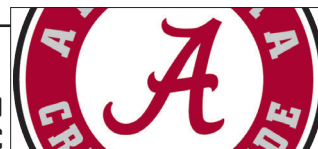

NOLES, TIDE FACE OFF IN GREATEST OPENER OF ALL TIME

- » Based on the preseason AP poll, which began in 1950, Florida State's matchup with Alabama is the first to feature two top-three teams in a season opener. The game will be the fourth top-five season-opening matchup and first since 1986
- » Florida State is ranked in the top-10 in the AP's preseason poll for the sixth time in eight seasons under head coach Jimbo Fisher, tied for the second-most appearances in the preseason top-10 since 2010
- » Florida State and Alabama are the only two programs in college football that have played in at least five straight BCS/New Year's Six bowl games. Florida State has played in the 2013 Orange Bowl, 2014 BCS National Championship, 2015 Rose Bowl, 2015 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and 2016 Orange Bowl. Alabama appeared in its sixth straight BCS/New Year's Six bowl game in 2016
- » Florida State is 9-1 against SEC opponents under head coach Jimbo Fisher, with records of 6-1 against Florida and 1-0 against Ole Miss, Auburn and South Carolina
- » Under head coach Jimbo Fisher, Florida State is 17-10 (.630) against ranked opponents. Coach Fisher and Alabama head coach Nick Saban (72-39) are two of only 11 active head coaches with a winning record in their career against AP-ranked opponents
- » The Seminoles have won three of their last four matchups against ranked teams
- » The Seminoles are 54-16 (.771) all-time in season openers, including a perfect 7-0 mark under head coach Jimbo Fisher
- » Since 2010, when Coach Fisher made his head-coaching debut, the Seminoles have outscored opponents 344-103 in season-opening games
- » For the 11th time in school history, and third time in the last four seasons, Florida State is opening the season with a neutral-site game. The Seminoles are 9-1 in neutral-site openers and have won eight straight, including a 45-34 victory over No. 11 Ole Miss in Orlando last season
- » Florida State boasts a record of 14-2 (.875) in NFL stadiums under head coach Jimbo Fisher and was 3-0 in 2016

XOS DIGITAL EXCHANGE

The data transfer speed is much faster than a traditional FTP service allowing very large files to be downloaded in just minutes.

PRESS PARKING

Once again, parking is limited in 2017 and passes will be issued on a priority basis within the same guidelines as working credentials. Press parking is approximately 600 yards from the press box, located in the parking garage just north of the Seminole Soccer Complex on Spirit Way.

MEDIA WILL CALL

Media Will Call is located near Gate B in the northwest corner of the end zone. Do not enter the stadium but proceed to the right and enter through the external doors marked 'Press Entrance' where the media will call table is located right inside the doors. All media, with the exception of the live network telecast crew, will work from the ninth level of the press box. Media can access the press box only through the designated elevator in the northwest tower of the University Center. The press box opens three hours prior to kickoff.

POSTGAME INTERVIEWS

Florida State's locker room is closed to the media following games, both at home and on the road. For home games, Coach Fisher will hold his postgame press conference in the media room, while requested players will be brought to the media room to meet with media representatives after Coach Fisher has finished. FSU Sports Information personnel will take player requests during the fourth quarter of each game.

IN HIS EIGHTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH, JIMBO FISHER HAS...

