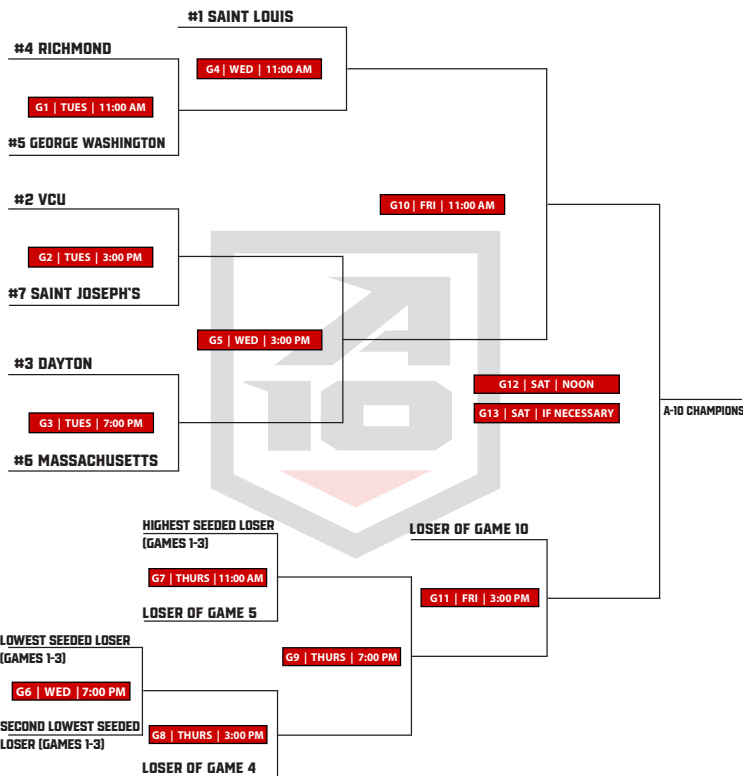

SPIDERS NOTES

GOTTA EARN IT

In his start against Cornell (March 15) Kyle Roche allowed his first walk of the season to the second batter of the game. Roche faced 106 batters over 25.2 innings of work before surrendering a base on balls. Since allowing a walk against High Point (March 22) he has not allowed another base on balls over his next eight starts. He leads the nation in strikeout to walk ratio (32.00) and in walks allowed per nine innings (0.24) after tossing 75.2 innings over 14 starts. Roche leads the Atlantic 10 in games started and fourth with a 3.69 ERA and fourth with a 1.23 WHIP. He was named as the No. 133 in D1Baseball's Week 6 Player Rankings - Top 150 Starting Pitchers March 29.

AROUND THE LEAGUE

Esteban Rodriguez is second in the league with 81 strikeouts over 68 innings. Cole Hentschel tops the league with eight saves on the season. Harrison Clifton is second the league with 25 appearances while Dane Armson and Hentschel is third with 24 appearances on the season. DJ Pacheco is eighth in batting average (.348). Aaron Whitley is second in average (.381) and third in slugging percentage (.682), on base percentage (.485) and OPS (1.140).

FOUR SEED RICHMOND vs FIVE SEED GW

The Spiders collected the program's third-straight league tournament berth with one win in the VCU series as UR, GW, UMass and Saint Joseph's all finished league play with a 13-11 record. Due to head-to-head records, UR was awarded the four seed while GW got the five seed, and six seed UMass had the upper hand on seven seed Saint Joseph's. Richmond swept GW at Pitt Field back (April 12-14), outscoring the Revs 26-12.

CLOSING OUT THE REGULAR SEASON

Jordan Jaffe hit a two-run home run in the bottom of the eighth in Thursday's series opener to put the Spiders back on top after VCU scored six in the top of the frame to tie the game at 10-all. Cole Hentschel got his fourth win of the season after striking out two and getting a ground out in the top of the ninth. With the win, UR secured their spot into the 2024 Atlantic 10 Tournament. VCU picked up the doubleheader sweep on Senior Day, winning game one 11-4 and game two 12-4.

