Headlines

→ Saturday's contest between Fresno State and Alabama will be the first meeting between the two schools.

→ This will be the third time the Bulldogs will have faced the No. 1-ranked team in the nation (USC, 2005; Oklahoma, 2003).

→ Fresno State is 12-31 in games against Power 5 schools since 1998.

→ Fresno State's contest at Alabama this weekend will be the first of back-to-back games against teams that played in the College Football Playoff in 2016 - three other teams have done this before, all Power 5 schools.

→ Fresno State enjoyed their largest margin of victory since Oct. 5, 1991 (def. New Mexico, 94-17) in their 66-0 win vs. Incarnate Word.

→ Fresno State shut an opponent out for the first time since 2009 in its opener.

→ Twenty-eight Bulldogs saw their first game action at Fresno State in week 1, while seven saw starts for the first time in their careers.

→ Ronnie Rivers was one of two true freshmen running backs to earn an FBS start over the weekend, joining Ohio State's JK Dobbins.

→ Chason Virgil made his 12th career start at quarterback in week 1, but split duties as Oregon State transfer Marcus McMaryion also saw time in the second half.

→ Fresno State retired Derek Carr's jersey last weekend during halftime of the season opener, making him the seventh in the 95-year history of the program to carry the honor.

Fresno State vs. No. 1 Ranked teams

This will be the third time the Bulldogs will have faced the No. 1-ranked team in the nation as they played at USC in 2005, falling 50-42, and traveled to Norman, Okla. in 2003 to play the Sooners, dropping a 52-28 contest.

Interestingly enough, those two seasons are also the only times that Fresno State has played the eventual Heisman Trophy winner in a season as OU quarterback Jason White picked up the hardware in 2003 and USC running back Reggie Bush took home the award in 2005.

Scouting Alabama

The top-ranked Crimson Tide won its season opener 24-7 against third-ranked Florida State in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game in Atlanta on Saturday night. The Tide totaled 269 yards on offense with 173 coming on the ground and 96 yards through the air. Sophomore quarterback Jalen Hurts, the 2016 SEC Offensive Player of the Year, went 10-of-18 for 96 yards and added 55 yards on the ground on 15 carries. Junior wide receiver Calvin Ridley tallied seven receptions for 82 yards and a touchdown. Alabama held Florida State to 250 yards on offense, including only 40 yards rushing on 27 attempts.

Alabama had an SEC league-high 15 selections on the preseason coaches All-SEC teams, including nine players on the first team. The Crimson Tide had a nation-leading five players on the AP Preseason All-America Team as junior DB Minkah Fitzpatrick was selected to the first team, while Ridley, junior RB Bo Scarbrough, senior P JK Scott and sophomore OL Jonah Williams received second team honors.

→ Tedford links to Saban?

While Tedford was the offensive coordinator at Oregon (1998-01), the Ducks matched up against a Nick Saban led Michigan State squad twice in back-to-back season openers in 1998 and 1999, respectively. The two have not shared opposing sidelines since.

Hostile environments

With Fresno State's impending trip to Alabama's Bryan-Denny Stadium, one of the nation's largest venues, the Bulldogs could face a 100K capacity crowd for the second time in the history of the program.

The stadium, which has a capacity of 101,821, was sold out in all seven games in 2016 and Saturday will mark Alabama's 2017 home opener. With a sellout crowd, it will be the second-largest crowd that Fresno State has ever played in front of, with No. 1 coming being Tennessee's Neyland Stadium (103,860) in 2003.

Chason Virgil remains Bulldogs' starting quarterback

Of the five quarterbacks on the Fresno State roster, sophomore Chason Virgil is the only Bulldog in that group that was a member of the team a season ago. With that experience, he retained the starting role he held a season ago at the conclusion of fall camp despite two strong challengers in junior college transfer Jorge Reyna and Oregon State transfer Marcus McMaryion. Virgil was named the game one starter on August 27 and continues to be at the top of the depth chart heading into week two.

→ New to the fold...

