What You Need To Know

- Rider plays host to Siena Friday night on ESPNU. RU looks to snap a two-game skid, having lost at home to Canisius and in 2OT at Quinnipiac last weekend.
- The two losses came following an eight-game winning streak that covered nearly a month, Jan. 15-Feb. 10. Rider defeated Fairfield and Manhattan twice each, along with wins over Iona, Marist, Niagara and Saint Peter's in the span.
- With his next game played, Ajiri Ogemuno-Johnson would tie Mike Ringgold for the program games played record (133).
- Allen Powell scored 18 points, including the game-winning jumper with 7.3 seconds remaining against Fairfield on Feb. 10. His heroics came after hitting the game-tying putback to beat the regulation buzzer and scoring seven more points in overtime as the Broncs defeated Fairfield on Jan. 29. Powell's putback with 1.7 seconds left at Quinnipiac on Feb. 19 also sent the game to overtime.
- Dwight Murray, Jr. continues to be the Broncs' do-it-all point guard, averaging 16.6 ppg., shooting 39.8 percent from deep. Murray's 3.0 assists and 1.4 steals per game are best on the team and his 4.9 rebounds are third.
- Siena leads the all-time series with the Broncs, 38-19. The two teams split a home-and-home series last season, with the road team winning each game. The Saints have won the last three meetings at Alumni Gym and have a slight 6-5 lead in Lawrenceville in Kevin Baggett's 11 years leading Rider. Three of Siena's last four wins at Alumni Gym have come by two points or less.
- Siena is led by Javian McCollum at 15.4 points and 3.8 assists per game. Jackson Stormo has contributed 13.1 ppg. and 5.3 rebounds per game, while Andrew Platek also averages in double figures at 11.4 ppg. SCOUTING THE SIENA SAINTS

Siena is led by Javian McCollum at 15.4 points and 3.8 assists per game. Jackson Stormo has contributed 13.1 ppg. and 5.3 rebounds per game, while Andrew Platek also averages in double figures at 11.4 ppg. Michael Eley (8.8 ppg.), Jared Billups (8.1 ppg., 6.7 rpg.) and Jayce Johnson (6.3 ppg.) have also contributed solidly, while Michael Baer has averaged 6.3 points and a teambest 7.5 rebounds in MAAC games.

ALL-TIME SERIES VS. SIENA

Siena leads the all-time series with the Broncs, 38-19. The two teams split a home-and-home series last season, with the road team winning each game. The Saints have won the last three meetings at Alumni Gym and have a slight 6-5 lead in Lawrenceville in Kevin Baggett's 11 years leading Rider. Three of Siena's last four wins at Alumni Gym have come by two points or less, including a one-point win in overtime last season.

THAT'S FOUL

Rider outshot Quinnipiac, 43.8 percent (35-80) to 43.1 percent (25-58) from the floor, and outrebounded the Bobcats, 45-33, including a 14-4 edge on the offensive boards in a double-overtime loss in Hamden on Feb. 19. But the difference in the game came in the 29-16 foul discrepancy and a 41-17 disparity in free-throw attempts in the Bobcats' favor. After an even 6-6 foul margin in the first half that still gave Quinnipiac an 8-4 edge in free-throw attempts, the Bobcats enjoyed a 23-10 disparity in foul calls in the game's final 30 minutes, leading to a 33-13 advantage in free-throw attempts in the game's most pivotal stretch. Included in the free-throw margin were the final two points for Quinnipiac to break an 88-88 tie in the final 21 seconds of the second overtime.

GOING NATIONAL

Rider is currently ranked nationally among the Division I leaders in rebounding margin and free-throw percentage. The Broncs have outrebounded the opposition by an average of 5.6 boards per game (25th), while shooting 75.3 percent from the line (44th).

ELDER OGEMUNO

With 132 career games played, Ajiri Ogemuno-Johnson would tie Mike Ringgold for the Broncs' all-time games played record with his next game played. After playing 25 of 31 games in his freshman year of 2018-19, Ogemuno-Johnson has played in all 107 games RU has contested on U.S. soil since. The only four games Ogemuno-Johnson has missed in the last four years have been due to visa issues and played abroad (Cancun - 2021-22, Dublin - 2022-23).