SPIDERS TAKE SERIES OVER URI

Richmond took the series over Rhode Island, picking up the Friday (3-2) and Saturday (21-2) contests at Belk Field. In Friday's game, the Spiders jumped on the board quickly with a Phil Bernstein RBI double in the first and a sac fly by DJ Pacheco in the second. URI got two solo home runs in the fourth, but Jaffe tallied the game winning RBI hit in the fifth. Cole Hentschel picked up his eighth save as Esteban Rodriguez picked up his fourth win of the season after striking out eight. UR hit the second-most hits of the season (20) while drawing a season-high 10 walks as Kyle Roche tossed six scoreless frames, scattering four base hits and seven strikeouts. Aaron Whitley and Jake Topolski both had four hits, while Topolski and Jack Arcamone picked up four RBI. Connor Larson hit the Spiders only home run, a two-run shot in the fifth.

SPIDERS DROP MIDWEEK AT TOWSON

The Spiders hit six home runs in a large J.B. Schuerholz Park, but it wasn't enough as the Tigers collected a 20-10 victory in seven innings. Jordan Jaffe brought in the Spiders first three runs. Zach Lass launched a two-run home run in fourth, while Aaron Whitley, Phil Bernstein and Jaffe went yard in three straight at bats. Joey Wilga tallied his home run in the sixth while DJ Pacheco hit his in the seventh. Jason Shockley tossed a scoreless inning in relief with one strikeout.

ARCAMONE NAMED A-10 ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Jack Arcamone collected his first and the squads fourth weekly honor of the season April 29 after helping the Spiders to a 3-1 week as the designated hitter. Arcamone kicked off the week going two-for-three against Norfolk State, including a grand slam in the third inning. Against St. Bonaventure, Arcamone logged five hits, with two doubles, and scored in each of the three road games. He finished the week hitting .412 with an on-base percentage of .444 and slugged .706.

FLYERS TAKE CHARGED SERIES

Dayton took the final two games of the series at Pitt Field behind strong pitching performances. In game one of the Friday doubleheader, UR got five runs in the bottom of the first inning on doubles from DJ Pacheco and Zach Lass for a 5-2 lead that shutdown the Flyers offense. In the second game, UR tied the game in the sixth at 2-2, but UD put up six runs on Spider relievers in the final three innings for an 8-6 victory. Nick Lorenzo hit a bases clearing double to get the Spiders within two, but the rally fell short. The Flyers got a complete game victory from their starter as UR was held to three runs on eight hits, one walk and one hit batter. Pacheco extended his hitting streak to eight games with two hits with his 17th multi-hit game.

SPIDERS SECURE SERIES OVER BONNIES

The Spiders collected the opening game 9-4 and the rubber match 8-4 at St. Bonaventure last weekend. In Friday's game, UR took a quick 2-0 lead in the first and didn't look back. Phil Bernstein and DJ Pacheco both had three hits and one RBI as all but one Spider collected a hit. The Bonnies flipped the script in Saturday's contest, scoring five runs in the first three innings and held off the Spiders ninth inning rally for a 5-2 victory. Sunday's contest was all about the long ball, Connor Larson and Aidan O'Keefe both hit three-run home runs, Larson in the second and O'Keefe in the fifth to put the game out of reach early. O'Keefe tallied a solo shot in the seventh for his fifth of the season. Chase Topolski picked up his first victory of the season allowing one hit and striking out one in 1.2 innings of relief.

SPIDERS TOP THE SPARTANS

After spotting a 3-0 lead to the Spartans in the first half inning, Richmond scored 13 unanswered runs over the next three frames, batting around in the first and third innings. Jake Topolski went 3-for-5 on the day with five RBI, including a double and a three-run home run in the second for his seventh home run of the season. Aaron Whitley tallied his team-leading eighth home run, a two-run shot in the eighth. Chase Topolski shook off the tough first inning to toss three-straight scoreless innings. Topolski allowed three runs on four hits, four walks and two strikeouts in four innings. Matthew Anderson (2-1) picked up the win after two scoreless innings with a strikeout. The Spartans added seven runs in the final three innings off Spider relievers on eight hits and three walks.

