Richmond opens the 2026 season hosting Monmouth at Pitt Field, shaking off the snow and cold weather that kept many preseason practices indoors or at Robins Stadium.

UP NEXT

UR will take a quick trip south to No. 11 North Carolina for a 4 PM match up on Tuesday, Feb. 17 on ACCNX before returning to Pitt Field to host James Madison Wednesday, Feb. 18 on ESPN+ with a 1:30 PM first pitch. The Spiders welcome Penn State for a four-game weekend beginning Feb. 20 at 1 PM.

SPIDERS VS MONMOUTH

The Monmouth Hawks head south for the first time since the 2019 season, when the game was called in the 13th inning due to darkness. The Hawks finished the 2025 season 24-30 and 10-17 in the CAA, missing out on the conference tournament. Monmouth is led by Preseason All-CAA honorees Ryan Mealy and Chris Walsh. Mealy, Preseason All-CAA, takes to the mound after a 5-2 showing on the hill, finishing with a 3.56 ERA in 68.1 innings of work. Walsh, an infielder and designated hitter, kept a sophomore slump at bay hitting .306 with 42 runs scored and 23 RBI for Preseason All-CAA Honorable Mention accolades.

NEW LOOK SPIDERS

Richmond reloaded for the 2026 season, adding 15 freshmen and eight graduate students to 16 returners. The Spiders return just one starter, utility man Michael Elko who saw action at second and behind the plate last season. UR had five student-athletes transfer, including Ryan Bilka (UMiami), Jack Arcamone (Georgia), and Jordan Jaffe (Liberty), and 15 graduate, including infielder Brady O'Brien (UDFA, Mariners), outfielders Phil Bernstein, Aaron Whitley and DJ Pacheco and pitchers Brian Reinke, Tyler Rigot (BananaBall) and Esteban Rodriguez.

RETURN-DERS

The weekend starting rotation has two sophomores and a junior, but all three have impactful experience as relievers and starters in their short time at Richmond. Jackson Hinchliffe tossed two one-run innings in the Spiders win over NC State (Feb. 25) and collected five scoreless frames in a 8-2 victory over VCU (May 9). Lefty Joey Giordano jumped into the rotation right as the Atlantic 10 Conference action started last season after being cleared from Tommy John surgery in his senior prep season. Glenn Smith tossed 19-plus innings over 13 appearances in his rookie season, including earning a save after a three-inning scoreless outing against UMass Lowell (Mar. 3). They join senior hurlers Chase Topolski and Chayse Gruber, sophomores Sam Young, Angel Santiago-Cruz and Paul Witkop as well as junior Kellen Heney.

POSITION PLAYERS READY TO GO

While Michael Elko is the only returning starter, the position players do not lack experience. Senior Infielder Aiden O'Keefe has seen action at second and third, as well as PJ Hughes who is more of a middle infielder. Sophomores Trevor Doesenbach and Grant Kennedy filled in for UR giants DJ Pacheco and Phil Bernstein last year and were both speedy options on the base paths. Catcher RJ Rickabaugh will also see action behind the plate for the Spiders after platooning with Jack Arcamone (Georgia) and battling injuries last season.

MEET THE GRAD GUYS

Eight graduate transfers will jump to make a big impact on the squad. In the outfield, speedy RJ Johnson Jr. will take over duties in centerfield after two years at Rutgers. Canadian Mateo Zeppereli will also look to strengthen the corner outfield, joining the squad from Mount St. Mary's. Two-way guy Khristopher Morris (UNCW) will toe the rubber and take reps as a corner infielder, while Sean Scanlon (Holy Cross) will battle for playing time at first with Ryan Recio (VCU/Webber International). Catcher Dylan Winebrenner (Salisbury) will guide the pitching staff, including right-handed pitchers Justin Gay (FAU) and Bijan Anvar (Franklin & Marshall). They join current graduate student-athletes right-handed pitchers Dylan Siesky and Mauricio Rodriguez who are both coming off Tommy John rehab stints.

FRESH FACE SPIDERS

Among the 15 true freshmen student-athletes, there is one catcher, one infielder, two outfielders, two infielder/ right-handed pitchers, five right-handed pitchers and three left-handed pitchers and all of them are competing for playing time in the starting line-up. Middle infielders Noah Haight (Arlington, Va.) and Noah Harvey (Cinnaminson, N.J.) have been battling for action at short stop while backstop Joe Crenshaw (Atlanta, Ga.) is grinding with upperclassmen for time. Chris Schaller (Garnet Valley, Pa.) and Reid Downs (Virginia Beach, Va.) look to make an impact whether on the base paths or when patrolling the outfield. The nine pitchers will get their chance to toe the mound early and in impactful situations for pitching coach Josh Epstein.

D1BASEBALL & PERFECT GAME PREDICTIONS

D1Baseball.com has predicted that the Spiders will finish in seventh, just behind crosstown rival VCU. At the time of publishing, the Atlantic 10 Conference Preseason Coaches Poll has not been released. Perfect Game named Michel Elko as a preseason A-10 All-Conference member while rookie Noah Haight garnered preseason all-rookie honors.

