### **DIRECTIONS TO THE ROCK AND MORROW FIELD HOUSE**

From I- 79, take Exit 105 (Slippery Rock). Turn left at the stop sign at the end of the exit ramp and follow State Route 108 north into Slippery Rock. At the traffic light, turn right onto Main Street. Follow Main Street to the second traffic light (Kiestler Road). Turn left onto Kiestler Road and proceed to the flashing light. Turn left onto the SRU campus. At the dead end, turn left to go to Morrow Field House or turn right to go to Visitors parking areas in the West Lake or East Lake parking areas. Please note: Parking adjacent to Morrow Field House is reserved for SRU staff during school hours but is available to the general public after 5 p.m. on weekdays and throughout the weekend.

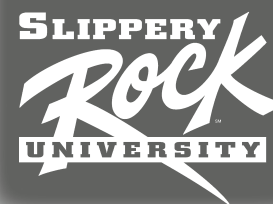

Laurel Heilman "came home" to accept the job as head women's basketball coach at Slippery Rock University nine seasons ago and immediately found the fit to be a good one.

"It's been everything I thought it would be," she says of the experience of coming back to the school at which she was once a player and assistant coach. "It's still a special feeling every time I step on the court that I used to play on."

Coach Heilman was a four-year letterwinner and two-time team captain at The Rock. She was captain of the 1985-86 PSAC championship team and earned All-PSAC first-team academic and athletic honors.

Following receipt of a Bachelor of Science degree in physical education/health in 1986, Coach Heilman remained at The Rock and served two seasons as an assistant coach while she completed work on her Master of Education degree in athletic administration.

Coach Heilman left The Rock in 1988 to become assistant coach

at her high school alma mater, Bethel Park, for one season. She was then named as an assistant coach at Rochester before accepting the job as head coach at Allegheny College in 1992.

At Allegheny, Coach Heilman compiled a 109-95 record in eight seasons and departed two wins shy of becoming the Gators' all-time winningest coach.

She led

Allegheny to 16 or more wins three separate seasons and coached 10 all-conference performers.

Coach Heilman has a 93-122 record in seven seasons at The Rock and owns a 16-year head coaching record of 202-217.

Three of her Rock teams have earned berths in the conference playoffs. She has tutored four players who attained All-America and first-team All-PSAC honors.

In past years, she served on the Division II East Region advisory Committee, as well as the WBCA Jostens-Berenson selection committee.

