WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- At No. 17 in the coaches poll and No. 19 in the AP poll, Ole Miss is ranked for the 35th time in the last 36 rankings.
- Ole Miss and Alabama are two of the five schools that have made back-to-back New Year's Six bowls.
- The renovated Vaught-Hemingway Stadium includes bowling in of the north end zone to increase capacity to 64,038 (largest stadium in Mississippi), natural grass playing surface (first time since 2002), three new LED video displays, new lights and sound system, and a new south end zone field club.
- Ole Miss is looking to become the first school to defeat a Nick Saban-coached Alabama team three straight times.
- The last time the Rebels faced the nation's No. 1 team was a 2014 win over Alabama ... Ole Miss is 1-10 all-time versus the top-ranked team in the land.
- Ole Miss is 10-13 against ranked teams, 4-9 against top-10 foes and 3-4 against top-five foes under **Hugh Freeze**.
- This is the 64th meeting between Ole Miss and Alabama ... The Crimson Tide hold a 47-11-2 series lead.
- Ole Miss is 33-46-3 all-time in SEC openers, including last year's 43-37 win at Alabama.
- Ole Miss plays 10 bowl teams from last year, tied for second-most in the country.
- Senior QB **Chad Kelly** leads the SEC with seven passing touchdowns and 42 points responsible for.
- Ole Miss is a perfect 10 of 10 in the red zone (all TDs) and leads the SEC with a 62.5 3rd-down conversion rate.

WEEKLY PRESS CONFERENCE: Ole Miss holds its weekly fall press conference each Monday of the regular season at 11:15 a.m. CT in the Burns Team Meeting Room at the Manning Center, which is adjacent to Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field. Various Ole Miss coaches and staff will take the podium first and will be followed by Coach Hugh Freeze at approximately 11:30 a.m., and quarterback Chad Kelly after Freeze. Members of the media unable to attend the Monday press conference may participate via the telephone beginning at 11:30 a.m.

PRACTICES: Viewing is permitted for approved media for select portions of practice on Tuesdays during the season. If you do not regularly attend practices, please contact Media Relations prior to your visit for exact details on times and location. Media are forbidden from reporting (e.g. tweeting, blogging, etc.) on anything related to practice until after the post-practice interviews. This includes media who leave practice early. Videographers and photographers must use tight shots and no formations. On available days, video is permitted for individual drills only, and media will be alerted which portions of practice (including stretch) are available for video. Use of footage from practices must be limited to three minutes per day. If you have not previously attended practices, please contact the Media & PR office for prior approval and daily alerts on practice locations and times.

AUDIO/VIDEO RESTRICTIONS: Press conferences, media opportunities, practices and any form of competition may not be broadcast live, including Periscope and related media, without prior consent of the athletics department. Audio/video use of content from press conferences and media opportunities is limited to five minutes per individual (coach or student-athlete) per day, and use of footage from practices is limited to three minutes per day. This includes content attained via FTP, which should be credited to Ole Miss Athletics. Ole Miss offers free FTP downloads of game highlights and interviews with coaches and players for television stations to use during regularly scheduled news/sportscasts. WEEKDAY PARKING: Parking permits are required for everyone on campus Monday through Friday between 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Media that plan to regularly attend practices, press conferences and other on-campus events may purchase a Vendor Permit from Campus Parking (www.olemiss.edu/parking), which is good for the full academic year. Those without parking permits are advised to park in a metered spot in the east lot of the Manning Center and feed the meter at \$1 per hour. Day passes are also available for \$3 online to print at <http://www.olemiss.edu/parking/visitors.html>. Parking is also available in the garage adjacent to The Pavilion at \$2 for the first hour and \$1 for each additional hour, up to a \$10 maximum charge for a 24-hour period. The garage will accept credit cards only as payment.

WORKING CREDENTIALS: To request game credentials, go to Ole Miss' online credentialing site: www.sportssystem.com/OleMiss. Credential requests must be made by the sports director of each media outlet and are limited to those media who will be attending the game in a working capacity. Media must approve the SEC Media Policy before requesting credentials. Media credentials are allotted on the following basis: (1) daily newspapers; (2) network affiliate television stations; (3) websites whose primary purpose is to gather and disseminate news and who have an affiliation with a nationally recognized media entity/network; (4) magazines, weekly newspapers and non-broadcast radio stations. **PHOTOGRAPHERS:** Per NCAA rule, images or likeness of current student-athletes may not be sold, distributed or used for commercial purposes.

