Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 4-1 in his career against the Aggies, with all of the meetings occurring during his tenure at Alabama. Texas A&M head coach Kevin Sumlin is 1-4 all-time against UA.

RANKINGS: Alabama remains No. 1 in the Associated Press and Amway Coaches polls this week following the Tide's 66-3 win over Ole Miss last Saturday. Texas A&M is receiving votes in both polls this week following the Aggies' 24-17 win over South Carolina.

NEXT GAME: The Crimson Tide will host SEC foe Arkansas for its Homecoming matchup in Tuscaloosa on Oct. 14. Alabama and Arkansas will meet for the 28th time in a series that dates back to 1962. The Crimson Tide leads the all-time series, 20-7 (17-8 after vacations/forfeits), including a 9-3 record (6-4 after vacations/ forfeits) at Bryant Denny Stadium. Alabama won last year's meeting, 49-30, in Fayetteville. Alabama head coach Nick Saban is 13-2 (12-2 after vacations) all-time against the Razorbacks, including a perfect 10-0 (9-0 after vacations) record at Alabama.

DOMINANT ON BOTH SIDES OF THE BALL: Alabama enters Saturday's game with Texas A&M as the only team in the country ranked in the top 15 in scoring defense (first), scoring offense (eighth), rushing defense (second), rushing offense (fourth), total defense (sixth) and total offense (14th). The Crimson Tide is outscoring its opponents by a margin of 37.6 points per game (46.2-8.6), outrushing the opposition by 241.8 yards per game (315.6-73.8) and has a total offense advantage of 255.6 yards per game (508.6-249.0).

TURNOVER-FREE SINCE 2016: Alabama has yet to turn the ball over this season and is riding 34-quarter turnover-free streak dating to the second quarter of the Auburn game on Nov. 24, 2016. The streak is the longest for Alabama since 1940. Alabama has run 590 plays in this current stretch, including 354 so far this season.

NON-OFFENSIVE TDs IN THE SABAN ERA: Levi Wallace's 35-yard interception return for a touchdown against Ole Miss on Sept. 30 was Alabama's 60th non-offensive touchdowns during the Nick Saban era and the first of 2017. Alabama totaled a single-season record 15 non-offensive scores in 2016. The 15 non-offensive touchdowns led the Football Bowl Subdivision and are the most in a season by an FBS team in the last 20 years. The Tide led the FBS with 123 points off turnovers in 2016 and scored at least one touchdown on defense or special teams in the first eight games of the season, including multiple non-offensive scores in the first three SEC road contests of 2016 (Ole Miss, Arkansas and Tennessee). Alabama scored a non-offensive touchdown in 10 consecutive games dating from to the CFP semifinal vs. Michigan State on Dec. 31, 2015, to the Texas A&M game on Oct. 22, 2016 and had 14 non-offensive touchdowns in that span – four interceptions, four punt returns, five fumble recoveries and a kickoff return.

UNRANKED, NO PROBLEM UNDER SABAN: Alabama has defeated 70 consecutive unranked teams under head coach Nick Saban. The last loss to an unranked team came against Auburn to close out the 2007 season. The current streak began with a win over Colorado on Dec. 30, 2007, in the Independence Bowl. Under Saban, Alabama holds a 73-3 (.961) (69-3, .958 after vacations) mark against unranked opponents, including a perfect mark in unranked matchups since 2008.

ALABAMA AS THE NATION'S NO. 1: Alabama has played 79 games as the nation's top-ranked team since the inception of the Associated Press Poll in 1936. In those games, the Crimson Tide boasts a 68-11 (.861) record. Those numbers are even more impressive when you look at the 11 seasons under the direction of head coach Nick Saban (2007-present). Since the ninth game of the 2008 season (121 games), Alabama has played 55 games while being ranked No. 1, posting a 49-6 (.891) record during that span.

DECADE AT NO. 1: With Alabama's preseason No. 1 ranking, the Crimson Tide has now been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press poll at least once each season since 2008. The 10-year streak is the longest in the history of the AP rankings. The previous long streak was seven seasons by Miami (Fla.) from 1986-92.

SABAN'S 56th GAME AS AP No. 1: The matchup against Texas A&M on Saturday will be Nick Saban's 56th career game coaching Alabama as the Associated Press No. 1 team, the most games coached as No. 1 at one school. At 49-6 (.891), Saban has won more games coaching as the No. 1 team at one school than any other coach in college football history. Woody Hayes (Ohio State) and Bobby Bowden (Florida State) are tied for second with 40 wins apiece. Bowden was 40-5 at Florida State as No. 1 and Hayes went 40-6 with Ohio State.

SABAN LEADS IN WINS VS. TOP-5 TEAMS: Alabama's 24-7 win over No. 3 Florida State on Sept. 2 was Nick Saban's 19th career victory vs. a team ranked in the top 5 of the Associated Press Top 25, the most in college football history. Saban's career winning percentage in those contests (.613) is also college football's best. Following Saban on the all-time victory list are Bobby Bowden (18/.378 winning percentage), Barry Switzer (15/.516), Woody Hayes (15/.516), Steve Spurrier (15/.429) and Lou Holtz (15/.419).

FACING OFF WITH THE BEST: The Crimson Tide has the second-toughest schedule in college football this season according ESPN.com's Preseason College Football Power Index. By season's end, Alabama will have faced off with at least nine teams who participated in a bowl game a season ago and will meet at least four teams who were ranked in the Associated Press Preseason Top 25.

TIDE TO FACE NINE BOWL TEAMS IN 2017: Alabama's 2017 schedule includes nine bowl teams, tied for the third-most in the country. In addition to opening the season against Florida State, the remaining bowl teams on the Tide's schedule are Colorado State, Vanderbilt, Texas A&M, Arkansas, Tennessee, LSU, Mississippi State and Auburn. The nine teams combined for a 4-5 record in bowl play last season. Only Notre Dame and Syracuse (11 each), Duke, Ole Miss and South Carolina (10 each) meet more teams that appeared in the 2016 postseason.

ALABAMA HAS MOST WINS SINCE 2008: Dating back to the start of the 2008 season. Alabama has won 117 games, which is the most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Crimson Tide won 12 games in 2008, followed by a perfect 14-0 record in 2009, a 10-3 mark in 2010 and a 12-1 record in 2011. Alabama finished 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014, 14-1 in both 2015 and 2016, and is 5-0 this season. Ohio State is second with 114 victories. Boise State is third with 102 while Oklahoma, Oregon and Clemson are tied for fourth with 97 wins.

BEATING THE BEST: The Crimson Tide is 49-13 (.790) against the Associated Press Top 25, including a 26-7 (.788) mark against AP top-10 teams since the start of 2008. Alabama opened the 2017 season with a 24-7 win over then-No. 3 Florida State in Atlanta. In 2016, the Tide faced 10 teams ranked in the AP poll, going 9-1 and outscoring those opponents by an average score of 38.0-17.3. Alabama finished 8-1 in 2015 against the AP Top 25 after going 5-2 in 2014, 3-2 in 2013 and 5-1 in 2012. The Tide held a 4-1 mark vs. top-25 teams in 2011 and went 5-3 in 2010.

ALWAYS IN THE HUNT: Since the 2008 season, Alabama has played in only three regular season games that did not have national championship implications. Following the Crimson Tide's 24-21 loss to LSU during the 2010 calendar year, UA was essentially eliminated from a chance to keep itself in the national championship discussion. The final three games of that season mark the only three regular season contests without direct national championship implications during that time.

RETURNING SUCCESS: The Crimson Tide returns 13 starters and 51 letterwinners from its 2016 squad that finished 14-1 as the SEC Champion and advanced to a second consecutive College Football Playoff National Championship Game. The 2017 team returns six starters apiece on both sides of the ball. The defensive unit is highlighted by a veteran secondary featuring starters Minkah Fitzpatrick, Ronnie Harrison, Anthony Averett and Tony Brown. Seniors Shaun Dion Hamilton and Rashaan Evans return to lead the linebacking corps while Da'Ron Payne stands out along the defensive front. Alabama's offense features second-year starter Jalen Hurts at quarterback with Calvin Ridley the leader among the wideouts. The Tide's standout backfield features veterans Damien Harris and Bo Scarbrough and will have an experienced offensive line unit to run behind that includes Bradley Bozeman, Ross Pierschbacher and Jonah Williams.

