

### GAME NOTES

- No. 8 Richmond hosts No. 13 Virginia for the 13th all-time meeting between the in-state foes. The 2026 matchup marks the first time Richmond enters the game as the higher-ranked team.
- The contest is Richmond's first this season against a ranked opponent. The Spiders are 14-40 all-time against top-20 teams.
- Saturday's game features five players named to the Tewaaraton Award Watch List this week: Richmond's Aidan O'Neil (attack), Hunter Smith (defense) and Jack Pilling (SSDM), along with Virginia's McCabe Millon (attack) and John Schroter (defense). Richmond is one of seven programs with three or more players recognized, joining Ohio State, North Carolina, Duke, Cornell, Syracuse (4) and Maryland (4).
- Both teams also feature a set of brothers, with Richmond's senior Aidan O'Neil and sophomore Evan O'Neil, while Virginia counters with junior McCabe Millon and freshman Brendan Millon. The O'Neils have yet to record an assist on one another's goals, while the Millon brothers connected on Virginia's third goal of the season opener against Colgate, with Brendan assisting McCabe.

### SERIES NOTES

- Richmond is 2-10 all-time against Virginia and most recently defeated the Cavaliers on the road, 13-10, in 2025. The victory marked Richmond's first win over Virginia in Charlottesville and its first win against a ranked opponent since 2022 — the same year the Spiders beat Virginia for the first time, 17-13, at Robins Stadium. The 2022 win snapped a seven-game skid against the Cavaliers.
- The Spiders and Cavaliers first met in 2014 during Richmond's inaugural game as a program, when then-No. 7 Virginia escaped the Spiders, 13-12, in front of a program-record crowd of 4,249 fans.
- The series is tied 2-2 in regular-season meetings since 2022. The teams also faced met in the First Round of the 2023 NCAA Tournament, where Virginia earned a 17-8 victory and went on to make a Final Four Appearance.

### SEASON NOTES

- 2026 marks the program's 13th season, all of which have come under the direction of Head Coach Dan Chemotti and Associate Head Coach/Defensive Coordinator Paul Richards. Together, the pair has amassed an 119-67 record, six conference titles and six NCAA Tournament appearances.

**SEASON NOTES, CONT.**

- Richmond returns six starters from its 2025 Quarterfinals team in attackmen Aidan O'Neil, Lucas Littlejohn and Jack Ricciardi, as well as midfielder Joe Sheridan and close defensemen Michael Farrell and Hunter Smith.
- Richmond's No. 9 (Inside Lacrosse, USILA) and No. 10 (USA Lacrosse Magazine) rankings are the highest-ever preseason rankings in program history and mark the first time Richmond has been a preseason top-10 team.
- The Spiders return seven of their top-10 points leaders from a year ago, including four of the top five in Lucas Littlejohn (40g, 13a, 53pts.), Aidan O'Neil (29g, 22a, 51pts.), Joe Sheridan (30g, 10a, 40pts.) and Gavin Creo (19g, 8a, 27pts.).
- Richmond goalie Connor Knight, who redshirted in 2025, will be Richmond's starter in goal during the 2026 campaign. He opened the season with 10 saves against Robert Morris.
- Richmond returns defending Atlantic 10 Players of the Year and All-Americans in Aidan O'Neil (offensive) and Hunter Smith (defensive), along with Atlantic 10 Tournament MVP Joe Sheridan and Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year Dan Chemotti.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT**

- Richmond saw high production out of a trio of freshmen in its season opener against Robert Morris, including faceoff athlete Vincent Gaylord and midfielders Tanner Huber and Cole Hayden. Huber (3 goals) and Hayden (2 assists) combined for five points in their collegiate debuts, with Hayden assisting Huber on his third goal to secure the hat trick in his first career game. At the faceoff stripe, Gaylord went 0-for-4 on his first four attempts before settling in and going 15-for-20 the rest of the way, putting together streaks of five and three consecutive wins that corresponded with Richmond scoring runs.

