and finished 21st in the coaches poll.

In 2010, Richmond earned its first NCAA at-large bid since 2004, garnering a seven seed before falling in the first round of the tournament. Mooney was named the 2010 Sporting News Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the 2010 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award. The Spiders finished the season ranked 24th in the final AP Top 25.

Mooney previously coached at Air Force for five seasons: three as an assistant, one as an associate head coach and his final season as head coach. In 2004-05, Mooney led the Falcons to an 18-12 record and votes in the national polls. His 18 victories were the most by a first-year head coach at Air Force.

Mooney began coaching at the high school level, taking a job at Lansdale Catholic High School in Lansdale, Pa., in 1994. His first college coaching experience came at Division III Beaver College, now known as Arcadia University. He spent two seasons there from 1998-2000. While at Beaver College, Mooney only coached part-time, spending much of his time as an event coordinator. He helped plan weddings and events while also serving as the team manager. Mooney is married to the former Lia Chomat, a Princeton graduate who also has a doctorate in psychology from Penn. The couple has two sons, Danny and Ryan.
