What's On Tap . . .

It all comes down to championship Saturday as a top-20 matchup unfolds when No. 18 and two-seeded Richmond squares off with No. 14 and top-seeded Saint Joseph's for the Atlantic 10 title and an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament . . . In just 11 seasons, Richmond makes its tenth-consecutive trip to a conference title game . . . The Spiders have made a conference championship game appearance every year of program existence excluding 2020 when one was not played due to the Covid-19 pandemic . . . Richmond is the only team to have ever made the NCAA Tournament in its first year of existence . . . With a win Saturday, Richmond will make its sixth trip to the NCAA Tournament.

Series History . . .

Saturday's game comes just one week removed from Richmond's regular season meeting with Saint Joseph's when the Hawks slipped past the Spiders, 10-9, in the Atlantic 10 regular season finale . . . Richmond is 1-3 all-time against the Hawks . . . The teams met for the first time in Philadelphia during Richmond's inaugural season in 2014 when the Spiders fell 7-4, then met a year later in 2015 when the Spiders won 9-5 . . . Richmond lost 2023's meeting — the first with both teams competing under the Atlantic 10 banner — 14-12 in Philadelphia . . . Both programs have immense respect for one another as Spiders Head Coach Dan Chemotti (Duke, '02) and Saint Joseph's Head Coach Taylor Wray (Duke, '03) played together for the Blue Devils and won a pair of ACC titles ('01, '02) and remain close friends to this day.

Spiders In Title Games . . .

Richmond has made it to the conference title game in every season of program existence and has done so in three different conferences (ASUN, SoCon, A-10) . . . In 10 title game appearances, Saint Joseph's is just the fourth unique opponent the Spiders have faced (High Point six times, Air Force two times, Jacksonville once) . . . Richmond has played in three title games that have gone to overtime (double overtime in 2015) and are 1-2 in such games . . . Richmond's six title game victories have been decided by a total of 18 goals and its four losses have been decided by just eight.

Spiders To Play In Tenth-Consecutive Conference Title Game With 11-10 Semifinal Win Over High Point . . .

Richmond will be making its tenth-consecutive trip to a conference championship game after it defeated High Point in a thrilling 11-10 decision Thursday night at UMass' Garber Field during game two of the Atlantic 10 Championship semifinal . . . Lance Madonna led the Spiders in the back-and-forth contest as he erupted to match a career-high seven points via four goals and three assists that both came as a season-high for the senior . . . The Spiders (10-5)

jumped to an early 4-0 lead in the first quarter thanks largely to Madonna . . . He scored the first two goals of the game with the first coming off a feed from Dalton Young, then scored another off a pass from Aidan O'Neil . . . Madonna recorded his first assist of the game, this time aiding a Joe Sheridan goal to go up 3-0 by the 8:40 mark of the opening frame . . . Lukas Olsson, who would go on to score the eventual game-winner, ended the night with a pair of goals on just three shots and scored his first with 1:35 left in the opening quarter off a pass from Young . . . The second quarter belonged to High Point (9-7) as the Panthers tallied half their goals between the 14:00 and 4:08 mark to go up 5-4, then O'Neil scored an unassisted goal at the 2:10 mark to stop the scoring run . . . From there, both teams traded goals as High Point took over the lead at 6-5, 7-6 and 8-7 while the Spiders kept them in reach with goals by Jeff Nugent, another from Madonna off a feed from Luke Grayum, and an unassisted goal from Gavin Creo . . . With the game tied at eight apiece, Henry Alpaugh gave Richmond its first lead since the score was 4-3 at 5:36 in the second when he took a shot from range off a pass from Madonna at the 8:51 mark of the final quarter . . . A quick 44 seconds later, High Point added another score to make it 9-9, then Madonna found Olsson for the would-be game-winner with 1:54 left in the game . . . Madonna scored his final of the night on an open cage with 14 seconds left to play, then High Point scored shortly after the ensuing face off to pull back within one, but it wouldn't be enough as Richmond secured the semifinal victory.

Young Named Tewaaraton Award Nominee . . .

Dalton Young has been named one of 25 nominees for the prestigious Tewaaraton Award . . . The Tewaaraton Award is recognized as the pre-eminent lacrosse award, annually honoring the top male and female college lacrosse player in the United States . . . Young earns the honor as one of the country's most consistent scorers, entering Saturday's game with 258 (144 goals, 114 assists) career points including a balanced 34 goals and 38 assists so far this season . . . It's been over three years since the last time Dalton Young didn't record a point in a game (March 7, 2021 at Duke) . . . Young holds a 56-game point streak heading into Saturday's championship game . . . He has recorded a point in 58 of 64 career games and is one of only a handful of active players with a 55+ game point streak, having racked up 133 goals and 108 assists for 241 points over the duration of his 56-game streak . . . Young is Richmond's second-leading all-time scorer and became the fastest player in program history to record 100 points, pulling off the feat in just 30 games . . . With his five points from the Virginia game, Young reached 203 career points and becomes just the third Spider ever to eclipse 200 . . . Young's 258 career points rank second all-time for the Spiders . . . Young currently ranks ninth in career points at 258 and his 114 assists rank 10th among the NCAA's active career leaders . . . He is the only player in the Atlantic 10 to make the list Tewaaraton nominees list.

