AOKI COLLECTS 600th CAREER COACHING WIN AGAINST VCU

Spiders head coach Mik Aoki collected his 600th career victories over 24 seasons coaching NCAA Division I baseball Saturday, May 10 in the Spiders 6-3 victory over VCU at The Diamond. Aoki is tied for 51st among active coaches with 601 wins. He collected 249 wins over nine seasons at Notre Dame (2010-11 - 2018-19), 114 wins at Boston College (2006-07 - 2009-10), 92 at Morehead State (2019-20 - 2022-23), 87 at Columbia (1998-99 - 2003-04) and 58 currently at the helm of the Richmond program.

SPIDERS VS DAVIDSON

The Davidson Wildcats head to Pitt Field after two-straight A-10 weekend at home at Wilson Field. The 'Cats dropped last weekend's series to George Mason but beat George Washington. DC also has A-10 series wins over St. Bonaventure and UMass with series sweeps of VCU and Fordham. The Wildcats are paced by Cider Canon's .388 batting average with 32 of his 66 hits for extra bases, including 16 home runs and 10 stolen bases. Michael O'Shaughnessy and Eli Putnam both have 15 home runs while O'Shaughnessy has 61 RBI and reached base 22 walks and 20 hit by pitches. Wilson Perkins (6-5) has made 13 starts logging 75.1 innings with 69 strikeouts.

FIVE SPIDERS IN D1BASEBALL WEEK 12 PLAYER RANKINGS

In the week 12 D1Baseball.com player rankings, five Spiders are still making some noise. Led by third baseman Brady O'Brien, who jumped six spots to number 24, first baseman Jordan Jaffe sits at number 40 of 50 nation-wide. Outfielder Phil Bernstein at 119 is joined by Aaron Whitley at 80 in 150 outfielders in NCAA Division I. Ryan Bilka came in at 93 of the nation's top 100 relievers.

SPIDERS SWEEP VCU

In the final meeting between the programs at Richmond landmark The Diamond, Richmond picked up a dominate sweep of Atlantic 10 rival VCU. The Spiders outscored the Rams 32-11, including a 18-6 seven inning run-rule victory to close out the series sweep. The Spiders launched seven home runs over the series, with three each in Friday's and Sunday's contest. After an hour and a half rain delay Friday, Jackson Hinchliffe tossed five scoreless frames, allowing only two hits and two walks while striking out two. Jordan Jaffe went 2-for-3 with a double and a solo home run, while DJ Pacheco had a 3-for-5 day at the plate including a two-run home run in the ninth. Saturday, Brady O'Brien went 4-for-5 with four RBI, with a double and home run to pace the Spider offense as Esteban Rodriguez worked out of trouble going seven innings, while scattering three runs on five hits and two walks with three strikeouts. Ryan Bilka collected his third save of the season in his second appearance of the series (2.0 IP, 4H, 1K). UR collected 18 runs for the third time this season Sunday and a second-straight run-rule get-away day conference victory. VCU got within one in the fourth, 4-3, then it was all Richmond as the Spiders closed out the game on a 14-3 run. Joey Wilga hit a 3-run home run in the 5th, O'Brien tagged his 3-run home run in the 6th and Pacheco launched his 3-run homer in the 7th.

SPIDERS ATOP THE NATION & LEAGUE

Jack Arcamone: 1st A-10 / 11th nationally in doubles (21 total), 6th in the league with 60 RBI, 5th with a .677 slugging percentage, 9th in the A-10 with 126 total bases, and 10th with 56 runs.

Jordan Jaffe: 3rd A-10 with 18 doubles, 5th in the league with 75 hits, 7th with 59 runs, 9th with a .368 batting average, 10th with 60 RBI, 126 total bases, and a .613 slugging percentage.