Away from school, Hoffman is a member of

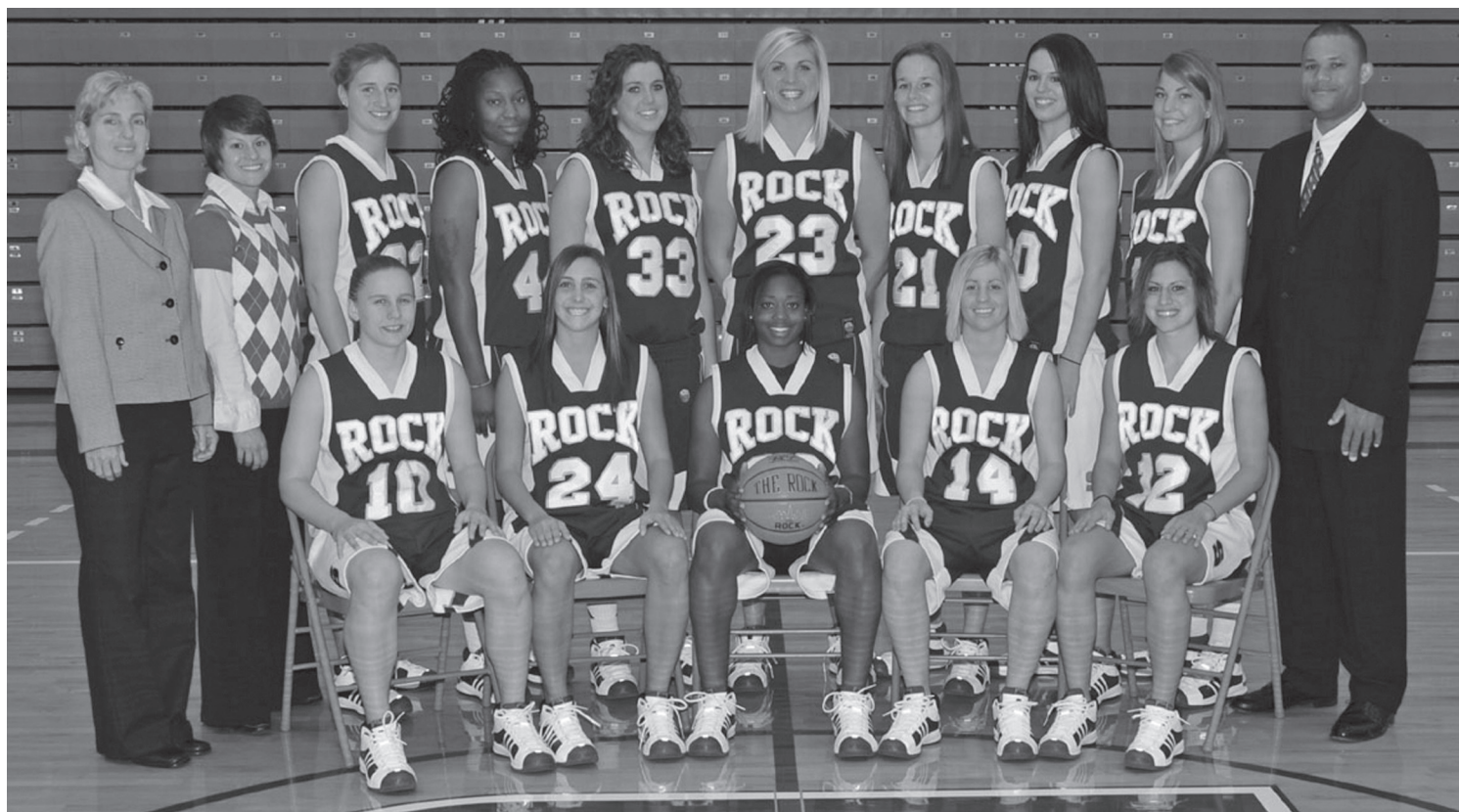


the Pittsburgh Passion, a member of the Independent Women's Football League. She scored her first professional touchdown, a 16-yard run, on her first-ever rushing attempt.