Climbing The Ranks . . .

Richmond ranks in the top 10 nationally and first in the Atlantic 10 in scoring defense (2nd, 8.87), scoring margin (4th, 4.80) and the team ranks 6th (3rd in A-10) in man-down defense at .773 . . . The team is top 20 nationally in shot percentage (13th, .324), assists per game (15th, 2nd in A-10, 7.73) . . . caused turnovers per game (15th, 3rd A-10, 9.27), clearing percentage (12th, 1st in A-10, .889), points per game (16th, 2nd A-10, 21.40) and scoring offense (14th, 1st A-10, 13.67).

Attendance Is Mandatory . . .

Richmond home games were some of the most well-attended in the country this season . . . Richmond ranked eighth in cumulative attendance with 16,238 (Syracuse led with 42,600) while the program was ninth in average attendance at 2,030.

Between the Pipes . . .

One of the country's top goalies, redshirt junior Zach Vigue has helped the Spiders reach second in the nation in scoring defense, holding teams to just 8.87 goals per game . . . Vigue ranks second in the nation and conference in goals against average at 8.65 and is sixth in save percentage (first in A-10) at .575 entering Saturday's title game . . . Against Duke, Vigue helped the Spiders force the Blue Devils to match a then-season low in goals with 12 . . . At the time, Duke was the nation's top scoring offense and averaged 18.29 goals per game.

Young Earns Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week Honors . . .

Young was named the Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week following the UMass victory, announced by the conference office Monday afternoon . . . Young earns the honor for the first time this season after helping lift the Spiders to their fourth conference win in a row with six

points from the UMass game last Saturday . . . Young registered two goals and chipped in four assists to pace the #14 Spiders to a 16-14 win over the Minutemen.

Pair of Spiders Take Home Atlantic 10 Weekly Awards . . .

Jack Pilling and Gavin Creo were named Atlantic 10 Defensive Player and Rookie of the Week, respectively, announced by the conference Monday afternoon . . . Pilling, a sophomore from Upper Dublin, Pa. earns his first Atlantic 10 weekly award after leading the Spiders defense during Richmond's 9-5 win over High Point last Saturday night . . . The defensive midfielder recorded a career-high five caused turnovers, scooped a ground ball and also came up with an assist in the win that put Richmond at 3-0 in conference contests and his five caused turnovers rank eighth all-time for the Spiders . . . Creo, a freshman Rockville Centre, N.Y. native, earns his third Rookie of the Week honor this season after recording two goals on three shots and a ground ball in Richmond's win.

Young, Vigue Named Midseason All-American Hon. Mentions By Inside Lacrosse . . .

Spiders fifth year attackman Dalton Young and redshirt junior goalie Zach Vigue have been named Inside Lacrosse Midseason All-American Honorable Mentions.

Vigue Named A-10 Defensive Player of the Week for Third Time This Season . . .

For the third time this season, University of Richmond goalie Zach Vigue was named the Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Week . . . Vigue earned the award after recording 15 saves, a pair of ground balls and a caused turnover during Richmond's 13-4 road win over UMBC Saturday . . . At the time of the award, Vigue lead the country in save percentage at .660 and helped the Spiders scoring defense to first in the nation, holding opponents to an average of 8.17 goals per game . . . The redshirt junior was also fifth in goals against average at 10.36 at the time of the honor.

Creo Tabbed Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week . . .

Gavin Creo was named the Atlantic 10 Rookie of the Week after his performance against Hobart . . . The Rockville Centre, N.Y. native chipped in a pair of assists during Richmond's 21-8 win . . . Creo dished a pass to Dalton Young just over one and a half minutes (13:27) into the game for Richmond's second score of the day and later connected with Jack Ricciardi for another Spiders tally.

Grayum Collects Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week Honors . . .

Attackman Luke Grayum was named the Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week after leading the Spiders offense during its 19-10 win over Binghamton . . . Grayum netted seven goals, the most of his career and tied the program record for most in a single game set by Richie Connell March 20, 2021 at Bellarmine . . . On top of his high-scoring day, Grayum helped the Spiders transition defense with a pair of caused turnovers.

Vigue Takes Home Back-to-Back Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Week Honors . . .

Goalie Zach Vigue was named the Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Week for the second week in a row following his performance against St. John's . . . Vigue recorded 15 saves in the win and the two goals allowed are the least by a Richmond opponent since April 4, 2015 when Richmond beat Furman at home, 8-2 . . . The week prior against No. 3 Virginia, Vigue earned the honor after he posted 17 saves, the third most of his career and seventh most ever by any Spider goalie during Richmond's 14-10 loss to the Cavaliers . . . The redshirt junior from Apex, N.C. recorded a pair of ground balls in the contest as well.

O'Neil Named Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week . . .

