THE GAME

Auburn finishes the 2004 regular season schedule with a trip to Tuscaloosa, Ala., to face Alabama in the 69th Iron Bowl.

AUBURN HEADLINES

- ▶ Auburn enters the Alabama game on an 12-game winning streak (dating back to the 2003 season). It's the longest winning streak for the Tigers under Tommy Tuberville and the longest winning streak since reeling off 20 consecutive between 1993-94.
- ▶ The 12-game winning streak is currently the fourth longest among Division I-A teams. Boise State has the nation's longest streak with 20 consecutive wins.
- ▶ The 12-game winning streak is also the fourth longest in school history and the longest in the SEC since Tennessee won 14 straight in 1998-99.
- ▶ The 10-0 start marks just the third time in school history that Auburn has begun a season 10-0, joining the 1993 and 1957 teams.
- ▶ Auburn is a win shy of becoming the sixth SEC team to go 8-0 in league play since the conference began divisional play in 1992. The last was Tennessee in 1998 and Florida in 1996. Both won national titles.
- ▶ Auburn's margin of victory in SEC games is an impressive 20.4 points per game. In all games, the Tigers are third nationally in scoring differential, outscoring their opponents 24.9 ppg. Louisville is first (26.0) followed by Southern California (25.5).
- ▶ Auburn owns a eight-game SEC winning streak, its longest since 1993-94 (14).
- ▶ With 48 wins at Auburn, Tommy Tuberville is tied with Jack Meagher (1934-42) for fourth on the school's all-time coaching victories list.
- ▶ Auburn is first nationally in scoring defense, holding opponents to 9.3 points per game. A total of 67 of the 93 points (72 percent) that the Tigers have allowed have come with Auburn leading by 20 or more points.
- ▶ Senior quarterback Jason Campbell is 28-9 (.757) in 37 career starts at Auburn. Campbell has started 28 consecutive games for Auburn, directing the Tigers to a 22-6 record, including a 8-4 mark against Top 10 teams.
- ▶ Campbell set an AU single-game completion record versus Georgia after completing 18 of 22 passes (81.8 percent).
- ▶ Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 29-0 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. Auburn has won 42 consecutive games when scoring at least 30 points in a game.

SEC WEST CHAMPS

Auburn's 35-14 win over Ole Miss in Oxford clinched the Tigers a berth in the SEC Championship game and the 24-6 win over Georgia locked up the outright Western Division title for Auburn.

The Tigers tied the 1993 Alabama team for the earliest date clinching a berth in the SEC Championship Game. Both squads earned their bids after games of October 30.

It marks the third time in school history that Auburn will travel to the league championship game. The Tigers previously made trips to the SEC title game in 1997 and 2000, falling to Tennessee, 30-29, in 1997 and dropping a 20-6 decision to Florida in 2000.

Auburn has won outright or tied for the SEC West title four times in the last five years under Tommy Tuberville (2000, '01, '02, '04).

AUBURN NO. 3 IN THE BCS

Auburn is ranked third in the latest Bowl Championship Series Standings, released November 8. The Tigers are behind Southern California and Oklahoma.

Other SEC schools in the poll include: Georgia (11), LSU (16), and Tennessee (17).

IN THE POLLS

Auburn is currently tied for second with Oklahoma in the Associated Press poll and third and by ESPN/USA Today. The Tigers are ranked for the ninth consecutive game for the first time since the 1997 season when they were ranked in every contest.

The last time Auburn was ranked as high as second in the AP poll was in 1990.

The Tigers are ranked in the AP Top 10 for the eighth consecutive week for the first time since the 1994 season when they were in the top 10 for eight consecutive games.

12 IN A ROW

The 24-6 victory over Georgia was Auburn's 12th consecutive victory dating back to the final two contests of the 2003 season. It is the program's longest winning streak since it captured 20 straight games from 1993-94.

Auburn's 12-game winning streak is the fourth longest active winning streak in the nation and is the fourth longest winning streak in school history.

TEN AND OH

Auburn's 10-0 start is just the third 10-0 start in school history. Auburn won its first 10 games en route to a 11-0 record in 1993 and the 1957 National Championship team was a perfect 10-0 on the season.

TUBERVILLE TIES MEAGHER

Coach Tommy Tuberville's win against Georgia was his 48th career victory at Auburn, tying him with Jack Meagher (1934-42) for fourth all-time at Auburn with 48 victories.

WIN SHY OF 8-0 IN LEAGUE

Auburn is a SEC win shy of becoming the first SEC team in six years to post a perfect 8-0 record in Southeastern Conference action. The feat was last accomplished by Tennessee in 1998.

Since the SEC began divisional play in 1992, only five teams have gone a perfect 8-0, with three eventually winning a national title.

Tennessee in 1998, Florida in 1996 and Alabama in 1992 all went undefeated in SEC play on their way to winning a national title. Other 8-0 teams since 1992 include Alabama in 1994 and Florida in 1995.

