Let's Take a Deeper Look ...

Through history, Richmond and Duquesne have met twenty-two times for competition. The Spiders hold the historic advantage over the Dukes with the all-time record standing at 16-6. Their most recent meeting dates back to 2023 where Richmond hosted Duquesne, where the Spiders dominated the Dukes 20-4 at Robins Stadium in the April matchup. The 2024 Richmond group led by head coach Anne Harrington is looking to carry their 2023 momentum into this away game. The reigning Atlantic 10 Champions defeated No. 16 UMass in the title game, earning the automatic bid into the NCAA Tournament. The Spiders traveled to UNC Chapel Hill where they faced Marquette in the first round, beating them out 18-8 to advance. This was the first NCAA tournament victory in program history. Richmond fell short to the defending national champions of UNC 16-12 in the second round, ending the historical season at 17-4. The Spiders ended their 2023 campaign ranked No. 14 in the country along with ranking as the No. 2 scoring offense and No. 1 in draw controls through the nation. Duquesne is entering this one on a 5-2 record, taking their most recent win against Radford on the road 14-12. The Dukes last saw action against Queens University of Charlotte where they dropped their second loss of the season at 14-5. Richmond faced Queens in 2023, taking control of that one with a 13-6 victory. The Spiders travel to Pittsburgh for Saturdays competition after dropping their second loss of the season against No. 13/15 Virginia by a score of 20-5. After facing No. 17 Navy just four days prior, losing that one 14-5, the Richmond group looks to rebound and put themselves back into the winning category against Duquesne. This game opens Atlantic 10 conference play for both the Spiders and Dukes.

Trendsetters...

2023, a year that the Richmond women's lacrosse program will look back at in the history books for years to come. On March 15 last year, a huge wave of momentum swung through the air on campus as the Spiders brought down the No. 7/10 UVA squad in double overtime with a 16-15 margin. All items fell into place for this program following that matchup. Through the regular season, they moved on to win all thirteen games but one (at No. 4 JMU) heading into the postseason. Making the short trip to VCU for the Atlantic 10 Championships, the Spiders defeated Saint Joseph's in the semi-finals 21-14. The confidence of the group carried into the championship round as Richmond took down No. 16 UMass in the finals, bringing home their first conference title since 2019. As they earned the automatic bid into the NCAA tournament, the Spiders traveled to UNC Chapel Hill where they matched up with Marquette in the first round, dominating the competition and winning the programs first ever NCAA tournament game 18-8. Heading into the second round, the team faced the defending national champions of UNC, falling short 16-12. This 2023 Richmond team ended the season ranked No. 14 in country along with adding many other accolades to their records. They were tabbed No. 1 in draw controls per game nationally (18.71), the No. 2 scoring offense (16.52), No. 3 in points per game (24) and No. 3 in draw control percentage (.617). Through Richmond history, this team had the most wins in program history (17), most points (504), most goals (347), most assists (157) and most draw controls (392).

Queens of the Atlantic 10...

Richmond enters this season ranked No. 1 in the Atlantic 10 conference following their 2023 season where they were victorius through the conference championship and earned the title. Three Spiders were named to the Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference team through the same annoucement made by the conference this week. Colleen Quinn represents Richmond as a member of the Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Attack squad. Entering 2024 as a team captain, Quinn played and started in all 21 games as a sophomore, tallying 58 goals, 28 assists and 13 ground balls on the year. Quinn was named the Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week on April 24 and was listed to the Atlantic 10 Attack All-Conference Second-Team. Through the postseason (Atlantic 10 Tournament and NCAA tournament) Quinn accounted for 11 goals and 4 assists (4 games against Saint Joseph's, UMass, Marquette and UNC). Grace Muldoon represents Richmond as a member of the Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Midfield squad. Muldoon played in all 21 games as a sophomore as she tallied 29 goals, 18 assists, 20 ground balls, 16 draw controls and 15 caused turnovers. In the double overtime victory against UVA on March 15, Muldoon accounted for 6 points from 3 goals and 3 assists. She was a clutch member for the Spiders in the postseason as she scored three points from 2 goals and 1 assist in the win against Saint Joseph's in the Atlantic 10 semi-finals.Last but not least, Hannah Custer represents Richmond as a member of the Atlantic 10 Preseason All-Conference Defense squad. Entering 2024 as a team captain, played and started in all 21 games as a sophomore, accounting for 36 ground balls, 14 draw controls, 20 caused turnovers, 4 goals and 5 assists. Custer was named to the Atlantic 10 Defensive All-Conference Second-Team. In the double overtime upset over No. 7 UVA on March 15, Custer scooped three ground balls, forced one caused turnover and found 2 draw controls. She led the Spiders defensive unit to success in the postseason as she collected 5 ground balls and forced 2 caused turnovers in the game against Marquette in the programs first NCAA tournament win.

