- Davis led the Vols with 78 yards rushing on 20 carries and two TDs in Tennessee's 24-10 win over Florida.
- Davis gained 74 of his 78 yards on 17 carries in the second half, replacing the injured Cedric Houston.
- Davis' first TD, a one-yard run, gave the Vols a 17-3 lead in the third quarter. His second TD, a nine-yard run in the fourth quarter, put the final margin at 24-10.
- He carried for five first downs in the second half and helped the Vols maintain a 20:06 to 9:54 edge in time of possession in the final half.

## 2003 SEC BOWL TIE-INS

**SEC CHAMPION - Bowl Championship Series**

The BCS consists of the Rose Bowl, Nokia Sugar Bowl, FedEx Orange Bowl and the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

ABC-TV will televise the four Bowl Championship Series games.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

Any Division I-A independent team or champion of Conference USA or any other Division I-A conference which is ranked sixth or higher in the BCS standings, will also be eligible for the Bowl Championship Series.

The BCS also guarantees automatic selection to the highest-ranked at-large team should that team be ranked either third or fourth in the final BCS standings of the regular season.

Otherwise, any Division I-A team can qualify for selection in the BCS if they have won at least 9 college football games during the most recently completed regular season (not to include wins in exempted games) and are ranked in the top 12 of the final BCS standings.

At the conclusion of the 2003 regular season, the Nokia Sugar Bowl will host the National Championship contest. The game will be played on Jan. 4 at 8 p.m. ET in New Orleans. The Nokia Sugar Bowl shall select the top two teams ranked in the BCS final regular season standings. Other BCS games following the 2003 regular season include the FedEx Orange Bowl on Jan. 1 at 8:30 p.m. ET, the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 2 at 8 p.m. ET and the Rose Bowl on Jan. 1 at 5 p.m. ET.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other "regional consideration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC or Big East champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 champion in the Fiesta Bowl.

Since the Sugar Bowl is hosting the national championship and if the SEC representative is not ranked first or second, that team would be available to play in any other BCS bowl.

**CBS SPORTS** - The 2002 season marks the seventh year for CBS as the league's national network television partner. CBS will televise up to 15 games per year throughout the season. CBS will normally broadcast its SEC games in the late afternoon window beginning at 3:30 p.m. ET. CBS provides exclusive national network broadcasts of conference home games during the season. CBS will televise the SEC Football Championship Game, which will be on Dec. 7 at 6 p.m. ET.

**ESPN/ESPN2**, the SEC's national cable provider, may televise up to 18 regular season games each year, with a minimum of nine on ESPN through the season.

**JEFFERSON-PILOT SPORTS (JP)** will continue its highly successful SEC Football Game of the Week this season. The Charlotte, N.C. company, holds the rights to televise 13 games annually throughout the nine-state SEC region on a syndicated basis. The games will be broadcast in the early afternoon at 12:30 p.m. ET.

**FOX Sports Net South (FSNS), FOX Sports Net Southwest (FSNSW) and Sunshine Network (SUN)** together form **SEC-TV**, the league's regional cable package. SEC-TV Weekly airs Thursday nights and Saturday mornings during the season, highlighting all of the SEC's athletic teams and events.

**SEC ENACTS SPORTSMANSHIP PROPOSALS**

The institutions of the Southeastern Conference have enacted proposals this season that will promote and demonstrate the positive aspects of sportsmanship at future SEC sporting events.

The SEC adopted a general sportsmanship statement that will serve as the principle for its institutions to follow. It states, "Coaches and student-athletes of a member institution, as well as individuals employed by or associated with that institution, including alumni, fans, patrons and boosters, shall conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their behavior shall at all times reflect the high standards of honor and dignity that characterize participation in the collegiate setting. For intercollegiate athletics to promote the character development of participants, to enhance the integrity of higher education and to promote civility in society, coaches, student-athletes and all others associated with these athletics programs and events should adhere to such fundamental values as respect, fairness, civility, honesty and responsibility. These values should be manifest not only in athletics participation but also in the broad spectrum of activities affecting the athletics program.