BIG WINS

Auburn has won nine of its 10 games by 18 points or more, including seven wins of 21 points or more. The Tigers have more wins by 18 or more points this season (9) than any other Division I-A program. Next are Utah (7), California (6), USC (6), Virginia (6) and Texas (6).

Auburn's margin of victory in SEC games is an impressive 20.4 points per game. The Tigers are also third nationally in scoring differential, outscoring its opponents 24.9 ppg. Louisville is first (26.0) followed by Southern California (25.5) and Auburn.

LAST 21

Since dropping its first two games of the 2003 season, Auburn is 18-3 and is outscoring its opponents by an average of 32.4-12.7.

TOUGH 29

In Auburn's previous 29 contests, 12 have come against an Associated Press Top 10 team. Auburn is 8-4 in its previous 12 games against top 10 foes.

Since the start of the 2002 season, Auburn (12) has played more games against Top 10 teams than any other 1-A school in the country.

AUBURN-ALABAMA SERIES NOTES

The team leading at halftime has won 73.5 percent of the time (50-of-68) ... There have been 22 shutouts in the rivalry, with the Tigers winning eight ... 13 of the last 16 meetings have been decided by 10 points or less ... The most recent shutout was a 9-0 Auburn victory in 2000 ... The visiting team has won four consecutive games from 1999-2002 after the home team had won the previous ten ... The game has been tied at the half on seven occasions, with Alabama winning six of those ... Since 1993 (last 10 meetings), the team leading at the half has won six times--Alabama in '94 and '01, Auburn in '95, '00, '02 and '03 ... The losing team scored less than 10 points in 2000, '01, and '02 ... Since 1980, with the exception of 1982, 1998, and 2003, at least one of the two teams has been ranked in the AP poll ... The winner of the last five meetings has won outrushed the losing squad.

AU-UA: THE 41-YEAR BREAK

Auburn and Alabama did not play for 41 years, from 1908 through 1947. There are two common misconceptions about the reason for the 41-year lapse. The first is that a fight broke out after a 6-6 tie in 1907 and caused both schools to discontinue the series. The second is that the state legislature got the two schools back together. Neither is true.

Auburn and Alabama quit playing because of money and officiating. Auburn wanted a northern umpire for the 1908 game, Alabama wanted a southern umpire. Auburn wanted to bring 22 players and allow \$3.50 per day for expenses. Alabama wanted to bring 20 players and allow \$3 per day for expenses. The two schools could never reach an agreement on these items and they became the bone of contention for years. After a period of time, scheduling became a problem.

The two schools quit playing in all sports. They renewed their athletic rivalry - the rivalry

off the field never quit - in 1948 after actually "burying the hatchet" in Birmingham's Woodrow Wilson Park.

In the winter and spring of 1948, Auburn president Dr. Ralph B. Draughon and Alabama president Dr. John Gallalee decided the disagreement had gone on long enough and agreed the series should be renewed after doggedly fighting what they considered interference into their internal affairs by the state legislature. Several cities, including Montgomery and Mobile, were considered for the game site. Birmingham was chosen because it had the largest stadium in the state, 44,000-seat Legion Field.

Alabama won that renewal game, 55-0, in 1948. The Tide was a prohibitive favorite the next year too, but Auburn pulled off one of its biggest upsets ever, 14-13, and one of the nation's great football rivalries was reborn.

PUNT BAMA PUNT

To Auburn people, one of the most incredible Auburn-Alabama games came on Dec. 2, 1972. A few days before the game, Alabama head coach Bear Bryant incited the rivalry when he told reporters that he would rather, "beat that cow college once than beat Texas 10 times." That set the stage as second-ranked Alabama brought a 10-0 record into Legion Field to meet the ninth-ranked Tigers, who were 8-1.

For the entire game, Bama's defense held the Auburn offense in check. With 5:30 remaining in the game, 16-point favorite Alabama held a seemingly insurmountable 16-3 lead. The Tigers, perhaps fueled by Bryant's remarks, came roaring back for one of the best finishes in Auburn-Alabama history. Auburn's Bill Newton blocked two Alabama punts and David Langer ran both in for touchdowns as Auburn came back to win 17-16. Newton and Langer will forever be remembered by Auburn fans for their play in the now famous "Punt Bama Punt" game.

THE 1980'S: THE NEW CHAPTER

Though Alabama dominated the series through the 60s and 70s, the rivalry reached new heights in the 80s as the average margin of victory was a mere 6.4 points. Some classic battles were waged in the decade.

Two games that epitomize the series came in 1985 and 1986. Auburn won the 1986 meeting on a Lawyer Tillman reverse into the endzone with 32 seconds remaining to down Bama 21-17. Alabama won the 1985 game, 25-23, on a 52-yard Van Tiffin field goal as the clock expired.