AOKI COLLECTED 600th CAREER COACHING WIN AGAINST VCU

Spiders head coach Mik Aoki collected his 600th career victory over 24 seasons coaching NCAA Division I baseball Saturday, May 10 in the Spiders 6-3 victory over VCU at The Diamond. Aoki is 50th among active coaches with 602 wins. He collected 249 wins over nine seasons at Notre Dame (2010-11 - 2018-19), 114 wins at Boston College (2006-07 - 2009-10), 92 at Morehead State (2019-20 - 2022-23), 87 at Columbia (1998-99 - 2003-04) and 60 currently at the helm of the Richmond program.

ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT

The 2026 installment of the A-10 Tournament will be a six-team affair May 20-23 at Capital One Park in Tysons, Virginia. UR missed competing in the 2025 Tournament by one game, edged out by Dayton due to tiebreakers. Rhode Island won the regular and tournament titles and represented the league in the Baton Rouge Regional. UR was second in the league in average (.316), led in slugging (.528) and fielding percentage (.976). The pitching staff allowed the fewest runs (316), doubles (71), triples (4) and walks (208).

Aoki joined Richmond in June 2023, bringing more than 20 years of head coaching experience and over 500 career wins to the Spiders.

In his second season, Aoki led Richmond to the program's first 33-win season since 2004 when Richmond Hall of Fame coach Ron Aktins was at the helm. UR went 3-0 against ACC teams, with wins over NC State, nationally ranked Virginia and Boston College. Aoki guided third baseman Brady O'Brien to an All-American season as well as a Dick Howser Award watch list member.

Aoki led the Spiders to a 27-32 record and 13-11 conference record in his first season at the helm of the program in 2024. UR clinched an Atlantic 10 Conference Championship tournament berth and as the four seed made it to the Championship Finals, going 3-2, suffering both losses to crosstown rival VCU. In the team's three postseason victories, the squad defeated George Washington 12-4, top-seeded Saint Louis 13-10, and Saint Joseph's 14-6.

Against Atlantic 10 opponents, the Spiders won four series in 2024, including a series sweep of George Washington at Pitt Field, and captured a victory against every A-10 opponent avoiding being swept. In the second game against George Mason, the Spiders came back from a 15-run deficit to collect a 17-16 extra innings walk off victory.

Spider starting pitcher Kyle Roche finished the season allowing just four walks, two during the regular season and two in the A-10 Tournament in 86.2 total innings on the hill. Roche led the nation averaging 18.0 strikeouts to every walk surrendered and 0.42 walks allowed per nine innings pitched.

Six different Spiders collected hardware in 2024. Brian Reinke (pitcher), Aidan O'Keefe (rookie) and Aaron Whitley (player) all collected weekly A-10 regular season honors. Esteban Rodriguez was named to the A-10 Second Team, while Jackson Hinchliffe picked up Rookie Team honors and Whitley was named A-10 Defensive Player of the Year. Phil Bernstein was named to the A-10 All-Academic and to the Jewish Baseball News All-America teams.

He came to UR from Morehead State, where in 2023 he guided the Eagles to a 36-20 record and the outright Ohio Valley Conference

regular season title, the first for the program since 1979. Morehead State's 36 wins were tied for fourth-most in school history and marked the third straight year the Eagles increased their win total from the previous season.

Aoki served as the head coach at Notre Dame for nine seasons from 2010-19, when he oversaw the program's transition from the Big East to the Atlantic Coast Conference. In their final Big East season in 2013, Aoki guided Notre Dame to a 34-24 record and a runner-up finish in the Big East Tournament. In the program's second ACC season in 2015, the Irish finished 37-23 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006.

Aoki spent seven seasons at Boston College as both an assistant and head coach, leading BC to some of the most successful seasons in program history. In 2009 — the third of Aoki's four seasons as head coach — the Eagles won 34 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1967. From 2004 to 2006, Aoki served as BC's pitching coach. He helped BC to a program-record 37 wins in 2005 and had six Eagles pitchers drafted by MLB clubs.

Aoki's first collegiate head coaching position was at Columbia from 1999 to 2003. Aoki led the Lions to 20 wins in 2001, their first 20-win season since 1987. The Lions reached 20 wins again in 2002 and 2003, compiling the second-longest string of 20-win seasons in school history at the time.

Everywhere he's coached, Aoki has demonstrated an ability to develop future professional players. More than 55 of his players have been selected in the MLB Draft, and 15 have gone on to reach the major leagues.

Aoki's teams have also performed in the classroom, posting a program GPA of 3.0 or better every year from 2012 to 2021. In 2018 and 2019, his Notre Dame teams received "The Trophy," an award given to the Irish team most committed to community service.

Aoki earned a Bachelor's degree from Davidson College in 1990 and a Master's degree from Ohio University in 1994. He and his wife Sue have three children, son Kai, and daughters, Bryn and Reese.

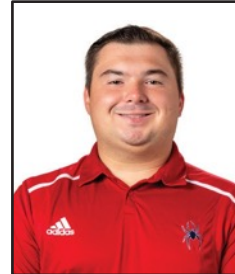

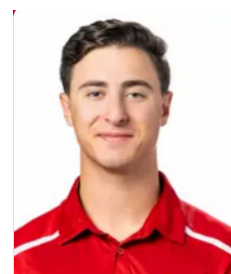
