SEC RUNNERS OF THE WEEK (SEPT. 6)

Men's Runner: Antibahs Kosgei, Alabama

**Alabama senior Antibahs Kosgei won his third race in his last four starts for the Crimson Tide in the season-opening Brooks Memphis Twilight Classic.
**Kosgei completed the four-mile course in 19:11.13, finishing first in a field that included 226 runners.

Women's Runner: Karis Jochen, Texas A&M

**Karis Jochen led Texas A&M to a team victory as she dominated the field and won by 35 seconds in the Aggie Opener.
**Jochen covered the 4,100m course in a time of 13:50.3 and was the lone runner under 14 minutes. The Aggies scored 23 points for the team win.

Men's Freshman: Brennan Fields, Kentucky

**Kentucky's Brennan Fields placed fourth overall and was UK's No. 3 finisher at the season-opening Wildcat Opener.
**He ran a 4k time of 12:00.24 in his first collegiate race, helping UK to a season-opening team victory.

Women's Freshman: Jessica Drop, Georgia

**Georgia's Jessica Drop opened her collegiate career by winning the UGA Cross Country Invitational by four seconds, leading the Lady Bulldogs to dual meet wins versus both Georgia Tech and Kennesaw State
**Drop, whose twin sister Sam finished fifth overall, shot out into the lead from the start line of the 5K and never relinquished it on the way to a 17:43.70 finish.

» Arkansas picked to win SEC titles

The University of Arkansas men and the Arkansas women have been predicted to claim the 2016 Southeastern Conference Cross Country Championships, as decided by a vote of the league's head coaches. The SEC on Aug. 29 released its 2016 SEC Cross Country Preseason Coaches' Poll.

Points for the men's poll were awarded on a 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12 basis, while the women's poll was awarded on a 1-2-3-4-5-6-7-8-9-10-11-12-13 basis. Coaches were not permitted to vote for their own teams.

The Arkansas men were predicted to win the 2016 SEC Cross Country Championship. The Razorbacks claimed the 2015 SEC Championship, their sixth consecutive SEC Championship and 23rd in the last 25 years. The No. 8 Razorbacks garnered 10 first place votes, while Ole Miss earned three first place votes.

The Arkansas women, who have won three consecutive SEC Cross Country Championships, were selected to win the 2016 SEC Cross Country Championship. The Razorbacks received 13 first place votes, and Vanderbilt earned one first place vote.

The 2016 SEC Cross Country Championships are slated to take place Friday, Oct. 28 in Fayetteville, Ark.

» SEC in the NCAA: Cross Country History

- The SEC has won eight NCAA Men's Cross Country Championships, with Arkansas claiming seven and Tennessee winning one. The last SEC NCAA Championship came in 2000, with Arkansas winning its third consecutive.
- The SEC has won one NCAA Women's Cross Country Championship, with Kentucky holding the only title, which the Wildcats won in 1988.
- The SEC boasts two NCAA Cross Country individual titles, as Godfrey Siamusiye of Arkansas won back-to-back national crowns in 1995 and 1996.
- No SEC woman has ever claimed an NCAA Cross Country individual championship. Four SEC women have finished as the NCAA runner-up: Shelly Steely, Florida (1984); Valerie McGovern, Kentucky (1989); Deena Drossin, Arkansas (1992) and Amy Yoder, Arkansas (1999).

» About the SEC

- Since its formation in 1933, the SEC has directed and organized interscholastic athletic competitions, conducted tournaments and prescribed eligibility rules for student-athletes. The Conference also facilitates and assists its member institutions in maintaining intercollegiate athletic programs compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports.
- The Southeastern Conference crowns champions in 21 sports - 12 women's sports and nine men's sports. They include baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, equestrian, football, men's and women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, and volleyball.
- In the fall of 2012, the University of Missouri and Texas A&M University became the 13th and 14th members of the Southeastern Conference. It marked the first expansion for the SEC since 1991 and the second-ever increase for the league since its founding in 1933.
- The SEC's mission statement reflects the priorities of the league. "The purpose of the Southeastern Conference is to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of programs of intercollegiate athletics which are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports."

