Tennessee holds a .656 winning percentage since the start of the 2015 season - a 21-11 mark - that ranks No. 24 among the Power 5.

Redshirt senior defensive tackle Kendal Vickers has made 32 consecutive starts - the longest active streak on the team, and the most starts by a current Vol defender. The Havelock, N.C., native has 28 tackles, 3.0 TFLs and 1.5 sacks in 2017.

23

Daniel Bituli tallied 23 tackles against Georgia Tech in the season-opener - the most by a player in CFB this season and the most by a Vol since 1988. He ranks second in the SEC with 9.2 tackles per game.

22

Trey Smith has emerged as the nation's top freshman offensive lineman and one of college football's top freshmen overall, while leading Tennessee with 22 knockdowns in six starts at right guard.

129.2

The Vols lead the SEC and also rank first among Power 5 schools in pass defense this season, allowing just 129.2 yards per game through the air.

Tennessee has scored nine kick return or punt return touchdowns since 2015 - tied for the second-most in the nation in that span with San Diego State and Washington, and behind Alabama (10).

4.67

Tennessee's defense is averaging 4.67 3-and-outs per game - a mark that ranks tied for 19th in the nation. The Vols have forced 28 3-and-outs in 79 drives (35.45%).

72

Trevor Daniel's 72-yard punt vs. South Carolina was the longest by a Vol this century and the second-longest by a Power 5 player this season.

133

The Vols totaled 133 yards in the first quarter versus South Carolina - its largest first quarter total in 2017. John Kelly had 46 yards rushing, while Jarrett Guarantano had 44 total yards.



HEAD COACH BUTCH JONES

>> FIFTH SEASON AT TENNESSEE >> 11TH SEASON AS HC



BUTCH JONES enters his fifth season at Tennessee and his 11th season overall as a head coach in 2017 with a résumé that not only places him among the top coaches in the Southeastern Conference, but also the entire country.

Jones' teams have won four conference championships, advanced to eight bowls and finished in the Top 25 five times during his 10 seasons as a head coach at Tennessee, Cincinnati and Central Michigan. Along the way, Jones has coached six All-Americans, 76 all-conference selections and 21 NFL Draft picks, including the NFL's highest-paid wide receiver Antonio Brown, and Tennessee's most recent first-round pick, Derek Barnett, who was selected at No. 14 by the Philadelphia Eagles in 2017. Jones holds an 83-51 record (.619) in 10-plus seasons as a head coach.

Tennessee is one of just three SEC teams to win at least nine games the last two seasons and one of just nine teams in the nation to win bowl games in three consecutive seasons heading into the fall. Momentum continues to build on Rocky Top under Jones as the charismatic leader has pushed the Vols to a 30-21 mark and three straight winning seasons for the first time in 12 years, while instilling a championship culture back to a program that had recorded just one winning season in the previous five years when he took over Tennessee prior to the 2013 campaign.

Faced with a rebuild when he was announced as the new head coach on Dec. 7, 2012, Jones has remodeled the Vols "brick by brick" into a consistent winner in his own image, as a passionate, competitive and consistent band of brothers, working tirelessly to bring Tennessee back to the top of the SEC.

Jones also has made developing men off the field a top priority at Tennessee and throughout his career. He has coached 203 academic all-conference award winners, including 109 SEC academic honor roll recipients at Tennessee. Under Jones, every academic

record in Tennessee football history has been broken and 84 Vols have earned degrees. In 2016, three Vols collected Academic All-District honors, while every senior on the 2016 team graduated with a degree. Last spring, Joshua Dobbs received the Torchbearer Award for 2016-17 – the highest honor given to a student at the University of Tennessee in recognition of their accomplishments in the community and academics. Additionally, 67 student-athletes earned Vol Scholar designation in 2016-17 for having a 3.0 GPA. UT football has achieved its highest-ever GPA, single-year and multi-year APR, and Graduation Success Rate during Jones' first four years at the helm. Over the last two seasons, 26 Vols have played in bowl games as college graduates.

A two-time BIG EAST Coach of the Year, Jones took over a program that hadn't won a bowl game since 2007. Jones' Vols have won three consecutive bowl games for the first time in over 20 years (1994-95-96) and have brought back-to-back nine-win seasons to Rocky Top for the first time in nearly a decade. Entering the 2017 season, the Vols own a 15-4 mark in their last 19 games, which is the second-best mark in the SEC.

Jones joined UT from the University of Cincinnati, where he finished with a 23-14 record (.657) in three seasons with the Bearcats. Jones was also the head coach for three years at Central Michigan (27-13, .675, from 2007-09). He has won at least eight games in seven of his 10 years as a head coach, including five seasons of nine-plus wins (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016). Jones has won 10 or more games twice, finishing 11-2 at CMU in 2009 and posting a 10-3 record with Cincinnati in 2011. He has led teams to four conference championships in his 10 seasons as a head coach, including the Big East title in 2011 and 2012 with Cincinnati and the 2007 and 2009 Mid-American Conference titles at Central Michigan.

JONES LEADS 2013 POWER 5 COACHING HIRES

Butch Jones was among 13 coaches hired by Power 5 programs in 2013 when Tennessee tabbed him to rebuild the Vols. Jones' résumé leads the pack of hires from that year. Only eight coaches remain in same job over four years later.

- Jones leads all of the 13 coaches with THREE BOWL WINS over the last four years
- Jones is the only coach of the eight still at their schools to win 9 or more games at least twice (Gary Anderson won 9+ games twice at Wisconsin, while Mark Helfrich won 9+ three times at Oregon).
- Jones is the only coach among the 13 to improve or maintain the previous years' win total each season.

JONES BY THE NUMBERS

JONES VS. RANKED FOES

- Tennessee is seeking its first win over ranked opponent this season. After going 3-2 against AP Top 25 teams in 2016, the Vols are 0-2 versus ranked foes in 2017.
- The Vols are 5-6 against ranked teams since 2015.
- Overall, Butch Jones has six wins over ranked teams as Tennessee's head coach.

