**WESTERN KENTUCKY
HILLTOPPERS**

THE GAME: The No. 1/1 University of Alabama football team opens its home schedule at Bryant-Denny Stadium facing Western Kentucky on Saturday, Sept. 10. The matchup between the Crimson Tide and Hilltoppers is scheduled for a 2:30 p.m. CT kickoff on ESPN2. Beth Mowins will serve as the play-by-play announcer with Anthony Becht at her side as the color analyst. The pair will be joined by sideline reporter Rocky Boiman. Eli Gold and Phil Savage will handle the radio call on the Crimson Tide Sports Network, with Chris Stewart serving as the sideline reporter.

RANKINGS: Both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches' polls will be released Tuesday due to the Ole Miss-Florida State game scheduled to be played on Labor Day (Monday) evening.

WESTERN KENTUCKY: The Hilltoppers enter Saturday's game with a 1-0 overall record after opening the season with a 46-14 win over C-USA foe Rice on Sept. 1. The Hilltoppers are led by Jeff Brohm, who is in his second season in Bowling Green. Brohm has a career record of 21-7 and has led Western to back-to-back bowl victories and the 2015 Conference USA championship.

SERIES HISTORY: Alabama and Western Kentucky will meet for the third time in the history of the two programs, with the Crimson Tide owning a 2-0 all-time advantage in the series. The most recent meeting between the two teams came on Sept. 8, 2012, in Tuscaloosa, when Alabama opened their home season with a 35-0 win at Bryant-Denny Stadium. In their first meeting in 2008, the Tide beat the Hilltoppers, 41-7, in Tuscaloosa.

HOME OPENERS: Alabama owns a 75-11-2 (.863) all-time record through 88 season openers at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Currently, UA is riding a 14-game winning streak in the team's first game in Tuscaloosa. Under head coach Nick Saban, the Tide sports a perfect 9-0 record in home openers.

NEXT GAME: Alabama will open Southeastern Conference play at No. 11/12 Ole Miss on Sept. 17 on CBS with a 2:30 p.m. CT kickoff at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium in Oxford, Miss. The Crimson Tide and Rebels have met 60 times in the series, with Alabama owning a 47-11-2 record, including a 7-4 mark in Oxford. Ole Miss won last year's matchup, 43-37, in Tuscaloosa.

CRIMSON TIDE PARTICIPATING IN FIRST AND GOLD! CAMPAIGN: For the third year in a row, the Alabama Crimson Tide is teaming up with Curing Kids Cancer to promote National Childhood Cancer Awareness Month during Saturday's game with Western Kentucky. Teams from the SEC, ACC, Sun Belt and Big South will wear Curing Kids Cancer helmet stickers and wristbands while coaches wear wristbands, gold whistles and lanyards signifying that September is National Childhood Cancer Awareness Month.

FACING OFF WITH THE BEST: The Crimson Tide has the fourth-toughest schedule in college football this season per ESPN.com's preseason College Football Power Index, trailing only USC, Ole Miss and Florida State. Alabama will face off with nine teams who participated in a bowl game a season ago and will meet four teams ranked in the Associated Press Preseason Top 25.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in just three regular season games without national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU during the 2010 calendar year, UA was essentially eliminated from a chance to keep itself in the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without national championship implications during that time.

RETURNING SUCCESS: The Crimson Tide returns 14 starters and 46 letterwinners from its 2015 squad that finished 14-1 as the SEC and National Champions. The 2016 team returns five starters on a veteran defense including seniors Jonathan Allen, Eddie Jackson and Reuben Foster. The offense welcomes back key pass catchers in tight end O.J. Howard and receivers Calvin Ridley and ArDarius Stewart.

FIRST TIME STARTERS: The Crimson Tide had seven student-athletes make their first career start in the season-opening contest with USC, including three on defense and four on offense. Getting their first career nod on defense were Ryan Anderson (LB), Dalvin Tomlinson (DE) and Tim Williams (LB). The offensive starters were made up of Blake Barnett (QB), Miller Forristall (TE), Damien Harris (RB) and Jonah Williams (OT).

