#### WINEBRENNER NAMED TO BUSTER POSEY NATIONAL COLLEGIATE CATCHER OF THE YEAR WATCHLIST

Dylan Winebrenne is one of 50 catchers named to the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Midseason Watchlist, the Wichita Sports Commission announced April 1. He is the first Spider since Drew Blakely was named to the watchlist and a semifinalist in 2021. Four catchers in the Atlantic 10 were named to the list.

#### RICHMOND VS LA SALLE

Richmond heads to Philadelphia to face La Salle for the first time since the 2018 season, a 6-1 Spider victory at Pitt Field, as the 2020 series was canceled due to the COVID-19 Pandemic and the squads were not in the same pod in 2021 before the Explorers program was shut down. La Salle won the last contest at DeVincent Field, an 8-6 decision in 2015. This season the Explorers are led by Chase Swain's .374 average with an 1.094 OPS, collecting 40 hits and 15 extra base hits. Carter Groen has 37 hits, 17 extra base hits and 46 RBI while Daniel Perez is 15 of 16 in stolen base attempts.

#### RICHMOND VS ATLANTIC 10

Richmond ranks at least seventh in 11 different categories among Atlantic 10 Conference opponents. The UR pitching staff is second in the league in strikeout-to-walk ratio (1.96) and WHIP (1.46) and third in ERA (5.47). The Spider offense is second in hit by pitch (61) and third

in fielding percentage (.973) and stolen bases (73). UR is also fourth in home runs (30) and slugging percentage (.421), fifth in on base percentage (.384), sixth in doubles (49) and seventh in runs (165).

Dylan Winebrenner leads with eight homeruns, third in total bases (66), fifth in slugging percentage (.606). Evan Wilson is third in the league with a .500 on-base average and fourth in hit by pitch (10). Michael Elko is seventh with 14 stolen bases. Joey Giordano is second in the nation with six wins in six starts this season. Giordano is also second in the A-10 with a 2.19 ERA, third with a 1.00 WHIP. Jackson Hinchliffe tops the league and second in the country with eight starts on the mound while Justin Gay is sixth with three saves on the season.

### RICHMOND VS RHODE ISLAND

The Spiders won the series after capturing the first two games of the weekend but dropped a pitcher's duel in the series finale. Chase Topolski tossed six scoreless in game one, and got run support as Sean Scanlon had two hits, including a two-run home run, and four RBI. UR scored nine runs in the first inning of game two to help Joey Giordano collect his sixth win of the season. Sean Scanlon hit his second two-run home run of the weekend in the fourth as 10 Spiders collected at least one hit and five with two hits. Noah Haught went 3-for-3 with a triple and two RBI. Aidan O'Keefe launched his first home run of the season in the third inning of Sunday's contest as the Spiders only run of the game. Jackson Hinchliffe went 6.1 innings allowed just two runs on four hits but was credited with the loss.

### RICHMOND VS OLD DOMINION

Richmond dropped the first of three midweek games to ODU (March 25), 7-2. RJ Johnson Jr. collected the Spiders first hit in the fifth inning with a double before scoring two batters later for UR's first run of the game. Ryan Recio picked up Sean Scanlon, who led off the sixth inning with the double, with a sacrifice fly. ODU picked at the UR pitching staff, getting a two-run home run in the second, single runs in the seventh and eighth, but the big inning was a three-run ninth. Noah Haught made his Spider debut on the mound, tossing a scoreless third inning, working around a hit and a walk while collecting his first strikeout.

### WILSON NAMED A-10 ROOKIE OF WEEK

Evan Wilson was named Atlantic 10 Conference Rookie of the Week March 23 for his first collegiate weekly honor and the program's second of the season. In four games last week, Wilson hit .538 with an on-base percentage of .647 and slugged .923. He went 7-for-13 at the plate with two doubles and a home run, two RBI, three walks and didn't strikeout. He also played left field, first base and right field as well as served as the designated hitter from the lead-off spot in the lineup and did not commit a defensive error. On the season, Wilson is hitting .385 over 16 games played including 12 starts. He has 15 hits, including four doubles and two home runs for seven RBI. He's drawn seven walks, been hit eight times and is 3-for-3 in stolen base attempts.

