### FOSTER AUDITORIUM

Beginning with the 2011 season, the Alabama volleyball team will compete in Foster Auditorium, a newly renovated facility located off Hackberry Lane between University Avenue and Paul Bryant Drive. The volleyball coaches offices and team locker room facilities are also located in Foster Auditorium.

### MEDIA PARKING

There is no specific media parking area for Alabama volleyball matches. Media members are allowed to park in any of the lots adjacent to Foster Auditorium.

# TOP RANKED

The University of Alabama perennially ranks among the top 50 public universities in the nation in U.S. News and World Report's annual college rankings and ranked 34th among public universities in the 2011 rankings. UA's latest college rankings include:

- The School of Law is ranked 38th among all law schools in the nation, spring 2010.
- The School of Library and Information Studies is ranked 22nd nationally, spring 2009.
- The undergraduate business program is ranked 35th among public undergraduate business schools and 57th when the private universities are included, fall 2010.

Enrollment at The University of Alabama reached a record high of 30,232 for fall 2010. The entering freshman class, at 5,563 students, is the largest in UA history and included almost 1,400 students who had a 4.0 or higher high school grade point average.

The University of Alabama's fall 2010 freshman class ranks sixth in the nation among public universities in the enrollment of National Merit Scholars.

The University of Alabama has produced a total of 15 Rhodes Scholars. And, in the past two decades, we've produced 30 Goldwater Scholars, 19 Hollings Scholars, seven Truman Scholars, two Javits Fellows, one Udall Scholar and one Portz Scholar.

The University of Alabama led the nation with a record 10 students named to USA Today's 2010 All-USA College Academic Team. UA has had great success in placing students on this national team that honors the "best of the best" undergraduate academic all-stars from across the nation, having placed 46 students on the team since 2003. In addition to 2010, UA also had the most students on the list in 2003, 2005, 2006, 2008 and 2009 and tied for the top spot in 2007.

PRWeek Magazine has recognized the public relations program at The University of Alabama as one of the top-five programs in the nation each of the last three years.

The University of Alabama has been named to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll by the Corporation for National and Community Service. The Community Service Honor Roll is the highest federal recognition a school can achieve for its commitment to service learning and civic engagement.

# MAL M. MOORE

## A T H L E T I C S      D I R E C T O R

The University of Alabama's Director of Athletics since 1999, Mal Moore has made an indelible mark on one of the nation's most storied athletic programs, leading a department that has enjoyed tremendous success athletically and academically while enjoying an unprecedented period of growth during his tenure.



His leadership has been crucial in helping guide Alabama through a period that has been, at times, extremely challenging. His guidance and effort helped Alabama athletics weather the storm, while continuing to move in a positive direction toward a future that holds great promise.

Through his guidance, Alabama's athletic department remains focused on his vision of having all Crimson Tide athletic teams and student-athletes competitive at the highest level nationally while continuing to elevate athletic facilities at the Capstone to premier status nationally for all sports.

Moore's dedication to, and love of, the University of Alabama was recognized on March 28, 2007, when as a permanent tribute to his lifelong contributions to The University of Alabama, the Board of Trustees of The University of Alabama System officially dedicated the facility formerly known as The Football Building as the Mal M. Moore Athletic Facility.

During his tenure as Director of Athletics, Moore has overseen more than \$200 million of capital improvements to University of Alabama athletic facilities. Those projects have encompassed the entire scope of all Crimson Tide athletic programs and have benefitted every Alabama student-athlete, coach, and administrator.

Under Moore's direction, Alabama's athletic teams have produced three national championships – the 2009 football title and the 2002 and 2011 NCAA gymnastics championships – as well as several Southeastern Conference championships, winning titles in football, gymnastics, men's basketball, women's golf, men's golf, men's cross country, baseball and softball; taking SEC tournament titles in both baseball and softball. Alabama athletes have earned some of the highest honors the SEC and NCAA have to offer, including SEC Athlete of the Year, SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, NCAA Top VIII, NCAA Postgraduate Scholarships and NCAA Sportsperson of the Year. These honors are over and above the individual conference and national titles that Alabama athletes continue to bring home to the Capstone on a regular basis.

