FACILITIES

As part of the Crimson Tradition Fund facility upgrades, Alabama's home golf course — Ol' Colony — has some recent additions that serve to turn the course into the Tide's real home. Construction took place in 2004 on the Jerry Pate Golf Center, UA's private practice facility and clubhouse that includes coaches offices, a fully furnished locker room and a team room. Ol' Colony, a course designed by former UA men's golf standout Jerry Pate, serves as the team's home course. In addition to its "home" course, the Alabama women's golf team benefits from the opportunity of being able to access several golf courses in the Tuscaloosa area for practice, including NorthRiver Yacht Club and Indian Hills Country Club.

WOMEN'S GOLF PREVIEW

After making the program's 11th consecutive NCAA championships appearance and capturing the school's third Southeastern Conference championship a season ago, Alabama women's golf coach Mic Potter has a one-word message to his team entering the 2016-17 season – Prepare.

"We need to prepare for the ultimate goal, which is the NCAA Championship," Potter said. "You always have to keep going forward, you can never allow yourself to become stagnant. Everything we do this year is geared toward getting into match play and winning matches. Sometimes it might be something they don't want to do, but everything we do has a purpose. Our main objective is how can we save shots, how can we shoot the lowest score possible, how we can manage the golf course, and just play one shot at a time?"

Alabama returns five letterwinners from 2015-16, including three players who were a big part of last season's SEC championship team – sophomore Cheyenne Knight and juniors Lakareber Abe and Nicole Morales. Knight posted one of the top seasons by a freshman in program history, earning Women's Golf Coaches Association Freshman of the Year honors to go along with consensus All-America recognition.

"I've said it before, Cheyenne has clearly exceeded expectations," Potter said. "To come in as National Freshmen of the Year and to do what she did last year is something you really build your program around. She is a leader on our team, she has a résumé to demand that and you need a player like that – someone who has excelled at the highest level – who can tell all the other girls how she did it and what they can become if they watch and listen."

Abe and Morales return considerable postseason experience as well, with both having played in the SEC championship, the Shoal Creek regional and NCAA championship a season ago.

"We expect a lot from Lakareber and Nicole," Potter said. "they are the best class we've ever signed. Nicole was number one in the class nationally and Lakareber was number three. They both are just ready to break loose. Lakareber did at times last year and Nicole made great progress throughout the spring. They both have competed at the highest level, and I expect them to continue to this year."

Also returning are seniors Mia Landegren and Cammie Gray, and Potter is counting on the duo to provide solid leadership for the underclassmen.

"Cammie and Mia both have a world of untapped potential," Potter said. "They are both long hitters, they both have a lot of experience competing, qualifying and even in day-to-day drills. They've competed against the best, like former All-American Emma Talley and some of the girls that have gone before them. Anytime you get good quality competition it's a good experience and they should be able to build on that and be better than they've ever been."

This year's roster will be strengthened by a trio of newcomers who bring a wide range of skills to the program – freshmen Kristen Gillman and Sarah Pabst and sophomore transfer Lauren Stephenson. Gillman won the U.S. Amateur as a 16-year-old and is the No. 2 ranked junior player in the United States. Pabst comes to The Capstone as a highly-decorated junior player as well. Stephenson became the first women's golfer in Clemson history to qualify for the NCAA championships in 2015.

"Blending them in is a good problem to have," Potter said. "Lauren clearly is one of the best players in the country after qualifying for the NCAA Championships an in individual. Kristen may have the best resume of any incoming freshmen in our program's history and Sarah brings an impressive resume as well."

The Tide said goodbye to a pair of highly-decorated seniors at the end of the 2015-16 season in Emma Talley and Janie Jackson and Potter knows they will be tough to replace.

"Emma was one of the best players in program history," Potter said. "She is one of only five girls to win the NCAA Championship and U.S. Amateur, so she meant a tremendous amount to us. Janie transferred here her sophomore year and filled a big hole."

Talley won Alabama's first individual national championship when she captured medalist honors as a junior at the 2015 NCAA Championships at the Concession Golf Club in Bradenton, Fla. In 2013, she won the U.S. Amateur at Charleston Country Club in Charleston, S.C. Jackson transferred to The Capstone from Arizona following her freshman year and went on to play in three SEC and NCAA championships in her three seasons with the Tide.

Alabama will open the fall season Sept. 16-18 at the Mason Rudolph Championship at the Vanderbilt Legends Club, site of the Tide's first national championship in 2012. Potter's squad won the tournament to open the season a year ago, with Abe earning individual medalist honors. The fall schedule also includes the Schooner Fall Classic in Norman, Okla. (Sept. 24-26), the Ruth's Chris Tar Heel Invitational (Oct. 14-16) in Chapel Hill, N.C. and The Landfall Tradition in Wilmington, N.C. (Oct. 28-30).

The spring schedule kicks off with the Northrop Grumman Regional Challenge (Feb. 12-14) in Palos Verdes Estates, Calif., followed by the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate (March 3-5) in Hilton Head, S.C. Alabama also won the Rucker last season with Knight capturing her first individual title as a collegian. The remainder of the spring schedule features the Bryan National Collegiate in Browns Summit, N.C. (March 31-April 2) and the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic in Athens, Ga. (April 7-9).

Postseason play begins with the SEC Championship April 21-23 at Greystone Golf and Country Club in Birmingham, where the Tide will be looking to defend its 2015 title. The NCAA regional round will take place May 8-10 at four sites

around the country with the NCAA Championships scheduled for May 19-24 at Rich Harvest Farms in Sugar Grove, Ill.

Potter feels the national schedule provides some good tests for the Tide as it strives for another trip to the NCAA Championships this season.

"Every tournament is a national championship," Potter said. "It's a chance to compete, it's a chance to use the golf course so that we can shoot the lowest score possible. It's a chance to win. Any time you get a chance to win it's a good thing and it can snowball into greater things."

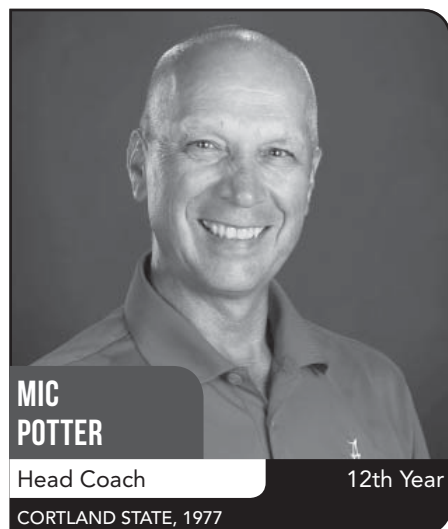

Alabama head coach Mic Potter added national champion to his resume in 2012 and begins his 12th season with the Crimson Tide and 33rd overall with another talented roster for the 2016-17 season.

Potter already had established a Hall-of-Fame legacy before he arrived in Tuscaloosa thanks to his impressive work building Furman into a national power but his work over the past 11 years at Alabama has been historic, culminating with the school's first national championship in 2012. Three seasons later, Potter helped guide Emma Talley to the individual NCAA Championship to cap off the 2014-15 season, making her the first NCAA medalist in the program's history.