TIDE AMONG LEADERS IN TRUE FRESHMEN DEBUTS: Defensive lineman LaBryan Ray became the 16th true freshman to see action for the Crimson Tide this season with his appearance against Ole Miss on Sept. 30. The 16 first-year players to debut this season ranks as the seventh-most in the Football Bowl Subdivision. LSU (20), Illinois (19), Texas A&M (18), Arizona, Georgia and Miami (Fla.) (17), are the only schools to play more true freshmen so far this season. Freshmen who have seen action for the Tide in addition to Robinson, James and Tennison include: Christopher Allen (LB), Thomas Fletcher (SN), Najee Harris (RB), Kedrick James (TE), Jerry Jeudy (WR), Alex Leatherwood (OL), Xavier McKinney (DB), Dylan Moses (LB), Brian Robinson Jr. (RB), Henry Ruggs III (WR), DeVonta Smith (WR), Tua Tagovailoa (QB), Major Tennison (TE), Jedrick Wills Jr. (OL) and Daniel Wright (DB).

LEADING THE WAY TO THE NFL: Alabama has had more draft picks over the last nine drafts (65) than any other college in the nation. Twenty-two of those picks have been first-round selections and 37 have gone in the first two rounds. The list of 65 features four Super Bowl champions, nine Pro Bowl selections, six All-Pro members and one Offensive Rookie of the Year.

NFL DRAFT: The Crimson Tide saw 10 former UA players selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, including four first-round picks in Marlon Humphrey (No. 16, Baltimore Ravens), Jonathan Allen (No. 17, Washington Redskins), O.J. Howard (No. 19, Tampa Bay Buccaneers) and Reuben Foster (No. 31, San Francisco 49ers). Cam Robinson (No. 34, Jacksonville Jaguars) was next to go as the second pick of the draft's second round. Joining Robinson in the second round were Ryan Anderson (No. 49, Washington Redskins) and Dalvin Tomlinson (No. 55, New York Giants). The third round saw Tim Williams (No. 78, Baltimore Ravens) and ArDarius Stewart (No. 79, New York Jets) go in consecutive order, before Eddie Jackson's fourth-round selection (No. 112, Chicago Bears) rounded out the former Alabama players taken. The 10 selections was the most UA players taken in one draft under head coach Nick Saban and represented the most Alabama players selected in a seven-round draft in program history.

OFF-THE-FIELD NOTES

ALABAMA DEGREES: Alabama's success on the field over the past 10 seasons under Nick Saban has coincided with the Crimson Tide's success in the classroom. The 2017 squad features 12 players who already had degrees in hand going into the season opener with Florida State, which is tops among teams ranked in the Associated Press Preseason Top-25. The 12 Tide graduates are Anthony Averett, Bradley Bozeman, Tony Brown, Hunter Bryant, Bo Grant, Shaun Dion Hamilton, J.C. Hassenauer, Vohn Keith Jr., Derek Kief, Andy Pappanastos, Ross Pierschbacher and Levi Wallace. Over the previous nine seasons (2008-16) Alabama saw 116 degrees earned (graduate and undergraduate) by players who were still suiting up for the Crimson Tide after having graduated. Since the 2010 season, Alabama has seen an impressive 14 players earn a master's degree before stepping foot on the field for the final time. In 2016, the Crimson Tide tied for second among all bowl teams with a total of 22 players who earned their degrees prior to the start of postseason play. Three of the 22 earned their master's degrees during the 2016 campaign.

ALABAMA IN THE AP POLL

Alabama has been ranked in 764 of the 1,126 Associated Press college football polls since 1936, according to the AP Poll Archive. The Crimson Tide owns a 459-128-8 (.778) all-time record in games when ranked in the Associated Press college football poll, including a 101-16 (.863) mark under head coach Nick Saban. The Crimson Tide is also ranked in the AP poll for the 138th consecutive week, topping its previous streak set in the mid 1990s when UA was ranked for 71 straight weeks under head coach Gene Stallings. Alabama has started six seasons at No. 1 (2017, 2016, 2013, 2010, 1978, 1966).

ALABAMA IN THE COACHES POLL

The Crimson Tide has enjoyed much success in the coaches rankings over the past half century. The United Press International debuted the coaches poll in 1950 and ran the poll through the 1990 season. USA TODAY has administered the poll for the past 27 seasons (1991-2017), and in 2014, Amway became the title sponsor. Alabama was ranked No. 1 in the 2010 preseason coaches' poll after starting out the 2009 preseason poll at No. 5. Alabama remained in the top five the entire season, reaching No. 1 after defeating Florida in the SEC Championship and holding the position to claim the national championship after defeating Texas in Pasadena. The Tide then claimed the No. 1 spot to close out the 2011, 2012 and 2015 seasons. The Tide has compiled five UPI (1961, 1964, 1973 & 1979) and five USA TODAY (1992, 2009, 2011, 2012 & 2015) coaches poll national titles.

GRADUATING WITH THE BEST: The Alabama football team has not only been dominant on the field, but also in the classroom. The Crimson Tide is tied for sixth among Associated Press Preseason Top 25 teams for its graduation rate of 80 percent. Ahead of Alabama are only Stanford (99 percent), Virginia Tech (89 percent), Miami (Fla.) (86), Clemson (84) and South Florida (82). Florida and Penn State are tied with the Tide for sixth place. Alabama's percentage tied for fourth among Southeastern Conference football programs.

ACADEMIC PROWESS: The Tide has been a model of success on the football field, but the team has generated plenty of accolades in the classroom as well. Below are some of the academic highlights under Nick Saban.

- A total of 12 Crimson Tide players will take the field with their degrees in hand for the season opener with Florida State.
- Earned Graduation Success Rate (GSR) of 80 this year is tied for fourth among SEC football programs.
- In 2016, Alabama tied for second nationally with 22 graduates on its roster during postseason play. The
 Tide led the nation in graduates on its roster during postseason play in 2015 (29), 2014 (22) and 2013 (28).
- Alabama's last four national title football teams (2009, 2011, 2012, 2015) included 89 players who had earned their degrees prior to game time.
- The 2014 team was recognized as one of the nation's top academic programs, ranking third in the annual
 academic rankings of the top 25 college football teams produced by New America, a Washington D.C.
 think-tank
- The 2011 BCS national championship team had 21 graduates playing in the bowl game, which was the second most in the country.
- That 2011 team led the SEC with 38 student-athletes being named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- The 2009 BCS national championship team led the country with 11 graduates playing in the bowl game.
- In 2016-17, Alabama finished second in the number of football student-athletes being named to the SEC First-Year Academic Honor Roll with 11 honorees. Alabama topped that list in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and shared the top spot in the 2015-16 academic year

CRIMSON TIDE IN THE COMMUNITY: Last season, Alabama worked 400-plus hours of community service in Tuscaloosa and the surrounding areas. The team volunteered its time across numerous areas during the 2016 season including in schools, hospitals, with Habitat for Humanity and on campus.

ALABAMA ATHLETICS AS A WHOLE: The University of Alabama has built a total program, winning championships on the field and bringing home plenty of academic awards in the classroom.

- Since 2008, Crimson Tide athletics teams have won 10 national championships in five different sports and 23 SEC championships in seven different sports.
- Alabama claimed another SEC team title during the 2016-17 academic year with football winning its 26th championship.
- The overall cumulative grade-point average of UA student-athletes in 2016-17 was 3.25.
- Fourteen Crimson Tide teams had cumulative GPAs above 3.0 for 2016-17
- Seven UA teams posted cumulative GPAs above 3.5 for 2016-17.
- Alabama student-athletes earned SEC Academic Honor Roll recognition 372 times during the 2016-17 academic year. The Crimson Tide had 78, 65 and 127 student-athletes named to the SEC Fall, Winter and Spring Academic Honor Rolls and 102 named to the First-Year Academic Honor Roll.
- Since 2009-10, UA leads all NCAA Division I schools with 77 Academic All-America honors. Stanford is second over that span with 72, while Nebraska is third at 58.
- Since 2000, UA has produced 123 Academic All-America honorees, which is third nationally behind only Nebraska (142) and Notre Dame (129). Stanford (117) and Penn State (104) round out the top five.