Aaron Whitley: 13th in the country / 2nd in the A-10 with 34 stolen bases, 19th in the country / 4th in the league with 65 runs, 4th with 17 hit by pitches, 5th in the league as the toughest to strikeout (9.7 at bat per strikeout) and 6th with 17 doubles. Whitley is two stolen bases shy of breaking John Wagler's program record of 35 stolen bases in 41 attempts in the 59 game 1998 season.

Phil Bernstein: In the A-10, he is the fourth toughest to strikeout (every 11.8 at bats).

Brady O'Brien: 9th nationally / 1st in the A-10 with 19 home runs, 7th nationally/1st in the league with a .789 slugging percentage, 13th nationally and 1st A-10 with 150 total bases, 11th nationally, 3rd A-10 with 68 RBI, 3rd with 18 doubles, 8th with a .374 batting average and 71 hits. 16 of his 19 team-leading home runs have come in A-10 games and has four games with at least two home runs, including a three home run game and a two home run game against Fordham.

BILKA'S THROWING FIRE

Relief pitcher Ryan Bilka is 13th in the nation with a 0.92 WHIP and 15th nation with a 2.23 ERA. He's second in the league with a 4.23 strikeout-to-walk ratio. Bilka is also third in the A-10 with a 1.93 walks allowed per nine innings average.

SPIDERS VS THE ATLANTIC 10

Richmond is sixth in the nation with 122 doubles, 12th in the nation with a .318 team batting average and 16th with a .526 slugging percentage. In the Atlantic 10, UR is second with 5.48 ERA and a 1.47 WHIP, and third with 72 home runs and 422 runs. The Spiders are fourth in the league with 535 hits and a 0.412 on base percentage.

SPIDERS SPLIT SEASON SERIES WITH TOWSON

Down 6-0 through four innings, Jordan Jaffe put the Spiders on the board in the fifth with a sacrifice fly, scoring Trevor Dosenbach. Joey Wilga hit a solo blast over the left field wall in the sixth for his second home run of the season. Aaron Whitley got hit by a pitch to lead off the seventh and advanced to second on a wild pitch before scoring on Jaffe's base hit through the infield. Brady O'Brien then tied the game at six-all with a three-run home run, his 17th of the season, that landed in the Spiders visitor bullpen in right field. Spider reliever Dylan Siesky was tagged with the loss after the Tigers scored the eventual game winning run on a Spider miscue in the bottom of the seventh. He went one and two-thirds of an inning allowing two hits, one unearned run, and struck out two.

SPIDERS VS DAYTON

Spiders won the series over the Flyers last weekend in Ohio, taking the first game 9-2 and the series finale 15-2 in seven innings on Sunday. In both victories, the Spiders put up crooked numbers in the middle innings. In the first game, UR starter Jackson Hinchliffe allowed just one run on three hits and two walks in four innings of work before Ryan Bilka tossed five innings of one run on two hits with three strikeouts for his sixth victory of the season. RJ Rickabaugh and Aaron Whitley both went 2-for-4 at the plate with two runs scored. Rickabaugh had two doubles and three RBI while Whitley legged out a triple. Phil Bernstein also had two hits and three RBI as Jordan Jaffe had two hits and two RBI. UR was able to bounce back in the series finale, the second

game of a Sunday doubleheader, to run rule the Flyers as Joey Giordano only allowed one run in his second career start. Giordano went three innings before handing the ball to Chayse Gruber. Gruber allowed only one runner, a hit batter, over four innings of work to collect the win. DJ Pacheco led the way with four RBI and three hits, while Trevor Dosenbach and Jack Arcamone both had three RBI in the victory. Arcamone capped off a two-for-three day with a solo home run in the seventh. Whitley collected his 30th stolen base of the season on a double steal play with Phil Bernstein.