### RICHMOND VS FORDHAM

Richmond dropped two of three at Fordham. In game one, Dylan Winebrenner hit a two-run home run to in the fifth inning while Evan Wilson launched his second home run, also a two-run shot, in the top of the ninth for the Spiders only runs of the game. In game two, used a three-run eighth inning to catapult by the Rams. RJ Johnson Jr., hit his third home run of the season in the eighth, bringing in Grant Kennedy to tie the game at 3-all. Winebrenner brought in the go-ahead run with a base hit to left, pushing in Reid Downs. Joey Giordano had a non-hitter through three and two-thirds of an inning but went on to log seven and two-thirds of an inning on the mound for UR to collect his fifth win of the season. Bijan Anvar retired all four batters he faced to collect his first save. In the rubber match, Richmond took a 3-2 lead into the bottom of the ninth. Ryan Recio doubled in RJ Rickabaugh in the second and Winebrenner launched a two-run home run in the fifth to give UR the lead. The Rams loaded the bases with two outs on Justin Gay and got the base hit to center to score two runs for the victory.

### RICHMOND VS MARYLAND

The Terps collected a 19-4 in seven innings decision to split the season series in College Park March 31 as both programs protected their home fields. Evan Wilson doubled in the Spiders first run in the first inning. Michael Elko laced a hit to right in the second to score Reid Downs who started the frame with a double, and Aidan O'Keefe who reached on a walk. RJ Johnson Jr picked up the Spiders fourth run in the fourth inning with an RBI ground out to bring in O'Keefe from third. UR had a tough day on the mound as eight pitchers were used on a staff day. UR allowed 19 runs, 16 earned, on 17 hits, 12 walks, four wild pitches and one error with four strikeouts. Richmond got timely hitting to defeat Maryland 7-5 (Mar. 17) at Pitt Field. UR got on the board in the second inning when Aidan O'Keefe put down a safety squeeze bunt to score Sean Scanlon and Chris Schaller. Jackson Kraemer then hit his first home run of the season to deep left field to give Richmond a 3-1 lead. After UMD put up four in the top of the sixth, the Spiders answered with four of their own in the bottom of the frame, all with two outs. Dylan Winebrenner doubled down the left field line bringing in two runs to tie the game. Michael Elko brought in two more runs with a sharp base hit to center field to give the Spiders a 7-5 lead. Richmond will head to Shipley Field at Bob "Turtle" Smith Stadium March 31 to kick off a nine-game road trip.

## **RICHMOND VS SAINT JOSEPH'S**

The Hawks swept the Spiders to open Atlantic 10 Conference action at Pitt Field. On Friday, SJU took a quick 9-0 lead in the first two innings. A home run by Sean Scanlon in the second and two home runs by Dylan Winebrenner, a solo blast to lead off the third and a grand slam later in the frame, tied the game. Reliever Chase Topolski allowed two runs in the fourth then locked down to toss five scoreless frames and collect a career-high 10 strikeouts in the loss. Game two on Saturday was more of the same, SJU took a quick two-run lead in the first, but Evan Wilson hit a solo home run to answer in the bottom of the frame. Scanlon had a pinch-hit two RBI base hit to give UR the lead but SJU pushed two runs in to win in the ninth. On Sunday, the Spiders left nine on the bases, as the squad was unable to push more than the one run in on Ryan Recio's sacrifice fly RBI in the third.

## **GIORDANO NAMED A-10 PITCHER OF WEEK**

Joey Giordano was named Atlantic 10 Conference Pitcher of the Week March 10 for his performance against Binghamton. In his outing against Binghamton (March 7), an 8-1 Spider victory, the sophomore lefty took a no-hitter through six and a third of an inning, working around some traffic in the second inning after allowing a walk and a Spider throwing error. The Montvale, N.J. native then retired the Bearcats in order over the next three innings. In the sixth, he hit one batter but got out of trouble with a strikeout. After striking out the first batter in the seventh, Giordano allowed the Bearcats only run of the day on a solo home run. He then ended the frame with back-to-back strikeouts to finish his day on the mound with a career-high 12 strikeouts.

