RICHMOND SPIDERS (1-0) vs EAST CAROLINA PIRATES (1-0)

• 12 different Spiders scored in Richmond's win Wednesday. That's the most in a game for the Spiders since Nov. 9, 2012, when 12 scored in a win vs Liberty. 11 different Spiders played at least 12 minutes Wednesday, the most in any of Richmond's 649 games under Chris Mooney.

• Mooney is in his 21st season at Richmond, making him the third longest-tenured coach in A-10 history behind John Chaney (24 seasons at Temple) and Phil Martelli (24 seasons at Saint Joseph's). His 21 seasons at Richmond give him the ninth-longest tenure at his current school among active head coaches.

• Richmond leads the all-time series vs ECU 53-30. Though the former CAA and Southern Conference rivals have met 83 times (UR's seventh-most meetings vs any opponent), this will be their first matchup since Nov. 13, 2007, a 67-65 Spiders win in overtime.

• The Spiders are seeking to start the season 2-0 for the fifth time in the last seven seasons following five straight seasons without a 2-0 start from 2014-15 to 2018-19.

• True freshman Aiden Argabright scored 11 points and led UR with three assists and three steals Wednesday. Argabright is the fourth true freshman to score 10 or more points in a Spiders season opener over the last 15 years, joining Jacob Gilyard (17 points in 2017), Kendall Anthony (20 points in 2011), and Cedrick Lindsay (10 points in 2010).

• 2025-26 is the 50th season of A-10 basketball and Richmond's 25th as a member of the conference. Since joining the league in 2001, Richmond has the second most total wins (432) and conference wins (219) of any Atlantic 10 program.

• Richmond will play 18 regular-season home games this season, its most in 54 seasons in the Robins Center. Richmond's first five games are at home, the longest single-season homestand for the Spiders since 1984.

• Mike Walz, a Preseason Third Team All-Conference selection, had nine points a team-high seven rebounds Wednesday. Last year, he ranked second in the conference in defensive rebounding percentage (23.5) and fourth in assist rate (27.4), via KenPom.

WITH A WIN ...

• UR would win its fourth straight game vs ECU, a stretch that dates back to 2001.

• UR would improve to 54-30 all-time vs ECU, its fifth most wins vs any opponent.

• UR would reach 2-0 for the fifth time in the last seven seasons.

• UR would win for the first time in its last six games vs Division I opponents.

• UR would improve to 34-5 in non-conference home games over the last seven seasons (since 2019-20).

THE BIG PICTURE

TEST RUN

Richmond's only public preseason action was an exhibition vs JMU at the Robins Center on October 25. The Spiders won 63-58 behind a game-high 16 points from Mikkel Tyne.

ROSTER RECONSTRUCTION

Half of the 16 members of the 2025-26 Spiders are new to Richmond, and UR's eight returners this year are tied for the second fewest in any of Chris Mooney's 21 years at Richmond. That group includes three players who redshirted last season (Bryson McGlothlin, Kirby Mooney, Jaylen Robinson).

After accepting just seven incoming transfers during his first 17 years at Richmond, Chris Mooney has now brought in 16 transfers over the last four seasons. This year's transfer class includes graduate student AJ Lopez, who earned All-America East honors at Maine last season, graduate student Will Johnston, who led Loyola Marymount in assists, three-point shooting, and free throw percentage last season, junior Jayden Daughtry, who was selected to the MVC's Most Improved and All-Bench Teams at Indiana State last season, and junior David Thomas, a leading reserve at DePaul last year.

RATE OF RETURN

Richmond's eight returning players, five of whom played last year and three of whom redshirted, accounted for 46 percent of UR's scoring and 52 percent of the team's total minutes played last year. That's the highest share of returning minutes and scoring for the Spiders since the 2021-22 season, when Richmond brought back 85% of its minutes and 81% of its scoring and went on to win the A-10 Championship.

WHO'S BACK

UR return three of its top five scorers from last season: Mikkel Tyne (9.3 PPG, 3rd), Mike Walz (7.4, 4th), and Jonathan Beagle (6.8, 5th).