SPIDERS VS SAINT LOUIS

Richmond was able to salvage the Sunday game of the series, getting a combined 6-0 shutout victory performance from Joey Giordano, Chayse Gruber and Tyler Rigot on the mound. Giordano made his first collegiate start, collected his second win of the season and struck out a season-high four in 4.1 innings. Jack Arcamone hit a 3-run home run in the third while Brady O'Brien hit a 2-run shot in the eighth. In the first two games, Richmond scored first but were unable to connect long enough rallies to tie or regain the lead. Jackson Hinchliffe tossed three scoreless to start Friday's contest, before Gruber allowed two and Ryan Bilka gave up four runs over 3.2 innings on nine hits and two walks. O'Brien went 3-for-4 with two home runs and a double to keep the Spiders in the game, but the late rallies fell short. Esteban Rodriguez took the loss after allowing four runs on seven hits, two hit batters and a walk over 5.2 innings.

SPIDERS VS LONGWOOD

Richmond took the season series, 7-1 on a strong pitching staff performance, allowing just one unearned run to Longwood at Buddy Bolding Stadium. After Glenn Smith tossed three scoreless, Sam Young chipped in two more before Jason Shockley tossed an immaculate sixth inning, using just nine pitches to retire the Lancers in order all on strikeouts. Angel Santiago-Cruz and Josh Willitts also tossed scoreless frames. UR got two three-run innings to keep Longwood at bay, first in the second inning using doubles by Jack Arcamone and RJ Rickabaugh plus two Lancer errors to push three runs across. In the eighth, the Spiders again got three runs on two hits, two walks and a hit batter. Phil Bernstein collected his third walk of the game to force in UR's seventh run in the top of the ninth.

SPIDERS VS GEORGE WASHINGTON

UR dropped all three games to GW at Tucker Field in close Atlantic 10 Conference battles, including the Spiders first extra inning game, 4-3 in 14 innings on Friday. Ryan Bilka tossed 5.2 innings in relief, scattering three hits and a walk with five strikeouts. In second game, Esteban Rodriguez got the loss after allowing four runs, three earned, on seven hits, two walks and five strikeouts over 4.1 innings. Aaron Whitley picked up an RBI base hit, pushing in RJ Rickabaugh for the Spiders only run of the game. in the series finale, UR took back the lead with a five-run second, on two two-run home runs by Brady O'Brien and Aaron Whitley. The Spiders dropped the back-and-forth contest, as the Revs got two runs late and held UR from three runners in scoring position to come in.

SPIDERS VS COPPIN STATE

UR used a 12-run third inning to catapult past Coppin State Tuesday for the program's seventh midweek win of the season. Jack Arcamone hit a grand slam, one of the Spiders six hits in the third, for his 10th home run of the season. Brady O'Brien collected his team-leading 12th home run in the fifth, while Grant Kennedy picked up his second long ball, a two-run shot in the eighth to clench the 10-run victory over the Eagles. Jackson Hinchliffe went three innings to collect the victory, scattering two hits, three walks and a hit batter with five strikeouts.

SPIDERS VS MASSACHUSETTS

UR captured the squad's second A-10 series of the season picking up an opening 9-3 victory and the series finale 3-1. In game one, E Esteban Rodriguez overcame allowing three runs, two earned, on two hits and a walk in the first inning to collect his second victory of the season. Rodriguez finished his outing allowing one more hit, two walks and struck out three for a full six innings on the mound. The of the Spiders 13 hits only two were for extra bases as eight of nine Spiders had at least one hit. Phil Bernstein went 3-for-3 with two walks, two runs scored and two RBI. Richmond tied the second game at 5-all, but UMass got to the Spiders relievers and put a 5-spot up in the eighth. Sunday, UMass got one run and left the bases loaded in the first. Seven UR hurlers held them off the board, allowing only one run on four hits, five walks and eight strikeouts. Joey Giordano, making his collegiate debut, scattered a hit and a walk with a strikeout over two innings to collect the victory. Ryan Bilka got the final five outs of the game, picking up two strikeouts to collect his second save of the weekend and season. DJ Pacheco tied the game with a RBI base hit in the second, then gave UR the lead with a solo home run in the fifth.