HALFWAY THERE

Rider shot an unconscious 80 percent (20-25) in the first half against Canisius on Feb. 17 at Alumni Gym. Tariq Ingraham made all four of his attempts, while Mervin James (5-6) and Dwight Murray, Jr. (4-5) shot high percentages. However, the Griffs also shot 59.1 percent (13-22) for the period to keep the game within nine points at the half and outscored Rider, 27-11, over the first 12 minutes of the second half to flip the game and hold on for an 81-78 win.

EIGHT WAS GREAT

Rider won eight-straight games from Jan. 15-Feb. 10, its longest string of consecutive victories since a 10-game winning streak from Jan. 18-Feb. 18, 2018. The 2018 streak was the longest streak in Kevin Baggett's 11-year tenure. The streak began with a comeback from down 18 in the second half at Iona and included series sweeps of Manhattan and Fairfield. The Broncs also beat Marist, Niagara and Saint Peter's in the stretch. Four of the eight wins came by three points or less, with a fifth coming as Rider pulled away in overtime.





THE DEER HUNTER

After struggling to a 1-for-7 start from the field on Jan. 29 at Fairfield, Allen Powell finished strong and led the Broncs to victory over the Stags. Powell would make five of his final six attempts from the floor, including the game-tying putback at the regulation buzzer and both of his attempts in overtime, including the three-pointer that put Rider ahead for good. For the game, he had 16 points and a team-high three assists. In his next chance against against the Stags, Powell went for a game-high 18 points, including the game-winning jumper with 7.3 seconds remaining in a 58-57 Rider win.

DOUBLE DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Mervin James had 20 points and 12 rebounds and Ajiri Ogemuno-Johnson compiled 14 points and 11 rebounds in Rider's Feb. 5 win at Manhattan. It was the first time two Broncs had double-doubles in the same game since Dwight Murray, Jr. (14 pts, 11 asst) and Dimencio Vaughn (14 pts, 10 reb) turned the trick last Jan. 9 at Marist and the first tandem of double-doubles both utilizing points and rebounds since Vaughn (16 pts, 11 reb) and Tyere Marshall (21 pts, 15 reb) both accomplished the feat on Feb. 28, 2020, vs. Monmouth. The duo nearly did it again a game later, when James had 10 points and 10 rebounds and Ogemuno-Johnson went for eight points and 10 rebounds vs. Fairfield.

DON'T DOUBT US DOWN DOUBLE DIGITS

Coming back from second-half deficits of 18 points at Iona on Jan. 15 and 11 points against Niagara on Jan. 20, Rider won for the 33rd and 34th times in Head Coach Kevin Baggett's 11 years leading the Broncs when trailing by 10 points or more. The number grew to 35 after a comeback from down 14 at Marist on Jan. 27 and further grew to 36 following a comeback from down 10 at Fairfield on Jan. 29. The largest deficit from which the Broncs have come back to win was a 21-point hole at Marist on Feb. 10, 2018. The Broncs' eightgame winning streak started with five-straight halftime deficits.

FIVE TO FLOG THE FLOCK

Rider had five players score in double figures in a single game for the first time in 2022-23 in an 82-61 win on Feb. 3 against Saint Peter's. Dwight Murray, Jr. led the group with 15 points, while Adetokunbo Bakare and Mervin James had 11 points apiece and Ajiri Ogemuno-Johnson and Allen Powell each scored 10. The Broncs shot 54.2 percent (26-48) from the floor, their second-best shooting performance of the year, including 66.7 percent (8-12) from long range. The Rider defense also came up big, holding Saint Peter's without a field goal for a stretch 10:10 of game time in the first half. The Broncs accomplished the feat for the second time in as many meetings with the Peacocks, after holding SPU without a field goal for a span of 12:32 last Feb. 11.

EXCELLENCE IN EXECUTION

Down three with 1:20 remaining against Niagara on Jan. 20, the Broncs executed offensively and defensively to score the game's final six points and take a three-point victory. The Broncs forced a steal and two missed field-goal attempts from Preseason All-MAAC First Team selection Noah Thomasson, while drawing fouls and going 4-for-4 from the free-throw line and effectively running the game clock down to 10 seconds before Dwight Murray, Jr. deftly found Ajiri Ogemuno-Johnson for a lay-up and a three-point lead. Coincidentally, the clock again read 1:20 with a one-point deficit two days later against Manhattan, when Murray came up with a steal off an inbounds play and went coast-to-coast for the go-ahead bucket. The Broncs never trailed again.