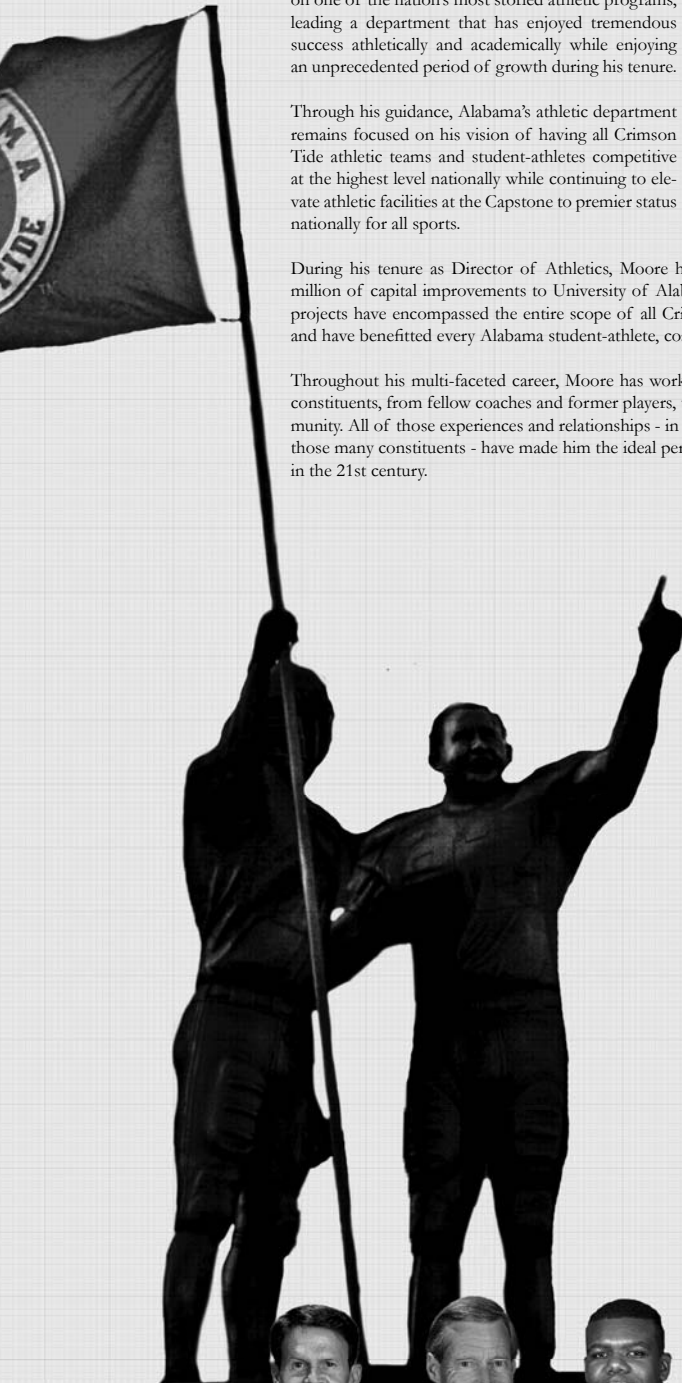
Throughout his multi-faceted career, Moore has worked with a diversified field of constituents, from fellow coaches and former players, to fans and the business community. All of those experiences and relationships - in addition to his ability to unify those many constituents - have made him the ideal person to lead Alabama athletics in the 21st century.

In addition to making his mark on Alabama, Moore has also had a national impact as a key member of several prestigious NCAA and college football committees. Moore has served on the NCAA Division I Football Issues Committee, the SEC Athletic Directors Bowl Advisory Committee and the Big Six Conferences Minority Coaches Forum.