WILDCATS TAKE SERIES, SPLIT SATURDAY DOUBLEHEADER

Davidson picked up the A-10 series over Richmond collecting a complete game 6-1 victory by Wilson Perkins Friday night at Wilson Field. Due to rain in the Sunday forecast, the squads played two on Saturday. Richmond took game one 9-4 getting a boost from Jordan Jaffe's 3-for-4 game, including a two-run home run in the first, RBI double in the third and scored a run in the three run fifth. Phil Bernstein put game one out of reach in the sixth with a two-run home run to right. Game one starter Kyle Roche allowed all four runs on 10 hits in four and two-thirds of an inning, striking out seven without allowing a walk. Game two starter Esteban Rodriguez tossed three scoreless frames before allowing three runs in the fourth. Rodriguez finished with five innings on the hill and struck out nine while allowing the three runs on four hits. The Wildcats got a fourth run off Chase Topolski in the sixth. The Spider offense got a jolt in the seventh after Jake Topolski hit a two-run home run to left field. Aidan O'Keefe doubled then scored on Bernstein's sacrifice fly to get within one. UR got two runners on in scoring position in the eighth, then loaded the bases in the ninth, but all five guys were stranded.

WHITLEY, O'KEEFE COLLECT WEEKLY AWARDS

Aaron Whitley and Aidan O'Keefe were named Atlantic 10 Conference Player and Co-Rookie of the Week, the league announced April 15. Whitley hit .526 with 10 hits, including five for extra bases, five RBI and seven runs scored. He collected three stolen bases in four attempts, reached base three times via hit by pitch and struck out once. Whitley sent the first pitch of the game at James Madison over the centerfield wall to give UR a quick lead. In Friday's contest against George Washington, he was a triple short of the cycle with two doubles and a home run. He clubbed his third home run of the week Sunday, following Connor Larson's solo blast in the Spiders seven-run fourth inning. Patrolling a windy outfield all week, Whitley made 10 putouts without committing an error. Starting at third base in all three games of the GW series, O'Keefe hit .400 with two

RBI, two walks, four runs scored and a hit by pitch. In his first at bat of the series on Friday after missing a week due to an injury, he launched his third home run of the season down the right field line. In the bottom of the ninth in Saturday's contest, he drew a bases loaded walk then slid headfirst into home to score on Larson's game-winning bunt.

SPIDERS SPLIT SEASON MIDWEEK ACTION AGAINST LONGWOOD

The Lancers collected the April 16 contest at Pitt Field, 17-5, capitalizing on 16 hits, 12 walks and two UR errors. LU put up two six-run frames on the UR pitching staff that threw seven arms against the Lancers. UR tallied a run in the second and two in the third, plus single runs in the fifth and seventh.

SPIDERS SWEEP THE REVOLUTIONARIES

UR collected the squad's first A-10 series sweep of the season, outscoring GW 26-12. UR hit six home runs, drew 13 walks and stole seven bases. In Friday's game, the Spiders used an eight-run inning to put the game away while in Sunday's game it was a seven-run offensive burst to clinch the sweep. Kyle Roche tossed four perfect innings to start Saturday's game. He got lifted with two outs in the seventh, allowing one run on six hits and striking out five. With the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth, Jack Arcamone scored two with a base hit. Aidan O'Keefe slid in headfirst to score the winning run on Connor Larson's perfectly placed bunt past the GW pitcher.

KEYDETS OUTLAST SPIDERS IN SLUGFEST

VMI jumped out to a 6-0 lead in three innings before the Spiders roared back to score five runs in the third and fourth to take a 10-6 lead. Jordan Jaffe launched a three-run home run in the third, while Joey Wilga and DJ Pacheco both hit two-run blasts in the fourth. UR added three more runs in the next few innings but VMI took advantage of 17 walks and seven hit batters to capture a 23-13 midweek victory.