SPIDERS VS RHODE ISLAND

Spiders took the first game of a Saturday double header 10-5, then dropped game two 1-20. Brady O'Brien picked up four RBI with a double and a two-run home run in game one. Ryan Bilka got the win, now 5-2 on the season, working around three hits and two walks with six strikeouts of five and a third of an inning of scoreless action. Josh Willitts picked up two strikeouts as he retired the side in order in the ninth. In game two, URI built up a 13-run lead when Trevor Dosenbach collected the Spiders first hit of the game in the top of the sixth. He then scored on Jordan Jaffe's double to right center for UR's only run of the contest. Richmond built up a 7-0 lead on the Rams, as opener Dylan Siesky faced one more than the minimum over two innings in his first collegiate start. O'Brien had another four RBI, four hit day with two solo

home runs. URI chipped away at the Spiders lead, but it was a 5-run bottom of the eight that the Spiders couldn't recover from to fall 9-12.

SPIDERS VS FORDHAM

Fordham swept Richmond, as the pitching staffs gave up 28 total home runs over the weekend series. Brady O'Brien hit five himself, three on Saturday and two Sunday. UR had a four run lead after eight, but Fordham scored nine in the top of the ninth to win Friday's game. UR was kept at bay in the second game, playing from behind the whole game as a late rally fell short. In the series finale, the Rams had a big lead most of the game and each time UR put up big innings, they answered with a big rally of their own. The Spiders put up eight runs in the bottom of the ninth, off a solo home run by O'Brien, a three-run pinch hit home run by Joey Wilga and a grand slam from Jack Arcamone. UR had the game tying run at the plate when the game ended.

SIX SPIDERS IN D1BASEBALL WEEK SIX RANKINGS

D1Baseball.com has six Spiders among it's week six player rankings. Jack Arcamone is 25th among the top 50 catchers. At second base, Michael Elko is 28th, while Brady O'Brien is 30th at third and Jordan Jaffe sits at the 33rd best first baseman in the country. Phil Bernstein, who has been out for the last nine games due to injury is ranked as the 90th of the top 100 outfielders in the country. Ryan Bilka was also ranked number 71 of 100 relief pitchers.

SPIDERS VS JAMES MADISON

Richmond defeated James Madison 12-4 (March 25) picking up the program's first win over the Dukes in Harrisonburg since 2022. Took a quick 3-0 lead after a half inning, Grant Kennedy launched his first collegiate home run in the second to put the Spiders up 5-1. Cole Palmeri hit his first home run as a Spider in the third, a three-run 420-foot blast to left to make it 8-1. UR added two insurance runs in the sixth and eighth to put the game out of reach for the Dukes. Gerry Peacock had another strong outing scattering one run on three hits, with a walk and a strikeout. Chayse Gruber picked up his second win of the season, tossing 2.2 innings allowing one run on two hits with a strikeout.

SPIDERS CATCHING SOME LOOKS

Richmond has received votes in back-to-back weekly USA TODAY Baseball Coaches Poll. Last week (March 17), UR tallied five votes and garnered eight votes in last week's poll (March 24).

SPIDERS TAKE SERIES FINALE AT SAINT JOSEPH'S

Saint Joseph's took two of three games, snapping the Spiders 12-game win streak, while Richmond picked up a 12-10 decision on Sunday. Jack Arcamone hit a grand slam in the third inning to put the Spiders up 9-3, picking up his team-leading seventh home run. DJ Pacheco hit a two-run home run in the eighth to give UR a few insurance runs late. In the first two games, the Spiders were unable to keep momentum at the plate to make long rallies. In game one, SJU starter Ciccone held the Spiders to three runs (two earned) on four hits and three walks with 11 strikeouts over eight innings of work.

ELKO NAMED A-10 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Infielder/catcher Michael Elko was named Atlantic 10 Player of the week (March 17) for his first weekly league honor and second for the program this season. The College Station, Texas native made four starts, three behind the plate, as he went 11-for-15 for a .733 batting average. He collected 11 RBI, four doubles, three home runs, three walks, and scored seven runs as he helped the Spiders go 4-0 with a midweek victory over Longwood and an A-10 series sweep over St. Bonaventure. Elko had a three-run home run against Longwood and in the first game Saturday against St. Bonaventure.