## **SPIDERS vs. COPPIN STATE**

UR's starter Angel Santiago-Cruz, a Maryland native, collected his first win of the season after tossing two scoreless frames and working around two hits and striking out three. Sam Young, Aaron Van Tuyle, Chase Lawley followed with scoreless frames of their own. Christian Dray went one and a third, allowing the Eagles only run of the day on a hit, a walk and a hit batter with two strikeouts. Paul Witkop got the final two outs, including a strikeout. The Spiders batted around in the first inning, scoring five runs on one hit, two hit batters, four walks and CSU error. UR was plunked a season-high eight times, including Evan Wilson getting hit three times. Michael Elko paced the Spiders with a 3-for-3 day, including a double and a walk, scored four times and stole a season-high four bases. Grant Kennedy tallied two hits and two RBI and a walk while Noah Harvey chipped in his first two collegiate hits, including a two-RBI base hit in the fifth.

## **SPIDERS vs. BINGHAMTON**

Richmond dropped its first weekend series of the season to Binghamton, with late rallies falling short on Friday and Sunday. Michael Elko launched his third home run of the season on Friday to help Glenn Smith's strong start (5.2 IP, 3H, 2R, 3BB, 4SO) but the Bearcats put three on Spider reliever Keane Hyer. Joey Giordano took a no-hitter into the seventh on Saturday, allowing the Binghamton run on a solo home run as he finished his outing with a career-high 12 strikeouts. He allowed a walk and a hit batter and worked around a UR throwing error. The Spider offense supported him with two three-run frames, including in the first inning. Sunday, Binghamton tossed up a three-run frame in the fourth and kept the Spiders rally in the seventh and eighth to just one run each frame.

## **SPIDERS vs. LONGWOOD**

Longwood captured this season's only match-up between the squads in midweek action. Longwood jumped on UR starter Mauricio Rodriguez in the first inning, tagging him for three runs on two hits and two walks and only getting one out. Angel Santiago-Cruz took over to get the other two outs of the first inning. Santiago-Cruz allowed two runs over two more innings of action on four hits, a walk and three strikeouts. Richmond got on the board in the second inning when Aidan O'Keefe laced a two RBI base hit through the infield, picking up Joe Crenshaw and Grant Kennedy who both reached on walks. Sean Scanlon launched a pinch hit, two-run home run over the outfield pavilion in right field in the sixth inning for the Spiders other two runs on the day. Rookie pitchers Evan Wilson, Dom Ruggiero, Christian Dray and Aaron Van Tuyle all saw action, with graduate Justin Gay tossing the ninth.

## **SPIDERS vs. CORNELL**

Richmond swept Cornell, capturing a third-straight series victory this season. The Spiders outscored the Big Red, 32-11, powered by nine home runs. Ryan Recio had a home run in each game, including a two-run home run on Friday and a three-run shot Saturday. Recio is now tied with Dylan Winebrenner with four home runs this season. RJ Johnson Jr. hit two home runs on Friday for the first time in his career. Michael Elko also chipped in two home runs on the weekend. Khris Morris launched a three-run shot to capture the sweep and run rule victory on Sunday.

## **SPIDERS at NC STATE**

Richmond fell to No. 14 NC State in midweek action in Raleigh, 27-0. The Wolfpack (6-1) jumped on Richmond starter Jackson Hinchliffe, tagging him for six runs, five earned, on five hits, a walk and a strikeout in two innings of work. Evan Wilson, in his first start as the designated hitter, broke up the perfect game in the third inning when he reached on a Wolfpack error. He made

it to third on a ground out and a wild pitch but was stranded. Dylan Winebrenner broke up the no-hitter an inning later with a base hit to center. Ryan Recio drew a two-out walk, but both runners were left on base. Wilson led off the fifth with a walk but was erased on a line-out double play to the first baseman. Joe Crenshaw was the Spiders fourth batter to reach in the eighth on a pinch hit walk to lead off the frame.