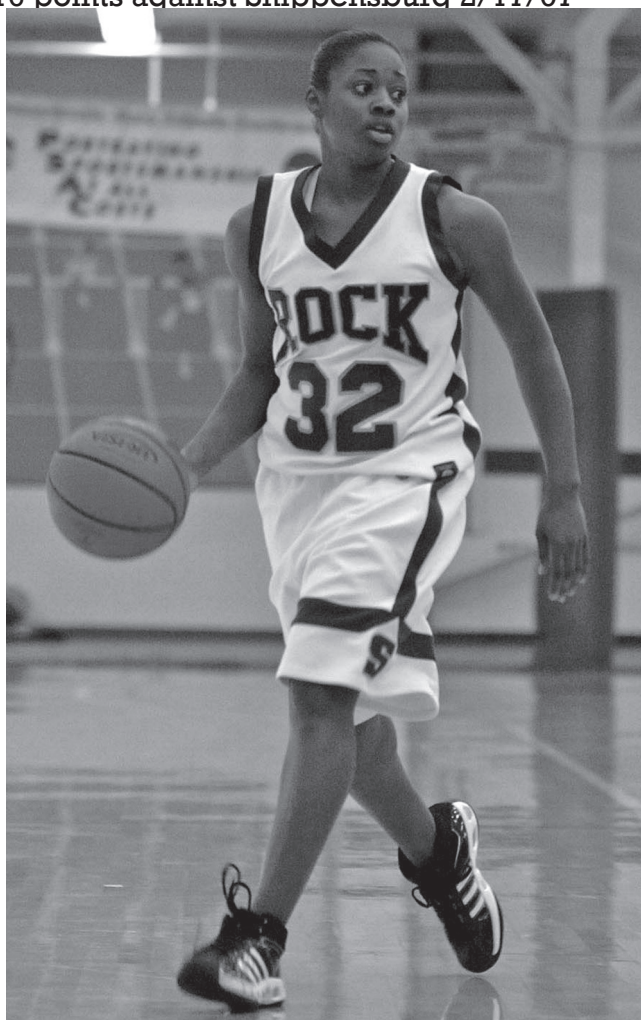

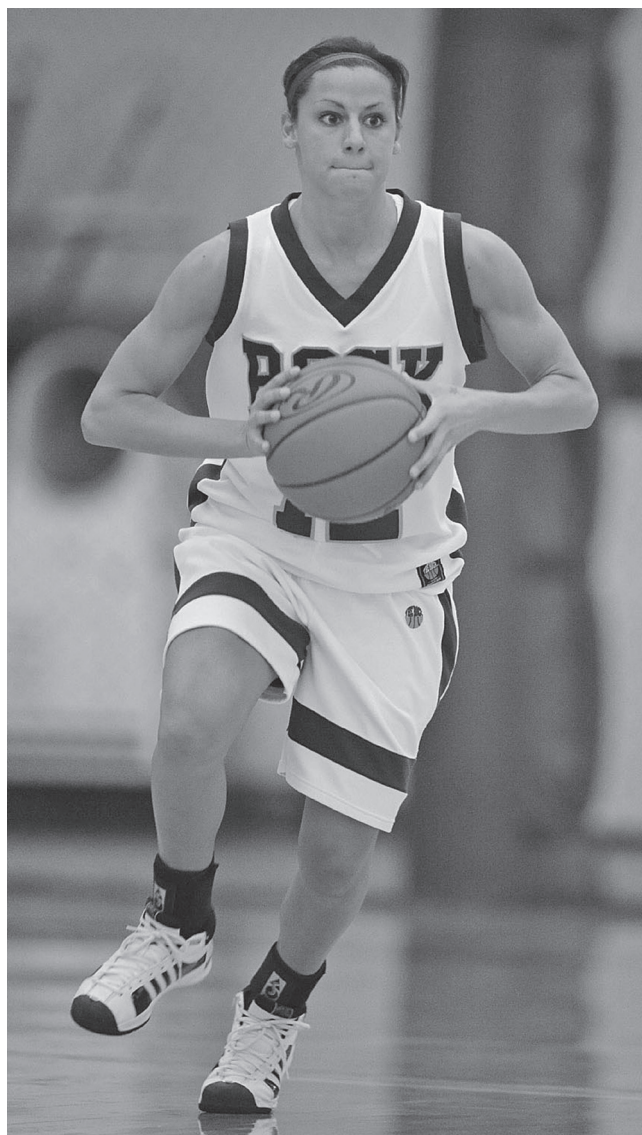

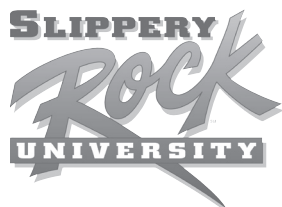

In 1980-81, she returned to The Rock and served as a women's basketball graduate assistant under Judy Battles.

From 1981-89, Parsons served as head coach at Thiel College, where she compiled a 110-73 record and led teams to four Presidents Athletic Conference titles in eight seasons.

Parsons has been the head coach at Clarion, a Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference-Western Division rival of SRU, since August 18, 1989 and has compiled a 270-229 record in 18 seasons as the Golden Eagles' head coach. She owns a 380-302 career record in 26 seasons as a collegiate head coach.

Parsons has served on the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Board of Directors since 2004 and was the 2007-08 USA Today ESPN Board of Coaches chairwoman.

## Did you know?



### C. VIVIAN STRINGER

Head coach  
Rutgers University  
(NCAA Division I)

Vivian Stringer earned both her bachelor's (1970) and master's (1973) degrees from SRU.

One of the most successful women's college basketball coaches in the country, she holds the distinction of being the first coach – male or female – to lead three different teams to NCAA Division I Final Four appearances: Cheyney (1982), Iowa (1993) and Rutgers (2000 and 2007). Her 2007 team played in the national championship game.