MERV'S WILD'N

Mervin James averaged 17.0 points and 7.0 rebounds per game, while shooting a difference-making 93.8 percent (15-16) from the free-throw line in the Broncs 2-0 weekend with wins over Niagara (Jan. 20) and Manhattan (Jan. 22) en route to MAAC and Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association Player of the Week honors. James became the first Bronc to earn Met Player of the Week since Teddy Okereafor earned the honor on Jan. 19, 2016.

DJ CLUTCH

Dwight Murray, Jr. hit his second game-winning shot in the final 7.5 seconds of regulation in as many games against Iona, Jan. 15 in New Rochelle. Murray most recently knocked down a right-wing three to break a 67-67 deadlock with 3.8 seconds left. His floater with 7.5 seconds left in the 2022 MAAC Quarterfinals also stunned the top-seeded Gaels.

TOKS THREE TO TANGO

Adetokunbo Bakare sparked the Broncs' comeback from down 18 at Iona on Jan. 15 with three three-pointers for nine-straight Rider points in a 20-3 second-half run. The three triples came in a span of 2:18 of game time at the 9:57, 8:30 and 7:39 marks. It was the second time he's shot 3-for-3 from long range this season (Jan. 6 vs. Quinnipiac), along with a 3-for-4 effort vs. Saint Peter's (Feb. 3) and he's now 14-of-22 (63.6 percent) from deep overall, including 11-for-13 (84.6 percent) in MAAC contests.

SLUGGISH SECOND HALF

Playing without Preseason All-MAAC First Team selection Dwight Murray, Jr., due to injury, Rider shot 53.6 percent (15-28) in the first half vs. Quinnipiac to take a 36-31 into the locker room on Jan. 6. However, the Broncs cooled off in the second half (35.7 percent, 10-28) and were outscored, 41-27, in the period as Quinnipiac took the victory. Allen Powell scored a season-high 19 points and Mervin James scored 16 points in defeat.

TOUGH ONE BY TWO

Rider took a tough 61-59 road loss at Niagara on Jan. 2. The Broncs erased what was once an 11-point deficit in the first half to take a one-point lead in the second. Rider trailed by two in the closing seconds and had a look to either win or tie the game, while Dwight Murray, Jr.'s jumper wouldn't fall.

BENCH BIG VS. CANISIUS

With zero points from Dwight Murray, Jr. and Mervin James in the first half at Canisius on Dec. 31, you'd hardly expect that the Broncs would lead by five at the half. But Tariq Ingraham scored eight of his 12 points in the opening 20 minutes, while Nehemiah Benson added six points and five rebounds and Corey McKeithan had four points. All told, Rider's bench outscored that of Canisius, 22-4, in the first half and 26-10 for the game. Ingraham shot 5-for-5 from the field and buried two pivotal free throws with 13 seconds remaining.

MURRAY'S MILESTONES

Dwight Murray, Jr. became the 41st Bronc all-time to eclipse 1,000 points in the cranberry and gray on Jan. 8 at Siena. In the same game, he surpassed 1,500 career points, including his two seasons at Incarnate Word. Murray scored his 1,000 points in 69 games played at Rider.





IN THE FIGHT WITH THE DAWGS

Though Rider never led for the first time this season on Dec. 28 at Georgia, the Broncs hung with the Dawgs for 40 minutes. Georgia scored the game's first 10 points, but Rider cut the deficit to five late in the first half. After rebuilding its lead to 20 with under 14 minutes left, Rider furiously came back to pull to within two with just over a minute remaining. But the Bulldogs held on, extending their lead to the final six-point margin from the free-throw line. For the game, Rider took advantages of 41-35 on the glass, 44-22 in points in the paint and 19-8 in second-chance points.

RIO UNLEASHED

Tariq Ingraham had his best game as a Bronc, going for 15 points and seven rebounds on Dec. 28 at Georgia. He made 5-of-7 attempts from the floor and all five of his free-throw attempts. Only his 19-point performance for Wake Forest against Delaware State in his true freshman year of 2020-21 stands as a greater offensive output for the Broncs' big man.