Potter, who came to the Capstone after 22 years at Furman, led the Tide to its second NCAA appearance in program history in his first year at Alabama and repeated the feat in 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015 and 2016. His 2012 national championship and 11 straight NCAA Championships berths only reaffirmed his status as one of the most accomplished coaches in women's collegiate golf. His reclamation project in Tuscaloosa is one of the most impressive turnarounds in collegiate golf history.

With the recent success, the honors continue to pile up for Potter, who helped the Crimson Tide develop into a national power in the ultra-competitive SEC. The veteran coach has won 14 Conference Coach of the Year awards, including six in the SEC.

Throughout his career, Potter has developed a reputation for being an excellent teacher of the game as well as a builder of elite college programs. His student-athletes consistently have performed at a high level both in the classroom and on the course, with several carrying that level of excellence into the professional ranks. Potter's former players who have gone on to careers in the LPGA include the legendary Dottie Pepper (who starred for his Furman teams) and several recent Alabama players, namely Kathleen Ekey, Jenny Suh, Brooke Pancake and Jennifer Kirby.

The 2015-16 season saw the Crimson Tide win its third Southeastern Conference championship under Potter and qualify for an 11th-consecutive NCAA Championships berth. Cheyenne Knight was named the NCAA Freshman of the Year by the Women's Golf Coaches Association (WGCA) and a First Team All-American by the WGCA and Golfweek. Senior Emma Talley was tabbed a First Team All-American by the WGCA and joined Knight as a first team SEC all-conference honoree.

The 2014-15 season marked the 10th consecutive NCAA berth for the Crimson Tide. Alabama finished 14th overall at the NCAA Championships. But the highlight of the season was undoubtedly Talley's triumph to claim the individual crown, finishing three-under par for the tournament to bring home the NCAA title. She was named a first team All-American by both the WGCA and Golfweek. Talley also earned the Honda Award for women's golf, the second player in program history to do so (Pancake, 2012). Freshman Lakareber Abe was selected to the 2015 SEC All-Freshman Team.

Stephanie Meadow led the 2013-14 team that finished ninth at the NCAA Championships and won The Landfall Tradition. Meadow became the school's all-time leading scorer and the program's first four-time First Team All-American. She was also named the SEC Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the second time. She was named the NCAA Elite 89 Award winner. Talley garnered honorable mention All-America honors and helped lead

the United States to victory at the Curtis Cu while Meadow played for the Great Britain and Ireland team.

The Crimson Tide's 2012-13 season was another for the record books as the program captured its second SEC championship and second NCAA East Regional title. Alabama won a school-record seven events, including six of eight on the spring schedule. Potter was named the SEC Coach of the Year and the SkyCaddie WGCA East Region Coach of the Year.

The 2012-13 team saw three players garner All-America honors, with Meadow a consensus first-team selection. Talley was a second-team pick by the NGCA and Jennifer Kirby earned honorable mention accolades. Meadow also became the first Alabama player to earn SEC Player of the Year honors and the third in conference history to also be named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year in the same season. Talley became the third Tide golfer to earn league Freshman of the Year honors. Hannah Collier garnered second team All-SEC recognition, along with Talley and Kirby.

The team's first win of the 2012-13 season came at the Betsy Rawls Longhorn Invitational, when they tied for first with Florida. The Tide then posted wins at the Lady Puerto Rico Classic, the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate, the Gator Women's Invitational and the PING/ASU Invitational along with SECs and NCAA Regional Championship.

The 2011-12 team captured its national title with a one-stroke victory over Southern California at the Vanderbilt Legends Club. The Crimson Tide spent most of that season ranked second in the polls and finished third in the SEC before tying for fourth at the NCAA East Regional leading up to NAAs. The Tide earlier posted team victories at the SEC/Pac-12 Challenge, the Darius Rucker Intercollegiate and the Liz Murphey Collegiate Classic. Alabama finished second on three other occasions and finished outside the top four only once in 2011-12.

The 2011-12 season saw three Alabama players, Pancake, Kirby and Meadow, earn First Team All-America honors. Pancake won the Honda Award, presented to the nation's top collegiate golfer, while also being named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the third time, the SEC Female Athlete of the Year and the CoSIDA Capital One Academic All-American of the Year. Pancake (United States) and Meadow

(Great Britain and Ireland) also participated in the Curtis Cup at Nairn in Scotland to cap the historic 2011-12 season.

Alabama's 2010-11 team turned in an outstanding season as the Crimson Tide continued its climb into the elite of women's collegiate golf. The Tide spent the entire season in the top five with a school-record five wins -- NCAA Fall Preview, Tar Heel Invitational, Lady Puerto Rico Classic, Liz Murphey Classic and the NCAA East Regional -- before tying for eighth at the NCAA Championship.

Two Alabama players captured medalist honors during the 2010-11 season. Meadow, then a freshman, had a school-record three wins (Lady Puerto Rico Classic, Sugar Bowl Intercollegiate and NCAA East Regional). Pancake won the Tar Heel Invitational in the fall of 2010 with an 11-under-par 206 while the team set the school record with a 28-under-par 836.

Meadow and Pancake were selected as 2011 First Team All-Americans while Camilla Lennarth garnered third-team honors. The Tide also had three first team All-SEC selections (Meadow, Pancake and Lennarth) and one second-team choice (Kirby). Potter was named the 2011 SEC Coach of the Year, Pancake the Student-Athlete of the Year and Meadow was the Co-Freshman of the Year.

The 2010 SEC Championship was a springboard for the program's best NCAA Championship finish to date, a third-place showing that was only four shots off the winning score. Alabama also captured a team win at the Lady Puerto Rico Classic.

The Tide had three players finish in the top 15 individually at the 2010 NAAs, with Kirby tied for seventh, Pancake 12th and Lennarth tied for 13th. That trio garnered All-America honors, with Lennarth earning second-team accolades while Kirby and Pancake were honorable mention selections.

Lennarth and Kirby also were First Team All-SEC selections, with Kirby adding the 2010 SEC Freshman of the Year. Pancake was a Second Team All-SEC selection and the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year. She also was honored with the NCAA Elite 88 Award at the NCAA Championship as the player in the field with the highest grade-point average (4.0). Potter was named the SEC and NGCA East Region Coach of the Year.

Potter's 2009-10 team set several school records. Lennarth set the single-season scoring record with a 72.59 average and Kirby broke the freshman scoring mark with a 73.06 average, shattering the mark of 74.06 set by Pancake in 2008-09. The team set a 54-hole scoring

record with a 4-under-par 848 to clinch the SEC Championship. Two Alabama NCAA scoring records also fell with the Tide posting a 5-over-par 1,157 over 72 holes at the NCAA Championship on the Dye Course at Country Club of Landfall in Wilmington, N.C., and Kirby's individual 72-hole scoring mark of 4-under 284.

Potter's 2008-09 team was a fixture in the top 10 nationally. The Tide finished the year 11th at the NCAA Championships while being ranked eighth in the final NGCA Coaches' Poll and seventh in the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index. The Tide captured their fifth tournament victory under Potter's guidance in 2009 at the First Market Bank Intercollegiate. Alabama also tied for second at the SEC Championships and then was runner-up at the NCAA East Regional. The Tide's fifth trip to the NCAA Finals in 2009 produced another improvement with an 11th-place finish.

Alabama had two players, Ekey and Lennarth, earn first team All-SEC honors in 2009 while Pancake was selected to the league's All-Freshman Team and awarded second team All-SEC recognition. Ekey and Lennarth garnered 2009 honorable mention All-America accolades, with Ekey, Lennarth and Pancake all earning NGCA All-East Region honors.