- » ...the second-highest winning percentage of any active head coach (minimum five years) with a record of 78-17 (.821).
- » ...led FSU to 78 victories since 2010, the second-most in college football over that span.
- » ...led Florida State to three ACC Championships. The Seminoles' 37-35 victory over Georgia Tech in the 2014 ACC Championship Game in Charlotte, N.C., gave the Seminoles 15 conference championships. FSU defeated Duke, 45-7, in 2013 and dropped Georgia Tech, 21-15, in the 2012 conference title game.
- » ...guided FSU to 29 consecutive victories during the 2012, 2013 and 2014 seasons. The 29-game win streak shattered the ACC and FSU records and was the second-longest streak over the last 20 years and 12th-longest streak in college football history.
- » ...overseen a 28-game Atlantic Coast Conference winning streak from 2012-15, the third-longest conference winning streak in FBS history (Ohio State, 2012-15, 30; Florida State, 1992-95, 29).
- » ...helped the Seminoles to a 35th-consecutive bowl appearance in 2016, tied with Nebraska (1969-2003) for the longest streak in NCAA history. FSU's streak dates back to 1982 and included the final 28 years of Bobby Bowden's historic run.
- » ...seen 83 Seminoles receive degrees since becoming head coach in 2010.
- » ...led FSU to its first National Championship win since 1999 with a 34-31 victory over No. 2 Auburn in the Vizio BCS National Championship on Jan. 6, 2014 in Pasadena, Calif. FSU finished a perfect 14-0 and ranked No. 1 in both the USA Today Coaches and Associated Press polls for the first time since 1999.
- » ...compiled a 17-1 mark against schools from the state of Florida: Miami (7-0), Florida (6-1), USF (3-0) and Bethune Cookman (1-0).
- » ...mentored quarterback Jameis Winston into the top quarterback in the country and Florida State's first-ever No. 1 NFL Draft pick in 2015. At the time, Winston became the youngest player to win the Heisman Trophy in 2013.
- » ...led FSU to seven-consecutive winning seasons. Former coach Bobby Bowden led FSU to a winning record in his final 33 seasons, and FSU has tied Nebraska's all-time record for consecutive winning seasons (1962-2001).

KIDZ1STFUND

On Aug. 5, 2011, Jimbo Fisher and Candi Fisher launched their public battle against Fanconi anemia (FA) after their youngest son, Ethan (now 12), was diagnosed with the rare disease that spring. Kidz1stFund was created with the goals of improving treatment options, raising national awareness of the disease, and helping to fund research that will lead to a cure.

The returns on the hard work have been impressive as Kidz1stFund has given more than \$4.5 million for FA research to the University of Minnesota's Fanconi Anemia Comprehensive Care Program.

The Fisher's commitment to defeating the disease is already showing progress for the families affected by the disease nationwide.

- » Entering his eighth year as the head coach at Florida State, Jimbo Fisher has authored one of the most successful starts to a head coaching career in college football history. Fisher's 78 wins are the most in college football history during a coach's first seven seasons, while his .821 winning percentage is by far the highest of any ACC coach all-time.
- » Among active coaches with five years of experience, Fisher's 11.14 wins per season average is the most of any coach in college football, while his .821 winning percentage ranks second behind only Urban Meyer (.851).

- » Since becoming FSU head coach in 2010, Jimbo Fisher has played an SEC opponent ten times - seven regular season meetings with Florida as well as the 2010 Chick-fil-A Bowl against South Carolina, the 2013 BCS National Championship against Auburn and the 2016 Labor Day game against Ole Miss.
- » Florida State is 9-1 in those matchups, with FSU winning both bowl games (26-17 over South Carolina and 34-31 over Auburn).
- » The Seminoles have outscored their SEC opponents by 12.8 points per game (30.2-17.4) under Fisher.
- » Fisher's nine wins against SEC teams are more than six of the SEC's current head coaches vs. SEC teams:

- » Saturday's game against top-ranked Alabama will be the first season-opener against teams ranked in the Top 3 in the history of the Associated Press preseason poll.

- » Florida State head coach Jimbo Fisher, a former assistant under Alabama head coach Nick Saban when both were at LSU, has never faced his former boss as a head coach. As FSU's offensive coordinator in 2007, the Seminoles beat Alabama 21-14 in Jacksonville, Fla.
- » FSU and Alabama are the only two teams in the country to finish in the AP Top 25 each of the past seven years (since Fisher became head coach in 2010).
- » Alabama (86) and FSU (78) are 1-2 in the country in wins since 2010.
- » FSU's five-game win streak entering 2017 is tied for the eighth-longest active streak in the country.

