Video is delivered through a customizable digital video player immediately after televised games/ events conclude. Participating news affiliates also can select individual clips to insert directly into online stories. Television stations also have access to an FTP account to run content on-air.

### INTERVIEWS

Head coach Jay Seawell and his team are available for interviews and can only be reached through the Alabama Athletics Communications Office, due to the extensive time the golf coaching staff spends outside on the course. Team practice sessions rotate times and locations daily, depending on upcoming events and areas of practice emphasis. Golf interview requests should be made at least 24 hours in advance. All golf interviews must be arranged through Aaron Jordan in the Athletics Communications office at 205-348-5401.

### FACILITIES

As part of the Crimson Tradition Fund facility upgrades, Alabama's home golf course — Ol' Colony — has some recent renovations that serve to turn the course into the Tide's real home with new green complexes and added length. The Alabama golf program is housed in the Jerry Pate Golf Center (2004), the Tide's private practice facility and clubhouse that includes coaches' offices, a fully furnished locker room and a team room. The Pate Center also provides Alabama golfers a myriad of chipping and putting greens, target greens and a full driving range. Ol' Colony, a course designed by former UA men's golf standout Jerry Pate, serves as the team's home course. In addition to its "home" course, the Alabama men's golf team benefits from the opportunity of being able to access several golf courses in the Tuscaloosa area for practice, including NorthRiver Yacht Club and Indian Hills Country Club.

## MEN'S GOLF PREVIEW

When it comes to filling out his lineup, University of Alabama men's golf coach Jay Seawell likens the five he plays during a team event to a starting rotation in Major League Baseball.

Each slot, one through five, means something, with different opportunities and varied expectations.

"Someone is the starting pitcher for a reason, and somebody is the No. 1 man for a reason," said the coach who is entering his 14th season with the Crimson Tide. "Somebody is the five-man for a reason. It doesn't mean that they both get the ball, that they both do the same thing. If you think about it there's a responsibility and a pressure that goes with each one. I'm looking, in my mind, trying to fill in a spot with each."

"The good thing about last year is that LSU proved that you don't have to have an No. 1 everyday starter to win the national championship. They kind of had a bunch of No. 2s and 3s."

While the national crown stayed in the Southeastern Conference, giving the league its third straight title after Alabama went back-to-back in 2013 and 2014, the young Crimson Tide wasn't on hand to attempt the three-peat. By placing seventh at the NCAA Noblesville Regional the Crimson Tide failed to reach Nationals for the first time since 2010.

However, everyone's back and there's still only one senior on the

roster. If Seawell is able to solve his biggest problem from 2014-15, never really finding that No. 5 starter, the Crimson Tide could be right back contending.

Even so, a lot will depend on the players being counted on most at the top of the lineup, namely junior Robby Shelton and senior Tom Lovelady. To the coach, Shelton isn't just the equivalent of having a No. 1 starter, but a staff ace.

"I like my ace," he said. "I like aces. That one guy, or that ace, is that guy who when you really need it at the end, whatever that round is, whether it's the end of the NCAAs, SEC's, regionals or really any tournament, that they've just got it. They have that 'it' about them. The more the pressure ratchets up the more things internally and flaws are always exposed."

"The reason why the better players always play better in the bigger events is not because, 'Oh, they finally show up,' it's because that pressure gets tighter. The reason why they're so good shows. That's why I like them."

Shelton arrived at the Capstone as the nation's No. 1-ranked junior golfer and during his first two years he posted two of the three lowest stroke averages in program history (70.14 in 2014 and 70.61 in 2015). The two-time All-American was named the 2014 National Freshman of the Year (Phil Mickelson Award), and the 2014 SEC Player of the Year.

## OUTLOOK

This past season he was ranked seventh in the Golfweek/Sagarin performance Index, and in addition to being a semifinalist for the prestigious Ben Hogan Award honoring the nation's top amateur golfer was named to the United States Walker Cup team and the United States Palmer Cup team -- a Ryder Cup-type event between college/university golfers. Shelton won all four of his matches to help lead the 18-12 victory over Europe.

Over the summer he also competed in his first PGA event as an amateur and finished tied for third with a four-day total of 14-under par 270 at the Barbasol Championship on the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail at Grand National in Opelika, Ala.

Consequently, Seawell is looking for Shelton take the next step in his career, and the coach isn't holding back by setting the highest of goals for his junior standout. Specifically, he wants him to take aim at being the collegiate player of the year.

"I think Robby is the best player in the world," the coach explained. "He's phenomenal and he's still just a 20-year-old kid. As talented as he is sometimes we take him for granted a little bit, they're so talented we think we're robotic a little bit, and they're not. There's a life, a breath and a heartbeat inside of all of them, especially him. How do we go that one extra step to become that guy? That's where they want to be, he should be, but there has to be that step."