MEDIA GATE: Media will enter Gate 31 on the west side of the stadium beginning three and a half (3.5) hours prior to kickoff. The media will-call table will be located there, and photographers will exchange their photo ticket for an armband at this location.

GAMEDAY PARKING: Gameday media parking is located in two locations: 1) garage adjacent to The Pavilion; and 2) lot near Tad Smith Coliseum. Media should check their pass to indicate for which lot they are designated. For passed marked for the garage, each pass is for a specific numbered parking spot. Cars parked in the wrong spot will be towed. Passes marked for Tad Smith Coliseum are for a lot located west of the old arena.

GAMEDAY DRIVING DIRECTIONS: Media traveling to campus should take the Chucky Mullins Drive exit off of Highway 6 and travel north toward the 4-way stop. Those with garage parking passes should turn right onto Hill Drive, and those with Tad Smith Coliseum passes should continue straight on Chucky Mullins Drive. Both lots are located on the right side of their respective streets.

OLE MISS HEAD COACH HUGH FREEZE

Hugh Freeze (Southern Miss, 1992) is in his fifth season at the Ole Miss helm. He inherited a team that went 2-10 and winless in SEC games in 2011 and has led the Rebels to four straight bowl games, including back-to-back "New Year's Six" bowl berths the last two seasons. He's the first coach to lead Ole Miss to four straight bowls since John Vaught, and he's the only Rebel coach to accomplish that feat in his first four seasons at the helm. A 2014 finalist for the Bear Bryant Award and Dodd Trophy, Freeze owns a 35-19 mark in Oxford and a career record of 65-26. His .648 winning percentage at Ole Miss is the second-best of any Rebel coach in the last 100 years. He was named the University's 37th head football coach on Dec. 5, 2011, coming to Oxford after one year as head coach at Arkansas State where he led the Red Wolves to a 10-2 season and the 2011 Sun Belt Conference title and was tabbed Sun Belt Coach of the Year. It is his second stint at Ole Miss, as he was a member of the Rebel coaching staff from 2005-07, including the final two seasons as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator with two of the top classes in school history.

ALABAMA HEAD COACH NICK SABAN

Nick Saban (Kent State, 1973) has led Alabama to four national titles (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015) and four SEC titles (2009, 2012, 2014, 2015) among his 10 seasons at the helm. He has an 102-18 record as the head coach of the Tide. He also won the national title with LSU (2003) and is the only coach with four BCS National Championships. His previous head coaching stops also include Toledo, Michigan State and the Miami Dolphins.

ALABAMA SCOUTING REPORT

Alabama is 2-0 on the young season and is ranked No. 1 in both the AP and coaches polls this week. The Crimson Tide has victories over then-No. 17 USC (52-6) and Western Kentucky (38-10). Alabama is riding a 14-game winning streak, dating back to last season's loss to Ole Miss, its only setback en route to winning the College Football Playoff. Sophomore Damien Harris leads the rushing attack with 183 yards, averaging a whopping 9.2 yards per carry which ranks fourth in the country. The Alabama offense is led by true freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts, who has thrown for 405 yards through the first two games of his career. The Tide defense has limited opponents to 43.5 rushing yards per game and 216.5 yards per game, ranking third and sixth in the nation, respectively. Alabama is also eighth nationally allowing only 8.0 per game.

VAUGHT-HEMINGWAY STADIUM EXPANSION AND RENOVATIONS

What was already the site of one of the best gameday atmospheres in college football, Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, has been significantly improved for the 2016 season. When the Rebels hosted Wofford on Sept. 10, they played on a natural grass field for the first time since 2002 and set a state of Mississippi record for college football attendance with 64,232. The stadium capacity of 64,038 is an increase of nearly 5,000 from last year.

The north side of the stadium has been closed in to provide additional student seating and has transformed into an exciting new "front door," which will be complete with a plaza and bell tower this spring. Other enhancements include three new videoboards, a new sound system and superior stadium lights.

As part of the \$200 million Forward Together capital campaign, the south end zone was also renovated to add 30 luxury suites and 770 club level seats, and the west suites were all refinished for the 2015 season.