For his efforts in Richmond's commanding 23-7 win over Robert Morris, sophomore attackman Aidan O'Neil was named the Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Week . . . O'Neil led the Spiders with six goals and six assists, tied the program record for most points in a single game, also held by Ryan Lanchbury who pulled off the feat twice (March 20, 2021 at Bellarmine and April 25, 2021 at Mercer) . . . O'Neil's six goals tie for the second most in a single game in program history and his six assists are third all-time for the Spiders.

Knight, Creo Tabbed Atlantic 10 Players of the Week . . .

Sophomore goalie Connor Knight and freshman attackman Gavin Creo were named the Atlantic 10 Defensive and Rookie Players of the Week, respectively following the game against Maryland . . . Making his first career start, Knight recorded 10 saves, taking the No. 6 Terrapins to double overtime . . . Knight recorded two ground balls as well as a crucial save on the doorstep in the first overtime period . . . Creo earned the honor after recording a goal and a ground ball in his collegiate debut . . . Creo's tally came at the 5:16 mark of the third quarter to tie the game at 8-8.

#16 Saint Joseph's Slips Past #14 Richmond In Regular Season Finale . . .

Richmond fell 10-9 in the regular season finale to Saint Joseph's Saturday . . . Saint Joseph's put the first points on the board at 12:19 in the first quarter before the Spiders (9-5, 4-1 A-10) added the next two . . . Dalton Young tied things at one apiece at 5:54, then Lance Madonna picked up his first of the day at 8:56 in the second . . . Both Young and Madonna would go on to tally two goals and an assist each . . . The Hawks (10-3, 5-0 A-10) scored two more goals in the second to take back the lead by 2:21, then Madonna scored his second goal, this one coming as the horn sounded heading into halftime to make it a tied game at three . . . Up 6-3, momentum swung in favor of Saint Joseph's as the Hawks scored six unanswered between 6:15 in the third and 10:17 in the fourth to go up 9-6 . . . Aidan O'Neil and Grayum scored to bring it within one by the 8:10 mark of the fourth, but Saint Joseph's would tack on another and O'Neil's second goal on the night at 3:25 would come as Richmond's last as the Hawks slipped away with the one-goal victory.

Spiders Remain Undefeated in Conference With 14-12 Win at UMass Saturday . . .

Richmond went on the road and remained undefeated at 4-0 in Atlantic 10 play, taking down UMass, 14-12, at Garber Field last Saturday . . .

Richmond scored 42 seconds into the game then added another at 11:39 to take an early 2-0 lead . . . The Minutemen (6-6, 2-2) responded with their first of the day at 6:41 before Richmond tacked on two more to take a 4-1 advantage into the second frame . . . From there, the momentum shifted in favor of UMass who would outscore the Spiders 6-1 in the second quarter . . . Down two coming out of the half, the momentum shifted once again and Richmond unleashed six unanswered goals in less than six minutes to go up 11-8 . . . UMass broke the Spiders scoring streak with a goal at 6:42, then Richmond scored it's last of the third at 5:49 . . . UMass put together a late comeback effort, outscoring Richmond 4-2 in the final quarter including three goals in the game's final 2:13, but it wouldn't be enough as the Spiders explosive third quarter lifted them to its second conference road win in as many weeks.

Spiders Take Down High Point Under The Lights, 9-5 . . .

Richmond went on the road and defeated rival High Point Saturday night, 9-5 . . . Richmond's defense held High Point to a season-low five goals and Atlantic 10 leading scorer and defending Offensive Player of the Week, Brayden Mayea, was held to just one . . . The Panthers put the first two points on the board, picking up two quick scores within the game's first two minutes . . . Down two, Richmond unleashed six unanswered goals to carry a 6-2 lead into the half . . . Richmond and High Point traded an even three goals apiece during the second half, but Richmond's explosive scoring run would prove enough to pull off the win and move to 3-0 in Atlantic 10 play.

Grayum's Record Seven Goals Paces Spiders On Senior Day . . .

Luke Grayum equaled a program record with seven goals and the Spiders blitzed Hobart with four scores in the game's first four-and-a-half minutes in a 21-8 Richmond win on Senior Day last Saturday at Robins Stadium . . . He equaled his own seven goals from earlier this season vs Binghamton and the seven goals scored by Richie Connell at Bellarmine in 2021 . . . Dalton Young recorded a team-high four assists as well as a pair of goals, giving him a team-high 58 points this season . . . Aidan O'Neil and Lance Madonna also scored twice, and eight other Spiders scored one goal each in UR's 21-8 win, its second largest of the season . . . The Spiders have outscored their opponents 40-16 in two conference games so far this season.

Spiders Secure Program's 100th Victory In Conference Opener At St. Bonaventure . . .