The 2007-08 season saw Alabama put together what was the program's most successful season to date. The Tide earned its third straight berth to the NAAs and finished 12th at the 2008 NCAA Championship. Alabama won three tournaments in 2007-08, including the Crimson Tide Classic in record-breaking fashion. The Tide turned in a school-record 54-hole score of 861 (-3) at the Ol' Colony Golf Club. Alabama shot a final-round score of 279 (-9), also a school record. Five Tide golfers finished in the top 10 with Ekey carding a school record and women's course record score of 65 (-7) to finish with a 54-hole score of 203 (-13) and medalist honors.

The Crimson Tide also earned tournament titles at the 2007 Wildcat Fall Invitational with a score of 889 and at the 2008 Lady Puerto Rico Classic. After the Classic, Sarah Sturm was named the Golf World National Player of the Week. Ekey went on to earn All-American honors in her first season at the Capstone (2008) and broke Suh's single-season record for stroke average by posting a 73.30.

The 2006-07 campaign saw the Tide take another step forward in the development of the program under Potter's guidance. Alabama recorded five top-five finishes, including a runner-up showing at the Derby Invitational. For the second straight year the Crimson Tide earned a berth in the NCAA East Regional

and finished seventh to advance to the NCAA Championship Finals for only the third time. Suh earned honorable mention All-America honors and became a two-time, first team All-SEC honoree after averaging 73.88 strokes per round.

Potter made an impact from the start. In his first season (2005-06), the legendary coach led his team to a tournament championship in his very first outing by winning Alabama's own Ann Rhoads Invitational. The 2005-06 team also recorded two top-five finishes during the spring season. After qualifying for the 2006 NCAA East Regional, the Crimson Tide put together a postseason run by defeating Virginia in a playoff to advance to the school's second-ever NCAA Championship.

Suh earned first team NGCA All-America honors in 2005-06 after shattering the school record at the time with a 73.44 stroke average. Looking back on Potter's resume, it comes as no surprise that he had his first Tide team competing for a national championship.

On June 17, 2005, The University of Alabama named the 1994 NGCA Hall of Fame honoree as its new women's golf coach. By doing so, the Crimson Tide added one of the most illustrious names in women's golf to its golf heritage.

Potter proved to be one of the collegiate golf's outstanding teachers and coaches while guiding Furman, a school competing in the Southern Conference, to national prominence in his 22-year tenure with the Paladins. He also served for 10 years as Furman's Director of Intercollegiate Golf. Potter guided Furman to 15 NCAA Championship berths and six top-10 national finishes, including an NCAA runner-up performance in 1987. He has yet to coach a season in which his team has not reached NCAA Regional competition, a streak dating back to 1993, the first season in which the regional format was established.

Potter's coaching accomplishments stand alone as an indication of the abilities of the Tide's mentor. In addition to these outstanding achievements, his players have recorded astounding success at both the collegiate level and in the professional ranks.

The ability to build and maintain a program certainly are among Potter's strengths when considering the amazing run of success he had throughout his career at Furman. Potter took the school, with an approximate enrollment of 2,500 students, into the upper tier of women's golf schools, leading the Paladins to unprecedented heights.

Potter was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year eight times and led his

Furman teams to 36 tournament titles while his Tide teams have captured 27 tournament wins, which puts him among the leaders for all active women's golf coaches with 63 total victories. To put that remarkable statistic in perspective, the Alabama women's golf program had won only 19 team tournament titles through the beginning of the 2005-06 season, a span of 31 years.

Led by Potter, the Paladins won 10 Southern Conference Championships since the tournament's inception in 1994, including the 2004-05 championship.

Potter has coached 38 WGCA All-Americans, 36 WGCA All-Scholar Team selections, 66 all-conference selections, seven players to 17 first team All-SEC awards, 14 conference players of the year and seven conference freshmen of the year.

One of the most important standards of success for any coach in major collegiate athletics is the ability to place players into the professional ranks while guiding them to a degree. Measuring Potter by these standards again places him among the very best in the nation. Since Potter's arrival at Alabama, six of his players have earned their LPGA Tour card, with Hannah Collier, Kathleen Ekey, Jennifer Kriby, Stephanie Meadow and Brooke Pancake all full-time members in 2016. Meadow finished third at the 2014 U.S. Women's Open and earned her LPGA Tour card for the 2015 season.

In 2016, Potter added an Olympian to the list of his former players as Meadow represented Ireland in the inaugural women's Olympic golf tournament at the 2016 Games in Rio.

In the exceedingly competitive LPGA atmosphere, Potter's former players have enjoyed long, successful careers in professional golf. Through the end of the 2016 season, former Potter pupils had amassed 90-plus seasons on tour. Pepper - a former Furman standout and Paladin Hall-of-Famer - had an illustrious LPGA career, winning 17 events, including the 1992 and 1999 Kraft Nabisco Championships. She earned more than \$5 million in career winnings before ending her 20-year professional career in 2003.

By any standard, Potter has proven to be one of the best women's golf coaches in the nation for more than three decades. He has built successful programs and maintained that standard by recruiting and cultivating talented players who advance to the professional ranks and obtain their degrees.

A 1977 graduate of Cortland State University, Potter majored in physical education while earning four varsity letters: three in soccer and one in golf. He is married to the former Kim O'Branski of Ithaca, N.Y. The couple has two sons, Ryan and Corey, and two granddaughters, Anna and Caroline.

management, coordination of golf operations and recruiting.

"Susan is a tremendous asset to this program," head coach Mic Potter said. "Her experience as a player and her ability to relate to our athletes make her an invaluable asset. I'm thankful to have a coach with her ability in the program."

During her first 13 years at the Capstone, Rosenstiel has mentored numerous top players who have combined for 17 All-America honors and 25 All-SEC accolades. Her career with the Tide includes the 2012 NCAA Championship, 11 NCAA Championships appearances and three SEC Championships.

Rosenstiel, formerly Susan Conger, began her collegiate playing career at the University of Tennessee, playing two seasons (1992-94) for the Lady Vols. She then transferred to the University of Florida, where she finished her playing career (1994-97) as a Gator.

During her stay at Florida, Rosenstiel garnered Academic All-America honors and SEC Academic Honor Roll accolades. She earned her bachelor's degree in agriculture, food and resource economics from the University of Florida in 1996 and received her master's in exercise and sports sciences, sports management in 1999.

While working on her master's, Rosenstiel spent time as an assistant with UF's College of Health and Human Performance. She also served as an intern to Florida's Associate Athletic Director and Senior Women's Administrator. After graduation, Rosenstiel was an assistant golf professional at the Tradition Golf Club in Royal Palm Beach, Fla., and then at the Turtle Point Yacht and Country Club in Killen, Ala.

The North Fort Myers, Fla., native was born on June 5, 1974, and is married to Tom Rosenstiel. The couple has two children, Henry and Elizabeth.

Head coach Mic Potter is aided at the Capstone by assistant coach Susan Rosenstiel, who is entering her 14th season on the Crimson Tide staff and 11th with Potter. A former collegiate golfer, Rosenstiel joined the Alabama coaching staff in the fall of 2003.