Moore's distinguished record of service to UA began more than 50 years ago when he joined the Crimson Tide football squad as a scholarship player for Coach Paul "Bear" Bryant from 1958-62. Moore has the distinction of being a part of eight national championship teams (1961, 1964, 1965, 1973, 1978, 1979, 1992 and 2009) with the first coming as a player, the next six during his coaching career and the most recent during his tenure as director of athletics. As a player and coach, he was also part of 14 SEC championships and 27 bowl trips. He is the only individual connected with the Alabama program to be a part of eight national championships.

During a coaching career that spanned 31 years, Moore spent 22 of those at Alabama with stops at Montana State, Notre Dame and the NFL's St. Louis/Phoenix Cardinals. At Alabama, Moore started as a graduate assistant under Coach Bryant in 1964, then as defensive backfield coach for six seasons (1965-70) before becoming quarterbacks coach from 1971-82, serving as the Tide's first offensive coordinator starting in 1975. He would go on to coordinate all of the offensive plays for several of Alabama's national championship football teams.

A 1963 graduate of The University of Alabama, Moore holds both an undergraduate degree in sociology and a 1964 Master's degree in secondary education from the Capstone. Moore was born December 19, 1939, in Dozier, Ala. He and the late Mrs. Charlotte Moore have one daughter, Mrs. Steve (Heather) Cook of Scottsdale, Ariz., a granddaughter, Anna Lee, and a grandson, Charles Cannon.

## P R E S I D E N T



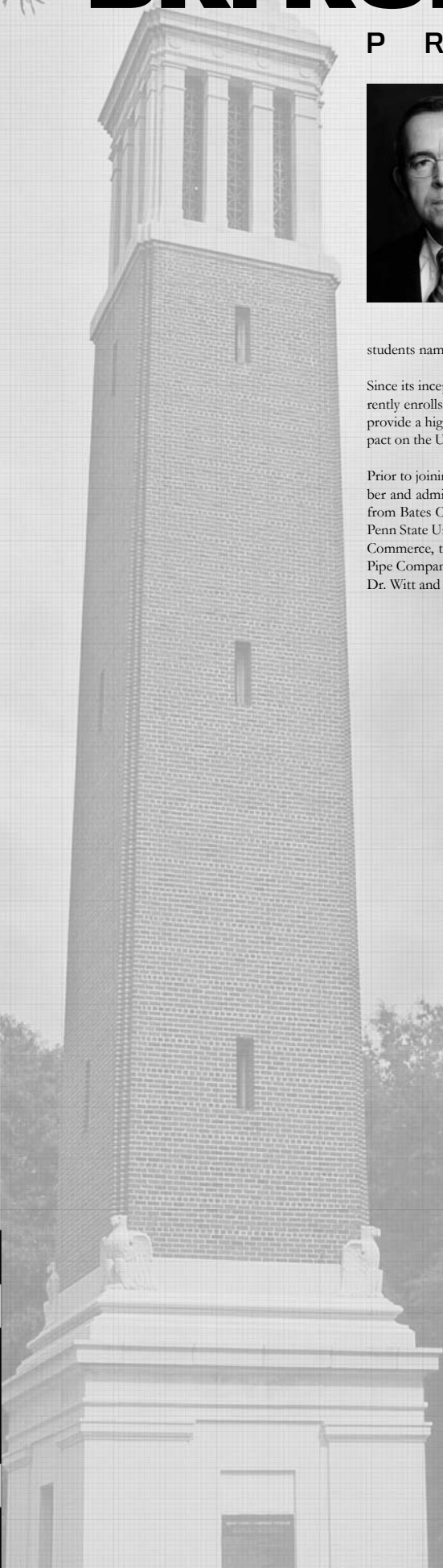
As president of The University of Alabama, Dr. Robert E. Witt has committed the University to an ambitious plan for academic growth and achievement.

His goals include increasing enrollment by recruiting academically talented students from Alabama and across the country, stimulating significant growth in research and strongly supporting the state's economic development efforts. Under his leadership, enrollment has reached record levels and now numbers more than 30,000.

Academic quality and scholarship opportunities for deserving students have increased significantly. The University ranks 6th nationally among public universities in the enrollment of National Merit Scholars and leads the nation in the number of students named to *USA Today's* All-USA College Academic Teams.