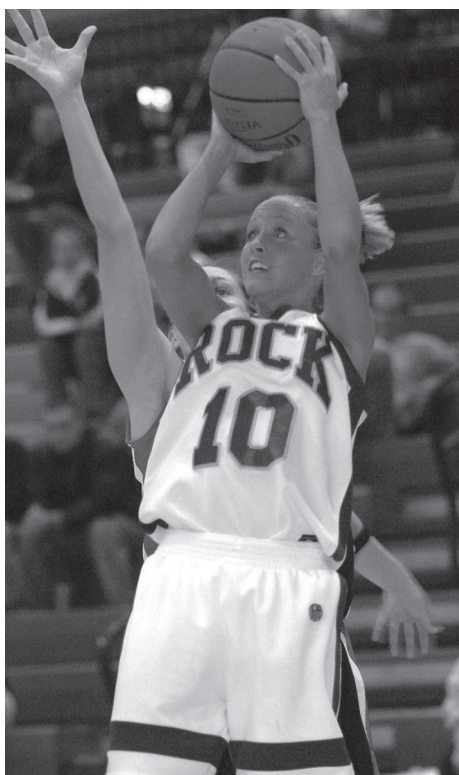
Stringer began the 2008-09 season with an 804-267 career record in 37 seasons. She has led teams to 20 or more wins in 29 of those seasons and is one of only three women's basketball coaches to have recorded 800 or more career victories.

She served as an assistant coach for the gold medal-winning U.S. team at the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece.

Stringer has earned three national "Coach of the Year" honors during her career.

A 2001 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, Stringer – a former basketball and field hockey student-athlete – was also a member of the first-ever class (1984) of inductees into the SRU Athletic Hall of Fame. She was also named as the 1983 recipient of SRU's "Outstanding Alumni Award."

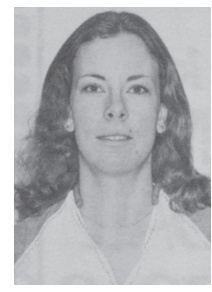

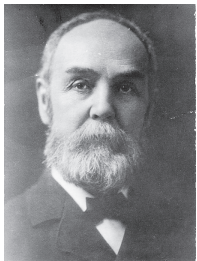

# MORROW FIELD HOUSE

Morrow Field House, the home of The Rock athletic department and site of home men's basketball games, is named in honor of Dr. James Morrow, to whom goes the credit for organizing and starting what is now Slippery Rock University.

Dr. Morrow was hired in 1889 as the first principal of Slippery Rock State Normal School. Prior to assuming that position, Dr. Morrow was a grade-school principal on Pittsburgh's north side, a licensed lawyer and attained the rank of captain in Company F of the First Virginia Volunteer Infantry during the Civil War.

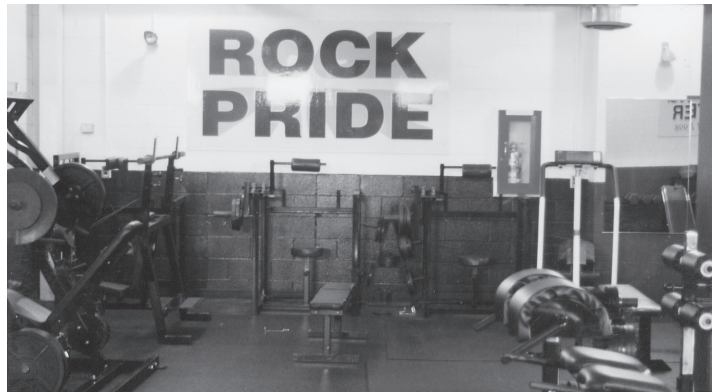
Dr. Morrow received his Bachelor of Arts, Master of Arts and Doctor of Philosophy degrees from Washington & Jefferson University.