Tyne was the only Spider to start all 32 games last season, and he was second on the team with 14 games of 10 or more points. Walz ranked second in the conference in defensive rebounding percentage (23.5) and fourth in assist rate (27.4), via KenPom and made 46.5 percent (20) of his 43 three-point attempts, the best three-point rate in the A-10 among players to shoot at least 40 threes. Beagle made a team-high 55% of his field goals, 15th in the A-10 among those with at least 100 FG attempts, and ranked second among Spiders with 53 assists.

UR's other two returners with experience are Collin Tanner, who appeared in all 32 games with five starts, and Apostolos Roumoglou, who was Richmond's second-leading rebounder (5.2 PG) and made 11 starts before a knee injury ended his season in early February.

#PROSPIDERS

Two members of last year's team are playing professionally: captain DeLonnie Hunt is with KK Dinamo in Croatia and Academic All-A-10 selection Dusan

Neskovic is with UC Heidelberg in Germany.

At least 15 former Spiders are currently playing professionally, a group that includes 2022 A-10 Championship Most Outstanding Player and NBA veteran Jacob Gilyard (Italy's Pallacanestro Cantu) and UR's No. 2 all-time leading scorer Grant Golden (Spain's Basquet Manresa). During his time at Richmond, Mooney has coached 39 players who went on to professional playing careers.

PRESEASON POSITION

The Spiders placed 10th in the Atlantic 10 Preseason Poll, which was released at A-10 Media Day on September 30.

THE BIG PICTURE

(29 in 2010-11), most conference wins in a season (15 in 2023-24), highest NCAA Tournament seed (7th in 2010), highest NIT seed (1st overall in 2015), and highest A-10 Championship seed (1st in 2024).

In 2024, he was named Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year and NABC District 4 (A-10) Coach of the Year for the first time and a finalist for the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award for the second time (also in 2010) after leading Richmond to a share of the Atlantic 10 regular season title and a 23-10 record.

Mooney has led Richmond to a pair of Atlantic 10 tournament titles (2011 and 2022) and its only A-10 regular season title (2024). He is one of 11 coaches ever to win multiple A-10 tournament titles, and his two A-10 tourney titles are tied for the fifth-most of any coach in conference history. Over the last five seasons (since 2021), the only schools other than Richmond to win both an A-10 regular season and conference tournament title are St. Bonaventure and VCU.

The Spiders have made 10 postseason appearances under Mooney (3 NCAA Tournaments, 4 NITs, 3 CBIs), reached the 2011 Sweet 16 and 2022 NCAA Tournament 2nd Round, and posted eight 20-win seasons, 12 winning seasons, and 14 seasons at .500 or better.

Mooney signed an extension with Richmond during the 2024 offseason. Terms were not disclosed.

VOICE OF THE SPIDERS

For the 43rd straight season, Bob Black is handling play-by-play duties for Spider Men's Basketball broadcasts. Black also hosts an afternoon show on ESPN Richmond, the Spiders radio rights-holder.

In 2023, Black received the Atlantic 10's Bob Vetrone Media Award, which recognizes those whose service, professionalism and commitment have made a lasting contribution to the A-10's student-athletes and institutions. In April 2023, he was also recognized by Richmond Athletics as the recipient of the Distinguished Faculty/Staff Award, and in January 2025 he won the Bill Schwanke Award, presented annually to the top play-by-play broadcaster in FCS football.

Scott Ungerer, a three-year starter for Richmond who began his Spiders career under John Beilein in 1998, will serve as the team's primary color analyst this season, his second in a full-time role with UR.

In addition to doing the ESPN Richmond radio broadcast for all Robins Center games on national TV, Black and Ungerer will anchor the SpiderTV broadcast for all of Richmond's home games on regional TV. Those broadcasts are produced and directed by Richmond Athletics Video Specialist Blake Ellett.