REBELS VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS

- Ole Miss went 5-2 against ranked foes last year with wins over No. 2 Alabama (43-37), No. 15 Texas A&M (23-3), No. 15 LSU (38-17), No. 21 Mississippi State (38-27) and No. 16 Oklahoma State (48-20).
- The five wins over ranked teams were a school record.
- In 2015, Ole Miss had multiple wins over AP top-15 teams in consecutive years for the first time since 1967-69.
- The Rebels have seven wins over top-15 teams in the last three years ... They had five such wins in the previous 22.
- Ole Miss is 68-150-2 all-time versus ranked teams and 10-13 with **Hugh Freeze** at the helm.
- Against ranked teams in the Freeze era, Ole Miss is 6-4 at home, 3-7 on the road and 1-2 at a neutral site.

AIMING FOR THREE STRAIGHT AGAINST THE TIDE

- Ole Miss is looking to become the first school to earn wins over Alabama in three straight seasons since Auburn (six straight from 2002-07) and LSU (five straight from 2003-07).
- No school has defeated a Nick Saban-coached Alabama squad three years in a row.
- Ole Miss was the only team to knock off Alabama in the regular season in both 2014 and 2015.
- Hugh Freeze** is one of two coaches (LSU's Les Miles) to defeat a Saban-coached Alabama team in consecutive years.
- Chad Kelly** is one of two active QBs (Texas A&M's Trevor Knight when he was at Oklahoma) to defeat the Tide.

RUGGED 2016 SCHEDULE

- Ole Miss plays 10 teams that made bowl appearances last year, tied for second-most in the nation with BYU, Colorado and Ohio State ... Only USC (11) will play more.
- The only teams on the Rebels' schedule that didn't go bowling last year are Wofford and Vanderbilt.
- Teams on the Rebels' schedule that are currently ranked include No. 1 Alabama, No. 2 Florida State, No. 13 Georgia, No. 17 Texas A&M, No. 20 LSU and No. 24 Arkansas.
- Three of the first four games are against national powerhouses Florida State (lost to the No. 4 Seminoles 45-34 in Orlando), Alabama (host the No. 1 Crimson Tide on Saturday) and Georgia (host the No. 13 Bulldogs next Saturday).

- Thanks to a renovated and expanded Vaught-Hemingway Stadium, the crowd of 64,232 at Saturday's home opener vs. Wofford broke the all-time Ole Miss and state of Mississippi attendance record for football.
- For the fourth straight season, Ole Miss has sold out of football season tickets.
- This year's total of 57,200 season tickets purchased broke last season's previous record of 52,375.
- Previous record-breaking season ticket sellouts were 51,316 in 2014 and 50,386 in 2013.
- The 2014 season attendance record of 430,829 fans is expected to be surpassed again this season.

SUCCESS ON THIRD DOWNS

Everyone knows success on third downs is critical in football, and Ole Miss has been very good in that area through the first two games. The Rebels lead all SEC teams and rank are tied for second nationally with a conversion rate of 62.5 percent (15 of 24). The Rebels were 5 of 11 vs. Florida State and 10 of 13 vs. Wofford.

PERFECTION IN THE RED ZONE

You can't get any better in the red zone than the Rebels have been through the first two games. Ole Miss is a perfect 10 of 10, scoring all touchdowns, from inside the 20. Those touchdowns have been scored by nine different players, with only true freshman WR **D.K. Metcalf** (currently out with a foot injury) finding the end zone twice.

BIG LEAD NOT ENOUGH FOR REBELS IN ORLANDO

Ole Miss led by 22 (28-6) against the No. 4 team in the nation on Labor Day, but it wasn't enough to put away the Florida State Seminoles in a 45-34 season-opening loss. The lead was the Rebels' biggest against a top-five opponent in the **Hugh Freeze** era. FSU reeled off 33 unanswered points before Ole Miss scored to make it 39-34 early in the fourth quarter. But the Seminoles, behind five sacks, put too much pressure on the Ole Miss passing game for the Rebels to regain the advantage. It was the first season-opening loss for the Rebels since 2011, the year before Freeze arrived.