Morrow Field House, in addition to being the home court of The Rock men's basketball team, hosts home competitions for SRU's women's volleyball, women's basketball, men's wrestling, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's water polo and men's and women's indoor track



and field teams. The facility also serves as the site of various team practice sessions when inclement weather conditions force teams to move indoors.

The Rock's athletic and physical education department offices are also housed in the Field House, which has taken on a relatively new look thanks to an extensive renovation project during the 2000-04 academic years.



## Top-notch weight training facilities

The Rock women's basketball team and all SRU student-athletes have access to some of the finest weight-training equipment and facilities available. **The Garry W. Benford Weight Room** (left), located on the lower level of Morrow Field House, was named on June 14, 2002, in honor of a former Rock powerlifter who went on to win world championships in the sport. **The Jerry Bejbl Weight Training Center** (right), located in the N. Kerr Thompson Stadium complex, was named on Nov. 15, 1997, in honor of a former Rock football and baseball student-athlete. Both Mr. Benford and Dr. Bejbl provided financial donations that covered the major portion of the funding for the construction of the weight-training facilities named in their honor.

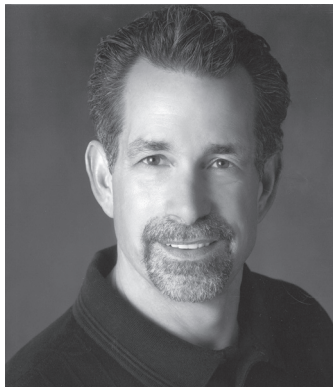

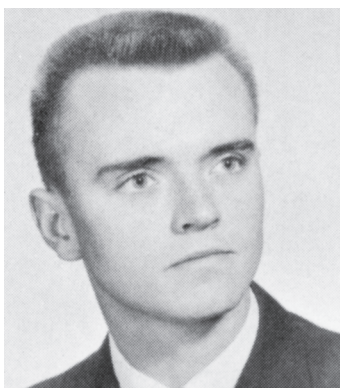

# ROCK WINS 2007-08 DIXON TROPHY

*SRU was recognized as the PSAC's most successful all-around program for the first time in the 13-year history of the award*

Slippery Rock University was named in May 2008 as the winner of the 2007-08 Dixon Trophy awarded to the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference's top all-around program.

The honor is the first received by SRU in the 13-year history of the award. The Rock finished third one year ago, which equalled its 2002-03 finish, Slippery Rock's highest prior to this year.

"We are extremely proud to be this year's Dixon Trophy recipient," SRU Director of Athletics Paul Lueken said. "To be crowned as 'the champion' of a conference loaded with the quality talent that exists in the PSAC is a real tribute to the time and efforts put forth by our student-athletes, coaches and administrators."

SRU nipped second-place West Chester by two points (132.5 to 130.5) in this year's close competition. California U. of Pa. finished third with 125.5 points, followed by Kutztown with 125, Indiana U. of Pa. 123.5, Shippensburg 122, Bloomsburg 120 and 2006-07 winner Lock Haven 119.

The Dixon Trophy is named after F. Eugene Dixon, Jr., former

chairman of the Board of Governors of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education. It is awarded annually to the PSAC member institution that accumulates the most points based on results of conference playoffs and/or regular-season records.

Each institution's point total is calculated by adding its top six men's finishes and top six women's finishes in 21 conference sports.

SRU is the sixth school to win the Dixon Trophy. Shippensburg has won the honor a conference-best five times, while Lock Haven has reigned five times and Bloomsburg two seasons. SRU and 2005-06 winner Kutztown are each one-time recipients.

The Rock's award-winning effort in 2007-08 was paced by four PSAC championships won by track and field programs under the guidance of SRU Athletic Hall of Famer John Papa. SRU won outright conference titles in the men's indoor and outdoor and women's outdoor competitions and claimed a share of the women's indoor title.