FIRST TIME PLAYERS: Alabama had some new faces on the field for last Saturday's season opener against the USC Trojans. True freshmen Shyheim Carter (DB), Trevon Diggs (DB), B.J. Emmons (RB), Terrell Hall (LB), Jalen Hurts (QB), Joshua Jacobs (RB), Jared Mayden (DB), Aaron Robinson (DB), T.J. Simmons (WR) and Mack Wilson (LB) made their collegiate debuts against the Trojans. Redshirt freshmen Keaton Anderson (LB), Anfernee Jennings (LB), Brandon Kennedy (OL), Deonte Thompson (DB) and Matt Womack (OL); sophomore Jamey Mosley (LB); junior Levi Wallace (DB); and senior Truett Harris also saw their first action. Junior transfer Jamar King (DL) and senior transfer Gehrig Dieter made their Crimson Tide debuts, as well.

THE FRIENDLY CONFINES OF BRYANT-DENNY STADIUM: Alabama has won 20 of its last 21 games at its home stadium. Prior to the Sept. 19 loss to Ole Miss, the Crimson Tide had not lost a game at home since falling to Texas A&M in 2012. Alabama boasts the fifth-best home winning percentage in the FBS at Bryant-Denny Stadium with an .819 mark (245-53-3) since the stadium opened in 1929. Marshall's Joan C. Edwards Stadium, which opened in 1991, is the leader with an .851 winning percentage (148-26), while Baylor's McLane Stadium, which opened in 2014, is second (.846, 11-2). Georgia Southern's Paulson Stadium (1984) is third at .844 (184-34), while Boise State's Albertsons Stadium (1970) is fourth with an .824 (248-53) mark just ahead of Alabama.

ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has won 99 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014 and 14-1 in 2015. Boise State is second with 91 wins while Oregon is third with 90 victories.

ALABAMA-USC DRAWS HUGE RATINGS: The season opening matchup on ABC's Saturday Night Football between the Alabama Crimson Tide and USC Trojans was college football's highest-rated game of the day, achieving a 4.9 overnight rating nationally, which was up 14 percent from the same window last season when Alabama's season opener with Wisconsin averaged a 4.3 overnight rating and was also the highest-rated game of the day.

NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw seven former UA players selected in the 2016 NFL Draft, including first-round pick Ryan Kelly who went 18th overall to the Indianapolis Colts. Linebacker Reggie Ragland was the next to go (41st, Buffalo Bills) followed by Derrick Henry (45th, Tennessee Titans), A'Shawn Robinson (46th, Detroit Lions), Jarran Reed (49th, Seattle Seahawks) and Cyrus Jones (60th, New England Patriots), all in the second round. Running back Kenyan Drake rounded out the 2016 NFL Draft class when he was chosen by the Miami Dolphins at 73rd overall in the third round.

NON-OFFENSIVE TDs IN THE SABAN ERA: Marlon Humphrey's 18-yard interception return in the second quarter was the 47th non-offensive touchdown of the Nick Saban era. In 2015, the Tide posted 10 non-offensive touchdowns, including four interceptions, four punt returns, one kickoff return and one blocked punt return. The Crimson Tide took a school-record three interceptions back for touchdowns against Texas A&M on Oct. 17. Since Saban took over in 2007, Alabama has garnered 20 interception returns, 13 punt returns, six kickoff returns, four fumble returns and four blocked punt returns for a touchdown. Alabama scored one non-offensive touchdown in 2014. The Tide scored seven non-offensive touchdowns in 2013, including three in the season opener against Virginia Tech, marking the first time the Crimson Tide had done so in a game since Sept. 30, 1995, against Georgia.

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last six drafts (44) than any other college in the nation. Fifteen of those picks have been first-round selections and 25 have gone in the first two rounds. The list of 44 features four Super Bowl Champions, seven Pro Bowl selections, one All-Pro and one Offensive Rookie of the Year.

OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past nine seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. **The 2016 squad features nine players who already have degrees in hand going into the season opener with USC.** Over the previous eight seasons (2008-15) Alabama saw **94 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate)** by players who were still suiting up for the Crimson Tide after having graduated. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen an impressive **11 players earn a master's degree** before stepping foot on the field. In 2015, the Crimson Tide led all bowl teams with a total of 29 players who earned their degrees prior to the start of postseason play. Three of the 29 earned their master's degrees during the 2015 season.