BIG BLOWS

Ole Miss suffered two big blows in the season opener in Orlando, losing starting CB **Ken Webster** and backup RB **Eric Swinney** to left knee injuries that will likely end both of their seasons. The Rebels took another hit last week against Wofford, as freshman WR **D.K. Metcalf** (the only Rebel with more than one touchdown this season) went down with a serious foot injury. More on his status should be known this week.

ODDS AND ENDS

- Ole Miss has had a winning SEC record in back-to-back years (2014-15) for the first time since 1989-90.
- Ole Miss has increased its win total by one game each year under **Hugh Freeze** - 7 in 2012, 8 in 2013, 9 in 2014, 10 in 2015.
- The Rebels face Wofford and Georgia Southern for the first time this year.
- Ole Miss is 28-5 under Freeze when leading at the half, including a 9-0 mark last year.
- Ole Miss is 30-3 under Freeze when it rushes for 150 or more yards, 5-16 when it rushes for less than 150 yards.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- After topping the SEC in scoring, total offense and passing a year ago, Ole Miss currently is tied for third in the league in scoring (36.0 ppg) and fifth in passing (277.5 ypg).
- The Rebels are first in the SEC and tied for second nationally with a third-down conversion rate of 62.5 percent.
- Ole Miss is a perfect 10 of 10 in the red zone this year, scoring 10 touchdown by nine different players.
- Half of the Rebels' eight receiving touchdowns have been scored by freshmen (2 by **D.K. Metcalf**, 1 by **A.J. Brown**, 1 by **Van Jefferson**).
- In the opener vs. Florida State, senior TE **Evan Engram** led the receiving corps with a career-high nine catches for 121 yards and a TD ... Senior WR **Quincy Adeboyejo**, junior WR **Damore'ea Stringfellow**, redshirt-freshman WR **Van Jefferson** and true freshman WR **A.J. Brown** all added at least two grabs.
- After the loss of redshirt-freshman **Eric Swinney** (left knee), the remaining available running back with the most game experience is senior **Akeem Judd**, who is now backed up by junior RB **Eugene Brazley** ... Judd leads the backs with 19 rushes for 108 yards and a score so far this season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- One of the best defensive lines in the country is headlined by junior DE **Marquis Haynes**, an All-SEC player who logged 16.5 tackles for loss and 10 sacks a year ago ... Fellow DE starter **Fadol Brown** is back, as well as veteran nose tackles **Issac Gross** and **D.J. Jones** and up-and-coming sophomore DT **Breeland Speaks**.
- Of the 11 defensive backs listed on the current depth chart, five are freshmen, including both players at Rover - No. 1 **Myles Hartsfield** and No. 2 **Deontay Anderson**.
- Graduate transfer (from Oregon State) **Rommel Mageo** made his first Rebel start at Mike linebacker vs. Wofford and led the team with eight tackles.
- The top three tacklers against FSU all set career highs: sophomore DB **Zedrick Woods** with 11, senior LB **Terry Caldwell** with 10 and senior CB **Carlos Davis** with eight.
- Junior LB **DeMarquis Gates** had a career-high 2.0 sacks in the effort at Orlando.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

- After two games, Ole Miss ranks third in the SEC and 16th nationally with a net punting average of 43.0.
- Senior **Carlos Davis** leads all SEC players and ranks 21st nationally with a kick return average of 27.2 yards ... As a team, Ole Miss is third in the SEC and 22nd nationally with a kick return average of 27.0.
- The kicking game should be a strong point this year with junior returnees **Gary Wunderlich** at placekicker and **Will Gleeson** at punter ... Wunderlich scored the second-most points in a season in school history (120) a year ago, while both he and Gleeson are entering their third seasons as full-time starters.

CHUCKY MULLINS COURAGE AWARD

In the spring, senior DE **John Youngblood** became the 26th different Rebel to be awarded the Chucky Mullins Courage Award, which goes to a standout defensive player each year. The award honors the late Chucky Mullins, who had his Ole Miss career come to an end during the 1989 Homecoming game against Vanderbilt when he was paralyzed after making a tackle. After returning to his studies at Ole Miss, Mullins passed away May 6, 1991. Youngblood wears the No. 38 jersey in Mullins' honor this season.