Rosenstiel's efforts in Tuscaloosa were honored following the 2010 season as the National Golf Coaches Association recognized her as National Assistant Coach of the Year. She brings her vast and diversified experience in women's collegiate golf to a Tide program that has shown unmatched growth during her time at the University. Rosenstiel's wealth of SEC experience includes a playing career at Tennessee and Florida, plus time on the staff at the University of Florida and as an assistant golf professional. She was also the tournament director for the 2010 SEC Championship at the North River Yacht Club in Tuscaloosa.

ALABAMA PRESIDENT DR. STUART R. BELL

Dr. Stuart R. Bell is entering his second year as president of The University of Alabama. Founded in 1831, the University is the state's flagship and a student-centered, comprehensive research university.

Dr. Bell has broad administrative experience and is a 30-year veteran of higher education. He previously served at UA for 16 years where he founded and directed an interdisciplinary research center.

"Our students continue to excel and represent the Capstone in the classroom, as well as in the laboratory, on the stage and on the field in ways that make us proud," Bell said near the end of the spring 2016 semester. "This is certainly an exciting time to be here at The University of Alabama."

Immediately prior to becoming UA's president, Dr. Bell was executive vice president and provost at Louisiana State University. During Dr. Bell's tenure there and earlier at the University of Kansas where he served as dean of its College of Engineering, those institutions opened new facilities, and student recruitment, retention and success were emphasized.

First joining UA in 1986 as an assistant professor in the UA College of Engineering's department of mechanical engineering, Dr. Bell was named department head nine years later.

With research interest in combustion engines, Dr. Bell has expertise in alternative fuels for engines, innovative engine designs and modeling of engine and engine processes. He directed UA's Center for Advanced Vehicle Technologies.

Dr. Bell was awarded the Society of Automotive Engineers' Ralph Teetor Award for Outstanding Contributions to Research and Teaching in 1988. He was presented the T. Morris Hackney Faculty Leadership Award for the UA College of Engineering in 2001, and, in 2005, he received the Richard S. Woodbury Award from the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

An Abilene, Texas, native, Dr. Bell earned a nuclear engineering degree from Texas A&M University in 1979. He earned his master's and doctorate degrees in mechanical engineering from Texas A&M in 1981 and 1986, respectively.

He and his wife, Susan, have three adult children, Stuart, Stacy and Stephen, and one granddaughter.

BILL BATTLE

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS



William R. "Bill" Battle is in his fourth year as Director of Athletics at The University of Alabama. Since taking the job on March 22, 2013, (succeeding the late Mal Moore), Battle has not only maintained Alabama's unparalleled athletics success, but also has placed increased focus on the

primary mission of Alabama Athletics: to recruit and develop student-athletes to compete at the highest levels in intercollegiate athletics, to educate and prepare student-athletes to compete at the highest levels in life after graduation, and to accomplish both with honor and integrity.

Battle took the job as Director of Athletics at Alabama after a career as a college football coach and entrepreneur that was consistently hallmarked by innovation and foresight. During Battle's tenure, Alabama has produced two NCAA team national championships (men's golf in 2014 and football in 2015); 10 SEC team championships in six different sports (two in football, two in gymnastics, one in men's golf, women's golf, softball and women's tennis); 16 NCAA individual champions; 27 NCAA Elite Award winners; 34 Academic All-Americans (leading the nation in that category in both 2013-14 and 2014-15); and 16 NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship awardees.

Battle's vision has impacted the Alabama Athletics Department in numerous ways, particularly in revitalized fundraising efforts that directly enhance the daily experience of every Crimson Tide student-athlete. Battle spearheaded the redevelopment of Alabama's historic baseball facility, Sewell-Thomas Stadium, which opened in February, 2016. He also has led the drive for numerous other facility and departmental improvements, including a new rowing facility and plans for a new aquatics facility.

A native of Birmingham, Ala., Battle attended The University of Alabama on a football scholarship and enjoyed a successful playing career as a three-year starter at end for the Crimson Tide under legendary head coach Paul "Bear" Bryant from 1960-62. Battle was a member of Bryant's first national championship team at Alabama in 1961, and was a three-year starter. Generally regarded as the team's best end throughout his playing career, Battle came to Tuscaloosa after starring in three sports at

Birmingham's West End High School.

An excellent student, Battle earned a bachelor's degree in Biology (minor in Psychology) from The University of Alabama in 1963 and a master's degree in Education from The University of Oklahoma in 1964. He was an Academic All-SEC selection as a senior in 1962 and was selected to play in the Senior Bowl all-star game in Mobile, Ala., in January of 1963. He was named first team tight end and second team defensive end on The University of Alabama All-Decade Team of the 1960s. Alabama won three national championships in the decade (1961, 1964 and 1965).

Battle entered the coaching profession as a graduate assistant at The University of Oklahoma in 1963 under famed head coach Bud Wilkinson. In 1964 and 1965, he served as an assistant coach at the United States Military Academy while serving a two-year military tour. In 1966, he moved on to the University of Tennessee, where he served as an assistant coach under head coach Doug Dickey for four seasons (1966-69) until he was named head coach of the Volunteers in 1970. When he was named head coach, Battle was the youngest head coach in college football at the age of 28.

During his seven-year tenure as head coach (1970-76), Battle's teams went 59-22-2, finished three seasons ranked in the nation's top 10 among five top-20 finishes and won four out of five bowl games. Battle's Tennessee teams won 11 games once (1970) and at least 10 games in three different seasons (1970, 1971 and 1972). His first Tennessee team finished the season ranked fourth in both national polls. His 1971 team finished ranked ninth in both national polls and the 1972 Tennessee squad finished ranked eighth by the Associated Press and 11th in the coaches' poll.

Battle embarked on a career in the private sector after his coaching career ended. He held various positions within Circle S Industries in Selma, Ala., and served as president of two different companies, as well as vice chairman of the Circle S Holding Company Board. During his six years at Circle S, the organization grew from two companies earning \$12 million in annual sales to 10 companies earning \$60 million.

Battle founded The Collegiate Licensing Company (CLC) in 1981, and served as president and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) until 2002. He also served as chairman of the board of Licensing Partners International (LPI), which was created in 2001 to represent the licensing interests of non-collegiate sports properties, as well as corporate and entertainment properties. The companies were sold

to IMG in 2007, but he continued as chairman of CLC and consultant to IMG until March of 2013 when he was called back to Alabama.

A 1981 inductee into the Alabama Sports Hall of Fame, Battle was inducted as the first member of the charter class of the National Collegiate Licensing Association Hall of Fame in 2000. He was the recipient of the 2005 Paul W. Bryant Alumni Athlete Award at The University of Alabama and was inducted into the International Licensing Industry Merchandisers' Association (LIMA) Hall of Fame in 2008.

Battle received a National Football Foundation award in December 2008 for Outstanding Contributions to Amateur Football. In June 2010, Bill was inducted into the National Association of Collegiate Marketing Administrators' (NACMA) Hall of Fame. He was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame, receiving its Lifetime Achievement Award in 2011. He is slated to be inducted into the Sporting Goods Industry Hall of Fame in May of 2016. He currently serves on the boards of the Bryant-Jordan Student-Athlete Foundation, The University of Alabama A-Club Educational & Charitable Foundation, the Crimson Tide Foundation, and the National Football Foundation.

