(5-2, 3-1 SEC) LSU TIGERS

THE GAME: The No. 1/1 University of Alabama football team returns to action after a week off for a meeting with the No. 15/14 ranked LSU Tigers. The matchup between the Crimson Tide and Tigers is scheduled for a 7 p.m. CT kickoff on CBS. Verne Lundquist and Gary Danielson will call the game from the booth with Allie LaForce on the sidelines. Eli Gold and Phil Savage will handle the radio call on the Crimson Tide Sports Network, with Chris Stewart serving as the sideline reporter. Nationally, the game will also air on ESPN Radio with Bill Rosinski, David Norrie and Ian Fitzsimmons on the call.

RANKINGS: Alabama remains No. 1 in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls this week. LSU is 15th in AP and 14th in the Amway Coaches Poll.

LSU: The Tigers enter Saturday's game with a 5-2 overall record, including a 3-1 mark in SEC play following an off week on Oct. 29. LSU opened the season with a 16-14 loss to Wisconsin at Lambeau Field in Green Bay, Wis., on Sept. 3. The Tigers rebounded with home wins over Jacksonville State, 34-13, on Sept. 10, and Mississippi State, 23-20, on Sept. 17, before falling at Auburn, 18-13, on Sept. 24. LSU returned home to defeat Missouri, 42-7, on Oct. 1. Following the postponement of the Tigers' Oct. 8 game at Florida due to Hurricane Matthew, LSU won back-to-back home games over Southern Miss, 45-10, on Oct. 15 and No. 23/22 Ole Miss, 38-21, on Oct. 22, before the Tigers' bye week. LSU is led by interim head coach Ed Orgeron, who is 3-0 this season after taking over for Les Miles on Sept. 25. Orgeron owns a 19-27 career record at Ole Miss, USC and LSU, including a 9-2 mark as an interim head coach at USC and LSU.

SERIES HISTORY: Alabama and LSU will meet for the 81st time in a series that the Crimson Tide leads, 50-25-5, dating back to the 1895 season. Since 2005, the LSU-Alabama games have been tight battles, with seven of those games being decided by seven points or less. During head coach Nick Saban's tenure in Tuscaloosa, six of the 10 duels between the two teams have been decided by that same narrow margin, with three of those games going into overtime. In last year's meeting, Derrick Henry rushed for three touchdowns and the Tide defense limited LSU to 182 yards in a 30-16 win in Tuscaloosa.

NEXT GAME: Alabama will return home to face Mississippi State on Nov. 12 at Bryant-Denny Stadium on ESPN at 11 a.m. CT. The Tide is 78-18-3 against the Bulldogs and 42-9-1 all-time in Tuscaloosa. Alabama defeated Mississippi State, 31-6, in Starkville in 2015. The Tide has won eight straight against State, including the last four in Tuscaloosa. Nick Saban is 13-1 against Mississippi State in his career, with an 8-1 record during his tenure at Alabama.

Nathan Sheehan Phone: 847-846-9894 e-mail: nsheehan@ia.ua.edu **STREAKING:** Alabama owns the longest winning streak in the Football Bowl Subdivision, having won 20 consecutive games dating back to last season (a loss on Sept. 19, 2015, vs. Ole Miss). The 20-game streak is the fourth-longest in school history (28 games twice: 1991-93 & 1978-80) and is the longest under the direction of head coach Nick Saban (previous long: 19 games in 2009-10). During this stretch, the Crimson Tide have won nine games at Bryant-Denny Stadium, seven straight road matchups and four consecutive neutral-site contests while going 13-0 against teams from the Southeastern Conference. Alabama has outscored its opponents by 492 points (768-276; 38.4-13.8), an average of 24.6 points per game, during the streak.

ALLEN IN HEISMAN CONVERSATION: Alabama senior defensive end Jonathan Allen has played his way into the Heisman Trophy conversation with an outstanding 2016 season. The native of Leesburg, Va., chose to return for his senior season and leads the team with two defensive touchdowns – fumble returns of 75 and 30 yards – while ranking second on the team with six sacks. He has added 35 tackles with 18 solo stops, 6.5 tackles for loss (-53 yards), a teamhigh 10 quarterback hurries, one blocked field goal and two pass breakups. That pace is on par or even better than Nebraska's Ndamukong Suh, who was a Heisman Finalist in 2009. In his first eight games of the 2009 season, Suh had five sacks, nine quarterback hurries, 49 tackles, 11 TFLs and no defensive touchdowns.

ALABAMA AS THE NATION'S NO. 1: The University of Alabama has played 67 games as the nation's top-ranked team since the inception of the Associated Press poll in 1936. In those games the Crimson Tide boasts a 57-10 (.851) record. Those numbers get even more impressive when you look at the 10 seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban (2007-present). Since the ninth game of the 2008 season (109 games), Alabama has played 43 games while being ranked No. 1, posting a 38-5 (.884) record during that span.

ALABAMA NO. 1 IN THE CLASSROOM AS WELL: Alabama has topped both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches' polls since the preseason but the Crimson Tide also leads all unbeaten Football Bowl Subdivision teams in another category - graduation rate. Alabama boasts the top Graduation Success Rate (GSR) among the nation's undefeated FBS teams at 86 percent. Clemson is second at 84 percent.

FACING OFF WITH THE BEST: The Crimson Tide has the fourth-toughest schedule in college football this season per ESPN.com's preseason College Football Power Index, trailing only Southern California, Ole Miss and Florida State. Alabama will, by season's end, face off with nine teams who participated in a bowl game a season ago and will have met four teams ranked in the preseason Associated Press Top 25.

12 STRAIGHT VS. RANKED TEAMS: Alabama has won 12 straight games vs. ranked opponents, the longest streak since Southern California won 16 straight from 2002-05 under Pete Carroll and is tied for the third-longest run all-time. The streak began at Georgia (Oct. 3) last season with a 38-10 win over the No. 8 Bulldogs in Athens. In those 12 games, the Tide is 7-0 against top 10 teams and 3-0 vs. the top 5 (LSU, Michigan State and Clemson). The Tide's last loss to a top 25 team was Sept. 19, 2015, against Ole Miss (37-43).

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 44-12 (.786) against the Associated Press top 25, including a 24-6 (.800) mark against AP top 10 teams since the start of 2008. This season, the Tide has faced five teams ranked in the AP poll, defeating then-No. 20 USC, 52-6, then-No. 19 Ole Miss, 48-43, then-No. 16 Arkansas, 49-30, then-No. 9 Tennessee, 49-10 and then-No. 6 Texas A&M, 33-14, an average score of 46.2-20.6. Alabama is scheduled for two more matchups against teams currently in the top 25 (No. 11 Auburn and No. 15 LSU). Alabama finished 8-1 in 2015 against the AP top 25 after going 5-2 in 2014, 3-2 in 2013 and 5-1 in 2012. The Tide held a 4-1 mark vs. top 25 teams in 2011 and went 5-3 in 2010.

SCORING SUCCESS: Alabama leads the SEC in scoring offense (43.9 points per game) and ranks second in scoring defense (14.9 ppg). Nationally, the Tide ranks eighth in scoring offense and fourth in scoring defense.

ESPN COLLEGE GAMEDAY: Alabama will be making its 38th (24-13 record) appearance on ESPN's College GameDay when the popular pregame show broadcasts from LSU Saturday prior to the SEC top-15 matchup between the Crimson Tide and the Tigers. It will mark Alabama's 29th appearance under head coach Nick Saban (21-7). The 29 appearances in the Saban era are eight better than Oregon for the most GameDay appearances since the 2007 season.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in only three regular season games that did not have national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU in 2010, Alabama was essentially eliminated from a chance to remain in the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without national championship implications during this span.

FIRST TIME STARTERS: Safety Hootie Jones became the 14th Crimson Tide student-athlete to make his first career start when he took the field for the opening defensive snap vs. No. 6 Texas A&M on Oct. 22. Running back Bo Scarbrough started for the first time against Tennessee on Oct. 15. Freshman running back Josh Jacobs recorded his first career start vs. Kentucky on Oct. 1. Wide receiver Cam Sims was in the starting lineup for the first time against Kent State on Sept. 24. Jalen Hurts (QB), Gehrig Dieter (WR) and Anthony Averett (DB) made their starting debuts vs. Western Kentucky on Sept. 10. Ryan Anderson (LB), Dalvin Tomlinson (DE), Tim Williams (LB), Blake Barnett (QB), Miller Forristall (TE), Damien Harris (RB) and Jonah Williams (OT) started for the first time vs. USC in the 2016 season opener on Sept. 3.

ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 106 games, the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014 and 14-1 in 2015. Boise State is second with 97 wins.

NON-OFFENSIVE TDs IN THE SABAN ERA: Jonathan Allen's 30-yard fumble return vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22 marked the 56th non-offensive touchdown of the Nick Saban era and the 12th for the Crimson Tide this season, extending the Crimson Tide's single-season record under Saban. Alabama has now scored at least one touchdown on defense or special teams in each game this season, including multiple non-offensive scores in all three SEC road contests this season (Ole Miss, Arkansas and Tennessee). Alabama has scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 consecutive games dating back to the CFP semifinal vs. Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015, and has 14 non-offensive touchdowns in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return

NON-OFFENSIVE WINS: Alabama's defense and special teams has outscored the Crimson Tide's opponent in four of eight games this season. In the season opener, Marlon Humphrey's 18-yard interception return accounted for seven of the Tide's 52 points, while the Trojans managed two field goals. Against Kent State, Xavian Marks' 75-yard punt return for a touchdown was the difference in Alabama's shutout victory. The defense once again proved to be enough against Kentucky with Ronnie Harrison's 55-yard fumble return going for seven points in a 34-6 win over the Wildcats. Defense and special teams provided two touchdowns in a 49-10 win over Tennessee on Oct. 15.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 752 of the 1,114 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 461-127-8 (.780) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 103-15 (.873) mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 139th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid-1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started five seasons at No. 1 (2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 26 seasons (1991-2016), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012 and 2015 seasons, while beginning at No. 1 in 2016. The Tide has compiled five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 & 1979) and five USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012 & 2015) coaches poll national titles.

TIDE LEADS THE NATION IN NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS: Alabama's 12 non-offensive touchdowns in 2016 tops the Football Bowl Subdivision. Akron has five while Houston, Michigan and Ohio State have each tallied four non-offensive scores. The Crimson Tide has scored at least one non-offensive touchdown in each of its last 10 games dating back to the CFP semifinal vs. Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015, and has tallied 22 non-offensive TDs in its last 19 games dating back to the Georgia game on Oct. 3, 2015. Alabama's 12 non-offensive scores equals the number of touchdowns the Tide defense has surrendered in 2016.