GRADUATING WITH THE BEST: The Alabama football team has not only been dominant on the field, but also in the classroom. The Crimson Tide ranks fourth among Associated Press Preseason Top 25 teams for its graduation rate of 86 percent. Ahead of Alabama are only Stanford (99 percent) and Notre Dame (93 percent) and UCLA (89 percent). Alabama's percentage was the Southeastern Conference's highest graduation success rate (GSR) of all 14 SEC football programs.

ACADEMIC PROWESS: The Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the academic highlights under head coach Nick Saban.

- A total of nine Crimson Tide players will take the field with their degrees in hand for the season opener with USC.
- Earned Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 86 this year, the highest across all 14 SEC football programs.
- In 2015, for the third consecutive year, Alabama football led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play (29 in 2015, 22 in 2014; 28 in 2013).

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 744 of the 1,106 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 454-127-8 (.777) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 96-15 (.864) mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 131st consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid 1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started five seasons at No. 1 (2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. *USA TODAY* has administered the poll for the past 25 seasons (1991-2015), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012 and 2015 seasons. The Tide has compiled five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 & 1979) and five *USA TODAY* (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012 & 2015) coaches poll national titles.

- Alabama's last four national title football teams (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015) included 89 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C. think-tank.
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That 2011 team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- In 2015-16, Alabama tied for the lead in the in number of football student-athletes being named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll with 10 honorees. Alabama topped that list in 2009, 2010 and 2011.

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY: Last season, Alabama worked 400-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered their time across numerous areas last season including in schools, hospitals, with Habitat for Humanity and on campus.

ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE: The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won 10 national championships in five different sports and 22 SEC championships in seven different sports.
- Alabama claimed two SEC team titles during the 2015-16 academic year - football and women's golf.
- The overall cumulative grade-point average of UA student-athletes in 2015-16 was 3.16.
- Twelve Crimson Tide teams had cumulative GPAs above 3.0 for 2015-16
- Alabama student-athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition 350 times during the 2015-16 academic year. The Crimson Tide had 82, 59 and 126 student-athletes named to the SEC Fall, Winter and Spring Academic Honor Rolls and 83 named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- Since 2000, UA has produced 113 Academic All-America honorees, which ranks third nationally over that span behind only Nebraska (136) and Notre Dame (125). Alabama passed Stanford (106) and Penn State (99) round out the top five.
- Since 2010, UA leads all NCAA Division I schools with 65 Academic All-America honors. Stanford is second over that span with 62, while Nebraska is third at 53.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

VETERAN DEFENSE: The 2016 Alabama defense includes five starters from a season ago. Those five return 245 total tackles, 32 tackles for loss and 16 sacks to this year's team. Of those returning starters, three come from the Tide secondary, including senior Eddie Jackson, who recorded 46 tackles, three tackles for loss and six interceptions. Jackson set a school record with 230 return yards on his interceptions and took two back for touchdowns. Senior linebacker Reuben Foster leads all returnees with 73 total tackles. Returning senior defensive lineman Jonathan Allen was the team leader in tackles for loss (14.5) and sacks (12.0) in 2015.

10 POINTS OR FEWER: Saturday's 52-6 win over USC marked the 58th time the Crimson Tide has held an opponent to 10 points or fewer under head coach Nick Saban since the start of the 2007 season. In 2015, Alabama held six opponents to 10 points or less and recorded two shutouts. In 2014, Alabama shut out two opponents and held seven opponents to two touchdowns or less. Alabama held 9-of-13 opponents to 10 points or less in 2013 with three shutouts. Seven opponents were limited to 10 points or less in 2012, four of which were shutouts. Alabama was successful in holding opponents in the 0-10 point range in nine games in 2011 and eight times in 2010. UA kept opponents within that range seven times in both 2008 and 2009, and in 2007 posted two games in which it held opponents to 0-10 points. Alabama has shut out the opposition 17 times during the Saban era.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no defense has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama's defense has surrendered only 142 touchdowns over the last 96 games. That is 44 fewer than the second most in the nation (Florida with 186).