A historic new page was added to the rivalry in 1989 when Alabama came to Auburn's Jordan-Hare Stadium for the first time. The game was held on Dec. 2, 1989, exactly 17 years after Auburn's 1972 miracle win over the Tide. Just like the 1972 meeting, Bama came into the game with a 10-0 record and a No. 2 ranking. Before a Jordan-Hare Stadium record crowd of 85,319, Auburn ended Alabama's national title hopes with a monumental 30-20 victory.

ON THIS DATE

Auburn is 3-1-1 all-time on November 20. The Tigers' last game on November 20 was a 28-17 loss to Alabama at Jordan-Hare Stadium in 1999.

The Tiger last win on November 20 was in 1993 when they defeated the Alabama, 22-14, en route to a perfect 11-0 season.

IN NOVEMBER

Auburn is 205-161-21 (.557) all-time in the month of November, including a 11-5 mark under Tommy Tuberville.

PERFECT AT JORDAN-HARE

Auburn ended the 2004 season a perfect 7-0 at Jordan-Hare Stadium. It is just the fifth time in school history that the Tigers have been 7-0 or better at home in a season and their first perfect record at home since 2000.

WHEN THEY GO OVER 100

Auburn has experienced a tremendous amount of success when Carnell Williams or Ronnie Brown rushes for over 100 yards as the Tigers are 18-4. When Williams rushes for 100+ yards, Auburn is 13-2, while when Brown goes over the century mark, it is 6-2. The duo have both gone over 100 yards in the same game once in their AU career, that coming this season at Mississippi State.

50-50 IS GOOD

Auburn is a perfect 15-0 over the last four years when Ronnie Brown and Carnell Williams each rush for at least 50 yards in the same game. In fact, the Brown-Williams combination have each rushed for at least 50 yards in the Tigers' last 11 games.

300+ FOR 12 IN A ROW

During Auburn's 12-game winning streak, the Tigers' offense has amassed 300 or more yards of total offense in each game.

The Tigers last tallied 300+ yards of total offense in 12 consecutive games from 1985-86 when they posted 15 games in a row with 300+ yards.

BELOW 150

Auburn's defense has not allowed an opponent to rush for 150 or more yards in its last 15 games. LSU ran for 157 yards against the Tigers last year in Baton Rouge.

It marks the first time since 1970 that Auburn has gone 15 or more games without giving up 150 rushing yards or less on the ground.

The AU defense has also not allowed a 100-yard rusher in the last 15 games since LSU's Justin Vincent rushed for 127 yards in 2003.

2004 AUBURN FOOTBALL

RUSHING SCORE ALLOWED

On October 23, Kentucky accomplished something that no Auburn opponent had done in nearly a year--score a rushing touchdown. Entering the game, the Auburn defense had not allowed a rushing touchdown all season and had gone its eight previous games (33 quarters) without letting an opposing rusher into the end zone. The Tigers went the first 438 minutes of the season without surrendering a rushing TD.

Auburn lead Division I-A in fewest rushing touchdowns allowed with one. Two teams are tied for second with three given up.

UNDER CENTER

Senior quarterback Jason Campbell is 28-9 (.757) in 37 career starts at Auburn.

Since 1970, he trails only Stan White (45) and in starts under center. Campbell's 28 wins as a starter are second at Auburn since 1970 as the Taylorsville, Miss., native trails only Stan White (29) in wins during that time period.

Campbell has also started 29 consecutive games, which is the longest streak by a Tigers' signal caller since White started in 44 consecutive games from 1990-93. In those 29 games, Campbell has directed the Tigers to a 8-4 mark against Top 10 teams and an 15-2 record in the other 17 contests.

DEFENSIVE LOCKDOWN

Auburn is first nationally in scoring defense holding opponents to 9.3 points per game.

Just 43 of the 93 points Auburn has allowed this season have come in the first three quarters of play. In the first three quarters of play, Auburn has outscored its opponents, 282-50.

The 1988 SEC Championship team led the nation in scoring defense with 7.2 ppg allowed.

BIG CATCH COURTNEY

Sophomore wide receiver Courtney Taylor not only leads Auburn in receptions (28), but leads the Tigers' in clutch catches. A remarkable 21 of Taylor's 28 catches have been for first downs, including 10 third down catches to move the chains and two on fourth down.

In Auburn's 10-9 upset of LSU on Sept. 18, Taylor came up with two important catches on the Tigers' fourth-quarter game-winning drive. On 4th-and-12 on the LSU 28 with 3:07 remaining and Auburn trailing 9-3, Taylor caught a 14-yard pass for a first down, keeping the drive alive. Three plays later, Taylor snared a 16-yard touchdown pass for the game-winner.

Two weeks later at No. 10 Tennessee on the Tigers' third play from scrimmage, Taylor ripped away a would-be UT interception and touchdown and gained 14 yards and a AU first down.

DRAWING A COMPARISON

Quarterback Jason Campbell, having his best season as Auburn's signal caller, has posted impressive numbers this season. Below is a comparison of Campbell's statistics versus the Associated Press' No. 1 and No. 2 (tied) ranked team's quarterbacks, USC's Matt Leinart and Oklahoma's Jason White.