» Arkansas

Men: Arkansas' men's cross country team heads into its 2016 campaign tabbed as the preseason No. 6 program in the country and the No. 1 selection in the South Central region for the fourth-consecutive year. The Razorbacks have reigned supreme as unchallenged champions of the South Central region since 2013. In total, Arkansas has won 35 regional titles since 1976. Arkansas returns five All-Region performers including Jack Bruce, Austen Dalquist, Alex George, Aidan Swain and Frankline Tonui. In addition to topping the region in preseason standings, Arkansas men's cross country has also been predicted to finish first as a team at the 2016 SEC Cross Country Championship. Opening up the season in Stillwater, Oklahoma at the Cowboy Duals the Razorbacks squad represented primarily by newcomers raced past Oral Roberts with a near perfect score of 16 to the Golden Eagles' 39. The Hogs' top five managed to attain a perfect score of 15 in their match-up with Wichita State all crossing the finish line ahead of the Shockers' top runners. Arkansas was led by Oregon transfer Kyle Levermore who completed the 5K course in 16 minutes, 13.50 seconds. The Mahwah, New Jersey, native placed 12th overall and was followed by Cameron Griffith (15th), Kyle Hosting (16th), Carter Persyn (17th) and Chris Mooneyham (26th). **Women:** Arkansas' women's cross country team has been selected as the No. 1 team of the South Central region in the USTFCCCA preseason rankings. The defending regional champions, Arkansas has maintained their stronghold on the team title for the last five years. Arkansas returns four All-Region performers including Nikki Hiltz, Valerie Reina, Kelsey Schrader and Regan Ward. Ranked 11th in the preseason national polls Arkansas opened the season with an outstanding effort, sweeping head-to-head competition against Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, Oral Roberts, Tulsa and Wichita State at the Cowboy Duals in Stillwater, Oklahoma. The Razorbacks posted three perfect scores in their races versus Oral Roberts, Tulsa and Wichita State as Arkansas' top five, led by freshman Carina Viljoen, completed the course 1-2-3-4-5 in each of those matchups. Viljoen was the top overall performer of the day, clocking a 3,000-meter time of 10 minutes, 35.50 seconds in her debut as a Razorback. She was joined by three additional underclassmen in the Razorbacks' top five including Rachel Nichwitz (second), Micah Huckabee (fourth) and Madeleine Reed (fifth). Returning All-SEC and All-Region performer Kelsey Schrader was also among Arkansas' best placing third within the team and seventh overall. All 13 Razorback entries finished inside the top 40 with their seven best runners among the top 20.

» Auburn

Auburn XC got the 2016 season off to a strong start, with a sweep at the JSU Strut's Opener on Fridays. After finishing last season with a seventh place finish at the NCAA South Regional, senior Veronica Eder picked up where she left off with a first place finish in the women's 4k, running a 13:46.60. Junior Anna Nelson finished second with a 14:25.0 and Rachel Givens finished third with a time of 14:33.90. On the men's side, Kevin Wyss fought off teammates Wesley Curles (15:20.6) and Coleman Churitch (15:20.9), to win the men's 5k with a time of 15:20.00. Juniors Wesley Pectol (15:21.8) and Mitchell Gomez (15:21.9) rounded out the top-five for Auburn. The Tigers will be back in action on Saturday, with a trip to Greenville, S.C. to face off in the Furman Classic.

» Florida

The Florida men's and women's teams both collected season-opening victories last Friday (Sep. 2) at the Covered Bridge Open, hosted by Appalachian State in Boone, N.C. On the women's side all five

of UF's counted scorers placed inside the top 10, including top-five finishes from senior Taylor Tubbs (second), sophomore transfer Noora Wallenius (fourth), and sophomore Elisabeth Bergh (fifth). Those performances led the Gators to a 21-point victory. While the men's competition was decided by just six points, UF's depth made the difference, as all five of its counted scores were inside the top 20. Seniors Carlos Miranda and Mac Reynolds logged a 2-3 finish, while sophomore Jack Guyton cross ninth. This is the 12th consecutive season UF's men won its opening meet. And of the seven men who ran at the Covered Bridge Open a year ago, three of them topped their 2015 times by at least 28 seconds. Florida returns to again on Saturday, Sep. 24, when it hosts the Mountain Dew Invitational at Mark Bostick Golf Course in Gainesville.