The Spiders opened Atlantic 10 conference play at St. Bonaventure last Saturday, taking down the Bonnies, 19-8, to earn Head Coach Dan Chemotti and the rest of the Spider program's 100th victory . . . Richmond controlled throughout, outshooting St. Bonaventure, 49-28, with 29 of the Spiders shots coming in the first half . . . Richmond jumped to an early lead to start the game, picking up a 5-0 goal advantage by the 6:02 mark of the opening quarter . . . From there, the Spiders offense opened up, scoring nine goals to St. Bonaventure's four to bring up a 14-4 halftime score . . . 14 goals is the most in a half for the Spiders since March 13, 2021 when Richmond jumped to a 15-4 first half lead over VMI . . . For the second time this season (also happened against Bucknell), every available field player saw game action as Richmond emptied its bench in the second half . . . While the Bonnies kept closer pace with the Spiders over the final 30 minutes, Richmond would tack on five more goals to St. Bonaventure's four and run away with a conference-opening win on the back of its explosive first half.

#10 Georgetown's Scoring Runs Trip Up #17 Richmond Saturday Night . . .

What started as a tight back and forth affair between No. 17 Richmond and No. 10 Georgetown ended in a 14-8 home loss for the Spiders as the Hoyas went on scoring runs of six and four goals last Saturday . . . Richmond and Georgetown went goal-for-goal for the game's first quarter before Georgetown went on a six-goal run between 9:15 in the second quarter and 14:16 of the third . . . The Spiders went on a run of their own with three quick goals to make it a 10-7 game, but the Hoyas would tack on four more unanswered goals to pull away with the win.

No. 4 Duke's Strong Second Half Too Much For No. 17 Spiders . . .

The No. 17 University of Richmond men's lacrosse team held the nation's top offense, No. 4 Duke, to a narrow 4-2 advantage through the first half of Saturday's game before the Blue Devils went on a 8-1 run over the final 30 minutes to run away from the Spiders, 12-3 . . . The game sat at a 0-0 deadlock until Duke went up 1-0 with a goal at 2:49 in the first quarter . . . Lance Madonna tied the game with his goal just under three minutes into the second before Duke answered back less than 30 seconds later with a goal at 11:16 . . . Luke Grayum scored off a feed from Dalton Young at 7:47 of the same frame in what would be the Spiders last goal for the next 27:38 as Duke scored eight unanswered including six in the third quarter . . . Young's goal at the 9:09 mark of the fourth quarter came off a pass from Jake Kapp and marked his 227th career point, moving the fifth-year senior to second all-time for the Spiders.

#17 Spiders Dominate From Start To Finish To Excel Past Bucknell Tuesday . . .

Richmond played lockdown defense and used efficient shooting to power past Bucknell on the road Tuesday, 17-5 . . . The Spiders connected on 17 of its 31 shots and added 11 assists as 15 Spiders recorded points and every available field player saw action as the team extended its win streak to four games . . . The Spiders offense jumped to an early five-goal lead by the 3:05 mark of the first quarter and would go on to outscore the Bison 4-1 to close out the first half . . . From there, Richmond continued to dominate on both ends of the field, outscoring the Bison 8-4 through the final two frames to pull away with the win.

No. 17 Spiders Topple UMBC On The Road, 13-4 . . .

The Spiders won their first true road contest of the season Friday evening, defeating UMBC, 13-4 . . . The Retrievers scored the game's first goal before Richmond went on a four-unanswered goal run to make it a 4-1 game by the 9:44 mark of the second quarter . . . From there, the Retrievers scored two more goals before Richmond put its foot on the gas and didn't let up, outscoring UMBC 9-1 to pull away with its fourth win of the season.

Strong Second Half, Grayum Pushes No. 14 Spiders Past Binghamton, 19-10 . . .

Richmond used an 11-3 scoring advantage during the second half to push the No. 14 Spiders past Binghamton, 19-10 . . . Luke Grayum, who recorded five of his seven goals in the second half, tied the Spiders program record for goals in a game, also held by Richie Connell (March 20, 2021 at Bellarmine).

Spiders Pull Away From St. John's . . .

Richmond picked up its second win of the season, and first at home, in convincing fashion last Saturday afternoon with an 18-2 victory over Big East foe St. John's . . . The Spiders (2-2) scored 13 unanswered goals during the second and third quarters, breaking open a 1-1 game and turning it into a 14-2 lead late in the third quarter . . . The Spiders' 18 goals are the second-most scored this season, trailing only the 23 goals scored in a win over Robert Morris . . . Luke Grayum led 13 different Spiders goal scorers on the afternoon with three goals and an assist.

Fourth Quarter Cavalier Surge Too Much as #3 Virginia Slips Past #17 Spiders . . .

The No. 17 University of Richmond men's lacrosse team fell at home against No. 3 Virginia, 14-10 on Feb. 17 . . . Playing relatively even with the Cavaliers through three quarters, the Spiders entered the final frame down by one goal at 10-9 . . . The Spiders turned then turned the ball over eight times and recorded just eight shots during the game's final 15 minutes as Virginia ran away with the win.

Spiders Power Past Robert Morris . . .