SCOTT A CANDIDATE FOR THE SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Alabama senior punter JK Scott has been named one of 30 candidates for the 2017 Senior CLASS Award. The Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. In the classroom, Scott maintains a 3.116 grade point average in general business and is on pace to graduate in December after only three and a half years. He was selected to the SEC Academic Honor Roll each of the last two years and was tabbed to the league's First Year Academic Honor Roll as a freshman. Scott has consistently ranked near the top of the Crimson Tide roster for hours worked in the community each of his first three years at UA. He spends extensive time working with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, speaking at local schools and working with youth groups. The senior also participates each year in the Athletics Department's Halloween Extravaganza, efforts with Project Angel Tree during the holiday season and has volunteered his time at local hospitals on Tide's bowl trips each of the last three years.

WUERFFEL TROPHY NOMINEE - MINKAH FITZPATRICK: Minkah Fitzpatrick has been nominated for the 2017 Wuerffel Trophy. The Wuerffel Trophy is named after 1996 Heisman Trophy winner Danny Wuerffel of Florida and is presented to the college football player who best combines exemplary community service with academic and athletic achievement. Alabama's Barrett Jones was the 2010 recipient of the award. While at UA, Fitzpatrick has been a team leader in the community and on campus. He has given his time to several groups in his two years with the football program, including the YMCA, TAP, Inc. and the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, mentoring at-risk youth in the Tuscaloosa area. Most recently, he spent his spring break with a group of Alabama student-athletes as part of an FCA mission trip that did relief work in Costa Rica.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

RETURNING DEFENSE: The 2017 Alabama defense includes six starters from a season ago. Those six return a combined career 462 total tackles, 33 tackles for loss, 10 sacks and 16 interceptions to this year's team. Of those returning starters, four come from the Tide secondary, including junior Minkah Fitzpatrick, who recorded 66 tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks and six interceptions in 2016. Fitzpatrick holds the school record for career interception returns for touchdowns with four. Junior Ronnie Harrison leads all returnees with 85 total tackles from a season ago, while senior linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton recorded 9.0 tackles for loss in 2016.

NO TOUCHDOWNS FOR YOU: Trevor Knight's 25-yard third-quarter touchdown pass to Christian Kirk in Alabama's 33-14 win over Texas A&M on Oct. 22 last season was the last touchdown surrendered by the Crimson Tide defense in an SEC regular season game (does not include SEC Championship Games). The Tide has played 21 quarters and 312 minutes and 12 seconds against the Aggies, Mississippi State, Auburn, Vanderbilt and Ole Miss in that span, surrendering just six field goals and recording two shutouts. The UA defense has not allowed a rushing touchdown in its last 26 quarters of SEC regular season play dating to the second quarter of the Tennessee game on Oct. 15 last season.

HARD TO FIND THE END ZONE AGAINST THE TIDE: Since the start of the 2009 season, no defense has allowed fewer touchdowns than the Crimson Tide. Alabama's defense has surrendered only 171 touchdowns over the last 115 games. That is 47 fewer than the second most in the nation (LSU with 218).

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 200: Vanderbilt's 78 yards in total offense on Sept. 23 marked the 45th time in the last 128 games under Nick Saban (since the start of the 2008 season), the Crimson Tide defense has held the opposition to fewer than 200 yards of total offense. The 78 yards surrendered by the Tide against Vanderbilt is the lowest total allowed by Alabama under Nick Saban.

HOLDING OPPONENTS UNDER 300: The Crimson Tide's defensive performance against Ole Miss on Sept. 30 marked the 92nd time in 143 games (64.3 percent) under head coach Nick Saban that the Tide has held an opponent to less than 300 yards of total offense. The Tide has now held four of its first five opponents this season - Florida State (250), Fresno State (274), Vanderbilt (78) and Ole Miss (253) to less than 300 yards of offense. In 2016, Alabama limited its opponents to less than 300 yards 12 times.

10 POINTS OR LESS: Alabama's 66-3 win over Ole Miss on Sept. 30 marks the 75th time under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide has held opponents to 10 points or fewer, the fourth time in five games this season and the 19th time in the last 35 games dating to the start of the 2015 season.

RUSHING DEFENSE: Alabama has surrendered only 17 individual 100-yard rushing performances dating back to the 2005 season, a mark that is the lowest in the nation. Since head coach Nick Saban's arrival in 2007, the Tide has allowed 12 players to rush for more than 100 yards in a game: Ole Miss' Jordan Wilkins (101 on Sept. 30, 2017), Georgia's Nick Chubb (146 on Oct. 3, 2015), Ohio State's Ezekiel Elliott (230 on Jan. 1, 2015), Auburn's Tre Mason (164 on Nov. 30, 2013), Virginia Tech's Trey Edmunds (132 on Aug. 31, 2013), Georgia's Todd Gurley (122 yards on Dec. 1, 2012), LSU's Jeremy Hill (107 on Nov. 3, 2012), Georgia Southern's Dominique Swope (153 on Nov. 19, 2011), Tennessee's Tauren Poole (117 on Oct. 23, 2010), Ole Miss' BenJarvus Green-Ellis (131 on Oct. 13, 2007), Houston's Anthony Alridge (100 on Oct. 6, 2007) and Darren McFadden of Arkansas (195 on Sept. 15, 2007).

DEFENSIVE DOMINANCE: Through five games this season, Alabama tops the SEC and ranks No. 2 nationally in rushing defense at 73.8 yards allowed per game and is first nationally in scoring defense at 8.6 points per game. Under head coach Nick Saban, Alabama's defense has finished in the top 10 nationally in rushing defense and scoring defense in each of the last nine seasons. During the current run, Alabama has led the nation in rushing defense four times (2016, 2015, 2012, 2011) and finished second twice (2009, 2008). The Tide has topped the nation in scoring defense three times (2016, 2012, 2011) and has held the opposition to less than two touchdowns per game in a season six of the last nine seasons (2016, 2013, 2012, 2011, 2010, 2009). No other FBS program has a current streak in both categories. Boston College has finished in the top 10 in rushing defense in each of the last three seasons. Ohio State, Michigan and Wisconsin have appeared in the top 10 in scoring defense in the previous two seasons.

TOUGH SLEDDING ON THE GROUND: Alabama has allowed one rushing touchdown this season and has permitted just 13 scores on the ground in its last 35 games dating to the start of the 2015 season. Alabama allowed only five rushing touchdowns in 2016 to lead the nation. In 2015, the Crimson Tide allowed just seven rushing touchdowns in 15 games, the second-lowest total in the country. The Tide leads the nation in allowing the fewest rushing touchdowns since the start of the 2005 season, surrendering only 82. Since head coach Nick Saban arrived in 2007, the Crimson Tide has allowed 69 rushing touchdowns. Ohio State is No. 2 in that category, giving up 109 since 2007, followed by lowa (123), Utah (128) and LSU and Florida (132).

FITZPATRICK SECOND ON CAREER INTERCEPTION RETURN YARDS LIST:

Junior defensive back Minkah Fitzpatrick is in second place on the Alabama career interception return yards list. Fitzpatrick has 274 career return yards on eight total interceptions (34.3 ypr). Fitzpatrick already holds the career (4) and single-season (2) interception returns for touchdown records and longest interception return record (100 yards vs. Arkansas in 2016). Eddie Jackson (2013-16) is the UA career return yards leader with 303 yards on nine interceptions.

OLE MISS: Senior Levi Wallace helped Alabama get off to a fast start aginat Ole Miss on Sept. 30 when he returned his second career interception 35 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter of the Crimson Tide's 66-3 win. The Tucson, Ariz., native added his third career pick late in the third quarter and returned it 31 yards to set up another Alabama score. Wallace is the first UA player to record multiple interceptions in a game since Minkah Fitzpatrick had three at Arkansas on Oct. 8, 2016. His return for a score was the first since Ryan Anderson's 26-yard return against Washington in the College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl on Dec. 31, 2016. Wallace now leads the Tide defense in interceptions (3) and pass breakups (6). His nine passes defended leads the SEC and ranks eighth nationally.

FITZPATRICK SETS CAREER HIGH IN TACKLES AGAINST THE REBELS: Junior Minkah Fitzpatrick led Alabama in tackles with a career-high eight in the Crimson Tide's 66-3 win over Ole Miss on Sept. 30. Fitzpatrick's previous high was seven against ULM in 2015. Fitzpatrick also finished with a career-best 2.0 tackles for loss (-17 yards) and picked up his fourth career sack. The Old Bridge, N.J., native is tied for the team lead in tackles this season with 23 and has added 2.5 tackles for loss (-18), one sack, three pass break-ups, two quarterback hurries and his first career blocked field goal.