GIVE ME A BREAK

First halves have not been kind to Auburn opponents this season as the Tigers have outscored their opposition, 194-26. In fact, 66 of the other 116 Division I-A football programs have given up more points (27) in the first half of at least one game, than Auburn has allowed the entire season (26) in the first half.

The Tigers have led by 17 or more points by halftime seven times and by 20 or more points five times at the half.

The Auburn defense has held its opponents to an average of 133.5 yards of total offense in the first half, including an average of just 51.4 yards on the ground. Offensively in the first half, the Tigers' offense is averaging 240.5 yards, including 107.9 on the ground and 132.6 in the air.

NO NAME DEFENSE

Coined the "no-name defense," Auburn's defensive prowess has truly been a team effort this season. A total of 24 players have contributed a tackle for loss, 13 have recorded a sack and eight have forced a fumble. Twenty-four players have 10 or more tackles on the season, including 14 with 20-plus stops.

RECORDS CHASE

Auburn quarterback Jason Campbell and running backs Carnell Williams and Ronnie Brown are within striking distance to move up in several Auburn career categories.

QUICK HITS

Auburn has won its SEC road games by 29, 24, and 21 points, marking the first time it has won three SEC road games by 20 or more points in the same season ... Auburn has eight 30+ point games this season, one shy of the school record of nine set in 1995 and 1970 ... The Tigers have had seven consecutive wins by 18 or more points and seven 20+ point victories this season.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Special team play has been solid for the Tigers as they are in the top four in the league in punting, punt returns and kickoff returns. Auburn is second in kickoff returns (24.7) and punt returns (13.7) and is third in punting (38.4). Placekicker John Vaughn is 8-for-10 (80 percent) which is third in the SEC in field goal percentage.

TRAVIS' TRADE

Despite his relatively small stature for a linebacker at 6-1, 212 lbs., junior Travis Williams has made a big impression on opposing offenses.

Williams leads Auburn with 62 tackles, 45 of which have been primary stops. He also has recorded seven and a half tackles for loss and had an interception in back-to-back games against Tennessee and Louisiana Tech.

In seven SEC games, Williams has 47 tackles, including 39 primary tackles and five TFLs.

CAMPBELL ON TARGET

Jason Campbell, has been extremely accurate this season, completing 67.7 percent of his passes while throwing 15 TD strikes and just four interceptions. Campbell leads the Southeastern Conference and is fourth nationally in passing efficiency with a 171.4 rating.

The Most Valuable Player of the Music City Bowl, Campbell holds the Auburn record for career completion percentage with a .637

mark. Campbell is ranked in the Auburn top 10 in several other career records including passing yardage (6,512-2nd), pass attempts (779-4th), pass completions (496-2nd) and touchdown passes (40-T2nd).

Campbell is third in the Southeastern Conference record books in completion percentage, trailing only Tim Couch (67.1%, 1996-98) and Dusty Bonner (65.3%, 1997, 99) of Kentucky. Tennessee's Peyton Manning (1994-97) is fourth at 63.7%.

WELL RESTED

Sophomore punter Kody Bliss punted just once in the first half of a five-game span from The Citadel to Kentucky. In the last seven games, Bliss has been forced to punt just five times.

On the season, Bliss has tallied just 11 first half punts as compared to 31 by the Tigers' opponents in the first two periods of play.

WELL RESTED, PART II

A majority of the Tigers' roster have played this season as 84 players appeared between the lines.

Auburn had a season-high 74 players see action against The Citadel and against Louisiana Tech. In the season opener against Louisiana-Monroe, 73 players received playing time in the 31-0 and 66 of 70 on the travel squad played at Mississippi State in the second game of the season. Against Kentucky, 71 players played in the 42-10 win. At Ole Miss, 55 of the 65 dressed saw action.

COACHES' COMPARISON

Auburn's 34-10 win over then-No. 10 Tennessee on Oct. 2 was the program's largest road win against a Top 10 team in school history. It also was head coach Tommy Tuberville's eighth win as Tigers' head coach over an AP Top 10 program.

PAT STREAK SNAPPED

Auburn's SEC-record 209 consecutive PAT kicks converted was snapped against Arkansas. After the Tigers went ahead 30-0 in the second quarter, PK John Vaughn connected on the PAT, however, an Auburn penalty negated the PAT and Vaughn missed the kick,

the Tigers' first PAT miss since 1999.

Prior to Vaughn's miss, the last PAT miss was by Rob Bironas against Idaho in 1999. Contributing to the 209 consecutive PATs included: Bironas (1), Damon Duval (130), Philip Yost (24) and John Vaughn (54).

The NCAA Division I-A record is 262 held by Syracuse (1978-89).

FOURTH QUARTER COMEBACKS

Auburn's 10-9 win over then-No. 5 LSU on September 18 was the Tigers' fifth fourth quarter come-from-behind win during the Tommy Tuberville Era and first since the 2001 season.