FROM RICHMOND, FOR RICHMOND

Three of this year's Spiders prepped at a Richmond-area high school: Jaden Daughtry (Benedictine & L.C. Bird), Aiden Argabright (John Marshall), and Donovan Richardson (Steward). They are the 9th, 10th, and 11th Richmond players to play for UR under Chris Mooney, who has had a Richmond native on his roster in 19 of his 21 seasons. The last time the Spiders had three Richmond-area players on their roster was 2016-17 (De'Monte Buckingham, ShawnDre Jones, Nick Sherod).

SMALL SCHOOL, BIG CROWDS

Richmond averaged 5,489 fans at home games last season, fourth most in the Atlantic 10 and 83rd across Division I. 2024-25 was the 14th straight season UR has ranked among the top 100 men's basketball programs in average attendance (not including the 2020-21 season when fans weren't permitted).

Last season, Richmond had the highest attendance across Division I (5,489) among schools with a total enrollment of less than 4,000 students, narrowly beating out Siena (5,004 average attendance).

CENTERS OF ATTENTION

A hallmark of Richmond's offense is centers who are playmakers. The Spider offense often runs through the center, with Richmond big men expected to be scorers, rebounders, and distributors – both from the post and from the top of the key. Mike Walz (80) and Jonathan Beagle (53), Richmond's two returning centers, ranked 1-2 on the Spiders in assists last year. It was the seventh and eighth times Richmond has had a player 6'9" or taller register 50 or more assists in a season over the previous six years, three more than any school in Division I. Over that same span, Spider players 6'9" or taller combined for 857 assists, most in the nation.

"SMALL GUARD U"

Another staple of the Spider attack is small guards who can score. 6'0" DeLonnie Hunt was Richmond's leading scorer (15.8 PPG) last season, and 5'10" Mikkel Tyne, now a junior, was UR's third-leading scorer (9.3 PPG). Over the previous six seasons, Spiders 6'0" or shorter have combined for 3,978 points, third most of any school in Division I.

Three of Richmond's top four scorers during Chris Mooney's tenure with the Spiders stood 6'0" or shorter (Kevin Anderson, Jacob Gilyard, Kendall Anthony). That doesn't include 5'10" ShawnDre' Jones, who scored 1,608 points for Richmond from 2013-17 and subsequently coined the term "Small Guard U" to describe UR under Mooney.

WHERE THE SPIDERS DWELL

ROBINS CENTER

Built in 1972 through the generosity of the E. Claiborne Robins family, the Robins Center is in its 54th season as one of the premier small-school college basketball arenas in the nation.

Last season, an average crowd of 5,489 attended Richmond's home games, 83rd best among all Division I schools and the 14th straight year UR has ranked in the top 100 in attendance nationally. Richmond also had the highest attendance among any Division I school with a total enrollment under 4,000 students, edging out Siena (5,044).

In September and October, the arena's video and audio systems were completely redone, with the four corner videoboard and all of the on-court video displays being replaced and the sound system being upgraded and redesigned. In total, more than 2,600 square feet of new videobards were installed in the arena. New scoreboards were also added to the outer walls of the bowl behind each basket.

Also this offseason, the space that was the former men's basketball locker room prior to the construction of the Queally Athletics Center was completely renovated. This new courtside space will be used for pregame, halftime, and postgame team meetings for Spider basketball on game days.

The playing surface in the Robins Center is named Dick Tarrant Court after the legendary Spiders coach who led Richmond to its first five NCAA Tournament appearances.

The facility is much more than a basketball arena, however. The Robins Center has been home to addresses by world leaders, University commencements, WTA Tour events, track competitions, water polo matches, concerts, a 1992 Presidential Debate, and more.

QUEALLY ATHLETICS CENTER

The Queally Athletics Center is the everyday home of Spiders basketball.

Opened in October 2020, the \$15 million practice facility's centerpiece is Breed Family Practice Court. The gym includes a replica of the Robins Center court plus two additional half-courts and two more retractable baskets on the sidelines of the main court, for a total of six in the facility. Next to the court is a 20-seat theater that allows for instant review of practice film and diagramming of offensive and defensive schemes.