THREE NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS EQUALS RECORD: Alabama's three non-offensive touchdowns at Ole Miss on Sept. 17 marked the third time in the last four seasons the Crimson Tide defense and special teams have found the end zone three times in the same game. The Tide took three interceptions back for scores against Texas A&M in 2015 and had punt, interception and kickoff returns against Virginia Tech in 2013. Prior to 2013, the last time the Crimson Tide had scored three non-offensive touchdowns in a game was Sept. 30, 1995, against Georgia.

NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw seven former Alabama players selected in the 2016 NFL Draft, including first-round pick Ryan Kelly who went 18th overall to the Indianapolis Colts. Linebacker Reggie Ragland was the next to go (41st, Buffalo Bills) followed by Derrick Henry (45th, Tennessee Titans), A'Shawn Robinson (46th, Detroit Lions), Jarran Reed (49th, Seattle Seahawks) and Cyrus Jones (60th, New England Patriots), all in the second round. Running back Kenyan Drake rounded out the 2016 NFL Draft class when he was chosen by the Miami Dolphins at 73rd overall in the third round.

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last six drafts (44) than any other college in the nation. Fifteen of those picks have been first-round selections and 25 have gone in the first two rounds. The list of 44 features four Super Bowl Champions, seven Pro Bowl selections, one All-Pro and one Offensive Rookie of the Year.

OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past nine seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. The 2016 squad features 10 players who already have degrees in hand going into the season opener with USC. Over the previous eight seasons (2008-15) Alabama saw 94 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate) by players who were still suiting up for the Crimson Tide after having graduated. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen an impressive 11 players earn a master's degree before stepping foot on the field. In 2015, the Crimson Tide led all bowl teams with a total of 29 players who earned their degrees prior to the start of postseason play. Three of the 29 earned their master's degrees during the 2015 season.

GRADUATING WITH THE BEST: The Alabama football team has not only been dominant on the field, but also in the classroom. The Crimson Tide ranks fourth among Associated Press Preseason Top 25 teams for its graduation rate of 86 percent. Ahead of Alabama are only Stanford (99 percent) and Notre Dame (93 percent) and UCLA (89 percent). Alabama's percentage was the Southeastern Conference's highest graduation success rate (GSR) of all 14 SEC football programs.

ACADEMIC PROWESS: The Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the academic highlights under head coach Nick Saban.

- A total of nine Crimson Tide players will take the field with their degrees in hand for the season opener with USC.
- Earned Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 86 this year, the highest across all 14 SEC football programs.
- In 2015, for the third consecutive year, Alabama football led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play (29 in 2015, 22 in 2014; 28 in 2013).
- Alabama's last four national title football teams (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015) included 89 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That 2011 team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- In 2015-16, Alabama tied for the lead in the in number of football studentathletes being named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll with 10 honorees. Alabama topped that list in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY: Last season, Alabama worked 400-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered their time across numerous areas last season including in schools, hospitals, with Habitat for Humanity and on campus.

HOWARD NOMINATED FOR WUERFFEL TROPHY: Alabama tight end O.J. Howard has been nominated for the 2016 Wuerffel Trophy. Howard completed his undergraduate degree in May 2016 and is pursuing a masters degree in sports business management. Howard, a 2016 Allstate/AFCA Good Works Team nominee, volunteers his time as a regular visitor to children's hospitals in Birmingham, with Habitat for Humanity and has been a regular visiting the VA hospital while with the Crimson Tide. Named after 1996 Heisman Trophy Winner, Danny Wuerffel, the trophy is presented in Fort Walton Beach, Fla., annually to the college football player that best combines exemplary community service with academic and athletic achievement. Former Alabama offensive lineman Barrett Jones is among the past recipients of the award. Jones was honored following the 2010 season.

ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE: The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won 10 national championships in five different sports and 22 SEC championships in seven different sports.
- Alabama claimed two SEC team titles during the 2015-16 academic year football and women's golf.
- The overall cumulative grade-point average of Alabama student-athletes in 2015-16 was 3.16.
- Twelve Crimson Tide teams had cumulative GPAs above 3.0 for 2015-16
- Alabama student-athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition 350 times during the 2015-16 academic year. The Crimson Tide had 82, 59 and 126 student-athletes named to the SEC Fall, Winter and Spring Academic Honor Rolls and 83 named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- Since 2000, UA has produced 113 Academic All-America honorees, which

DEFENSIVE NOTES

ALLEN EARNS SEMIFINALIST NOD FOR THE MAXWELL AWARD: Senior defensive lineman Jonathan Allen has been named one of 18 semifinalists for the Maxwell Award, which is presented each season to college football's player of the year. Allen is joined on the list by teammate Jalen Hurts. A feared pass rusher and proven run stopper for the Tide, Allen has a team-high 10 quarterback hurries to go with his 35 tackles, 6.5 of which are sacks (-53 yards) to rank him second on the team. He has also returned a team-leading two fumble recoveries for 105 combined yards and two touchdowns. The Leesburg, Va., native's 24 career sacks ranks No. 3 on the Tide's all-time list. Finalists for the Maxwell Award will be announced on Nov. 21, with the winners being announced on Dec. 8 on ESPN at The Home Depot College Football Awards.

ANDERSON AND FOSTER SEMIFINALISTS FOR THE BUTKUS

AWARD: Senior linebackers Ryan Anderson and Reuben Foster were named to the list of 12 semifinalists for the Butkus Award, the Butkus Foundation announced on Oct. 31. The Butkus Award is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker. Anderson ranks second in the SEC with 11.5 tackles for loss (-61 yards) and is 10th in sacks with 4.5 (-38 yards) as part of his 29 total tackles. He has added three forced fumbles and five quarterback hurries to his season totals and has played a key role on an Alabama defense that is tops in the nation with 4.0 sacks per game. Foster, the team leader in tackles with 53, is the Tide's main signal caller on the defense. He has collected 4.5 tackles for loss (-22 yards) and has 1.5 sacks (-15 yards). The senior from Auburn, Ala., has added four quarterback hurries and two pass breakups from his middle linebacker spot.

ALLEN AND FOSTER NAMED TO SEMIFINALIST LIST FOR THE BEDNARIK AWARD: Senior defensive lineman Jonathan Allen and senior linebacker Reuben Foster were named to the list of 18 semifinalists for the Bednarik Award, given annually to college football's defensive player of the year. Finalists for the Bednarik Award will be announced on Nov. 21, with the winners being announced on Dec. 8 on ESPN at The Home Depot College Football Awards.

FITZPATRICK A SEMIFINALIST FOR THE JIM THORPE AWARD:

Sophomore defensive back Minkah Fitzpatrick was named to the list of 16 semifinalists for the prestigious Jim Thorpe Award, the Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame announced Oct. 24. The Jim Thorpe Award is presented annually to the nation's top defensive back. Fitzpatrick is in the midst of a breakout season in 2016, as he leads the Crimson Tide in interceptions (3), pass breakups (5) and sacks (1.5). He has three career interception returns for touchdowns, tying him for the Alabama career lead. Through eight games this season, Fitzpatrick has recorded 36 tackles, two tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, three interceptions, five pass breakups and forced one fumble.

ALLEN EARNS MULTIPLE DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS FOR PERFORMANCE VS. TEXAS A&M: Senior defensive end Jonathan Allen was named the SEC & FWAA/ Nagurski Defensive Player of the Week and the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week following his performance against Texas A&M on Oct. 22. Allen finished the matchup against the Aggies with one sack for a loss of eight yards, along with a career-high four quarterback hurries. He totaled six tackles on the day, three of which were solo stops, and added his second defensive score of the season. Allen picked up an Aggie fumble and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown late in the third quarter to put the Tide in front by two scores. This year, Allen has totaled a team-high 10 quarterback hurries while ranking second in sacks with 6.0 (-53 yards). He has also added 6.5 tackles for a loss (-53 yards) as part of his 35 total tackles. Allen leads the defense with two touchdown scores, both fumble recoveries, and has two pass breakups to his name.

TIDE LEADS NATION IN DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS: Jonathan Allen's 30-yard fumble return vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22 gives Alabama an FBS-best nine defensive touchdowns this season. Central Michigan, Ohio State, Houston and Wyoming have scored four times on defense this season. Alabama has now scored nine touchdowns on 16 forced turnovers this season (four of eight interceptions, five of eight fumbles).

10 POINTS OR FEWER: Alabama's 49-10 win over then-No. 9/11 Tennessee on Oct. 15 marked the 62nd time the Crimson Tide has held an opponent to 10 points or fewer under head coach Nick Saban since the start of the 2007 season and the fifth time in 2016. In 2015, Alabama held six opponents to 10 points or less and recorded two shutouts. In 2014, Alabama shut out two opponents and held seven opponents to two touchdowns or less. Alabama held nine of 13 opponents to 10 points or less in 2013 with three shutouts. Seven opponents were limited to 10 points or less in 2012, four of which were shutouts. Alabama was successful in holding opponents to single digits in nine games in 2011 and eight times in 2010. Alabama kept opponents within that range seven times in both 2008 and 2009, and in 2007 posted two games in which it held opponents to 0-10 points. Alabama has shut out the opposition 17 times during the Saban era.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no defense has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama's defense has surrendered only 154 touchdowns over the last 102 games. That is 37 fewer than the second most in the nation (Florida with 191).

POINTS HARD TO FIND: Through eight games in 2016, the Alabama defense has surrendered only 119 points (14.9 ppg) to rank fourth nationally and second in the SEC in scoring defense. The Tide has held five of its seven opponents - USC (52-6), Western Kentucky (38-10), Kent State (48-0), Kentucky (34-6) and Tennessee (49-10) - to 10 points or less this season and has allowed only six red zone touchdowns in 16 trips inside the 20 by opponents.