**SMITH PICKS UP A-10 DPOW**

- Senior defenseman Hunter Smith was named Atlantic 10 Defensive Player of the Week after a career-best performance in Richmond's 17-7 season-opening win over Robert Morris. One of the nation's elite cover defensemen, Smith's impact is often felt more in the opportunities he erases than the statistics he amasses

for himself, as he is routinely tasked with shutting down opponents' top attackmen. While those contributions don't always appear on the stat sheet, Saturday proved an exception. Smith paired his lockdown defense with tangible production, recording a career-high four caused turnovers and doubled his previous career-high in ground balls with eight. Behind Smith, Richmond limited Robert Morris to 28 total shots, including just 17 on goal. The Spiders were especially dominant in the second and third quarters, allowing only four combined shots on cage — two in each period.

- Dan Chemotti was named 2025 Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year after leading Richmond to the most successful season in program history. Richmond finished 14-3 overall and went a perfect 5-0 in Atlantic 10 play to win its first-ever A-10 regular-season title and captured its second A-10 tournament championship in three years.
- Richmond earned its first NCAA Tournament victory with a 13-10 upset of No. 8 North Carolina in Chapel Hill.
- The Spiders climbed as high as No. 5 in the national polls, the highest ranking in program history.

- Eight Richmond players earned All-America honors and the Spiders claimed five of the six Atlantic 10 postseason major awards, including

#### BREAKING THROUGH

- In 2025, Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year Dan Chemotti guided Richmond to the most successful season in program history. The Spiders posted a program-record 14-3 overall record and went a perfect 5-0 in Atlantic 10 play to secure the program's first-ever A-10 regular-season title, along with its second conference tournament championship in three years. Richmond earned its first NCAA Tournament victory with a 13-10 upset of No. 8 North Carolina in Chapel Hill and climbed as high as No. 5 in the national polls, the highest ranking in program history. The Spiders were one of only two teams in the 2025 NCAA Tournament — alongside two-time defending champion Notre Dame — to rank in the national top 10 in both scoring offense and scoring defense. Richmond also established a program record with a nine-game winning streak and defeated four nationally ranked opponents — the most in a single season — including No. 7 Virginia, No. 13 Georgetown, No. 19 UMass, and No. 17 Saint Joseph's. The Spiders' only loss by more than one goal came in the season opener at Maryland, while they dropped one-goal decisions to Cornell and pushed Duke to double overtime.

#### IRON SHARPENS IRON

- As they say, "to be the best, you've got to play the best," and the Spiders have

never taken the easy way out when it comes to scheduling, having played at least three ranked opponents each season, excluding 2016 when they played two. Richmond is 14-36 all-time in program history against top 20 opponents. Richmond's 14 wins over ranked opponents have come in 2025 (5 times), 2022 (2 times) 2019 (2 times), 2018, 2017 (3 times) and 2016. The highest-ranked opponent Richmond has ever beaten came in 2022 when it knocked off No. 2 Virginia at Robins Stadium. The highest-ranked opponent the Spiders have defeated on the road has been No. 7 three times - Virginia in 2025, North Carolina in 2017 and Duke in 2016. Richmond will face nine opponents ranked or receiving votes in the preseason polls in 2026 in Maryland, Virginia, Cornell and Georgetown, Saint Joseph's, Delaware, High Point, Robert Morris and UMass.

#### ROCKING ROBINS STADIUM

- The Spiders ranked among the nation's top 15 programs in both average and cumulative home attendance in 2024 and 2025. Richmond averaged 2,488 fans per game over the last two seasons. The two largest crowds in program history both came against Virginia, led by a record attendance of 4,249 fans on Feb. 8, 2014, for the program's inaugural game. The second-largest crowd followed in 2024 against Virginia, when 4,012 fans packed the stands at Robins Stadium.

#### RICHMOND'S IRON MEN

- Seniors attackman Aidan O'Neil and defenseman Hunter Smith have started every game of their collegiate careers, with both Spiders having started and

appeared in 50 games entering the 2026 season.

#### KNIGHT IN CAGE

- Goalie Connor Knight returns to the lineup in 2026 after redshirting last season behind 2025 Atlantic 10 Goalie of the Year and All-American Zach Vigue. Prior to the start of the 2025 season, Knight had appeared in nine career games, posting a 9.38 GAA and a .500 save percentage. He has made one career start — the 2024 season opener at Maryland — where he recorded 10 saves in the 12-11 2OT.