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: During head coach Nick Saban's last 111 games at the Capstone (since the start of the 2008 season), the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposing offense to fewer than 200 yards of total offense 37 times, the most recent being USC in Saturday's season opener (194 yards). In 2015, the Crimson Tide held four opponents to fewer than 200 yards (Florida – 180, Charleston Southern – 134, LSU – 182 yards, ULM – 92). Alabama's best came in 2009 when the Tide held Chattanooga to 84 yards of total offense.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: In head coach Nick Saban's tenure at Alabama, the Crimson Tide has limited opponents to under 300 yards of total offense 77 times, or 69.4 percent of the time. Alabama opened the 2016 season by limiting USC to just 194 yards in the Tide's 52-6 victory. In 2015, the Crimson Tide held the opposition to less than 300 yards of offense 10 times in 2015 (Michigan State, 239 yards; Florida, 180; Auburn, 260; LSU, 182; Arkansas, 220; Georgia, 299; ULM, 92; Middle Tennessee, 275; Wisconsin, 268).

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama allowed only seven rushing touchdowns in 15 games in 2015, second-lowest total in the country and hasn't surrendered a rushing score in 2016. The Tide leads the nation in allowing the fewest rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2005 season, surrendering only 78. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 62 rushing touchdowns. Ohio State is No. 2 in that category, giving up 96 since 2007.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Alabama has surrendered only 16 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that leads the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed only 11 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game: Georgia's Nick Chubb (146 on Oct. 3, 2015), Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliot (230 on Jan. 1, 2015), Auburn's Tre Mason (164 on Nov. 30, 2013), Virginia Tech's Trey Edmunds (132 on Aug. 31, 2013), Georgia's Todd Gurley (122 yards on Dec. 1, 2012), LSU's Jeremy Hill (107 on Nov. 3, 2012), Georgia Southern's Dominique Swope (153 on Nov. 19, 2011), Tennessee's Tauren Poole (117 on Oct. 23, 2010), Ole Miss's BenJarvus Green-Ellis (131 on Oct. 13, 2007), Houston's Anthony Alridge (100 on Oct. 6, 2007) and Darren McFadden of Arkansas (195 on Sept. 15, 2007).

ANDERSON CONTINUES STRONG PLAY: Senior linebacker Ryan Anderson led Alabama with a team-high five tackles in the first half, along with one sack, and finished with as many by game's end against USC. His play to start the new season continued his hot streak that ended the 2015 season. In the final six games of the 2015 campaign, Anderson recorded eight tackles for loss and six sacks. Seven of his career 11.5 sacks and nine of his 22 career tackles for loss have come in his last seven games played. Across his time at Alabama, the redshirt senior has accumulated 22 tackles for a loss of 96 yards and added 11.5 sacks for -78 yards.

ALLEN PILING UP SACKS: Senior Jonathan Allen's two sacks against USC on Sept. 3 marked the sixth time for his career that the senior has registered a multi-sack game. In addition, he has now collected eight sacks in his last seven games played dating back to 2015. Allen's career-high mark of three came against Mississippi State last season as part of his team-leading total of 12.0 sacks by year's end. His 20.0 sacks for his career rank as the seventh-most in Alabama history, just half a sack behind Antwan Odom (2000, 02-03) for sixth place. The Crimson Tide's all-time leader for career sacks is Derrick Thomas (1985-88) with 52.0.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

ALABAMA OPENS SEASON WITH A BANG: Alabama's 46-point margin of victory over No. 20 USC was its largest against a top 20 team since it beat No. 14 Syracuse by 55 points (61-6) in the 1953 Orange Bowl. It is also the third largest margin of victory against any ranked team in program history with the largest coming in the 59-0 win over No. 21 Texas A&M in 2014.

FIRST-YEAR QUARTERBACKS: Alabama opened the 2016 season with a new starting quarterback for the fifth time under head coach Nick Saban. Blake Barnett took the game's opening snap for the Crimson Tide against USC last Saturday. Since 2009, Alabama's four previous rookie signal callers posted a record of 52-3 (.945) and won three national championships.

FIRST HALF POINTS: Jalen Hurts' 39-yard touchdown pass to ArDarius Stewart in the second quarter extended Alabama's first half scoring streak to 119 games, the longest streak in the nation. The last time UA failed to score in the first half was on Sept. 29, 2007, when Alabama and Florida State headed into halftime in a scoreless tie. The Seminoles won that game, 21-14. Alabama owns a 103-16 record during the current streak.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: ArDarius Stewart's 39-yard touchdown catch from Jalen Hurts in the second quarter of the season opener against USC extended Alabama's consecutive games scoring streak to 199 contests - the longest streak in program history.