"It is the responsibility of each member institution to establish policies for sportsmanship and ethical conduct in intercollegiate athletics consistent with the educational mission and goals of the institution. Furthermore, member institutions are responsible for educating on a continuing basis all constituencies about these policies."

Each institution will participate in the promotion of proper sportsmanship at its home games, by featuring public address announcements, video spots and game program advertisements. The SEC and its institutions also will place radio, television and print advertisements in its media inventories.

Also, the league has developed a formal policy on items being thrown onto the playing field/court. Each school in the SEC has adopted the "zero-tolerance" policy for such behavior, which will result in the violators being ejected from the stadium.

In the sport of football, visiting teams will not be allowed to come back out onto the stadium turf to celebrate a victory, and the visiting team's band will be allowed to play no more than two songs following the conclusion of the game.

Also, in football, cheerleaders and mascots will be restricted to designated sideline areas between the bench boundary and the end line, as well as behind the respective end zone to the goal post, and behind the photographer zone. At no time, may cheerleaders or mascots enter the playing field (defined as any area beyond the 6-foot limit lines surrounded the playing field) while the game is in progress. Home team cheerleaders and mascots shall not enter any visiting team area. Any type of physical contact between team mascots and cheerleaders is strictly prohibited.

The SEC has had a history of addressing the issues of sportsmanship and fan behavior in recent years. Prior to these proposals being passed, the league has adopted policies pertaining to the placement of student sections and bands as related to visiting bench areas, prohibition of artificial noisemakers, elimination of "pass outs" during games, restrictions on "huddles" or "dances" on the field or court, pregame warmup "buffer zone" in football and pregame sportsmanship announcements on video boards and public address systems.

## 2003 SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE TEAM-BY-TEAM NOTES

**ALABAMA CRIMSON TIDE** (2-2, 1-0 SEC)

TB Shaud Williams leads the SEC with seven TDs this season ... He is also third in the SEC in rushing average (114.75 yards per game) and third in all-purpose rushing average (153.25) ... The Tide have lost just one fumble this season ...

Redshirt freshman DT Kyle Tatum made his Crimson Tide debut against Northern Illinois ... Soph. Clint Johnston made his first start of the 2003 season at the F-Back position ... He is the third player to start at that position this season (Tim Castille/Le'Ron McClain) ... Senior SE Zach Fletcher had his first TD reception of the season ... The Tide's average starting field position vs. NIU was its' 19-yardline.

**ARKANSAS RAZORBACKS** (3-0, 0-0 SEC)

Senior RB Cedric Cobbs leads the SEC in rushing, averaging 121.3 yards per game ... Cobbs has hit the 100-yard mark in the first three games of the season, marking the first time since 1975 that a Razorback has eclipsed the century mark in the initial three games of a season ... In 1975, Jerry Eckwood rushed for 100-plus yards in the first five games of the season ... The Razorbacks have lost just one turnover this season while gaining seven ... Arkansas scored 3 TDs against North Texas in a span of 2:32 in the second quarter ... Arkansas scored all of its points (31) in the first half.

**AUBURN TIGERS** (1-2, 1-0 SEC)

The Tigers won their 11th straight SEC opener ... 38 points was the largest margin of victory for the Tigers in an SEC game since defeating Vanderbilt, 56-6, in 1990 ... WR Jeris McIntyre set career highs with 117 receiving yards and 2 TDs and tied a career-high with four receptions ... The Tigers had three RBs each rush for more than 50 yards for the first time since 1996 (vs. Georgia) ... Carnell Williams had 69 yards and a TD, Brandon Jacobs rushed for 68 yards and Ronnie Brown had 50 yards and a TD ... DE Reggie Torbor forced two fumbles and recovered one.