Battle's wife, Mary, is a summa cum laude graduate of the University of Texas' School of Nursing with a Bachelor of Science degree in nursing. She earned a Master of Science in healthcare administration from the University of Alabama-Birmingham. For many years Mary worked in the healthcare industry both in the clinical setting and for healthcare corporations that developed and managed physician provider networks including the development of strategically significant relationships with payors and business and industry.

Mary currently serves on the Arthritis Foundation National Board of Directors and is the chairperson of the Arthritis Foundation Leadership Council for the Birmingham market. She is also a member of the Volunteer Engagement Task Team for the Arthritis Foundation. In addition, Mary is an inaugural member of the UAB School of Medicine Board of Visitors and is active in fundraising activities for UAB that support research projects targeting more effective treatment for rheumatoid arthritis.

The Battles are part of UAB's Stem Cell Institute Board and are both active in their support of UAB's Department of Rheumatology. In their leisure time, the Battles enjoy life on their ranch in Georgia. Mary is an avid equestrian while Bill enjoys working on various projects around the ranch.

The Jerry Pate Golf Center at the newly renovated Ol' Colony Golf Complex provides The University of Alabama women's golf team with one of the best practice and playing facilities in collegiate golf. The Pate Golf Center is a private facility that is only utilized by the Alabama golf teams. The Pate Golf Center provides plenty of space for both the men's and women's teams with the ability to conduct full practice sessions during inclement weather. The facility has six indoor hitting bays and two indoor putting surfaces. The Pate Golf Center is also equipped with state-of-the-art teaching tools, including the V1 Swing Analysis System, the SAM Putting Lab and Trackman, which aides the coaching staff in ball flight analysis using doppler radar and club fitting. The locker rooms inside the Pate Golf Center feature tour-sized lockers and all of the amenities, while the lounge area includes comfortable seating and a large-screen television.

The Ol' Colony Golf Course was named one of the "Top Five Best New Public Courses in America" by *Golf Digest* in 2001 and *Golfweek* named it one of the top-50 municipal courses in America in 2010. The Jerry Pate-designed course is considered one of the best public courses in the nation. The course is a test for even the most advanced golfer with large bunkers, mature trees and numerous water hazards, including a 25-acre lake that challenges almost every shot.

The practice range at the Pate Golf Center, which already provides the Crimson Tide golfers all of the practice components and tools needed to develop, recently finished an expansion and renovation. The facility includes a full practice range, putting greens, a chipping area and practice bunkers. The Jerry Pate Golf Center recently added a new putting green with an expanded chipping and hitting area. The new chipping and hitting areas are complete with new bunkers and practice tees that allow players to hit their own golf balls up to 200 yards into six new target greens.

Joy McCann Culverhouse laid the groundwork for the Alabama women's golf program

As golfing matriarchs go, no program in the nation can claim a more impressive lineage than Alabama's Joy McCann Culverhouse, who claimed two Alabama Women's State Championships (1941 and 1947) and the 1961 Florida Women's Amateur title.

The University of Alabama announced on Wednesday, Feb. 18, 2015, that Hugh Culverhouse Jr. had given \$250,000 to endow a women's golf scholarship in honor of his mother, Joy McCann Culverhouse who starred at Alabama in the early 1940s.

"All of us who are associated with the women's golf program at The University of Alabama are grateful for the generosity shown by Hugh Culverhouse in honoring his mother, Joy McCann Culverhouse, with an endowed scholarship in her name," Alabama head coach Mic Potter said. "This endowment will ensure that deserving student-athletes will have the opportunity to compete at the highest level of intercollegiate golf well into the future.

"I am hoping that the publicity surrounding this endowment will serve to honor Joy McCann Culverhouse as the pioneer that she is, not only for The University of Alabama women's golf, but for women's amateur golf on the national level," Culverhouse Jr. added. "I am proud of The University of Alabama Golf program, and I want the women's team to uphold the tradition of excellence my mother brought to golf."

In an effort to further enhance the development of opportunities for the women's golf program at Alabama and expand the Crimson Tide's donor base, Culverhouse Jr. pledged to double his donation to the program (an additional \$250,000) if others responded to this gesture by donating gifts of their own totaling \$500,000.

Just six months later, Culverhouse's challenge had not only been met but exceeded. The

resulting gifts and pledges total more than \$510,000 in support of scholarships for the Crimson Tide's women's golf program. Subsequent to Mr. Culverhouse's original \$250,000 donation, several Alabama supporters answered the call and accepted the challenge, providing those additional gifts and pledges.

The catalyst for the fundraising effort was the inspirational example set by Culverhouse's mother, Joy McCann Culverhouse, who celebrated her 95th birthday in March of 2015. She set a standard of excellence in competition that has served as the benchmark for achievement in Alabama's storied women's golf program, which won the NCAA Championship in 2012 under Potter's leadership.

"As a young boy, I learned so many good life lessons from shagging golf balls while my mother prepared for tournaments and watching her determination as she played," Culverhouse explained. "Whether she won a match or lost, she was always a lady. Of course, if she lost, I spent a lot more time shagging those golf balls! Her work ethic was amazing, and it lives within me to this day. I can say, without any doubt, that work ethic has led to whatever personal success I have had. I would like Joy McCann Culverhouse to represent a high standard at the place that deserves it, and for a program that has earned it - the University of Alabama Women's Golf Team."

McCann Culverhouse, who was hailed as "Montgomery's finest links competitor in a generation," became the youngest golfer to win the Alabama Women's State Championship in 1941. McCann Culverhouse went on to capture the Alabama State Championship again in 1947 and she won the Florida Amateur title in 1961.

McCann Culverhouse actually got her start as a freshman at LSU, becoming one of the first women granted a partial scholarship for athletics and playing as the ninth player on the Tigers' men's squad. She transferred back home to The University of Alabama where she continued her golfing career, was a member of Delta Delta Delta sorority, secretary of the senior class and a member of Pan Hellenic.

McCann Culverhouse led the way for the Crimson Tide women's golf program to achieve full recognition as a varsity team prior to the

1974-75 season, creating opportunities for some of the game's greats to wear the crimson and white including Martha Jones Lang, Peggy Kirsch, Judi Schneider, Kathryn Cusick, Jenny Suh, Kathleen Ekey, Camilla Lennarth, Brooke Pancake, Jennifer Kirby, 2012 Ladies British Amateur champion Stephanie Meadow and 2015 NCAA medalist and 2013 United States Amateur champion Emma Talley.

"I am so very proud to have one of this University's finest alumnae and athletes giving back to a sport that she helped begin during her time at the Capstone," Alabama Director of Athletics Bill Battle said. "The generosity shown Joy McCann Culverhouse and her son, Hugh Culverhouse Jr., will be instrumental in the continued success of the Alabama women's golf program."

She finished her coursework at the Capstone in 1942, earning her degree in arts and sciences. McCann Culverhouse won a total of 27 championships during her golfing career. In 1997, the Florida House of Representatives passed a house resolution in recognition of her numerous contributions to the advancement of women.

"Every journey starts with the first step, and Hugh has certainly provided us with a big step," Battle stated. "Our journey to endow all of our athletics scholarships will be a long one, but we are off to a great start due to the generosity of these outstanding supporters of our athletics program. The tremendous commitment of our donors is proof positive that our larger goal of endowing all athletics scholarships is not only necessary, but also attainable."