Seawell's other goal on the individual side for Lovelady to wrap up his impressive career as an All-American. The fifth-year senior and team captain was granted a medical hardship for the 2011-12 season and has already won two national championships and three Southeastern Conference titles.

If those two things happen, Seawell won't have to work too much about the team side, especially since two other spots in the lineup are pretty much locked up as well.

"There's Jonathan Hardee, who was All-SEC freshman, and Dru Love just won the Georgia State-Am," Seawell said. "Those four

guys really separated themselves on last year's team."

That leaves the fifth slot, where Seawell might have another potential ace in the making. Out of Hattiesburg, Miss., freshman Davis Riley was the 2014-15 American Family Insurance ALL-USA Boys Golf Player of the Year, and played in the U.S. Open after placing eighth in a sectional qualifier.

"Davis Riley is really good," Seawell said about his 18-year-old newcomer who was ranked third by Golfweek and No. 6 by the American Junior Golf Association.

"That fifth spot was kind of a bouncing-around spot at the end of the year. Is it someone returning from last year? Is it the Robby Praters of the world? Or is it Tyler Hitchner, or someone like that? Or is it Davis Riley? That's what we're going to find out. Everyone has to earn their spot when they get here. Everyone knows that, we recruit that way."

"I believe in the end, with Davis, that will be the five guys that we see at the beginning of the year, but I also know that on the back end the other guys are good enough to get into the lineup," he said. "So I'm excited about that."

Seawell got a taste of the team's potential during the 2015-16 opening event when before fading in the final round Alabama held the lead and Davis was atop the leaderboard of the Carpet Collegiate Classic. The Crimson Tide was also without Shelton, who was in England participating in the Walker Cup (he went 1-1-2 as the United States lost to Great Britain & Ireland).

"I think we have a chance to be pretty good," Seawell said.

Jay Seawell not only rekindled the proud tradition of the Alabama Crimson Tide men's golf program, he has entrenched the Crimson Tide into the forefront of the nation's elite teams, securing back-to-back national championships in 2013 and 2014.

The 14th-year head coach is now charged with sustaining one of the country's top programs – something that is made easier with the return of every golfer from the 2015-16 season.

The golf team's success under Seawell has energized the Tide's alumni base and created an excitement for Alabama golf not seen in recent memory.

Named The University of Alabama's head men's golf coach on July 26, 2002, Seawell's teams have captured four Southeastern Conference championships, including three over the last four seasons. He has led UA to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and eight NCAA Championship berths – all in the past 12 years.

His 2012 team reached the NCAA Finals, falling just short to Texas. The Tide used that experience to fuel a return trip to the NCAA Finals in 2013 and 2014.

Seawell is producing headline-worthy student-athletes on the course and in the classroom while his golfers also are among the most active in the Tuscaloosa community, volunteering their time at schools and helping host athletic department events for local children.

Men's golf has put 70 players on the SEC Academic Honor Roll in the last 13 years and he has seen eight players (16 honors) named to the Cleveland Golf All-America Scholar Team. Joseph Sykora, was a three-time Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-American and was voted by the league golf coaches as the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year an SEC-record three times. In 2008, Sykora won the SEC's H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award (all sports, all males in the league) and Alabama's Bryant Award, as the top male student-athlete from any sport. Cory Whitsett then received the 2012 and 2013 NCAA Elite 89 Award, presented annually to the golfer at the NCAA Championships with the highest GPA. He also was named a 2013 and 2014 Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-American and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year while winning the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award and the Bryant Award in 2014.

Seawell has coached 29 All-Americans during his coaching career with 14 of those coming over the last four years alone (four in 2011-12, five in 2012-13, four more in 2013-14 and one last season). His golfers at Alabama have been nominated for the sport's highest national awards, including the Ben Hogan Award, the Jack Nicklaus Award, the Fred Haskins Award, the Phil Mickelson Award and the Byron Nelson Award. Justin Thomas won the Nicklaus, Haskins and Mickelson awards in 2012 and Robby Shelton was named the Mickelson Award winner in 2014.

Seawell has coached Alabama to 42 team tournament championships with 31 individual medalists in 13 years in Tuscaloosa.

The Crimson Tide won back-to-back titles in 2013

and 2014, the latest by a commanding 4-1 victory over No. 2 Oklahoma State in the NCAA Finals at the Prairie Dunes Golf Club in Hutchinson, Kan. Alabama's dominant season broke the season-old record of team victories with nine in 12 events during the 2013-14 season. UA also set a school record for winning percentage with a 150-6-2 record for a winning percentage of 95.6.

Seawell was named the Dave Williams National Coach of the Year and the SEC Coach of the Year in 2014. It was Seawell's third SEC Coach of the Year Award in as many years and fourth overall.

The Crimson Tide finished tied for second in the stroke-play portion of the NCAA Championships before fighting its way through three rounds of match play with victories over SMU (3-2), LSU (4-1) and Oklahoma State (4-1) in the finals. Alabama also won the school's fifth SEC Championship, third straight and fourth under the direction of Seawell with a 16-shot win at the Sea Island Golf Club. The Tide also won its third straight and fourth overall NCAA Regional Championship with a victory at Auburn.