## **SPIDERS VS PENN STATE**

Penn State shut out Richmond in the series opener on Friday taking edge in the pitcher's duel. Glenn Smith kept the Nittany Lions off the board over four and a third of an inning. Smith allowed two hits, including a solo home run to break up the scoreless affair, with three walks and a career-high five strikeouts over a career-high five innings. Winebrenner went 2-for-3 with a triple, stolen base and a hit by pitch. On Saturday in game one, Joey Giordano scattered three hits, three walks and struck out three over five innings of action to capture his second win of the season. He gave the ball over to Bijan Anvar who tossed two more scoreless frames allowing one hit and striking out two. Justin Gay collected his second save of the week with two hitless frames to close out the victory. UR tallied runs off a Penn State error and two sacrifice flies for the win. In the second game of the doubleheader Winebrenner hit two solo home runs, while Khris Morris chipped in his first blast of the season. UR's other run came off a sacrifice fly by Noah Haught who had a 3-for-3 game. Chase Topolski scattered four hits, one run, three walks with six strikeouts over four innings of work. Chayse Gruber got out of an inherited bases loaded situation in the sixth with two strikeouts. Gruber allowed two runs on four hits, a walk and a hit batter with four strikeouts over his four innings of work to get the victory.

## **SPIDERS VS NORTH CAROLINA**

Richmond fell to No. 10 North Carolina, 10-0, in seven innings after a six-run second inning. UNC launched two three-run home runs to take an 8-0 lead after one and a third of an inning of action. Spider relievers Dylan Sieskey (4th inning) and Christian Dray (5th inning) retired the Tar Heels in order both picking up a strike out in their 1-2-3 frames. Keane Hyer allowed a hit and a walk but got out of the sixth without allowing a run to score in his debut. Jackson Kraemer and Noah Haught broke up the no-hitter in third with back-to-back base hits. Ryan Recio also collected a hit in the fifth while Khris Morris tallied his base hit in the sixth.

## **SPIDERS VS JAMES MADISON**

Richmond jumped out to a quick lead on the Dukes Wednesday on a two-run home run by Ryan Recio, his first of the year. UR added two more in the third for a 4-0 lead before JMU scratched a run across in the fifth. UR responded with three runs in the fifth on back-to-back doubles by RJ Rickabaugh (1 RBI) and Chris Schaller (2 RBI). Dylan Winebrenner launched his second solo home run in the sixth to put the Spiders up 8-1. JMU got four runs in the seventh to make it 8-5 but UR got an insurance run in the eighth. Jackson Hinchliffe collected his first win of the season on a staff day, going 3.1 IP, scattering just two hits and a walk with a strikeout. Justin Gay finished the game with two scoreless innings allowing a hit and a strikeout in his second relief appearance of the season.

## **SPIDERS VS MONMOUTH**

Richmond collected the season opening series over Monmouth. UR dropped a close Friday contest, before collecting Saturday's double header at Pitt Field. Michael Elko paced the Spider offense hitting .500 on the weekend, going 6-for-12 with two doubles and four RBI. Dylan Winebrenner had a strong weekend on the plate, 5-for-11 with a double and a home run with two RBI for a .455 average and .818 slugging percentage. Utility player (INF/OF/RHP) Khris Morris had five RBI on three hits, two HBP and a walk at the plate while tossing an inning in relief, allowing a run on a hit with a strikeout to collect the save in game two. Joey Giordano collected the game one victory after tossing 5.1 innings, scattering four runs on four hits and a walk while striking out eight. Chase Topolski picked up the save going 3.2 on one run on one hit, two walks and four strikeouts. Reliever Bijan Anvar collected the game two win after 1.2 innings of action, scattering one run on three hits with two strikeouts. Fellow reliever Evan Wilson tossed three innings, allowing one run on two hits while striking out four, including striking out the side in the eighth in 10 pitches.

## **NEW LOOK SPIDERS**

Richmond reloaded for the 2026 season, adding 15 freshmen and eight graduate students to 16 returners. The Spiders return just one starter, utility man Michael Elko who saw action at second and behind the plate last season. UR had five student-athletes transfer, including Ryan Bilka (UMiami), Jack Arcamone (Georgia), and Jordan Jaffe (Liberty), and 15 graduate, including infielder Brady O'Brien (UDFA, Mariners), outfielders Phil Bernstein, Aaron Whitley and DJ Pacheco and pitchers Brian Reinke, Tyler Rigo (BananaBall) and Esteban Rodriguez.