RUSHING TO SUCCESS: Alabama is 81-4 since the start of the 2008 season when rushing for at least 140 yards. The only losses were at Auburn in 2013, Ole Miss and Ohio State in 2014, and Ole Miss in 2015. The Crimson Tide rushed for 140 yards or more 10 times in 2015.

BALL PROTECTION: In its past 110 games dating back to a 20-6 win over Tulane on Sept. 6, 2008, Alabama has turned the ball over only 129 times (71 fumbles, 58 interceptions) for 1.17 turnovers per game. Since 2009, that mark is even better as the Tide has turned the ball over only 110 times in 96 games (1.14/gm). Since 2009, UA starting quarterbacks have thrown an impressively low 45 interceptions in 2,621 attempts (1 INT every 58.2 attempts). Dating back to the 2009 season, the top two running backs in the rotation have lost a fumble only 20 times. Over that 109-game span, the top two running backs have recorded 2,897 touches, losing a fumble once every 144.8 touches.

STEWART'S CAREER NIGHT: ArDarius Stewart's third quarter 71-yard touchdown reception against USC was the longest reception of his career. Stewart finished the contest against the Trojans with career highs in touchdown receptions (2) and yards (113). The redshirt junior finished last season second on the team in receptions with 63 for 700 yards and four touchdowns. His previous career-high mark for touchdowns scored was one, which he had accomplished four times, most recently against Florida in the 2015 SEC Championship. The 88 yards receiving against Tennessee last season ranked as his career high until Saturday.

HURTS SHOWS VERSATILITY IN FIRST GAME: In his first game as a collegiate quarterback, true freshman Jalen Hurts had a versatile performance that opened up the Crimson Tide offense after a sluggish start. Hurts entered the game on the Tide's third offensive possession and lost a fumble on his first play, but he quickly settled into the role and ignited the Tide offense through the air and on the ground. Hurts ended the night accounting for four touchdowns (two rushing, two passing), the first time a Tide player has had two TDs both passing and rushing since Tyler Watts in 2001. Hurts passed for 118 yards and two touchdowns with one interception while completing six of 11 pass attempts. He rushed for 32 yards and two touchdowns on nine carries. Hurts' longest pass completion was a 71-yard touchdown strike to ArDarius Stewart in the second quarter.

HOWARD AMONG ACTIVE TIGHT END LEADERS: Alabama senior tight end O.J. Howard ranks among the national leaders in receptions, yards per reception and receiving yards among active tight ends. Howard's 16.3 yards per reception is the second-best on the list. His 1,170 yards ranks fifth and his 72 career receptions is the ninth-best total.

RIDLEY LED ALL SEC FRESHMAN RECEIVERS: In 2015, Calvin Ridley broke the school and SEC single-season freshman record for receptions with 89. He finished with the second-highest catch total by a true freshman receiver in FBS history behind Antonio Brown's mark of 102 at Central Michigan in 2007. Ridley also set the Alabama single-season freshman receiving record for yards with 1,045, eclipsing the previous mark of 1,000 held by Amari Cooper (2012).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

SCOTT AMONG THE NATION'S BEST PUNTERS: Junior punter JK Scott is again a candidate for the Ray Guy Award, presented annually to the nation's top punter. In Alabama's season opener against USC, Scott averaged 47.0 yards per punt on five attempts and placed three of his kicks inside the 20-yard line, one of which pinned the Trojans at their own two-yard line. Scott proved to be nothing short of amazing as a freshman in 2014, averaging 48.0 yards per punt to lead the nation. He also helped Alabama lead the nation in net punting at 44.67 yards per punt. Scott placed 26 of his 55 punts (56.4 percent) inside the 20, which was the best percentage nationally. Scott has placed 59 punts inside the 20 and booted 47 punts of 50 yards or more in 29 career games.

GRIFFITH NOW AMONG TOP 10: Senior placekicker Adam Griffith accounted for 10 points in the season opener against USC with one field goal and seven successful extra-point kicks. With 238 career points (37 FG, 127 PAT), Griffith moved into 10th place on Alabama's all-time scoring list. On Saturday night, Griffith passed running back Johnny Musso, who scored 232 points (38 TD, 2 2-point conversions) from 1969-71 and currently sits in 10th. Griffith also ranks sixth on Alabama's all-time kick-scoring list. Jeremy Shelley is in the No. 5 spot on the list with 304 kicking points (44 FG, 133 PAT) from 2009-12.