WILLIAMS MAKES HISTORY

Tigers' running back Carnell Williams was named the Southeastern Conference Offensive Player of the Week for an SEC-record eighth time after rushing for 122 yards and two touchdowns in Auburn's 43-14 win over Mississippi State on Sept. 11.

Williams' eight SEC honors surpassed former Alabama running back Shaun Alexander and Florida quarterback Danny Wuerffel, who each won the award seven times. Williams was honored four times in 2003, including three straight from October 4-18.

OVER THE CENTURY MARK

Auburn running backs Carnell Williams and Ronnie Brown have combined to rush for eight 100-yard games this season.

Williams ran for 103 yards in the Tigers' season-opening win over Louisiana-Monroe and posted a 144-yard effort at Mississippi State. Against Kentucky, Williams rushed for a season-best 149 yards and two touchdowns and posted a 101-yard day against Georgia. The Cadillac has come up just shy of 100 yards three times this year, with 95 yards against both The Citadel and LSU and 96 at

Ole Miss.

Brown, meanwhile tallied a 147-yard effort at Mississippi State and has belted out three consecutive 100-yard efforts. Brown rushed for 109 yards against Louisiana Tech, 101 versus Arkansas and 100 at Ole Miss.

Williams has 15 100-yard games in his Auburn career, which is tied for second all-time at Auburn with James Brooks (1977-80). Bo Jackson (1982-85) is the Auburn record holder with 21.

Brown has eight career 100-yard performances, which is ninth all-time at Auburn.

THE DECADE CLUB

In his 10th year as a head coach, Tommy Tuberville has five assistant coaches who have been with him all 10 years. That group includes: defensive tackles/nose guard coach Don Dunn, running backs/special teams coach Eddie Gran, wide receivers coach Greg Knox, offensive line coach Hugh Nall and defensive ends coach Terry Price.

IRON MEN

Of Auburn's 18 seniors, 10 have seen time in 40 or more games in their careers. Junior Rosegreen and Donny Young lead the list, playing in all 47 of the Tigers' games during the last three-plus seasons. They are followed by Carlos Rogers (46), Ronnie Brown (45), Jason Campbell (45), Derrick Graves (44), Mayo Sowell (42), Silas Daniels (42), Jay Ratliff (42), and Danny Lindsey (41).

Campbell, Lindsey and Rosegreen are tied for the most starts with 36.

STARTS STREAK

Five Tigers currently own starting streaks of 20 or more games.

Leading the way is DB Junior Rosegreen and OL Danny Lindsey who have started in 37 and 36 consecutive games, respectively. QB Jason Campbell has started in 29 straight, while OL Troy Reddick has started in 23 consecutive. DB Will Herring has started in 21 straight contests.

BIG CLASS

Head Coach Tommy Tuberville has his largest senior class at Auburn in 2004. The Tigers' roster includes 18 seniors, which eclipses Tuberville's other senior classes: 13 in 2003, 15 in 2002, 10 in 2001, 14 in 2000 and 14 in 1999.

TIGERS GRADS

Auburn has seven graduates on its roster, which is tops in the SEC and is tied for eighth best among all Division I-A football teams.

The Tiger graduates include: RB Ronnie Brown (Communication), QB Jason Campbell, DE Bret Eddins (Business), C

Jeremy Ingle (Political Science), OT Rich Trucks (Marketing/Business Administration), DB Donnay Young (Public Administration), PK Philip Yost.

WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is 41-4 when scoring 20 or more points in a game, including a 41-3 mark in the regular season.

Dating back to 1995, Auburn is 62-11 when scoring 20 or more points in a game.

30+ POINTS EQUALS VICTORY

Under Tommy Tuberville, Auburn is a perfect 29-0 when scoring 30 or more points in a game. Auburn has won 42 consecutive games when scoring 30 or more points in a game.

The last time the Tigers lost when registering at least 30 points was a 56-49, four over-time loss to Georgia in 1996.

In the last 21 years, Auburn is 104-2 when scoring 30 points.

POSITION CHANGES

Several players entered 2004 at a different position from where they played last season. On offense, Danny Lindsey moved from center to guard. Lindsey started all 13 games at center in 2003, but started 11 games at guard in 2002.

On defense, Jay Ratliff moved from defensive end to defensive tackle. A senior from Valdosta, Ga., Ratliff played in 21 games, including nine starts, in his career at defensive end.

Karibi Dede moved to linebacker after playing in all 13 games at safety last season.

The Tigers return 47 lettermen from last season, including 21 on offense, 23 on defense and three specialists. Auburn returns seven starters on offense and five on defense.

Auburn's roster of 105 players includes 18 seniors, 22 juniors, 24 sophomores, 15 redshirt freshmen and 26 freshmen. The underclassmen (65) represent 61.3 percent of the Tigers' roster.

A number of walk-ons joined the program after the first day of classes on August 18.