## **RETURN-DERS**

The weekend starting rotation has two sophomores and a junior, but all three have impactful experience as relievers and starters in their short time at Richmond. Jackson Hinchliffe tossed two one-run innings in the Spiders win over NC State (Feb. 25) and collected five scoreless frames in an 8-2 victory over VCU (May 9). Lefty Joey Giordano jumped into the rotation right as the Atlantic 10 Conference action started last season after being cleared from Tommy John surgery in his senior prep season. Glenn Smith tossed 19-plus innings over 13 appearances in his rookie

season, including earning a save after a three-inning scoreless outing against UMass Lowell (Mar. 3). They join senior hurlers Chase Topolski and Chayse Gruber, sophomores Sam Young, Angel Santiago-Cruz and Paul Witkop as well as junior Kellen Heney.

#### **POSITION PLAYERS READY TO GO**

While Michael Elko is the only returning starter, the position players do not lack experience. Senior Infielder Aiden O'Keefe has seen action at second and third, as well as PJ Hughes who is more of a middle infielder. Sophomores Trevor Doesenbach and Grant Kennedy filled in for UR giants DJ Pacheco and Phil Bernstein last year and were both speedy options on the base paths. Catcher RJ Rickabaugh will also see action behind the plate for the Spiders after platooning with Jack Arcamone (Georgia) and battling injuries last season.

#### **MEET THE GRAD GUYS**

Eight graduate transfers will jump to make a big impact on the squad. In the outfield, speedy RJ Johnson Jr. will take over duties in centerfield after two years at Rutgers. Canadian Mateo Zeperele will also look to strengthen the corner outfield, joining the squad from Mount St. Mary's. Two-way guy Khristopher Morris (UNCW) will toe the rubber and take reps as a corner infielder, while Sean Scanlon (Holy Cross) will battle for playing time at first with Ryan Recio (VCU/Webber International). Catcher Dylan Winebrenner (Salisbury) will guide the pitching staff, including right-handed pitchers Justin Gay (FAU) and Bijan Anvar (Franklin & Marshall). They join current graduate student-athletes right-handed pitchers Dylan Siesky and Mauricio Rodriguez who are both coming off Tommy John rehab stints.

#### **FRESH FACE SPIDERS**

Among the 15 true freshmen student-athletes, there is one catcher, one infielder, two outfielders, two infielder/ right-handed pitchers, five right-handed pitchers and three left-handed pitchers and all of them are competing for playing time in the starting line-up. Middle infielders Noah Haught (Arlington, Va.) and Noah Harvey (Cinnaminson, N.J.) have been battling for action at short stop while backstop Joe Crenshaw (Atlanta, Ga.) is grinding with upperclassmen for time. Chris Schaller (Garnet Valley, Pa.) and Reid Downs (Virginia Beach, Va.) look to make an impact whether on the base paths or when patrolling the outfield. The nine pitchers will get their chance to toe the mound early and in impactful situations for pitching coach Josh Epstein.

#### **D1BASEBALL & PERFECT GAME PREDICTIONS**

D1Baseball.com has predicted that the Spiders will finish in seventh, just behind crosstown rival VCU. The Atlantic 10 Conference Preseason Coaches Poll was released late Feb. 13, with the Spiders predicted to finished tied for fifth with Dayton. Reigning A-10 Champion Rhode Island was picked to repeat, with George Mason tabbed for second. Saint Joseph's and Saint Louis were tied for third. After UR and Dayton in fifth, Davidson, VCU, George Washington, Fordham, St. Bonaventure and returning program La Salle rounded out the 12-team prediction. Perfect Game named Michel Elko as a preseason A-10 All-Conference member while rookie Noah Haught garnered preseason all-rookie honors.

#### **ATLANTIC 10 CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT**

The 2026 installment of the A-10 Tournament will be a six-team affair May 20-23 at Capital One Park in Tysons, Virginia. UR missed competing in the 2025 Tournament by one game, edged out by Dayton due to tiebreakers. Rhode Island won the regular and tournament titles and represented the league in the Baton Rouge Regional. UR was second in the league in average (.316), led in slugging (.528) and fielding percentage (.976). The pitching staff allowed the fewest runs (316), doubles (71), triples (4) and walks (208).