Since its inception in 2003, the University's Honors College has grown exponentially, and currently enrolls more than 1,300 freshmen each year. UA's loyal alumni and friends continue to provide a high level of support to the University, with private giving having an important impact on the University's ability to fund scholarships, faculty support and construction projects.

Prior to joining The University of Alabama in 2003, Dr. Witt spent 35 years as a faculty member and administrator in the University of Texas System. He received his B.A. in economics from Bates College, his M.B.A. from Tuck School at Dartmouth College, and his Ph.D. from Penn State University. He serves on the boards of directors of the West Alabama Chamber of Commerce, the Black Warrior Council Boy Scouts of America, and the American Cast Iron Pipe Company. He is a member of the Tuscaloosa County Industrial Development Authority. Dr. Witt and his wife, Sandee, have five grandchildren.





# Foster Auditorium

## Home of the Alabama Crimson Tide

The University of Alabama Athletics Department renovated and expanded Foster Auditorium to create a new home for the Crimson Tide's volleyball and women's basketball programs in 2011.

"We are pleased to be able to renew and restore Foster Auditorium to its position as a vital hub of campus life," Alabama Director of Athletics Mal Moore said. "Our volleyball and women's basketball programs will have a tremendous arena to practice and play in that is located in the heart of campus."

The restoration of the venerable three-story building was completed in January of 2011 in time for the women's basketball game between Alabama and Florida on Feb. 13, when the Tide defeated the Gators 64-59.

The remodel of the facility included refurbishing the arena portion of the building with new seating both on the floor level and the second level which overlooks the court, creating an impressive competitive atmosphere for both sports.

"From the outside, Foster is a magnificent building," head women's volleyball coach Ed Allen said. "Once you get to the inside you see the quality at which the building was renovated, with the ability to create an intimate environment. Everything was done first class."

The renovation also included suites for both programs that house the teams' locker rooms, team areas, meeting and video rooms and coaches' offices. A weight room and athletics training facilities were also included in the project.

"Foster Auditorium is one of the best volleyball facilities in the country," Allen said. "It's going to have a huge impact on our ability to attract the kind of athletes we expect to get at Alabama. For them to see the atmosphere they're going to play in and how they are going to be taken care of makes the facility vital to our success. The fact that we don't have to leave the arena to lift weights, practice or play will be enticing to future players at Alabama."



Originally built in 1939, Foster Auditorium was named in 1942 for Richard Clarke Foster, president of the University of Alabama from 1937-41. It was the largest and most expensive of 14 buildings added to campus between 1936 and 1939 using funds from the Public Works Administration.

In its original capacity, Foster served as home for intramurals sports, graduations, concerts, lectures and campus meetings. It also served as the home of several varsity athletic programs over the years, including the men's basketball team from 1939-68, women's basketball, which played a few games in Foster in their inaugural season in 1975, and gymnastics from 1975-84.

In the early years of the Alabama's volleyball program, the team practiced and competed in Foster. The women's volleyball program, which began in 1974, played their first 15 seasons (1974-81 and 1989-95) in Foster Auditorium. The program was discontinued from 1982-88. The volleyball program made the move away from Foster before the 1996 season, playing in the main arena of Coleman Coliseum from 1996-99. Beginning with the 2000 campaign, volleyball competed in the Coleman Auxiliary Volleyball Extension (CAVE) to 11 seasons, before returning to Foster Auditorium in 2011.

Additionally, the women's athletic program, including coaches and administrative offices, was located in Foster during the 1970s through the early 1980s.

Allen added, "Foster is going to create a lot of energy for the team and an atmosphere that fans will want to come back to. Playing in an intimate environment is going to be a huge home court advantage for us and it provides an opportunity to springboard the program. Additionally, it has all the bells and whistles that should help attract top-notch recruits. It was a huge selling point in my decision to come to Alabama."

COACHING STAFF

Director of Athletics Mal Moore announced the hiring of Ed Allen as the head women's volleyball coach at the University of Alabama on January 10, 2011. Allen comes to the Crimson Tide after being named the 2010 Conference USA Coach of the Year and the 2010 AVCA Midwest Regional Coach of the Year at the University of Tulsa.