**FLORIDA GATORS** (2-2, 0-1 SEC)

13 true freshmen have played for Florida this season. This is the third highest amount of true freshmen to ever play for Florida in a single season. The true freshmen that have played for the Gators this season are Andre Caldwell, Joe Cohen, Channing Crowder, Earl Everett, Chad Jackson, Chris Leak, Howard Lingard, Jarvis Moss, Marcus Thomas, Steve Rissler, Skyler Thornton, Dee Webb and Eric Wilbur ... Of the 52 freshmen on Florida's roster this year, 31 have seen action ... Freshmen have accounted for nine of UF's 22 TDs this season (40 percent). Two true freshmen have scored TDs (Chad Jackson and Skyler Thornton)

**GEORGIA BULLDOGS** (3-1, 1-1 SEC)

Junior DB Sean Jones has three interceptions in the first four games of the season, which is tied for first in the SEC and sixth in the nation ... The Bulldogs lead the SEC and are fourth in the nation in scoring defense, allowing just 8.5 points per game ... QB David Greene's consecutive attempt without an interception streak ended at 174, the third longest streak in SEC history and second at Georgia (176, Eric Zeier) ... Greene's 93-yard TD pass to Tyson Browning is tied for the longest pass play in Georgia history (Talley/Maxwell vs. Vandy, 1989; Belue/Scott vs. Florida, 1980).

**KENTUCKY WILDCATS** (2-2, 0-1 SEC)

WR/RS Derek Abney is second in the SEC in all-purpose rushing, averaging 158.8 yards per game ... Abney has now become the school's career leader in average yards per all-purpose play with 15.2 (4,670 yards on 307 attempts) ... Soph. DB Muhammad Abdullah has three interceptions in the first four games, tying for the SEC lead ... LB Deion Holts had three QB sacks against Indiana ... DE Vincent Burns had one TFL against Indiana upping his streak of consecutive games with at least one TFL to 10 ... QB Jared Lorenzen is now fifth in the SEC career total offensive yardage record list with 9,090 yards.

**LSU TIGERS** (4-0, 1-0 SEC)

Junior DB Corey Webster has three interceptions in four games and is tied for the SEC lead ... He now has 10 interceptions in his career, which is tied for most among active SEC players ... WR Michael Clayton leads the SEC in receiving yards (446) and total receptions (25) ... Clayton has now caught at least one pass in every game of his career (30 games) ... By holding Georgia without a TD in the first half, LSU has not allowed an opponent to score in the first half during a regular season game since Ole Miss scored a TD on Nov. 23, 2002. The streak extends to 11 straight quarters, including all eight first half quarters this season.

**OLE MISS REBELS** (2-1, 1-0 SEC)

Ole Miss had 612 total offensive yards against ULM, the second highest total in school history (623 vs. Auburn, 1951) ... With the win, Ole Miss becomes the 30th team in Division I-A history to record 575 all-time wins ... The school's all-time record is 575-426-35 (57.1 percent) ... QB Eli Manning threw for 353 yards and 3 TDs vs. ULM ... It is the fourth 350+ passing yardage game of his career, a school record ... WR Chris Collins extended his streak to 25 straight games with at least one catch (9 for 121 yards) ... WR Taye Biddle had a career-high 105 receiving yards ... Ole Miss' first 100+ receiving yards duo since 1995.

**MISSISSIPPI STATE BULLDOGS** (0-3, 0-0 SEC)

So. RB Nick Turner leads the SEC and is fifth in the nation in all-purpose rushing, averaging 183.3 yards per game ... Sr. WR Justin Jenkins leads the SEC in receptions per game (24 in 3 games) and receiving yards per game (132.3) ... With nine receptions for 172 yards and two touchdowns vs. Houston, Jenkins had the best game of his career for the second straight week (9 for 164, 2 TDs vs. Tulane) ... State's 0-3 start marks its first such beginning based upon on-the-field results since 1968 ... MSU's current eight-game losing skid ties for the third-longest streak in school history.