NO GO IN THE RED ZONE: Alabama only ranks 47th nationally in red zone defense, having surrendered 13 scores in 16 opponent trips inside the 20-yard line. But a closer look at the numbers reveals how dominant the Crimson Tide defense has been once an opposing offense reaches the Tide 20. Of the 13 opponent scores in eight games, only six have been touchdowns, tied with Michigan for the fewest in the country.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: During head coach Nick Saban's last 118 games at the Capstone (since the start of the 2008 season), the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposing offense to fewer than 200 yards of total offense 40 times, the most recent being Tennessee (163) on Oct. 15. The Tide has also held USC (194) and Kent State (166) and Kentucky (161) below the 200-yard mark this season. In 2015, Alabama held four opponents to fewer than 200 yards (Florida – 180, Charleston Southern – 134, LSU – 182 yards, ULM – 92). Alabama's best came in 2009 when the Tide held Chattanooga to 84 yards of total offense.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: In head coach Nick Saban's tenure at Alabama, the Tide has limited opponents to under 300 yards of total offense 82 times, or 62.6 percent of the time. UA opened the 2016 season by limiting USC to just 194 yards in the Tide's 52-6 victory and followed that up by holding Western Kentucky to 239 yards on Sept. 10. Alabama held Kent State to 166 yards on Sept. 24, Kentucky to 161 on Oct. 1, Tennessee to 163 yards on Oct. 15 and most recently held Texas A&M to 278 yards on Oct. 22. In 2015, the Crimson Tide held the opposition to less than 300 yards of offense 10 times (Michigan State, 239 yards; Florida, 180; Auburn, 260; LSU, 182; Arkansas, 220; Georgia, 299; ULM, 92; Middle Tennessee, 275; Wisconsin, 268).

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama has allowed only three rushing touchdowns so far this season. In 2015, the Crimson Tide allowed just seven rushing touchdowns in 15 games, second-lowest total in the country. The Tide leads the nation in allowing the fewest rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2005 season, surrendering only 81. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 64 rushing touchdowns. Ohio State is No. 2 in that category, giving up 97 since 2007.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Alabama has surrendered only 16 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that is the lowest in the nation. Alabama has not allowed a 100-yard rusher in the past 18 games (Nick Chubb, UGA). Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed 11 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game: Chubb (146 on Oct. 3, 2015), Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliott (230 on Jan. 1, 2015), Auburn's Tre Mason (164 on Nov. 30, 2013), Virginia Tech's Trey Edmunds (132 on Aug. 31, 2013), Georgia's Todd Gurley (122 yards on Dec. 1, 2012), LSU's Jeremy Hill (107 on Nov. 3, 2012), Georgia Southern's Dominique Swope (153 on Nov. 19, 2011), Tennessee's Tauren Poole (117 on Oct. 23, 2010), Ole Miss' BenJarvus Green-Ellis (131 on Oct. 13, 2007), Houston's Anthony Alridge (100 on Oct. 6, 2007) and Darren McFadden of Arkansas (195 on Sept. 15, 2007).

OVERWHELMING DEFENSE VS. KENT STATE: Alabama posted its first shutout of the season in a 48-0 win over Kent State, but the true domination is found with a closer look at the box score. Alabama's first-team defense limited Kent to just 61 total yards on 27 plays before heading to the bench after the first drive of the second half. The more amazing part was the Tide surrendered a 47-yard run on the first play of the game and then allowed just 14 yards to KSU on the next 26 plays (0.54 yards per play).

On Sept. 10, Eddie Jackson found the end zone on a 55-yard return against Western Kentucky and Marlon Humphrey returned a pick 18 yards for a touchdown against USC on Sept. 3. Prior to 2016, the most-recent instance of back-to-back games with interceptions for touchdowns was in 2008 when Rashad Johnson returned interceptions for scores against Arkansas State and LSU on Nov. 1 and Nov. 8.

ALLEN MOVING UP CAREER SACK LIST: Jonathan Allen's first quarter sack vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22 gives him six sacks in 2016 and moved the senior from fifth into sole possession of third place on the Alabama career sack list with 24, breaking a tie with of Jarrett Johnson (1999-2002). Allen is now one sack shy of second place Kindal Moorehead (25, 1998-2002). The Crimson Tide's all-time leader for career sacks is Derrick Thomas (1985-88) with 52.0. Allen has recorded 12 sacks in his last 14 games. His two sacks against USC on Sept. 3 marked the sixth time in his career that the senior has registered a multi-sack game. Allen's career-high mark of three came against Mississippi State in 2015 as part of his team-leading total of 12.0 sacks by year's end.

WILLIAMS NOW NINTH ON ALABAMA SACK LIST: Senior linebacker Tim Williams vaulted into the top 10 on Alabama's career sack list with a pair of sacks vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22. Williams now has 18.5 sacks for the Tide, good for ninth all-time and just a half sack shy of Jeremy Nunley's 19.0 (1990-93) for eighth place. Williams leads Alabama with 6.5 sacks this season and is second on the squad in tackles for loss with 9.5.

FITZPATRICK LEADING THE SECONDARY: Sophomore Minkah Fitzpatrick continued his breakout season against Texas A&M on Oct. 22. The Thorpe Award semifinalist recorded three tackles to up his season total to 36, good enough for fourth on the team. He leads the Tide in interceptions with three (including a school-record 100-yard return vs. Arkansas) and pass breakups with five. He has also forced one fumble and recorded two tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.

CAREER DAY FOR FOSTER VS. TEXAS A&M: Against Texas A&M on Oct. 22, linebacker Reuben Foster equaled his career high with 12 tackles. Foster previously had 12 stops at Ole Miss on Sept. 17 to surpass his previous high of 11 against Tennessee in 2015. The senior leads the Tide in total tackles (53), solo tackles (29) and assists (21) this season to go with 4.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and three quarterback hurries. For his career, Foster has notched 160 tackles, 92 solo stops and 15.5 tackles for loss.

FITZPATRICK'S RECORD RETURN AT ARKANSAS: Sophomore Minkah Fitzpatrick's 100-yard interception return for a touchdown vs. Arkansas on Oct. 8 is the longest in school history, breaking the previous record of 98 yards set by Mark McMillan vs. Chattanooga on Oct. 5, 1991. The score also gives Fitzpatrick three career interception returns for touchdowns, tying him for the Alabama career lead with Antonio Langham (1990-93), C.J. Mosley (2010-13) and current teammate Eddie Jackson (2013-present).

HAMILTON'S CAREER NIGHT VS. ARKANSAS: Linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton established a new career high for tackles with nine stops against Arkansas on Oct. 8. The junior also added sack, 1.5 tackles for loss and forced a fumble in the 49-30 win over the Razorbacks. Hamilton ranks second on the team in tackles with 40 and has 7.5 tackles for loss of 32 yards and two sacks (-13 yards).

ANDERSON SETS CAREER HIGH IN TACKLES: Ryan Anderson's nine tackles vs. Arkansas on Oct. 8 are a new career high. His previous career high was six, set against Texas A&M in 2014. Anderson has 29 tackles this season along with a team-high 11.5 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks, five quarterback hurries, one fumble recovery, three forced fumbles and a pass breakup. His numbers this season continues his hot streak that ended the 2015 season. In the final six games of the 2015 campaign, Anderson recorded eight tackles for loss and six sacks. 10 of his career 15 sacks and 19.5 of his 32.5 career tackles for loss have come in his last 14 games played. In his time at Alabama, the redshirt senior has accumulated 32.5 tackles for a loss of 152 yards and added 15 sacks for -111 yards.

JACKSON EQUALS UA CAREER INTERCEPTION RETURNS FOR TOUCHDOWNS RECORD: Senior Eddie Jackson tied the Alabama career record for interception returns for touchdowns with his 55-yard return against Western Kentucky on Sept. 10. Jackson has three touchdowns on interceptions in his career, equaling the record held by Antonio Langham (1990-93), C.J. Mosley (2010-13) and Minkah Fitzpatrick (2015-present). Jackson had two returns for touchdowns in 2015 - a 50-yard score against Georgia on Oct. 3 and a 93-yard return against Texas A&M on Oct. 17. The return against the Aggies is the fourth-longest interception return for a touchdown in Alabama history.

FITZPATRICK GARNERS FOUR DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS AFTER ARKANSAS PERFORMANCE:

Defensive back Minkah Fitzpatrick was named the SEC, Bednarik Award and Walter Camp FBS Defensive Player of the Week and Thorpe Award Player of the Week for his performance at Arkansas on Oct. 8. Fitzpatrick set a career high with three interceptions, returning one 100 yards for a touchdown, and recorded five tackles and two pass breakups in the Tide's 49-30 win. His three interception returns for touchdowns ties him for the Alabama career record with Antonio Langham (1990-93), C.J. Mosley (2010-13) and current teammate Eddie Jackson (2013-Present).

ALLEN NAMED SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior defensive end Jonathan Allen was named the SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his performance against

USC on Sept. 3. Allen led an Alabama defense that limited No. 20 USC to just 194 yards of offense and six points in the Crimson Tide's 52-6 win. The senior leader recorded a team-high two sacks for a loss of 15 yards along with four solo tackles and two pass breakups and was a disruptive force throughout the game.

VETERAN DEFENSE: The 2016 Alabama defense includes five starters from a season ago. Those five returned 245 total tackles, 32 tackles for loss and 16 sacks to this year's team. Of those returning starters, three come from the Tide secondary, including senior Eddie Jackson, who recorded 46 tackles, three tackles for loss and six interceptions entering the season. Jackson set a school record with 230 return yards on his interceptions and took two back for touchdowns a year ago. Senior linebacker Reuben Foster leads all returnees with 73 total tackles. Returning senior defensive lineman Jonathan Allen was the team leader in tackles for loss (14.5) and sacks (12.0) in 2015.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

HURTS ONE OF 18 SEMIFINALISTS FOR THE MAXWELL

AWARD: Freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts has been named one of 18 semifinalists for the Maxwell Award, which is presented each season to college football's player of the year. Hurts is joined on the list by teammate Jonathan Allen. Hurts has excelled at quarterback since taking over the full-time starter duties in week two. The freshman signal-caller has thrown for 1,578 yards and 12 touchdowns through the air while adding 521 yards rushing and nine scores on the ground. He has completed 63.1 percent of his passes and boasts a 147.72 quarterback rating to rank fourth in the SEC. Hurts' 262.4 yards per game of total offense leads all freshmen in the SEC and also sets him at fourth among all conference players. Finalists for the Maxwell Award will be announced on Nov. 21, with the winners being announced on Dec. 8 on ESPN at The Home Depot College Football Awards.

FIRST-YEAR QUARTERBACKS: Alabama opened the 2016 season with a new starting quarterback for the fifth time under head coach Nick Saban and has played two first-year starters so far this season. Blake Barnett took the game's opening snap for the Crimson Tide against USC on Sept. 3 and Jalen Hurts has been under center for the first snap in every game since. Since 2009, Alabama's rookie signal callers have posted a record of 61-4 (.938) and won three national championships.