Allen, who is the fourth head coach in the 30-year history of the Alabama volleyball program, led Tulsa to a school record 31 wins, including a perfect 20-0 record in C-USA, this past season. The 20 conference wins also set a new school mark. He also guided the Golden Hurricane to the school's first ever NCAA Tournament victory, a 3-0 upset win over No. 13 seeded LSU in December.

Tulsa captured the 2010 C-USA regular season title for the second time in school history, the first coming in 2006, Allen's first year with the program. He led Tulsa to a 31-3 campaign and a second round finish in the NCAA Tournament in 2010.

In five seasons at Tulsa, Allen led his team to at least 20 wins each year, and compiled an overall record of 133-37 (.782) with a 65-19 (.774) conference mark. He was the fastest Golden Hurricane coach to reach 100 wins since the program began in 1976, accumulating more wins in the first five seasons than any other coach in the history of the program.

A total of 24 Tulsa volleyball players were all-conference selections during Allen's tenure, including nine first-team selections, two player of the year honorees, one setter of the year honoree, and one freshman of the year awardee. In 2010, Tyler Henderson was named the C-USA Player of the Year, and garnered her second straight AVCA All-American selection. Henderson was the second all-American for Tulsa to be coached by Allen.

In his last eight seasons as a head coach, Allen has guided his teams to eight regular season or tournament championships. His first squad (2006) at Tulsa won the C-USA regular season title, while his second (2007) won the C-USA postseason tournament crown, earning

the school's first NCAA Tournament berth.

By defeating regular season champion Marshall and defending tournament champion UAB, Allen led the Golden Hurricane to their first ever NCAA Regional with Conference USA's automatic bid in 2007. The Hurricane set 13 school records during the 2007 season. In 2006, Allen not only led the Golden Hurricane to their first-ever regular season conference title, but he also led TU to a then-school record 13 league victories. The 27 wins were also, at the time, the most victories for a TU squad since the NCAA officially recognized the sport with a championship in 1982.

In 19 years (1992-2010) as a collegiate head coach, Allen has compiled a 494-183 (.729) career coaching mark, while coaching 61 all-conference performers and eight conference player of the year selections. Allen has earned conference coach of the year honors six times in his career, including the 2006 and 2010 Conference USA Coach of the Year awards.

Prior to Tulsa, Allen spent three seasons (2003-05) as the head volleyball coach at Presbyterian College in Clinton, South Carolina. During his tenure, Allen's teams compiled an overall 98-18 record, a 39-3 conference mark, won three straight South Atlantic Conference Championships, two conference tournament titles and qualified for the NCAA Division II National Tournament twice. At Presbyterian, Allen coached three conference players of the year, two conference tournament MVPs, one freshman of the year, 12 all-conference players, five all-region selections and two All-Americans.

Before that, Allen spent 11 years as head coach of the Anderson University volleyball program in Anderson, Ind. During his tenure, he built the program into one of the nation's premier NCAA Division III programs. His teams compiled a program-record 11 straight winning seasons, including nine 20-win seasons, won 17 tournament titles, and posted a 267-128 (.676) record. He coached 34 all-conference, 23 all-tournament, and two conference player of the year selections during his tenure with the Ravens.

Allen also served as assistant director of athletics at Anderson University for seven years where he was responsible for facility management. He is a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) and in the past served on the NCAA Division II Head Coaches Committee, NCAA Division II South Region Poll Committee and NCAA Division II South Region Player Committee while at Presbyterian.

In five of his final six years at Anderson, Allen's teams earned Academic All-America mentions and in each of his 11 years as head coach at Anderson the team compiled at least a 3.0 GPA. He also coached four academic all-region and two academic All-American selections at Anderson.

Prior to moving to the collegiate level, Allen was an assistant volleyball coach at Pendleton Heights (Ind.) High School for three years (1989-91) and also had a two-year mark of 33-6 as the junior varsity coach.