The Boggs Strength and Conditioning Room, used exclusively by the men's and women's basketball teams, abuts the court's endline and is separated only by a pair of see-through retractable overhead doors. A six-table Sports Medicine suite, a hydrotherapy room with two pools, and the Bugg Fueling Station all border the strength and conditioning area and form the Ball Family Training Center.

Locker rooms and lounges for the men's and women's teams are also located on the ground floor, while the second floor includes Spider Hall, the main entrance to the Queally Athletics Center. The space features a giant video board as well as entrances to Millhiser Gymnasium and the University's Student Well-Being Center, which are both adjacent to the QAC.

Head coach Chris Mooney believes that the facility has a tremendous impact on his team. "The Queally Athletics Center has transformed our entire basketball program. Our student-athletes utilize the amenities of the physical structure each and every day as prospective Spiders see the facility and anticipate their future at Richmond," said Mooney.

The facility is named for 1986 alumni Paul and Anne-Marie Queally, longtime supporters of the University of Richmond who contributed a \$7.5 million lead gift to launch the fundraising efforts for the center.



MILLHISER GYMNASIUM (MILL-high-zer)

Now in its second century, one of the most historic and celebrated buildings on the University of Richmond campus now houses the Millhiser Student-Athlete Development Center and offices for both the men's basketball and women's basketball staffs.

The newest version of Millhiser Gymnasium opened in fall 2020 as part of the University's construction of the Queally Athletics Center and the Student Well-Being Center. A mezzanine level was installed to provide office suites for Richmond's basketball programs while the first floor, which still includes the historic gymnasium court surface, is the site of the Student-Athlete Development Center. The Center includes study and meeting spaces for student-athletes as well as offices for Richmond Athletics' Academic Services and Leadership Development departments.

Millhiser's entry hall includes a restored classroom that overlooks the Queally Athletic Center's practice court and a recruiting room with end-zone views of Robins Stadium, home of Spider football and lacrosse, as the 2020 renovation re-opened many of Millhiser's iconic arched windows, which had been bricked in for decades.

Millhiser Gymnasium opened in 1921 and was Richmond's home court between 1922 and 1946.

SPIDER BITES

Here's what you really need to know about the 2025-26 Spiders.

For starters, their names are their names. Among Spiders who admitted to having a nickname, nearly all of them were simply their initials or something similar, with two notable exceptions: Bryson McGlothlin will answer to B-Magic, and Will Harper III at times goes by Whoppa.

Like most of Gen Z, this year's Spiders enjoy their screen time. But what they like to watch is as varied as the players themselves. A total of 15 different movies were named when the 16 Spiders were asked to pick their favorite, with only 1995's Friday receiving multiple votes (Aiden Argabright and AJ Lopez). Other 90s classics picked by the Spiders (all of whom were born in the 21st century) include Rudy (Kirby Mooney), Good Will Hunting (Dylan Homenick), and Boyz in the Hood (Collin Tanner). In terms of favorite TV shows, only two received more than one vote: The Office (K. Mooney and Homenick) and Rick and Morty (Argabright and Will Johnston).

There's more agreement about their favorite TV show when they were a child in the pre-streaming days. Six different players named SpongeBob SquarePants, and Phineas and Ferb also earned votes from a pair of international Spiders (Apostolos Roumoglou and Mikkel Tyne).

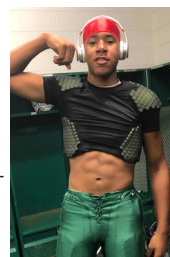
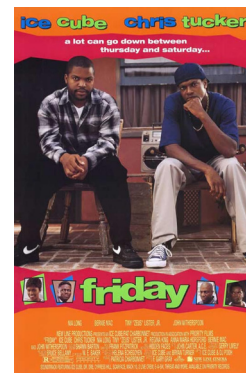
Not surprisingly, basketball is the subject of the Spiders favorite podcasts and their favorite video games. More than half of Richmond's roster picked a basketball-affiliated option when asked to select their favorite podcast. Club 520, the podcast hosted by former NBA player Jeff Teague, was named by five players, while Curious Mike (Michael Porter Jr.'s podcast), Gil's Arena (Gilbert Arenas), Podcast P (Paul George), and Spiders Sound Off (Richmond basketball fan podcast) each earned a vote. When it came to preferred video games, seven players picked NBA 2K as their favorite, narrowly edging out Call of Duty (four players), with a conflicted Bryson McGlothlin splitting his vote between the top two options.