HURTS AWAY FROM HOME: For a true freshman quarterback, Alabama's Jalen Hurts has been solid away from the friendly confines of Bryant-Denny Stadium. He has completed 64.0 percent of his passes for 701 yards and five touchdowns while rushing for 330 yards on 47 carries for an average of 7.0 yards per carry.

HARRIS VS. RANKED TEAMS: Sophomore running back Damien Harris has been at his best this season against the five ranked teams the Crimson Tide have defeated. He has accounted for 623 of his 697 yards in those five games. He is averaging 8.9 yards per carry in those games with one touchdown. He had 138 yards vs. No. 20 USC, 144 yards at No. 17 Ole Miss, 122 at No. 16 Arkansas, 94 at No. 9 Tennessee and 125 vs. No. 6 Texas A&M.

TIDE TOPS SEC IN SCORING: Through eight games in 2016, Alabama leads the SEC in scoring, averaging 43.9 points per game. The Tide has scored 46 touchdowns, converted 10 field goals and 45-of-45 on PAT kicks (0-for-1 on two-point conversions) for 351 points. Alabama's 46 touchdowns also leads the conference eight more than second place Texas A&M. Nationally, Alabama ranks eighth in the FBS in scoring.

RUSHING DIFFERENTIAL: Alabama has outrushed its opponents 2,118 to 561 through the first eight games of the season, an average of 264.8 yards per game to 70.1 yards per game. That number gets even better in SEC games, with the Tide averaging 293.4 yards per game to just 78.4 of its opponents. Alabama has rushed for 20 touchdowns this season, compared to just three for its opposition.

FIRST HALF POINTS: Adam Griffith's 32-yard first quarter field goal vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22 extended Alabama's first half scoring streak to 126 games, the longest streak in the nation. The last time UA failed to score in the first half was on Sept. 29, 2007, when Alabama and Florida State headed into halftime in a scoreless tie. The Seminoles won that game, 21-14. Entering today's game, Alabama owned a 110-16 record during the current streak.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama's school record consecutive games scoring streak was extended to 206 games with Adam Griffith's 32-yard field goal in the first quarter vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22. Alabama was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000.

RUSHING TO SUCCESS: Alabama is 87-4 (.956) since the start of the 2008 season when rushing for at least 140 yards. The only losses were at Auburn in 2013, at Ole Miss and vs. Ohio State in 2014, and against Ole Miss in 2015. The Crimson Tide rushed for 140 yards or more 10 times in 2015 and has done so seven times this season.

BALL PROTECTION: In its past 117 games dating back to a win over Tulane on Sept. 6, 2008, Alabama has turned the ball over only 139 times (77 fumbles, 62 interceptions) for 1.19 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 120 times in 102 games (1.18/game). Since 2009, UA starting quarterbacks have thrown an impressively low 49 interceptions in 2,721 attempts (1 INT every 55.5 attempts). Dating back to the 2009 season, the top two running backs in the rotation have lost a fumble only 21 times. Over that 117 game span, the top two running backs have recorded 2,998 touches, losing a fumble once every 142.8 touches.

HIGH-SCORING HALF: Alabama's 41-point outburst in the first half against Kent State on Sept. 24 was a season high for Alabama in the opening two quarters and the most since tallying 49 against Charleston Southern on Nov. 21, 2015. The Tide had tallied 17 points in the first half in each of the first three games of the season. The 21 first-quarter points equals the previous season high for a quarter, set in the third quarter of the season opener with USC.

ALABAMA DEEP AT WIDEOUT: The Alabama receiving corps boasts one of the deepest and most talented groups in the nation. The Crimson Tide have four receivers (WR/TE) with at least 1,000 career receiving yards and 75 career receptions. Sophomore Calvin Ridley has 133 career grabs for 1,542 yards (11.6 ypc) and 12 touchdowns. Tight end O.J. Howard has 91 catches for 1,409 yards (15.5 ypc) and six scores while redshirt junior ArDarius Stewart has 103 career catches for 1,321 yards and eight scores. Graduate transfer Gehrig Dieter has 1,669 career receiving yards and 12 touchdowns on 137 receptions combined between Bowling Green and Alabama. He has eight catches for 175 yards with the Crimson Tide and had 129 catches for 1,494 yards for the Falcons.

HURTS MOVING UP QB RUSHING CHART: Quarterback Jalen Hurts is rapidly climbing the Alabama single-season quarterback rushing list. Hurts has carried the ball 95 times for 521 yards this season to rank No. 6 on the single-season after the first eight games of his freshman season. Pat Trammel (1959) is currently No. 5 on the list at 525 yards. Steadman Shealy holds the all-time record with 791 yards for the Crimson Tide's 1979 national championship team. Hurts' 521 rushing yards is already the most for an Alabama quarterback under Nick Saban. The previous high was 350 yards by Blake Sims in 2014.

HURTS TOUCHDOWN RESPONSIBILITY: With his two touchdown passes and one rushing touchdown vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22, Jalen Hurts moved into ninth place on the Alabama single-season touchdown responsibility list with 21. Hurts has thrown 12 touchdown passes and rushed for nine scores so far this season. Harry Gllmer is eighth with 22 scores in 1945 (13 passing, 9 rushing). Blake Sims (2014) holds the single-season record with 35 touchdowns (28 passing, 7 rushing).

DUAL THREAT: Jalen Hurts has added a new dimension to the Crimson Tide offensive attack in 2016 with the QB running game. The Channelview, Texas, native has rushed for 521 yards this year with nine rushing scores while throwing for 1,578 yards, 12 touchdowns and just five interceptions. He has completed 63.2 percent of his passes and boasts a passing efficiency rating of 142.72, which ranks fourth in the SEC. Hurts is averaging 262 yards of total offense per game with 20 touchdowns responsible for and has thrown and rushed for 100 or more yards in a game twice this season (Tennessee, Oct. 15 & Ole Miss, Sept. 17).

HURTS SETS NEW CAREER HIGH IN RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS:

Alabama freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts established a new career high in rushing touchdowns with his three scores vs. Tennessee on Oct. 15. The freshman found the end zone on runs of 45, 2 and 1 yards against the Volunteers. Hurts previous career high was two rushing touchdowns set in his Alabama debut vs. USC on Sept. 3 and equaled on Oct. 8 at Arkansas.

HURTS & SCARBROUGH ECLIPSE 100 ON THE GROUND AT TENNESSEE: Quarterback Jalen Hurts rushed for 132 yards and three touchdowns on 12 carries and running back Bo Scarbrough ran for 109 yards and a score on five carries in Alabama's win over Tennessee on Oct. 15, giving Alabama two 100-yard rushers in the same game for the 23rd time in Crimson Tide history and the second time this season. Hurts (146 yards) and Damien Harris (144) also topped the century mark at Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

HURTS OVER 100 RUSHING AND PASSING AGAIN AT TENNESSEE: Jalen Hurts rushed (132) and passed (143) for more than 100 yards in a game for the second time this season at Tennessee on Oct. 15. Hurts also accomplished that feat at Ole Miss on Sept. 17 in his second college start (146 rushing/158 passing). Prior to this season, the last Tide signal caller to rush for more than 100 yards in a game was Tyler Watts in 2001 (110 vs. Ole Miss on October 13, 2001). Hurts is also the only quarterback to throw and rush for 100 yards in a game under Nick Saban in his 21 years as a college head coach.

STEWART SETS NEW PERSONAL BEST FOR RECEIVING YARDS VS. ARKANSAS: ArDarius Stewart's 120 yards receiving vs. Arkansas on Oct. 8 is a new single-game best for the redshirt junior. His previous best was 113 yards vs. USC on Sept. 3 this season. Stewart established personal bests for touchdown catches (2) and longest reception (71 yards) against the Trojans. Het is second on the team in receiving yards this season with 325 yards on 18 receptions (18.1 ypr) and three touchdowns.

CAREER NIGHT FOR JACOBS AGAINST UK: Freshman running back Josh Jacobs established new career highs in rushing attempts and yards with 16 carries and 100 yards rushing vs. Kentucky on Oct. 1. The yardage total also gave him his first 100-yard game at Alabama. Jacobs added three catches for 44 yards against the Wildcats to finish with 144 yards of total offense on 19 touches.

RIDLEY'S CAREER NIGHT VS. KENTUCKY: Calvin Ridley's 11 receptions and 174 yards vs. Kentucky on Oct. 1 established new career bests for the sophomore receiver. Ridley reached his previous high of nine catches twice, most recently against Western Kentucky on Sept. 10. Ridley's previous career high in yards was 140 vs. Arkansas last season. His two touchdowns against the Wildcats equaled his career best set against Michigan State in last season's CFP semifinal at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl.

SIMS' CAREER DAY VS. KENT STATE: Cam Sims' four catches and 54 yards against Kent State on Sept. 24 led all Tide receivers in the game and surpassed his previous career highs of three receptions (twice, last vs. Western Carolina in 2014) and 33 yards (vs. Western Carolina, 2014). Sims has five receptions for 66 yards in his three appearances this season, pushing his career totals to 18 catches for 174 yards, an average of 9.7 yards per reception.

HURTS OVER 100 RUSHING AND PASSING IN OXFORD: Alabama freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts became the first Tide signal caller to rush for more than 100 yards since Tyler Watts in 2001 (110 vs. Ole Miss on October 13, 2001) in a win at Ole Miss on Sept. 17. Hurts accounted for 146 yards on the ground and threw for 158 more to accumulate 304 yards of total offense on the day. His rushing total ranks fifth in Alabama history for rushing yards by a quarterback.

HARRIS & HURTS BOTH ECLIPSE 100 ON THE GROUND AT OLE MISS: Running back Damien Harris rushed for a career-best 144 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries and quarterback Jalen Hurts ran for a team-high 146 yards on 18 carries in the win over Ole Miss on Sept. 17, giving Alabama two 100-yard rushers in the same game for the 18th time in Crimson Tide history. It also marked the first time a quarterback has figured into that achievement since Jeff Rutledge and running back Johnny Davis did so against Auburn in 1977.