#### NEW FACE ON STAFF

- Conor Whipple joined the Richmond coaching staff in August of 2025 and will work with the Spiders' offense and man-up units while running the substitution box during games. Whipple brings a high-level playing pedigree and a proven coaching résumé, most recently helping guide RIT to back-to-back NCAA Division III Final Four appearances, including a trip to the 2024 National Championship. Prior to RIT, he spent five seasons on the coaching staff at Bucknell, serving as the face-off coordinator before taking on offensive and recruiting coordinator duties, where he helped develop a top-20 extra-man offense. As a player, Whipple enjoyed a standout career at the University of Tampa where he played for his father, Rory Whipple, the all-time winningest coach in NCAA Division II men's lacrosse history.

#### WAY TO REPRESENT

- Attackman Lucas Littlejohn (Canada) and two-way midfielder Charlie Packard (U.S.) Represented their home countries in the World Lacrosse U20 Championships this past summer in Jeju Island, Korea. The pair met in the gold medal game where Littlejohn and Team Canada team beat the U.S., 6-5.

**THINKING INSIDE THE BOX**

- Lucas Littlejohn had a standout box season over the summer for the Whitby Warriors of the Ontario Junior Lacrosse League. He led the OJLL in both goals (67) and assists (111) en route to winning the The Green Gael Trophy as the league's Most Valuable Player.

**WORLD TRAVELERS**

- Shortly after the conclusion of the 2025 season, the Spiders traveled to Portugal and Spain for a team trip. The program immersed itself in local culture while kayaking, zip-lining, taking a cooking lesson, learning to surf and competing in two exhibition games against Scotland's national team. The trip marked the first time Head Coach Dan Chemotti led one of his teams on an international tour. Under NCAA regulations, programs are permitted to take an international summer trip once every four years.

# DAN CHEMOTTI

**HEAD COACH | 13TH SEASON | DUKE '02 | 118-67 (.637)**

Dan Chemotti enters his 13th season as head coach of the University of Richmond men's lacrosse program in 2026, continuing a tenure that has defined the program since its inception. Hired in 2012, Chemotti is the program's first and only head coach and has overseen its development from a first-year Division I team into a nationally recognized contender.

Chemotti has guided Richmond to six NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2018, 2019, 2022, 2023, 2025) within the program's first 12 seasons, including conference tournament championships in three different leagues (Atlantic Sun, Southern Conference, Atlantic 10). Under his leadership, the Spiders have won five regular-season conference titles and reached the conference championship game in every season of program existence and has produced 17 All-Americans during his tenure.

Entering 2026, Chemotti has compiled a 118-67 (.637) career record at Richmond, including nine seasons with double-digit wins. The Spiders have won more than 80 percent of their conference games all-time (54-12) and earned the program's 100th victory on March 30, 2024.

The 2025 season marked the most successful campaign in program history. Richmond finished 14-3 overall and went a perfect 5-0 in Atlantic 10 play to secure its first A-10 regular-season title and a second conference tournament championship in three years. The Spiders earned their first NCAA Tournament victory with a 13-10 upset of No. 8 North Carolina on the road and reached a program-high national ranking of No. 5. Richmond finished the season ranked in the top 10 nationally in both scoring offense and scoring defense, joining Notre Dame as the only NCAA Tournament teams to do so in 2025.

Richmond defeated four nationally ranked opponents during the season, set a program record with a nine-game winning streak, and ranked among the national leaders in scoring margin, scoring defense, caused turnovers, clearing percentage, scoring offense, and points per game. Eight Spiders earned All-America honors, and the team claimed five of six Atlantic 10 major postseason awards, including Chemotti's first Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honor. Close defenseman Mitchell Dunham became the first active Spider selected in the PLL College Draft when he was chosen 21st overall by the Utah Archers.

Prior to Richmond, Chemotti served as offensive coordinator at Loyola University Maryland, where he helped lead the Greyhounds to the 2012 NCAA National Championship. During his time at Loyola, the program earned four NCAA Tournament berths, produced 12 All-Americans, and led the nation in several offensive categories. Earlier coaching stops included Dartmouth and St. John's.

A 2002 graduate of Duke, Chemotti was a four-year starter and team captain for the Blue Devils, helping lead the program to four NCAA Tournament appearances and back-to-back ACC Championships. He later played professionally in Major League Lacrosse and the National Lacrosse League.