Richmond's two Canadians (Tyne and Homenick) unsurprisingly picked the Toronto Raptors as their favorite NBA team, while DMV products Will Harper III and Donovan Richardson chose the Washington Wizards. But the most popular choice, with four selections, was the Los Angeles Lakers, who play their home games approximately 2,600 miles west of the Robins Center. Perhaps a certain King might have something to do with that, as 10 Spiders picked LeBron James as the NBA's Greatest of All-Time. That includes Jayden Daughtry, who not only chose James but also said his favorite NBA team is simply "LeBron's team."

There's less agreement when the Spiders weigh in on sports other than basketball. No athlete was mentioned by more than two Spiders when the team was asked to pick its favorite non-basketball athlete, with Tiger Woods, Tom Brady, and Lamar Jackson each being named twice. Football was the most popular choice when the team was asked to pick which sport they are best at other than basketball, with Jaden Daughtry, Jaylen Robinson, Bryson McGlothlin, Kirby Mooney, and David Thomas all saying they have skills on the gridiron. Baseball was second with three votes, followed by a variety of sports named by a single Spider each, including volleyball (Apostolos Roumoglou), track (Aiden Argabright), soccer (Mikkel Tyne), rugby (Will Johnston), pickleball (Donovan Richardson), hockey (Dylan Homenick), golf (Mike Walz, a scratch golfer), and cricket (Will Harper III).

Regardless of their skills outside of basketball, it's safe to say that the Spiders feel most comfortable on the hardwood. When representing UR on the court, this year's Spiders opt for Richmond's white jerseys, the preferred uniform of nine current players, more than both blue (five) and red (two) combined.

CHRIS MOONEY

In his first 20 seasons at Richmond, Chris Mooney has led the Spiders to their only two Atlantic 10 tournament championships (2011, 2022), their only Atlantic 10 regular season championship (2024), three NCAA Tournaments, eight 20-win seasons, and 10 postseason appearances while amassing 358 wins, more than any other coach in program history.

Mooney ranks among the longest-tenured and most successful coaches ever in the Atlantic 10. His 21 seasons with the Spiders mark the third-longest tenure by a coach at a single school in conference history (John Chaney - 24 seasons at Temple; Phil Martelli - 24 seasons at Saint Joseph's). In his first 20 seasons at Richmond, Mooney recorded 180 conference wins, tied for the third most in A-10 history, and 358 total wins, third in Atlantic 10 history. Mooney is one of 11 coaches to win multiple A-10 tournament titles, and only four coaches have won more A-10 tournament championships than Mooney's two: John Chaney (6), John Calipari (5), Phil Martelli (3), and Fran Dunphy (3).

In 2024-25, the Spiders featured nine newcomers, the most for Mooney in his 20 seasons at UR, and one returning starter, tied for the fewest the program has had under Mooney. DeLonnie Hunt, Richmond's captain and its sole returning starter, fractured his foot on Jan. 8 and missed the next 15 games. Richmond went 3-12 during that stretch and finished the year 10-22 overall.

The 2023-24 Spiders stormed to the program's first regular season title since joining the Atlantic 10 in 2001, winning a program-record 15 conference games along the way and earning consensus A-10 Coach of the Year honors for Mooney and recognition as a finalist for the Jim Phelan Award, given to the National Coach of the Year. Richmond finished 15-1 at home, its best record in the Robins Center since the arena opened in 1972. Jordan King was named A-10 Co-Player of the Year, First Team All-Conference, and selected to the A-10's All-Academic Team, Dji Bailey was a co-winner of the Chris Daniels Award, given to the A-10's Most Improved Player, and Neal Quinn was named Second Team All-Conference as the Spiders dominated the league's end-of-year honors. Richmond finished the year 23-10, tied for the sixth-most wins in a season in program history.