The 2013-14 Crimson Tide team was led by a duo of first team All-Americans: Wyatt and Shelton. The Tide boasted four All-Americans in all with Trey Mullinax (second team PING and Golfweek) and Whitsett (honorable mention PING and second team Golfweek) both receiving All-America honors. Shelton was also the SEC Player and Freshman of the Year while Whitsett was the league's Scholar-Athletes of the Year. The Tide also had a record four first team All-SEC selections.

Alabama's 2013 NCAA national championship concluded an historic season at the Capstone that saw the Crimson Tide win a school-record eight times in 12 events and post a 154-15-3 cumulative record. Alabama won seven of eight events in the fall, including the final six events.

The Crimson Tide finished tied for third in the stroke-play portion of the NCAA Championships before rolling through three rounds of match play with victories over New Mexico (4-1), Georgia Tech (3-0-2)

and Illinois (4-1) in the finals. Alabama also won the school's fourth SEC championship, second straight and third under the direction of Seawell with a two-shot win at the Sea Island Golf Club. The Tide also won its second straight NCAA Regional championship with a victory in Baton Rouge.

The 2012-13 Crimson Tide team was led by a trio of first team All-Americans: Whitsett, Wyatt and Thomas. The Tide boasted five All-Americans in all with Mullinax (PING) and Scott Strohmeyer (Golfweek) both receiving honorable mention All-America honors. Whitsett was the SEC Player of the Year and one of the league's Scholar-Athletes of the Year while winning two times. Thomas, a sophomore, also won twice to set Alabama's career record for victories with six. Whitsett, Thomas and Wyatt were all selected for the United States 2013 Walker Cup team.

Seawell was named the SEC Coach of the Year for the second time in as many years and third overall while also being named a finalist for the Dave Williams Award (national coach of the year).

The 2011-12 Alabama team captured the SEC Championship, NCAA Athens Regional and a runner-up finish at the NCAA Championships. The Tide won the stroke-play portion of the NCAA Championships at Riviera Country Club with a 7-over 859. Alabama then dispatched of Kent State (3-1-1) in the quarterfinals of match play and California (3-2) in the semifinals. The Crimson Tide's bid for the program's first national championship fell one match short as the Tide were

edged by Texas (3-2) in the NCAA Finals.

Alabama won five of the final seven team events heading into the 2012 NCAA Championships with victories at the Puerto Rico Classic, the Schenkel Invitational, the Linger Longer Invitational, the SEC Championship and the NCAA Athens Regional. The 2011-12 Tide set school records for team season scoring average at 284.56 (.78 vs. par), low round vs. par at 20-under 268 and low 54 holes vs. par 47-under 817.

Seawell was named the SEC Coach of the Year for the second time and was a finalist for the Dave Williams Award (national coach of the year).

Seawell also coached impact freshman Thomas to unseen heights in 2011-12. The rookie from Goshen, Ky., won a school-record four times, including medalist honors at the SEC Championships. For his efforts, Thomas was named the SEC Player and Freshman of the Year and was the first Tide player to be selected as the national player of the year.

Whitsett and Wyatt turned in successful sophomore campaigns in 2011-12. Whitsett won twice, capturing the 2011 Western Refining All-America Classic and the 2012 Linger Longer Invitational. He finished with a 71.38 scoring average and earned second-team All-America and first-team All-SEC accolades. Wyatt averaged 71.70 strokes per round and was a second-team All-American and first-team All-SEC choice, after recording seven top-five finishes. Hamrick wrapped up his decorated Alabama career by earning 2012

honorable mention All-America honors and second-team All-SEC plaudits.

Alabama's 2010-11 team captured five tournament titles and finished outside of the top four only once in stroke play. The Tide posted a 137-24-0 record in head-to-head meetings and had four players ranked in the top 65 of the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index at the end of the season.

Alabama posted a runner-up finish at the SEC Championships and qualified for the NCAA Championships with a third-place finish at the 2011 NCAA Indiana Regional.

Bud Cauley re-wrote the Alabama record book in 2010-11 with a 70.75 scoring average over 36 rounds. He finished 15 shots under par and was named a first-team All-American by both PING and Golfweek while also being selected to the All-Nicklaus team. Whitsett garnered 2011 All-America honors under Seawell's tutelage, being named to the second team by both PING and Golfweek while garnering first-team All-SEC and SEC Freshman of the Year honors. Wyatt was a second-team All-SEC choice.

Returning only two lettermen for the 2009-10 season, Seawell was presented one of his biggest challenges. The veteran coach responded with a squad that captured its fourth straight Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate and boasted four medalists throughout the season. The win at the Jerry Pate was the program's fourth in eight years under Seawell's guidance.