DEFENSE THROTTLES VANDERBILT: The Alabama defense turned in one of the most dominant performances in school history in the Crimson Tide's 59-0 win over Vanderbilt on Sept. 23. UA limited the Commodores to just 78 yards on 38 plays and held VU to just three first downs, which is the fewest allowed by an SEC team in the last 20 years. The three first downs equals the fourth-fewest surrendered by an Alabama defense and the fewest allowed since Mississippi State was held to three on Sept. 12, 1992. The 78 yards of offense is the fewest given up by the Tide under Nick Saban. The total is the eighth-lowest ever allowed by Alabama against an SEC opponent and the fourth-lowest UA has allowed in an SEC road game. The 'Dores' 38 plays is the fewest run against a Saban-coached Alabama defense, besting the previous low of 43 run by Florida Atlantic in a weather-shortened game in 2014 and Vanderbilt in 2011, and the third-fewest ever allowed by Alabama in an SEC game (33 - Arkansas, 1993; 36 - Mississippi State, 1940) and the fewest in an SEC road contest.

HAMILTON CAREER-HIGH IN TACKLES FOR LOSS VS. FLORIDA STATE: Senior linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton finished with a career-high 3.5 tackles for loss vs. Florida State on Sept. 2. Hamilton's previous high was 2.0, which he had achieved three times in his career, most recently against Tennessee in 2016. The total is also the most by a Tide defender since Javier Arenas recorded 4.5 vs. the Vols in 2009.

WALLACE EARNS SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS FOLLOWING OLE MISS VICTORY: Alabama senior defensive back Levi Wallace was named Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in UA's 66-3 win over Ole Miss on Sept. 30. The selection is the first of Wallace's career. The Tucson, Ariz., native sparked an impressive defensive showing by the Crimson Tide in its win over Ole Miss with two interceptions, including the first defensive touchdown of his career. His 35-yard first quarter interception return was the 60th non-offensive touchdown scored by Alabama during the Nick Saban era and the first in 2017. Thanks in part to Wallace's efforts Alabama allowed just 253 total yards to the Rebels.

HAMILTON NAMED SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK FOR FLORIDA STATE PERFORMANCE: Alabama senior linebacker Shaun Dion Hamilton was named the Southeastern Conference Defensive Player of the Week following his performance against Florida State on Sept. 2. Hamilton led an Alabama defense that limited the third-ranked Seminoles to 250 yards in total offense in the top-ranked Tide's 24-7 win. The 'Noles' lone touchdown marked the 16th time in the last 31 games that the Crimson Tide limited an opponent to 10 points or less. The senior finished with a teamhigh eight tackles, a career-high 3.5 tackles for loss and one sack, as the Tide limited an FSU offense that averaged 202 yards rushing in 2016 to just 40 yards on the ground.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

11 PLAYERS SCORE IN WIN OVER OLE MISS: Alabama had 11 different players put up points in the Crimson Tide's 66-3 win over Ole Miss on Sept. 30. The Tide got touchdowns from senior Levi Wallace, juniors Bo Scarbrough, Hale Hentges and Ronnie Clark, sophomores Josh Jacobs and Jalen Hurts and freshmen Najee Harris, Tua Tagovailoa and Henry Ruggs III. In addition, senior JK Scott connected on a 48-yard field goal, and senior Andy Pappanastos was 9-for-9 in PATs.

MOST POINTS SINCE 1979: Alabama's 66 points scored in its 66-3 win over Ole Miss on Sept. 30 marked the highest point total for the Crimson Tide since it won by the same score at Vanderbilt on Sept. 29, 1979. The victory was also the 28th game in Alabama history scoring 60 points or more and the first 60-point game for the Tide since a 63-7 win over Georgia State on Nov. 18, 2010 at Bryant-Denny Stadium. Alabama last scored 60 points in an SEC contest in a 62-27 win over Ole Miss on Oct. 7, 1989, in Jackson, Miss.

ALABAMA'S 66 POINTS TIES FOR SECOND MOST IN AN SEC GAME: Alabama's 66 points against Ole Miss on Sept. 30 is tied for second in program history for points scored in a Southeastern Conference game. The UA record for an SEC game is 71 points in a 71-0 win at Vanderbilt on Nov. 17, 1945.

FIFTY POINTS IN CONSECUTIVE GAMES: Alabama's 66-3 win over Ole Miss on Sept. 30 gives the Crimson Tide consecutive games with 50+ points for the first time since 1991 when the Tide defeated Chattanooga, 53-7, on Oct. 5 at Legion Field and Tulane, 62-0, on Oct. 12 at Bryant-Denny Stadium. The Ole Miss and Vanderbilt victories also marks the first time Alabama has scored more than 50 points in consecutive SEC games since defeating Kentucky, 60-19, and Vanderbilt, 71-0, on Nov. 3 and Nov. 17, 1945. Both of those contests were on the road. Alabama last defeated consecutive opponents by 50+ points in 1945 when the Tide downed Howard (now Samford), 63-7, and Millsaps, 55-0, on Oct. 7 and Oct. 14.

CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH 600+ YARDS FOR THE FIRST TIME: Alabama's 677 yards of total offense aganist Vanderbilt on Sept. 23 and 613 total yards against Ole Miss on Sept. 30 marks the first time in UA history that the Crimson Tide has surpassed the 600-yard mark in back-to-back games. The 1,290 yards of total offense in the two contests is more that the Tide defense has surrendered to its opponents in five games this season (1,245).

TIDE TOPS THE SEC IN OFFENSE: Through five games in 2017, Alabama tops the Southeastern Conference in total offense (508.6 ypg), rushing offense (315.6 ypg) and scoring offense (46.2 ppg). Nationally, the Tide ranks 14th, fourth and eighth, respectively, in the same categories.

SCORING STREAK CONTINUES: Alabama's school record consecutive games scoring streak was extended to 218 games against Ole Miss on Sept. 30 with Bo Scarbrough's first quarter, six-yard touchdown run. Alabama was last held off the scoreboard in a 9-0 loss to Auburn on Nov. 18, 2000. Alabama has a 167-51 (.766) record over the course of the current streak

RUSHING TO SUCCESS: Alabama rushed for 365 yards against Ole Miss on Sept. 30 and is now 96-5 (.950) since the start of the 2008 season when rushing for at least 140 yards. The only losses were at Auburn in 2013, at Ole Miss and vs. Ohio State in 2014, against Ole Miss in 2015 and against Clemson in 2016. The Tide has topped the 140-yard mark 28 times in its last 35 games dating to the start of the 2015 season. UA rushed for 140 yards or more 10 times in 2015 and 13 times in 2016 and has done so in all five games this season.

BALL PROTECTION: In the last 130 games dating to the start of the 2008 season, Alabama has turned the ball over only 146 times (80 fumbles, 66 interceptions) for 1.12 turnovers per game. Since 2009, the Tide has turned the ball over only 128 times in 114 games (1.12/game). That number since 2009 includes 53 interceptions in 3,003 attempts (1 INT every 56.7 attempts) by UA starting quarterbacks and 21 fumbles in 3,242 carries (one fumble every 154.3 carries) by the Tide's top two running backs.

HURTS' CAREER RUSHING: Jalen Hurts' 101 rushing yards against Ole Miss on Sept. 30 was his third 100-yard game of the season and the seventh of his career. The total moves him into fourth place on the Alabama quarterback career rushing list with 1,415 yards. HURTS OVER 3,000 YARDS PASSING: With 197 yards passing against Ole Miss on Sept. 30, Jalen Hurts now has 3,527 total passing yards in 20 career games at Alabama. The sophomore has completed 297 of 471 career passes (63.1 percent) with 29 touchdowns and nine interceptions.

HURTS OVER THE CENTURY MARK ON THE GROUND AGAINST OLE MISS:

Alabama sophomore quarterback Jalen Hurts rushed for 101 yards on 10 carries against Ole MIss on Sept. 29, his third game with 100+ yards this season and the seventh 100-yard rushing game of his career. Hurts rushed for a career-high 154 yards on 10 carries against Fresno State on Sept. 9 and 103 yards on 11 carries against Colorado State on Sept. 16. In his two career appearances against Ole Miss, the Channelview, Texas, native has rushed for 247 yards on 28 carries (8.82 ypr) with one touchdown. Hurts is averaging 92.2 yards per game and 8.4 yards per carry this season.

