## WEEK TWO IN C-USA

A wide variety of challenges await Conference USA teams in the second week of the season. Two games against SEC opponents and single contests vs. ACC, Big 12, Big Ten, Mountain West and Sun Belt teams highlight the 13 game schedule that begins Friday night when Maryland becomes the second straight Big Ten team to visit FIU (7 p.m. CDT on CBS Sports Network).

WKU will visit top-ranked Alabama (2:30 p.m. CDT on ESPN 2) and Middle Tennessee makes the short trip to Vanderbilt (3 pm CDT on the SEC Network) as the league faces a pair of SEC opponents for the second straight Saturday.

The first matchup with the ACC comes Saturday night when Florida Atlantic makes the short drive south to face Miami at the newly-renovated Hard Rock Stadium (5 pm CDT on ESPN 3). UTSA will visit Mountain West foe Colorado State (3 p.m. CDT on Campus Insiders) and Old Dominion, which saw its season-opener pushed back a day by Hurricane Hermine, will face an Appalachian State team from the Sun Belt that took No. 9 Tennessee to overtime on opening night (2:30 p.m. CDT on ASN).

UTEP will take on Texas from the Big 12 (6 p.m. CDT on Longhorn Network), while Rice renews a rivalry with Army (11 a.m. CDT on CBS Sports Network).

Five other C-USA schools are in action against FCS opponents.

## LEADING BY AIR AND GROUND

After the first week of the 2016 season, Conference USA has the nation's leading passer and rusher. WKU junior QB **Mike White** threw for 517 yards in a 46-14 conference-opening victory over Rice on Sept. 1 to top the nation's signal-callers. UTEP junior RB **Aaron Jones** returned to action after missing most of last season with an injury and rushed for a career-high 249 yards in a win over New Mexico State, best among all FBS runners.

## GO AHEAD, CALL IT A COMEBACK

Southern Miss opened its 100th football season by scoring 34 unanswered points to win at Kentucky, 44-35. It trailed 35-10 with 56 seconds remaining in the first half and held a 295-56 yardage advantage in the second half, while outscoring UK, 27-0. Twice before, the Golden Eagles had won after trailing by 21 points.

## WHITE HOT

In his first game in a Hilltoppers uniform, WKU junior transfer QB **Mike White** has already etched his name in the history books. He threw for 517 yards in a 46-14 conference-opening victory over Rice on Sept. 1. That yardage total is the third-most in WKU history and the 10th-highest total in C-USA annals.

# CONFERENCE USA TELEVISION

## C-USA ON NATIONAL TV

Conference USA has announced its preliminary television schedule for the 2016 football season. The current confirmed schedule features games to air nationally on all four of the league's primary television partners, with many additional games to be added prior to the beginning of the season, through additional league partnerships, along with selected games as part of other conference's television deals.

National games will be televised this season on ESPN Networks, CBS Sports Network, American Sports Network and beIN SPORTS. The majority of these exposures will take place on Saturday, with select Thursday and Friday night telecasts also being featured.

The 2016 C-USA Championship game on Saturday, Dec. 3 is scheduled to air on either ESPN or ESPN 2. It marks the 12th-straight year that the C-USA Championship will air on the ESPN Networks. ESPN is also scheduled to carry all six of C-USA's bowl games in which it has a guaranteed selection.

Additional Conference USA football television exposures will be released as soon as they are finalized.

## C-USA EXTRA POINTS

### CHARLOTTE 49ERS

The 49ers, in their first-ever game against a nationally-ranked FBS opponent, fell at 19th-ranked Louisville (1-0), 70-14, in their season-opener on Sept. 1. The TD pass from junior transfer QB **Kevin Olsen** to senior WR **Austin Duke** was the 48th TD drive all-time under 1:30 and the 33rd pass TD of 15+ yards in program history. Duke's last four TD catches, dating back to last year, have come from four different QBs, and he now has 21 scoring receptions in his career. In his debut, Olsen completed 16-of-29 passes for 141 yards. He had three completions of 15 or more yards, including the 24-yd TD pass to Duke, and did not throw an interception. The 49ers 18 receptions were distributed among nine different receivers.