Hamrick captured medalist honors at the 2009 JPNI and the Western Refining All-America Classic while tying for first the following spring at the Schenkel E-Z-Go Invitational, on his way to honorable mention All-America honors. Cauley set a school record for scoring average at 71.32 while Hamrick finished second on the team at 72.88. Cauley won the Isleworth Collegiate and the Linger Longer Invitational while garnering 2010 first-team All-American honors.

The 2008-09 team added a program first to Seawell's resume with a victory at the NCAA Northeast Regional. It was the first regional title for the Crimson Tide's men's golf team and the club's second win of the season.

Seawell's teams from 2007-09 finished sixth, 13th and 15th, respectively, in the NCAA Championships while the 2008 team also captured the school's first Southeastern Conference Championship since 1979.

The 2008-09 team finished with two tournament titles, at the Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate and the NCAA Northeast Regional. Seawell's five-man team almost always included at least three freshmen and finished with a 292.06 average score per round.

Freshman sensation Cauley garnered 2009 first-team All-America honors from Golfweek and second-team honors from PING. He was first-team All-SEC and the SEC Freshman of the Year. Cauley won

medalist honors at the United State Collegiate Championship while Hamrick was the medalist at the NCAA Northeast Regional. Cauley was also a semifinalist for the Ben Hogan Award (national amateur of the year) and selected to play for the Americans at the 2009 Walker Cup and the 2009 Palmer Cup.

Alabama's 2007-08 team finished the season ranked No. 3 in the final Golf World/NIKE Coaches poll and captured its first SEC golf championship in 29 years. Seawell's success caught the attention and respect of his coaching peers, who voted him the 2008 SEC Coach of the Year. His 2008 Tide team co-led the nation in team tournament championships with six wins and also produced four medalists in 2007-08. The team set the school's 54-hole record with the 810 it shot to win the 2007 Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate. In 2007-08, the golf team won both of the UA athletic department's biggest awards, the men's team with the highest GPA and the men's community service award.

Seawell's program in 2006-07 made Alabama history, catapulting to the nation's No. 1 ranking in all three collegiate polls in September of 2006 and holding the top spot in the Coaches poll from September through early February of 2007. The team won four tournaments and set school scoring records on its way to a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championships and a runner-up showing at the SEC Championships.

After arriving at the Capstone for the 2002-03 season, Seawell and quickly established a formula for success. His first Crimson Tide team finished sixth at the SEC Championships, after a ninth-place showing the previous year. Alabama also qualified for the NCAA East Regional, only the second appearance in six-year span for the Tide.

The 2003-04 season helped build the foundation for the coming years at Alabama. The Crimson Tide finished 11th at the SEC Championships, but earlier captured its first tournament team title with a win at the Conrad Rehling Invitational, proving that the program was building for the future.

That future came quickly as the Crimson Tide qualified for not only the NCAA Regionals in 2005, but tied for 28th at the NCAA Championships. It was Alabama's first NCAA Championship appearance since the 1996 season. The Tide posted a sixth-place finish at the NCAA East Regional to qualify.

The Crimson Tide again qualified for NCAA regional play in 2006, finishing 14th at the NCAA West Regional. Alabama also recorded a third-place finish at the SEC Championship, its best at that time since a third-place showing in 1990.

Seawell began his coaching career at Anderson College, where he coached from 1991-96 and won five consecutive Region 10 championships. His work earned him five Region Coach of the Year Awards. After briefly leaving Anderson for another career pursuit, Seawell returned to coach Anderson again in 1997-98.

Seawell was hired by Augusta State as its head coach prior to the start of 1998-99 season. He led ASU to four straight NCAA Regional appearances and three trips to the NCAA Championships. Seawell's 2001 team finished seventh at the NCAAs before turning in the best finish in school history the following year with a fifth-place showing. He coached three All-Americans during his tenure at ASU, including two-time All-American Jamie Elson along with All-American and former Ryder Cup player Oliver Wilson.

Seawell is a 1988 graduate of the University of South Carolina with a degree is in hotel and restaurant management. He lettered on the Gamecocks golf team and served as the president of the University's Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Seawell and his wife, Stephanie, have three children: Brooke, Jackson and Lauren.







Jon Howell is in his second season as assistant men's golf coach at the University of Alabama in 2015-16.

Howell's duties for the Crimson Tide include assisting Seawell in day-to-day operations of the program while also serving as the recruiting coordinator and assisting in player development. He serves as the Director of the Alabama Golf Academy while overseeing alumni relations and the Crimson Tide Open.

"It's been great having Jon on board," Alabama head coach Jay Seawell said. "He has done a fabulous job of developing and teaching young players as a PGA Professional. Jon is extremely valuable to our current players from an instruction standpoint and is a tremendous

benefit on the recruiting trail as someone who really understands junior golf."

Howell came to Tuscaloosa after serving nearly four years as the director of golf instruction at the Country Club of Jackson (Miss.), where he had a track record for developing some of the top junior players in the nation.