Aoki joined Richmond in June 2023, bringing more than 20 years of head coaching experience and over 500 career wins to the Spiders.

In his second season, Aoki led Richmond to the program's first 33-win season since 2004 when Richmond Hall of Fame coach Ron Aktins was at the helm. UR went 3-0 against ACC teams, with wins over NC State, nationally ranked Virginia and Boston College. Aoki guided third baseman Brady O'Brien to an All-American season as well as a Dick Howser Award watch list member.

Aoki led the Spiders to a 27-32 record and 13-11 conference record in his first season at the helm of the program in 2024. UR clinched an Atlantic 10 Conference Championship tournament berth and as the four seed made it to the Championship Finals, going 3-2, suffering both losses to crosstown rival VCU. In the team's three postseason victories, the squad defeated George Washington 12-4, top-seeded Saint Louis 13-10, and Saint Joseph's 14-6.

Against Atlantic 10 opponents, the Spiders won four series in 2024, including a series sweep of George Washington at Pitt Field, and captured a victory against every A-10 opponent avoiding being swept. In the second game against George Mason, the Spiders came back from a 15-run deficit to collect a 17-16 extra innings walk off victory.

Spider starting pitcher Kyle Roche finished the season allowing just four walks, two during the regular season and two in the A-10 Tournament in 86.2 total innings on the hill. Roche led the nation averaging 18.0 strikeouts to every walk surrendered and 0.42 walks allowed per nine innings pitched.

Six different Spiders collected hardware in 2024. Brian Reinke (pitcher), Aidan O'Keefe (rookie) and Aaron Whitley (player) all collected weekly A-10 regular season honors. Esteban Rodriguez was named to the A-10 Second Team, while Jackson Hinchliffe picked up Rookie Team honors and Whitley was named A-10 Defensive Player of the Year. Phil Bernstein was named to the A-10 All-Academic and to the Jewish Baseball News All-America teams.

He came to UR from Morehead State, where in 2023 he guided the Eagles to a 36-20 record and the outright Ohio Valley Conference

regular season title, the first for the program since 1979. Morehead State's 36 wins were tied for fourth-most in school history and marked the third straight year the Eagles increased their win total from the previous season.

Aoki served as the head coach at Notre Dame for nine seasons from 2010-19, when he oversaw the program's transition from the Big East to the Atlantic Coast Conference. In their final Big East season in 2013, Aoki guided Notre Dame to a 34-24 record and a runner-up finish in the Big East Tournament. In the program's second ACC season in 2015, the Irish finished 37-23 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2006.

Aoki spent seven seasons at Boston College as both an assistant and head coach, leading BC to some of the most successful seasons in program history. In 2009 — the third of Aoki's four seasons as head coach — the Eagles won 34 games and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1967. From 2004 to 2006, Aoki served as BC's pitching coach. He helped BC to a program-record 37 wins in 2005 and had six Eagles pitchers drafted by MLB clubs.

Aoki's first collegiate head coaching position was at Columbia from 1999 to 2003. Aoki led the Lions to 20 wins in 2001, their first 20-win season since 1987. The Lions reached 20 wins again in 2002 and 2003, compiling the second-longest string of 20-win seasons in school history at the time.

Everywhere he's coached, Aoki has demonstrated an ability to develop future professional players. More than 55 of his players have been selected in the MLB Draft, and 15 have gone on to reach the major leagues.

Aoki's teams have also performed in the classroom, posting a program GPA of 3.0 or better every year from 2012 to 2021. In 2018 and 2019, his Notre Dame teams received "The Trophy," an award given to the Irish team most committed to community service.

Aoki earned a Bachelor's degree from Davidson College in 1990 and a Master's degree from Ohio University in 1994. He and his wife Sue have three children, son Kai, and daughters, Bryn and Reese.



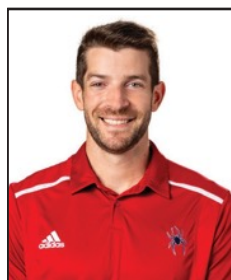

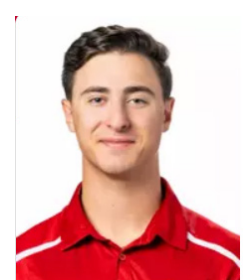