NOLES NEARLY PERFECT IN NEUTRAL SITE OPENERS

- » Florida State's game against No. 1 Alabama will be the 11th time the program will kick off a season at a neutral site. The Seminoles are 9-1 all-time with eight consecutive wins in neutral site season-openers.
- » This is FSU's third neutral-site opener in the past four seasons. Prior to 2014, FSU had not played a neutral-site opener since 2002.
- » In 2016, FSU beat Ole Miss 45-34 in the Camping World Kickoff in Orlando, Fla.
- » In 2014, FSU defeated Oklahoma State 37-31 at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas.
- » FSU's string of eight-consecutive neutral site opening victories includes wins over six current Power 5 programs: Ole Miss, Oklahoma State, Iowa State, Texas A&M, Duke and Kansas. Two wins over BYU round out the win streak.
- » The lone neutral site opening loss was 28 years ago, on Sept. 2, 1989, when Brett Favre-led Southern Miss defeated FSU 30-26 in Jacksonville, Fla.
- » Florida State's first neutral site opener was a 24-9 win over Southern Miss on Sept. 11, 1971 in Mobile, Ala.

- » Florida State was part of the inaugural GameDay road show when it traveled to Notre Dame on Nov. 13, 1993 for the "Game of the Century".
- » FSU's most frequent opponents on GameDay have been in-state rivals Florida (8) and Miami (7).
- » The Seminoles boast a 17-16 all-time record in GameDay contests. This is FSU's eighth neutral site game, and just the second regular-season neutral site game (vs. Oklahoma State in 2014).
- » Only three schools - Alabama (39), Florida (37) and Ohio State (37) - have been involved in more GameDay contests than Florida State.

QUARTERBACK DEONDRE FRANCOIS

- » Redshirt sophomore quarterback and reigning ACC Rookie of the Year Deondre Francois enters his second season as the Florida State starter. He led FSU to a 10-3 record in 2016 and a win over No. 6 Michigan in the Orange Bowl.
- » Francois was one of only two freshman quarterbacks in the country to pass for over 3,000 yards, and his seven interceptions were fewest for any freshman QB with at least 2,000 passing yards.

- » Francois added five rushing touchdowns, the most for a Seminole quarterback since Chris Rix also had five rushing touchdowns in 2003.

100-yard rushing games for junior running back Jacques Patrick. Backing up All-American Dalvin Cook each of his first two seasons, Patrick made the most of his limited action. In a start against Syracuse in 2015, Patrick rushed for 162 yards and three touchdowns, and added 62 receiving yards. Last year, Patrick ran for 124 yards and a touchdown at USF.

JUNIOR WRs LOOK TO EMERGE

- » After losing its top four receiving options, rising junior wide receivers Nyqwan Murray and Auden Tate enter 2017 with the most experience of any Florida State receivers. Murray averaged 16.3 yards per catch, while Tate led the Noles with a 16.4 yards per reception average in 2016.
- » Murray totaled 27 receptions for 441 yards and five touchdowns in 2016 with 22 catches, 395 yards and all five scores coming over the final six games.
- » Murray, who switched his jersey to No. 8 from No. 80 this season, had a nine-catch, 153-yard effort at NC State en route to ACC Receiver of the Week honors.
- » Tate emerged as a big-play threat as a sophomore, starting four games and finishing with six touchdowns on just 25 catches (4.2 catches per touchdown). He totaled 409 yards.
- » Tate had six catches, 101 yards and two touchdowns vs. Boston College, all career-highs. Tate also had a pair of receiving touchdowns at Louisville.

NOLES AMONG NATION'S BEST IN RED ZONE

- » Florida State led the country in red zone scoring percentage again in 2016, converting 55 of 57 attempts for a 96.5 scoring percentage.
- » It was the highest percentage by a college football team since FSU converted 97.3 percent of its red zone attempts (71-73) in 2013.
- » During Jimbo Fisher's tenure as a head coach, the Seminoles are converting 91.5 percent (386-422) of their red zone trips - the best mark in the country since 2010.