Mooney's season ended prematurely in 2022-23, when on February 17 he announced that he was stepping away from the program to have heart surgery. At the time of his announcement, the Spiders were 13-14 overall. Mooney underwent a successful procedure to remove an aortic aneurysm at the University of Virginia Medical Center and was back in the office that April.

In 2021-22, Mooney and the Spiders captured the second A-10 title in program history and upset Big Ten champion Iowa in the First Round of the NCAA Tournament. Richmond won four games in four days to win the Atlantic 10 and earned a 12 seed in the Midwest Region of the NCAA Tournament. Days after being named Most Outstanding Player of the A-10 Tournament, Jacob Gilyard led all players with 24 points and six assists as UR defeated the Hawkeyes to secure the sixth trip to the Second Round of the NCAA Tournament in program history. After setting the NCAA Division I career steals record in December, Gilyard was a semifinalist for the Naismith National Defensive Player of the Year, a Lefty Driesell Defensive All-American, and the Virginia State Defensive Player of the Year. In April, he won the Senior CLASS Award as the top senior or graduate student-athlete in NCAA Division I Men's Basketball. Grant Golden finished his Spiders career with the second-most points (2,246), third-most rebounds (1,015), and fourth-most assists (476) in Spiders history.

Mooney and the Spiders posted a 14-9 record in the COVID-shortened 2020-21 season and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NIT. Richmond opened the season by winning the Bluegrass Showcase in Lexington, Ky. The Spiders beat 10th-ranked Kentucky in the final game for the program's first road win ever vs a team in the top 10 of the Associated Press Poll. UR rose as high as 19th in the AP Top 25 during its 4-0 start, the best ranking for the Spiders since December 1957.

In 2019-20, Mooney was on the verge of taking the Spiders to the NCAA Tournament when the postseason was canceled due to COVID-19. The Spiders went 24-7, tying the school record for regular-season wins, and finished second in the Atlantic 10 at 14-4. The Spiders received votes in the AP Top 25 six times, including a season-high six in the final poll of the season.

In 2016-17, the Spiders swept the two major Atlantic 10 awards, with senior T.J. Cline winning A-10 Player of the Year and freshman De'Monte Buckingham earning Rookie of the Year honors. In 2014-15, Richmond was one of the "Last Four Out" of the NCAA Tournament at-large field, thereby securing the No. 1 seed and home-court advantage in the NIT, where they would reach the tournament's quarterfinals.

In 2010-11, Richmond won the A-10 Tournament for UR's first Atlantic 10 title. The Spiders would advance to the second Sweet 16 in program history by downing Vanderbilt and Morehead State in the NCAA Denver Subregional. Richmond finished 29-8, set a school record for wins, and finished 21st in the coaches poll. In 2009-10, Richmond earned its first NCAA bid since 2004, garnering a seven seed before falling in the first round of the tournament. Mooney was named the 2010 Sporting News Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year, and was a finalist for the 2010 Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award. The Spiders finished the season ranked 24th in the final AP Top 25. During those seasons, the Spiders were led by Kevin Anderson, a 2010 Associated Press All-America Honorable Mention and 2010 Atlantic 10 Player of the Year, and Justin Harper, a 2011 Lute Olson All-American and First Team All-Atlantic 10 selection. Harper went on to a 3-year NBA career, making him one of 39 of Mooney's former players who have gone on to play professionally in either the NBA, the G League, or overseas.

Mooney previously coached at Air Force for five seasons: three as an assistant, one as an associate head coach and his final season as head coach. In 2004-05, Mooney led the Falcons to an 18-12 record and votes in the national polls.

Mooney began coaching at the high school level, taking a job at Lansdale Catholic High School in Lansdale, Pa., in 1994. His first college coaching experience came at Division III Beaver College, now known as Arcadia University. Mooney is married to the former Lia Chomat, a Princeton graduate who also has a doctorate in psychology from Penn. The couple has two sons, Danny and Ryan.