MOST DRAFT PICKS IN FIRST 4 ROUNDS IN 15 YEARS

- Jones attended the 2017 NFL Draft and watched Derek Barnett's selection by the Philadelphia Eagles with the No. 14 pick in the first round. Overall, six Vols were selected in the draft's first four rounds - the most UT draftees in the first four rounds in 15 years (since six went in rounds 1-4 in 2002).

SPECIAL TEAMS STANDARD

- Jones' coached teams make special teams a priority. Tennessee has finished in the Top 20 in kickoff returns and punt returns in 2015 and 2016, including No. 1 in kickoff returns (33.4 avg, 3 TDs) and No. 4 in punt returns (17.2 avg, 3 TDs) in 2015. The Vols ranked No. 11 in kickoff returns (24.9, 1 TD) and No. 18 in punt returns (11.1, 1 TD) in 2016.

COACHING NOTES

TENNESSEE TURNAROUND

- Tennessee has won 33 games over the last four seasons under Jones and produced a winning record in three straight seasons. In the previous eight seasons before Jones arrived, the Vols had only produced three winning seasons.

► SERIES NOTES

- Tennessee and Alabama have played every year since 1928 with the exception of 1943.
- With this year being the 100th time the two teams have met on the gridiron, Alabama has won 10 consecutive meetings and leads the all-time series 54-38-7.
- The Alabama series is the third-longest in UT history (99 games) behind Kentucky (112) and Vanderbilt (110).
- UT's last win over Alabama came in 2006. Arian Foster scored the game-winning touchdown in the fourth quarter to put the Vols up, 16-13. It was their first lead of the game.
- Tennessee won seven consecutive games in the series from 1995-2001 and is the only school to defeat the Crimson Tide in at least seven consecutive meetings.
- The Vols lost to Alabama, 49-10, at home last season in a matchup between top-10 teams.
- The last time the two teams met in Tuscaloosa, the Volunteers stayed within one score from start to finish thanks to an outstanding effort by its defense, which tallied 10 tackles for a loss and five sacks and made a pair of big red zone stops in the second half. A late offensive surge seized a 19-14 win for No. 8/8 Alabama in the fourth quarter. UT's five sacks were its most against Alabama since recording five in 2005.
- Alabama defensive backs coach Derrick Ansley held the same position for Tennessee during the 2012 season.

GAME NOTES

Redshirt junior running back Alvin Kamara carded his third rushing touchdown of the season and 10th of his career midway through the second quarter, punching it in from seven yards out to help UT capitalize on an Alabama fumble. UT furthered its streak to 22 consecutive games with a rushing TD, dating to 2014.

Junior defensive end Derek Barnett came up with a huge sack midway through the second quarter, taking down Alabama quarterback Jalen Hurts for a 14-yard loss and forcing a fumble. It was Barnett's sixth sack this season and 26th of his career.

Barnett is now all alone at third for career sacks at UT, trailing Leonard Little (28, 1995-97) and Reggie White (32, 1980-83). Barnett recorded his first career interception in the game, which was the first by a Vol defensive lineman since Jacques Smith had one vs. Auburn in 2013.

Safety Todd Kelly Jr. recorded a career-high 11 tackles, including seven solos, to pace the Vol defense.

Evan Berry moved into third on Tennessee's career kickoff return yards list, surpassing Devrin Young (1,543, 2011-14).

#9/11 TENNESSEE FALLS TO #1 ALABAMA 49-10

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. -- No. 9/11 Tennessee fell to No. 1/1 Alabama 49-10 on Saturday at Neyland Stadium.

Alabama jumped out to a 14-0 lead, but Tennessee (5-2, 2-2 SEC) pulled within seven in the second quarter after forcing a turnover in Crimson Tide territory. Derek Barnett got around the edge and forced a fumble by quarterback Jalen Hurts. Quay Picou recovered the ball to set the Vols up at Alabama's 11-yard line. Two plays later, Alvin Kamara rushed seven yards up the middle on a read-option play to bring the score to 14-7.

Alabama (7-0, 4-0 SEC) opened the scoring with an eight-play, 91-yard drive, capped by a 29-yard touchdown. On second down, wideout Calvin Ridley took a short shovel pass from Hurts and then handed off to ArDarius Stewart on the reverse. Stewart, who entered the play from the right side of the formation, took the ball 29 yards into the left corner of the end zone.

The Crimson Tide pushed its lead to 14-0 when Ronnie Harrison picked off Joshua Dobbs on a screen pass intended for Jalen Hurd and returned the ball 58 yards for a touchdown with 14 seconds left in the first quarter.

Alabama responded after Tennessee's score as Hurts held the ball on a read-option and took it 45 yards off the right side for an Alabama score.

Tennessee kept Alabama off the scoreboard twice near the end of the second quarter as Shy Tuttle deflected a pass by Hurts and Barnett caught the ball for the first interception of his career. After a UT punt, Alabama drove the ball into field goal position, but Adam Griffith missed a 37-yarder as time expired, keeping the score at 21-7 entering halftime.

Alabama added another score on their second possession of the third quarter. The Crimson Tide traveled 51 yards in five plays as Hurts hit Stewart on a 23-yard crossing pattern and followed that with a 21-yard rush to the right, before punching it into the end zone from two yards out on a sweep to the right.

Aaron Medley chipped into the deficit with a 37-yard field goal to make the score 28-10 at the 4:03 mark of the third quarter.

However, Alabama responded with another Hurts touchdown run that extended the Tide's lead 35-10. Alabama added two more scores on Eddie Jackson's 79-yard punt return and Bo Scarbrough's 85-yard run in the fourth quarter to push the margin to 49-10.

Josh Malone notched a team-high 61 receiving yards on five catches. Barnett finished with one sack, one forced fumble, one interception and two tackles for loss. Todd Kelly Jr. (11), Elliott Berry (nine) and Baylen Buchanan (eight) all set career highs in tackles while Emmanuel Moseley tied his career best with eight tackles.

Hurts finished the game with 143 yards passing, 132 yards rushing and three rushing touchdowns. Scarbrough had 109 rushing yards and Damien Harris tallied 94 rushing yards. Alabama had success on the ground, totaling 438 rushing yards as a team.