SPIDERS FALL TO THE DUKES

Aaron Whitley launched the first pitch of the game over the wall in left center to give UR a quick lead, but the JMU offense took advantage of 13 walks and five extra base hits over eight innings to capture a 14-4 victory. UR got runs in the eighth on a bases loaded sacrifice fly by RJ Rickabaugh and a two-run double by Jordan Jaffe.

SPIDERS AVOID SWEEP BY RAMS

Richmond picked up a 6-2 Sunday victory over Fordham to avoid an Atlantic 10 Conference series sweep in New York. After Fordham took the lead in the seventh, the Spider offense answered with two runs in the eighth and three more in the ninth. Cole Hentschel picked up his fourth save and second of the week in a two-inning outing and worked out of a bases loaded situation in the ninth with back-to-back strikeouts. The Rams kept the Spider offense from gaining any footing in the first two contests, collecting 5-2 game one victory and 12-2 game two victory.

SPIDERS OUTLAST THE LANCERS

UR starter Vincent Corso tallied three scoreless frames, collecting four strikeouts, while working around one hit and a walk. UR got on the board first in the top of the fourth, as Aidan O'Keefe scored on Jack Arcamone's triple. Longwood took a 3-1 lead in the bottom of the fourth. Aaron Whitley tallied his fifth home run of the season to lead off the fifth to make it 3-2. Ethan Sannes got the win after he tossed a clean fifth, working around an infield single, to quickly get the Spider offense back at the plate. After Connor Larson legged out a triple to start the fifth, Phil Bernstein collected his team-leading leading 25th hit and 26th RBI with a bases loaded infield hit to tie the game. Jake Topolski scored two runs with an infield single to give the Spiders a 5-3 lead. Topolski came up with the base loaded in the eighth and doubled down the left field line to score two more runs, putting the Spiders up 7-4. Cole Hentschel picked up his third save of the season after retiring the Lancers in order with two strikeouts.

SPIDERS TAKE SERIES OVER THE PATRIOTS

Richmond opened the 2024 Atlantic 10 Conference slate with a wild weekend series victory over George Mason. Friday, after hitting a solo home run in the eighth to tie the game, Jordan Jaffe drew a bases loaded walk to force in the game-winning run in the bottom of the ninth. The Spiders loaded the bases with back-to-back hit by pitches and a bunt single. A third hit by pitch scored the first run, the second came on a wild pitch before Jaffe's walk sealed the victory.

Saturday, down 16-2 heading into the bottom of the sixth, Richmond rattled off 15-unanswered runs to walk of the Patriots for a second time on a sacrifice fly. Aaron Whitley's second solo home run of the game kicked off the three runs scored in the sixth. Jaffe tallied a two-RBI double, followed by Phil Bernstein's RBI base hit, a sacrifice fly by Jack Arcamone and a base hit by Aidan O'Keefe in the seventh to cut into the Patriots lead, 16-10. In the ninth, UR tallied six runs on back-to-back bases loaded walks, a sacrifice fly, and back-to-back doubles before Nick Lorenzo, who tallied his first collegiate hit in the eighth, hit the sacrifice fly in the tenth to win the game.

Sunday, down 3-0 going into the bottom of the fifth, Joey Wilga hit a solo blast to get the offense going. Bernstein tallied a sacrifice fly and Jake Topolski picked up two RBI to give UR a 4-3 lead. Mason built up their lead to 9-4 going into the bottom of the eighth. Larson doubled in two runs to make it 9-6 but Mason's closer retired the Spiders in order in the ninth.

MIDWEEK AT No. 9 VIRGINIA

Jake Topolski put the Spiders up quickly, launching his fifth home run and his second grand slam of the season to leftfield in the top of the first. Logan Ymker got the start, keeping UVA off the board in the first, but was hit with a come backer in the second, cutting his outing short. UVA tied the game in the third at 4-all before DJ Pacheco doubled in Connor Larson to take a 5-4 lead in the fourth. UVA answered with three in the bottom of the fourth and took control of the game.