The big question many might have for this squad is how different it looks from the majorly successful 2023 unit...Twelve members of that roster have moved on from Richmond by graduation or transfer...Hearing from head coach Anne Harrington, her view on this team doesn't change with the roster updates..."Different doesn't mean better and diffferent doesn't mean worse. Different is just different", a quote from Harrington as full practice started to roll in January...The Richmond coaching staff is confident as ever with their new additions to the squad, including a class of 10 of the best freshman in the country who are looking to make their impact known as soon as possible...With the game ever-evolving, 2024 will be a season to view just how well the young coaching staff of Richmond adapts to change and adversity...The confidence in the program this year is higher than ever, with energy buzzing through campus for all to see the Spiders hold success and continue their legacy.

The Future is Harrington...

Head coach Anne Harrington led the Spiders through all of their 2023 success in only her first year as head coach outside of her interim 2022 period... Harrington joined the program in 2017, accounting for three of the six Spider conference titles during her time at Richmond... During her time at Richmond, the Spiders have recorded a 99-26 mark... Through head coaching time alone, Harrington is 35-10...This record accounts as the 8th highest win percentage amongst all current head coaches in Division 1 (.778) after only 2 years at the helm (coaches with higher 16 seasons, 12 seasons, 20 seasons, 22 seasons, 1 season)...Her 2023 win percentage (.809) was the 9th highest in Division 1 amongst all head coaches...How many other NCAA Division 1 head coaches get to say in their first year as a full-time head coach that they took their team to win the conference championship against a ranked opponent AND to win the programs first ever NCAA tournament game?..Harrington has only just begun at Richmond, as everyone in the community is excited to see how her and her staff mold the 2024 season.

Dipping into the Portal . . .

The Spiders picked up a few new additions to the team via transfers in the offseason... Anne Harrington and her staff worked diligently in the off-season navigating the transfer portal, finding three standouts to bolster the roster...Charlotte Edwards, a San Francisco, CA. native wrapped up her 2023 freshman campaign at Lafayette where she competed in all 17 games, scoring 25 points from 10 goals and 5 assists as an attack...Meaghan Trainer, a John's Creek, GA. native finished her 2023 sophomore campaign at Butler where she competed in all 28 games and started in 21...During those two years she collected 33 ground balls, forced 18 turnovers and had 25 draw controls as a defender...Whitney Liebler, a Williamsburg, Va. native wrapped up her 2023 junior season at Virginia Tech where she competed in 49 games and started in 29, scoring 81 points from 41 goals and 40 assists as an attack.

Talk Within the Cage . . .

Heading into the 2024 season, the goalie position for the Spiders may be in the talks through the lacrosse community...Emilie Bloyer, the 2023 standout goalie graudated from Richmond, leaving room for another Spider to fill that role this year...Two members of the team will have the oppurtunities through the first few 2024 games to compete for the starting spot...Nicole Burney, the senior Yardley, Pa. native is one of the available Richmond goalies...She has played in nine games during her time at Richmond, accounting for 12 saves...Freshman Abby Francioli, the Baltimore, MD. native hopes to join the action through the season....Francioli has left a strong impression on the coaching staff through her early time at Richmond.

Win the Draw, Rule the World...

A term that many Richmond staff members and lacrosse players like to say, "win the draw, rule the world". In 2023, Richmond embodied that motto, ending their campaign as the No. 1 draw unit in the country. Through the first five games this season, the Spiders have continued their success in the draw circle, averaging 14.83 draw controls per game. The draw unit led by Clare McCooe stands as No. 29 in the country in draw control percentage (.567) and No. 39 in draw controls per game. McCooe leads the Spiders with 28 draw controls entering this game.

The Tale of Susskind and Quinn...

With Richmond refreshing their roster heading into the 2024 season, the returners from the historic 2023 season have been asked by head coach Anne Harrington to step up in major ways. Senior Ali Susskind and junior Colleen Quinn have taken control of the offensive reigns for the Spiders, statistically declaring themselves as scoring leaders of this team. Colleen Quinn leads Richmond as the 2024 points leader with 21 points coming from 12 goals and 9 assists. Ali Susskind leads the squad this year in goals, pushing through 14 on the season so far. These two look to continue their success in agressive scoring patterns through the 2024 season.

Give us MORton...

Let's not forget about sophomore Alexis Morton when we talk about the offensive success of the Spiders. Morton, named as a 2022 Incoming Power Freshman by Inside Lacrosse, has made her presence felt through the 2024 season. She stands as the No. 2 points scorer for Richmond, contributing with 18 points from 10 goals and 8 assists. The young Spider has the oppurtunities this year to become an early leader of this strong Richmond offense.

Four Decades of Excellence...

2024 marks the program's 41st season..Richmond started it's women's lacrosse program in 1983 and has since built one of the top programs in the country...In the past 19 years, the Spiders have brought six conference championships back to Richmond...As well through the previous 19 seasons, the Spiders have capped off their schedules with 15 positive correlations with their final records.

Anne Harrington

3rd Season William & Mary, 2007

Anne Harrington was named Head Coach of Spider Women's Lacrosse in May of 2022 after spending six years on the Spiders' staff, including the 2022 season as interim head coach. During her time at Richmond, the Spiders have recorded a 95-24 (.798 winning percent) mark that includes a 44-7 (.863) record in Atlantic 10 Conference play. She has been part of the program that has won three regular season A-10 titles and made three NCAA Tournament appearances in 2018, 2019 and 2023. Harrington led the Spiders to their first ever NCAA Tournament win in 2023 against Marquette. She ended her 2023 season ranked as the No. 6 Division I Women's Lacrosse head coach in the country based off of active win percentage.