Carnell Williams scored on an 80-yard run on the first offensive play from scrimmage and Auburn never looked back in beating intrastate rival Alabama, 28-23, in the 68th edition of the Iron Bowl.

Williams, who rushed for a career high 204 yards on 26 carries, got Auburn on the board 15 seconds into the game when he broke a toss sweep down the sideline in front of the Auburn bench.

On the ensuing possession, Alabama stalled but downed a Bo Freeman punt on the two-yard line, putting the Tigers backs against the endzone.

Williams next carry would also result in points, two for Alabama as Anthony Bryant got into the backfield and took down Cadillac for a safety.

Auburn would strike for another big play on its next possession when Jason Campbell found Ben Obomanu over the middle for a 64-yard scoring strike. Obomanu caught the ball in traffic and broke a tackle before breaking loose for the score.

The pair of big plays marked just the second time in school history Auburn had an 80-yard run and a 60-yard pass in the same game. The other occurrence came against the Tide in 1977.

Leading 15-2 midway through the first quarter, Auburn would add a 22-yard John Vaughn field goal to wrap up the scoring in the first half.

After combining for 20 points in the first quarter, the second quarter was scoreless.

Typical to Iron Bowl history, the trailing team came out fired up at halftime as Alabama's Brandon Brooks took the opening kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown. It was the first kickoff return for a score in the series since 1969.

After forcing Auburn to three-and-out, the Crimson Tide mounted an eight-play, 82-yard drive for a touchdown that cut the Tiger deficit to 18-16.

Shaud Williams, who had 41 yards on the drive, put Alabama in the end zone with a six-yard scamper.

On the ensuing possession, Auburn extended its advantage to five on Vaughn's second field goal, a 32 yarder.

The Tigers final score was set up by a Will Herring interception at midfield. Auburn drove 50 yards, capped by a 1-yard Williams touchdown run to go up 28-16.

Alabama added a late Lance Taylor touchdown reception before failing on an onside kick attempt.

Auburn won back-to-back Iron Bowls for the first time since 1988-89 and became the first home team to win in the series since Alabama's 1998 victory.

Jason Campbell passed for two touchdowns and Carnell Williams ran for 103 yards as Auburn shut out Louisiana-Monroe, 31-0, at Jordan-Hare Stadium for both teams' season opener.

Campbell, who passed for 110 yards on the strength of 11-of-18 passing, found Williams for a 9-yard score in the first, then connected with Devin Aromashodu for a 32-yard touchdown in the third quarter.

Williams ran 23 times, earning his 12th career 100-yard rushing effort. Ronnie Brown ran seven times for 55 yards and one touchdown, a 30-yard blast in the final moments of the third quarter to end Auburn's scoring day. The Tigers averaged 4.7 yards per rush en route to 194 yards overall on the day.

The Auburn defense held Louisiana-Monroe to just 99 yards passing and 239 overall. Will Herring intercepted a pass for the fourth straight game and Travis Williams forced his third career fumble. Pat Sims, playing in his first career game, forced his first fumble, recovered by another freshman, Tony Bell.

Auburn took a quick 17-0 lead, scoring on its first three possessions of the game. Campbell took the Tigers on a seven-play drive, ending with Williams' first career passing touchdown.

John Vaughn, named the starter by head coach Tommy Tuberville earlier in the week, connected on a 43-yard field goal with 3:54 remaining in the first quarter to put the Tigers up by 10.

On his sixth career play, Brandon Cox put Auburn up, 17-0, with a 14-yard touchdown run. The redshirt freshman led the Tigers on a 6-play drive for the score, marching the team 71 yards. He found Courtney Taylor for a 39-yard completion on the third play of the drive, the first of Cox's career.

Running back Carnell Williams crossed the plain twice en route to 122 yards rushing. Teammate Ronnie Brown led the Tigers with 147 yards rushing; Auburn ended the afternoon with 283 yards on 41 carries -- and average of 6.9 yards per rush.

Campbell set a career-high with three touchdown passes. He ended the game with 139 yards on 8-of-17 passing. Brandon Cox came in the game in relief of Campbell and was perfect in passing, connecting on all five of his attempts. He finished the game with 43 yards, including a 7-yard strike to Obomanu early in the fourth quarter.

The Auburn defense held Mississippi State to less than 300 overall yards -- the second feat in a row for the Tigers -- and the Bulldogs weren't able to reach the 100-yard rushing mark.

Montavis Pitts and Mayo Sowell led the Tigers with six tackles. Eric Brock picked off his first career interception and Jay Ratliff forced a fumble on a sack. Sowell, Stanley McClover and Donnay Young were all credited with pass breakups.

Auburn jumped out to a 21-0 lead at halftime. Mix, Williams and Obomanu all scored touchdowns in the first half, pushing Auburn to its fourth straight victory over the Bulldogs.