Alabama women's golfer Lakareber Abe became the first recipient of the Joy McCann Culverhouse scholarship. Abe had an outstanding rookie season as a freshman in 2015 as she earned Southeastern Conference All-Freshman team honors, becoming only the seventh player in program history to achieve the feat. She played in 10 tournaments throughout the 2014-15 season, five of which resulted in top-20 finishes. Abe finished the season second on the team with a 75.03 scoring average, while 27 of her 31 rounds counted toward the team score.

"Lakareber Abe is an outstanding person to represent our program with the first

Culverhouse scholarship," Potter said. "She has been great in the classroom and great on the golf course, and is a terrific representative on what the Alabama women's golf program is all about."

With these donations, the Crimson Tide Foundation has now raised more than \$25.6 million since 2010 specifically for endowed scholarships.

"I am very thankful for the opportunity to be able to honor my mother in this way," Culverhouse said. "In particular, I want to thank Bill Battle, Sam Branch (Sr. Associate Athletics Director for Development), Mic Potter (UA women's golf coach) and, especially, those who accepted the challenge and matched my original donation. It's a fitting way to honor Joy, and a tremendous example of the difference we can make."

Mr. Culverhouse's effort, and the corresponding generosity inspired by it, is the latest in a series of giving examples over the last several years that are part of a larger campaign to eventually endow every athletics scholarship at Alabama. The Crimson Tide Foundation has set a goal of raising \$100 million for endowed scholarships with the knowledge that the ultimate cost of fully endowing every athletics scholarship likely will exceed \$300 million.

"First of all, what has come to my attention throughout this process is what Joy McCann Culverhouse has meant to the women's golf program at the University of Alabama," Potter

added. "Clearly, she had a great career in amateur golf. I was somewhat aware of her accomplishments before but, since Hugh has come forward with such generosity, it has been nice to be able to trace back that history and tradition by getting to know the Culverhouse family. I am also thankful for the other donations we have received. Nothing warms a coach's heart more than to get your program's scholarships fully endowed. Hugh had a vision, not only for athletics success, but academic success as well, and he has stepped forward with this program. I can't thank him enough for his loyalty and generosity."

2012 NCAA NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

Alabama shot a 19-over 1,171 to edge Southern California by one shot over 72 holes to win the program's first national championship on the Crimson Tide's eighth visit to the NCAA Finals. It was head coach Mic Potter's seventh trip to the NAAs at Alabama and his 22nd NCAA Championships appearance overall for the WGCA Hall of Famer. UA was led by senior Brooke Pancake, who finished runner-up individually at 2-under 286. The Chattanooga, Tenn., native drained a four-foot par putt on the 72nd hole to secure the national championship. The Tide carded rounds of 286 (-2), 285 (-3), 306 (+18) and 294 (+6). Pancake won the Honda Award, which goes to the nation's best women's golfer and the Crimson Tide had three First Team All-Americans in Pancake, Jennifer Kirby and Stephanie Meadow.

2015 NCAA INDIVIDUAL CHAMPION - EMMA TALLEY

Emma Talley became the first NCAA individual champion in Alabama women's golf history with 3-under 285 on Monday, May 25, 2015 at the par-72, 6,468-yard Concession Golf Club in Bradenton, Fla. Her bogey-free final round of 3-under 69 sealed the one-shot victory.

"It was just an incredible week," Talley said. "I had been playing well up to this point, and everything kind of came together and clicked just at the right time. God's blessed me with so much, and I just took it and ran with it."

Talley entered the final round with a one-stroke lead. She started on the back nine, and played the first nine at even-par, making pars on all nine holes. When her birdie putt on the par-4 18th lipped out and Duke's Leona Maguire took the lead at 1-under, Talley would answer right back with a birdie on the par-4 first.

Continuing her bogey-free round, the junior golfer from Princeton, Ky., would par No. 2, before making birdie on the par-5 third, once again countering Maguire's birdie, and moving to 2-under.

Clutch putting on the par-3 fourth, the par-3 sixth, and the par-4 eighth preserved Talley's 2-under, and she would walk to her final hole with a one-stroke lead.

On the par-4 ninth, Talley's tee shot would find the fairway bunker. She would hit seven-iron from the sand 148 yards from the hole, and would land it on the green, within eight feet of the hole.

"It was as good [a shot] as I've seen," head coach Mic Potter said. "Up-hill, and into the wind, and to be able to hit it that solid, it never left the flagstick. It was pretty impressive."

Lining up her birdie putt, the horns sounded and play was suspended for 52 minutes for lightning in the area. After the delay, Talley would sink the putt, to close the first, and one of only two, bogey-free rounds of the championships at 3-under 69.

"I came back out [from the clubhouse], and all the nerves hit me again," Talley said. "It was really nerve-racking, but I think my past experiences really helped me be able to take care of that pressure."

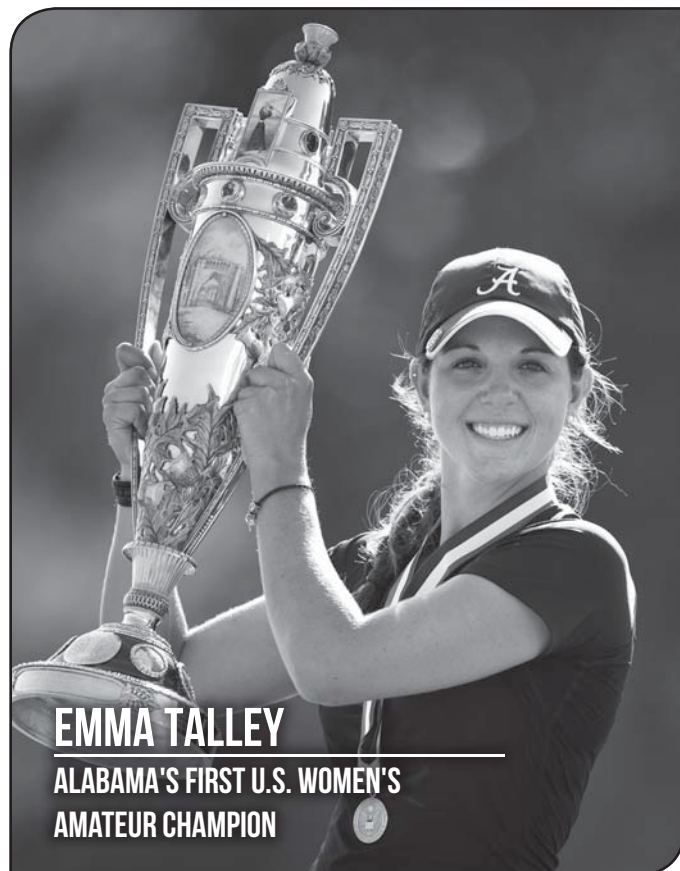
Talley's 3-under 285 (70-73-73-69) is the second-best under-par and second-lowest score for any Alabama golfer in a 72-hole event, trailing only Jennifer Kirby's 4-under 284 in 2010. Previously, the best finish at the NCAA Championships by a UA player was Brooke Pancake in 2012, as she finished second. It is just the 13th round in the 60s by a UA player in NCAA Championships history.

With the title, Talley adds to a long list of accomplishments. She becomes the fifth player in history to win a U.S. Amateur and an NCAA Championship individual crown, and the first since Virada Nirapathpongpor (2002/2003). Talley was also a part of the 2014 U.S. Curtis Cup win, and was the low amateur at the 2014 British Open.