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-WESTERN KENTUCKY SERIES: Alabama and Western Kentucky will meet for the third time in the history of the two programs, with the Crimson Tide owning a 2-0 all-time advantage in the series. The most recent meeting between the two teams came on Sept. 8, 2012, in Tuscaloosa, when Alabama opened their home season with a 35-0 win at Bryant-Denny Stadium. In their first meeting in 2008, the Tide beat the Hilltoppers, 41-7 in Tuscaloosa.

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama has compiled a 240-131-4 (.645) all-time record in 375 televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts). The Crimson Tide were 14-1 in televised games in 2015.

94 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 110 GAMES: With the Tide's 52-6 win over USC, Alabama has now played in 94 nationally televised games since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest in 2014 and 2015. The Crimson Tide was featured on CBS seven times in 2015, including at Georgia, Texas A&M, Mississippi State and Auburn; home against Tennessee and LSU and against Florida in the SEC Championship Game. The ABC family of networks hosted the other eight contests during the 2015 season, including the season opener against Wisconsin and Clemson (ABC), against Middle Tennessee, Louisiana-Monroe and Charleston Southern (SEC Network) and on ESPN for the Ole Miss, Arkansas and Michigan State games. In 2014, UA was televised in eight games on the ABC family of networks including contests with West Virginia (ABC), FAU (SEC Network), Southern Miss (ESPN2), at Arkansas (ESPN), at Tennessee (ESPN2), Western Carolina (SEC Network), the most-viewed college football game ever on ESPN, the Iron Bowl against Auburn and the Sugar Bowl against Ohio State (ESPN). The Tide also played in six contests that were televised on CBS, including versus Florida, at Ole Miss, against Texas A&M, in the Bayou against LSU, versus top-ranked Mississippi State, and finally in the SEC Championship against the Missouri Tigers. Eleven of the Crimson Tide's 13 games in 2013 were televised nationally with the Virginia Tech, Arkansas, Mississippi State and Oklahoma games on ESPN, the Texas A&M, Tennessee, LSU and Auburn games on CBS, the Colorado State and Kentucky games on ESPN2. UA played 12 nationally televised games in 2012, with one game on ABC, six on CBS and five on ESPN. In 2011, Alabama played on CBS four times, while having one on ABC, two on ESPN and ESPN2, and one game on ESPNU. In 2010, Alabama had five games on CBS, three on ESPN, two on ESPN2, one on ABC and one on ESPNU. In 2009, UA played two games on ABC (including the BCS title game), and six on CBS, while ESPN televised two more Crimson Tide games. In 2008, Alabama had 10 of its 14 games televised nationally, including five on CBS, three on ESPN, one on ABC and one on FOX.

HOME SWEET HOME OPENERS: The Crimson Tide owns a 75-11-2 (.863) all-time record across 88 total home-opening games. Currently, UA is riding a 14-game winning streak in the team's first game at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Under head coach Nick Saban, the Tide sports a perfect 9-0 record in home openers.

ALABAMA VS. CONFERENCE USA: Alabama has played in 62 total games in program history against the current members of Conference USA and owns a 48-12-2 record overall in those contests. The Crimson Tide has played nine of the 14 current members, with Charlotte, Marshall, Old Dominion, Texas-San Antonio and UAB being the only teams the Tide has not met. UA's most common C-USA opponent is Southern Miss, with the two programs meeting a total of 41 times. Alabama owns the advantage in all series except for Rice, where the Owls own the 3-0 advantage all-time, and the Louisiana Tech matchups which is a split at 2-2. The most recent matchups between UA and C-USA opponents came last season when the Tide claimed a 37-10 win over Middle Tennessee to open its home slate.