Courtney Taylor caught a 16-yard touchdown pass with 1:14 to play as No. 14 Auburn defeated fifth-ranked LSU, 10-9, in front of a Jordan-Hare Stadium and state of Alabama record crowd.

Taylor's touchdown reception was the only of the game for Auburn, which improved to 3-0 overall and 2-0 in Southeastern Conference play. Quarterback Jason Campbell, who finished the game 16-of-27 passing for 170 yards, led the Tigers on a 12-play, 59-yard drive to cap the Tigers' victory.

Earlier in the drive, on a 4th-and-12 from LSU's 28, Campbell found Taylor for a 14-yard pass to the right. Two plays later, Campbell connected with Taylor again, giving Auburn the win.

Auburn missed the ensuing extra point, but an LSU personal foul on the play enabled the Tigers to rekick, which John Vaughn promptly nailed.

Junior Rosegreen halted the ensuing LSU drive when he picked off a JaMarcus Russell pass intended for Early Doucet. The Tiger defense allowed LSU 308 yards, but just three points after the Bayou Bengals opened the game with an 80-yard scoring drive. LSU quarterbacks Russell and Marcus Randall combined to throw for 168 yards on 12-of-28 passing.

After Randall found Dwayne Bowe for a 9-yard touchdown to begin the game, Auburn used a 14-play, 69-yard drive to put three points on the board. John Vaughn connected for his second field goal of the season, a 29-yarder, to bring the score to 6-3 (LSU missed its extra point).

The Bayou Bengals answered back with a 42-yard field goal early in the second quarter and the score stayed that way well into the fourth quarter as both teams' offense's stalled.

Carnell Williams led Auburn with 75 yards rushing on 18 carries. Ronnie Brown pitched in with 67 yards in nine attempts.

Auburn outgained The Citadel, 593 yards to 169, holding the Bulldogs to less than 100 yards both rushing and passing.

Auburn opened the game with a 1-yard score by Stewart, the first of his career. The running back ended the game with 10 carries for 91 yards, a career high and just four off the pace of Williams, who led the game despite not playing a single down in the second half.

Defensive back Junior Rosegreen tied a 65-year-old Southeastern Conference record and the Auburn offense raced to a 31-3 halftime lead as the Tigers defeated Tennessee, 34-10, in front of 107,828, the largest crowd Auburn has ever played in front of.

Rosegreen intercepted four passes off Volunteer quarterbacks Erik Ainge and Brent Schaeffer. Rosegreen tied an SEC record set in 1939 by Mississippi State's Jack Nix. As a team, the Tigers picked off five passes and forced six turnovers.

The Auburn offense capitalized, posting 17 points off Tennessee turnovers. Carnell Williams and Ronnie Brown both had rushing touchdowns while Courtney Taylor and Ben Obomanu scored through for the air for Auburn, which improved to 5-0 overall and 3-0 in Southeastern Conference play this season.

The win, Auburn's first in Knoxville since the 1983 season, was the second this season over a top 10 opponent. The Tigers defeated then-No. 5 LSU, 10-9, two weeks earlier.

Auburn scored on its opening drive of the game for the fourth time this season. Brown crossed the scoring plane with his 22nd career touchdown, a 9-yard run within the first six minutes of the game to put Auburn up early.

Tennessee's James Wilhoit answered back with a 41-yard field goal five minutes later, but it proved to be the last points the Volunteers scored in the first half. The Tigers held Ainge and Schaeffer to 6-of-23 passing in the first half and kept Tennessee to 119 yards of total offense -- Auburn had 333.

Ben Obomanu put Auburn ahead, 14-3, with a 5-yard touchdown reception from quarterback Jason Campbell late in the first quarter.

After a 24-yard John Vaughn field goal, Williams, less than three minutes later, put the Tigers up, 24-3, with a 5-yard run for a 4-play drive that lasted just 1:24.

Auburn scored early, and save for a small period in the third quarter, dominated Louisiana Tech for a 52-7 victory in the 78th Homecoming contest.

Auburn opened the game with 14 points in the first quarter and led 24-0 at halftime. Jason Campbell and Brandon Cox both tossed touchdown scores for the sixth-ranked Tigers, who improved to 6-0 this season.

Ben Obomanu caught two of those touchdown strikes -- the second time he has accomplished the feat this season -- while Maurice Anderson and Silas Daniels were members of the end zone club. Ronnie Brown, who rushed for 109 yards on 10 carries, and Carnell Williams both ran in scores for the Tigers.

Defensively, Auburn held Louisiana Tech to 222 total yards of offense -- 37 on the ground -- while being credited with nine sacks and 15 tackles for loss. Carlos Rogers returned an interception for a 53-yard touchdown and Travis Williams picked off his second pass in as many games.

Carnell Williams began the game with a 6-yard score in the first quarter, followed by Brown's 3-yard burst to put the Tigers up by 14.

After John Vaughn put a 41-yard kick through the uprights, Rogers returned the interception, giving Auburn a 24-0 lead that lasted into the third quarter.