Richmond jumped to an early 7-0 lead by the 4:29 mark of the first quarter and would later go on scoring runs of three (3x) and five goals . . . Robert Morris went on a three-goal run of their own late in the second quarter to bring the game within five goals at 4-9, but that would be the closest the Colonials would get for the remainder of the game . . . Richmond's 23 goals ties for second most in program history, while Aidan O'Neil, who led the Spiders with six goals and six assists, tied the program record for most points in a single game, also held by Ryan Lanchbury who pulled off the feat twice (March 20, 2021 at Bellarmine and April 25, 2021 at Mercer) . . . O'Neil's six goals tie for the second most in a single game in program history and his six assists are third all-time for the Spiders.

No. 20 Men's Lacrosse Outlasted By No. 6 Maryland In Double Overtime . . .

The No. 20 University of Richmond men's lacrosse team dropped a 12-11 double overtime decision to No. 6 Maryland in the season opener in front of a crowd of 2,407 at Robins Stadium . . . Richmond and Maryland traded goals to begin the first quarter before the Spiders went on a three unanswered goal run followed by a five unanswered goal run from the Terrapins to make it a 7-5 game with 4:07 left to go in the opening half . . . The second half saw three ties at 8-8, 10-10 and 11-11 . . . Maryland took a 10-8 lead with 2:32 left in the third quarter before Dalton Young and Aidan O'Neil added goals to make it 10-10 early in the fourth . . . Both teams scored again to make it an 11-11 game by 7:32 of the fourth quarter, a score that would stand for the following 12:37 of play until Maryland gained possession on the opening face off of the second overtime period and scored the game-deciding goal shortly after.

Iron Sharpens Iron . . .

As they say, "to be the best, you've got to play the best," and the Spiders have never taken the easy way out when it comes to scheduling, having played at least three ranked opponents each season, excluding 2016 when they played two . . . Richmond is 9-32 all-time in program history against top 20 opponents . . . The Spiders' nine wins over ranked opponents have come in 2022 (2 times) 2019 (2 times), 2018, 2017 (3 times) and 2016 . . . The highest-ranked opponent Richmond has ever beaten came in 2022 when it knocked off No. 2 Virginia at Robins Stadium . . . The highest-ranked opponent the Spiders have defeated on the road has been at No. 7 twice - North Carolina in 2017 and Duke in 2016 . . . Four teams that finished in the top 10 of last year's final polls will visit Richmond this season: national runner-up Duke, in-state foe Virginia and perennial powers Georgetown and Maryland.

Channeling a New Era For Spiders Lacrosse . . .

New this season and in response to demand for past home games against highly-ranked teams, the popularity of the 2023 Atlantic 10 Men's Lacrosse Championship hosted at Robins Stadium and the team's overall success, Richmond Athletics will be ticketing for all men's lacrosse games in 2024 . . . Ticket revenue will contribute to game day enhancements that will improve both the student-athlete and fan experience . . . Also new in 2024, the Spiders welcome Khari Smart, the program's first-ever full time Director of Lacrosse Operations.

Preseason All-American Honors for Madonna and Young . . .

Ahead of the 2024 season, fifth year Dalton Young and senior Lance Madonna have been named USA Lacrosse and Division I Men's Preseason All-American Honorable Mentions, WITH Madonna also being named an Inside Lacrosse Preseason All-American . . . Last season, Young, the Atlantic 10 Offensive Player of the Year, lead the Spiders with a single season career-high 73 points via 32 goals and 41 assists and finished eighth in the nation in assists per game with 2.56 . . . Madonna earns Preseason All-American Honorable Mention status after scoring 29 goals and dishing out 17 assists en route to being named the Atlantic 10 Midfielder of the Year . . . Madonna lead the Spiders in game-winning goals with three last season and finished second on the team in points only behind Young . . . Madonna put up a 15-game scoring streak last season, scoring at least one goal in all but one game . . . He finished with 12 multi-point games and recorded three or more points in 11 games in 2023 and has recorded points in 33-of-40 career games . . . Both Young and Madonna were named USA Lacrosse Magazine All-American Honorable Mentions at the end of the 2023 season.

Preseason All-Atlantic 10 . . .

For the second year in a row, the University of Richmond men's lacrosse team was chosen as the preseason favorites to win the Atlantic 10 championship, which will be contested May 2 and 4 at UMass' Garber Field . . . As selected by the conference's six head coaches, the Spiders were picked to finish ahead of Saint Joseph's, UMass (T.-3), High Point (T.-3), Hobart and St. Bonaventure— in that order . . . Of six possible first place votes, Richmond picked up four, while the Hawks of Saint Joseph's grabbed the other two . . . On top of being predicted to finish first, four Spiders were named to the Atlantic 10 men's lacrosse Preseason All-Conference Team in attackman Dalton Young, midfielder Lance Madonna, Long-stick midfielder Tommy Stull and defenseman Hunter Smith . . . Both Young and Madonna were named preseason All-Atlantic 10 selections a year ago as well.

Creo Listed on Inside Lacrosse's Power 100 Freshmen Rankings . . .