WHITLEY NAMED GOLDEN SPIKES PLAYER OF THE WEEK

After tallying multi-hit outings in all four games last week, Aaron Whitley was named USA Baseball's Golden Spikes Award Week 5 Player of the Week presented by Chinook Seedery and DI Baseball. Whitley batted .600 on the week after helping the Spiders secure a 12-2 midweek win over Longwood and series sweep over St. Bonaventure to extend their win streak to 11 games. After going 2-for-4 with a run scored against Longwood, Whitley proceeded to tally 10 hits and 12 RBIs in the series against St. Bonaventure. His weekend at the plate was highlighted by four-hit outings in games two and three. Five of those hits were for extra bases, as he clubbed two homers in game two and hit two doubles and a home run in the series finale.

SPIDERS UPSET No. 23 VIRGINIA

Richmond handed UVA the program's first non-conference midweek loss since 2022, snapping a 31-game win streak with a 6-2 victory in Charlottesville. UR extended its win streak to 12-straight victories, snapped a six-game losing streak at UVA (2018) and collected its first win over a ranked opponent since 2019, defeating #17 Georgia Tech, 7-1. Gerry Peacock (2-0) picked up the win after tossing 4.1 innings of two-hit, one run ball with five strikeouts. UR took a 4-0 lead in the second with a pair of two-out two run doubles, first by Trevor Dosenbach then Jordan Jaffe. UR added a run in the third and a solo home run by DJ Pacheco in the fifth to make it 6-0. UVA got two runs in the fifth and sixth but the UR bullpen locked down the final three frames including Angel Santiago-Cruz picking up his first career save as he got the final out, stranding the bases loaded.

SPIDERS DOMINATE BONNIES

Richmond outscored St. Bonaventure 51-18 over the weekend series at Pitt Field. Friday's 12-0 combined shutout with Esteban Rodriguez and Ryan Bilka was the first shutout for UR since a 2-0 victory over Sacred Heart (March 2, 2024). UR now has 11 victories scoring at least 11 runs on the season. UR's 21 runs against SBU matched the most the program has scored against an A-10 opponent since URI May 11, 2024. Spider bats did not cool down despite the cool and cloudy temps over the weekend series as the squad launched 11 home runs, including four in each Saturday contest. UR also legged out a season-high eight doubles in the first game of the Saturday doubleheader.

ARCAMONE, ELKO HOME RUNS BLAST SPIDERS PAST LANCERS

Richmond took control of the game in the second inning after Jack Arcamone hit a grand slam into the parking lot past the right field wall to extend his hit streak to 12 games and give UR a 6-0 lead. Michael Elko made it 10-1 in the fourth with a three-run home run. Gerry Peacock went 3.1 innings, allowing one unearned run with three strikeouts. Tyler Rigot went 1.2 innings, giving up one hit and striking out four while Angel Santiago-Cruz made his collegiate debut, throwing a scoreless inning with a strikeout. Kellan Heney tossed the seventh, allowing one run and one hit.

SPIDERS TOO MUCH FOR LAFAYETTE

The Spiders outscored the Leopards 25-4 on 25 hits while the pitching staff hold them to 14 hits in 16 innings of action. In the first game, UR used a six run eighth inning to put the game out of reach. Aaron Whitley picked up an RBI base hit before Jordan Jaffe collected a two RBI double. Jack Arcamone then tripled in two more before the sixth run of the frame came in on a sac fly. Jackson Hinchliffe tossed four scoreless frames and struck out four. On Sunday, UR allowed three runs then scored 16 unanswered runs on the Leopards. Michael Elko tallied six RBI, including a bases clearing triple and a two-run home run. Phil Bernstein extended his hit streak to 14 games with two hits and two RBI as he is the 12th hardest to strikeout (26.0 at bats) in the country.