FIRST ROAD TRIP TO HIGH POINT

Richmond dropped the weekend series of the season to High Point as the Panthers outscored the Spiders 44-11 at Williard Stadium in North Carolina. DJ Pacheco launched two more lead off home runs to lead the team with five on the season. Jordan Jaffe paced the squad with six hits on the weekend, including two doubles. Freshman Jackson Hinchliffe tossed three scoreless frames Saturday, walking one and striking out one in his second collegiate appearance.

MONARCHS SNAG MIDWEEK ROAD CONTEST

Jordan Jaffe put the Spiders on the board first with a two-run home run in top of the first inning. ODU answered with a two-run shot in the bottom of the second. Both pitching staffs then tossed five scoreless frames. The Spiders left seven on, drawing four walks and picking up four base hits and a double. UR starter Logan Ymker scattered four hits, two runs, two walks and four strikeouts over five innings of work. Jackson Hinchliffe made his collegiate debut, retiring all three batters he faced in the sixth. Harrison Clifton made his 11th appearance of the season, striking out one and walking one in the seventh. Dane Armson took the loss after giving up a solo home run in the eighth. Armson went two-thirds of an inning with a strikeout. Cole Hentschel allowed one hit and got the final out of the eighth via strikeout.

HOME SWEET HOME

Richmond wrapped up 19-straight home stand as Spring Break came to an end, taking two of three from Cornell, dropped a midweek to Lafayette (March 13) and defeating Princeton (March 11). Over the five-game week, nine home runs were mashed, including three each by Jason Shockley and DJ Pacheco. Along with Jake Topolski, they all pace the squad in the long ball. Pacheco and RJ Rickabaugh each had grand slams over the week. Shockley, Pacheco and Phil Bernstein each collected eight RBI.

SPIDERS TAKE SERIES AGAINST BIG RED

Richmond picked up two 8-4 victories over Cornell to wrap up a five game Spring Break week and 19-game home stand. DJ Pacheco had two home runs in each of the first two games against the Big Red, with grand slam in the second inning of the first game. He launched the first pitch he saw in the bottom of the first in the second game. Jason Shockley hit a three-run blast in the final game of the series to break a 2-2 tie in the fifth for his third home run of the season.

LATE RALLY FALLS SHORT AGAINST LEOPARDS

Lafayette collected their second win of the season 7-6 as Richmond's rallies in the eighth and ninth fell short. The Spiders put up a 5-0 lead in the first, including a solo home run for DJ Pacheco, who finished the day a double shy of the cycle. The Leopards clawed their way back to take the lead with a three-run sixth. Phil Bernstein picked up his team-leading 21st RBI in the bottom of the seventh to tie the game at 6-all, but UR left two stranded in the eighth and one in the ninth. Logan Ymker scattered three runs on four hits, three walks and a career-high seven strikeouts over five innings of work.

SPIDERS SPLIT SUNDAY DOUBLE HEADER WITH RED FOXES

Richmond took the final game against Marist 11-4 (Mar. 10) after dropping the first game 1-4, to split the Sunday doubleheader. RJ Rickabaugh hit his first home run in the Friday afternoon 3-5 (Mar. 8) loss while Joey Wilga tattooed his first career home run in the Spiders' second game Sunday.

RICHMOND OFFENSE ERRUPTS AGAINST TIGERS

In the Monday matinee against Princeton, UR used a 12-run fourth inning, including seven runs with two outs, for a 24-8 victory. The offensive output was the most runs scored since Richmond defeated Sacred Heart 23-2 in 2022. Jason Shockley led the way with five hits, two doubles, two home runs and six RBI, while Phil Bernstein tallied five RBI and RJ Rickabaugh launched a grand slam. Jake Topolski hit his team leading third home run in the eighth inning.