HURTS CAREER LONG TOUCHDOWN PASS: Jalen Hurts' first quarter 78-yard touchdown pass to junior Calvin Ridley against Colorado State on Sept. 16 is a new career long pass for the sophomore signal-caller. Hurts' previous career long pass (and touchdown pass) was 71 yards to ArDarius Stewart vs. USC on Sept. 3, 2016.

HURTS CAREER HIGH IN RUSHING YARDS: Quarterback Jalen Hurts' 154 yards rushing against Fresno State on Sept. 9 is a new career high and ranks No. 5 all-time at Alabama for rushing yards by a quarterback in a single game. Hurts' previous best was 146 yards at Ole Miss in 2016. The performance marked the fifth time the sophomore surpassed the 100-yard rushing mark in a game.

TIDE OFFENSE HAS RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCE AT VANDERBILT:

Alabama's 59-0 win at Vanderbilt on Sept. 23 was a record-breaking day for the Crimson Tide offense. The Tide's 677 yards in total offense is the most ever recorded by UA against an SEC opponent and trails only the 833 yards accumulated by Alabama against Virginia Tech in a 77-6 win in 1973. The total offense differential with the Commodores (677-78) is the largest in a single game for UA. The 38 first downs is also a school record and ties for third-most in SEC history. Alabama's 496 rushing yards is the most by a Tide team under Nick Saban, the sixth-most in school history and fourth-best total against an SEC opponent. The 93 plays run (66 rush/27 pass) ties for No. 5 all-time in school annals.

HARRIS' CAREER DAY AGAINST THE COMMODORES: Junior Damien Harris recorded career highs in rushing yards (151) and rushing touchdowns (3) and set a new mark for long touchdown run (61 yards) against Vanderbilt on Sept. 23. Harris' previous single-game rushing high was 144 yards at Ole Miss on Sept. 17, 2016. The performance against the Commodores was also Harris' fourth career 100-yard rushing game and his first this season.

SCARBROUGH'S FOURTH TWO-TOUCHDOWN GAME: Junior Bo Scarbrough's two first half touchdown runs against Vanderbilt on Sept. 23 marks the fourth time in his career the Northport, Ala., native has found the end zone on the ground multiple times. Scarbrough last rushed for two touchdowns against Clemson in the 2017 CFP National Championship Game.

HARRIS AND PIERSCHBACHER EARN SEC WEEKLY HONORS FOLLOWING VANDERBILT WIN: Alabama junior running back Damien Harris and redshirt junior left guard Ross Pierschbacher were named Southeastern Conference Players of the Week for their performances in Alabama's 59-0 win over Vanderbilt on Sept. 23. Harris was chosen on offense, while Pierschbacher was selected as the league's top offensive lineman. Harris finished his day in Nashville setting new career-best marks in rushing yards (151) and touchdowns (3), all coming on only 12 carries. The junior averaged 12.6 yards per carry, as he led an Alabama rushing attack that compiled 496 rushing yards in the win. Pierschbacher played a key role along the offensive front, opening up holes and picking up key blocks to help the Crimson Tide offense amass nearly 700 yards of total offense. The Tide was able to rack up 496 yards on the ground and 181 yards through the air in what would finish as the second-most offensive yards in a single game in Alabama history at 677. The Cedar Falls, lowa, native did not allow a sack and played a penalty-free game in the victory on his way to the league honors.

WOMACK NAMED SEC OFFENSIVE LINEMAN OF THE WEEK FOR FRESNO STATE PERFORMANCE: Alabama redshirt sophomore offensive tackle Matt Womack was named the Southeastern Conference Offensive Lineman of the Week following his performance against Fresno State on Sept. 9. The conference award is the first of Womack's career. Womack did not allow a sack or quarterback hurry and played a penalty-free game in the Tide's 41-10 win over the Bulldogs. He graded out at 90 percent and recorded three knockdown blocks against Bulldog defenders. The Hernando, Miss., native helped open holes for an Alabama running game that finished with 305 rushing yards and three touchdowns. Quarterback Jalen Hurts recorded his fourth career 100-yard rushing game with a career-high 154 yards and freshman Najee Harris added 70 yards on 13 carries to pace the running backs.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

POINT OF NO RETURN: Through five games this season, Alabama's JK Scott is averaging 39.0 yards per punt, but lost in that number is the fact Crimson Tide opponents have yet to return one of his 15 kicks. Eight of his 15 punts have resulted in fair catches, four have landed out-of-bounds, two have been downed inside the opponent 10-yard line by the Tide punt coverage unit and one has gone for a touchback. Dating to his final attempt against Florida State on Sept. 2, seven of Scott's last 10 punts have resulted in fair catches inside the opposing 20-yard line, including three inside the 10-yard line, and one punt out of bounds at the opponent four-yard line.

PAPPANASTOS TOPS THE SEC: Through five games, senior place kicker Andy Pappanastos leads the SEC in scoring and kick scoring (10.4 ppg) and is third in field goals per game (1.6). Pappanastos ranks No. 6 nationally in kick scoring and 18th in total scoring. Pappanastos has converted 8-of-11 field goal attempts and 28-of-28 PATs so far this season and hit a career-long 46-yard kick against Colorado State on Sept. 16.

FIRST CAREER FIELD GOAL FOR SCOTT: Senior punter JK Scott's third quarter 48-yard field goal against Ole Miss on Sept. 30 was the first field goal of his career. Scott is now 1 for 3 all time at Alabama and 1 for 2 this season.

SCOTT AMONG THE NATION'S BEST: Senior JK Scott is again a candidate for the Ray Guy Award, presented annually to the nation's top punter. Scott is averaging 45.8 yards per punt in his career on 204 attempts, a mark that ranks No. 1 all-time at Alabama. So far this season, Scott has only been asked to punt 15 times and is averaging 39.0 yards per kick. He has placed 10 of those kicks inside the 20, with eight fair catches and a long of 59 yards. In 2016, the Denver, Colo., native averaged 47.2 yards per punt on 64 attempts, mark that ranked No. 4 nationally. Scott forced 15 fair catches and dropped 25 punts inside the 20. Twenty-five of his 64 punts traveled more than 50 yards, including six of 60 yards or more, which was second nationally. He has placed 89 punts inside the 20 and booted 75 punts of 50 yards or more in 47 career games.

SCOTT CLIMBING TIDE CAREER PUNTING LISTS: Punter JK Scott's two punting attempts against Ole Miss on Sept. 30 gives the senior 204 for his career, the secondmost in Alabama history. P.J. Fitzgerald (2006-09) is Alabama's career leader with 238 punts. Scott's 85 punting yards against the Commodores gives him 9,339 for his career, good for second all-time at UA behind Fitzgerald (9,485).

FITZPATRICK BLOCKS SECOND CAREER KICK IN FLORIDA STATE WIN: Junior defensive back Minkah Fitzpatrick recorded the second blocked kick of his career in the Tide's win over Florida State on Sept. 2. With Alabama leading 10-7 late in the first half, Florida State was attempting to tie the game with a 37-yard try that was foiled by the Old Bridge, N.J. native to preserve the lead for UA heading into the locker room. Fitzpatrick posted his first block as a freshman when he stuffed a punt attempt against Georgia and recovered it in the end zone for his first career touchdown.

CAREER FIRSTS ON SPECIAL TEAMS FOR HARRIS AND HOLCOMBE: Junior Damien Harris and junior Keith Holcombe posted career firsts in consecutive special teams appearances during a crucial stretch in the Tide's win over Florida State on Sept. 2. With the Tide leading, 10-7, late in the third quarter, Harris broke free on a Seminole punt attempt to record his first career blocked kick. Alabama extended its lead to 13-7 on the ensuing possession on a 25-yard Andy Pappanastos field goal. Holcombe then recovered a fumble by the 'Noles on the following kickoff at the Florida State 11-yard line to set the stage for an 11-yard touchdown run by Harris on the next play.