- McMaryion joined the group late in fall camp, August 12, after transferring from Oregon State where he recently completed his undergraduate degree.
• Reyna, head coach Jeff Tedford's first commitment after taking the job, was the Metro League Offensive Player of the Year in 2016 after passing for 3,646 yards and 39 touchdowns at West Los Angeles College.
• The 'Dogs also added freshmen Kyle Lindquist and Brent Bailey to the depth chart.

First time participation/true freshmen starters

Twenty-eight Bulldogs saw their first game action at Fresno State in the season opener, while seven saw starts for the first time in their careers against Incarnate Word.

→ 15 freshman saw action for the first time, including seven true freshman.

→ With 44 newcomers on the team this year, Johnny Johnson Jr., and Ronnie Rivers led a group of 19 newcomers who saw time on field on Saturday.

Making an impact from the start

With a big and talented group of newcomers this fall, they made their presence felt on Saturday in the season opener, accounting for 14 points and two forced turnovers.

- In the backfield true freshmen Ronnie Rivers and Jordan Mims combined for 98 yards and two touchdowns on 17 carries. The duo totaled 160 all-purpose yards.
- Junior Emeka Ndoh recorded three tackles for a loss, including two sacks, a safety, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery, the Bulldogs' first forced turnover of the season.
- Junior Sherman Coleman Jr. came up with the team's lone interception on the night and blocked a field goal for Fresno State for the first time since 2013.

Joining Rare Company

When Ronnie Rivers trotted out for the first offensive play against Incarnate Word, the Brentwood, California native became the first true freshman at Fresno State to start at running back in a season opener since 1980 (records are inconclusive from the first year freshmen were eligible to play in 1972 through 1979).

- Prior to this season, true freshmen had accounted for 18 starts at tailback for Fresno State since 1980.
• Current Bulldogs Justin Rice (Week 10) and Josh Hokit (Week 12) each made starts at running back as true freshman for the Bulldogs in 2016.
• In his first-career start, Rivers totaled 101 all-purpose yards, including 60 yards rushing and a touchdown on nine carries.
• With another start this season, he will be the fourth Bulldog true freshman to make multiple starts in season since 1980.

A Change In Style

During head coach Jeff Tedford's tenure at Cal, the running game was a focal point, but it was primarily built around one primary back. With the Golden Bears, Tedford had eight 1,000-yard rushers, two which produced back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons (Marshawn Lynch, Shane Vereen), and one who surpassed the 2,000-yard mark (J.J. Arrington).

Wrestler, linebacker, running back...quarterback?

The versatility of running back Josh Hokit was once again on display during the 2017 season opener, this time in the passing game. While the sophomore walked-on to the Fresno State football team in 2016, passing on a scholarship offer to wrestle at Drexel after winning the 182-pound state championship in high school, he was plugged in at linebacker during fall camp.

Jimmy Camacho seizes field goal duties

A season ago while Jimmy Camacho watched from the sideline, junior Kody Kroening went 15-of-17 on field goal attempts for the 'Dogs and was named a Lou Groza Award semifinalist and entered his senior season on the Groza Award watch list.





They play who back-to-back ?

Bulldog offense gashes FCS Incarnate Word for 66 points

Fresno State amassed 613 yards of offense in its season opening win, the most offense produced by a FS squad since posting 680 yards on Sept. 20, 2014 vs. Southern Utah. The 'Dogs also enjoyed their largest margin of victory since October 5, 1991 when the 'Dogs won 94-17 against New Mexico. The 'Dogs also managed to post the largest margin of victory of all teams during week 1 of the college football weekend.

The offense made its mark with 11 chunk plays (20-plus yard plays), including 10 through the air and one on the ground. Fresno State had not posted double-digit chunk plays since Derek Carr's 2013 team that registered 13 chunk plays (2 rush/11 pass) at San Jose State. The Bulldogs offense also flashed back to Carr's Senior Night by scoring the most points in a game against Incarnate Word since November 23, 2013 when they piled on 69 in a 41-point win over New Mexico.