### FIU PANTHERS

The Panthers carried a lead into the fourth quarter before falling to Indiana on Sept. 1, 34-13. Senior TE **Jonnu Smith** led all players in receptions (8) and receiving yards (89), moving past 1,500 yards in his career (now 1,584). Junior RB **Alex Gardner** had a tough night running the ball, but did rush for FIU's touchdown. Senior LB **Treyvon Williams** had a huge night to lead the defense, finishing with a career-high 13 tackles and one sack.

### FLORIDA ATLANTIC OWLS

The Owls opened the season with a victory for the first time since 2012, defeating Southern Illinois, 38-30. Junior RB **Greg "Buddy" Howell** surpassed 100 yards in the first half, 102, on just six carries, and ended the game with 128 yards on the ground, including a 48-yard TD run. Sophomore QB **Jason Driskel** accounted for over 300 yards of total offense, and was an extremely efficient 14-of-16 passing in the second half. All told, the signal-caller was 23-of-31 for 287 yards in the air and added 41 yards rushing. Senior DE **Trey Hendrickson** had five tackles, two QB hurries, a sack, and blocked a Saluki extra point attempt in the fourth quarter.

### MARSHALL THUNDERING HERD

Marshall is the only C-USA school that did not play the opening week of the season. The Thundering Herd opens their slate on Saturday by hosting Morgan State (6 p.m. EDT on beIN SPORTS). Sophomore QB **Chase Litton**, who became the starter in week three last year, threw 23 touchdown passes to lead all true freshmen in the FBS. He completed 60.1 percent (230-of-583) of his passes for 2,605 yards and led Marshall to nine victories in his 11 starts. Junior TE **Hunter Yurachek** led all FBS tight ends in touchdown receptions last season with 10. He grabbed 44 passes for 417 yards.

### MIDDLE TENNESSEE BLUE RAIDERS

The Blue Raiders scored 28 first-quarter points and never looked back in posting a 55-0 victory over Alabama A&M. Sophomore QB **Brent Stockstill** completed his first 22 passes of the game, breaking the previous MT school record of consecutive passes completed of 19, set by Logan Kilgore in 2011. Stockstill completed 30 of his 36 throws in the first half for 329 yards, five scores and one interception before calling it a night. With eight receptions, sophomore WR **Richie James** jumped into a tie for seventh place on the MT all-time list in just 14 games played. James now has 116 career receptions and needs six more to take over sixth place. While the Blue Raider offense was impressive, scoring 45 points in the first half alone and gaining 681 total yards in the game, their defense was equally strong in the shutout. Alabama A&M gained just 146 total yards of offense and punted 13 times in 16 possessions. The Blue Raiders added four sacks and an interception.

### OLD DOMINION MONARCHS

The Monarchs opened the season a day late due to Tropical Storm Hermine, but disposed of local rival Hampton, 54-21, on Sunday. Senior QB **David Washington** tossed a career-high-tying four TD passes, completing 10-of-18 passes for 187 yards (146 in the first half). Junior RB **Ray Lawry** added 172 yards from scrimmage and two touchdowns to help the Monarchs post 500 yards of total offense. With 110 rushing yards, Lawry recorded his 12th career 100-yard rushing game. Junior TE **Joey Verhaegh**'s first career catch went for a 32-yard touchdown to give ODU a 47-21 lead.

### WKU HILLTOPPERS

WKU defeated Rice on Sept. 1, 46-14, is now 18-2 in its last 20 contests and has won 13-straight conference games (11 consecutive at home and seven straight overall). WKU scored 45-plus points for the fifth straight game dating back to 2015. It's the first time in program history the Tops have had such a streak. In his first career game at WKU, junior QB **Mike White** threw for a career-high 517 yards. He was 25-of-31 overall and threw for a career-high-tying three touchdowns. It was the third 500-yard passing performance in WKU history and the 10th most passing yards in a game in C-USA history. Junior WR **Nicholas Norris** caught 7 passes for 147 yards and 2 TDs. His 87-yard score was the longest reception of his career. Senior WR **Taywan Taylor** had 5 grabs for 165 yards. It was his 11th career 100-plus yard receiving effort, including his ninth in his past 13 games.