SRU has each of the last three PSAC women's outdoor championships. This year's women's indoor co-championship

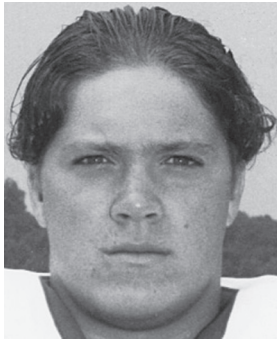

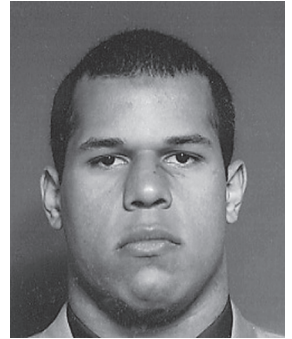

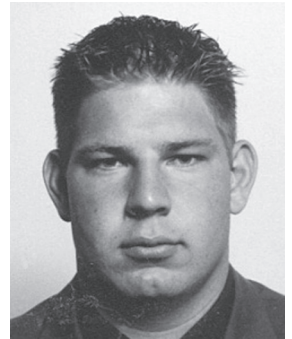

## Cummings and Hansen Named Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year

Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Commissioner Steve Murray is proud to recognize 1,488 student-athletes from the league who will be known as "Scholar-Athletes" for the 2007-08 academic year. The total eclipses last year's figure of 1,420.

Atop the list are the 2007-08 PSAC Pete Nevins Scholar-Athletes of the Year: Mansfield's Chris Cummings and Slippery Rock's Jennifer Hansen.

The PSAC Pete Nevins Scholar-Athlete of the Year Awards are presented to the top student-athletes who have achieved at least a 3.25 cumulative grade point average while competing at an outstanding athletic level. Student-athletes must have been recognized as a Fall, Winter or Spring Top Ten Award winner to be eligible.

In its 18th year of existence, the awards were renamed in 2007 to honor East Stroudsburg's long-time sports information director Pete Nevins, who passed away earlier that year after a short battle with cancer. Nevins held his position at ESU for 33 years, and it is estimated that he wrote articles on more than 12,000 ESU events that covered more than 5,000 student-athletes.

Cummings, a graduate student at Mansfield, excelled in his final season of eligibility. He was the only PSAC male to garner All-America honors in cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field. His highest national showing came with a second-place finish in the mile during the indoor championships. At other NCAA Championships, he placed sixth in the 1,500m during the outdoor season, and was 26th at the cross country nationals. During the indoor season, Cummings won the mile and ran a leg of the winning distance medley relay at the PSAC Championships. He was crowned co-MVP of the meet and was later recognized as the 2008 PSAC Indoor Track Athlete of the Year.

Recently named an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship recipient, Cummings maintained a 4.0 GPA while pursuing his master's degree in education. As an undergraduate, Cummings carried a 3.86 GPA as a physics major. He finishes his storied career at Mansfield as a five-time All-American - twice each in indoor and outdoor track and field, and once in cross country. Between the two track seasons, the Mansfield native owns school records in nine individual and four relay events.

Hansen, a junior elementary education major, has established a 4.0 GPA. The Charleston, W. Va. product continues to set new standards in the pole vault, which includes All-America citations during this year's indoor and outdoor seasons, finishing third at both national events.

Her outdoor season included a vault of 13-3.75 at the league championships, establishing a new meet record. Coupled with her third-place effort in the long jump, Hansen was named the Most Valuable Field Athlete for the meet. Just a few weeks earlier Hansen established a new PSAC overall record in the pole vault, clearing 13-5.25 at Allegheny's Gator Invitational. It marked the fourth time in two weeks that she had broken the conference record. During the indoor season, Hansen registered a meet and overall record by vaulting 13-1.25 at the conference championship and was later honored as the PSAC Field Athlete of the Year.

Hansen was one of only three PSAC student-athlete to earn first-team Academic All-America status from ESPN The Magazine, and the only one to do so in the cross country/track and field category. She is a five-time PSAC Champion and four-time All-American.

# Rock achieves best-ever finish in NACDA Directors’ Cup

**CLEVELAND, Ohio** – The Rock finished 26th in the final 2007-08 Division II U.S. Sports Academy Directors’ Cup Standings announced by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics.

That finish was the highest ever recorded by SRU, bettering a 27th-place finish in 1999-2000, and represented an improvement of 28 places from The Rock’s 54th-place finish a year ago.