Since their respective redshirt freshman seasons, juniors KeeSean Johnson and Jamire Jordan have been steady pass catchers for Bulldog quarterbacks. Jordan has caught a pass in every game he has played (25) while Johnson has gone without a catch once during his two-year FS playing career - his second career game at Ole Miss in 2015. Johnson has logged catches in 23-straight games. The two Bulldogs are amongst a group of 18 individuals in the nation with 23 or more consecutive receptions.

→ The Bulldogs are the only Mountain West team with two returning receivers (Johnson and Jordan) that had more than 45 catches last season.

California Born

Of the 106 players on the Bulldogs' roster heading into the opening game of the season, 82 hail from the state of California, an increase of nine from the 2016 season finale's roster. When breaking down three of the state's major regions, 33 players are from Southern California, 30 are from the Central Valley and 13 are from the Bay Area. Of this year's group of newcomers, 37 of the 44 are from California.

- The Bulldogs won their 11th straight season opener played at home in Bulldog Stadium. Fresno State improved to 56-36-4 in season openers in program history.
The 'Dogs moved to 13-0 against FCS opponents since 2000 last weekend.
The official attendance was 39,447, which was the largest crowd since hosting Nebraska in 2014.
The Bulldogs scored their second-highest point total in a shutout win (66-0), since blanking Fort Ord 80-0 in 1942.
The last time the 'Dogs held a team below 200 yards of offense was against Sacramento State (9/10/16).
The last time the 'Dogs held a team to negative rushing yards was against San Jose State (11/21/08).
The 'Dogs held UIW to eight first downs It was the first game since Sacramento State (9/10/16), that an opponent was held to less than 10 first downs.
Fresno State scored four points on two safeties in its win against Incarnate Word. The last time the Bulldogs had two safeties in a game was Nov. 22, 2014 at Nevada.
Sherman Coleman Jr.'s blocked field in the fourth quarter to preserve the Bulldogs shutout was the first blocked field goal since Marcel Jensen did so at San Diego State (10/26/13).
The last time the 'Dogs had four receivers with touchdown receptions was against Southern Utah (9/20/14) as Jamire Jordan, Justin Allen, Jared Rice and Kyle Riddering all scored for the 'Dogs in the season opener.
KeeSean Johnson and Jordan extended their consecutive games with a reception to 23 and 25 games, respectively.
Fresno State scored eight touchdowns in the 2017 season opener; the 'Dogs scored 24 TDs in all of 2016.

Anybody, Anytime, Anywhere

Since 1998 Fresno State has played in 78 nonconference games in the regular season and 43 of them have been against teams from a Power 5 conference. The Bulldogs have a 12-31 record in those games with wins over California (2000), Colorado (2001/2012), Illinois (2010), Kansas State (2004/2007), Oregon State (2001/2003), UCLA (2008), Washington (2004) and Wisconsin (2001).

There is no sign of backing off its tradition of playing against the best competition in the nation. Fresno State will play at Alabama and Washington in 2017 while also hosting BYU. Other future games include 2018 tilts at Minnesota and UCLA, a 2019 home game vs. Minnesota and a game at USC, 2020 games at Colorado and Texas A&M, 2021 games at Oregon and at UCLA, a 2022 contest at USC, a 2023 contest at Arizona State, a 2024 contest back at UCLA and another tilt at USC in 2025.

JEFF TEDFORD

HEAD COACH

1ST SEASON | FRESNO STATE (1992)

Jeff Tedford, 55, was named the 19th head football coach in Fresno State history on Nov. 10, 2016 and was introduced to the Red Wave by Director of Athletics Jim Bartko at a press conference on Nov. 11, 2016.

Tedford, a former Bulldog quarterback and Fresno State assistant coach, returned to the Valley after holding the position of offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies – a 2016 College Football Playoff team.

Tedford assumed the role of acting head coach on Nov. 27, following the conclusion of the 2016 season as interim head coach Eric Kiesau carried out his duties for the remaining two games following Tedford's introduction.