GAME NOTES: DEFENSE

JAMES, McFADDEN LEAD EXPERIENCED SEMINOLE DEFENSE

- » Junior Tarvarus McFadden burst onto the scene in 2016 by tying for the nation's lead with eight interceptions in his first year as a starter. He was a finalist for the Nagurski Trophy given to the nation's top defensive player and collected the Jack Tatum award as the nation's top defensive back from the Columbus Touchdown Club. He grabbed First Team All-America honors from FWAA and Phil Steele.
- » McFadden's eight picks tied for the second-most in FSU history with Monk Bonasorte (1979) and Curt Campbell (1951). Terrell Buckley set the school record with 12 picks in 1991 en route to the Jim Thorpe Award.
- » McFadden's eight picks tied for the eighth-most in a single-season in ACC history.
- » McFadden was a consensus preseason All-American, as was fellow defensive back Derwin James. James, named the top player in college football this offseason by both Sports Illustrated and ESPN, played in just two games in 2016 before suffering a season-ending injury.
- » As a true freshman in 2015, James was second on the team with 91 tackles, 4.5 sacks and 9.5 tackles for loss and added two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries, five pass breakups and three QB hurries. He had his first career interception in the 2016 season opener against Ole Miss.

Passing yards allowed against Boston College in 2016, the fewest for FSU against an ACC opponent since allowing 45 to Georgia Tech in 1993. The Eagles did not record a first down in the second or third quarters in FSU's 45-7 win on Nov. 11, 2016.

EXPERIENCE MATTERS

- » Florida State returns 83.3 percent of its tackle production on defense this season.
- » Matthew Thomas, FSU's leading returning tackler after a 15-tackle output against No. 6 Michigan in the Orange Bowl, returns with 77 tackles a year ago.
- » Of FSU's top 25 tacklers in 2016, 22 return for 2017. Behind Thomas, No. 3 Trey Marshall (58), No. 4 Ro'Derrick Hoskins (53) and No. 5 Derrick Nnadi (49) round out the top returning tacklers.

SACK ATTACK

- » Florida State led the nation in sacks per game (3.92) and finished second in total sacks (51) in 2016. The Noles return 68.6 percent of their sacks in 2017 (35 of 51). FSU loses consensus All-American defensive end DeMarcus Walker (16.0 sacks), but returns freshman All-American Brian Burns (9.5 sacks), two-year starter Josh Sweat (7.0 sacks), All-ACC nose tackle Derrick Nnadi (6.0 sacks) and three-year contributor Jacob Pugh (4.5 sacks) among others.
- » Burns was outstanding in 2016, leading all freshmen nationally in sacks (9.5) en route to freshman All-America honors.
- » Burns' 9.5 sacks in 2016 were the most for an FSU freshman since Ron Simmons had 12 in 1977.
- » As a team, FSU had eight sacks at Syracuse and six against Florida to close the 2016 regular season. It was the first time since 2010, and just the seventh time in school history, that FSU had six or more sacks in consecutive games.

THOMAS DOMINATES WOLVERINES

- » Redshirt senior linebacker Matthew Thomas had the best performance of his career against No. 6 Michigan in the 2016 Orange Bowl, totaling a career-high 15 tackles and 3.5 tackles for loss on the way to collecting ESPN All-Bowl team honors.
- » Thomas led FSU with 77 tackles in 2016 in his first year as a full-time starter for the Seminoles.
- » The Miami, Fla., native has totaled 107 tackles and 15.5 TFLs over 25 career games with 15 starts.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

- » Florida State had seven players named to the Senior Bowl Watch List in August.
- » All seven are members of Charles Kelly's defense - defensive backs Nate Andrews, Ermon Lane, and Trey Marshall; linebackers Ro'Derrick Hoskins, Jacob Pugh, and Matthew Thomas; and defensive tackle Derrick Nnadi.
- » In total, the FSU defense returns players that have combined to make 183 career starts, led by Nnadi (24), Andrews (21), and Josh Sweat (20).
- » Andrews, Hoskins and Thomas were all members of Florida State's 2013 National Championship team and are looking to become the first players in school history with two national championships.

GAME NOTES: SPECIAL TEAMS

WHAT A PAIR

- » Ricky Aguayo and Logan Tyler flashed their talent as true freshmen specialists in 2016.
- » Aguayo, brother of three-time All-American Roberto Aguayo, collected ESPN True Freshman All-America and All-ACC honorable mention honors as FSU's primary placekicker. Aguayo made 19-of-26 field goals in 2016, including a school- and national-freshman-record of six in his collegiate debut against Ole Miss.
- » Tyler handled punting and kickoffs. He averaged 40.3 yards per punt. On kickoffs, he had 57 touchbacks on 90 kicks, an average of 64.1 yards per kick which ranked No. 1 in the ACC and No. 9 in the nation. Tyler kicked a 53-yard field goal on his first career attempt.