This year’s final finish also represented a four-spot improvement over SRU’s 30th-place standing at the end of the 2007-08 winter sports season.

SRU, which last month won its first-ever Dixon Trophy as the top all-around program in the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, had 425 points in this year’s Directors’ Cup competition, the third highest total compiled by a PSAC institution.

California U. of Pa. finished eighth with 607.5 points, while West Chester is in 12th place with 555.5 points.

The next five PSAC schools ranked lower than SRU were Bloomsburg (28th place, 414 points), Edinboro (47th place, 319.5 points), Indiana U. of Pa. (Tie-64th place, 272 points), Lock Haven (66th place, 270 points) and Shippensburg (82nd place, 217.5 points).

Two other PSAC schools are included in the top 100: Kutztown in 89th place with 203.5 points and Clarion in 94th place with 195 points.

Millersville was in 107th place with 169.5 points, East Stroudsburg 121st place with 148.5 points, Mansfield tied for 160th place with 92 points and Cheyney tied for 215th place with 25 points.

Mercyhurst and Gannon, which will join the PSAC at the start of the 2008-09 academic year, finished 132nd (136.5 points) and 157th (97 points), respectively.

Points are awarded based on each institution’s national finish in up to 14 sports, seven women’s and seven men’s.

The top five teams in the Division II ranking were Grand Valley State (Mich.) with 1028.75 points, Abilene Christian (Texas) with 808 points, Minnesota State Mankato with 788.75 points, UC San Diego with 752 points and Tampa with 650 points.

# PA. STATE ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

The Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, with 57 years of organized competition, has evolved into one of the NCAA's largest and most heralded intercollegiate athletic conferences.

The 2008-09 academic year will be a groundbreaking one for the PSAC, as the league will expand beyond its original 14 members for the first time since its official formation in 1951. New full-time members Gannon University and Mercyhurst College, along with associate member Long Island University – C.W. Post, expect to complement the PSAC's already solid foundation.

With 16 full-time institutions, the PSAC shares distinction with the West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference as the NCAA Division II's largest in terms of membership. League expansion has brought acclaim through postseason opportunities, as well. In 2008-09, the Conference will sponsor 23 championships, the most for leagues in Division II.

Highly competitive on a regional and national level,

PSAC schools annually combine to send nearly one-third of its teams into NCAA postseason play. Ultimately, the membership's success has yielded 40 NCAA team and 218 individual title winners.

While proud of its athletic accomplishments, the league also has evolved into one of Division II's finest from an academic standpoint. Today, well over a quarter of the PSAC's estimated 5,300 participants are honored each year as "Scholar-Athletes" for maintaining a grade-point average of 3.25 or better - a total that has nearly doubled since PSAC Scholar-Athletes were first recognized in the mid-1990s.

The PSAC was organized in 1951 for the purpose of promoting and administering men's athletic programs of the 14 state teachers colleges in Pennsylvania.

In 1977, due to the interest and growth of women's athletics, the conference was restructured to provide for women's programs.

Upon its formation, the league did not have a standard competitive division. However, in 1980, the league voted to reclassify the entire conference to NCAA Division II.

Although all 16 current institutions are members of Division II, eight schools also compete at the Division I level in select sports. PSAC schools enroll over 117,000 students and claim over 661,000 alumni, including 430,000 who reside in Pennsylvania.

The PSAC is governed by the presidents of the 16 member institutions. It employs a commissioner, two assistant commissioners and a director of media relations at its headquarters in Lock Haven, Pa.