EMMA TALLEY — 2013 U.S. WOMEN'S AMATEUR CHAMPION

The University of Alabama's Emma Talley won the 2013 United States Women's Amateur Championship with a 2 and 1 victory in the 36-hole final at the par-71, 6,488-yard Charleston Country Club. Talley, from Princeton, Ky., is the first Alabama player to win the U.S. Women's Amateur Championship and the second Alabama player to claim a USGA event (Martha Lang [Jones] won the 1988 USGA Women's Mid-Amateur). Talley carded a par to close out Yueer Cindy Feng on the 35th hole of the final match on the 154-yard par-3 17th hole. She defeated Lydia Choi 3 and 1 in the first round of match play after qualifying for match play by tying for second in the 36-hole qualifier at 2-under 140. Talley beat Tatiana Wijaya in the second round 8 and 7 and advanced to the quarterfinals with a 2-up win over Maria Fassi. Talley then dispatched Su-Hyun Oh 1 up in 19 holes to reach the semifinals. In the semifinals, Talley won the 17th hole against No. 1 junior Alison Lee and earned a half on the 18th to secure the 1-up win.

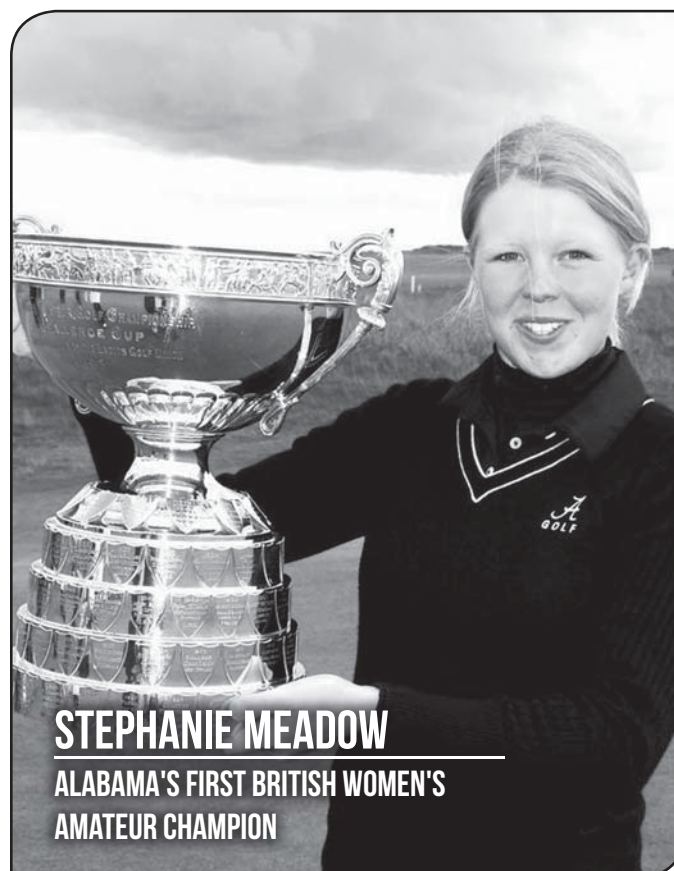

Stephanie Meadow won the 2012 Ladies British Open Amateur Championship. She defeated Spain's Rocío Sanchez Lobato 4 and 3 in the final at Carnoustie. Meadow sank an eight-foot putt to win the first hole and went 2 up with a par on No. 2 and went 3 up with a birdie on No. 4. Lobato won the fifth but Meadow responded by winning the sixth and seventh holes to move to 4 up. Lobato made birdie at the eighth to win the hole but Meadow came right back with a birdie on the 11th. Her Spanish opponent countered with a winning birdie at the 12th to cut Meadow's lead back to three. Meadow birdied the 13th — almost holing her tee shot — to go 4 up with five to play. Meadow then closed out the match on the 14th and 15th holes with halves. Meadow defeated England's Georgia Hall 3 and 2 in the semifinals and Wales' Amy Boulden 2 and 1 in the quarterfinals. She knocked off Emily Taylor 1 up in extra holes in the first round and defeated Nathalie Mansson 4 and 2 in the round of 32.

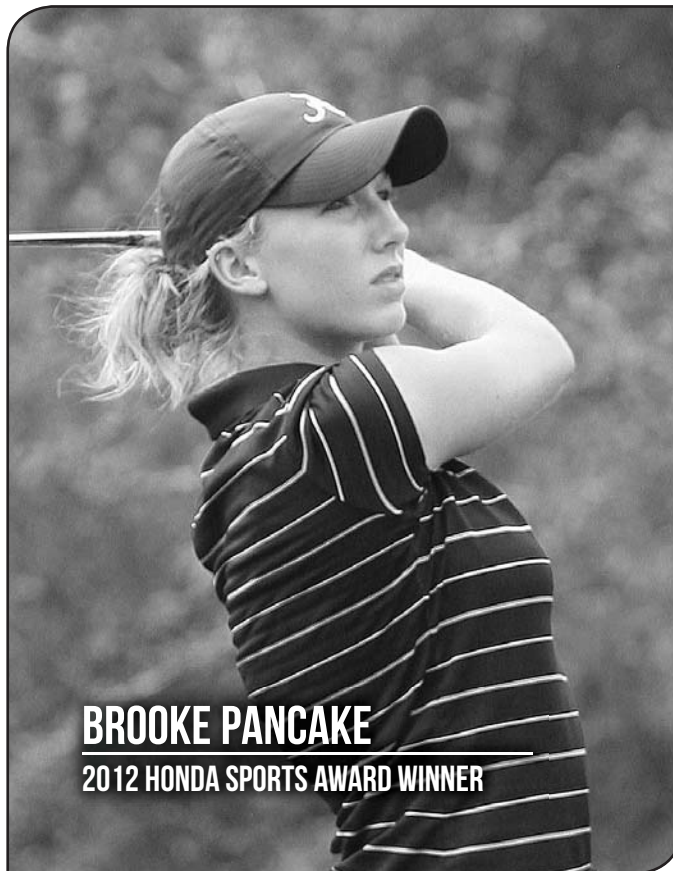

WOMEN'S GOLFER BROOKE PANCAKE WINS 2012 HONDA AWARD

Alabama's Brooke Pancake has won the 2012 Honda Sports Award in golf, given annually to the nation's top female collegiate golfer.

"I am ecstatic about the Honda Award," Pancake said. "I honestly couldn't ask for a better way to cap off my collegiate career."