The Vols were not able to overcome the rash of injuries that they have battled through over the past month. Starters Cameron Sutton, Jalen Reeves-Maybin, Darrin Kirkland Jr., Malik Foreman, Cortez McDowell, Jashon Robertson and Dylan Weisman did not play on Saturday. Additionally, Brett Kendrick, Micah Abernathy and Kahlii McKenzie left the game and did not return for the Vols..

ANDERSON TRAINING CENTER

Tennessee's state-of-the-art Anderson Training Center is one of the most modern and functional buildings of its kind.

The 145,000-square foot building includes an amphitheater-style team room, coaches' offices, position meeting rooms, a dining hall, players' lounge, a 7,000-square foot locker room, a 22,000-square foot, multi-level weight room as well as a new training room, hydrotherapy and nutrition area.

The building also features several technological upgrades, including a state-of-the-art video delivery system for players and coaches. The locker room includes roomy, custom-built and ventilated lockers with electrical outlets for charging portable devices like cellphones, iPods and laptops.

Also included in the building is an updated football hall of fame area.

The Anderson Training Center joins the Brenda Lawson Athletic Center and Neyland-Thompson Sports Center. It provides student-athletes direct

access to both the 120-yard Robert E. White indoor football field and Haslam Field, Tennessee's two outdoor football practice fields.

The facility is named in honor of the leadership support of the Anderson family, including Charlie and Moll Anderson of Knoxville, Terry and Susan Anderson and Charlie Sr. and Hilda Anderson, both of Florence, Ala. Charlie is a former student-athlete with the Volunteer football program (1974-76) and served as a Board of Trustee member. He and Moll have been leadership donors to athletics for many years and have also impacted multiple areas of campus with their generosity. Terry also played football at UT and his son, Carson, also played for the Vols and graduated in Dec. 2012.

The \$45 million facility had its dedication ceremony on April 19, 2013.

- The Vols will look to earn their first SEC win and snap a 10-game losing streak to Alabama.
- Tennessee is 18-29-6 all-time against the Crimson Tide when playing in the state of Alabama (4-8 is Tuscaloosa and 14-21-6 in Birmingham).
- Saturday's game will be 100th meeting all-time between Tennessee and Alabama (Bama leads series 54-38-7).
- UT is looking to end a two-game losing streak following back-to-back home losses to Georgia and South Carolina.
- Saturday's contest will be broadcast nationally on CBS at 3:30 ET and has been tabbed the CBS SEC Game of the Week. The Vols are 0-2 when playing on CBS this season with losses to Florida and Georgia.

WEEK IN REVIEW

- The Vols are coming off a close 15-9 loss at home to South Carolina last Saturday.
- Tennessee was held without a touchdown for the second straight game, the first time that has happened under head coach Butch Jones.
- UT drove down to the Gamecocks' 2-yard line on the game's final possession and had a chance to win before Jarrett Guarantano's pass was broken up in the endzone as time expired.
- Guarantano, a redshirt freshman, made his first-career start and finished 11-of-18 passing with 133 yards with no touchdowns or interceptions.
- The Tennessee defense continued its solid play, holding the Gamecocks to just one touchdown and 129 passing yards.
- Redshirt junior DB Rashaan Gaulden matched a career high with 10 tackles to lead the defense.

SCOUTING ALABAMA

- Alabama enters this Saturday as the unanimous No. 1 team in both the AP Poll and Amway Coaches' Poll after starting the year 7-0.
- The Crimson Tide are coming off a 41-9 home victory over Arkansas last Saturday.
- Bama ranks first nationally in rushing defense, allowing just 66.7 yards per game.
- The Tide lead the SEC in scoring (42.7 ppg), scoring defense (10.1 ppg), rushing yards (302.6 ypg), rushing defense (66.7 ypg) and total offense (484.9 ypg).
- RB Damien Harris ranks second in the SEC with nine touchdowns this season.
- Alabama has forced 14 turnovers and leads the SEC in turnover margin and interceptions (10). Levi Wallace leads the team with three picks.

A WIN WOULD...

- Snap a 10-game losing streak against Alabama.
- Give UT its first SEC victory of the year.
- Improve UT's road record against Bama to 19-29-6.
- Be UT's first road victory of the season.
- Give Tennessee its 833rd win in program history.
- Give Butch Jones his 84th career victory and 34th as head coach at Tennessee.

UT vs. TOP-RANKED TEAMS

- Tennessee is 2-10 all-time vs. teams ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll and has never beaten an AP No. 1 ranked team on the road.
- The Vols' last win over an AP No. 1 ranked team came in 1985 when an unranked Tennessee team defeated No. 1 Auburn, 38-20, in Knoxville.

- UT's only other win over a top-ranked opponent came in 1959 when the Vols beat LSU, 14-13, in Knoxville.

RANKED WINS UNDER JONES

- Tennessee had recorded six wins over ranked foes since Butch Jones took over as head coach in 2013.
- Five of those six victories have come since 2015.
- The Vols were 1-22 vs. ranked teams in the five seasons prior to Jones' arrival.
- A win on Saturday would be the first win over a top-10 team for Tennessee under Jones.

KELLY LEADING THE OFFENSE

- RB John Kelly has been the driving force behind the Tennessee offense through six games this season, averaging 133.7 yards from scrimmage (tops in the SEC).
- The Detroit, Mich., native ranks second in the Southeastern Conference in rushing yards/game (92.0) and sixth in rushing touchdowns (6).
- Kelly and Penn State's Heisman contender Saquon Barkley are the only two Power 5 running backs to lead their teams in rushing yards and receptions.
- Kelly has three 100-yard rushing games so far this

season (Georgia Tech, Florida & UMass).

- Kelly accounted for 237 of UT's 442 total offensive yards UT's loss to Florida. He set career highs with 141 yards rushing and 96 receiving yards and scored his fifth touchdown of the year.
- Kelly became the first Vol to rush for four touchdowns in a game since James Stewart did so against Georgia in 1994 after doing so in the season opener against Georgia Tech.