### LOUISIANA TECH BULLDOGS

The Bulldogs dropped a heart-breaker at Arkansas to open the season, 21-20. In his first career start, redshirt freshman QB **J'Mar Smith** was 19-for-31 for 212 yards and a rushing touchdown. Smith became the first freshman QB to open the season for LA Tech since 2011. On the ground, the Bulldogs were led by junior RB **Jarred Craft**, who rushed for 68 yards on 12 attempts and a touchdown. After catching 99 passes last season, senior WR **Trent Taylor** picked up where he left off, posting eight receptions for 78 yards. Junior WR **Carlos Henderson** tied his career high with six receptions that went for 71 yards. The Bulldog defense held the Razorbacks to 297 yards of total offense. Only Alabama was able to hold Arkansas to under 300 total yards last season. LA Tech registered two interceptions, the first time an opponent had picked off Arkansas more than once in a game since Oct. 18, 2014.

### NORTH TEXAS MEAN GREEN

The Mean Green dropped their season-opener vs. SMU, 34-21. The attendance was 24,718, marking the third-largest crowd in Apogee Stadium's six-year history. Senior QB **Alec Morris** made his first North Texas start and settled down after a pair of early interceptions to go 24-of-39 for 237 yards and two TDs. Freshman QB **Mason Fine** made his debut late in the game and led the Mean Green on an 11-play, 80-yard scoring march. Fine was eight of 11 for 74 yards, and junior RB **Jeffrey Wilson** finished the drive with an 11-yard TD run. Senior WR **Thaddeous Thompson** caught his career-first TD pass in the second quarter, a 7-yard toss.

### RICE OWLS

The Owls dropped the C-USA opener at defending league champion WKU on Sept. 1, 46-14. Senior QB **Tyler Stehling**, making his first career start, threw for 183 yards on 22-of-37 passing. He also rushed for a career-high 85 yards and his first career touchdown. Sophomore WR **Parker Smith** led the Owls in receiving, catching three passes for a career-high 60 yards, while junior RB **Jowan Davis** scored the team's first TD of the season on a two-yard rushing touchdown, the 11th of his career.

### SOUTHERN MISS GOLDEN EAGLES

Southern Miss opened its 100th season by scoring 34 unanswered points to win at Kentucky, 44-35, after trailing 35-10 with 56 seconds remaining in the first half. The comeback was the largest in school history. The Golden Eagles held a 295-56 yardage advantage in the second half, outscoring UK, 27-0. Southern Miss' 554 yards of total offense marked the ninth time since the start of 2015 that it eclipsed the 500-mark. Junior running backs **Ito Smith** (36-173) and **George Payne** (16-100) became the first Golden Eagle duo with 100-plus rushing yards since Smith and Jalen Richard did so on Nov. 21, 2015 vs. Old Dominion. Senior QB **Nick Mullens** finished over 200 yards passing with 258 for the 28th time in his career, trailing only Austin Davis (2008-11) who had 32 in his four-year career. He also hit junior WR **Isaiah Jones** for a 71-yard scoring strike just before the end of the first half, marking the longest pass play for Mullens since he hit Markese Triplett for an 81-yard TD pass against Marshall (11/2/13).

### UTEP MINERS

UTEP posted its eighth consecutive victory over New Mexico State, winning 38-22 at the Sun Bowl Saturday night. Senior RB **Aaron Jones** returned to action in a big way, rushing for a career-high 249 yards (140 in the fourth quarter), the third-highest total in school history and the most by any FBS player opening weekend. He had 292 total yards and scored a pair of touchdowns. On the other side of the ball, his brother, junior LB **Alvin Jones**, recorded a career-high 12 tackles. Junior QB **Zack Greenlee** threw three TD passes in his UTEP debut, going 15-of-27 for 249 yards. The Miners converted 11-of-17 third downs. Four of them were from 3rd & 10 or longer. Sophomore **Terry Juniel** recorded 104 yards on six punt returns. It's the most yards on gained on punt returns since UTEP recorded 125 yards on seven returns on Sept. 8, 2001.