SERIES NOTES

THE ALABAMA-TEXAS A&M SERIES: Alabama leads the series with Texas A&M by a 7-2 margin, dating back to the first meeting in the 1942 Cotton Bowl, a 29-21 Alabama win that secured a piece of the 1941 national championship. The Aggies defeated the Tide in the 1968 Cotton Bowl, 20-16, to even the series. Alabama then swept a home-and-home series, winning 23-10 in Birmingham in 1985 and 30-10 in College Station in 1988. In 2012, Texas A&M came out blazing and used an early lead to win the game, 29-24. Alabama returned the favor a year later in College Station, winning 49-42. In 2014, the Crimson Tide pitched a 59-0 shutout in Tuscaloosa, the largest win over a ranked opponent in Alabama history. In 2015, the Tide returned three interceptions for touchdowns on the way to a 41-23 win over the Aggies in College Station. Most recently, Alabama broke open a tight game with two third-quarter touchdowns to defeat the Aggies, 33-14, at Bryant-Denny Stadium in 2016.

SABAN VS. TEXAS A&M: Alabama head coach Nick Saban has faced off with Texas A&M just five times, all of the matchups coming while at Alabama. He owns a 4-1 record overall and has won the last four meetings after falling in his initial contest against the Aggies during the 2012 season. Saban and the Tide won the last meeting in College Station, 41-23, during the 2015 season.

ALABAMA-TEXAS A&M CONNECTIONS: The Alabama football team has many connections back to Texas A&M. Most of those relationships were formed via former Alabama head coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's coaching stints at both schools. Two of Bryant's protégés have served as head coach at A&M: Gene Stallings and Jackie Sherrill. Bryant and Stallings are the most notable connection between the two programs. Stallings played for Bryant at A&M before serving as an assistant coach at Alabama from 1958-64. He returned to Tuscaloosa as head coach from 1990-96, and has remained active with both institutions since his retirement from coaching. Sherrill played for Bryant at Alabama from 1963-65 and served as head coach at A&M from 1982-88. Both Stallings and Sherrill coached against the Crimson Tide as A&M head coach, with Stallings and the Aggies winning the 1968 Cotton Bowl against Bryant and Sherrill leading the Aggies against Alabama in 1985 and 1988. There are numerous other connections as well: John David Crow was the 1957 Heisman Trophy winner and an assistant coach at Alabama from 1969-71 ... Curly Hallman, a native of Northport, Ala., played at A&M for head coach Gene Stallings and starred as defensive back from 1966-68 before returning to Alabama as an assistant from 1973-76 and 1996-97 ... Bobby Drake Keith played for Bryant at A&M and was an assistant coach at Alabama in 1958-59 ... Elwood Kettler was a quarterback on Bryant's first A&M team in 1954 and was an assistant at Alabama in 1960 ... Bobby Marks played for Bryant at A&M and was later a part of his Alabama staff from 1972-82 ... Dee Powell played for Bryant at A&M and served 20 years as an assistant coach at Alabama in 1958 and 1964-82 ... Dennis Franchione was the head coach at both schools, coaching the Crimson Tide in 2001-02 before taking over as head coach at A&M from 2003-07 ... Amy Bragg, who serves as the Crimson Tide Director of Performance Nutrition, came from Texas A&M prior to the 2010 season.

PAUL "BEAR" BRYANT AT TEXAS A&M: Before he became a national icon, legendary Alabama head coach Paul "Bear" Bryant earned a national reputation as an outstanding coach via a remarkable turnaround of the Texas A&M program as head coach from 1954-57, where he compiled a 25-14-2 overall record and won a Southwest Conference championship. Bryant took a struggling Aggie program from a 1-9 record in 1954 to a 7-2-1 mark in 1955 (the best single-season turnaround in A&M history), a 9-0-1 SWC championship season in 1956 and an 8-3 mark in 1957. A&M was ranked No. 1 in the nation for three weeks during the 1957 season — the last time that A&M has achieved that lofty status. Bryant accepted the Alabama job near the end of the 1957 season, returning to Tuscaloosa where he created an unparalleled standard of excellence while leading the Crimson Tide to six national titles and 13 SEC championships. The only Heisman Trophy winner that Bryant coached, John David Crow, played for him at A&M before serving as an assistant coach at Alabama. Crow later served as athletics director at A&M.

ALABAMA VS. A&M AT VARIOUS SITES: The Alabama-Texas A&M series has been played at four different sites and returns to Kyle Field for the fourth time. Since the initial meeting in the 1942 Cotton Bowl in Dallas, the Crimson Tide faced the Aggies in the 1968 Cotton Bowl and then played A&M in Birmingham in 1985, Tuscaloosa in 2012, 2014 and 2016 and College Station in 1988, 2013 and 2015.

GENERAL NOTES

SABAN'S ROAD RECORD: Head coach Nick Saban owns a 65-29-1 (.689) mark in road games across his four career stops, including a 37-6 (.860) mark while at Alabama. Saban has notched six perfect road seasons (2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016) and has lost more than one game on the road in only two seasons (2007, 2010). Alabama has won 24 of its last 26 road games dating back to the start of the 2011 season and is riding an 11-game road winning streak.

SABAN IN SEC ROAD GAMES: Head coach Nick Saban owns a 47-14 (.770) mark in SEC road games across his time at LSU and Alabama, including a 35-6 (.854) mark with the Crismon Tide. Saban has notched seven perfect SEC road seasons (2003, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2015, 2016).

SABAN MOVING UP SEC WINS LIST: Alabama head coach Nick Saban's 102 conference wins (including SEC championship games) ranks fifth all-time in SEC history. Three of the four coaches ahead of Saban on the list are already in the College Football Hall of Fame (Paul "Bear" Bryant, Johnny Vaught and Vince Dooley). Saban ranks first in league history in SEC regular season winning percentage at .803 (102-25). He is first in league history in winning percentage in all games at .827 (167-35). Saban is eighth on the SEC career wins list at 167. Tennessee's Robert Neyland is seventh at 173.

SABAN AMONG 20-YEAR LEADERS: Alabama's 45-40 win over Clemson in the 2016 College Football Playoff Championship Game was head coach Nick Saban's 191st victory in his first 20 years as a college head coach. That total is the secondmost in FBS history for a coach in the first 20 seasons of his career. Former Nebraska head coach Tom Osborne won 195 games in the opening two decades of his tenure in Lincoln. Long-time Penn State head coach Joe Paterno ranks third with 187. Saban's five national championships in 20 seasons tops both Osborne (none) and Paterno (1).

111-7 UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AT THE HALF: Under head coach Nick Saban, the Crimson Tide is 111-7 (.941) when leading at the half. Alabama led Ole Miss, 35-3, at halftime on Sept. 30 and has held the lead in 29 of its last 35 games dating back to the start of the 2015 season, including 13 of 15 games in 2016 and all five games this season.

FIRST TIME STARTERS: Offensive tackle Jedrick Wills Jr. became the 13th Crimson Tide player to make his first career start this season when he lined up at right tackle for the first offensive snap against Ole Miss on Sept. 30. The Crimson Tide had four student-athletes make their first career start vs. Fresno State, all on defense. Making their first starts were defensive lineman Raekwon Davis, linebackers Keith Holcombe and Jamey Mosley, and defensive back Levi Wallace. Eight student-athletes made their first career start in the season-opening contest vs. Florida State, including two on offense, three on defense and two specialists. Getting their first career nod on offense were tight end Irv Smith Jr. and offensive tackle Matt Womack. Making their first start on defense were defensive back Trevon Diggs, linebacker Anfernee Jennings and defensive lineman Isaiah Buggs. Placekicker Andy Pappanastos and long snappers Scott Meyer and Thomas Fletcher started for the first time on special teams.

ALL-AMERICANS: Under head coach Nick Saban, 36 Crimson Tide players have earned 40 first-team All-America honors since 2008, including an FBS-best 29 consensus All-Americans. Florida State is second with 12 consensus picks. Oklahoma (11) and Texas (10) are the only other programs with double-digit totals in that span. Of the Tide's 29 consensus selections under Saban, 16 were unanimous picks.

10-WIN SEASONS: With last season's 51-3 victory over Mississippi State, Alabama reached the 10-win milestone for the ninth consecutive season. The nine straight years with 10 wins extends the school record. The previous total for most consecutive 10win seasons was five, set by coach Paul "Bear" Bryant's teams from 1971-75. In 121 seasons, the Tide has won 10 or more games 36 times, equaling Oklahoma for the most 10-win seasons in college football history. Alabama has produced 11 10-win seasons since 2002 (2002, 2005, 2008-2016). Bryant had a school-record 13 10-win seasons at Alabama, while Saban is second with nine.