REINKE COLLECTS A-10 PITCHER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Brian Reinke was named Atlantic 10 Conference Pitcher of the Week (March 5) for the first weekly honor of his career and the team this season after he posted a career-high 10 strikeouts over a career-high six innings of work against Sacred Heart. Reinke didn't get the decision but kept the Spiders in the game to get the win after Aaron Whitley broke scoreless draw in the seventh with a solo home run. In three starts over 15 innings of work, Reinke holds a 4.20 ERA, with 19 total strikeouts which is the fifth-best total in the league. He is also ranks sixth with 1.80 walks allowed per nine innings.

SPIDERS GO 2-1 IN CENTRAL VIRGINIA CHALLENGE

Kyle Roche didn't allow a walk for another 5.1 innings against Boston College but took the 7-2 loss (Mar. 1). Brian Reinke didn't get the decision in a pitcher's duel against Sacred Heart (Mar. 2) but kept the Spiders in the contest, striking out 10 over six innings of work, before Aaron Whitley hit the game-winning home run in the seventh. Esteban Rodriguez came out of the pen for his fourth appearance for UR, striking out six, while UR bats came alive in a 13-3 victory over Central Connecticut State (Mar. 3). Against CCSU, Jack Arcamone hit his first collegiate home run, a two-run blast to right in the fourth. Jake Topolski tallied his second multi-run home run of the season, a three-run shot to center, in the seventh while Aidan O'Keefe tallied his first collegiate home run, also a three-run shot to left in the seventh.

SWEET SWEEP FOR AOKI'S FIRST UR WINS

The Spiders captured head coach Mik Aoki's first win at the helm of the program in the first game on Feb. 24, after a dominate performance on the mound by Kyle Roche, 8-2. UR bats picked up timely hits late in the second game, including a bases loaded two-RBI hit by Zach Lass. Phil Bernstein had a four-RBI game, including a three-run home run and a RBI double, in the series finale Sunday. Lass hit his first home run of the season, but with two on, two out, in the bottom of the ninth rookie Joey Wilga sent the 2-2 pitch back through the infield to score two for the 9-8 walk off win.

WELCOME TO PITT FIELD

UR starter Esteban Rodriguez struck out nine over five innings of work, scattering two hits and only allowing one run in the third. William & Mary bats found holes and tacked nine runs on Spider relivers. Richmond tallied its only run in the fifth and was held to three hits, while drawing three walks and left eight on base.

SPIDERS FALL TO PURPLE EAGLES

UR had a tough foe in Niagara for four games, getting out scored 36-12 by the Purple Eagles. Jake Topolski paced the Spiders with five hits, including a grand slam and two doubles, five RBI for 10 total bases over the weekend. Jake Elbeery showed patience at the plate drawing five walks. Phil Bernstein tallied four hits and collected three RBI in 14 at-bats. Brian Reinke struck out a career-high six batters, while fellow starters Kyle Roche and Logan Ymker tallied five and three swings and misses.

ATLANTIC 10 PRESEASON COACHES POLL

The Atlantic 10 released the 2024 Preseason Coaches Poll Feb. 14, with the Spiders slated to finish just outside the tournament in eighth. Saint Louis topped the poll with three first place votes, while George Mason (2), Saint Joseph (1), Davidson (2) and VCU (2) rounded out the top five. Dayton (1), Rhode Island (1) tallied sixth and seventh ahead of UR, while George Washington, Fordham, Massachusetts and St. Bonaventure rounded out the 12-team league.

SPIDER RETURNERS - POSITION PLAYERS

2023 Atlantic 10 Conference Rookie of the Year and starter Jordan Jaffe heads back to the hot corner, as junior Jake Elbeery take his spot at first base. Jaffe finished his rookie season with a .341 average, 64 hits with 20 doubles and 12 home runs while drawing 22 walks, 59 RBI and scoring 51 runs. Elbeery tallied a .286 average, picking up 56 hits, nine doubles, two home runs with 38 RBI and 28 runs scored. Also returning is catcher Zach Lass, infielders Chase Conklin, Aidan O'Keefe and Jake Topolski, and outfielder DJ Pacheco.