HEARTBREAK AT THE HANDS OF THE HENS

Rider led for 31:33 of game time to Delaware's 3:27 with a lead in the Broncs' 60-59 heartbreaking loss to the Blue Hens on Dec. 19. Jameer Nelson, Jr. fell to the ground with 9.7 seconds left, successfully selling a Mervin James offensive foul, before contributing the game-winning tip-in with 3.6 seconds remaining. Dwight Murray, Jr. led Rider with 21 points, while Allen Powell had 15.

BIG THREE SOAR OVER SKYHAWKS

Mervin James, Dwight Murray, Jr. and Ajiri Ogemuno-Johnson all had big games in the Broncs' 78-67 win at Stonehill on Dec. 7. James went for 23 points, 13 rebounds and five assists, compiling his first double-double as a Bronc. He had nine of them in two seasons at North Alabama. Murray added 20 points, including 4-of-7 shooting from long range. Finally, Ogemuno-Johnson scored 13 of his 19 points in the second half, while also adding nine rebounds.

DYNAMIC DJ

Dwight Murray, Jr. led the Broncs in scoring in eight of the first nine games this season, scoring at least 17 points in the first 10 games, before seeing his streak snapped at Georgia. Included was a career-high-matching 30 against Central Arkansas on Nov. 19.

MAAC OPENING WIN AT THE MOUNT

Rider outlasted Mount St. Mary's on the road, 68-65, in the Broncs' league opener on Dec. 3. Tied with less than a minute remaining, Ajiri Ogemuno-Johnson converted a conventional three-point play and the Broncs never trailed again. Dwight Murray, Jr. led all scorers with 19 points. The Broncs trailed by as many as eight points in the game and five points in the second half, but held the Mountaineers without a field goal for a stretch of 9:56 of game time in the latter stanza to spark the comeback.

RUN AND SHOOT

Rider used runs of 14-0, 10-2 and 7-0 in the first half, another 9-0 run in the second and shot a season-high 57.7 percent (30-52) for the game in an 88-62 win over Monmouth on Nov. 30. Mervin James and Dwight Murray, Jr. led the Broncs with 17 points apiece.

NO LUCK IN IRELAND

The Broncs lost a pair of MAAC/ASUN Dublin Classic Games, Nov. 18-19, in Ireland. Rider fell to Stetson and Central Arkansas. Dwight Murray, Jr., led the Broncs in both games, scoring 17 points against the Hatters and matching his career high with 30 points against the Bears.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS VS. TCNJ

Rider shot 50.7 percent (36-71) in defeating local foe The College of New Jersey on Nov. 12. Dwight Murray, Jr. led the way with 17 points on 6-of-7 shooting, whiel Allen Powell had 14 points and a career-high four steals. Tariq Ingraham scored in double-digits for the first time as a Bronc with 10 points off the bench.

JAMES FOR 1,000

Mervin James eclipsed the 1,000-point mark for his collegiate career with his first bucket on Nov. 12 vs. TCNJ. He came to Rider with 620 points in two seasons at North Alabama, before adding 366 points last season for the Broncs.

TALE OF TWO HALVES AT PROVIDENCE

Rider built a lead of as many as 15 in the Nov. 8 season opener at Providence and led by 10 at the half, on the strength of hot shooting and 10 first-half points from Dwight Murray, Jr. Providence kept it as close as it did, getting 22 trips to the free-throw line in the period to zero for Rider. For the game, it was a 43-10 discrepancy, more than putting the Broncs at a disadvantage in what would prove to be a one-point game. In the end, the Friars used 21-3 second-half run to produce an eight-point lead the Broncs whittled to one, but couldn't overcome.

BRONCS PICKED THIRD IN THE MAAC

With four of five starters and 74 percent of its scoring from a year ago returning and an influx of incoming talent, Rider was picked third in the MAAC by the league's coaches, just three points behind second-place Manhattan. A week after the poll was announced, Manhattan parted ways with Head Coach Steve Masiello and, as a result, also lost Preseason MAAC Player of the Year Jose Perez, among others. Iona is the preseason favorite in the league.

INFAMOUS TO UNANIMOUS

After being snubbed by the MAAC's coaches and being left off the 2021-22 All-MAAC Teams, Dwight Murray, Jr. was a unanimous 2022-23 Preseason All-MAAC First Team selection. The recognition comes after Murray showed his worth in the 2022 MAAC Championships, averaging 17.3 points, 6.0 assists and 4.7 rebounds per game in the MAAC Tournament, including 21 points, eight assists and the game-winning floater to knock off top-seeded Iona to earn MAAC All-Championship Team honors. For the season, he led the MAAC at 4.7 assists per game and 37.4 minutes per game, while also leading the team in scoring (13.1 ppg.- 11th-MAAC), assist-to-turnover ratio (1.9 - 2nd-MAAC) and free-throw percentage (.813 – 8th-MAAC).