SPIDERS BLAST PAST UMASS LOWELL

Richmond outscored the Riverhawks 23-3 in 15 innings this weekend on 34 hits. Jordan Jaffe spurred the offense on Friday against UML with two home runs, a double and four RBI. Jack Arcamone also went 4-for-5 at the dish while Connor Larson picked up three hits. Esteban Rodriguez got the win after allowing one unearned run on three hits and five strikeouts in five innings. On Saturday, Larson picked up three more hits while DJ Pacheco hit in four and Jaffe had three RBI. Chase Topolski went four innings, allowing two runs on five hits, a walk and a hit batter with two strikeouts. Dylan Siesky made his season debut with a scoreless frame, walking one and striking out two to get the win. Glenn Smith got his first career save after three scoreless frames, giving up just one hit and striking out one.

REINKE COLLECTS A-10 PITCHER OF THE WEEK HONORS

Tuesday (March 4) relief pitcher Brian Reinke was named Atlantic 10 Conference Pitcher of the Week, his second of his career and first for the program in 2025. Reinke went 2-0 in two relief appearances over 7.2 innings of work, allowing only one hit and striking out seven. He picked up the win at NC State (Feb. 25) after tossing four and a third of an inning, striking out four. Against Toledo (Mar. 2), he allowed one hit then retired eight straight including three strikeouts.

SPIDERS SHUTDOWN TOWSON

The Spiders scored in five of six innings at the plate against seven Towson pitchers. Brady O'Brien paced the Spiders with a two-for-three day at the plate with, two walks, a double, a two-run home run and four RBI. Connor Larson went three-for-three with two doubles, as eight of nine Spiders in the starting line-up picked up at least one hit against the Tigers. Towson got single runs in the first and second off UR starter Gerry Peacock. He allowed two runs on four hits, a walk and a hit batter, while striking out two. Chase Topolski took over and tossed four scoreless frames, allowing one hit and hitting one batter while striking out one. Kellan Heney tossed the seventh, allowing one run on three hits and striking out two.

SPIDERS FALL TO PENN STATE

Richmond stumbled against Penn State Friday in the Central Virginia Challenge, falling 17-6 in seven innings. PSU got to Spider starter Esteban Rodriguez, forcing him out after an inning plus of work, allowing four runs, three earned on three hits, two walks and two hit batters. Jordan Jaffe collected three RBI and scored two runs including a two-run home run, while Jack Arcamone also went three-for-four at the plate.

ARCAMONE, BILKA POWER SPIDERS PAST BOSTON COLLEGE

After BC got a run off UR starter Chase Topolski on two hits, it was all Richmond. Ryan Bilka took over on the mound in the second and kept the Eagles off the scoreboard for five innings, working around two hits and striking out five to pick up his second victory of the year. Jordan Jaffe brought in Aaron Whitley from second with an RBI base hit through the infield in the first. In the second, a sacrifice fly by Aidan O'Keefe gave the Spiders a lead they never let go of. Connor Larson had a strong day at the plate. He led off the third with a double, took third on a Whitley fly out and scored on a wild pitch. With two outs and two on via walks, Jack Arcamone hit a three-run home run to push the Spiders lead out to 6-1, for his third home run of the season. Richmond tacked on single runs in the fourth as Phil Bernstein brought in Whitley to extend

his hit streak to eight games. In his first start in left field, Grant Kennedy got his first hit in the second, then followed it up with his first RBI double in the fifth.

SPIDER ARMS STIFLE TOLEDO OFFENSE

Richmond wrapped up the Central Virginia Challenge with a 5-1 victory over Toledo Sunday. Phil Bernstein doubled to extend his hit streak to nine games then scored on Brady O'Brien's base hit in the first. The Rockets only run came in the second, a solo home run off starter Jackson Hinchliffe. Brian Reinke took over on the mound in the fourth and tossed three and a third of an inning of scoreless action. Toledo got one hit off Reinke, then he retired eight straight, including three strikeouts to collect the victory. UR got two runs on three hits, a walk and a Toledo error in the second to take a 3-1 lead. UR added insurance runs in the sixth and seventh. Chayse Gruber tossed the final two and two-thirds of an inning, allowing only one runner to reach on an error, for Richmond.