» Georgia

Men: The Bulldogs opened their season with their only home meet of the year at the UGA Cross Country Invitational in Bishop, Ga. On an 8K course that wraps around the UGA Equestrian Complex, Georgia tallied dual meet wins over both Georgia Tech and Kennesaw State. Junior Bryan Kamau won his first collegiate cross meet and was the Bulldogs' top finisher for the first time in his career after running a 25:12.42. Kamau sprinted past Yellow Jacket runner and former high school teammate Nahom Solomon in the final 200 meters for the victory. Fifth-year senior Sid Vaughn was next across the line for UGA, taking third with a time of 25:15.76. Junior Austin Sprague, who was making his Bulldog debut after transferring from Furman, finished fourth overall and was the third Georgia finisher after crossing the finish line in 25:20.26. Fellow junior Eric Westog clocked a personal record of 25:43.12 for fifth-place honors while redshirt sophomore Terrell Estime scored for the first time for the Bulldogs with a personal-best time of 26:16.52. Georgia returns to action at the Commodore Classic in Nashville, Tenn., on September 17. **Women:** The Georgia women started their 2016 campaign by sweeping both Georgia Tech and Kennesaw State at the UGA Cross Country Invitational in Bishop. Three true freshmen highlighted the Lady Bulldogs' five scorers with Jessica Drop leading the charge. Drop, a native of Durham, Conn., picked up a four-second victory over junior teammate Morgan Ainslie with a 5K time of 17:43.70. Ainslie ran the fastest time of her career (17:47.94) to be second overall and freshman Yanely Gomez was next across the line in fourth place overall with an 18:14.27. Jessica's twin sister, Sam, was the fifth overall finisher and fourth Lady Bulldog across the line after she completed her laps in 18:17.34. Georgia's fifth and final scorer on the day was junior Laurel Sumner, who registered a time of 18:35.38 for ninth place. Georgia returns to action at the Commodore Classic in Nashville, Tenn., on September 17.

» Kentucky

Kentucky's women's and men's cross country teams both defeated Cincinnati to open the 2016 season on Thursday at Masterson Station Park. Katy Kunc won the women's race 4,000-meter race in 14:12.00, and Kendall Muhammad won the men's 4k in 11:45.51. The Kentucky women's team won 15-50. Kentucky had the top 11 finishers in the women's race with Amy Hansen (14:35.92), Jill Weston (14:36.99), Caroline McCaslin (14:40.68) and Avery Bussjager (14:47.89) earning Kentucky's scoring finishes. The Kentucky men's team defeated Cincinnati 19-41. Daniel Southard placed third overall, and as UK's No. 2 scorer, in 11:59.20.. Brennan Fields crossed the line behind Southard in 12:00.24, Mick Iacofano was fifth overall in 12:01.10, and Ben Young was UK's No. 5 finisher in 12:04.05. Cross country meet team scores are calculated by adding up the values of

top-five placers finishes, with the low score winning. Kentucky's next meet will be the Bluegrass Invitational on Sept. 10 at Masterson Station Park. Kentucky will host the Bluegrass Invitational on Saturday.

» Ole Miss

The Rebels ran in the Brooks Memphis Twilight Classic on Saturday September 3 at Christian Brother's University. The men and women ran teams of younger competitors as a way for them to get a taste of collegiate competition. These youthful squads turned in third place team finishes in both the Men's 4-Mile Run and the Women's 5K. The men were led by junior Derek Gutierrez of Keller, Texas who finished fourth individually with a time of 19:46.79, an almost 30 second improvement from the same meet in 2015. The women were led by junior Anna Braswell of Mobile, Ala., who finished 14th individually with a time of 17:59.75. The Rebels will be back in action Friday September 9 as they play host to the Inaugural Rebel Invite in Oxford, Miss.

» Missouri

Mizzou opened its 2016 season at the Hawkeye Invitational on Friday, finishing sixth on the men's side and seventh on the women's side. On the men's side, redshirt senior Drew White (Crystal City, Mo.) paced the Tigers, finishing fifth in the 6000m with a time of 18:05.60, posting his highest event finish as a Tiger. For the women, redshirt junior Valeska Halamicek (Weldon Spring, Mo.) also posted her best event finish as a Tiger, finishing sixth in the 3000m with a time of 10:29.00. Sophomore Hannah Thomas (Urbandale, Iowa) finished 17th in the 3000m with a time of 10:30.00. Mizzou will next compete at the Commodore Classic on Saturday, Sept. 17 in Nashville, Tenn., where the full Tiger squad is scheduled to race.