JAMES, POWELL TAKE THIRD TEAM

Mervin James and Allen Powell were also named Preseason All-MAAC Third Team. James was often thrust into roles as a power forward or even center in his first year in Lawrenceville, evolved into his role throughout the season and was a force come MAAC Tournament time. He was fourth on the team and 20th in the MAAC at 11.1 points and 5.0 rebounds per game last year. Powell was third on the team and 14th in the MAAC at 12.1 points per game a year ago, shooting a team-high 36.0 percent (68-189) from long range, good for 12th in the league. He scored in double digits 21 times and scored 20 or more points three times.

PEBBLEBROOK PIPELINE

Rider Head Coach Kevin Baggett added Dwight Murray, Jr. as a transfer from Incarnate Word for the 2020-21 season and he immediately became an All-MAAC Second Team performer. A year later, Baggett added his Pebblebrook (GA) High School teammate, Mervin James, following two years and an All-ASUN selection while at North Alabama. James started 31 of 33 games played, averaging 11.1 points and 5.0 rebounds per game. For a third-straight year, Baggett has gone to the Pebblebrook well, adding freshman Kami Young, a 2,000-point scorer in high school with a reputation as a sharpshooter.

EUROPEAN TOUR TIMES TWO

Rider embarked on a week-long tour of Belgium, The Netherlands and France in late August. Rider won all of its three exhibition games against top competition in Belgium, while also enjoying a top-notch cultural experience. The Broncs again headed across the pond for the MAAC/ASUN Dublin Challenge, Nov. 18-19, in Ireland. Rider fell in a pair of games to Stetson and Central Arkansas.





TRANSFER TALENT

The Broncs have added talent for this season, including four players through the transfer portal. Tariq Ingraham joined the Broncs for second semester last year after parts of three seasons at Wake Forest. He was a high school teammate of Ajiri Ogemuno-Johnson and is expected to be an inside-outside threat for the Broncs. A former All-CAA Third Team selection at Towson and a contributor at Rhode Island before an injury robbed him of the last season-plus, Allen Betrand started the Broncs' exhibition game against Cabrini and scored 13 points on 5-of-6 shooting. Adetokunbo Bakare also brings Division I experience, having played 2020-21 at NJIT before playing last season at Indian Hills C.C. Transferring up from Division II Lincoln, Zahrion Blue was his conference's Player of the Year after averaging 19.2 points and 7.5 rebounds per game last year. A Princeton, NJ, native, he's the most local recruit the Broncs have had in recent years.

IT BACK TO THE BRONCS

Rider legend Jason Thompson '08 begins a new chapter of his career as the Broncs' Special Assistant to the Head Coach this season. The 2008 NBA Lottery Pick announced the end of his 13-year pro-playing career, including the first eight in the NBA with the Sacramento Kings, Golden State Warriors and Toronto Raptors, this Fall. Thompson was an Associated Press Honorable Mention All-America, US Basketball Writers' Association District II Player of the Year, the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 3 selection, MAAC Player of the Year, and the MAAC Defensive Player of the Year at Rider. He compiled 2,040 points (third-most ever at Rider) and a Rider-record 1,171 rebounds, including a Broncs single-season-best 412 in 2007-08. His 235 career blocks and 91 rejections in 2007-08 are also Rider records. He was a first-ballot Rider Athletics Hall of Fame inductee in 2016, and his No. 1 jersey hangs from the rafters of Alumni Gym as one of only two Rider men's basketball players of all-time to have their numbers retired (Darrick Suber, No. 4). Thompson went on to play 541 games for the Sacramento Kings in the NBA, the most ever for the franchise while based in Sacramento, compiling over 5,000 points and 3,750 rebounds in seven seasons, before splitting his eighth season in 2015-16 with the Golden State Warriors and Toronto Raptors.