95-6 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide is 96-6 (.942) when leading at the half. Alabama led USC 17-3 at the half last Saturday and had the lead in 11 of its 15 games in 2015, trailing Ole Miss and Arkansas, tied at 7-7 versus Tennessee and 14-14 vs. Clemson at the midway point. UA had converted 36 straight halftime leads into wins before falling at Auburn on Nov. 30, 2013. The Crimson Tide had converted 28 consecutive halftime leads into victories before seeing that streak snapped in 2010 against LSU. In 2007, Alabama held a 20-17 halftime lead before losing to LSU, 41-34, in 2007 at Bryant-Denny Stadium. In 2010, the Tide led 10-3 at the half before the Tigers rallied for a 24-20 win in Death Valley. Alabama lost 28-27 to Auburn to close out the 2010 season, after leading 24-7 at the half. The Crimson Tide is 4-8 under Saban when trailing at halftime after coming away with a victory against Arkansas on Oct. 10, despite trailing 7-3 at half. The four wins in the Saban era when trailing at the half: 34-24 over No. 7 Virginia Tech in 2009 (in Atlanta); a 24-15 over No. 9 LSU in 2009; 24-20 at Arkansas in 2010; 27-14 vs. Arkansas in 2015. His Tide teams are 4-3 when tied at halftime, and Alabama's four wins under Saban when tied at halftime: at LSU in 2008, (27-21), at Auburn in 2009 (26-21), against Tennessee in 2011 (37-6) and against Tennessee this season (19-14).

SABAN IN HOME OPENERS: Nick Saban is 18-2 all-time in home openers across his four stops as a head coach. He is currently riding a 15-game winning streak in the first game at his home stadium, with the last loss coming in 1998 when his Michigan State Spartans fell to Colorado State, 23-16. In home openers, Saban's teams are outscoring the opposition 734-238 and have shut out the competition on three occasions with the most recent shutout coming in 2014's rain-shortened, 41-0 win over Florida Atlantic. While at Alabama, Saban is a perfect 9-0 overall and has recorded two of those three shutouts, including a 35-0 shutout victory over Western Kentucky in 2012. For his career, he owns a 1-0 record at Toledo, 3-2 mark at Michigan State, and perfect records of 5-0 and 9-0 at LSU and Alabama, respectively.

SABAN AGAINST NON-CONFERENCE OPPOSITION: Nick Saban owns a career mark of 71-18 against non-conference opponents (including bowl games) across his 21 years as a head coach in the collegiate ranks. During his time at Alabama, Saban owns a 40-5 record in against non-conference opposition, including a 26-1 mark at home. The Crimson Tide is currently riding a 24 game winning streak against non-conference opponents at home after losing to ULM in 2007 by a score of 21-14. Saban-coached Alabama teams are outscoring its non-conference opponents by an average of 38.9-12.2 (1,752-551) and have shut out the opposition nine times.

SABAN VS. CONFERENCE USA: Crimson Tide head coach Nick Saban has faced current Conference USA teams a total of 11 times in his career. Saban's teams are 10-1 all-time against C-USA opponents, including a 9-0 mark at Alabama. Saban's Tide squads are 2-0 against Western Kentucky, North Texas and Florida Atlantic and 1-0 against FIU, Southern Miss and Middle Tennessee. Saban's LSU teams were 1-0 against Louisiana Tech and 0-1 against UAB. Alabama's most recent win over a C-USA team is a 35-10 win over Middle Tennessee on Sept. 12, 2015 in Tuscaloosa.

SABAN AMONG 20-YEAR LEADERS: Alabama's 45-40 win over Clemson in the 2016 College Football Playoff Championship Game was head coach Nick Saban's 191st victory in his first 20 years as a college head coach. That total is the second-most in FBS history for a coach in the first 20 seasons of his career. Former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne won 195 games in the opening two decades of his tenure in Lincoln. Long-time Penn State head coach Joe Paterno ranks third with 187. Saban's five national championships in 20 seasons tops both Osborne (none) and Paterno (1).

SEC RECORD: In 2015, Alabama extended its record for most consecutive 10-win seasons in SEC history when it defeated Charleston Southern on Nov. 21, 2015, to improve to 10-1 on the year. UA had a 12-2 record in 2008, 14-0 in 2009, 10-3 in 2010, 12-1 in 2011, 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014 and 14-1 in 2015.

10-WIN SEASONS: With last season's 56-6 victory over Charleston Southern, Alabama reached the 10-win milestone for the eighth consecutive season. The eight straight years with 10 wins extends the school record. The previous total for most consecutive 10-win seasons was five, set by coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's teams from 1971-75. In 120 seasons, the Tide has won 10 or more games 35 times, one behind Oklahoma (36) for the most 10-win seasons in college football history. Alabama has produced ten 10-win seasons since 2002 (2002, 2005, 2008-2015). Bryant had a school-record 12 10-win seasons at Alabama, while Saban is second with eight.