BIG DAY FOR HARRIS VS. OLE MISS: Running back Damien Harris had a career day at Ole Miss on Sept. 17. The sophomore ran for 144 yards on 19 carries, a 9.0 average, and had a 67-yard run that set up Alabama's go-ahead touchdown. He improved as the game wore on. Harris went into halftime with six rushes for 29 yards and broke out in the second half with 10 rushes for 115 yards and a touchdown. Harris' numbers are even more impressive as the game goes along. He has averaged 9.4 yards per carry (31 rushes for 291 yards) in the third and fourth quarters this season.

HURTS FIRST TRUE FRESHMAN TO START AT QB IN 32 YEARS: With his start against Western Kentucky on Sept. 10, Alabama's Jalen Hurts became the first true freshman to start at quarterback for Alabama since Vince Sutton in 1984. Sutton's first start was against Southwestern Louisiana on Sept. 22 that season. He would go on to also start against Vanderbilt, Georgia, Penn State and Tennessee.

HURTS SETS PASS YARDS RECORD FOR STARTING DEBUT & FRESHMAN: In his first career start at quarterback for the Crimson Tide, true freshman Jalen Hurts completed 23-of-36 attempts for two touchdowns while passing for 287 yards without an interception against Western Kentucky on Sept. 10. In addition to breaking the previous record for passing yards in a starting debut of 285 yards set by Brodie Croyle versus Arkansas on September 28, 2002, Hurts' performance also surpassed the previous Crimson Tide freshman passing yards mark of 167 yards set by Vince Sutton against Tennessee on October 20, 1984. Hurts connected on three passes of 40 yards or longer in the performance.

HURTS SHOWS VERSATILITY IN FIRST GAME: In his first game as a collegiate quarterback on Sept. 3 vs. USC, true freshman Jalen Hurts had a versatile performance that opened up the Crimson Tide offense after a sluggish start. Hurts entered the game on the Tide's third offensive possession and lost a fumble on his first play, but he quickly settled into the role and ignited the Tide offense through the air and on the ground. Hurts ended the night against the Trojans accounting for four touchdowns (two rushing, two passing), the first time a Tide player has had two TDs both passing and rushing since Tyler Watts in 2001. Hurts passed for 118 yards and two touchdowns with one interception while completing 6-of-11 pass attempts. He rushed for 32 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries. Hurts' longest pass completion was a 71-yard touchdown strike to ArDarius Stewart in the second quarter.

HURTS NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK FOR PERFORMANCE AT TENNESSEE: Freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts was selected as the Southeastern Conference Freshman of the Week for his performances at then-No. 9 Tennessee on Oct. 15. Hurts excelled once again, accounting for 132 yards rushing and 143 yards through the air in Knoxville to earn freshman of the week honors. He rushed 12 times for 132 yards to average 11.0 yards per carry while totaling a career-high three rushing touchdowns. Hurts also added a 16-of-26 performance for 143 yards through the air to help the Tide finish off the Vols, 49-10.

WILLIAMS EARNS SEC OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS FOLLOWING TENNESSEE GAME: Freshman offensive tackle Jonah Williams picked up SEC Offensive Lineman of the Week honors following the Tide's 49-10 win over then-No. 9 Tennessee. Williams shined once again at right tackle, helping clear a path for the Tide's 594 yards of total offense. The freshman posted a grade of 90 percent and did not allow a quarterback hurry or a sack while committing no penalties. He provided the time for Alabama to rush for a Saban-era high 438 yards on the ground with five rushing touchdowns. Williams' blocking helped quarterback Jalen Hurts (132) and running back Bo Scarbrough (109), eclipse the 100-yard rushing barrier while Damien Harris was just off the century mark at 94 yards on the ground. The Crimson Tide averaged 7.8 yards per play and 8.9 yards per rush thanks to the line's standout protection.

HURTS NAMED SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK: Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts was named the SEC Freshman of the Week for his performance at Arkansas on Oct. 8. Hurts completed 13-of-17 passes for 253 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 20 yards and two touchdowns on eight carries against the Razorbacks. The rushing, passing and touchdowns responsible for (4) equal his career highs set in his first college appearance against USC on Sept. 3.

JACOBS EARNS SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK HONORS: Alabama freshman running back Josh Jacobs was named SEC Freshman of the Week following his performance vs. Kentucky on Oct. 1. Jacobs made his first career start against the Wildcats and posted career highs in carries (16) and rushing yards (100) to help lead the Tide to a 34-6 Homecoming victory. He is Alabama's second-leading rusher this season with 307 yards on 37 carries (51.2 ypg) and has scored three touchdowns.

HURTS NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against Ole Miss on Sept. 17. Starting in his first SEC road game, the freshman signal-caller became the first Tide quarterback to rush for more than 100 yards since Tyler Watts in 2001 in the win over the Rebels. Hurts accounted for 146 yards on the ground and threw for 158 more to accumulate 304 yards of total offense on the day. Hurts' rushing total ranks fifth in Alabama history for rushing yards by a quarterback.

WILLIAMS EARNS SEC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK NOD:

Alabama freshman offensive lineman Jonah Williams was named SEC Freshman of the Week following his performance against USC on Sept. 3. Williams made his collegiate debut as Alabama's starting right tackle and was a vital component on a unit that rolled up 465 yards in total offense and averaged 5.4 yards per attempt on the ground. The Tide offensive line played a big part in career nights from running back Damien Harris and receiver ArDarius Stewart as Alabama topped the 50-point mark in a season opener for the first time since 2007.

RIDLEY LED ALL SEC FRESHMAN RECEIVERS: In 2015, Calvin Ridley broke the school and SEC single-season freshman record for receptions with 89. He finished with the second-highest catch total by a true freshman receiver in FBS history behind Antonio Brown's mark of 102 at Central Michigan in 2007. Ridley also set the Alabama single-season freshman receiving record for yards with 1,045, eclipsing the previous mark of 1,000 held by Amari Cooper (2012).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

SCOTT AMONG CANDIDATES FOR THE RAY GUY AWARD:

Junior punter JK Scott is one of 66 candidates for the Ray Guy Award, which is presented annually to college football's top punter. Scott was selected for the award for a third consecutive year thanks to his SEC-leading 47.5 yards per punt average on his 28 punts, which ranks second in the SEC. He is tied for fourth nationally in punting average and is in a tie for 13th nationally with 14 punts of 50-plus yards. Half of his punts have gone beyond 50 yards to rank him second in the nation for percentage of punts that travel over 50 yards, while he is also second nationally in 60-plus yard punts with four. In total, Scott has maintained a 41.3 net average on his boots while limiting the opposition to only 93 return yards through eight games.

GRIFFITH SIXTH ON ALL-TIME SCORING LIST: With two field goals and three extra points vs. Texas A&M on Oct. 22, senior placekicker Adam Griffith now has 73 points in 2016 (10 field goals and 43 PAT) to give him 301 career points (46 FG, 163 PAT). Griffith now ranks sixth on the Tide's career scoring list, three points shy of Jeremy Shelley (304 points on 44 field goals and 172 PATs) Griffith also ranks sixth on Alabama's all-time kick-scoring list just behind Shelley.

GRIFFITH AMONG CAREER PAT & FIELD GOAL LEADERS: With his three PATs against Texas A&M on Oct. 22, placekicker Adam Griffith has now converted 163 of 164 attempts and remains No. 2 on the Alabama career PAT list behind Jeremy Shelley (2009-12), who converted a school-record 172 PATs on 175 attempts. Griffith's two field goals against the Aggies gives him 46 for his career (on 69 attempts) and moved him into sole possession of fifth place on Alabama's career list, breaking a tie with Shelley (44-of-55). Van Tiffin (1983-86) is fourth at 59.

eight games, punter JK Scott is averaging 47.5 yards per punt on 28 attempts which has him tied for fourth nationally. Scott has forced nine fair catches, dropped 10 punts inside the 20 and 14 of his kicks have traveled more than 50 yards, including four of 60 yards or more with two traveling a season-long 63-yard at Ole Miss on Sept. 17 and Arkansas on Oct. 8. Scott proved to be nothing short of amazing as a freshman in 2014, averaging 48.0 yards per punt to lead the nation. He also helped Alabama lead the nation in net punting at 44.67 yards per punt. Scott placed 26 of his 55 punts (56.4 percent) inside the 20, which was the best percentage nationally. He has placed 64 punts inside the 20 and booted 57 punts of 50 yards or more in 35 career games.

CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH PUNT RETURN TDs: Xavian Marks' 75-yard third quarter punt return for a touchdown against Kent State on Sept. 24 and Eddie Jackson's 85-yard punt return for a score against Ole Miss on Sept. 17 gave the Tide punt returns in consecutive games for only the second time since 1944. The only other occurrence was Nov. 14 and 21, 2015, when Cyrus Jones returned punts 69 yards and 43 yards for scores at Mississippi State and at home against Charleston Southern, respectively. Based on records available at this time (dating back to 1944), these are believed to be the only two occurrences in Alabama football history.

JACKSON FINDING THE END ZONE: Eddie Jackson's 85-yard punt return for a touchdown at Ole Miss on Sept. 17 and 75-yard return vs. Tennessee on Oct. 15 are the first for Alabama since Cyrus Jones went 57 yards for a score against Michigan State in the 2015 CFP Semifinal at the Goodyear Cotton Bowl. Jackson's return at Ole Miss ties for the eighth-longest in school history. The two punt returns for touchdowns this season ties him for fourth on the single-season list in that category.

JACKSON LEADS THE NATION IN PUNT RETURNS: Senior Eddie Jackson leads the FBS in yards per return with an average of 23.0 yards per return (11 returns for 253 yards). The last 18 times the dual-threat returner/defensive back has touched the ball, the senior has accounted for five touchdowns (27 percent) on seven interceptions (three pick-sixes) and 11 punt returns, two of which he has returned for touchdowns. In his career, he has touched the ball 22 times, accounting for 607 yards, averaging 27.5 yards per touch with five scores. In addition to his punt return numbers, Jackson has nine career interception returns for 303 return yards and four fumble returns for 51 yards. Jackson was lost for the remainder of the season due to a broken leg suffered in Alabama's 33-14 win over Texas A&M on Oct. 22.

SCOTT EARNS SEC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS: Junior punter JK Scott was named the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance at Arkansas on Oct. 8. Scott averaged 51.5 yards per punt on four attempts with two touchbacks and two kicks inside the 20-yard line. He also equaled his season-long punt with a 63-yard boot on his first punt of the game. Scott also had a 63-yard effort at Ole Miss on Sept. 17.