Obomanu caught a juggling 9-yard pass from Campbell in the first eight minutes of the second half. A Johnat Holland pass from Matt Kubik -- a 78-yarder -- put the Bulldogs on the board, but Auburn answered back with Daniels' touchdown less than two minutes later. The pass play set an Auburn record, two yards better than the previous record of 85 yards last equaled by Reggie Slack and James Joseph in 1988.

Obomanu and Anderson finished up Auburn's scoring for the afternoon with their respective scores, giving the Tigers a season-high 52 points.

Auburn set a Southeastern Conference record with the win. On his first kick of the game, Vaughn sent the extra point through the uprights, giving the Tigers 200 straight PAT's, surpassing Alabama, which made 199 straight from 1981-87. A sluggish first half proved to be no concern as third-ranked Auburn defeated Ole Miss, 35-14, under the lights in front of an ESPN-national audience.

Auburn clinched the Southeastern Conference Western Division title with the victory, guaranteeing itself its first trip to Atlanta for the SEC Championship since 2000. The Tigers moved to 9-0 on the season -- their best start since 1994 -- and 6-0 in conference with two games left in the season.

Jason Campbell ran for two touchdowns -- one in a 28-point second half -- and passed for 234 yards and another touchdown. Ronnie Brown ran for 100 yards and Carnell Williams rushed 16 times for 96 yards.

The Auburn defense bent, but didn't break in the win over the Rebels. The group racked up seven sacks, led by Stanley McClover's two, and picked off another interception, this one, the third of the season, by Will Herring.

Auburn failed to get on the board in the first quarter for the first time this season and came close to getting shut out in the first half altogether. But Campbell snuck one in from the 1-yard line with 26 seconds to play, giving Auburn the lead to start the game for the eighth time this season.

Brown upped that lead to 14-0 two minutes into the second half on a 2-yard blast.

Ole Miss answered back with a 64-yard Bill Flowers touchdown reception, but Courtney Taylor replied with a 9-yarder four minutes later.

The Rebels came within seven again, six seconds into the fourth quarter, on a Tye Biddle 25-yard touchdown catch, but another Campbell run, yet another 1-yarder, and a Williams 29-yard run with a little more than five minutes later sealed the win, the conference and an 11-game winning streak dating back to the 2003 season.

Travis Williams, Wayne Dickens, Doug Langenfeld, Antarrrious Williams and Quentin Groves all recorded sacks for the Auburn defense, which didn't allow a rushing touchdown for the eighth time in nine games this season.

Campbell found Taylor four times for 73 yards, while Williams, on the strength of a 57-yard catch, caught two passes for 70 yards.

Auburn continued its quest for a perfect season with a 24-6 victory over No. 8 Georgia at Jordan-Hare Stadium, to improve to 10-0 on the season. The Tigers became just the third team in school history to start 10-0, joining the 1993 and 1957 teams.

Jason Campbell threw for 189 yards and touchdown, while Carnell Williams ran and threw for a touchdown. Campbell also set a school single-game completion percentage record after connecting on 18 of 22 passes, good for 81.8 percent.

The Tigers improved to 7-0 in the Southeastern Conference to capture the outright Western Division title. The victory over the Bulldogs sent Auburn to 12 straight since 2003, the team's longest since the 1993-94 period.

Auburn's defense, meanwhile, came two minutes away from posting its second shutout of the season. The Tigers held Georgia to 279 offensive yards -- just 85 on the ground -- and were credited with three sacks and five tackles for loss (-25).

Auburn got on the board in a hurry, posting a score in its opening drive for the eighth time in 10 games this season. Williams capped off an 8-play, 80-yard drive with a 1-yard run to the right, giving the Tigers a 7-0 lead with 6:14 to play in the first.

Williams struck again in the second quarter, only in a dramatically different fashion. On the ninth play of an 80-yard drive, Williams, from the running back spot, found wide receiver Anthony Mix for a 29-yard touchdown pass.

After a John Vaughn 32-yard field goal, Auburn held a 17-0 lead at halftime. On the season, the Tigers have outscored their opponents, 194-26, going into the break.

Both teams kept each other scoreless in the third quarter, but Auburn wasted no time in the fourth. Brown caught a 15-yard touchdown pass from Campbell less than a minute into the quarter, putting Auburn up and in control, 24-0.

A late Georgia touchdown -- David Greene found Leonard Pope for a 6-yard score with 2:13 left -- got the Bulldogs on the board for the first and only time in the game.

Williams led all rushers with 101 yards, while Brown paced the Tigers with 88 yards receiving on seven catches.

Williams also had a stellar game on special teams, finishing the game with 77 punt return yards.

Carlos Rogers led Auburn with eight tackles and picked off a David Greene pass in the end zone. Rogers also was credited with a sack and two tackles for loss (-9).

Travis Williams, Antarrrious Williams and Stanley McClover were all credited with at least half a sack. Travis Williams also led the Tigers with two quarterback hurries.