Allen earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1988 and his master's degree in athletic administration in 1996, both from Ball State (Ind.) University.

Allen, 46, and his wife, Karis, have three sons: Drake, Payton and Nolan.

Julia Silva joined the University of Alabama volleyball program as an assistant coach in 2011. In her first year with the program, Silva serves as the recruiting coordinator, oversee the setter position, and assist with the offensive game planning, as well as practice and game preparations.

Prior to coming to Tuscaloosa, Silva spent three seasons (2008-10) as a member of the University of Tulsa coaching staff. During her three seasons as an assistant coach at Tulsa, the program compiled a 78-21 (.715) overall record, including a 31-3 mark in 2010. In 2010, Tulsa set a school record for single season wins (31) and won the school's first ever NCAA Tournament match, a 3-0 victory over No. 13 seeded LSU.

She was also vital to the development of the team's setters, helping Jordan Clampitt win the Conference USA Setter of the Year award as a sophomore in 2010.

Silva made the transition from player to coach after being a three-year letterwinner for the Golden Hurricane from 2005-07. A three-time Division I AVCA Honorable Mention All-America selection, Silva was a two-time Conference USA Setter of the Year award winner.

Silva set school records for assists in a season each of her three years in a Golden Hurricane uniform, and was the first Tulsa setter to reach 4,000 career assists with 4,206. She is also the first TU volleyball player to have her jersey (No. 14) retired.

Silva posted 68 double-doubles and 17 triple-doubles during her career for the Hurricane. She was named Conference USA Setter of the Week 14 times, including a record-setting six times during the 2007 campaign. Silva played in 366 sets at TU, while starting all 101 of TU's matches during that span. She led TU to a 77-24 record during her playing career, while finishing as one of TU's winningest players.

Transferring to TU from Jefferson College in Hillsboro, Mo., Silva helped lead the Vikings to a 22-14 record and a regional runner-up finish as a freshman. She earned AVCA Second-Team All-American honors as well as NJCAA All-America honorable mention merits while at JeffCo, in addition to being an all-conference and all-region.

Silva graduated from Tulsa in 2008 with a bachelor's degree in business marketing.

Joining the Alabama women's volleyball program for his first season as an assistant coach is Ryan Wills. In his role with the Tide, Wills' primary responsibilities will include working with the middle blockers, installing the passing system, helping with the coordination of the defensive scheme, and serving as the camp coordinator.

Before coming to Alabama, Wills was an assistant coach at the University of Tulsa for one season. In 2010, he helped the Golden Hurricane post a school record with 31 wins, including winning the school's first ever NCAA Tournament match. Tulsa finished the 2010 season with a 31-3 record and was a perfect 20-0 in Conference USA, earning the school's second regular season conference title. Tulsa ended the season ranked No. 20 in the country in the AVCA Coaches' Poll.

Prior to his time at Tulsa, he spent two years in California, where he served as Beach Program Director at Mizuno Long Beach Volleyball Club and coached two teams for the club. He also served as a volunteer coach for the UCLA women's volleyball team for two seasons.

As a volunteer coach at UCLA from 2008-10, Wills assisted the Bruins program under now-retired head coach Andy Banachowski, the all-time winningest NCAA Division I women's volleyball coach. During Wills' time with the program, UCLA reached the NCAA Regional Semifinals in 2008 and the NCAA Second Round in 2009. He helped train three AVCA All-Americans, two Pac-10 Conference Freshmen of the Year and one AVCA National Freshman of the Year.

As the BEACH Team Director and Developer at Mizuno Long Beach Volleyball Club in Long Beach, Calif., Wills organized a sand volleyball program for the club, and in 2009 the program won the inaugural overall club championship for Club Beach Volleyball.

As an assistant coach for the Mizuno Long Beach programs, Wills helped one team win a silver medal in the 16 Open Division at the Junior Olympics, as well as the Southern California Volleyball Association in 2008. While an assistant at the Mizuno Long Beach Volleyball Club, he trained nine girls that received Division I scholarships and had five players earn Junior Olympic All-America honors.