Tedford, who is a proven winner on the West Coast, comes to the Valley with 11 years of head coaching experience at the Division I level – having led the California Golden Bears to 82 wins from 2002-2012. He left as the school's all-time winningest coach.

Tedford's ties to the Valley and Fresno State run deep. He played quarterback at Fresno State in 1981-82 under Jim Sweeney and coached at Fresno State under Sweeney from 1987-88 and 1992-96, and under a then-first-year head coach Pat Hill in 1997.

Tedford's coaching career started at Fresno State, volunteering as an assistant for the 1987-88 seasons, from there he picked up his first full-time position as an assistant for the Calgary Stampeders of the Canadian Football League – a familiar league in which he played quarterback for six seasons after his collegiate career at Fresno State.

He returned to Fresno State in 1992 as the quarterbacks coach and served as the offensive coordinator for the

Bulldogs over the ensuing five seasons.

Tedford held the same position at Oregon (1998-2001) before he became the head coach at Cal. He was named the Pac-10 coach of the year twice, led the Golden Bears to a school record seven consecutive bowl games and to a conference title in 2006.

Following Tedford's stint at Cal, he moved on to the NFL in 2014 as the Tampa Bay Buccaneers' offensive coordinator. The stop did not last long due to health issues during the preseason that evolved into an indefinite leave of absence which resulted in the two sides mutually agreeing to part ways.

Tedford made his return to the CFL in 2015 as he was named the head coach of the B.C. Lions. At the conclusion of the season, Tedford elected to exercise an option in his contract to resign and pursue opportunities in college football.

Tedford made his return to college football as an offensive consultant for the Washington Huskies under head coach Chris Peterson in 2016. A relationship rekindled after their time together as assistants at Oregon under then-coach Mike Bellotti. Washington's staff also included associate head coach Bob Gregory, who served as Tedford's defensive coordinator at Cal for eight seasons.

Tedford graduated from Warren High School in Downey and attended Cerritos Junior College for two seasons before becoming the Bulldogs' quarterback in 1981.

He and his wife Donna have two children, Taylor and Quinn.

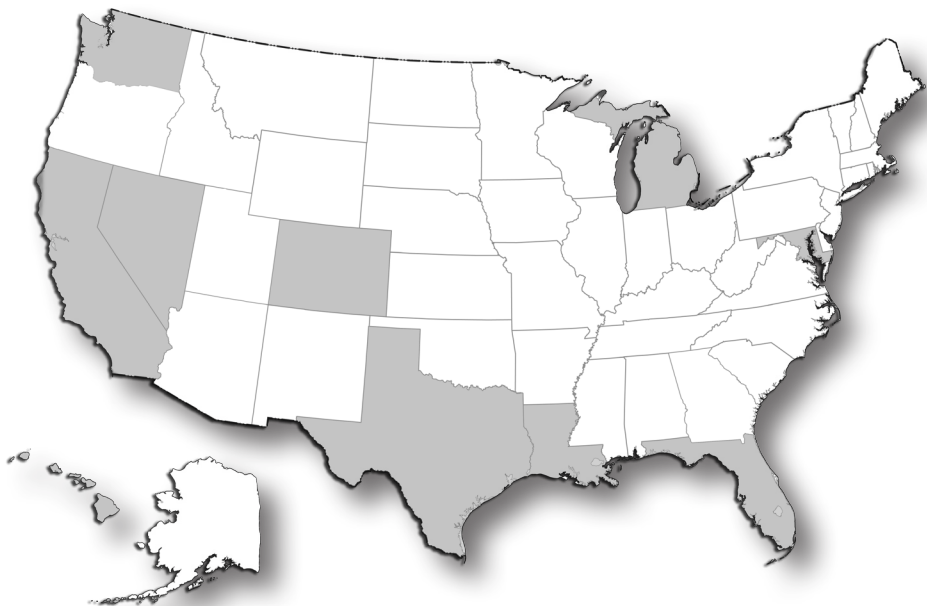