POWELL PRODUCES LATE

Allen Powell stepped up in the last 16 games of 2021-22, averaging 15.3 points. Included in the stretch was conversions on 21-straight attempts from the free-throw line. He turned up his aggressiveness, getting to the free-throw line 57 times in the last 16 games, compared to the 22 free-throw attempts he had through the first 17 games of the year. After averaging 7.7 points on 28.7 percent shooting from the floor (29-101) and 26.4 percent (14-53) from long range through 11 games, Powell averaged 14.2 points on 39.8 percent (104-261) from the floor and 39.7 percent (54-136) from long range in the last 22. The tale of two seasons mirrors Powell's performance in 2020-21, when he started the season 9-of-30 (30.0 percent) from deep through 12 games, before turning it on with 51.9 percent (28-54) shooting in the season's final 11 games to lead the MAAC at 44.0 percent (35-84) on the year.

14-1 RUN (BABY RUN)

The Broncs used a 14-1 second-half run to turn a 41-36 deficit into a lead it wouldn't relinquish Feb. 11, 2022, at Saint Peter's newly-renovated and renamed Run Baby Run Arena. Defense was the catalyst in the run, which extended to a 22-6 spurt, covering 12:32 of game time in which Rider did not allow a Saint Peter's field goal and only six free throws made. Only a lay-up with nine seconds left and the game well in hand prevented the Broncs from holding Saint Peter's without a conversion in the final 12:42. During the Peacocks' dry spell, Rider forced 13-straight missed field-goal attempts and five turnovers. Saint Peter's, of course, would go on to make college basketball history as the first No. 15 seed in tournament annals to reach the Elite Eight.

MURRAY MOVES PAST 1,000

Dwight Murray, Jr. eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau for his collegiate career on Dec. 3, 2021, at Iona. He accomplished the feat in 94 games, spanning two seasons at Incarnate Word and 34 games over two years at Rider. He averaged 8.1 points per game over 61 games in 2018-19 and 2019-20 for the Cardinals, before almost doubling that production at 15.3 ppg. over the next 33 games at Rider.

Two-time MAAC Coach of the Year Kevin Baggett returns for his 11th season as the Rider University head basketball coach in 2022-23. The 2022-23 season is the 17th for Baggett as a member of the Rider staff, serving two as an assistant coach and four as an associate head coach. In the last 16 years, Rider has compiled 272 wins, the third-most in the MAAC behind only Iona (295) and Siena (273). Baggett has coached on the Division I level for 26 years and has been on the Rider staff since the 2006-07 season.

'Baggs' is a two-time MAAC Coach of the Year (2015 and 2018) and has been a finalist for three different National Coach of the Year Awards - the Ben Jobe Award, the Joe B. Hall Award and the Hugh Durham Award.

As Head Coach at Rider, Baggett has led his players to 22 All-MAAC honors and two MAAC Sixth Player of the Year awards. The total increases to 32 including six seasons as an assistant coach, with mentorship of 2008 NBA Lottery Pick Jason Thompson, the 2008 MAAC Player of the Year and two-time MAAC Defensive Player of the Year, to his credit. In addition, he's coached six MAAC All-Rookie Team honorees.

In his first season at Rider, Baggett took a team with just two returning starters and six total letterwinners that was picked to finish seventh in the 10-team Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference in 2013 and finished in second place. With an emphasis on defense, Baggett's Broncs led the MAAC in three-point field goal percentage defense in 2012-13 and was second in overall field goal percentage defense, third in blocks and fourth in points allowed.

He guided the 2012-13 Broncs to a 19-win season, the most by a Rider rookie head coach since Bob Greenwood led Rider to a 20-win season in 1962-63. The only other Rider basketball coach to compile 19 wins in his rookie campaign was the legendary Clair Bee. Included in the 19 wins was Rider's first-ever Division I national postseason tournament victory, a road win at Hartford in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT). The last time Rider had won a game in a national postseason tournament came in 1957, when the Roughriders won a pair of games in the NCAA College Division Championships (now NCAA Division II).

In 2013-14, Coach Baggett took a young team and produced two All-MAAC performers along with a MAAC All-Rookie team selection. His 2013-14 squad was ranked eighth in the nation in three-point field goal percentage and was 51st in Division I in three-point field goals made.

In 2014-15, Baggett took a squad that was picked seventh in the MAAC and guided the team to a 21-win season and a second place finish in the conference, earning MAAC Coach of the Year honors as Rider was selected to play in the College Basketball Invitational tournament. Baggett was a finalist for the Ben Jobe National Coaching Award for the second time in three years and he was named the UPS All-District 1 Coach of the Year.