A member of the PGA of America, Howell attended Mississippi State's professional golf management program, graduating in 2010.

When he was hired, Howell became the fourth assistant coach in as many years for the Crimson Tide with each assistant landing a head coaching job. Former Tide assistant Mike McGraw replaced Roby Bradley, who was named the head coach at Purdue following the Crimson Tide's 2013 NCAA Championship victory. Bradley had replaced Scott Limbaugh, who took over the Vanderbilt program in the summer of 2012, after Alabama's NCAA runner-up finish.

Howell is married to the former Kay Nobles and the couple has a daughter Sadie.





## ALABAMA PRESIDENT DR. STUART R. BELL

Dr. Stuart R. Bell became the 29th president of The University of Alabama on July 15, 2015. Founded in 1831, the University is the state's flagship and a student-centered, comprehensive research university.

Dr. Bell has broad administrative experience and is a nearly 30-year veteran of higher education. He previously served at UA for 16 years where he founded and directed an interdisciplinary research center.

"I certainly look forward to leading this university as its next president and working alongside the many men and women who have made it a great university today and who will also make it a great university in the future," Bell said on the day he was named UA president. "It's just great to be here in Tuscaloosa, and it's great to be in Alabama and to, once again, be able to say Roll Tide!"

Immediately prior to becoming UA's president, Dr. Bell was executive vice president and provost at Louisiana State University. During Dr. Bell's tenure there and earlier at the University of Kansas, where he served as dean of its College of Engineering, those institutions opened new facilities, and student recruitment, retention and success were emphasized.

First joining UA in 1986 as an assistant professor in the UA College of Engineering's department of mechanical engineering, Dr. Bell was named department head nine years later.

With research interest in combustion engines, Dr. Bell has expertise in alternative fuels for engines, innovative engine designs and modeling of engine and engine processes. He directed UA's Center for Advanced Vehicle Technologies.

Dr. Bell was awarded the Society of Automotive Engineers' Ralph Teetor Award for Outstanding Contributions to Research and Teaching in 1988. He was presented the T. Morris Hackney Faculty Leadership Award for the UA College of Engineering in 2001, and, in 2005, he received the Richard S. Woodbury Award from the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

A native of Abilene, Texas, Dr. Bell earned a nuclear engineering degree from Texas A&M University in 1979. He earned his master's and doctorate degrees in mechanical engineering from Texas A&M in 1981 and 1986, respectively.

He and his wife, Susan, have three adult children, Stuart, Stacy and Stephen.

# BILL BATTLE

## DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



William R. "Bill" Battle is in his third year as Director of Athletics at The University of Alabama. Battle took over the job on Friday, March 22, 2013, succeeding Mal Moore who had held the position since November, 1999. Battle joined the Crimson Tide after a career as a college football coach and entrepreneur that was consistently hallmarked by innovation and foresight.

A native of Birmingham, Ala., Battle attended The University of Alabama on a football scholarship and enjoyed a successful playing career as a three-year starter at end for the Crimson Tide under legendary head coach Paul "Bear" Bryant from 1960-62. Battle was a member of Bryant's first national championship team at Alabama in 1961. Generally regarded as the team's best end throughout his playing career, Battle came to Tuscaloosa after starring in three sports at Birmingham's West End High School.

An excellent student, Battle earned a bachelor's degree in Biology (minor in Psychology) from The University of Alabama in 1963 and a master's degree in Education from The University of Oklahoma in 1964. He was an Academic All-SEC selection as a senior in 1962 and was selected to play in the Senior Bowl all-star game in Mobile, Ala., in January of 1963. He was named first team tight end and second team defensive end on The University of Alabama All Decade Team of the 1960s.

Battle entered the coaching profession as a graduate assistant at The University of Oklahoma in 1963 under famed head coach Bud Wilkinson. In 1964 and 1965, he served as an assistant coach at the United States Military Academy while serving a two-year military tour. In 1966, he moved on to the University

of Tennessee, where he served as an assistant coach under head coach Doug Dickey for four seasons (1966-69) until he was named head coach of the Volunteers in 1970. When he was named head coach, Battle was the youngest head coach in college football at the age of 28.

During his seven-year tenure as head coach (1970-76), Battle's teams went 59-22-2, finished three seasons ranked in the nation's top 10 among five top-20 finishes and won four out of five bowl games. Battle's Tennessee teams won 11 games once (1970) and at least 10 games in three different seasons (1970, 1971 and 1972). His first Tennessee team finished the season ranked fourth in both national polls. His 1971 team finished ranked ninth in both national polls and the 1972 Tennessee squad finished ranked eighth by the Associated Press and 11th in the Coaches' poll.

Battle began a career in the private sector after his coaching career ended. He held various positions within Circle S Industries in Selma, Ala., and served as president of two different companies, as well as vice chairman of the Circle S Holding Company Board. During his six years at Circle S, the organization grew from two companies earning \$12 million in annual sales to 10 companies earning \$60 million.