Freshman attackman Gavin Creo has been named to the Inside Lacrosse Power 100 Freshmen Rankings . . . Creo is ranked No. 62 on the list of freshmen who will play in their debut college seasons in 2024 . . . Creo is just one of two Atlantic 10 players to make the list alongside UMass midfielder Matt Cargiulo, who is ranked No. 72 . . . The Rockville Centre, N.Y. native is a product of Chaminade High School where he served as captain for the Flyers and was named team MVP as a senior . . . Creo was named Catholic High School Athletic Association All-League and was tabbed First Team All-Long Island by Newsday . . . A standout in the classroom and the field, Creo was honored with the Joseph F. Thomas Student-Athlete Award, given to the top Chaminade student-athlete in their class . . . The four-year honor roll student was named a USA Lacrosse Academic All-American and was a member of the National Honor Society.

Young Selected by Philadelphia Wings in 2023 NLL Entry Draft . . .

Dalton Young was selected 45th overall by the Philadelphia Wings in the third round of the 2023 National Lacrosse League Entry Draft in September . . . Young is the third Spider to be drafted to the NLL after Jake Saunders was selected 16th overall by the Las Vegas Desert Dogs in 2022 and Ryan Lanchbury went second overall to the Georgia Swarm in 2021 . . . Lanchbury is now signed with the Rochester Knighthawks.

Cheers to Five Years . . .

The Spiders bring a wealth of experience into 2023 with fifth year players Jake Kapp, Joe Gooley, Dalton Young and Jack Fabean . . .

2023 At A Glance . . .

In 2023 the Spiders earned their fifth NCAA Tournament appearance and the first-ever Atlantic 10 title after taking down rival High Point, 15-8, in the title game at Robins Stadium . . . The win marked the third conference Richmond has won titles in (Atlantic Sun, Southern, Atlantic 10) and the Spiders went a perfect 9-0 at home for just the second time in program history . . . Nine Spiders were named to All-Atlantic 10 teams including the Offensive (Dalton Young), Midfield (Lance Madonna) and Rookie (Aidan O'Neil) Players of the Year as well as four All-Rookie selections in Hunter Smith, Jack Pilling, Joe Sheridan and O'Neil . . . Richmond finished the season 11-5 including a 4-1 conference record.

2023 marked Dan Chemotti's 10th season as the men's lacrosse head coach at the University of Richmond. Chemotti is the program's first-ever head coach and has guided the Spiders to unprecedented success for such a young program.

The two-time Southern Conference Coach of the Year, Chemotti has guided the Spiders to five NCAA Tournament appearances (2023, 2022, 2019, 2018, 2014), in the first 10 years of program existence, including back-to-back seasons as Southern Conference Tournament champions (2019, 2018) and the inaugural Atlantic 10 Men's Lacrosse champions. Richmond has won four regular season league titles in its first ten years (no title awarded in 2020) and has been in the conference tournament championship game every season (2020 season impacted by COVID-19).

Chemotti has led Richmond to a 94-57 (.623) record as head coach, including seven years off 10 or more wins and the Spiders have won 80 percent (44-11) of their conference games in program history.

In 2023, Chemotti guided the Spiders to its fifth NCAA Tournament appearance and the first-ever Atlantic 10 title after taking down rival High Point, 15-8, in the title game at Robins Stadium. The win marked the third conference Chemotti has led Richmond to titles in (Atlantic Sun, Southern,

Atlantic 10). Richmond went a perfect 9-0 at home for just the second time in program history and nine Spiders were named to All-Atlantic 10 teams including the Offensive (Dalton Young), Midfield (Lance Madonna) and Rookie (Aidan O'Neil) Players of the Year as well as four All-Rookie selections. Dalton Young and Lance Madonna were also named All-American Honorable Mentions by USA Lacrosse Magazine.

2022 saw Richmond win its third SoCon title and name nine players to the All-Conference teams including three First Team selections. The Spiders finished the year ranked in the top 10 nationally in six categories and earned the program's first-ever win over in-state foe, No. 2 Virginia. The 17-13 win came as the highest-ranked victory in program history, surpassing a win over No. 6 Notre Dame in 2019.

Chemotti led Richmond to a share of the Southern Conference regular season title and the number one seed in the SoCon Tournament in 2021. The Spiders swept the postseason SoCon awards with Ryan Lanchbury (Offensive Player of the Year), Sean Menges (Defensive Player of the Year), Dalton Young (Freshman of the Year) and his own SoCon Coach of the Year award. The Spiders placed a SoCon record 11 players on the two All-Conference teams, including six named First Team All-Conference and five earning Second Team All-Conference accolades.

In the shortened 2020 season, the Spiders finished the year ranked No. 18 in the country with a 4-3 record. The Spiders' three losses all game to nationally ranked opponents in No. 4 Maryland, No. 6 Notre Dame and No. 13 Duke.

In 2019, the Spiders booked their third NCAA Tournament appearance in program history and second-straight by winning the SoCon Championship with a 15-7 victory over No. 11 High Point on the road. The Spiders dominated the Panthers in the championship game and goalkeeper Jack Rusbuldt was named the Most Outstanding Player after allowing 13 goals in the two SoCon games.