HISTORIC START FOR KELLY

- RB John Kelly is off to one of the best starts rushing in program history with 552 rushing yards through UT's first six games.

BIG PLAY CALLAWAY

- Vols' sophomore WR Marquez Callaway has been a big play threat for the Vols so far this season.
- Callaway is averaging 19.58 yards per catch this season, which ranks seventh in the SEC and 21st nationally.
- The Georgia native also ranks 10th in the SEC with three receiving touchdowns.
- Callaway also is a threat on punt returns, ranking second in the SEC and 14th in the country in punt return average (13.2).
- Callaway had a breakout performance in the season opener to help UT defeat Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game.
- Callaway set career highs with 115 receiving yards on just four catches (28.75 avg) and added a pair of touchdown grabs to spark the UT offense in the second half.

JOHNSON EMERGING AS CONSISTENT TARGET AT WR

- Sophomore WR Brandon Johnson has emerged as a go-to target for the Vols this season.
- Johnson leads the team with 259 receiving yards and is second on the team with 21 receptions.
- The Florida native led UT with three catches for 54 yards in last week's loss to South Carolina.
- Johnson had a breakout performance in UT's win over UMass on Sept. 23.
- Johnson set career highs with seven catches for 123 yards, including a 66-yard catch and run to set up the Vols' first touchdown late in the first half.

SPREADING THE LOVE

- Tennessee has featured a balanced passing attack with 15 players having caught at least one pass already this season.
- Four Vols have hauled in 10 or more catches this season (John Kelly - 24, Brandon Johnson - 21, Marquez Callaway - 12, Ethan Wolf - 10).

- Senior center Jashon Robertson is Tennessee's top graded offensive lineman with an average grade of 80.4 %.

- Robertson has given up ZERO sacks in 2017, while registering 14 knockdowns – second-best on the team.

- Offensive lineman Trey Smith is among the best freshmen in the country.
- The Jackson, Tenn., native is the nation's top-rated freshman offensive lineman and the No. 7 freshman overall according to PFF College. Smith is also a Freshman All-America candidate.
- Smith is one of just two UT offensive linemen to start every game for the Vols this season and leads the team with 22 knockdowns.
- Smith ranks second on the team in average grade and led UT with a 70 % grade vs. Georgia, one of the top defensive teams in the country.
- Smith's 78 % grade last week vs. South Carolina was his highest of the season.
- Smith was rated the No. 1 overall player in the ESPN 300 recruiting rankings coming out of high school.

VERSATILE KENDRICK MAKING FINAL SEASON COUNT

- Redshirt senior Brett Kendrick has started 19 consecutive games for the Vols across three different positions: right tackle, left tackle and left guard.

- The Dodd Trophy, college football's most coveted coaching award, celebrates the head coach of a team who enjoys success on the gridiron, while also stressing the importance of scholarship, leadership and integrity – the three pillars of legendary coach Bobby Dodd's philosophy. Dodd was Georgia Tech's head coach from 1945-66 and was also a three-year Tennessee letterman from 1928-30, earning All-America honors in 1930.
- The watch list was created through a selection process by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation and Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, taking into consideration each program's graduation rate, commitment to service and charity in the community, projected success for the 2017 season and Academic Progress Rate (APR).

HC EXPERIENCE ON STAFF

- Tennessee has four assistant coaches that boast Division I head coaching experience.
- Associate head coach Brady Hoke and defensive coordinator Bob Shoop have each logged full-time head coaching experience, while offensive coordinator Larry Scott and quarterbacks coach Mike Canales have each served in interim roles.
- Hoke became the first Michigan head coach to go undefeated at home in his first two seasons since Fielding Yost in 1901-02. Hoke also became one of eight coaches to direct a team to a BCS bowl in his first season while he became the third coach to direct a team to a BCS bowl victory in his first season. Nationally, he was named the Maxwell Football Club Collegiate Coach of the Year and was named a finalist for three other national coach-of-the-year honors: the Bear Bryant, Eddie Robinson and Liberty Mutual awards. The Big Ten Conference's coaches voted Hoke as the inaugural recipient of the Hayes-Schembechler Coach-of-the-Year Award, while the Big Ten media named him the Dave McClain Coach of the Year.

- On top of being selected to the Senior Bowl Watch List and his Preseason All-SEC accolades, Trevor Daniel was named to the preseason watch list for the 2017 Ray Guy Award. The award is given annually to the nation's top punter.
- Daniel was recently named to The Athletic's Midseason All-SEC Team.
- Daniel currently ranks third nationally with a 48.2 net punting average.**
- Daniel started the 2017 season vs. Georgia Tech (9/4) with five punts inside the 20-yard line and one punt inside the 10-yard line. He also tied his career-long punt of 70 yards (at SC, 2016) during the first quarter against the Yellow Jackets. His performance earned him Ray Guy Punter of the Week honors (9/5).
- Of Daniel's four punts vs. Indiana State (9/9), he landed three inside the 10-yard line and had two punts over 50 yards.
- Daniel finished the game vs. UMass (9/23) with eight punts for 391 yards and a 48.9 average. He had four punts over 50 yards and landed two punts inside the five-yard line.
- Carded efforts of 56 (1Q), 53 (1Q), 52 (2Q) and 53 yards (4Q) vs. Georgia on Sept. 30, en route a 46.3 punting average
- In 2016, Daniel posted a 44.6-yard average with 28 of his 70 punts inside the 20, 29 fair catches and 21 punts of 50 or more yards.
- Daniel was a candidate for the Ray Guy Award in both 2015 and 2016.