Battle founded The Collegiate Licensing Company (CLC) in 1981, and served as president and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) until 2002. He also served as chairman of the board of Licensing Partners International (LPI), which was created in 2001 to represent the licensing interests of non-collegiate sports properties, as well as corporate and entertainment properties.

A 1981 inductee into the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame, Battle was inducted as the first member of the charter class of the National Collegiate Licensing Association Hall of Fame in 2000. He was the recipient of the 2005 Paul W. Bryant Alumni Athlete Award at The University of Alabama and was inducted into the International Licensing Industry Merchandisers' Association (LIMA) Hall of Fame in 2008.

Battle received a National Football Foundation award in December 2008 for Outstanding Contributions to Amateur Football. In June 2010, Bill was inducted into the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators' (NACMA) Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame, receiving its Lifetime Achievement Award in 2011. He currently serves on the boards of the Bryant-Jordan Student-Athlete Foundation, The University of Alabama A-Club Educational & Charitable Foundation, the Crimson Tide Foundation, and the National Football Foundation.

Battle's wife, Mary, is a summa cum laude graduate of the University of Texas School of Nursing with a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing. She earned a Master of Science in healthcare administration from the University of Alabama-Birmingham. For many years Mary worked in the healthcare industry both in the clinical setting and for healthcare corporations that developed and managed physician provider networks including the development of strategically significant relationships with payors and business and industry.

Mary currently serves on the Arthritis Foundation National Board of Directors and is the chairperson of the Arthritis Foundation Leadership Council for the Birmingham market. She is also a member of the Volunteer Engagement Task Team for the Arthritis Foundation. In addition, Mary is an inaugural member of the UAB School of Medicine Board of Visitors and is active in fundraising activities for UAB that support research projects targeting more effective treatment for rheumatoid arthritis.

The Battles are part of UAB's Stem Cell Institute Board and are both active in their support of UAB's Department of Rheumatology. In their leisure time, the Battles enjoy life on their ranch in Georgia. Mary is an avid equestrian while Bill enjoys working on various projects around the ranch.






NCAA ELITE 89 AWARD WINNER

The Crimson Tide golf team has a history of producing some of the University's best athletes and brightest students. Joseph Sykora, a senior in 2008, became the first men's golfer (from any school) to be a three-time recipient of the Southeastern Conference Scholar-Athlete of the Year award, winning in 2006, 2007 and 2008 with his 4.0 cumulative GPA. Cory Whitsett has since followed with two NCAA Elite 89 Awards (2012 and 2013), the 2014 Bryant Award and was named a Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-American in 2013 and 2014.

Sykora was a three-time Academic All-American, winning in one of the toughest categories, the at-large division, which includes student-athletes from several sports. Sykora finished his Crimson Tide career by receiving the H. Boyd McWhorter Award, presented to the SEC's Student-Athlete of the Year. Whitsett became the second Alabama golfer honored with the McWhorter Award in 2014.

The 2010, 2011 and 2012 seasons each saw six Alabama golfers earn SEC Academic Honor Roll accolades while five were chosen in 2013. The list includes players such as Bud Cauley, Hunter Hamrick, Lee Knox, Trey Mullinax, Hunter Slatton, Scott Strohmeyer, Phillip Weaver, Cory Whitsett, Bobby Wyatt and Justin Thomas. Cauley and Hamrick also garnered Cleveland Golf/Srixon All-American Scholar honors in 2011 and Hamrick became a two-time honoree in 2012. Whitsett, Wyatt, Strohmeyer and Mullinax all were honored as All-American Scholars in 2013. Whitsett became the first men's golfer from Alabama to be honored with the NCAA Elite 89 Award in 2012 and made it back-to-back honors in 2013. The NCAA Elite 89 Award is presented to the competitor with the highest GPA at the NCAA Championships.

Standing out in the classroom while playing a year-long sport is a feat not easily achieved. Golfers contend with a season that starts in early September and continues through the last week of May with the NCAA Championships.

Despite those demands, Alabama has produced 121 Academic All-SEC golfers since 1985. Joseph Joyner was the first Tide golfer to be named to the Academic All-SEC Honor Roll. In 2004, the SEC began its Freshman Academic Honor Roll. Since that time, 13 Crimson Tide freshmen have been honored.

Encouraging academic success is as much a part of Alabama's coaching mantra as is winning championships. Celebrating academic success also is a priority.

Six Alabama men's golfers have received Alabama's highest academic honor for an athlete, The Bryant Award. Cory Whitsett is the most recent of the recipients,

winning the honor in 2012 and 2013. The award is announced each spring and is given to the top male and top female student-athlete at the University, placing emphasis on athletic achievement, academic achievement and leadership. Dicky Pride, Marten Olander, Dan Mutert, Allan MacDonald and Thompson are the men's golfers who have received the Bryant Award. Olander, an All-American on the golf course and a four-time Academic All-American, earned the Ben Hogan Award in 1993. Pride is a PGA Tour player.