Richmond advanced to the NCAA Tournament with the automatic bid and played at No. 4 Duke in the first round. The Spiders gave the Blue Devils all it wanted, out-scoring Duke 4-0 in the fourth quarter before running out of time and falling by a 12-11 margin. Richmond finished the season ranked No. 18 in the country in the final polls.

Sophomores Ryan Lanchbury and Mitch Savoca earned All-America honors last season, becoming the third and fourth All-Americans in program history. Lanchbury set the Richmond single-season scoring record with 72 points and 52 goals. His 52 goals also set the SoCon single-season goal scoring record. He is currently sixth in the nation in goals and 14th in the country in points.

The Spiders placed five members on the First Team All-SoCon squad in 2019. Ryan Lanchbury, Teddy Hatfield, Mitch Savoca, Jason Reynolds and Sean Menges picked up the honors. The Spiders' five First Team All-SoCon selections ties the school record set in 2017, which is also the most in SoCon history, happening for the fourth time in the league's five-year history of men's lacrosse. Additionally, Richmond added to its SoCon-record of 21 First Team All-Conference selections in program history, nine more than the second place team in league history (Air Force, 12 selections).

In 2018, the Spiders won the SoCon regular season championship with an 11-6 overall record and a 6-1 mark in league play. Richmond was a perfect 9-0 at home at Robins Stadium last season, including winning the 2018 SoCon Tournament championship. The Spiders won the tournament title in impressive fashion as Teddy Hatfield scored the game-winning, overtime goal to defeat Jacksonville and send Richmond to its second NCAA Tournament in program history.

The Spiders had their name called in the NCAA Selection Show and made it out of the play-in game for the first time in program history. Richmond went on the road and battled No. 2 Albany in the first round.

The Spiders had six members named to the All-Conference team last year. Joining the First Team, is senior LSM Austin Cates, redshirt-senior attacker Mitch Goldberg, junior attacker Teddy Hatfield and freshman defenseman Jason Reynolds. Freshman midfielder Mitch Savoca is lone Spider representative on the Second Team but in addition, joins fellow newcomer Ryan Lanchbury on the All-Freshman Team.

2017 was a historic season for the Spiders, posting a program record 12 victories and reaching as high as No. 11 in the national polls. For the second straight year, Richmond knocked off a national power, taking down defending national champion UNC, 6-5, in Chapel Hill. In addition, two Spiders earned First Team All-American honors for the first time when Brendan Hynes and Benny Pugh were recognized. Pugh and Hynes also became the first Spiders to ever be drafted into the professional ranks, both being drafted in the Major League Lacrosse draft.

The Spiders saw success again in 2016, their second season in the Southern Conference, posting an 11-5 overall record and a 6-1 mark in conference play. After jumping out to a 4-1 start, the Spiders logged the biggest win in program history, taking down No. 9 Duke on the road, 12-10. The win and another victory over Jacksonville would give the 6-1 Spiders the best start in program history, propelling the team to a No. 18 ranking, the highest in program history.

Shortly after, Mitch Goldberg was named to the prestigious Tewaaron Award Watch List. The team finished third nationally in scoring defense, allowing just 7.44 goals per game, and first in caused turnovers and clearing percentage for the second year in a row. Junior Brendan Hynes ranked second in the nation in caused turnovers, while junior Ryan Dennis ranked ninth nationally in the same category. Seven Spiders earned postseason honors, led by Hynes and senior Alex Hatem, who were named to the SoCon First Team.

In 2015, the Spiders finished 6-0 in the new league and boasted the nation's second-most stingy defense. The Spiders allowed just 7.44 goals per game, within less than half a goal per game from the nation's leader. Richmond also led the country in clearing percentage and finished fourth in the country in scoring margin, winning on average by more than four goals per game.

The Spiders boasted the league's Defensive Player of the Year in Brendan Hynes, while goalie Benny Pugh was second nationally in both save percentage (.590) and goal-against average (7.42) for the year. On the offensive side, the second-year program scored 20-or-more goals three times, finished 15th nationally in scoring offense (11.75) and 11th in assists per game (7.25). Richmond earned its first national ranking for the season, appearing at No. 20 in a national poll. UR was among teams receiving votes for the majority of, and in the final poll of, the season. Richmond got above .500 after just two seasons, sitting at 17-16 overall in just two years as a varsity program.

Chemotti did what no other coach in the history of Division I lacrosse was able to accomplish; he took a first-year program to the NCAA Tournament in 2014. He followed that by taking the Spiders to an undefeated league season in the newly-formed Southern Conference in 2015.

After helping lead the Loyola University Maryland men's lacrosse team as offensive coordinator to the 2012 Division I National Championship in 2012, Chemotti was named head coach of the Richmond men's lacrosse team in October of 2012. He spent that school year recruiting and putting in place the tenets of the program which began play in the 2014 season, and it led to the young squad earning an Atlantic Sun Conference championship and berth into the newly-expanded NCAA Tournament.