» South Carolina

The South Carolina Gamecocks opened their season by winning the Division I portion of the Carolina Challenge. Senior Mary Reisser topped the team and finished second in the division with her 18:39.67 in the 5K race, 12 seconds better than her time from last year's lid lifter. Freshman Anna Kathryn Stoddard broke 19 in her first collegiate race, finishing 11th overall in the field that had 14 college teams and some unattached runners. Senior Martha McCoy topped her best time from a year ago, clocking a 19:04.30 to finish 12th overall. Three more freshmen, Leah Ford, Emily Crouse and Sarah-Sims McGrath, finished in the team's top eight as well with times better than 19:45. The Gamecocks compete in the Winthrop/adidas Invitational on Sept. 17.

» Tennessee

Tennessee's cross country team opened its 2016 season at the Tennessee Dual against UT Martin. The men's team placed first in a 4-mile competition, and the women's squad earned second in the 3-mile race at the opening of the Tennessee Cross Country Course at Cherokee Farm in Knoxville. Sophomore Zach Long returned this season to lead the Vols and recorded a time of 21:00.20. Crossing the line shortly behind was sophomore Wesley Robinson, clocking 21:16.50 to finish third overall. The race included 19 runners; three of Tennessee's 12 runners ran unattached. In the women's 3-mile race, Peighton Meske led the Volunteers. Meske finished the competition in fifth with a time of 18:45.60. Julia Rizor finished just behind Meske, posting a time of 18:54.50. Her sister, Jessica Rizor, completed the race in 18:57.30 to take seventh. The Vols will be off next week as they prepare for the Commodore Classic at Vaughn's

Gap Course at Percy Warner Park in Nashville on Sept. 17.

» Texas A&M

Texas A&M opened the cross country season by claiming a pair of individual wins on the way to securing both team titles in the Aggie Opener held on its Dale Watts course. The Aggies will compete again on September 24 when they host the Texas A&M Invitational. **Men:** Cameron Villarreal won the men's 6,000-meter race in a time of 18:18.1 as the Aggies compiled a perfect score of 15 points to defeat Lamar (15), UTSA (72) and Texas Southern (120). In addition to claiming the top five positions, Texas A&M also had nine of the top 10 finishers in the race. Austin Wells clocked 8:30.4 as runner-up. Completing the Aggies perfect score were Elliott Farris in third place at 18:30.8, Jacob Perry fourth with an 18:31.0, and Christian Farris in fifth (18:40.8). Colin Stoeber led the next crew in sixth (18:53.3) while Ryan Teel (18:58.3), Eli Canal (18:59.4), and Aaron Murray (19:00.3) placed 8-9-10. **Women:** Texas A&M scored 23 points to defeat Lamar (47) and UTSA (66). Aggie senior Karis Jochen led the women's field by 35 seconds in covering the 4,100m course in a time of 13:50.3. Texas A&M claimed places fourth through 13th with a wave of finishers, led by freshman Ashley Driscoll, who ran 14:36.9 in her debut race for the Aggies. The top five Texas A&M finishers included Kelsey Persyn (14:40.6), Haley Deakins (14:42.3) and Devin Norton (14:53.9). The next batch of Aggie finishers included Hannah Campbell (14:59.3), Katie Watson (14:59.6), Laura Craig (15:01.9), Lauryn Barrientos (15:04.9), Lauren Fontana (15:12.3) and Amelia McElhinney (15:12.4).

» Vanderbilt

Competing at the Belmont Opener on Saturday, the No. 28-ranked Commodores captured the women's team title by placing five runners among the Top-8. Sophomore Sara Tsai was the star of the show, sailing to first place with a time of 17:29.9 and finishing more than 12 seconds ahead of runner-up Brooke Kingma of Belmont. The Commodores – competing on their home course that they share with Belmont – demonstrated their pack mentality, with a spread of just 19.5 seconds between their top five runners. Vanderbilt finished with 24 points, followed by Lipscomb with 31 and Belmont with 86. Maddie Criscione was the second Commodore across the line, finishing third overall at 17:43.5. Devon Grisbaum was fifth at 17:46.1. Reagan Anderson was seventh at 17:47.7 and Megan Huebner was eighth at 17:49.4. On the men's side, Jake Van Geffen took 19th with a time of 15:48.3 to pace the Commodores, who finished fourth among the D-I teams. Vanderbilt's Nikolaos Gkotsis was 21st at 15:53.1. The Commodores return to action in two weeks, when they host their only home meet of the season, the Commodore Classic.