SPIDER PITCHERS DOMINATE NC STATE

NC State got a run in the first and that was it Tuesday at Doak Field as the Spiders defeated the Wolfpack 5-1. It was the fourth-straight victory for UR in Raleigh and first since the 2014 season. Brian Reinke (1-0) took over in the third and retired the next 13 Wolfpack batters, striking out four over four and a third of an inning. UR tied the game in the third on a Jack Arcamone RBI hit to score Jordan Jaffe. UR bats came alive in the seventh, scoring four runs with two outs. Jaffe hit a three-run home run as Arcamone followed with a solo shot to put the game out of reach. Chayse Gruber took over for Reinke and tossed 2.2 innings with five strikeouts and one walk to close out the win.

SPIDERS TAKES SERIES FROM STAGS

Richmond picked up the series win after taking game one 2-1 (seven innings) of the Sunday doubleheader before Fairfield snagged game two 6-3. UR came back from a 9-1 deficit in the series finale Monday to collect a 11-10 win. Joey Wilga collected his second pinch-hit walk off victory in game one, powering the ball into short right center. Monday, UR hurlers Jason Shockley and Tyler Rigot slammed the door on Stag batters, combining for five scoreless innings over seven innings of relief. Outfielder Phil Bernstein extended his hitting streak to five games as he led the team with six hits, two walks, a home run, three RBI and two stolen bases against Fairfield. Aaron Whitley launched two solo home runs to left field in game three.

SPIDERS PICK UP ROAD WIN OVER TRIBE

Richmond collected the program's first win in Williamsburg Tuesday (Feb. 18) at Plumeri Park, 12-3, since 2011. The Spiders jumped on the Tribe pitching staff early and often, led by Jordan Jaffe's three doubles in a four-hit, four runs scored day. Phil Bernstein also went 4-for-4 with two RBI and three runs scored. Aidan O'Keefe tallied three hits with three RBI while Brady O'Brien chipped in two hits and two RBI. Rookie Glenn Smith picked up his first collegiate victory, tossing two scoreless innings after working around three hits and striking out two. Ryan Bilka struck out four and allowed one hit in his two innings of scoreless work while Dane Armson retired the Tribe in order with two strikeouts.

SEASON OPENING SERIES SWEEP VS NAVY

Richmond came from behind to take the Opening Day doubleheader, both by a score of 2-1. In game one, Aidan O'Keefe sent a bloop single into rightfield to score Brady O'Brien in the ninth for the win. Jordan Jaffe legged out a two-RBI triple down the right field line in the bottom of the sixth in game two. In the series finale, Jaffe put the Spiders out in front from the start with a two-run home run in the first inning. Richmond scored five runs in the sixth, including RBI singles by Joey Wilga and Aaron Whitley to put the game out of reach of the Midshipmen.

GOTTA EARN IT

Coming off a second-place finish in the 2024 Atlantic 10 Tournament, Richmond baseball has been picked to finish atop the league, along with VCU, in 2025. The Spiders received 125 points and one first-place vote in the annual league-wide coaches preseason poll, the conference announced Feb. 12. The Spiders and crosstown rival VCU tied with 125 points, while the Rams collected four first-place votes to the Spiders one. Saint Louis landed in third one point off with five first-place votes, while George Washington (104 points) and Davidson (80 points) both collected one first-place vote to land in fourth and fifth, respectively. Dayton (75 points), Rhode Island (71) and Saint Joseph's (66) land in sixth, seventh and eighth. George Mason (58), Massachusetts (44), Fordham (35) and St. Bonaventure (29) round out the league.