Seawell and assistant coach Jon Howell work closely with the Center for Academic Student Services (CASS). CASS monitors the academic progress of each athlete who wears a Crimson Tide uniform and advises the athletes on areas of study that best suit their capabilities and dreams. Study hall is required for all freshmen and for any athletes whose grades aren't Academic All-SEC worthy.

Jon Dever is Alabama's Associate Athletics Director for Student Services. The CASS Center is located in the Bryant Academic Center, as is the Champs Lifeskills program.

The Bryant Academic Center, which houses the CASS staff and is a frequent stop in the daily lives of Alabama's student-athletes, is the crown jewel in the Alabama athletic department's Crimson Tradition Fund facility enhancement campaign. The renovation project at Bryant Hall was completed for \$10.3 million in 2005.

"This project has been priority one since we started the renovations of our athletic facilities," said former Alabama athletics director Mal Moore. "Academics are at the center of our mission at Alabama and we wanted to create a place that would aid all our student-athletes in their educational pursuits. I feel very strongly that Bryant Hall will benefit every student-athlete, not just during their years at Alabama, but for a lifetime."

The building's many amenities include a 48-seat computer lab that boasts brand-new equipment. The computer lab has 25 laptop computers available for student-athletes to check out and use on team road trips. The building features math, English and writing labs along with 40 individual study rooms. A pair of 50-seat classrooms and a 140-seat lecture hall also are available. The lobby of the building showcases the Crimson Tide Academic Hall of Fame with plaques recognizing all of Alabama's Academic All-America selections.





The Jerry Pate Golf Center at the Ol' Colony Golf Complex provides the University of Alabama men's golf team with one of the best practice and playing facilities in collegiate golf. The Pate Golf Center is a private facility that is only utilized by the Alabama golf teams. The Pate Golf Center provides plenty of space for both the men's and women's teams with the ability to conduct full practice sessions during inclement weather. The facility has six indoor hitting bays and two indoor putting surfaces. The Pate Golf Center is also equipped with state-of-the-art teaching tools, including the V1 Swing Analysis System, the SAM Putting Lab and Trackman, which aides the coaching staff in ball flight analysis using doppler radar and club fitting. The locker rooms inside the Pate Golf Center feature tour-sized lockers and all of the amenities, while the lounge area includes comfortable seating and a large-screen television.

The Ol' Colony Golf Course was named one of the "Top 5 Best New Public Courses in America" by Golf Digest in 2001 and Golfweek named it one of the top-50 municipal courses in America in 2010. The Jerry Pate-designed course is considered one of the best public courses in the nation. The course is a test for even the most advanced golfer with large bunkers, mature trees and numerous water hazards, including a 25-acre lake that challenges almost every shot.

The practice range at the Pate Golf Center, which already provides the Crimson Tide golfers all of the practice components and tools needed to develop, recently finished an expansion and renovation. The practice facility includes a full practice range, putting greens, a chipping area and practice bunkers. The Jerry Pate Golf Center recently has added a new putting green with an expanded chipping and hitting area. The new chipping and hitting areas are complete with new bunkers and practice tees that allow players to hit their own golf balls up to 200 yards into six new target greens.



# 2013 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

The Alabama men's golf team reached the pinnacle of collegiate golf in 2013, capturing the program's first NCAA Championship title. The Crimson Tide also won the Southeastern Conference title and the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional on the way to the NCAA title at the Capital City Club's Crabapple Course located outside of Atlanta. The Tide set a school record for team victories in a season with eight (out of 12 events) while winning the final six tournaments of the year and seven of eight on the spring schedule. Alabama's national championship squad featured five All-Americans, including three first-team honorees in Bobby Wyatt, Cory Whitsett and Justin Thomas while Trey Mullinax and senior captain Scott Strohmeyer earned honorable mention accolades. Whitsett was the SEC Player of the Year and shared SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors. Strohmeyer finished his Alabama career by winning the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional title and then delivering a 2-0-1 record in match play at the NCAA Championships. Head coach Jay Seawell capped off his 11th year at the Capstone with his first national championship and SEC Coach of the Year honors.



# 2014 NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Alabama became the second school since the mid-1980s to win back-to-back NCAA Men's Golf Championships, with a 4-1 win over second-ranked Oklahoma State in the 2014 NCAA Match Play Finals. The Crimson Tide also captured its third straight SEC Championship title and won its NCAA regional for a third consecutive year, winning at the Auburn site in 2014. Alabama broke the year-old school record with nine team wins in 12 events, including the first five events of the season to set an NCAA record with 11 straight tournament victories. The Tide also won the last four events in 2014 to give the senior class of Cory Whitsett, Bobby Wyatt and Trey Mullinax 27 wins in their four years at the Capstone. Alabama had four players garner All-America honors, with freshman Robby Shelton and Wyatt named to the first team. Shelton received SEC Player and Freshman of the Year en route to being named the Phil Mickelson Award winner as the national freshman of the year. The Tide finished tied for second in NCAA Championships stroke play and then defeated SMU (3-2) and LSU (4-1) to reach the NCAA Match Play Finals for the third straight year.