SPIDER RETURNERS - PITCHING STAFF

On the mound, junior Esteban Rodriguez tossed 66.2 innings, second most on the squad in 16 appearances with one start for a 5-2 record. He put together a 4.32 ERA with two saves, 81 strikeouts and 16 walks. Fellow junior Brian Reinke makes another foray into a starting role this season (8.10 ERA, 0-0, 10 APP, 2 starts, 16.2 IP) along with sophomore Chase Topolski (10.59 ERA, 1-1, 17.0 IP, 12 APP, 1 start, 16 SO). Relievers Dane Armson, Matthew Anderson and Cole Henschel look to be a force.

Four undergrad transfers join three true freshmen in the infield while two graduate students will patrol the outfield. Middle infielders Connor Larson (Wofford) and Michael Elko (Northwestern) along with corner rookies Nick Lorenzo and Joey Wilga are pushing upper-classmen for the starting job. Three catchers also joined the squad for 2024 in Jason Shockley (Rutgers), RJ Rickabaugh (Notre Dame) and Jack Arcamone. Aaron Whitley (Rochester) and Phil Bernstein (Hamilton) bring experience to the outfield, with two-way athlete Jackson Kraemer (Wake Forest) seeing time in centerfield.

SPIDER NEW GUYS - PITCHING STAFF

Three freshmen join six graduate transfers as the new guys on the pitching staff this season. Leftie rookies Hugh Hill and Kellan Heney and right-hander Jackson Hinchliff are looking to make their mark on the squad. Righties Ethan Sannes (Augustana), Kyle Roche (Franklin & Marshall), Logan Ymker (Presbyterian), Gerry Peacock (Notre Dame) and Dylan Siesky (Lafayette) and left-hander Jake Young (Florida) will have their experience called upon.

reer wins to the Spiders.

He came to UR from Morehead State, where in 2023 he guided the Eagles to a 36-20 record and the outright Ohio Valley Conference regular season title, the first for the program since 1979. Morehead State's 36 wins were tied for fourth-most in school history and marked the third straight year the Eagles increased their win total from the previous season.

Aoki served as the head coach at Notre Dame for nine seasons from 2010-19, when he oversaw the program's transition from the Big East to the Atlantic Coast Conference. In their final Big East season in 2013, Aoki guided Notre Dame to a 34-24 record and a runner-up finish in the Big East Tournament. In the program's second ACC season in 2015, the Irish finished 37-23 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006.

Aoki spent seven seasons at Boston College as both an assistant and head coach, leading BC to some of the most successful seasons in program history. In 2009 — the third of Aoki's four seasons as head coach — the Eagles won 34 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for

the first time since 1967. From 2004 to 2006, Aoki served as BC's pitching coach. He helped BC to a program-record 37 wins in 2005 and had six Eagles pitchers drafted by MLB clubs.

Aoki's first collegiate head coaching position was at Columbia from 1999 to 2003. Aoki led the Lions to 20 wins in 2001, their first 20-win season since 1987. The Lions reached 20 wins again in 2002 and 2003, compiling the second-longest string of 20-win seasons in school history at the time.

Everywhere he's coached, Aoki has demonstrated an ability to develop future professional players. More than 55 of his players have been selected in the MLB Draft, and 15 have gone on to reach the major leagues.

Aoki's teams have also performed in the classroom, posting a program GPA of 3.0 or better every year from 2012 to 2021. In 2018 and 2019, his Notre Dame teams received "The Trophy," an award given to the Irish team most committed to community service.

Aoki earned a Bachelor's degree from Davidson College in 1990 and a Master's degree from Ohio University in 1994. He and his wife Sue have three children, son Kai, and daughters, Bryn and Reese.

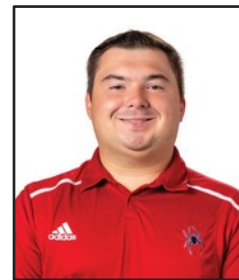