NOLES OWN LONGEST PAT STREAK IN HISTORY

- » Before having his final extra point attempt of 2016 blocked in the Orange Bowl against No. 6 Michigan, Ricky Aguayo had made his first 51 of the season.
- » Florida State owns the NCAA record for consecutive extra points made with 302. FSU broke the previous record of 263 (Syracuse, 1978-89) against USF on Sept. 24, 2016.
- » Dustin Hopkins made his final 50 PATs in 2012 and three-time All-American Roberto Aguayo, Ricky's older brother, was 198-for-198 from 2013-15. Ricky Aguayo was 51-for-52 and Logan Tyler was 3-for-3 last year.
- » Michigan (284) and Memphis (209) are the only schools with a current streak over 200.

Consecutive games since allowing a kickoff return touchdown, dating back to Oct. 2, 2004, against Clemson. FSU's 169-game streak is the longest active streak in the country.

BURNS SHINES ON SPECIAL TEAMS, TOO

- » In addition to his 9.5 sacks, the most for a freshman in 2016, sophomore defensive end Brian Burns was the first FSU player with a blocked punt since head coach Jimbo Fisher's first game at FSU in 2010 (Chris Thompson vs. Samford).
- » Burns' block against Syracuse was part of a five tackle, 2.5-sack game against the Orange.

FISHER NAMES THREE RETURNERS

- » Florida State is tasked with replacing its main kickoff and punt return men in 2016. Kermit Whitfield set the FSU records for career kickoff return yards (2,386) and returns (94), while Bobo Wilson was FSU's return man for the first half of 2016 before suffering a season-ending injury.
- » In 2017, wide receiver Keith Gavin and defensive back Derwin James are expected to field the majority of kickoffs. James has never returned a kick at FSU, while Gavin has returned just one - a 66-yarder in his first touch as a Seminole in the final minutes of the 2016 Orange Bowl that led to FSU's 33-32 win over the No. 6 Wolverines.
- » On punt returns, defensive back Tarvarus McFadden has been named the go-to return man. McFadden has no punt returns and just one kick return in his career, a 26-yard return as a freshman in 2015.

OF NOTE...

- » Logan Tyler's 53-yard field goal against Boston College in 2016 was the first attempt of his career. It was FSU's longest field goal of the season. The Seminoles have not had a longer made field goal since Dustin Hopkins' 56-yarder in 2012.
- » Keith Gavin's 66-yard kickoff return in the Orange Bowl against Michigan was FSU's longest since Kermit Whitfield's 100-yard return touchdown against Auburn in the 2013 BCS Championship.
- » Ricky Aguayo was named the Lou Groza 'Star of the Week' after his 6-for-6 game against Ole Miss in the season opener in 2016. In addition to setting the FSU record for field goals in a game, Aguayo set the national record for field goals in a debut and set the record for points in a game by a kicker at Florida State (21), breaking his brother Roberto's record of 19 against Wake Forest in 2014.
- » Bobo Wilson's 89-yard punt return touchdown against Charleston Southern in Week 2 last season was the third-longest in FSU history and the first punt return for a touchdown since Tyler Hunter's against Duke in 2012.

- » May: finished eighth at the ACC Outdoor Championships, earning bid to NCAA East Region meet.
- » June: earned All-American honors at the NCAA Outdoor Championships, placing seventh with a career-best leap of 7.63 meters (25-0.5).
- » Senior defensive tackle Fredrick Jones also contributed to the Seminoles' track & field team, placing eighth at the ACC Outdoor Championships in the discus. Becker and Jones join Jalen Ramsey, Warrick Dunn, Deion Sanders, Sammie Smith, Dexter Carter, Antonio Cromartie, Ken Lanier and Rohn Stark, among others, in the long line of football & track and field stars at FSU.