FREEZE'S WEEKLY RADIO SHOW ON MONDAYS

Ole Miss head coach **Hugh Freeze's** weekly radio show, RebTalk, airs live each Monday of the regular season from 7-8 p.m. CT on the IMG Ole Miss Radio Network. The show, which is hosted by the "Voice of the Rebels" **David Kellum** and includes special guests, will broadcast from Buffalo Wild Wings on West Jackson Ave. in Oxford.

LANDSHARK

At Ole Miss, “Landshark” is a term adopted by the Rebel football team’s defensive unit. As part of that identity, defensive players will celebrate big plays by putting a hand to their forehead in the shape of a shark fin. A battle cry of “fins up” also contributes to the players’ persona.

With the popularity of both the players and the “Landshark” celebration, Ole Miss student-athletes from other sports have even performed the hand gesture as a tribute to their fellow Rebels on the football team.

Roots of the “Landshark” at Ole Miss date back to 2008. After four straight losing seasons, the Rebel football team returned to national prominence with a 9-4 record and a victory over 7th-ranked Texas Tech in the Cotton Bowl. Leading the charge was a defensive squad that ranked fourth in the nation in rushing defense and included All-Americans Peria Jerry and Greg Hardy and eventual All-SEC standout Jerrell Powe.

The term “Landshark” originated that season from senior linebacker Tony Fein, an Army veteran who served a one-year tour in the Iraq War before arriving in Oxford. A two-year letterman after transferring from Scottsdale (Ariz.) Community College, Fein was the 2008 recipient of the Pat Tillman Award by the Military Order of the Purple Heart. Fein passed away in October 2009, but his legacy at Ole Miss continues through the “Landshark.”

FLORIDA STATE NOTES

GENERAL: This was the second all-time meeting between Ole Miss and Florida State, and the series is now tied at one win apiece ... Attendance at Camping World Stadium was a sellout crowd of 63,042 ... Ole Miss is now 90-27-5 all-time in season openers and lost for the first time since 2011 vs. BYU ... The Rebels drop their first game against a ranked opponent since last year's Memphis game (Oct. 17) ... They are 68-150-2 all-time against ranked foes and 10-13 under **Hugh Freeze** ... Freeze has now led the team to a 3-4 record against top-five foes in his tenure ... Ole Miss falls to 27-5 under Freeze when leading at the half and 29-6 under Freeze when scoring first.

OFFENSE: Senior QB **Chad Kelly** completed 21 of 39 passes for 313 yards with four TDs and three interceptions ... Kelly has now led Ole Miss to a score on its first offensive series in eight of his 14 starts ... Kelly now has six career games with 3+ touchdown passes and nine with 300+ passing yards ... Senior TE **Evan Engram** had a career-high nine catches for 121 yards and a TD ... It was his fourth career 100-yard receiving game ... Engram moved into a tie for fourth place on the all-time list of touchdown catches by an Ole Miss tight end, with eight ... Junior WR **Damore'ea Stringfellow** had three catches for 41 yards and a touchdown, the first score of the season for the Rebels ... Redshirt-freshman WR **Van Jefferson** had two catches for 23 yards and his first career touchdown, a 20-yard grab in the end zone ... True freshman WR **D.K. Metcalf** had an impressive first career touchdown, tipping the ball to himself over the defender's head for a 3-yard score ... Senior RB **Akeem Judd** rushed eight times for 44 yards, including an 11-yard TD run for his fourth career TD.

DEFENSE: Sophomore DB **Zedrick Woods** led the team in tackles with a career-high 11 ... His previous high was four at Mississippi State last year ... Senior LB **Terry Caldwell** posted a career-high 10 tackles ... Senior DB **Carlos Davis** had a career-high eight tackles ... Junior LB **DeMarquis Gates** made seven tackles and collected his first two career sacks ... Junior DE **Marquis Haynes** made six tackles with a sack, bringing his career total to 18.5 sacks.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Juniors **Gary Wunderlich** (3 punts) and **Will Gleeson** (1 punt) both averaged 44.0 yards on their punts.

WOFFORD NOTES

GENERAL: This was the first all-time meeting between Ole Miss and Wofford ... The Rebels have won 12 of 13 games against FCS since 2005, including six straight ... Attendance at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium was 64,232, a school record and biggest college football crowd in state of Mississippi history ... Ole Miss improves to 28-5 under **Hugh Freeze** when leading at the half and 30-6 under Freeze when scoring first ... The Rebels improve their record after a loss under Freeze to 11-7 ... Ole Miss improves to 30-3 under Freeze when it rushes for 150 or more yards in a game.