As a student assistant at Tulsa from 2006-08, Wills helped the Golden Hurricane win its first Conference USA regular season title in 2006, and its first C-USA tournament championship and NCAA Tournament appearance in 2007. TU compiled a 54-15 record during those two seasons.

Wills assisted with Club ONE Volleyball in Tulsa from 2006-08, during which time the program won three Oklahoma Regional Volleyball Association Championships and received three bids to the Junior Olympic National Championship. He has also served as a personal beach volleyball coach in Hermosa Beach, Calif., from 2006-10.

Wills graduated from Tulsa in 2008 with a bachelor of science degree in business administration. He and his wife, Evyn currently live in Northport, Ala.

↘ *Setting the standard for intercollegiate athletics in volleyball.*

The Southeastern Conference continues to flourish as a solid and competitive league in women's collegiate volleyball.

In the last two decades, the SEC has made stellar contributions in volleyball. The conference has sent at least two SEC teams to the NCAA Tournament in every season the last 21 years. The SEC had a team reach the Final Four seven of the 10 seasons in the '90s with the league having a team advance to the regional final nine of those 10 seasons.

Since 2000, the SEC has had a team reach the Final Four three times and regional final four times. In 2009, the LSU Tigers won the SEC title, their fifth in program history, first since 1991. The win by LSU snapped an 18-year reign of the Florida Gators.

The SEC sent six teams to the NCAA Tournament last season: Florida, Kentucky, LSU, Tennessee, Auburn and Mississippi. Only Florida advanced to the Regional rounds.

Since the inaugural SEC volleyball championship in 1979-80, many changes have occurred in the conference with volleyball. The addition of Arkansas and South Carolina to the league in 1991 brought the divisional format to the sport with five teams competing in the Eastern Division and six teams in the Western Division.

In 2009, the SEC entered into an unprecedented TV agreement with ESPN that provided exclusive coverage of SEC athletics. With the arrangement, SEC volleyball is now broadcast on three different platforms: ESPNU, FS South/Southwest/Sun Sports and CSS and has more exposure than any other league. Live SEC volleyball coverage can now reach into 73 million homes nation-wide on ESPNU, and in the SEC nine-state region, 25 million homes on FS South/Southwest/Sun Sports, and 11 million homes on CSS.

The SEC now offers access to free licensed game highlights and other newsworthy event video, including select live streams, through the SEC Affiliate Network. This annual program is exclusively available to the accredited media. It covers all teams and all sports for both men's and women's teams. Video is delivered through a customizable digital video player immediately after televised games/events conclude.

Participating news affiliates can also select individual clips to insert directly into online stories. Television stations also have access to an FTP account to run content on-air. The SEC Affiliate Network is managed through XOS Digital. ## SEC ACCOLADES

- The 2010 season marked the 21st consecutive season in which the SEC placed at least two teams in the NCAA Tournament. The SEC landed six teams in the NCAA Tournament: Florida, Kentucky, LSU and Tennessee, Auburn and Mississippi.
- Florida captured the No. 1 national seed, marking the first in school history and in SEC history.
- Florida captured its 19th SEC title in 2010 and LSU claimed the Western Division crown in 2010 for the sixth consecutive season.
- Seven student-athletes were named to ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District teams for a total of 63 all-time.
- Tennessee's Nikki Fowler was named CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine First Team Academic All-America, while Mississippi State's Kayla Woodard was named Third Team.
- The 2010 All-SEC teams had all 11 schools represented, the first time since 2000.
- The SEC earned three AVCA All-America honors in 2010: Kelly Murphy (UF), First Team; Nikki Fowler (UT) and Regina Thomas (UM), Third Team.
- Six SEC student-athletes earned 2010 AVCA All-America Honorable Mention honors.
- The SEC has 56 total AVCA All-Americans (First, Second or Third Team).
- Florida's Mary Wise was named AVCA South Region Coach of the Year.
- The SEC had 12 individuals named to the 2010 AVCA South All-Region Team, including three honorable mentions.