SEC RECORD: In 2016. Alabama extended its record for most consecutive 10-win seasons in SEC history when it defeated Mississippi State on Nov. 12, 2016, to improve to 10-0 on the year and finished 14-1. UA had a 12-2 record in 2008, 14-0 in 2009, 10-3 in 2010, 12-1 in 2011, 13-1 in 2012, 11-2 in 2013, 12-2 in 2014 and 14-1 in 2015.

ALABAMA'S TV RECORD: Alabama has compiled a 258-132-4 (.660) all-time record in 394 televised games (not including pay-per-view, tape-delayed or closed circuit telecasts). The Crimson Tide was 14-1 in televised games in 2015 and again in 2016.

113 NATIONAL TV APPEARANCES IN 130 GAMES: With the Tide's appearance on ESPN against Ole Miss on Sept. 30, Alabama has played in 113 nationally televised games since the start of the 2008 season, including every contest since the start of the 2014 season. This season, Alabama appeared on ABC against Florida State on Sept. 2, on ESPN 2 against Fresno State on Sept. 9 and Colorado State on Sept. 16, CBS against Vanderbilt on Sept. 23 and ESPN vs. Ole Miss on Sept. 30. In 2016, Alabama appeared on CBS six times (Ole Miss, Tennessee, Texas A&M, LSU, Auburn and the SEC Championship Game). ESPN aired five Tide contests (Kentucky, Arkansas, Mississippi State, the CFP Semifinal at the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl vs. Washington and CFP National Championship Game vs. Clemson). ESPN2 carried the Western Kentucky and Chattanooga games and the SEC Network broadcast the Kent State matchup. The Tide opened 2016 vs. USC on ABC.

ALABAMA-FLORIDA STATE DRAWS HUGE RATINGS: The season-opening matchup on ABC's "Saturday Night Football" between Alabama and Florida State was college football's highest-rated game of the day, achieving a 7.3 overnight rating nationally and had a streaming audience of 237,000 viewers, making it ESPN's highestrated and most-streamed kickoff weekend game ever.

ALABAMA AND MIAMI (FLA.) TO MEET IN 2021 CHICK-FIL-A KICKOFF GAME:

For the first time in 28 years, Alabama and Miami (Fla.) will face off on the gridiron when the two programs meet in the 2021 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta, game organizers announced Sept. 5. The exact date, start time and television network will be finalized at a later date. The two programs have met 17 times, with the Tide holding a 14-3 advantage. Their most recent meeting is one of the more memorable games in UA history as Alabama defeated the Hurricanes, 34-13, in the 1993 Sugar Bowl to win the school's 12th national title. Alabama defeated Florida State, 24-7, in the 2017 Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game on Sept. 2 for its fifth win in five appearances in the game. The Tide is also scheduled to meet the Duke Blue Devils in the 2019 edition of the contest.

NEW HIRES: Nick Saban made three new additions to his 2017 staff during the offseason, hiring Brian Daboll as offensive coordinator, Michael Locksley as wide receivers coach and co-offensive coordinator and bringing back Joe Pannunzio to coach tight ends and special teams. Daboll was tapped to coordinate the Alabama offense in February after spending 17 years in the National Football League with New England, Kansas City, Miami, Cleveland and the New York Jets. Locksley spent the 2016 season as an offensive analyst at UA and has previous head coaching experience at New Mexico and Maryland. Pannunzio returns to Alabama after spending the last two seasons as the Philadelphia Eagles' director of personnel operations. He served as Alabama's director of football operations from 2011-14.

ALABAMA AMONG NFL COACHING EXPERIENCE LEADERS: The Alabama coaching staff ranks fifth among all Football Bowl Subdivision programs - and leads the SEC - in years of National Football League coaching experience among its onfield coaching staff. The Crimson Tide boast 36 years of NFL experience between head coach Nick Saban (eight years), offensive coordinator Brian Daboll (17) and defensive line coach Karl Dunbar (11). Illinois ranks No. 1 with 56 years followed by UCLA (45), Michigan (40), Baylor (38) and the Tide.

SABAN AND FIRST ROUND NFL DRAFT PICKS: Since the advent of the NFL Draft, Alabama head coach Nick Saban ranks third all-time among college coaches who have tutored first round draft picks. Saban has coached a total of 27 players who were chosen in the opening round of the draft, including 22 from Alabama. Florida State's Bobby Bowden is the career leader with 35, followed by Penn State's Joe Paterno at 32.

ALABAMA IN THE NFL (WEEK 3): Below is a look at some of the week three highlights from former Crimson Tide platers currently in the NFL.

Ha-Ha Clinton-Dix came up big in week four, tallying eight tackles to rank second for the Packers, as Green Bay defeated the rival Chicago Bears, 35-14, on Thursday Night Football. The safety also notched his first interception of the season in the Thursday pairing.

The Los Angeles Rams won their third game of the season, thanks in part to **Mark Barron**. The linebacker tied for the team lead with seven tackles and added an interception. Barron currently leads the Rams defense in solo tackles with 25 across four games.

C.J. Mosley put together another strong performance, finishing with a season-high 12 tackles and a forced fumble as the Baltimore Ravens fell to the Pittsburgh Steelers, 26-9. Mosley currently ranks fifth in the league in total tackles with 38 in the first quarter of the season.

A trio of former Crimson Tide teammates met in Tampa Bay, as **O.J. Howard** and the Buccaneers welcomed **Dalvin Tomlinson**, **Landon Collins** and the New York Giants. Howard had the best game of his young career, finishing with two receptions for 63 yards and his first career touchdown in the Buccaneers 25-23 win over the Giants.

Opposite of Howard, Tomlinson and Collins put forth solid efforts for the New York defense. Tomlinson tallied three stops on the afternoon, while Collins racked up a team-high seven tackles. Collins ranks as the leader of the Giants' defensive unit in total tackles with 29 thus far.

CRIMSON TIDE PLAYERS ON NFL ROSTERS: The Alabama football program is again well-represented in the NFL heading into the 2017 with numerous former players dotting league rosters. The Tide has 47 former players (active, injured reserve, practice squad) working on an NFL roster. In the last nine NFL Drafts (including the 2017 Draft), Alabama has had 65 players selected, including 22 players in first round, 22 in the second and third rounds, six in the fourth, seven in the fifth, one in the sixth and seven in the seventh round.