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban is quickly moving up the charts for victories in SEC regular season games against conference opponents with 94. His 94 wins rank seventh in SEC history, four behind Shug Jordan (Auburn) and Phillip Fulmer (Tennessee) on the league's list of conference wins. Each coach ahead of Saban on the list, except for recently-retired South Carolina and Florida head coach Steve Spurrier, is in the College Football Hall of Fame. Paul "Bear" Bryant tops the list with 159 conference wins at Kentucky (1946-53) and Alabama (1958-82). Spurrier is second with 131 league wins followed by Johnny Vaught (Ole Miss, 106), Vince Dooley (Georgia, 105), Jordan (Auburn, 98) and Fulmer (Tennessee, 98). Saban ranks first in league history in SEC regular season winning percentage at .790 (94-25). He is second in league history in all-time winning percentage at .814 (149-34) and ranks ninth all-time for career wins.

NEW HIRES: Nick Saban made three new additions to his 2016 staff during the offseason, hiring Derrick Ansley to coach the secondary, Karl Dunbar to lead the defensive line and bringing in Brent Key to coach the offensive guards and centers. Ansley rejoins the Crimson Tide staff after four seasons at Tennessee (2012) and Kentucky (2013-15). He previously served as a graduate assistant under Saban in 2010 and 2011. Dunbar is returning to college football after a decade in the National Football League with the Bills, Jets and Vikings from 2006-2015. Dunbar also worked as a defensive line coach with the Bears in 2004. He previously

coached at the college level with LSU, Oklahoma and Nicholls (La.) State. Key joined the Alabama staff after 11 seasons at UCF, most recently serving as the Knights' offensive coordinator and running backs coach.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban ranks third all-time among college coaches who have tutored first round draft picks. Saban has coached a total of 23 players who were chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 18 from Alabama.

CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS: The Alabama football program is well-represented in the NFL heading into the 2016-17 season with numerous former players dotting league rosters. The Tide has 54 former players (active or injured reserve) working on an active NFL roster this season, the second-most nationally behind only LSU (55). In the last eight NFL Drafts, Alabama has had 55 players selected, including 18 players in first round, 17 in the second and third rounds, five in the fourth, seven in the fifth, one in the sixth and seven in the seventh round.

- Saban has a 192-60-1 (.761) record as a college head coach to date. He has five national championships – four at Alabama – seven conference championships and 17 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff National Championship Game in 2015.

- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships and the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships. He has won five titles in his last 13 years coaching college football after capturing CFP National Championship following the 2015 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame - 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska - 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the second coach in the poll era to win five national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant).

- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He then took down Clemson 45-40 to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game.

- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.

- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).

- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.

- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.

- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.

- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and a daughter-in-law, Kelsé.

- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Sabans have helped raise approximately \$5.5 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 16 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Project Team Up and Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that stuck Tuscaloosa.

- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

ARLINGTON, Texas — True freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts accounted for four touchdowns (two passing, two rushing) while receiver ArDarius Stewart and running back Damien Harris had career-best performances, supplementing a suffocating performance by the Crimson Tide defense to lead the No. 1 ranked University of Alabama football team to a 52-6 victory over the 20th-ranked University of Southern California Trojans before a crowd of 81,359 at AT&T Stadium.

The 46-point margin of victory was the largest Alabama winning margin over a top-20 ranked opponent since a 35-0 win at sixth-ranked Florida in 1991, and was the second-largest victory margin over a top 20 team in Crimson Tide history following only a 55-point win (61-6) over Syracuse in the 1953 Orange Bowl (1952 season). The largest Alabama victory margin ever against a ranked team was a 59-0 win over No. 21 Texas A&M in 2014.

Defensively, Alabama was stifling after allowing a scoring drive to open the game. The Tide was dominant at the line of scrimmage, holding the Trojans to 64 yards rushing on 30 attempts, an average of 2.1 yards per rush. Redshirt freshman cornerback Anthony Averett recorded a team-best eight total tackles, including seven solos. Additionally, cornerback Minkah Fitzpatrick had six tackles and broke up two passes, defensive end Jonathan Allen had two quarterback sacks and the team broke up seven passes, had nine tackles for loss and three sacks. Sophomore cornerback Marlon Humphrey returned an interception for a touchdown in the first half.