JACKSON NAMED SEC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE

WEEK: Senior Eddie Jackson was named the SEC Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance at Ole Miss on Sept. 17. The senior defensive back took the field as the Tide's punt returner against Ole Miss and returned two Rebel punts for a total of 95 yards. Jackson's 85 yard effort for a touchdown late in the second quarter sparked an Alabama's rally that led to the Tide's 48-43 win. The performance in Oxford marked the first time in Jackson's career that he has returned punts for Alabama.

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-LSU SERIES: Alabama leads the series with LSU 50-25-5, which dates back to the 1895 season. The 2016 game will be the 81st meeting between these two long-time Southern football rivals. Since 2005, the LSU-Alabama games have been true battles, with seven of those games being decided by seven points or less. During head coach Nick Saban's tenure in Tuscaloosa, six of the 10 duels between the two teams have been decided by that same narrow margin, with three of those games going into overtime. In last year's meeting, Derrick Henry rushed for three touchdowns and the Tide defense limited LSU to just 182 yards in 30-16 win in Tuscaloosa. The Tigers won the inaugural meeting in Baton Rouge, 12-6, on Nov. 18, 1895. The two teams did not meet again until the 1902 season, with LSU prevailing once again. Alabama's first series win came on Nov. 9, 1903, in Baton Rouge as the Crimson Tide scored a 10-0 victory. From 1919-45, Alabama posted a 12-game unbeaten streak (9-0-3) against LSU. The series was resumed during the 1944 season with the Tigers gaining a slight advantage over the next nine meetings, posting a 5-3-1 record from 1946-58. Alabama went 16-2 (.889) against LSU from 1964-81, including a series-long 11-game winning streak from 1971-81. LSU also ended UA's school record 31-game (30-0-1) unbeaten streak with a 17-13 win at Bryant-Denny Stadium in 1993. The Tigers snapped a 15-game winless streak to the Crimson Tide in Tiger Stadium with a 30-28 win in Baton Rouge on Nov. 4, 2000. Alabama snapped a five-game series skid with the 27-21 overtime win in Baton Rouge in 2008 and followed that with a 24-15 win in Tuscaloosa in 2009. In 2011, the Tide fell to the Tigers 9-6 in overtime in the regular-season contest before meeting for the BCS National Championship, where Alabama came out on top, 21-0. Alabama then produced one of the more memorable victories with a come-from-behind 21-17 victory at Tiger Stadium in 2012 as AJ McCarron found T.J. Yeldon on a screen pass for a 28-yard touchdown with 51 second remaining in the game. Alabama pulled away in the second half for a convincing 38-17 win in 2013. In 2014, a stunning last-minute drive in the fourth quarter by Blake Sims produced a game-tying field goal to send the 2014 matchup into overtime. The Crimson Tide would secure the win, 20-13, as Sims found DeAndrew White in the corner of the end zone for a six-yard score to push UA ahead for the win in Baton Rouge.

SABAN VS. LSU: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 7-4 in his career against LSU, following last year's 30-16 win in Tuscaloosa. Prior to the home victory, the Tide took down the Tigers, 20-13, in overtime in Alabama's last visit to Baton Rouge in 2014. Saban's squad also defeated LSU, 38-17 in Tuscaloosa in 2013. Alabama would earn another victory in the final minutes in 2012 in Baton Rouge, coming away with a last-minute, 21-17. Saban also beat the Tigers in the 2012 BCS National Championship Game (21-0) in New Orleans. Prior to that, Alabama had lost two in a row with a 9-6 overtime defeat in Tuscaloosa on Nov. 5, 2011, and a 24-21 loss in Baton Rouge in 2010. Alabama won the 2008 and 2009 meetings, posting a 27-21 overtime victory in 2008 and a 24-15 win in 2009. Before his arrival in Tuscaloosa, Saban-coached teams were 0-1 against LSU, losing 46-25 to the Tigers while at Michigan State in the 1995 Independence Bowl in Shreveport. Saban was the head coach at LSU from 2000-04 and compiled a 48-16 (.750) record, leading the Tigers to two SEC Championships during his tenure. In 2003, Saban coached the Tigers to a 13-1 record and a 21-14 win over Oklahoma in the BCS National Championship Game played at the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans, La.

ALABAMA-LSU AT VARIOUS SITES: The Alabama-LSU series has been played at six different sites since the initial meeting in 1895. The city of Baton Rouge has hosted the most games in the series (38), with Alabama posting a 27-9-2 record on the LSU campus. New Orleans is the only other Louisiana city to host the series, with Alabama and LSU playing to a 7-7 tie in New Orleans in 1921 and the Crimson Tide claiming the 2011 national championship inside the Superdome, 21-0, over the Tigers. Four Alabama cities have played host to this rivalry, including Tuscaloosa, Mobile, Montgomery and Birmingham.

ALABAMA-LSU SERIES IS A LONG ONE: The LSU series is the fourth-longest series in school history. The two teams began playing in 1895, the 15th game in Crimson Tide history, and the 2016 game marks the 81st meeting between the two teams. Only Mississippi State (99), Tennessee (99) and Vanderbilt (83) have played Alabama more than LSU. Auburn and LSU have played the Tide 80 times.

LSU CONNECTIONS: The Alabama football team has many connections back to LSU and the State of Louisiana with seven staff members who worked in the state and eight players from Louisiana. Tide head coach Nick Saban spent five seasons (2000-04) running the Tigers' program, leading them to the 2003 National Championship and two SEC Championships. Running backs coach Burton Burns grew up in New Orleans and had assistant coaching stints at Tulane, Southern and St. Augustine High School. Defensive line coach Karl Dunbar is an LSU graduate and coached the Tigers' defensive line in 2005. Dunbar also served as a strength coach at LSU in 2000-01 and began his college coaching career as the defensive line coach at Nicholls State in Thibodaux, La in 1998-98. The Tide's Director of Strength and Conditioning Scott Cochran is an LSU graduate and an assistant strength coach in 2003-04. Special Assistant to the Head Coach Bobby Williams coached the wide receivers at LSU in 2004. UA equipment manager Jeff Springer is also an LSU graduate and was an assistant equipment manager for the Tigers from 2003-05. The eight players from Louisiana include: DB Shyheim Carter (Kentwood), WR Raheem Falkins (New Orleans), DB Hootie Jones (Monroe), OL Cam Robinson (Monroe), WR Cam Sims (Monroe), TE Irv Smith, Jr. (New Orleans), DL O.J. Smith (Bossier City) and LB Tim Williams (Baton Rouge).

GENERAL NOTES

SABAN'S ROAD RECORD: Head coach Nick Saban owns a 63-29-1 (.683) mark in road games across his four career stops, including a 35-6 (.854) mark while at Alabama. Saban has notched five perfect road seasons (2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015) and has lost more than one game on the road in only two seasons (2007, 2010). Alabama has won 22 of its last 24 road games dating back to the start of the 2011 season and is riding a nine-game road winning streak.

SABAN IN SEC ROAD GAMES: Head coach Nick Saban owns a 45-14 (.763) mark in SEC road games across his time at LSU and Alabama, including a 33-6 (.846) mark with the Crismon Tide. Saban has notched six perfect SEC road seasons (2003, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015).

SABAN VS. SEC OPPONENTS: Crimson Tide head coach Nick Saban owns a 100-26 (.794) career record in 126 games against SEC opponents. While at Alabama, he has compiled a 70-13 (.844) record versus conference foes, and is outscoring opponents by a staggering 3,309-1,297, or 39.9-15.6 points per game. Of his 13 losses against SEC opponents while at Alabama, all but two (Florida, 2008 and South Carolina, 2010) have been by seven points or less. Saban's first matchup with an SEC team came in the 1995 Independence Bowl against LSU, where his Michigan State Spartans fell, 45-26, to the Tigers. He would later go on to coach LSU to 30-12 overall record against conference opponents.

SABAN VS. AP TOP 25: Alabama's 33-14 win over No. 6 Texas A&M on Oct. 22 gives head coach Nick Saban 68 career wins vs. Associated Press Top 25 teams, good for third all-time. Former Penn State head coach Joe Paterno leads the list with 86, four victories ahead of Florida State's Bobby Bowden (82). Paul "Bear" Bryant is fourth at 66. Recently retired Duke, Florida and South Carolina coach Steve Spurrier is fifth at 64. Saban's winning percentage against AP ranked teams (68-37, .648) tops Bryant (.592), Bowden (.557), Spurrier (.529) and Paterno (.512).

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is quickly moving up the charts for victories in SEC regular season games against conference opponents with 99 following the win over Arkansas on Oct. 15. His 99 wins moves him into sole possession of fifth place, one ahead of Auburn's Shug Jordan and Tennessee's Phil Fulmer on the league's list of conference wins. Thee of the four coaches ahead of Saban on the list, except for recently retired South Carolina and Florida head coach Steve Spurrier, is in the College Football Hall of Fame. Paul "Bear" Bryant tops the list with 159 conference wins at Kentucky (1946-53) and Alabama (1958-82). Spurrier is second with 131 league wins followed by Johnny Vaught (Ole Miss, 106), and Vince Dooley (Georgia, 105). Saban ranks first in league history in SEC regular season winning percentage at .792 (99-26). He is second in league history in winning percentage in all games at .821 (156-34). Saban is eighth on the SEC career wins list at 156. Tennessee's Robert Neyland is seventh at 173.

101-6 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide is 101-6 (.943) when leading at the half. Alabama led Texas A&M, 13-7, at the half on Oct. 22, and has held the lead in 18 of its last 23 games dating back to the start of the 2015 season, including seven of eight games this season. Alabama had converted 36 straight halftime leads into wins before falling at Auburn on Nov. 30, 2013. The Crimson Tide converted 28 consecutive halftime leads into victories before seeing that streak snapped in 2010 against LSU. In 2007, Alabama held a 20-17 halftime lead before losing to LSU, 41-34, in 2007 at Bryant-Denny Stadium. In 2010, the Tide led 10-3 at the half before the Tigers rallied for a 24-20 win in Death Valley. Alabama lost 28-27 to Auburn to close out the 2010 season, after leading 24-7 at the half. The Crimson Tide is 5-8 under Saban when trailing at halftime after coming away with a victory against Ole Miss on Sept. 17 after entering the locker room down 24-17 at the break. The five wins in the Saban era when trailing at the half: 34-24 over No. 7 Virginia Tech in 2009 (in Atlanta); a 24-15 over No. 9 LSU in 2009; 24-20 at Arkansas in 2010; 27-14 vs. Arkansas in 2015 and 48-43 at Ole Miss on Sept. 17. His Tide teams are 4-3 when tied at halftime, and Alabama's four wins under Saban when tied at halftime: at LSU in 2008, (27-21), at Auburn in 2009 (26-21), against Tennessee in 2011 (37-6) and against Tennessee in 2015 (19-14).