- Saban has a 215-61-1 (.778) record as a college head coach to date (210-61-1, .774 after vacations). He has five national championships four at Alabama eight conference championships and 18 of his teams have played in postseason bowl games, including a trip to the BCS National Championship Game following the 2003, 2009, 2011 and 2012 seasons and the College Football Playoff Seminfinals each of the last three seasons including the CFP National Championship Game in 2015 and 2016.
- Saban is the only coach to win four BCS national championships and the only coach to win back-to-back BCS national championships. He has won five titles in his last 13 years coaching college football after capturing CFP National Championship following the 2015 season. Saban is one of three college coaches in the poll era (since 1936) to win three national championships in four years, joining Frank Leahy (Notre Dame 1946-47, 1949) and Tom Osborne (Nebraska 1994-95, 1997). He is also just the second coach in he poll era to win five national championships (Paul "Bear" Bryant).
- In 2009, Saban produced Alabama's first national championship in 17 years by guiding the Crimson Tide to a 14-0 season with dominant wins over Florida in the SEC championship and Texas in the Citi BCS National Championship Game. He then followed that up with his second BCS championship in three years with a 21-0 shutout of LSU following the 2011 season at the Allstate BCS National Championship Game. He made it back-to-back BCS national championships in 2012 with a 42-14 win over Notre Dame in the Discover BCS National Championship Game. He then took down Clemson 45-40 to capture title No. 5 following the 2015 season in the CFP National Championship Game.
- In addition to the on-field success, the 2011 team was also recognized with the Disney Spirit Award, which was presented to snapper Carson Tinker, for the team's response to the community following the tornado that devastated Tuscaloosa on April 27, 2011. The Tide also had extensive success in the classroom that year with 38 SEC Academic Honor Roll selections, a league record, and produced an Academic All-American in Barrett Jones.
- His most recent college head coaching stint, a five-season run at LSU, produced a record of 48-16 (.750), one national championship (2003), two Southeastern Conference championships, three SEC West Division championships, and a 3-2 record in bowl games including two Sugar Bowl victories and a Peach Bowl win. The Tigers constructed a 28-12 (.700) record against SEC opponents under Saban's guidance. He was named the 2003 National Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and earned both the Paul W. "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award and the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award by the Football Writers Association of America. Saban was named SEC Coach of the Year twice (by the Birmingham News in 2001 and by the Associated Press in 2003).
- Saban served as head coach at Michigan State from 1995-99, his second stint at the East Lansing school as he also spent 1983-87 as the Spartans' defensive coordinator/secondary coach. After playing in just one bowl game in the previous four years, Michigan State made four postseason appearances in Saban's five years at the helm. Saban led MSU to a 34-24-1 (.585) record as head coach.
- In 1999, Saban led his final Spartans team to a No. 7 national ranking as MSU finished in a tie for second in the Big Ten. The Spartans defeated Notre Dame, Michigan, Ohio State and Penn State in the same year for the first time since 1965 and recorded six wins at home for the first time since the 1912 season. The Spartans' performance that year landed them a spot in the Citrus Bowl. The Spartans led the Big Ten in rushing defense (77.0 yards per game) and total defense (299.0 yards per game) while ranking fifth nationally in rushing defense and 11th in total defense. The Michigan State offense averaged 31.0 points per game.
- Saban's first head coaching position came at the University of Toledo in 1990, as he guided the Rockets to a record of 9-2 that year, finishing as co-champions of the Mid-American Conference. The Rockets ranked among the NCAA leaders in both total defense (12th at 284.8 yards) and scoring defense (16th at 16.2 points), and missed posting an undefeated record by a mere five points.
- A native of Fairmont, W.Va., Saban is a 1973 graduate of Kent State University where he earned a bachelor's degree in business. He earned a master's degree in sports administration from Kent State in 1975. Born October 31, 1951, Saban and his wife, the former Terry Constable, have two children, Nicholas and Kristen. They have one granddaughter, Amélie, and a daughter-in-law, Kelsé.
- At Michigan State, Saban started the "Nick's Kids" Foundation, which the Sabans continue here in Tuscaloosa. Since their arrival at the University of Alabama, the Saban's have helped raise more than \$7 million for "Nick's Kids" that has been distributed to more than 250 charities and organizations throughout the state of Alabama and the Southeast. The Sabans also built 16 homes, one for each of the Tide's national championships, with Habitat for Humanity following the April 27, 2011, tornado that struck Tuscaloosa.
- In June of 2008, the Sabans announced a \$1 million gift to benefit Alabama's first-generation scholarship program. The gift has a special meaning to the Sabans as both Nick and Terry were both first-generation graduates.

ATLANTA — The top-ranked University of Alabama football team forced two interceptions, caused and recovered a fumble and blocked two kicks in its 24-7 win over the No. 3-ranked Florida State Seminoles in the Chick-Fil-A Kickoff Game inside the brand new Mercedes-Benz Stadium. The victory extended the Crimson Tide's winning streak in season openers to 16 straight games.

The Alabama special teams forced a fumble on a kickoff as well as blocking a field goal and a punt, while converting on three field goal attempts in the decisive victory. The Tide defense buckled down in the second half, allowing the potent Seminole offense just 65 total yards, while picking off FSU quarterback Deondre Francois twice in the final 16 minutes of the game. Shaun Dion Hamilton led the Alabama defense with eight tackles from his starting linebacker spot, including 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack.

Jalen Hurts finished the night 10-of-18 for 96 yards and a touchdown, while also rushing for 55 yards on 15 carries. Damien Harris paced the Crimson Tide rushers, contributing a team-high 73 rushing yards on nine carries while adding a touchdown. Calvin Ridley's big night helped him move to fifth all-time in career receiving yards at Alabama with 1,896 after amassing 82 yards on seven catches. He also moved into fifth all-time in career receiving touchdowns after catching a 53-yard score in the first half.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — Sophomore quarterback Jalen Hurts amassed a career-best 154 rushing yards to go along with two scores on the ground and one through the air as the top-ranked University of Alabama football team dominated Fresno State, 41-10, in the Crimson Tide's 2017 home opener at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Hurts' career day on the ground marked his fourth 100-yard rushing game at Alabama. The Houston native's previous career high came last season on Sept. 17 against Ole Miss when he complied 146 rushing yards in a 48-43 comeback victory.

The Tide's signal-caller also went 14-of-18 for 128 yards and a touchdown through the air to lead the UA offense. With 231 yards of total offense in the first half, Hurts surpassed 4,000 yards of total offense in his Alabama career. Freshman Najee Harris led all running backs with 70 yards on 13 carries for the win.

The Crimson Tide outgained the Bulldogs in total offense, 497-273, including a 305-57 ratio on the ground.

Sophomore defensive lineman Raekwon Davis and junior defensive back Ronnie Harrison led the Alabama defense with a team-high eight tackles apiece, while redshirt senior defensive back Anthony Averett totaled four tackles to go along with his first career interception.

On the defensive side of the ball, junior Keith Holcombe led the way with a career-high nine total tackles and a pass breakup. Senior defensive back Hootie Jones and junior back Ronnie Harrison each had interceptions to anchor the defense.

NASHVILLE — A stout running game coupled with a stifling defensive effort led the top-ranked Alabama football team to a 59-0 shutout win at Vanderbilt Stadium in the Crimson Tide's Southeastern Conference opener.

Alabama rolled up 496 rushing yards, the most in head coach Nick Saban's tenure, to go with a program-best 38 total first downs in the victory. The Tide collected 677 total yards for the sixth-most yards in a single game in program annals. The offense finished with six rushing touchdowns, two receiving scores and a field goal to tally the final score.

Junior running back Damien Harris led the rushing attack with a career-best 151 yards on 12 carries and three touchdowns, highlighted by his career-long 61 yard rush for UA's second touchdown of the day. Fellow junior Bo Scarbrough added 79 yards on 11 carries with two touchdowns. Seven other Alabama players toted the rock, including the backfield's sixth rushing touchdown of the day from freshman runner Brian Robinson Jr.

Playing exclusively in the second half, freshman quarterback Tua Tagovailoa amassed 103 yards on 8-of-10 passing and two scores to a pair of freshmen wideouts, one to Jerry Jeudy and the other to DeVonta Smith.

The Crimson Tide defense limited the Commodores to 78 total yards of offense, the fewest allowed by an Alabama defense under Saban, holding VU to only 40 yards rushing and 38 yards through the air on the day. The Tide defense did not allow Vandy past its own 44 on the afternoon and gave up only three first downs, the fewest by an SEC team in the last 20 years of the league.

Senior Shaun Dion Hamilton led the defense with five tackles, including two solo stops. Junior safety Ronnie Harrison hauled in his second interception in as many games, while sophomore Anfernee Jennings forced a fumble that was recovered by Scarbrough to round out the turnovers for Alabama.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. — The No. 1-ranked University of Alabama football team defeated Ole Miss, 66-3, on Saturday night in front of a sold-out crowd at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Following the Tide's SEC home opener, Alabama scored 50-plus points in back-to-back Southeastern Conference openers for the first time since 1945, after the previous weekend's impressive 59-0 win at Vanderbilt to begin conference play. The 66 points scored by Alabama is the most since 1979, when the Crimson Tide downed Vanderbilt, 66-3, in Nashville. The huge scoring output also marked the Tide's most points scored against Ole Miss in program history.

Alabama dominated Ole Miss on both sides of the ball, outgaining the Rebels, 613-253, while forcing two turnovers and compiling five sacks in the game.

Sophomore quarterback Jalen Hurts finished the night 12-of-19 for 197 yards and two scores passing, while adding a team-high 101 rushing yards and a score on 10 carries to lead the Alabama offense, despite playing just over one half of football. The performance marked Hurts' seventh career 100-yard rushing game and his third of the 2017 campaign.

Five different rushers scored on the ground for UA, including Hurts, freshmen Najee Harris and Tua Tagovailoa, and a pair of junior running backs in Ronnie Clark and Bo Scarbrough. Junior Hale Hentges along with sophomore Josh Jacobs and freshman Henry Ruggs III each recorded a touchdown reception to round out the scoring.

On defense, senior corner Levi Wallace led the way with a Tide season-high and career-high two interceptions, including one which he returned for a 35-yard touchdown in the first quarter. Junior safety Minkah Fitzpatrick was tops on the team in tackles with a career-high eight stops to go along with his first sack of the season.