OFFENSE: Nine different Rebel receivers caught a pass in the game, and five different players scored a touchdown (four receiving, one rushing) ... Senior QB **Chad Kelly** completed 20 of 27 passes for 219 yards, three touchdowns and no interceptions ... Freshman WR **D.K. Metcalf** caught a 10-yard touchdown, his second straight game with a score, before leaving the game with a foot injury ... Junior WR **Markell Pack** had three catches for 46 and a TD, his fourth career score ... Senior RB **Akeem Judd** led the running backs with 11 carries for 64 yards ... Redshirt-freshman QB **Jason Pellerin** made his Ole Miss debut in the game and completed 2 of 3 passes for 23 yards, a TD and an INT, while rushing six times for 27 yards and another TD ... Freshman WR **A.J. Brown** had two catches for 15 yards and his first career score ... Senior WR **Quincy Adebeyejo** caught one pass for a 6-yard touchdown, his 11th career score.

DEFENSE: Graduate LB **Rommel Mageo** made his first start for the Rebels and led the team with eight tackles ... Freshman S **Deontay Anderson** added seven tackles in his second career game ... Sophomore DT **Jordan Herbert** recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter.

SPECIAL TEAMS: Junior K **Gary Wunderlich** converted a 40-yard field goal on the Rebels' opening drive of the game, his first attempt and make of the year ... Senior DB **Carlos Davis** returned a kickoff for a career-best 62-yard return ... Redshirt-freshman WR **Van Jefferson** saw his first action at punt returner, making one return for 6 yards.

ALABAMA NOTES

@COACHHUGHFREEZE

Hugh Freeze refers to his tenure at Ole Miss as a “journey.” Suffice it to say the journey has moved at a quicker pace than even Freeze could have imagined.

A Mississippi native, inspirational leader and one of the nation's top rising coaches, Freeze was the first choice to return championships to Ole Miss Football and was introduced as the Rebels' 37th head coach on December 5, 2011.

In the time since Freeze inherited a team coming off a two-win season and 14 straight Southeastern Conference losses, the Rebels have made four straight bowl appearances and won three of them. The team's win total under Freeze has risen as consistently as possible — from seven in 2012 to eight in 2013, nine in 2014 to 10 last season.

Freeze is the first coach in school history to guide the Rebels to a bowl game in each of his first four seasons, including wins in the BBVA Compass, Music City and Sugar. Ole Miss is one of five programs in the country (along with Alabama, Florida State, Michigan State and Ohio State) to make consecutive New Year's Six bowl appearances in the first two years of the College Football Playoff system.

Freeze's 34 wins in his first four seasons at Ole Miss — which include a number of landmark victories over programs such as Alabama, LSU and Texas — are the most by a Rebel head coach in his first four seasons. He and Alabama's Nick Saban are the only current coaches with a .500 or better record against every other SEC West team.

Freeze's teams have shattered most of the offensive school records and had the nation's No. 1 scoring defense in 2014. His high-flying tempo offense has helped shine the college football spotlight brightly on quarterbacks Bo Wallace and Chad Kelly and receivers Donte Moncrief, Laquon Treadwell, Evan Engram and others.

Seven Ole Miss players have been selected in the NFL Draft since Freeze arrived as head coach, including 2016 first-rounders Laremy Tunsil, Treadwell and Robert Nkemdiche.

Freeze and his staff have collected four straight recruiting classes ranked among the top 15 in the nation. The 2013 and 2016 classes were both among the top five in the country, which makes them the best two classes in recorded program history.

A total of 97 players have earned their University of Mississippi degrees since Freeze's arrival, while the 2016 spring semester saw the team earn its highest cumulative grade point average in recorded history. Freeze's staff has brought stability to the program's academic standing and has emphasized the value of good character and brotherly love throughout all aspects of the team. Many players volunteer their time to community service projects in the Oxford area, and 19 players have participated in mission trips to Panama and Haiti over the last three spring breaks.