## NATIONAL HONORS

In his first season at the Capstone in 2012, Justin Thomas joined some of the most decorated collegiate golfers in the history of the Alabama program. Thomas, a native of Goshen, Ky., was named the consensus National Collegiate Player of the Year in 2012, winning the Jack Nicklaus Award, the Fred Haskins Award and the Phil Mickelson Award, which goes to the nation's most outstanding freshman. He advanced to the semifinals of the United States Amateur and was named to the U.S. team for the 2012 World Amateur Team Championships. Thomas was a unanimous first team All-American and was a Freshman All-America selection. Thomas also garnered SEC Player and Freshman of the Year honors. In 1993, Marten Olander was named the recipient of the prestigious Ben Hogan Award. Alabama's Michael Thompson (2008) and Bud Cauley (2009 and 2011) have also been finalists for the Ben Hogan Award. Robby Shelton then added to Alabama's tradition in 2014 when he captured the Phil Mickelson Award as the nation's top freshman while garnering SEC Player and Freshman of the Year honors.






# THE JERRY PATE NATIONAL INTERCOLLEGIATE

## JERRY PATE NATIONAL INTERCOLLEGIATE

Each October, 12 of the nation's best men's college golf teams gather in Vestavia Hills, Ala., for the University of Alabama's annual Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate. In addition to welcoming a premier field for this elite event, the tournament annually raises some \$20,000 for charities.

The host and tournament namesake Jerry Pate is the most successful professional golfer to have worn the Crimson and White. The former Tide golfer and current Champions Tour player proudly lends his name and plays an active role — from team selection to presenting the awards trophies.

Pate and Alabama have hosted this event since 1986. Originally, the tournament was held in Pate's hometown of Pensacola, Fla. He moved the tournament in 1992 to Birmingham's Shoal Creek, where it remained for five years. In 1997, the JPNI moved to its current home, the Old Overton Club.

The strength of the JPNI field makes it a premier team fall gathering. Even the selection committee is a powerful one. The tournament's selection committee has included PGA greats Arnold Palmer, Ben Crenshaw and Mark McCormack. The committee seeks the highest-ranked teams from the previous season that are expected to again be in the national title hunt.

In the fall of 2004, Georgia finished fourth at the JPNI but went on that spring to win the NCAA title. The 1995 JPNI champion Arizona State won the (spring) 1996 NCAA Championship while fall 1997 JPNI participant UNLV didn't win the JPNI, but the Rebels went on to win the 1998 NCAA title. The 1994 field included all of the top nine team from the 1994 NCAA Championships, including national champion and 1994 Jerry Pate champion, Stanford, which was led by 1994 U.S. Amateur Champion Tiger Woods. Woods also was the 1994 JPNI medalist. Other prominent medalists have included LSU's David Toms (1988), Arizona's Rory Sabbatini (1997), Georgia Tech's Bryce Molder (2000), Oklahoma State's Hunter Mahan (2001) and Wake Forest's Bill Haas (2002).

Alabama joined the list of JPNI participants that went on to win the NCAA National Championship. The Tide won the 2012 Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate and then emerged victorious at the 2013 NCAA Championships.

The Crimson Tide has experienced recent success in the Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate, winning five of the past seven years. The Crimson Tide has seen five players capture medalist honors over the years, including David Kirkpatrick in 1991, Joseph Sykora in 2006, Mark Harrell in 2007, Hunter Hamrick in 2009 and Justin Thomas in 2012.

## HOW IT WORKS

Each May, the NCAA hosts six regionals, which are spread around the country and provide for exciting golf from coast to coast. The six-regional format was started at the 2009 NCAA Championships and replaced the old three-regional system that began play in 1992 when the NCAA first instituted a regional format.

Each of the six 2015 regional sites will qualify five teams for the NCAA Championship Finals, being held at The Concession Club in Bradenton, Fla., on May 28-June 2, 2015. Those 30 teams then will play 54 holes of stroke play (May 28-30) and cut to the top-15 teams and top 40 individuals for a fourth round of stroke play to determine match-play seedings and the NCAA individual champion. The No. 1 team will face the No. 8 team, No. 2 will face No. 7, No. 3 vs. No. 6 and No. 4 vs. No. 5. Match play quarterfinals and semifinals will be held on June 1, followed by the finals on June 2.

Teams are selected for regional competition based upon their overall tournament finishes and head-to-head finishes against other teams that are in their region. Selection is made by a regional committee comprised of head coaches. From 1989 through the 2008 NCAA Championships, the finals consisted of 72 holes of play with a cut after 54 holes to the top-15 teams.