BERRY IN THE RECORD BOOKS

- Evan Berry is one of 46 multi-talented college football student-athletes on the 2017 Watch List for the Paul Hornung Award presented by Texas Roadhouse. The Paul Hornung Award, now in its eighth season, is given annually to the most versatile player in major college football.
- In the 2017 season opener vs. Georgia Tech (9/4), Berry returned two kicks for 86 yards, including a season-long 51-yard return. The return is his longest since UT's game at South Carolina in 2016 when he returned a kick for 100-yard touchdown.
- The Georgia native earned Athlon Preseason All-America honors this offseason and was a 2016 Coaches Second Team All-SEC selection after averaging 32.9 yards on 14 kick returns, including a 100-yard return for a touchdown at South Carolina on Oct. 29.
- In 2016, he also tallied 12 tackles and one tackle for loss. As a sophomore in 2015, he ranked first in the NCAA with a 38.3-yard kickoff return average and was named a First Team All-American by Walter Camp, Sporting News and Sports Illustrated.
- For his career, Berry has returned 51 kicks for 1,763 yards, a UT-record 34.6-yard average and four touchdowns. His 34.6-yard career kickoff return average is the best mark of any current player in the NCAA, regardless of division.**

GAULDEN GOING STRONG

- Tennessee redshirt junior DB Rashaan Gaulden has been one of the Vols' top defensive players this season.
- Gaulden ranks third on the team with 40 tackles and three TFLs. He is also tied for the team lead with one interception and has forced a fumble.
- The Spring Hill, Tenn., native tied a career high with 10 tackles in last Saturday's game vs. South Carolina.
- Gaulden was targeted five times against USC and allowed just two catches for four yards, limiting Gamecocks' QB Jake Bentley to a 47.9 passer rating in those situations.

SACK PARTY

- Tennessee's defense logged seven sacks against UMass (9/23), marking the Vols' most since posting seven against Vanderbilt on Nov. 22, 2008.
- It was also the first time since UT's Oct. 8 game at Texas A&M in 2016 that six different players recorded a sack: Kendal Vickers (0.5), Colton Jumper (2.5), Kahlii McKenzie (1), Jonathan Kongbo (1), Alexis Johnson (1) and Elliott Berry (1).
- Colton Jumper's 2.5 sacks vs. UMass (9/23) were the most by a Vol in a single game since VFL Derek Barnett collected 3.0 sacks at South Carolina on Oct. 29, 2016.
- With 4.5 sacks this season, Jumper is tied for sixth in the SEC and tied for 27th nationally.**

JUMPING OFF THE STAT SHEET

- Senior LB Colton Jumper is in the midst of a career season, as he leads the team in TFLs (7.0) and sacks (4.5), both single-season career bests.
- Entering Tennessee's game at Florida, Jumper had zero career sacks. Over the past four games, Jumper has a combined 4.5 sacks, and is currently tied for sixth in the SEC in that category.

CAREER FIRSTS ON DEFENSE

- Three seconds into the second quarter vs. No. 7 Georgia, senior defensive back Justin Martin intercepted Jake Fromm's first pass (and the first of his career) to set up a Tennessee drive starting at the UGA 27 (9/30).
- Martin has forced a turnover (one forced fumble and one interception) in each of Tennessee's last two SEC games. Martin had previously never forced a turnover.
- Redshirt sophomore defensive end Darrell Taylor forced the first fumble of his career during Georgia's opening drive of the third quarter, forcing the Bulldogs to punt (9/30).
- Redshirt sophomore linebacker Quart'e Sapp had a career game vs. Georgia, collecting 10 tackles and the first tackle for loss of his career (9/30).
- With under seven minutes to go in the second quarter vs. UMass, redshirt junior defensive lineman Alexis Johnson brought down Andrew Ford for a four-yard loss, marking the first sack of his UT career (9/23).
- With 1:17 left in the third quarter, senior linebacker Elliott Berry sacked Ford for a three-yard loss to the UMass 27 (9/23). It was the first sack of Berry's career.
- Senior linebacker Colton Jumper sacked Florida quarterback Felipe Franks for a nine-yard loss on 3rd-and-8 two minutes into the second quarter (9/16). It marked the first sack of Jumper's career in his 29th career game and was the first sack by a Vols linebacker since Darrin Kirkland had a sack versus Virginia Tech on Sept. 10, 2016.
- Redshirt sophomore Darrell Taylor also recorded the first sack of his career for a 15-yard loss with just under nine minutes remaining in the first half at Florida (9/16). He

also recovered the first fumble of his career during the third quarter.

- Senior Justin Martin and sophomore Nigel Warrior both recorded the first forced fumbles of their careers during the second half against Florida (9/16).
- Freshman DE Deandre Johnson logged the Vols' first sack of 2017 in the fourth quarter vs. Indiana State (9/9) when he strip sacked Sycamores' QB Isaac Harker for a 10-yard loss on a 3rd-and-8. The sack was also Johnson's first of his career.

FIRST HALF STATS

- UT held South Carolina to 104 yards total offense (49 rushing and 55 passing) in the first half. Rashaan Gaulden, Quart'e Sapp, Micah Abernathy, Justin Martin, Kyle Phillips and Shaq Wiggins each had at least two tackles in the half (10/14).
- Tennessee held South Carolina to just three points in the first half, marking the third time this season the Vols have held an opponent without a touchdown in the first half.
- On Sept. 9, UT held Indiana State scoreless in the first half and went on to win 42-7. On Sept. 16, the Vols trailed Florida, 6-3, at halftime before falling to the Gators, 26-20.

THIRD DOWN, LET'S GO

- This season, Tennessee has limited opposing defenses to just 17 third down conversions on 54 attempts while playing in Neyland Stadium.
- UT's defense stymied Indiana State on third downs during a 42-7 win on Sept. 9. The Sycamores were 0-of-11 on third-down conversions.
- The Vols last held an opponent to one third-down conversion or less on Sept. 19, 2015, when Tennessee held Western Carolina to 1-of-12.

BITULI TACKLES UT RECORDS

- Sophomore linebacker Daniel Bituli ranks sixth in the SEC with 8.0 tackles per game
- Bituli posted a career-high 23 tackles against Georgia Tech in UT's season opener on Sept. 4.
- The Tennessee native's career outing tied for the eighth-most tackles in a single game in UT history. Former Vol Keith Delong last collected 23 tackles vs. Alabama in 1988.
- Bituli's 23 tackles were more than any Vol had in any game in 2016. Jalen Reeves-Maybin had a UT season-high 13 tackles against Virginia Tech in the Battle at Bristol on Sept. 10, 2016, at Bristol Motor Speedway. Reeves-Maybin was the last Vol to record 20 tackles in a game as he tallied 21 total stops against Oklahoma on Sept. 12, 2015.