### UTSA ROADRUNNERS

UTSA played its first season opener at home since its inaugural 2011 campaign, defeating Alabama State, 26-13. Junior QB **Dalton Sturm** finished the night 20-of-25 for a career-high 274 yards and two touchdowns. He completed passes to 10 different receivers and he also rushed three times for 58 yards and another score. Junior TE **Shaq Williams** led the receiving corps with three receptions for 63 yards in his first-ever game as a Roadrunner. UTSA racked up a program-record six sacks, which broke the previous mark of five that had occurred six times (last: at Marshall; Oct. 5, 2013). Freshman LB **Joseph Tauaefa**'s debut with the Roadrunners featured team highs of 13 tackles (nine solos) and a pair of sacks. UTSA limited the Hornets to just 102 total yards (10 rush/92 pass) in the second half.

### C-USA BOWL SYNOPSIS

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with six bowl partners for the 2016 season, as well as one secondary agreement: the Gildan New Mexico, Hawai'i, Marmot Boca Raton, Popeyes Bahamas, R+L Carriers New Orleans and Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowls are primary agreements. The Camping World Independence Bowl in Shreveport, Louisiana, is a secondary agreement, should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

#### C-USA and the College Football Playoff

As a member of the College Football Playoff, Conference USA will be a part of one of the College Football Playoff bowls if it has the highest rated champion from among the American, C-USA, Mid-American, Mountain West and Sun Belt Conferences.

#### The Playoff

During the 2014-15 season, college football entered a new era when postseason playoffs began. The format is simple: top four teams, two semifinals played in bowl games and a national championship game played in a different city each year. Each semifinal will be played during the New Year's holiday with the national championship game in prime time on a Monday night at least a week later.

#### The Selection Committee

A selection committee will choose the four teams for the playoff based on their performance during the regular season, including, strength of schedule, head-to-head results, championships won, and other factors. The teams will be seeded so that No. 1 will play No. 4 in one semifinal and No. 2 will meet No. 3 in the other, with the two winners advancing to the national championship game.

#### The Rotation

The semifinals will rotate among six different bowls, extending the experience to more fans. In the years when the bowls are not hosting semifinals, the bowls will feature eight other teams in four compelling matchups.

For the 2015-16 season, the Peach Bowl (Dec. 31), Fiesta Bowl (Dec. 31), Rose Bowl presented by Northwestern Mutual (Jan. 1) and Allstate Sugar Bowl (Jan. 1) will host its regular bowl games, while the Capital One Orange (Dec. 31) and Goodyear Cotton Bowl (Dec. 31) will host semifinals. The College Football Championship will be held on Monday, Jan. 11 in Glendale, Arizona.

### GILDAN NEW MEXICO BOWL

Conference USA will enter its third year as a primary partner with the Gildan New Mexico Bowl and is scheduled to send a team to Albuquerque each season between 2016 and 2019. C-USA will face a representative from the Mountain West Conference each season at University Stadium on the campus of the University of New Mexico....C-USA has participated in the New Mexico Bowl twice before, as UTEP met its former conference rival BYU in 2010, and the Miners met Utah State in 2014...This year's game will mark the 11th in the bowl's history, which produced two of the highest scoring and most exciting comeback finishes among all bowl games in 2012 and 2013...This bowl will once again be played on the opening day of the bowl season, which it has nearly each time during its existence.