The Broncs had another very successful campaign in 2016-17, winning 18 games and advancing to the MAAC Championship Quarterfinals. Rider was offered the chance to play in multiple national postseason tournaments, but declined. Seniors Jimmie Taylor and Kahlil Thomas were each named to the All-MAAC Third Team. Rider finished first in the league in rebounds per game (40.3), with three Broncs - Thomas, Norville Carey and Taylor - finishing in the top 20 individually.

2017-18 was a banner year for Baggett and the Broncs. Picked to finish seventh in the MAAC after losing four starters to graduation, the Broncs won 22 games, a share of the MAAC Regular Season Championship and advanced to the NIT for the second time

in program history. Baggett was named MAAC Coach of the Year for the second time in six years, took NABC All-District 1 Coach and was also a finalist for the Hugh Durham and Ben Jobe Awards. Baggett guided four players to All-MAAC honors, including First Teamer Dimencio Vaughn, Second Teamer Stevie Jordan and Third Team honorees Jordan Allen and Frederick Scott. Scott was named MAAC 6th Player of the Year, while Allen earned All-Rookie Team honors. Vaughn was also selected to the NABC All-District Second Team and earned Second Team All-Met. As a team, Rider led the MAAC in field-goal percentage (.465), offensive rebounds per game (13.2), rebound margin (+2.6), steals per game (7.5), rebounds per game (39.2), turnover margin (+2.2) and turnovers forced per game (15.4). Jordan led the league in assists (5.9) for the second-straight year and was 26th in the nation. Allen's 2.88 three-point field goals made per game ranked 50th in the country, while Vaughn's 1.83 steals per game were 55th. Baggett earned his 100th career win on Jan. 26, 2018, against Saint Peter's.

Stevie Jordan and Frederick Scott repeated as All-MAAC Second and Third Team selections, respectively, in 2018-19, as the Broncs finished tied for second in the MAAC Regular Season Standings. Jordan recorded his 1,000th career point, becoming the 37th player in Rider history to reach the plateau.

In 2019-20, Tyere Marshall joined the ranks of All-MAAC selections, earning Third Team recognition. Dimencio Vaughn returned to All-MAAC First Team form, while Scott earned his third-straight Third Team honor. Vaughn, Scott and Marshall became the 38th, 39th, and 40th Broncs to score their 1,000th points in the cranberry and white. The Broncs compiled an 18-12 overall record and a 12-8 mark in league play. Baggett's Broncs earned the No. 3 seed in the MAAC Championships and were riding a three-game winning streak when the tournament was halted due to COVID-19.

Rider once again won a MAAC Tournament game in 2020-21 under Baggett, taking an opening-round contest against sixth-seeded Canisius. Dwight Murray, Jr. earned All-MAAC Second Team and NABC All-District 1 Second Team honors.

While 2021-22 had its up's and down's, the year ended on a high note, as Baggett led the Broncs to a pair of MAAC Tournament wins, including an upset of top-seeded Iona in the quarterfinals. Dimencio Vaughn earned All-MAAC Second Team honors and Dwight Murray, Jr. was named to the MAAC All-Championship Team after hitting the game-winning shot against Iona with six seconds remaining in regulation.

Baggett was named the Rider men's basketball head coach at a standing room only press conference on May 24, 2012.

"This was a popular decision," Rider Director of Athletics Don Harnum said at that time. "It was also a convenient decision, but let me make it very clear, this was not a hire of convenience. This was a hire because I firmly believe and am very confident that Kevin is the right person to lead this program in the future."

Baggett hails from Burlington, NJ and was a 2006 inductee into the South Jersey Hall of Fame. He was a member of the Saint Joseph's 1985-86 basketball team that compiled a 26-6 record and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. He received his bachelor's degree in marketing from Saint Joseph's in June, 1989.

Baggett came to Rider from the University of Maryland Baltimore County, where he served as assistant coach from 2004-06. At UMBC Baggett recruited an America East All-Rookie Team member who went on to earn First Team All-Conference honors three times, as well as a pair of transfers from the Colonial Athletic Association who went on to earn All-America East honors.

Baggett has also served as an assistant coach at James Madison, Howard, Western Kentucky and Coastal Carolina.