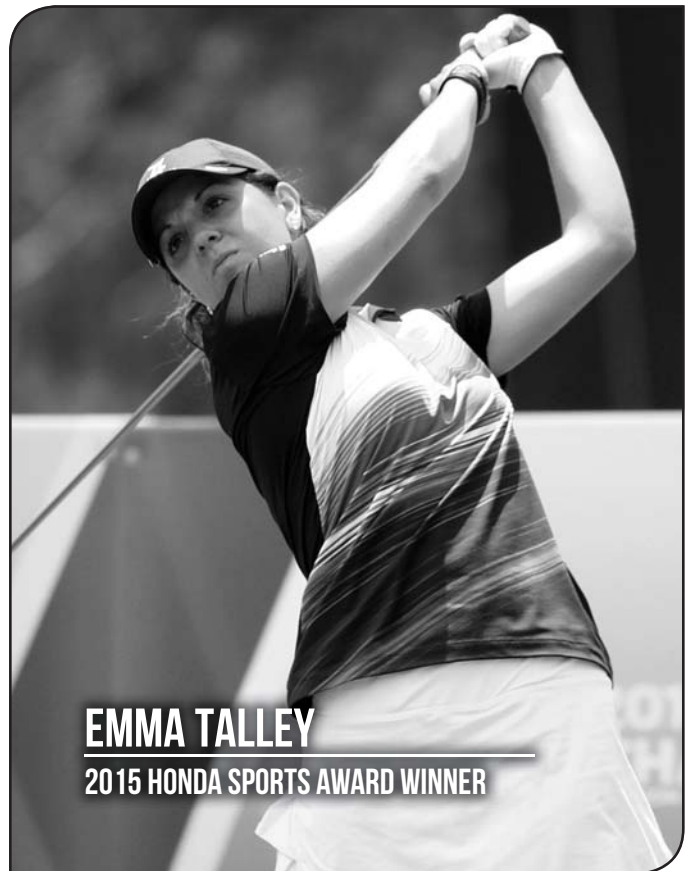
This honor came in the midst of a very busy and productive time for the Chattanooga, Tenn., native. In mid-May she graduated from the Capstone with a bachelor's degree in marketing after carrying a perfect 4.0 grade point average for her career. Later that same month, she led the Crimson Tide to its first NCAA Women's Golf Championship with a runner-up individual finish.

Pancake followed the NCAA Championships by playing in a U.S. Open qualifier before traveling to Scotland where she competed as part of the United States Curtis Cup team.

Pancake's collegiate career culminated with a four-foot par putt on the 18th hole that secured the Tide's first national championship in women's golf with a one-stroke victory over Southern California. A three-time All-American, twice garnering first team honors, she finished her career with a 73.08 scoring average and led the team in 2011-12 with a 72.52 stroke average.

"For me, there was no player at the time I would rather have with that last shot," UA head coach Mic Potter said. "Over the course of her career, she's become such a complete player, a great competitor and a tremendous ambassador for our program. Off the course, I can't say enough about what she's accomplished."

A first-team Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-American, Pancake earned the Edith Cummings Munson Award from the NGCA in 2011 as the student-athlete with the highest GPA among first team All-Americans. She also earned the NCAA Elite 88 Award (now called the Elite 90 Award), given to the student-athlete with the highest GPA at an NCAA Championships final site, in 2010.

EMMA TALLEY NAMED HONDA SPORTS AWARD WINNER

Alabama's Emma Talley was named the 2015 Honda Sports Award winner for golf the Collegiate Women's Sports Awards (CWSA).

"I am truly honored to win the Honda Award for Golf," Talley said. "Just being a finalist was special for me, so to win the award over such a talented group of finalists is amazing. My win at the NCAA Championships was a dream come true, and I want to thank coach Mic Potter, coach Susan Rosenstiel and all of my current and former teammates. I would not have this opportunity without all of the guidance and inspiration they have provided throughout my time at Alabama."

Talley, a native of Princeton, Ky., capped off a stellar junior season with a one-stroke victory at the NCAA Championships at The Concession Club in Bradenton, Fla., on June 25, becoming the first NCAA medalist in Alabama golf history. She posted a bogey-free final round of 69 and finished 3-under 285.

She earned Women's Golf Coaches Association (WGCA) First Team All-America honors this season making her a three-time All-American after garnering second-team honors as a freshman and honorable mention accolades as a sophomore. She is just the fifth player in golf history to win both an NCAA Championship and the U.S. Amateur (2013).

"I could not be more excited for Emma," Alabama head coach Mic Potter said. "The Honda Award for Golf is one of the most prestigious honors in our sport and Emma is very deserving. I can't say enough about her performance at the NCAA Championships. Her consistent excellence over four rounds, and her dedication to playing one shot at a time is why she is one of the best amateur players in the world. Emma has become such a complete player, a great competitor and a tremendous ambassador for our program. She is a truly special student-athlete and the epitome of the complete student-athlete."

Talley finished the season with a team-best 72.50 stroke average with seven top-10 finishes. She averaged just .69 strokes per round over par and counted towards the team score in 31 of 32 rounds.

SEC HISTORY

Alabama captured its third SEC Championship in 2016 with a five-shot victory over runner-up Florida. Alabama captured the program's first SEC Championship in 2010 with a four-stroke victory at the NorthRiver Yacht Club in Tuscaloosa. The Crimson Tide then claimed the school's second title in 2013.

In 2013, the SEC Championship moved to a neutral site at Greystone Golf and Country Club in Hoover, Ala., where it remains.

The Crimson Tide boasts a long line of outstanding golfers, but some of the best have played for the Tide and excelled in the Southeastern Conference over the past several years. Alabama has had more first team All-SEC selections over the past 10 seasons (17) than it had in its history prior to 2006 (6). Along with the 2010, 2013 and 2016 victories, Alabama has finished runner-up in the SEC Championship on four occasions, including 1991, 1994, 2009 and 2011.

Along with the eight golfers earning 17 first team All-SEC honors in the past nine years, the Crimson Tide produced three first-team selections in 2011 and 2012 and two each in 2009, 2010 and 2016. Kathleen Ekey and Camilla Lennarth earned first-team honors in 2009 with Lennarth and Jennifer Kirby doing the same in 2010. Lennarth, Stephanie Meadow and Brooke Pancake were first-team choices in 2011 while Kirby, Meadow and Pancake were selected in 2012. Cheyenne Knight and Emma Talley were first-teamers in 2016. Alabama has also seen eight golfers named to the SEC All-Freshman Team over the past eight years, including three SEC Freshmen of the Year — Kirby (2010), Meadow (2011) and Emma Talley (2013) — which gives the Tide its foundation for success. Stephanie Meadow is the only player to win SEC Player of the Year honors, going back-to-back in 2013 and 2014. Tide coach Mic Potter was selected as the SEC Coach of the Year in 2007 and then again in 2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013.

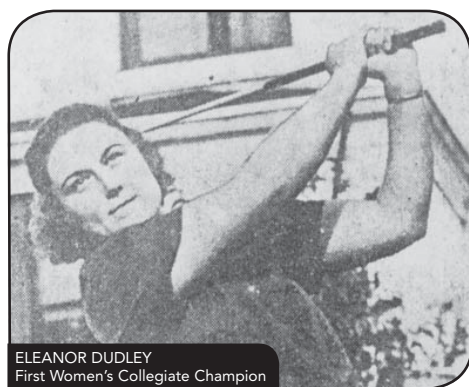

ELEANOR DUDLEY
First Women's Collegiate Champion

Much has changed in collegiate golf since the Crimson Tide's Eleanor Dudley won the first collegiate championship in 1941. Most notably, there are now women's golf teams. Alabama formed its first women's team in 1974.

In 1982, the NCAA finally got into the business of women's athletics and hosting nationals, and that year there were two national tournaments with Tulsa winning both the AIAW and NCAA team titles. The NCAA took over the administering championship starting in 1983. Alabama captured its first NCAA Championship in women's golf in 2012, joining a prestigious list of champions.

The young women who compile the elite roster of national champions are some of the most famous names in professional golf. The medalist roll call includes: Nancy Lopez (Tulsa, 1976); Patty Sheehan (San Jose State, 1980); Annika Sorenstam (Arizona, 1991).