**SOUTH CAROLINA GAMECOCKS** (3-1, 0-1 SEC)

South Carolina leads the SEC in pass defense, allowing 143.0 yards per game ... RB Demetris Summers rushed for 161 yards on 21 carries and 3 TDs against UAB ... He tied the school record for TDs by a freshman and had the third highest rushing yards total by a freshman in school history ... Summers' 54-yard TD run was the longest run from scrimmage since Oct. 6, 2001 (58 yards) ... The last time USC scored 28 points in the first half and 42 points in a game was against Temple last season ... Ten of 14 UAB's offensive drives against South Carolina were four-plays-or-less and nine drives were less than 10 yards.

**TENNESSEE VOLUNTEERS** (3-0, 1-0 SEC)

The Vols lead the SEC and are sixth in the nation in rushing defense, allowing just 53.3 yards per game ... Opponents are averaging just 1.95 yards per rushing attempt against Tennessee ... QB Casey Clausen ranks to No. 2 on Vols' career passing yardage list (7,368 yds), completions (593) and touchdowns (54) ... Clausen is 27-7 as a starting QB and 11-0 in opponents' stadiums ... PK James Wilhoit's 51-yard field goal in the third quarter was a career-long (previous: 42 vs. Marshall) ... His 51-yard FG was the longest for the Vols since Alex Walls hit a 51-yarder vs. LSU in the 2001 SEC Championship.

**VANDERBILT COMMODORES** (1-3, 0-2 SEC)

Freshman Brian Stamper earned his first collegiate start at right offensive tackle, replacing Kenan Arkan, who saw his consecutive start streak end at 14 due to a high-ankle sprain ... QB Jay Cutler passed for a career-high 250 yards against TCU ... The Commodores are -6 in turnover margin in their three losses ... Sr. P Abtin Iranmanesh is fourth in the SEC in punting average (41.4 yards per punt) ... Soph. WR Erik Davis is third among SEC receivers with 10-or-more receptions in yards per catch ... Davis has 12 catches for 254 yards, an average of 21.17 yards per catch.

## THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE

### ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

- More than 1,746 student-athletes were named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2002-03. Each SEC institution had at least 96 student-athletes achieve honor roll. Members of the SEC Academic Honor Roll must have a 3.0 grade point average for either the previous academic year or his/her academic career.
- During the 2002-03 academic year, the Southeastern Conference had 17 student-athletes selected first-team Verizon Academic All-America, the most of any conference in the nation. Not only did the SEC have 17 first-team Academic All-Americans in 2002-03, but also placed 13 on second-teams and five on third-teams, giving the league a total of 35 student-athletes honored.
- During the last seven years, the SEC has had 12 winners of the NCAA Today's Top VIII Award, which is given annually to eight outstanding senior student-athletes. Since 1997, no other conference has had as many student-athletes honored with this prestigious award. In 2003, Alabama gymnast Andree' Pickens was named a recipient of this award.
- The Southeastern Conference had three student-athletes named by the National Football Foundation as National Scholar-Athletes. In 2003, the NFF honored 14 student-athletes from all classifications. In Division I-A, the SEC had three of the six student-athletes honored.

### FOR THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

- The SEC was the first conference in the nation to assemble a Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. Two representatives from each of the SEC member schools are selected to serve on the committee which meets twice a year to discuss issues of concern to the student-athlete.
- The SEC, in conjunction with the ALLTEL Corporation, annually awards post-graduate scholarships totaling \$130,000 to 24 student-athletes each year. The top male and female nominee each receive the H. Boyd McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award, named for the league's fourth commissioner, and a \$10,000 scholarship. Last year, 22 additional student-athletes (11 female and 11 male) received \$5,000 to continue their education. Alabama gymnast Kristin Sterner and Florida men's basketball player Matt Bonner were named McWhorter Scholar-Athlete Award winners.
- The SEC has established a Community Service Award to honor a male and female student-athlete with a \$5,000 scholarship for outstanding service in the community. Georgia football player Brett Kirouac and Tennessee women's basketball player Kara Lawson were named recipients of this award in 2003.
- The SEC was the first conference to develop a "Principles for Gender Equity," which, among other things, calls for each league school to provide equitable funding for women's sports, promotions and marketing and other support services. The SEC currently conducts championships in 11 women's sports and nine men's sports.
- The conference office supplies each SEC institution with a \$2000 grant each year to assist with stipends for minority and female student internship opportunities. This season, the conference office reinstated a minority internship program that will offer opportunities for growth in the athletic industry.