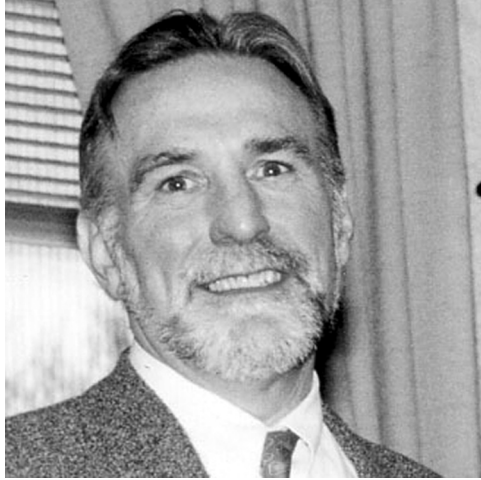

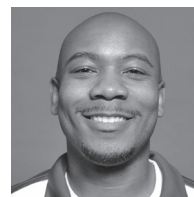

# SLIPPERY ROCK UNIVERSITY

Slippery Rock University opened its doors March 26, 1889, as Slippery Rock State Normal School. Its first president was James E. Morrow, grandfather of Anne Morrow Lindbergh. Enrollment for the first session was 168 students. Limited to a singular mission in teacher education, the normal school fulfilled its mandate well, and over the years graduated thousands of teachers qualified to staff public schools in Pennsylvania and the nation.



In 1916, the school was purchased by the commonwealth, and in 1926 became a four-year teachers college, permitted the following year to change its name to State Teachers College at Slippery

Rock. The institution continued its tradition of teacher training while offering four-year, bachelor's degrees. Although the curricular preparations were in elementary education and in a number of secondary education subjects, the area of academic focus assigned during that era by the Pennsylvania Department of Education was health and physical education. It was in that concentration that the institution soon achieved a national reputation for excellence.

Slippery Rock State College was established in 1960 and for the first time could award undergraduate and graduate degrees in the liberal arts and in the professions. Expanded curricular offerings and an increased number of degree programs created an appreciable rise in enrollment. From 1960 to 1970, enrollment climbed from 1,314 to 5,446.

Today, as part of the State System of Higher Education, Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania enjoys an enrollment of 8,325 students in more than 100 undergraduate, graduate and doctoral degree programs, including students in its College of Business, Information and Social Sciences, College of Health, Environment and Science, College of Humanities, Fine and Performing Arts, College of Education, its School of Physical Therapy and School of Business.

Students are currently enrolled from some 30 states and some 35 countries.

As one of the largest campuses in Pennsylvania, SRU is situated on 600+ acres in 52 buildings.

Additions to campus include the 1,500-seat Jack Critchfield Park baseball complex, made possible through a generous gift from 1955 SRU graduate, Dr. Jack Critchfield

and his wife, Mary; and the School of Physical Therapy Building. The multi-million dollar Robert N. Aebersold Student Recreation Center and the ROCK apartments on campus are meeting student demands for modern facilities. Those visiting campus will see SRU's new \$14.5-million Advanced Technology and Science Hall and the Slippery Rock University Foundation Inc., \$110-million campus residence hall replacement project which opened in 2006. Others will enjoy the refurbishing of Carruth Rizza Hall (formerly West Hall) which has undergone \$2.5 million in historic restoration made possible by a gift from the late Mrs. Ethel Carruth of Houston, Texas.

To complement on-campus resources, today's students have access to learning facilities at nearby Moraine State Park, Pymatuning State Park, Jennings Environmental Education Center, McKeever Environmental Learning Center and at the Marine Science Laboratory at Wallops Island, Virginia.

## **The Story Behind the Slippery Rock Name**

Stories about how Slippery Rock received its name are nearly as colorful as the name itself. The favorite tale goes something like this:

In 1779, a certain Col. Daniel Brodhead was in command of Fort Pitt at the present site of the city of Pittsburgh. Col. Brodhead begged Gen. George Washington to allow him to lead an expedition against the Seneca Indians who were raiding settlements in the area. The troops encountered the Indians and were forced to flee for their lives.

In pursuit, the soldiers crossed a creek at a place where the stream bed was comprised of large, smooth rocks. Wearing heavy boots, the soldiers were able to cross the creek safely, but the Seneca Indians, wearing smooth moccasins, slipped and fell on the rocks — enabling the cavalry to make its escape.

Historically, the Indians called the stream "Wechachochapohka," which means — "a slippery rock." Since the location of the stream is in the heart of land once occupied by the Delawares, many believe the authenticity of this legend.

Once the Slippery Rock Creek was christened, the adjoining town later became known by the catchy name.