### ZAXBY'S HEART OF DALLAS BOWL

Conference USA is slated to play an opponent from the Big Ten Conference in the seventh annual Heart of Dallas Bowl on Dec. 26....The bowl is the only one that honors first responders and it also benefits organizations working to eradicate homelessness in Dallas....Last year, Southern Miss became the first C-USA school to play a Pac-12 team in a bowl game, falling to Washington, 44-31....The 2014 game saw C-USA West Division Champion Louisiana Tech defeat Illinois, 35-18, as Houston Bates recorded a bowl record 4.5 sacks for the Bulldogs....In 2013, North Texas celebrated its return to postseason play with a 36-14 win over UNLV in front of a partisan Mean Green crowd at Cotton Bowl Stadium...Conference USA made its first appearance in the bowl on Jan. 1, 2012 when No. 17 Houston concluded a 13-1 season with a win over No. 22 Penn State in a matchup of nationally-ranked teams. It was one of just nine bowl games during the 2011-12 bowl season that matched two top 25 teams.

## C-USA CHAMPIONSHIP INFORMATION

### UAB FOOTBALL BACK IN 2017

The UAB Football team returns to action September 2, 2017, when the Blazers host Alabama A&M at Legion Field. Under the direction of head coach Bill Clark, UAB will practice during the 2016 campaign in anticipation for its return to the field in 2017.

On June 17, 2016, the University of Alabama Board of Trustees approved the final stages of UAB's proposed Football Operations Center. The Blazers begin construction on a \$22 million practice facility this August, which includes an open-air pavilion covering the turf practice field, making UAB a pioneer in this architectural design. Included in this was a \$4.2 million sponsorship and naming agreement with Legacy Credit Union – the largest of its kind in UAB Athletics history. The Blazers anticipate the Football Operations Center and Legacy Pavilion to be completed by the start of the 2017 season.

Clark will lead the Blazers onto the field in 2017 just as he did in his first year as head coach of UAB in 2014. Clark inherited a team that was 2-10 the year before and turned them into a team that won six games and earned bowl eligibility for the first time in a decade. For his efforts, Clark was named the C-USA Coach of the Year by the league's media.

The Blazers also proved that they will be competitive from the moment they step onto the field as Clark signed the league's No. 2 recruiting class in 2016.

UAB's 2017 non-conference schedule includes home games against Alabama A&M (Sept. 2) and Coastal Carolina (Sept. 16), and road contests at Ball State (Sept. 9) and at Florida (Nov. 18).

### 2016 C-USA BOWL SYNOPSIS

Conference USA has secured guaranteed commitments with seven bowl partners for the 2015 season, as well as one secondary agreement: The Arizona, Gildan New Mexico, Miami Beach, Popeyes Bahamas, R+L Carriers New Orleans, St. Petersburg and Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowls are primary agreements. The Independence Bowl in Shreveport, La., is a secondary agreement, should the ACC or SEC not be able to provide a bowl-eligible team. There is no set selection order among C-USA's bowl partners.

As a member of the College Football Playoff, Conference USA will be a part of one of the CFP bowls if it produces the highest rated champion from among the American Athletic, C-USA, Mid-American, Mountain West and Sun Belt Conferences.



### 2016 C-USA FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP GAME

Conference USA will host its 12th football championship game in 2016.

The event is slated for Saturday, December 3, and will be televised by ESPN or ESPN 2. The team with the highest league winning percentage will serve as host site for the game.

The title game will feature champions from the East and West divisions of the league. Seven different schools have hosted the first 11 championship games.

WKU won its first Conference USA Football Championship last season with a 45-28 win over Southern Miss in Bowling Green, Ky., becoming the first league school to go undefeated in league play and then win the Championship Game. Marshall took its first C-USA title in 2014 with a triumph over Louisiana Tech in Huntington, W. Va. In 2013, Rice won its first C-USA Football title with a victory over Marshall at Rice Stadium. Southern Miss won the 2011 C-USA Championship, when the nationally-ranked Golden Eagles defeated previously undefeated Houston on the Cougars home field. Former members East Carolina, Tulsa and UCF each won two championship games, while Houston claimed one crown.

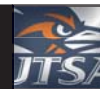