### IN THE COMMUNITY

- Nearly 13,000 elementary schools and public libraries across the nine-state SEC region were sent a free copy of the SEC Kid's College Educational CD-Rom. This unique software is the cornerstone of the league's Education Initiative. Targeted to elementary students in grades K-3, the software captivates children by using their favorite sports with SEC teams and famous mascots to reinforce skills taught in the classroom. Each CD-ROM has a school-wide license, which allows the software to be loaded on every computer in the school or library.

- Building on the overwhelming success of last year's Education Initiative that impacted over one million students, the Southeastern Conference announced the release of a new web-based version of the Kid's College™ program. The 2003-04 Initiative launched this month and continues the SEC's comprehensive campaign to assist teachers in providing a solid educational foundation for young students. The new release of Kid's College™ will be available online to every public and private K-8 school classroom in the nine-state SEC region.

- SECKids.com is an all new website uniquely designed for school age students. Now fan's of all ages can access exciting, interactive and educational information on the SEC and its universities. SECKids.com features exclusive behind-the-scenes access at championship events, profiles of student-athletes and coaches, along with games and video highlights. Teachers can also register online to utilize the SEC Kids's collegiate software in their classroom.

- The SEC and its member institutions have joined in a partnership with the nine Special Olympics state organizations in the SEC region. The partnership is featured on public service announcements aired on SEC telecasts and Special Olympics will also participate in the Dr Pepper SEC FanFare, held in conjunction with the SEC Football and Basketball Championships.

- The SEC and its corporate partners host youth clinics each year in conjunction with several conference events, including the football championship game, the men's and women's basketball tournaments, the baseball tournament and the volleyball tournament. These clinics provide children from host cities the opportunity to receive instruction from SEC and other area coaches.

- The SEC selects a Good Works Team in all of its sports. The Good Works Team features a representative from each institution who has shown a commitment to community service.

### OVERALL ATHLETICS SUCCESS

- Since 1990, the SEC has won 91 team and 529 individual national championships. Since that time, the SEC has had at least one team ranked in the top five nationally 76.6 percent of the total sports competed in (206 of 269). Nine of the SEC's 12 schools have won at least one national championship since 1990.
- In the 20 sponsored sports of the Southeastern Conference, the SEC had a higher national finish than any other conference in the nation in 2002-03. In a ranking system, using national polls and NCAA Championships finishes, the SEC had 1423.5 points, edging second-place Pac-10 with 1339 points. The Big 12 was third with 916.5 points followed by the Big Ten with 782.5 and the Atlantic Coast with 572.5 points. The SEC placed first in eight sports, including men's outdoor track, men's indoor track, women's indoor track, women's outdoor track, men's swimming & diving, men's tennis, gymnastics, and women's basketball. In 10 of its 20 sponsored sports, the SEC had teams finish in the top two in the nation and had at least one team ranked or finish in the top 10 of every sport that the league sponsors.

### FOR THE FANS AND ALUMNI

- For the 22nd straight season, the SEC recorded the largest total and average football attendance of any conference in the country. More than six million fans attended SEC football games in 2002 while stadiums were filled to almost 968 percent of capacity.

- The SEC is the only conference that is guaranteed a national network appearance in football each week through its contract with CBS Sports. The network also televises SEC men's and women's basketball games.

- The SEC also has an extensive agreement with FOX Sports Net South to televise original programming featuring conference sports, including live Olympic Sports coverage and conference championships. FOX Sports Net South, FOX Sports Net Southwest and Sunshine Network combine to form SEC-TV, which blankets the Southern United States.