Harrington led the Spiders to 17 victories in 2023, the most for the Spiders since 2019. Richmond finished the regular season ranked No. 14 in the Inside Lacrosse/IWLCA Division I poll. She led the Spiders to the No. 2 seed in the Atlantic 10 Conference Tournament where the Spiders claimed the title for the third time in program history with Harrington on staff. Following her success in the conference postseason, Harrington marched her squad to Chapel Hill, NC. where Richmond defeated Marquette in the programs first ever NCAA Tournament victory.

Multiple Spiders earned accolades following the team's record-setting season. Lindsey Frank went on to claim the Atlantic 10 Most Outstanding Player award, All-Tournament Honors, First-Team All-Conference honors, USA Lacrosse Magazine All-American Honors, IWLCA All-American Honors and IWLCA All-Region Honors. Another standout student-athlete in the 2023 season under Harrington was Arden Tierney. Tierney went on to claim Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Year Honors, First Team All-Conference Honors, All-Academic Honors, All-Tournament Honors, USA Lacrosse Magazine All-American Honors, IWLCA All-Region Honors, IWLCA All-American Honors and CSC Academic All-District Honors. Sophia DiCenso, the 2022 Midfielder of the Year, also flourished from Harrington's lead as she claimed First-Team All-Conference Honors, All-Tournament Honors and All-Region Second-Team Honors.

Harrington's Spiders shattered the record books in the 2023 season as they finished the year as No. 1 in the nation for draw controls per games (18.71), the No. 2 scoring offense in the nation (16.52), No. 3 in the nation for points per game (24.00) and No. 3 in draw control percentage (.617). With 17 wins on the year, the 2023 group of Spiders matched the numbers for most wins in program history, achieved the most points in program history (504), scored the most goals in program history (347), achieved the most assists in program history (157), claimed the most draw controls in program history (392) and had the most draw controls in a single game (30). Along with these accomplishments, this group took home 5 Atlantic 10 Conference weekly awards.

The Spiders ended their year with positive numbers at home, on the road and at neutral sites. With a 6-2 record at Robins Stadium, this Richmond group highlighted their competition at home with the win over the No. 7/10 ranked Cavaliers of UVA in double overtime. On the road, Harrington led the Spiders to an 8-2 record, including significant conference wins against Davidson and Saint Joseph's. With a perfect 3-0 finale on neutral fields, the Spiders won the Atlantic 10 conference title on VCU's campus and won their first NCAA competition in program history.

In 2019, the Spiders set a new program record with 17 wins while winning their second-straight Atlantic 10 Championship title with a 19-18 comeback in in overtime over UMass. The team competed in its second-straight NCAA Tournament and fifth all-time to finish the year at 17-4 overall. Five student-athletes earned first or second team All-Conference honors, led by two-time Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Year Julie Ball, who became the first student-athlete in A-10 history to earn the honor more than once. The Spiders boasted one All-Rookie Team and three All-Academic Team honorees, while Ball also earned IWLCA Second Team All-Region honors for the second-straight season.

In just her second season with the Spiders, the 2018 squad tied a program-best record of 16-4 overall, finished in a tie for first in the Atlantic 10 Regular Season, and took the 2018 A-10 Tournament Title with a 12-11 overtime win over UMass. The squad advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2007, while eight student-athletes earned All-Conference honors, including A-10 Offensive Player of the Year Kim Egizi and A-10 Defensive Player of the Year Julie Ball. Egizi and Ball also earned IWLCA Second Team All-Region honors for their efforts.

Harrington helped lead the 2017 squad to a 14-6 overall record and a runner-up finish at the Atlantic 10 Championship. Nine student-athletes earned All-Conference honors on the year, including A-10 Rookie of the Year Sam Geiersbach, and First Team honorees Kim Egizi and goalie Megan Gianforte.

With the guidance of Harrington, Gianforte became the first rookie to be named the conference's top goalie since 2006, compiling a .499 save percentage and a 9.48 goals against average. Defender Leslie Espenschied was honored as a member of the A-10 Second Team.

A former student-athlete at William & Mary, Harrington played four seasons of lacrosse in the midfield for the Tribe before entering the coaching world.

A native of Alexandria, Virginia, Harrington joined the Spiders after spending two years serving as the Annual Giving Assistant at the University of Virginia for the Virginia Athletics Foundation.

Harrington began her coaching career in England, where she worked for two years as a high school teacher and head of lacrosse for the English Lacrosse Association in England.

Following her time abroad, she was the First Assistant Coach at Dickinson College in Pennsylvania for two seasons before taking the role of First Assistant Coach at the University of Connecticut for one season.

She graduated from William & Mary in 2007 with a degree in Kinesiology before receiving her master's degree in Education from UVA in 2014.