Freeze, a noted speaker and recruiter throughout his career, has enjoyed success at nearly every coaching level over the past 20 years, from high school to NAIA to FBS, and each stop has featured a high-scoring offense and the ability to motivate young people. Before returning to Oxford, the former Ole Miss assistant experienced a record-setting run at Arkansas State. With Freeze as head coach in 2011, the Red Wolves captured the Sun Belt Conference championship and became just the third school in Sun Belt history to finish undefeated in league play with an 8-0 mark. In the best debut season ever by an A-State head coach, Freeze became just the 14th FBS first-year head coach to win 10 regular season games. The Sun Belt Coach of the Year also returned ASU to a bowl game for the first time since 2005.

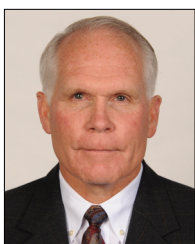

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — For the second straight year, Ole Miss and Alabama delivered an instant classic on the gridiron. For the second straight year, Ole Miss took down Alabama. Behind five turnovers forced by the Landshark defense, the No. 11 Rebels won 43-37, defeating the No. 2 Crimson Tide in consecutive seasons for the first time in program history.

Playing a night game on the road in front of a capacity crowd of 101,821 at Bryant-Denny Stadium, Ole Miss led the entire game and left Tuscaloosa victorious for the first time since 1988.

Ole Miss scored at least 43 points for the third consecutive game, marking the first time that feat has ever been accomplished in program history. The 43 points was also the most the Rebels have ever scored in a game played in Tuscaloosa.

Junior quarterback Chad Kelly was calm, cool and collected as he played away from Vaught-Hemingway Stadium for the first time in his Rebel career. He finished the evening completing 18-of-33 passes for 341 yards and three touchdowns through the air, while also rushing for a score. Kelly and the Ole Miss offense did not turn the ball over once and recorded 24 points off of the five Alabama turnovers.

A.J. Moore was in on two of the turnovers, recovering the fumble on the opening kick and forcing a fumble on another kick return later in the first half. Trae Elston picked off a pass for the third straight game, while teammate C.J. Johnson has made an interception in back-to-back games. Tony Bridges' interception with 2:36 left in the game was the fifth and final turnover forced by the Landshark defense.

Cody Core caught four passes for a career-high 123 yards, including a 73-yard TD. Laquon Treadwell hauled in a team-high five passes for 80 yards, his last catch a 24-yarder in the end zone that ended up being the game-winning score.

Alabama recorded 503 yards of total offense led by running back Derrick Henry and quarterback Jake Coker. Henry rushed 23 times for 127 yards.

OXFORD, Miss. — A school-record crowd of 64,232 showed for No. 18 Ole Miss' home opener at newly renovated Vaught-Hemingway Stadium and the Rebels certainly did not disappoint the assembled throng.

Kelly wasted little time getting the Rebels on the board after he guided Ole Miss 42 yards on the opening drive of the game and kicker Gary Wunderlich connected from 40 yards out to give the Rebels a 3-0 lead less than two minutes into the game.

After the Landshark Defense forced a Terrier three-and-out, the Rebel offense took over on their own 19-yard line. Kelly marched Ole Miss 81 yards capped by a five-yard touchdown strike to Markell Pack that gave the Rebels a 10-0 lead with 7:11 to go in the first quarter. Kelly completed 20-of-27 passes and threw no picks in three quarters of football, while Pack finished with three grabs for 46 yards and a score.

Following another Wofford punt, Kelly led the Rebels on an 11 play, 92-scoring scoring drive culminating in a 10-yard touchdown pass to freshman wideout D.K. Metcalf to put the Rebels up 17-0 in the second quarter.

Senior running back Akeem Judd led the Rebel rushing attack with 64 yards on 11 carries as Ole Miss rushed for 174 yards on the ground. Junior Damore'ea Stringfellow posted a team-high five receptions for 40 yards, while redshirt freshman receiver Van Jefferson added 4 catches for 31 yards. Nine different Ole Miss receivers recorded a reception in the game.

The Ole Miss defense limited the Terriers to just 305 yards of total offense and only 72 yards through the air. It marked the fewest passing yards the Rebels have allowed in a game since giving up 67 yards passing to Presbyterian in 2014. Senior transfer linebacker Rommel Mageo led the team with eight tackles, including three solo stops, and the Rebels posted 6.0 TFLs as a team.