EBERLE, SAUNDERS LEAD ON & OFF FIELD

- » Redshirt junior center Alec Eberle was named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team in 2016 when he was recognized for his work as Florida State's president of its Uplifting Athletes Chapter which raises funds for rare diseases. Eberle is FSU's fifth player, and first since 2010, to earn the honor.
- » In April, tight end Mavin Saunders was named Riley Elementary's Volunteer of the Year for his work at the local Tallahassee school. Saunders was named to the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team watch list entering 2017.

GAMES WITHOUT CONSECUTIVE LOSSES

- » At 76 games, the Seminoles have the longest current streak without losing back-to-back games, dating to a three-game losing stretch in early 2011 (Oklahoma, Clemson, Wake Forest).
- » With the Ole Miss game at a neutral site in Orlando, all four chances to defend the streak in 2016 came away from Tallahassee.
- » FSU is one of only six schools that has not lost consecutive games since 2014.

...No. 2 FSU lost to Southern Mississippi, 30-26, in Jacksonville, Fla. Southern Miss scored 13 in the 4th quarter, including a touchdown pass from quarterback Brett Favre with 23 seconds left. Seminoles Co-Offensive Coordinator/Wide Receivers coach Lawrence Dawsey caught a touchdown pass in the third quarter to tie the game at 17.

...No. 1 FSU beat Duke, 70-26, in Orlando, Fla. The Noles tallied 797 yards of total offense. The Seminoles extended their ACC winning streak to 25 games, as well as notching head coach Bobby Bowden's 250th career victory.

2013

...No. 10 FSU defeated Pittsburgh 41-13 on Labor Day night, en route to a perfect 14-0 record and the school's third national championship. Quarterback Jameis Winston completed 25 of 27 passes for 356 yards and five total touchdowns. His 92.6% completion percentage broke a school record set by quarterback Danny Kanell in 1995 (87.5% against NC State).

DID YOU KNOW?

While it is true that the prestigious Florida State College for Women (FSCW) became coeducational and Florida State University in 1947 in order to accommodate all the males returning with GI Bills, the athletics history of the University pre-dates the 1947 start date of modern FSU football. Florida State College (established 1851) fielded football teams from 1902-04, including beating Florida for the state championship in 1904, before a 43-year hiatus as FSCW. Alabama, by the way, was 14-11 from 1902-1904.

291 & COUNTING

The Noles boast a 291-89-4 all-time record at Doak Campbell Stadium with a winning percentage of .763. Overall, FSU is 299-93-4 (.760) as the home team, which includes three seasons – 1947-49 – when they played their home games at Centennial Field. FSU was 8-4 at the downtown Tallahassee site, including 8-0 in coach Don Veller's first two seasons.

AGAINST THE ACC

Florida State is 87-14 against Atlantic Coast Conference teams in Doak Campbell since joining the league in 1992, including a 39-0 record from 1992 to 2001. FSU has had a perfect home record against league opponents 16 of 25 seasons since joining the league (four times under Jimbo Fisher).

LONGEST STREAKS

Florida State entered the 2016 season with the nation's longest active home win streak at 21 games (reached 22). FSU's all-time longest win streak inside Doak Campbell was 37 wins between 1995-2001 (unbeaten streak was 54 games between 1992-2001).

DEFENDING OUR HOUSE

Under head coach Jimbo Fisher, the Seminoles are 42-6 since 2010 in Doak Campbell Stadium. Three of FSU's losses during that span (Oklahoma, 2011; Clemson, 2016; and Florida, 2012) were Top 10 teams.

OSCEOLA & RENEGADE

One of the best traditions in college football unfolds right before kickoff as Osceola charges down the field atop Renegade - an Appaloosa horse - and plants a flaming spear at midfield. There have been six different Renegades and 16 different riders since 1978, and Brendan Carter is the current rider. In 2011, ESPN's SportsNation voted Osceola & Renegade the best NCAA Football Tradition in the country.

VIDEO BOARDS

When the Seminoles opened the 2016 season, fans were greeted with the tallest video board in college football at 63 feet high. This season, a south endzone scoreboard was added above the Champions Club seating.

FEELS GOOD TO BE HOME

FSU has a .763 winning pct. at home since Doak opened in 1950, the 15th-best win percentage among current stadiums. The 291 total wins rank sixth among the top 15 schools.