DANIEL MAKES CASE FOR RAY GUY

- Redshirt senior punter Trevor Daniel ranks second in the SEC and third nationally among FBS punters with an average of 48.2 yards per attempt.
- Finished the South Carolina game with a 52.3 punting average, marking a career-best. His previous career-high of 51.3 was set at Florida in 2015.
- Last Saturday's (10/14) average ties for third in UT's single-game record book. VFL Chris Hogue last recorded a 52.3 punting average vs. Nebraska in the 1998 Orange Bowl.
- Daniel's 72-yard punt in the fourth quarter vs. the Gamecocks is a career-long. It's also the longest punt in a regular-season game by a Tennessee player since VFL Joey Chapman booted an 74-yard punt vs. Pacific in 1990.
- Daniel has placed 15 punts inside the 20 this season with a punt to the SC-11 in the third quarter vs. South Carolina. The total is tied for first in the SEC and eighth nationally. He has pinned 68 punts inside the 20 for his career.

- Daniel has boomed six punts inside the 10 in 2017 and 33 for his career.

HOUSE CALL FOR CHANDLER

- True freshman running back Ty Chandler returned the opening kickoff vs. Indiana State (9/9) 91 yards for a touchdown to put the Vols up 7-0 just 14 seconds into the game.
- Chandler became the first Vol to return an opening kick for a touchdown since Oct. 3, 2015 when Evan Berry did so vs. Arkansas. He is the first Tennessee true freshman to accomplish the feat since Leonard Scott returned one for 100 yards against Georgia in 1999.
- Chandler earned SEC Freshman of the Week honors on last week.

TO THE CHECKERBOARDS!

- Since Butch Jones took over the helm of the program in 2013, Tennessee has scored 11 touchdowns on kick returns and punt returns combined. Alabama leads the nation with 14.
- In kick returns alone, the Vols' five touchdowns since 2013. Duke leads the country with eight heading into Week 7.
- With nine special teams touchdowns since 2015, Tennessee is tied for second with Washington and San Diego State and trails only Alabama (10) among FBS schools.

- Tennessee's double overtime win over Georgia Tech in Atlanta marked UT's 20th overtime game in program history—the most of any FBS team since the overtime rule was implemented during the 1995-96 bowl season.
- The victory over the Yellow Jackets also marked UT's 13th overtime win in school history—the most among FBS programs.
- The Vols are 13-7 in overtime games and their 20 overtime appearances are the most in FBS history.

2016 IN REVIEW

- In 2016, the Vols finished in the Top 25 (CFP No. 21, AP No. 22, Coaches No. 24) for the second straight season. Led by Dobbs at quarterback, the Vols put together the most prolific offense in Big Orange history.
- The Vols' explosive offense set a new school record for points scored (473), while piling up 5,768 yards of total offense – the second-most in Tennessee history.
- UT had the SEC's second-best scoring offense at 36.3 points per game.
- On defense, VFL and first round draft pick Derek Barnett totaled an SEC-best 13.0 sacks en route to consensus All-America accolades and broke Reggie White's career sack record with 33.0.

SEC PRESEASON PICKS

- At the 2017 SEC Media Days in Hoover, Ala., Tennessee was picked to finish third in the SEC Eastern Division and four Vols received Preseason All-SEC Honors: Jashon Robertson, Jauan Jennings, Evan Berry and Trevor Daniel.
- Five Vols were also named to Athlon Preseason All-SEC Teams: Berry, Jennings, Robertson, Darrin Kirkland Jr. and Daniel.
- Four players earned Preseason Coaches All-SEC teams recognition on Aug. 23.
- Berry collected second-team recognition as a return specialist, while senior offensive lineman Robertson, junior wide receiver Jennings and redshirt senior punter Daniel grabbed third team selections.

ELI WOLF EARNS SCHOLARSHIP

- Head Coach Butch Jones awarded redshirt sophomore walk-on Eli Wolf a scholarship during training camp on August 15 during Tennessee's "Circle of Life" drill.
- As Wolf squared off with his older brother Ethan Wolf, a senior tight end for the Vols, Jones blew his whistle to start the drill. Eli and Ethan lunged towards each other only to be stopped right before contact by a second Jones whistle. Jones then handed Eli Wolf a slip of paper announcing that he would receive a scholarship.
- To the coaching staff and Team 121, Wolf's consistency and work ethic in the weight room and on the field have been invaluable and played a part in the decision to award him a scholarship.

2017 NFL DRAFT RECAP

- Jones' fourth Tennessee team found additional success following the season when six Vols were selected in the 2017 NFL Draft in the spring.
- At No. 14, Derek Barnett became the highest drafted Vol since Eric Berry (No. 5) in 2010 and UT had its most players drafted in the first four rounds since 2002 as all six Vols were selected before the start of the fifth round.
- In addition to Barnett, who became the UT's 46th first-round pick all-time, Alvin Kamara (third round, No. 67, New Orleans Saints), Cameron Sutton (third round, No. 94, Pittsburgh Steelers), Jalen Reeves-Maybin (fourth round, No. 124, Detroit Lions), Josh Malone (fourth round, No. 128, Cincinnati Bengals) and Joshua Dobbs, (fourth round, No. 135, Steelers) were all selected in the draft.

BARNETT NOTCHES FIRST NFL SACK

- All-time Tennessee sack king and current Philadelphia Eagles defensive end Derek Barnett recorded his first career NFL sack in the fourth quarter of the Eagles' 28-23 Week 6 Thursday night win over the Carolina Panthers.
- Barnett tallied 33 sacks over the course of his three seasons in college with Tennessee, and was the 14th overall pick in the NFL Draft.