PRESEASON LOVE

Senior pitcher Esteban Rodriguez and graduate centerfielder Aaron Whitley were both named to D1Baseball.com's preseason top 150 player ranking lists for their respective positions. Rodriguez landed at 119th among the nation's top pitchers while Whitley was 78th among outfielders. The site also picked the Spiders to take the A-10 title.

Aoki joined Richmond in June 2023, bringing more than 20 years of head coaching experience and over 500 career wins to the Spiders.

Aoki led the Spiders to a 27-32 record and 13-11 conference record in his first season at the helm of the program in 2024. UR clinched an Atlantic 10 Conference Championship tournament berth and as the four seed made it to the Championship Finals, going 3-2, suffering both losses to crosstown rival VCU. In the team's three postseason victories, the squad defeated George Washington 12-4, top-seeded Saint Louis 13-10, and Saint Joseph's 14-6.

Against Atlantic 10 opponents, the Spiders won four series in 2024, including a series sweep of George Washington at Pitt Field, and captured a victory against every A-10 opponent avoiding being swept. In the second game against George Mason, the Spiders came back from a 15-run deficit to collect a 17-16 extra innings walk off victory.

Spider starting pitcher Kyle Roche finished the season allowing just four walks, two during the regular season and two in the A-10 Tournament in 86.2 total innings on the hill. Roche led the nation averaging 18.0 strikeouts to every walk surrendered and 0.42 walks allowed per nine innings pitched.

Six different Spiders collected hardware in 2024. Brian Reinke (pitcher), Aidan O'Keefe (rookie) and Aaron Whitley (player) all collected weekly A-10 regular season honors. Esteban Rodriguez was named to the A-10 Second Team, while Jackson Hinchliffe picked up Rookie Team honors and Whitley was named A-10 Defensive Player of the Year. Phil Bernstein was named to the A-10 All-Academic and to the Jewish Baseball News All-America teams.

He came to UR from Morehead State, where in 2023 he guided the Eagles to a 36-20 record and the outright Ohio Valley Conference regular season title, the first for the program since 1979. Morehead State's 36 wins were tied for fourth-most in school history and marked the third straight year the Eagles increased their win total from the previous season.

Aoki served as the head coach at Notre Dame for nine seasons from 2010-19, when he oversaw the program's transition from the

Big East to the Atlantic Coast Conference. In their final Big East season in 2013, Aoki guided Notre Dame to a 34-24 record and a runner-up finish in the Big East Tournament. In the program's second ACC season in 2015, the Irish finished 37-23 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006.

Aoki spent seven seasons at Boston College as both an assistant and head coach, leading BC to some of the most successful seasons in program history. In 2009 — the third of Aoki's four seasons as head coach — the Eagles won 34 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1967. From 2004 to 2006, Aoki served as BC's pitching coach. He helped BC to a program-record 37 wins in 2005 and had six Eagles pitchers drafted by MLB clubs.

Aoki's first collegiate head coaching position was at Columbia from 1999 to 2003. Aoki led the Lions to 20 wins in 2001, their first 20-win season since 1987. The Lions reached 20 wins again in 2002 and 2003, compiling the second-longest string of 20-win seasons in school history at the time.

Everywhere he's coached, Aoki has demonstrated an ability to develop future professional players. More than 55 of his players have been selected in the MLB Draft, and 15 have gone on to reach the major leagues.

Aoki's teams have also performed in the classroom, posting a program GPA of 3.0 or better every year from 2012 to 2021. In 2018 and 2019, his Notre Dame teams received "The Trophy," an award given to the Irish team most committed to community service.

Aoki earned a Bachelor's degree from Davidson College in 1990 and a Master's degree from Ohio University in 1994. He and his wife Sue have three children, son Kai, and daughters, Bryn and Reese.

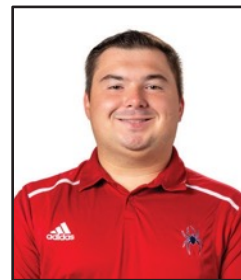