**NINA FOSTER**  
**VOLLEYBALL MAGAZINE • HONORABLE MENTION • 1995**

Nina Foster will be remembered as one of the greatest volleyball players in the program's history after her back-to-back stellar performances during the 1994-1995 seasons. As a middle blocker, Foster became the first Crimson Tide player to earn All-American status and AVCA All-District honors. The three-time SEC player of the week led the nation in blocks per game in 1994 (1.90) and was second in the nation in kills per game (6.02). During her tenure at the Capstone, Foster led the conference in blocks per game

and kills per game. Foster can also be found in numerous categories in the Alabama record books. Foster is second all-time for solo blocks with 115, eighth in block assists with 240 and eighth in kills with 1,289. Foster holds the record for the all-time highest career hitting percentage with .3402.



**ERIN HEFFNER**  
**AVCA • HONORABLE MENTION • 2003 & 2004**

Hailing from Ft. Wayne, Ind., Erin Heffner became only the second player in Alabama volleyball history to earn All-America honors and was the first Crimson Tide volleyballer to be elected by the AVCA. Heffner is also the only UA player to earn the honor twice in the program's existence. During her tenure at the Capstone, Heffner led the SEC in kills per game in 2003 and 2004. Heffner also finished ninth in the nation in 2004 in the same category with 5.55 kills per game. The five-time SEC player of the week and two-time AVCA All-District selection also garnered AVCA South District Freshman of the Year accolades in 2001. Perhaps one of the most successful players to wear the crimson and white, Heffner can be found on every career record list except assists and is the all-time kills leader with 2,090.

Hudson was also selected to the All-SEC first team as a junior and senior.

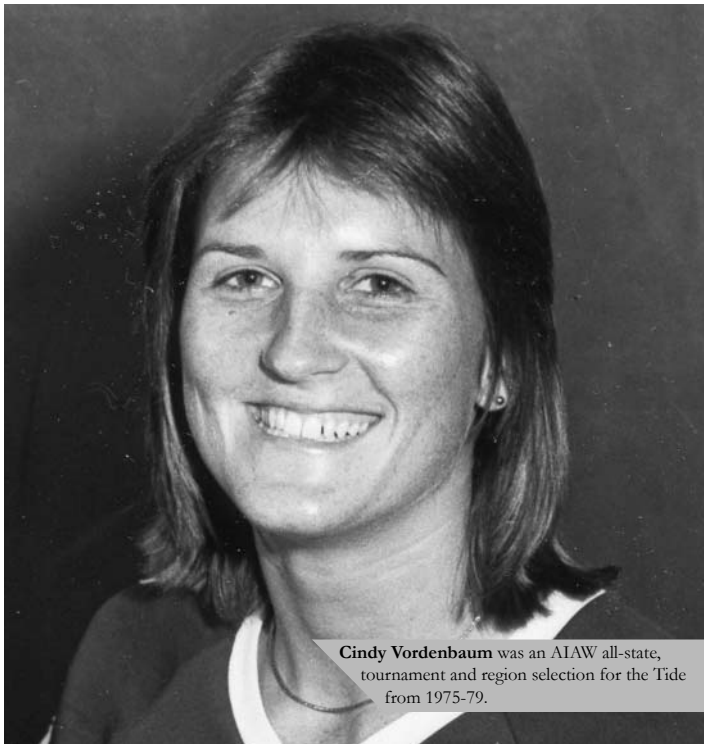

In addition to being a standout player for the Crimson Tide in the late 1970s, Dorothy Franco Reed was entrusted with rebuilding the volleyball program at Alabama after its reinstatement in 1989. During her tenure, she guided the Tide to its first 20-plus win seasons in the modern era.

Stephanie Schleuder served as the head coach for both the volleyball and women's basketball teams at Alabama from 1975-77. She compiled a 39-36 mark as the basketball mentor. She was the first official head coach for both of those programs. Following her stint at Alabama, Schleuder coached at Minnesota for 13 seasons and was the head coach at Macalester College in St. Paul, Minn. for 12 years before retiring after the 2009 season.