VOLS TO THE NFL



The Vols have one of the most storied histories of producing NFL Players:

- 343 drafted players, tied most in SEC and tied for eighth among all schools.
- At least one former Vol has played in 24 of the last 26 Super Bowls, with a total of 39 playing in the big game since 2000. For Super Bowl LI, VFL Justin Coleman was on the New England Patriots' roster and VFL Matt Simms was on the Atlanta Falcons' roster.
- Fifteen former Vols have been selected in the first round of the NFL Draft since 2000, while 76 UT players have been selected overall in that time frame.
- UT is third in the SEC and seventh in the nation with 46 all-time first-round draft picks.
- UT sack king Derek Barnett was selected by the Philadelphia Eagles with the 14th overall pick of the 2017 NFL Draft, making him the Vols' first NFL first-round pick since the Miami Dolphins selected Ja'Wuan James with the 19th overall selection in 2014. He also became Tennessee's first defensive player selected in the first round since 2010, when the Kansas City Chiefs selected Eric Berry with the fifth pick and the Arizona Cardinals selected Dan Williams with the 26th pick.
- Six Vols were selected in the first four rounds of the 2017 NFL Draft. That marks the most Vols picked in the first four rounds since 2002.

- Tennessee rallied back from 14-point deficit to take a thrilling 42-41 double-overtime win over Georgia Tech in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.
- UT went into overtime for the second-consecutive season opener. Kelly punched in a touchdown from one yard out in the first overtime to match a one-yard touchdown run by Georgia Tech quarterback TaQuon Marshall and keep the game timed at 35-35. In the second overtime, Kelly punched in a score from two yards out to put the Vols up 42-35. Georgia Tech found the end zone with a 13-yard run by Marshall on its ensuing possession and decided to go for a two-point conversion. The UT defense came up with a huge stop to seal the 42-41 victory. UT redshirt sophomore defensive end Darrell Taylor forced an incomplete pass by Marshall on the conversion attempt.
- Making his first career start at quarterback, junior Quinten Dormady helped lead a second-half surge and completed 20 of 37 passes for 221 yards and two scores. He also had two rushes for 13 yards. Dormady was outstanding in the second half and overtime, going 12-for-17 169 yards and two touchdowns.
- Junior running back John Kelly led UT's ground attack, gaining 128 yards and four scores on 19 carries. His four rushing scores tied for the second-most in a game in UT history and the most by a Vol since James Stewart rushed for four scores at Georgia in 1994. Kelly also caught five passes for 35 yards.
- Sophomore receiver Marquez Callaway enjoyed a breakout game, catching four passes for 115 yards and two touchdowns. His 10-yard touchdown reception with 42 seconds left in the third quarter drew the Vols to within 21-14. With 11:49 on the clock in the fourth quarter, Callaway sprinted down the left sideline for a 50-yard touchdown catch.
- With 4:50 left in the game, redshirt junior defensive back Rashaan Gaulden forced a fumble that was recovered by junior safety Micah Abernathy at Tennessee's seven-yard line. The Vols then marched 93 yards down the field using a 40-yard catch by Callaway and two runs by Kelly for 27 yards and a touchdown to tie the game, 28-28.
- Redshirt senior defensive tackle Paul Bain blocked a 36-yard field goal attempt by Shawn Davis with time expiring to send the game into overtime.

- Tennessee opened the game with a bang as true freshman running back Ty Chandler returned the opening kickoff 91 yards for a score, giving the Vols a quick, 7-0 lead. Chandler's 91-yard touchdown run marked the first time a Vol had returned the game's opening kickoff for a score since Evan Berry had a 96-yard return against Arkansas on Oct. 3, 2015. Chandler is the first UT true freshman with a kickoff return touchdown since Leonard Scott took one 100 yards against Georgia in 1999. Chandler's score marked the 11th kick or punt return for a touchdown in the Butch Jones era.
- UT junior quarterback Quinten Dormady connected on 13 of 18 passes for 194 yards and two touchdowns. Junior running back John Kelly racked up 140 yards of total offense, rushing for 80 yards on 18 carries and totaling 60 receiving yards on five catches. Sophomore running back Carlin Fils-aime rushed for 41 yards and two touchdowns on three carries.
- UT sophomore quarterback Jarrett Guarantano made his collegiate debut, going 4-for-12 for 41 yards and one touchdown.
- The Vols' defense limited Indiana State to just 215 yards of total offense and the Sycamores were 0-of-11 on third-down conversion attempts.
- Tennessee led 28-0 at the half. After Chandler's 91-yard score on the opening kickoff, Fils-aime rushed for a four-yard score and a 30-yard score. Dormady capped UT's first-half scoring with a 19-yard touchdown pass to Brandon Johnson, marking the first touchdown of the sophomore wideout's career.
- Indiana State scored its lone touchdown at the 10:07 mark of the third quarter as Cade Sparks connected with tight end Jacquie McClendon for a 19-yard touchdown.
- UT added a pair of second-half scores. Dormady found sophomore Marquez Callaway for 37-yard touchdown with 2:12 left in the third. Guarantano hit redshirt junior Jeff George in the end zone for an 11-yard score with 56 seconds left in the game.
- Freshman defensive end Deandre Johnson logged Tennessee's first sack of the year in the fourth quarter when he brought down ISU's Isaac Harker on a 10-yard strip sack.

- Down 10 points with 5:13 remaining in the fourth quarter, Tennessee rallied with a 28-yard touchdown pass from Quinten Dormady to Ethan Wolf and a 27-yard field goal by Aaron Medley to tie the game at 20-20 with 50 seconds remaining. Florida quarterback Feleipe Franks threw a 63-yard touchdown pass to Tyrie Cleveland with time expiring to give the Gators a 26-20 win.
- Tennessee junior running back John Kelly led Tennessee's comeback charge, finishing with 19 carries for 141 yards and one touchdown and six receptions for 96 yards. Kelly shined in the second half, rushing 11 times for 96 yards and score and making four catches for 84 yards in the game's final 30 minutes.
- The Vols trailed at halftime, 6-3. Tennessee's defense forced three turnovers in the second half to help the Vols rally late.
- On Florida's first possession of the second half, UT sophomore safety Nigel Warrior forced a fumble by UF running back Lamical Perine and redshirt sophomore defensive end Darrell Taylor recovered the ball at Florida's 49-yard line.
- With 10:45 left in the fourth quarter, senior cornerback Justin Martin chased down Florida running back Malik Davis after a 72-yard run and punched the ball out before Davis entered the end zone. The play resulted in a touchback and possession for the Vols as the ball rolled out of the back of the end zone.
- With the Vols down, 20-17, redshirt junior defensive back Rashaan Gaulden intercepted a pass by Feleipe Franks at the UF 40-yard line with 3:57 left in the game. Tennessee's offense marched 31 yards in eight plays and tied the game with a 27-yard field goal by Aaron Medley.
- UT junior quarterback Quinten Dormady finished 21-for-39 for 259 yards, one touchdown and three interceptions.
- Gaulden led the Vols defense with 10 tackles (five solo). Jonathan Kongbo, Quart'e Sapp and Micah Abernathy had seven tackles each in the loss.
- Taylor and senior linebacker Colton Jumper each recorded the first sacks of their careers in the first half. Jumper's sack was the first by a Tennessee linebacker since Darrin Kirkland Jr.'s sack against Virginia Tech on Sept. 10, 2016.