200 WINS: Alabama head coach Nick Saban recorded his 200th on-the-field collegiate victory against his alma mater Kent State on Sept. 24. It was his 109th on-the-field win during his 10 seasons in Tuscaloosa. He recorded his first nine collegiate wins at Toledo in 1990, then won 34 games in five seasons at Michigan State and 48 contests in five years at LSU. With the win over Texas A&M on Oct. 22, his 113 wins at Alabama are just two shy of Frank Thomas for the second most in school history. Saban boasts a 113-18 (.863) record at Alabama and a 204-60-1 (.772) record as a collegiate football coach (199-60-1 with vacated victories). Saban's first five victories at Alabama were vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

SABAN AMONG 20-YEAR LEADERS: Alabama's 45-40 win over Clemson in the 2016 College Football Playoff Championship Game was head coach Nick Saban's 191st victory in his first 20 years as a college head coach. That total is the second-most in FBS history for a coach in the first 20 seasons of his career. Former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne won 195 games in the opening two decades of his tenure in Lincoln. Long-time Penn State head coach Joe Paterno ranks third with 187. Saban's five national championships in his first 20 seasons tops both Osborne (none) and Paterno (1).

AGAINST NO. 1: Alabama's eight wins over the nation's No. 1 team is the most of any program in college football history. The Crimson Tide has squared off against the top-ranked team in the AP poll 12 times in its history, going 8-4. And once again, the record gets even better under the direction of head coach Nick Saban, under whom the Tide is 5-1 against the No. 1. This includes national championship game victories over LSU, Notre Dame and Clemson, an SEC Championship Game victory against Florida and a regular-season win over Mississippi State in 2014. UA's lone loss was a 9-6 overtime defeat to LSU in the 2011 regular season, a loss avenged later that season in the BCS Championship Game, 21-0

LARGEST DEFICIT OVERCOME: Alabama erased a 21-point second-quarter deficit at Ole Miss on Sept. 17, tying the largest deficit overcome in the program's history (not just in a victory, but in any game). Trailing, 24-3, with less than three minutes remaining in the second quarter, the Tide launched a comeback that equaled a 21-point comeback against a previous Rebels squad in a memorable 62-27 Alabama win in 1989. The Tide used a punt return touchdown by Eddie Jackson, and fumble return touchdowns by Da'Ron Payne and Jonathan Allen to punctuate the victory.

ALABAMA OPENS SEASON WITH A BANG: Alabama's 46-point margin of victory over No. 20 USC was its largest against a top 20 team since it beat No. 14 Syracuse by 55 points (61-6) in the 1953 Orange Bowl. It is also the third largest margin of victory against any ranked team in program history with the largest coming in the 59-0 win over No. 21 Texas A&M in 2014.

RETURNING SUCCESS: The Crimson Tide returned 14 starters and 46 letterwinners from its 2015 squad that finished 14-1 as the SEC and national champions. The 2016 team returned five starters on a veteran defense including seniors Jonathan Allen, Eddie Jackson and Reuben Foster. The offense welcomed back key pass catchers in tight end O.J. Howard and receivers Calvin Ridley and ArDarius Stewart.

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama has compiled a 247-131-4 (.652) all-time record in 382 televised games (not including payper-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts). The Crimson Tide was 14-1 in televised games in 2015.

101 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 118 GAMES: With the Tide's 49-10 win over Tennessee on Oct. 15, Alabama has played in 101 nationally televised games since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of the 2014 season. The Crimson Tide was featured on CBS seven times in 2015, including at Georgia, Texas A&M, Mississippi State and Auburn; home against Tennessee and LSU and against Florida in the SEC Championship Game. The ABC family of networks hosted the other eight contests during the 2015 season, including the season opener against Wisconsin and Clemson (ABC), against Middle Tennessee, Louisiana-Monroe and Charleston Southern (SEC Network) and on ESPN for the Ole Miss, Arkansas and Michigan State games. In 2014, Alabama was televised in eight games on the ABC family of networks including contests with West Virginia (ABC), FAU (SEC Network), Southern Miss (ESPN2), at Arkansas (ESPN), at Tennessee (ESPN2), Western Carolina (SEC Network), the most-viewed college football game ever on ESPN, the Iron Bowl against Auburn and the Sugar Bowl against Ohio State (ESPN). The Tide also played in six contests that were televised on CBS, including versus Florida, at Ole Miss, against Texas A&M, in the Bayou against LSU, versus top-ranked Mississippi State, and finally in the SEC Championship against the Missouri Tigers. Eleven of the Crimson Tide's 13 games in 2013 were televised nationally with the Virginia Tech, Arkansas, Mississippi State and Oklahoma games on ESPN, the Texas A&M, Tennessee, LSU and Auburn games on CBS, the Colorado State and Kentucky games on ESPN2. Alabama played 12 nationally televised games in 2012, with one game on ABC, six on CBS and five on ESPN. In 2011, Alabama played on CBS four times, while having one on ABC, two on ESPN and ESPN2, and one game on ESPNU. In 2010, Alabama had five games on CBS, three on ESPN, two on ESPN2, one on ABC and one on ESPNU. In 2009, the Tide played two games on ABC (including the BCS title game), and six on CBS, while ESPN televised two more Crimson Tide games. In 2008, Alabama had 10 of its 14 games televised nationally, including five on CBS, three on ESPN, one on ABC and one on FOX.

10-WIN SEASONS: With last season's 56-6 victory over Charleston Southern, Alabama reached the 10-win milestone for the eighth consecutive season. The eight straight years with 10 wins extends the school record. The previous total for most consecutive 10-win seasons was five, set by coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's teams from 1971-75. In 120 seasons, the Tide has won 10 or more games 35 times, one behind Oklahoma (36) for the most 10-win seasons in college football history. Alabama has produced ten 10-win seasons since 2002 (2002, 2005, 2008-2015). Bryant had a school-record 13 10-win seasons at Alabama, while Saban is second with eight.

ALABAMA-USC DRAWS HUGE RATINGS: The season opening matchup on ABC's Saturday Night Football between the Alabama Crimson Tide and USC Trojans was college football's highest-rated game of the day, achieving a 4.9 overnight rating nationally, which was up 14 percent from the same window last season when Alabama's season opener with Wisconsin averaged a 4.3 overnight rating and was also the highest-rated game of the day.

NEW HIRES: Nick Saban made three new additions to his 2016 staff during the offseason, hiring Derrick Ansley to coach the secondary, Karl Dunbar to lead the defensive line and bringing in Brent Key to coach the offensive guards and centers. Ansley rejoins the Crimson Tide staff after four seasons at Tennessee (2012) and Kentucky (2013-15). He previously served as a graduate assistant under Saban in 2010 and 2011. Dunbar is returning to college football after a decade in the National Football League with the Bills, Jets and Vikings from 2006-2015. Dunbar also worked as a defensive line coach with the Bears in 2004. He previously coached at the college level with LSU, Oklahoma and Nicholls (La.) State. Key joined the Alabama staff after 11 seasons at UCF, most recently serving as the Knights' offensive coordinator and running backs coach.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban ranks third all-time among college coaches who have tutored first round draft picks. Saban has coached a total of 23 players who were chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 18 from Alabama.

CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS: The Alabama football program is well-represented in the NFL heading into the 2016-17 season with numerous former players dotting league rosters. The Tide has 43 former players (active or injured reserve) working on an active NFL roster this season, the second-most nationally behind only LSU (45). In the last eight NFL Drafts, Alabama has had 55 players selected, including 18 players in first round, 17 in the second and third rounds, five in the fourth, seven in the fifth, one in the sixth and seven in the seventh round.

ALABAMA IN THE NFL (WEEK 8): Below is a look at some of the highlights from last week by former Crimson Tide players currently in the NFL.

Amari Cooper set a new career mark in both catches and receiving yards, hauling in 12 passes for 173 yards and a touchdown in the Oakland Raiders' 30-24 overtime win against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. At the midway point of the season, Cooper has 52 catches for 787 yards and two touchdowns. He currently ranks second among wideouts in yards after the catch (295) and is third in both receiving yards (787) and receptions (52).

Derrick Henry enjoyed the best game of his young career, setting a career-high in both carries (16) and rushing yards (60) as the Tennessee Titans defeated the Jacksonville Jaguars, 36-22. The Heisman Trophy winner also recorded his first NFL touchdown on a six-yard run early in the second quarter.

A'Shawn Robinson set a new personal mark with four tackles, including his second career sack, in the Detroit Lions' 20-13 loss to the Houston Texans.

A pair of former Crimson Tide teammates met in Buffalo, as *Marcell Dareus* welcomed the New England Patriots and *Don't'a Hightower* to town. Hightower once again led the Patriots' defense in tackles, notching six total stops in a 41-25 victory over the Bills. Making his 2016 season debut, Marcell Dareus showed why he is regarded as one of the top defensive linemen in the league, finishing with four tackles, including a sack and another tackle for loss.

Julio Jones made an impact away from the ball for the Atlanta Falcons, catching three passes for 29 yards while demanding double-coverage throughout the team's 33-32 victory over the Green Bay Packers. Widely considered the top pass-catcher in the league, Jones has grabbed 43 passes for 859 yards and four touchdowns. The All-Pro receiver currently ranks second among wideouts in receiving yards (859) and third in yards after the catch (291).

- Saban has a 199-60-1 (.767) record as a college head coach to date (204-60-1, .772 on-field record). He has five national championships four at Alabama seven conference championships and 17 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in 2015.
- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships and the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships. He has won five titles in his last 13 years coaching college football after capturing CFP National Championship following the 2015 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the second coach in he poll era to win five national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant).
- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He then took down Clemson 45-40 to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game.
- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.
- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).
- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.
- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.
- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.
- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and a daughter-in-law, Kelsé.
- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Saban's have helped raise approximately \$5.5 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 16 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Project Team Up and Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that stuck Tuscaloosa.
- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

ARLINGTON, Texas — True freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts accounted for four touchdowns (two passing, two rushing) while receiver ArDarius Stewart and running back Damien Harris had career-best performances, supplementing a suffocating performance by the Crimson Tide defense to lead the No. 1 ranked University of Alabama football team to a 52-6 victory over the 20th-ranked University of Southern California Trojans before a crowd of 81,359 at AT&T Stadium.