The Spiders jumped into their inaugural season by hosting No. 7 Virginia on February 8, 2014. Over 4,000 fans packed into Robins Stadium to see the beginning of a magical season. The Spiders did not come away with a win that day, but battled the Cavaliers to a 13-12 loss, which set the tone for things to come.

Despite losing the first five games of the season, the Spiders kept things positive, and finally broke through for a win against Vermont in Durham, North Carolina on March 8. That was the start of a run of four wins in eight games, including a pair of Atlantic Sun Conference games that propelled the young squad into the four-team Atlantic Sun Championship Tournament.

The Spiders beat both the top seed and host Mercer and second-seeded High Point, avenging two regular-season losses and stringing together back-to-back wins for the first time in team history, and the one time that it mattered, as they earned the league's automatic bid to the NCAA. That feat drew a trip to Colorado Springs and a road game at Air Force in the NCAA Tournament.

During his five seasons with the Greyhounds, Chemotti was a part of four NCAA Tournament berths and at least a share of three ECAC conference titles at Loyola. Chemotti also saw 30 players earn all-conference honors and 12 be named All-Americans during his time there.

Chemotti's powerful offense helped lead the Greyhounds to an 18-1 mark and their first-ever national championship in 2012. The Loyola offense ranked eighth in goals per game (12.05), ninth in EMO at .444% and fifth in turnovers per game at 12.84. A versatile and diverse offense, the Greyhounds saw eight players rack up 10 or more goals, three tally more than 20 and three reach the 50-goal barrier in 2012.

The offense of which Chemotti was the architect afforded Loyola players the ability to shoot quickly, whether in transition or settled offense, and garner a high volume of shots. Despite the high number of shots, Loyola's shot percentage did not drop. In fact, the Greyhounds' shot percentage rose from .249 in 2011 to .299 during the team's 18-1 run to the NCAA Championship.

Two members of Chemotti's offense, Sawyer and midfielder Davis Butts, earned All-ECAC First Team honors in 2012, and Lusby was named to the Second Team. Sawyer was a USILA Second Team All-American, and Lusby and Butts earned All-America Honorable Mention.

In 2010, a pair of Loyola attackers, Collin Finnerty and Cooper MacDonnell, were named to the All-ECAC First Team, and MacDonnell picked up ECAC Offensive Player of the Year honors and was named All-America Honorable Mention. In addition to those honors, Finnerty, MacDonnell and Matt Langan split ECAC Offensive Player of the Week honors five times, and freshman attacker Patrick Fanshaw earned ECAC Rookie of the Week laurels once.

During the 2009 season, Chemotti's attack produced three players with 30 or more total points - Shane Koppens (41), Cooper MacDonnell (38) and Collin Finnerty (37) - a mark not accomplished by a Loyola trio since 2003.

The Greyhounds led the ECAC in goals per game (10.43), a category they finished 17th in all of NCAA Division I during 2009. Koppens led the conference in points per game (3.42) and finished his Loyola career 12th in the nation in the category.

In 2008, the Greyhounds captured the ECAC title behind an explosive offense that ranked second in goals per game and points per game (13.43), and first in shooting percentage, in the league.

Under Chemotti's direction in 2008, Koppens was named ECAC Offensive Player of the Year after finishing as the league's top scorer. In Chemotti's three years calling the offense, nine offensive players have been awarded with post season All-ECAC honors (four first-team and five second-team).

In 2007 the Loyola offense ranked 17th nationally in team offense and finished the season with a .640 assist percentage.

A 2002 graduate of Duke University, Chemotti led the Blue Devils to back-to-back ACC Championships during his junior and senior seasons. During his career in Durham, N.C., the Blue Devils reached the NCAA Tournament all four years, advancing to the NCAA Quarterfinals three times. He was selected a team captain his senior year, and was awarded the school's Roy Skinner Award for Dedication and Sacrifice.

Following graduation, Chemotti worked as an assistant coach at Dartmouth College from 2002-2004, working primarily with the offense and the face-off men. In 2004, the Big Green's offense ranked third nationally in assist percentage and 15th nationally in team offense, and in 2003, Dartmouth's face-off percentage was good enough to finish ninth in the country. Chemotti then worked as an assistant at St. John's for two seasons, 2004-2006, before moving to Loyola for the 2006-2007 academic year.

In addition to coaching, Chemotti played lacrosse professionally as a midfielder for the New Jersey Pride and Washington Bayhawks of Major League Lacrosse. He was a member of the Pride from 2003-2008 and the Bayhawks in 2009. Serving as a two-way midfielder for the Pride and Bayhawks, Chemotti has amassed 54 points and 143 ground balls in 69 career games. Chemotti also played one season (2003) in the National Lacrosse League (NLL) for the New Jersey Storm.

Chemotti, a native of Syracuse, N.Y., played high school lacrosse for West Genesee in Syracuse, where he was named an All-American and the Central New York Player of the Year in his senior campaign. He led the Wildcats to a Class A New York State Championship his senior season and to a runner-up finish his junior season.