Pellerin found freshman A.J. Brown in the corner of the endzone from 12-yards out with 6:16 to go in the fourth quarter. Pellerin threw for 23 yards and that score in mop up duty and added 27 yards and a TD on the ground. The Terriers added a 50-yard field goal with 2:28 left for the final score of 38-13.

#4 FLORIDA STATE 45, #11 OLE MISS 34

ORLANDO, Fla. — In front of a crowd of 63,042 at Camping World Stadium, No. 11 Ole Miss jumped out to a 28-6 over No. 4 Florida State, but the Seminoles took advantage of four Rebel turnovers and scored 30 unanswered points to down the Rebels 45-34.

Senior quarterback Chad Kelly was 21-of-39 through the air for 313 yards, including four touchdowns and three interceptions. Classmate Evan Engram caught a career-high nine passes for 121 yards and one touchdown in the setback. Freshmen D.K. Metcalf and Van Jefferson caught touchdown passes from Kelly, the first of their respective careers. Akeem Judd led Ole Miss (0-1) in rushing, accounting for 44 yards.

Ole Miss marched straight down the field to begin the game, leaning on the strong arm of Kelly, who went 4-for-5 for 59 yards on the drive, including a 36-yard hook-up with freshman A.J. Brown on third down. Kelly found Engram twice for 20 yards on the drive before hitting Damore'ea Stringfellow on a three-yard slant for the touchdown.

Kelly accounted for 267 of the Rebels' 312 yards in the first half, throwing for 215 (14-of-23, 3 TDs) and rushing for 52. On defense, Ole Miss limited FSU to 14 yards during the opening half.

Another FSU score put the Rebels in an eight-point deficit heading into the final 15 minutes of play. Another FSU field goal pushed the margin to 11 points, but a 49-second drive put Ole Miss within single digits. Kelly threw a bomb to Engram for 42 yards to get the Rebels into Seminole territory, and a 20-yard pass to Van Jefferson resulted in a touchdown. Quickly, the Red and Blue had some life left with 12:09 left in the contest.

However, FSU continued to move the ball down the field. Aguayo added two more field goals as the Rebels were unable to complete the comeback, dropping the season opener 45-34.

OXFORD, Miss. — A school-record crowd of 64,232 showed for No. 18 Ole Miss' home opener at newly renovated Vaught-Hemingway Stadium and the Rebels certainly did not disappoint the assembled throng.

Kelly wasted little time getting the Rebels on the board after he guided Ole Miss 42 yards on the opening drive of the game and kicker Gary Wunderlich connected from 40 yards out to give the Rebels a 3-0 lead less than two minutes into the game.

After the Landshark Defense forced a Terrier three-and-out, the Rebel offense took over on their own 19-yard line. Kelly marched Ole Miss 81 yards capped by a five-yard touchdown strike to Markell Pack that gave the Rebels a 10-0 lead with 7:11 to go in the first quarter. Kelly completed 20-of-27 passes and threw no picks in three quarters of football, while Pack finished with three grabs for 46 yards and a score.

Following another Wofford punt, Kelly led the Rebels on an 11 play, 92-scoring scoring drive culminating in a 10-yard touchdown pass to freshman wideout D.K. Metcalf to put the Rebels up 17-0 in the second quarter.

Senior running back Akeem Judd led the Rebel rushing attack with 64 yards on 11 carries as Ole Miss rushed for 174 yards on the ground. Junior Damore'ea Stringfellow posted a team-high five receptions for 40 yards, while redshirt freshman receiver Van Jefferson added 4 catches for 31 yards. Nine different Ole Miss receivers recorded a reception in the game.

The Ole Miss defense limited the Terriers to just 305 yards of total offense and only 72 yards through the air. It marked the fewest passing yards the Rebels have allowed in a game since giving up 67 yards passing to Presbyterian in 2014. Senior transfer linebacker Rommel Mageo led the team with eight tackles, including three solo stops, and the Rebels posted 6.0 TFLs as a team.

Pellerin found freshman A.J. Brown in the corner of the endzone from 12-yards out with 6:16 to go in the fourth quarter. Pellerin threw for 23 yards and that score in mop up duty and added 27 yards and a TD on the ground. The Terriers added a 50-yard field goal with 2:28 left for the final score of 38-13.