The 46-point margin of victory was the largest Alabama winning margin over a top-20 ranked opponent since a 35-0 win at sixth-ranked Florida in 1991, and was the second-largest victory margin over a top 20 team in Crimson Tide history following only a 55-point win (61-6) over Syracuse in the 1953 Orange Bowl (1952 season). The largest Alabama victory margin ever against a ranked team was a 59-0 win over No. 21 Texas A&M in 2014.

Defensively, Alabama was stifling after allowing a scoring drive to open the game. The Tide was dominant at the line of scrimmage, holding the Trojans to 64 yards rushing on 30 attempts, an average of 2.1 yards per rush. Redshirt freshman cornerback Anthony Averett recorded a team-best eight total tackles, including seven solos. Additionally, cornerback Minkah Fitzpatrick had six tackles and broke up two passes, defensive end Jonathan Allen had two quarterback sacks and the team broke up seven passes, had nine tackles for loss and three sacks. Sophomore cornerback Marlon Humphrey returned an interception for a touchdown in the first half.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts set a school record for passing yards by a quarterback in a career starting debut, throwing for 287 yards and two touchdowns to lead the top-ranked Crimson Tide football team to a 38-10 victory over the Western Kentucky Hilltoppers before a crowd of 101,821 at Bryant-Denny Stadium on The University of Alabama campus.

In addition to breaking the previous record for passing yards in a starting debut of 285 yards set by Brodie Croyle versus Arkansas on September 28, 2002. Hurts' performance also surpassed the previous Crimson Tide freshman passing yards mark of 167 yards set by Vince Sutton against Tennessee on October 20, 1984.

Tide wide receiver Calvin Ridley's 129 yards and a touchdown on nine catches led all receivers, while receiver ArDarius Stewart had five catches for 90 yards and a touchdown, including a 52-yarder. Running back Damien Harris rushed for 45 yards on 11 carries to lead the Tide on the ground.

Defensively, Alabama was as stingy as ever, allowing the only touchdown of the season with just 46 seconds remaining after WKU recovered a Tide fumble at the Alabama 26-yard line. Linebacker Reuben Foster recorded a team-best six total tackles, including five solos, and Eddie Jackson posted an interception return for a touchdown.

Punter JK Scott averaged 46.4 yards on five punts, placing three inside the Tide 20 and two traveling more than 50 yards with a long of 58.

OXFORD, Miss. — Alabama's top-ranked football team erased a 21-point second-quarter deficit, tying the largest deficit overcome in the program's history by scoring three non-offensive touchdowns, to defeat the 19th-ranked Ole Miss Rebels, 48-43. The win came before a stadium-record crowd of 66,176 (capacity: 64,038) at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

The largest crowd ever to attend a college football game in the state of Mississippi witnessed a wild one as the Crimson Tide snapped a two-game losing streak to the Rebels, outscoring Ole Miss by a 45-13 margin after trailing, 24-3, with less than three minutes remaining in the second period. That comeback tied the Alabama football record for the largest deficit overcome in a game. The Tide used a punt return touchdown by Eddie Jackson, a fumble return touchdown by Da'Ron Payne and an interception return by Jonathan Allen to punctuate the victory.

Alabama freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts became the first Tide signal caller to rush for more than 100 yards since Tyler Watts in 2001 (110 vs. Ole Miss on October 13, 2001). Hurts accounted for 146 yards on the ground and threw for 158 more to accumulate 304 yards of total offense on the day. Tide wide receiver Calvin Ridley's 81 yards on eight catches led Tide receivers, while receiver Gehrig Dieter had two catches for 47 yards. Running back Damien Harris rushed for a career-best 144 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries to lead the Tide running backs on the ground.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Sophomore wide receiver Calvin Ridley had a career-best performance with 11 catches for 174 yards and two scores, and the Crimson Tide defense produced another dominant performance to lead top-ranked Alabama to a 34-6 Homecoming victory over the Kentucky Wildcats in front of a capacity crowd of 101,821 at Bryant-Denny Stadium on the Alabama campus.

Ridley caught scoring passes of 10 and 19 yards from Tide quarterback Jalen Hurts and also had a 46-yard catch to highlight a solid performance by the Alabama offense. Hurts threw for 262 yards and two scores on the night, completing 20 of 33 attempts, while freshman running back Joshua Jacobs rushed for 100 yards on 16 carries and caught three passes for 54 yards on the night. Jacobs' rushing outing marked his first 100-yard rushing performance for the Tide.

Alabama was methodical after falling behind 3-0 early, building a 17-3 halftime lead on Jacobs' one-yard touchdown run and a 55-yard fumble return for a score by Tide linebacker Ronnie Harrison in the second quarter. Ridley's two touchdown catches came in the third quarter, putting the game away at 31-3 entering the final period.

Overall, the Tide gained 488 yards (315 passing and 173 rushing), picked up 25 first downs, and averaged 6.5 yards per play. Kentucky gained 161 yards (89 passing and 72 rushing), along with converting 12 first downs and averaging 2.8 yards per play. Tide linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton recorded a team-best eight total tackles, including four solos. As a unit, the Tide defense had four quarterback sacks, nine tackles for loss, forced three fumbles and was credited with six quarterback hurries. Tide punter JK Scott punted only once, a boot that traveled 58 yards. Placekicker Adam Griffith connected on two of three field goal attempts, hitting from 44 and 24 yards, missing from 35.

 $\textbf{FAYETTEVILLE, Ark.} \\ - \text{Two touch downs by the defense and an explosive performance} \\$ by the offense highlighted a big road victory as the No. 1-ranked Alabama Crimson Tide beat the 16th-ranked Arkansas Razorbacks, 49-30, before an overflow crowd of 75,459 on Frank Broyles Field at Donald W. Reynolds Razorback Stadium (capacity: 72,000).

Alabama's freshman quarterback, Jalen Hurts, accounted for four touchdowns (two rushing and two passing) while the Tide's defense punctuated an inconsistent performance with back-breaking scores on a pair of interception returns for touch downs.

Hurts passed for 253 yards and two touchdowns with one interception while completing 13-of-17 attempts. The interception snapped a string of 139 clean attempts by Hurts, the second-longest in Crimson Tide history. Running back Damien Harris rushed for 122 yards on 13 carries, including a 57-yarder while averaging 9.4 yards per attempt, along with 60 yards and a touchdown on three catches. Wide receiver ArDarius Stewart returned to action after missing time with an injury to catch five passes for 120 yards, including a 67-yard reception. Freshman running back Josh Jacobs had a 56-yard run and gained 57 yards on three attempts early in the game before leaving with an injury.

Linebackers Shaun Dion Hamilton and Ryan Anderson led the Tide with a game-high nine tackles. Hamilton had four solos, including one quarterback sack and 1.5 tackles for loss along with a forced fumble while Anderson had one sack and two tackles for loss. The Tide defense produced three interceptions, forced three fumbles, had six quarterback sacks, nine tackles for loss, broke up five passes and was credited with 12 quarterback hurries on the night.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts rushed for 132 yards and three touchdowns to key a dominant running attack while the Crimson Tide defense and special teams contributed touchdowns of their own as the top-ranked University of Alabama football team decisively defeated the ninth-ranked Volunteers of the University of Tennessee, 49-10, before a capacity crowd of 102,455 at Neyland Stadium on the UT campus.

Hurts directed the Tide offense to five touchdowns. Eddie Jackson returned a punt 79 yards for a score, and free safety Ronnie Harrison returned an interception 58 yards for a touchdown as Alabama moved ahead early and remained in command all afternoon. The Alabama defense limited the explosive Tennessee offense to a season-low 163 yards, including season lows in rushing (32 yards) and passing (131). Meanwhile, the Tide offense grinded out 594 yards of total offense, the most in a game since 2010 (591 vs. San Jose State) and the 16th-most yards gained in a single game in Alabama history (the most ever by an Alabama team against Tennessee).

The Tide rushed for 438 yards against the Vols, the most by an Alabama team since the Tide rushed for 457 yards against Tennessee in a 56-28 win in 1986 in Knoxville. Two Alabama players rushed for more than 100 yards in the game as Hurts had 132 and three touchdowns while Scarbrough finished with 109 and a touchdown on five carries. Hurts completed 16 of 26 pass attempts for 143 yards, throwing one interception. Wide receiver ArDarius Stewart had eight catches for 54 yards and wide receiver Calvin Ridley had five catches for 65 yards to lead the Tide

Alabama's defense produced 10 tackles for loss, three quarterback sacks, broke up six passes, intercepted a pass and had numerous quarterback hurries in the game. Free safety Ronnie Harrison led the impressive effort with seven total tackles (six solos), intercepted a pass that he returned 52 yards for a touchdown and broke up two passes on the day. Linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton had six tackles (five solos), including two for losses. Cornerback Minkah Fitzpatrick also had six tackles (four solos).

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — In a game that stayed tight into the third quarter, the No. 1-ranked University of Alabama Crimson Tide football team used yet another defensive touchdown to break things open against No. 6 Texas A&M, winning the game 33-14 on a picture-perfect afternoon in Bryant-Denny Stadium in front of a capacity crowd of 101,821 fans.

Tide freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts threw for 164 yards while completing 15 of 25 attempts for two touchdowns with two interceptions. Sophomore running back Damien Harris led all rushers with 125 yards on 18 attempts while Hurts gained 93 yards and a touchdown on 21 rushes. Senior tight end O.J. Howard led all receivers with eight catches for 69 yards and a touchdown while wide receiver ArDarius Stewart had 57 receiving yards and receiver Calvin Ridley had 27 yards and a touchdown.

A&M quarterback Trevor Knight completed 14 passes on 31 attempts for 164 yards and two touchdowns with one interception. Junior running back Keith Ford led A&M with 62 yards. Wide receivers Christian Kirk and Josh Reynolds both hauled in touchdowns for the Aggies, with Kirk gaining 58 yards through the air on nine catches while Reynolds pulled in 27 yards on two receptions.

Alabama linebacker Reuben Foster led the Tide defense with 12 tackles, including eight solo stops. Alabama had five sacks for 50 yards on the day, with 11 tackles for loss for minus-74 yards. Linebacker Tim Williams had two sacks for 27 yards and linebacker Ryan Anderson had three tackles for loss for 12 yards.