- Tennessee junior running back John Kelly rushed for 101 yards and junior quarterback Quinten Dormady threw for 187 yards as Tennessee held on to defeat UMass, 17-13.
- The Vols got on the board first when Kelly scored his sixth touchdown of the season with a 12-yard run, which was set up by a 66-yard pass—Tennessee's longest play from scrimmage this season—from Dormady to sophomore receiver Brandon Johnson. Kelly's score gave the Vols a 7-0 lead in the second quarter.
- UMass responded in the second quarter, pulling to within 7-6 when quarterback Ross Comis ran it in from five yards out to cap a five-play, 75-yard drive. The Minutemen missed the ensuing PAT to keep the Vols on top.
- With 25 seconds remaining in the first half, Dormady hit sophomore receiver Tyler Byrd for an eight-yard touchdown pass in the back corner of the end zone, giving the Vols a 14-6 halftime lead.
- After an Aaron Medley 40-yard field goal midway through the third quarter, UMass took its second drive of the second half 75 yards down the field, finishing with a 13-yard touchdown pass from Andrew Ford to Sadiq Palmer to cut the Vols lead to 17-13.
- Kelly, who rushed for 80 yards in the first half, recorded his third 100-yard rushing game of the season with 101 yards and one touchdown on 25 carries.
- Dormady finished 17-for-27 for 187 yards and one touchdown to earn his third win as UT's starting quarterback.
- Johnson posted career highs with seven receptions for 123 yards.
- Tennessee's defense buckled down and held on to preserve the Vols' perfect home record, holding the Minutemen to just 281 yards of total offense. UMass finished 3-for-14 on third-down conversion attempts and failed to convert on fourth-down.
- Tennessee also had seven sacks, 12 TFLs and broke up six passes. The Vols' seven sacks were their most since recording seven against Vanderbilt on Nov. 22, 2008. UT's top tackler on the day was Quart'e Sapp, who recorded nine stops. Linebacker Colton Jumper logged 3.5 TFLs, including 2.5 sacks.
- Redshirt senior punter Trevor Daniel finished the game with eight punts for 391 yards, marking his best average in four games this season (48.9 average). In the first quarter, he kicked a 56-yard punt that pinned UMass at its own 3. His next punt for 53 yards pinned the Minutemen at their own 2.

- Georgia running back Sony Michel ran for a 21-yard touchdown with 1:04 left in the third. In the fourth quarter, Brian Herrien punched in a one-yard touchdown and backup UGA kicker David Martin booted a 19-yard field goal.
- Tennessee's lead in its all-time series against Georgia is now 23-22-2. The loss was UT's first against Georgia since 2014 when the Bulldogs edged the Vols, 35-32 in Athens, Ga.
- With 14:57 on the clock in the second quarter, Justin Martin intercepted a pass from Fromm at the UGA 27. The pick was the first of Martin's career and the second of the season for the Vols.

- Despite a strong showing from its defense and a late fourth-quarter drive with a chance to win the game with time expiring, Tennessee came up short in a 15-9 loss to South Carolina at Neyland Stadium.
- Making his first career start, redshirt freshman quarterback Jarrett Guarantano finished 11-for-18 for 133 yards and rushed 17 times for -2 yards. Junior running back John Kelly gained 58 yards on 16 carries and also had two catches for 21 yards. Sophomore receiver Brandon Johnson caught three passes for 54 yards.
- The Vols enjoyed a fast start, racking up 133 yards of total offense in the first quarter, which was UT's most in a first quarter since posting 167 yards against Kentucky on Nov. 12, 2016.
- Tennessee had a 6-0 lead after the opening quarter as freshman placekicker Brent Cimaglia made field goals from 29 yards and 33 yards.

- The Gamecocks knotted the game at 9-9 with 1:02 left in the third quarter when A.J. Turner ran for a 20-yard touchdown. South Carolina did not convert the extra point as holder Danny Gordon mishandled the snap and threw the ball away with pressure bearing down on him.
- White made a 21-yard field goal with 5:17 left in the game to give South Carolina the lead and followed with a 36-yarder with 1:13 remaining to push the Gamecocks' lead to 15-9.
- Guarantano and the Tennessee offense took over with 1:13 remaining and drove the ball 73 yards down the field on a drive highlighted by a 39-yard pass to Brandon Johnson that put UT on the SC 22 and a defensive pass interference call in the left corner of the end zone that set up 1st-and-goal from the SC 2 with seconds remaining. With one second left, Guarantano zipped a pass that went through Johnson's hands in the right side of the end zone.

Upon further review, it was determined that he gained only five yards on the carry and was down at the 15-yard line where his knee touched the ground. (REVERSED)
- On Tennessee's first overtime drive vs. Georgia Tech, John Kelly was initially ruled down at the one yard line. After review, officials overturned the call and ruled the play as a one-yard rushing touchdown, saying the ball crossed the scoring plane. (REVERSED)
- With 10:07 remaining in the third quarter, Indiana State quarterback Cade Sparks completed a 23-yard touchdown pass to McClendon. After a review, it was confirmed that Jacquie McClendon maintained control of the ball as it crossed the goal line. (CONFIRMED)
